Bhubaneswar (KCN): Odisha State Beverages Corporation Limited (OSBCL) has gone

to Odisha State Beverages Corporation Ltd. to lift liquor stock from the Corporation's ware-

payment module would make the business of the Corporation hassle free and more transparent and would facilitate real time transaction tracking.

Odisha State Beverages Corporation started its journey towards online digital regime in 2014 and in August 2015 implemented generation of indent by the liquor suppliers, purchase orders by the Corporation, excise permits by the excise authority, consignment dispatch note by the liquor suppliers and stock receipt note by the Corporation on a cent percent real time online platform in all its nine depots. Since May 2016 the issue of stock to the retailers batch wise has been started on online platform.

NIC, Bhubaneswar has been generous enough to take the responsibility of developing and maintaining the software for the online regime, said Sethi.

"With the online payment module coming into operation from to-day, the retailers will be able to remit their payment to OSBC for

purchase of liquor on an online platform through net banking on a payment gateway path of SBIEPay. This will not only ensure faster remittance and credit of funds to OSBC account but also it will save a lot of time, energy and money which the retailers are now incurring in making Bank Drafts at the Bank and coming physically to the OSBC depots to deposit the same for lifting liquor stock", said the Excise Secretary.

There are 1848 retail shop licensees in Odisha who are purchasing liquor from OSBC warehouses located at 9 different places across the State. These licensees include IMFL OFF Shops, IMFL ON Shops, Beer Parlours, Clubs, Country Spirit shops and Military Canteens. So far these shops were purchasing liquor stock from OSBC by making payment in shape of Bank Draft. With the advent of online payment mode, the hassles associated with payment through Bank Draft will now be removed and the payment system will be prompt,

seamless, transparent, reconciliation friendly and expense-free, said Sethi adding that this is a part of the present Digital India Movement in the Country and a step forward in complying with the slogan of cashless economy recently being emphasized by the State Government.

The online payment mode will be implemented first in Chandikhol depot covering on the retail shops of Jajpur District and subsequently rolled over to other depots by 31st March, 2017. Following inauguration a training session was held for the retailers of Jajpur District at the inauguration venue.

Arun Jaitley Thanks People For Supporting Note Ban, Says No Incident Of Unrest Reported

Sentiment turned for the better after Finance Minister Arun Jaitley on Thursday

said there has been a sharp jump in tax collections, belying fears of a sharp slowdown in the economy in view of demonetisation.

After a higher start, the 30-share index hit the day's high of 26,678.60 and closed up 260.31 points, or 0.99 per cent, at 26,626.46 — a level last seen on December 13 when it settled at 26,697.82.

It had gained 155.47 points yesterday as December derivatives contracts expired amid recovery in the rupee.

The Nifty rose 82.20 points, or 1.01 per cent, to end at 8,185.80, after touching the day's high of 8,197.

For the week, the Sensex and the NSE

Nifty recorded a rise of 585.76 points, or 2.24 per cent, and 200.05, or 2.50 per cent, respectively.

"The euphoria continued on the last trading day of the year, hoping for radical remarks in the Prime Minister's speech on Saturday. Additionally, an expectation of tax sops in the budget, weakness of the dollar and robust tax collection are adding to the positive sentiment," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit BNP Paribas Financial Services.

The year saw the Sensex zooming to a high of 29,077.28 on September 8 and a low of 22,494.61 on February 29. Today's closing meant a net gain of 508.92 points, or 1.94 per cent from

its last year-end close of 26,117.54.

During the year, the Nifty gained 239.45 points, or 3.01 per cent. The gauge had climbed to a high of 8,968.70 on September 7 and touched a low of 6,825.80 on February 29.

Domestic institutional investors (DIIs) bought shares worth a net Rs 957.83 crore as per provisional data. But foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) net sold shares worth Rs 662.29 crore yesterday.

GAIL saw the maximum jump, up 3.07 per cent, followed by Sun Pharma (2.59 per cent), ITC (2.31 per cent) and PowerGrid (2.14 per cent).

In terms of sectors, the rally was

driven by FMCG (up 1.67 per cent), power (1.30 per cent), healthcare (1.11 per cent) and realty (1.10 per cent).

Broader markets such as BSE mid-cap and small-cap ended higher with gains of 1.07 per cent and 0.77 per cent, respectively.

