

In fight intensifies in CONG Warning towers for calamity

Bhubaneswar (K-CN): There seems to be no end to the tussle over the change of guard of the Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC).

The tussle even get activated even after AICC General Secretary in-charge of Odisha B K Hariprasad saying that there is no vacancy for the new person in the post of OPCC President.

Hariprasad said OPCC President Prasad Harichandan will continue at least till gram panchayat elections in February 2017.

Hariprasad reaction in this regard came after 16 Congress MLAs met

AICC Vice-President Rahul Gandhi the OPCC. As the MLAs



and sought for a change of guard in Prasad, the OPCC

President wanted to show his strength before the Congress High Command.

Sources said Prasad is planning to parade the District Congress Committee (DCC) Presidents before the High Command and claim that the demand of his change not acceptable for the entire state.

The 16 Congress MLAs who hail from different 11 districts like Koraput, Bolangir, Kendrapara, Sundergarh, Jharsu-guda, Bargarh, Cuttack, Gajapati, Jagatsinghpur, Kandhamal and Nabarangpur, would try that the DCC Presidents from

their area do not join Prasad's army.

Some of the Lawmakers are also District Presidents, so what will be their stand it has to seen.

The Congress MLAs, who won elections in 2014 fighting against the Naveen and the Modi Wave feel insulted when the party high command denied to accept their demand for a change.

Though the MLAs will not openly ask the DCC Presidents to refrain from joining Prasad's camp, they have decided to ensure that the OPCC president's bid to convince the High Command in his favor fail.

Several senior Congress leaders on 29 October met at the official residence of the Leader of Opposition Narasingha Mishra to chalk out the strategy to counter Prasad's bid.

Senior leaders Niranjan Patnaik, Chiranjib Biswal, Jagannath Patnaik, Anant Sethi, Ganeswar Behera accompanied by many of the sitting MLAs of the party were among others in the group.

It is no longer a secret that strong resentment is brewing against the OPCC President in the State and all of the Lawmakers want his replacement.

Warning towers for calamity

Bhubaneswar (K-CN): Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik announced that as Odisha is prone to natural calamities such as cyclone and flood, the State Government will be setting up early warning towers along the state's coastline.

"Provision for last connectivity with the facility of early warning towers has been taken up at 122 locations all along the coast to disseminate cyclone/tsunami warning," Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik said while addressing a

state-level function organised on the occasion of Disaster Preparedness Day and National Day for Disaster Reduction.

Chief Secretary A P Padhi, Development Commissioner R Balakrishnan, Special Relief Commissioner Pradipta Kumar Mohapatra and others were present.

The day is widely observed in the state as about 10,000 people of Odisha were killed on this date in 1999 due to the Super Cyclone.

Nature care moves NGT

Bhubaneswar (KCN): Nature Care Initiative has moved to the National Green Tribunal (NGT) praying for immediately steps to ensure free flow of water in River Mahanadi system to maintain ecology and Bi Diversity of Satkosia and Bhitarkanika, which prompted the Green Panel to seek response from the Centre and other parties on the matter.

The Bench headed by Justice Jawad Rahim issued notices to Ministry of Environment and Forests, Ministry of Water Resources, Governments of Chhattisgarh and Odisha and State Pollution Control Boards and Central Pollution Control

Board asking their response.

Hearing a plea filed by Shakti Prasad Nayak of Nature Care Initiative seeking legal action against all the industries operating near River mahanadi, its tributaries and distributaries being carried out without seeking prior environment clearance or in violation of the conditions prescribed in the environment clearance, if granted and without any preventive measures, and report the same to NGT.

"State of Chhattisgarh and Odisha have been constructing major and medium projects on Mahanadi without assessing its impact on water flow, ecology and biodiversity...Chhattisgarh

government has constructed 8 major and 34 medium irriga-



tion projects on the upper catchment of Mahanadi river and another four major and medium projects each are under construction.

"State of Odisha

is implementing several major and medium irrigation

Ret, Dahuragoth are in progress, Ong, Brutang, Upper Lanth, Kutulisinga, Tel Integrated, Khadga, Utei Raul, Jira, Upper Udanti, Ranjor, Ahirajor, Laksh-mipathar Nal, Bramhani Pad and Salki projects are in survey and investigation stage," the plea filed through advocate Purushottam Sharma Tripathi said. The NGO contended that industries located along the river were discharging waste directly into Mahanadi which was also adversely affecting the ecosystem.

"Direct the respondent authorities to take appropriate legal action against all the urban Local Bodies/municipal corporations/sewerage Board, situated

near Mahanadi, its tributaries and distributaries causing pollution and running without seeking prior environment clearance," it said.

The issue of sharing of Mahanadi river water has snowballed into a major controversy between the two states.

Odisha has been accusing Government of Chhattisgarh of unilaterally constructing projects on the upstream of River Mahanadi, which caused decline in the flow of its water to the state.

JICA Projects On Fast Lane

Bhubaneswar (K-CN): JICA assisted Odisha Integrated Sanitation Improvement Project works in the twin city of Cuttack and Bhubaneswar have been expedited in the past three months as per the direction of the Chief Secretary Aditya Prasad Padhi.

The achievement is up to 42 per cent in physical progress of the project said officials here during a review meeting chaired by Mr.Padhi at State Secretariat.

The Chief Secretary directed the executing agencies to complete the drains and sewerage points started before digging new areas in the wake of frequent complaints from the silver city.

The department was also directed to have close micro level monitoring of the physical progress and ensure that the money spent yields highest result in terms of the core works of the project, said sources.

Notably, the project includes 632 km of sewer network (252 kms of in Bhubaneswar and 380 kms in Cuttack), 26 sewerage treatment plants and 48 pumping stations in the twin city.

The project cost has been estimated around Rs 2974 crore out of which State Government share is Rs 594 crore. The project has been divided to four broad packages.



Unbeaten Brathwaite anchors West Indies to 244/6

SHARJAH (KCN): chored West Indies Opening batsman to 244-6 on the second day of the third Test against Pakistan on Monday.



Brathwaite re-lived West Indies solid half century stands with Roston with Brathwaite batting resolutely after facing 206 balls, hitting 10 fours and captain Jason Holder not out on 6.

Besides Brathwaite's batting, it was fast bowler Mohammad Amir's best day in test cricket since returning from a five-year spot-fixing ban.

Amir first played a 20-run cameo to stretch Pakistan total to 281 and then brought off a spectacular two-handed diving catch his first in 20th test to remove Darren Bravo before grabbing the wickets of Jermaine Blackwood (23) and Chase.

Amir made a

quiet return to test cricket against England in August as Pakistan drew the test series 2-2. He was then rested in the second test against West Indies after taking three wickets in the first day-night test at Dubai.

West Indies ran into early trouble when Wahab Riaz had Leon Johnson leg before wicket in his second over and then combined with Amir to shake the confidence of in-form Bravo.

Both left-arm seamers set up Bravo with a barrage of short pitched deliveries before the left-hander threw away his wicket.

Bravo tried to

break the shackles and loft spinner Zulfiqar Babar over mid-off but sliced to Amir, who held on to a two-handed diving catch while running backwards from the covers. Leg spinner Yasir Shah then had Marlon Samuels lbw without scoring to reduce West Indies to 38-3 before Amir had Blackwood caught at gully after the break to make it 68-4.

But Brathwaite led the West Indies fightback with two carbon-copy 83-run stands with Chase and Dowrich.

Chase raised his half century with a six over wide mid-on off Yasir Shah but two ball later Younis

Khan grabbed a brilliant catch as Chase chased a wide Amir delivery.

Dowrich then featured in another 83-run stand with Brathwaite. He was caught off Riaz's no-ball on 15 and then on 21 Younis juggled but couldn't hold onto a sharp edge in the slip.

Riaz, who was twice warned by the umpires for running onto the danger area on the wicket, finally made amends when Dowrich dragged a wide ball from the left-arm seamer back onto his stumps just before close. But Brathwaite stood firm and had his eyes set on his first century in the series.