Trading was thin across the globe during the last day of the year, with volumes remaining below average. In the rest of Asia, Hong Kong's Hang Seng rose 0.94 per cent while Shanghai Composite gained 0.24 per cent. Japan's Nikkei shed 0.16 per cent.

In Europe, London's FTSE, Germany's Frankfurt and France's Paris were down by up to 0.25 per cent in their late morning deals.

deteriorated, the RBI said. "Asset quality of the non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) also worsened. The degree of interconnectedness in the banking system measured by the connectivity ratio showed a declining trend. Banks



warned against a sharp rise in the non-performing assets (NPAs) of banks as "the banking stability indicator shows that the risks to the banking sector remained elevated due to continuous deterioration in asset quality, low profitability and liquidity".

The stress test indicated that under the baseline scenario, the GNPA ratio may increase from 9.1 per cent in September 2016 to 9.8 per cent by March 2017 and further to 10.1 per cent by March 2018, it said. "If the macroeconomic conditions deteriorate, the GNPA ratio may increase further under such consequential stress scenarios," the RBI said in its Financial Stability Report for December 2016.

Among the bank groups, public sector banks may continue to register the highest GNPA ratio, it said. "Under baseline sce-

The business growth of banks remained subdued with PSBs continuing to lag behind their private sector peers. System level profit after tax (PAT) contracted on y-o-y basis in the first half of FY17, the RBI said. "The asset quality of banks deteriorated further between March and September 2016. PSBs continued to record the lowest capital to risk-weighted assets ratio among the bank groups with negative returns on their assets," the FSR said.

According to the FSR, the macro stress test shows that GNPA ratio of banks may increase further under assumed baseline macro scenarios. "The PSBs may record the highest GNPA ratio and lowest capital to risk-weighted asset ratio (CRAR) among bank-groups although the CRAR at the system as well as bank-group levels is expected to remain above the regulatory required minimum," it said.

Asset quality of scheduled urban co-operative banks (UCBs)

were the dominant players accounting for nearly 59 per cent of the total bilateral exposures followed by NBFCs.

On a net basis, asset management companies managing mutual funds (AMC-MFs) followed by the insurance companies were the biggest fund providers in the system while NBFCs followed by banks were the biggest receivers of funds," the RBI said.

With the implementation of global regulatory reforms most of the major international banks have become more resilient in terms of capital and liquidity, the RBI said. "However, risks of divergence from the demanding global standards amidst discriminatory treatment of foreign financial institutions seem to have increased. Globally, some risks inherent in banks may be getting transferred to other segments of the financial markets due to increased regulatory scrutiny and elevated capital requirements for banks," it said.

China to ban ivory trade by end of 2017

BEIJING(KCN): China will ban trade and processing of all domestic ivory by the end of 2017 in a bid to save the fast dwindling tusker population in the country, a "historic move" hailed as a "game changer" for African elephants.

The decision came after China had imposed a three-year ban on ivory imports in March this year, in an escalated fight against illegal trading of wild animals and plants.

"China will gradually stop the processing and sales

of ivories for commercial purposes by



the end of 2017," the official Xinhua news agency said, citing a government statement.

The move will impact China's 34 processing enterprises and 143 designated trading venues,

with dozens to be closed by the end of

ated with the elephant's tusk, an official told the agency.

China's move, if implemented, strictly could a "game changer", specially the African elephant conservation as hundreds killed every year by poachers to feed into the burgeoning markets in China and Hong Kong.

As a result the numbers of Africa's savannah elephants dropped to 3.5 lakh thousand in 2014.

China's move to ban ivory trade followed a resolution at the Convention on International Trade in

Endangered Species (Cites) in South Africa in October.

China has the biggest ivory market in the world - some estimates suggest 70 per cent of the world's trade ends up there. Ivory's price can reach USD 1,100 per kg in China.

Conservation group WWF welcomed the latest news, calling it a "historic announcement", signalling an end to the world's primary legal ivory market and a major boost to international efforts to "tackle the elephant poaching crisis in Africa", BBC reported.

Elly Pepper, deputy director of wildlife trade for the Natural Resources Defence Council, praised China for its "great leadership" on the issue.

"Setting such an aggressive timeline to close - once and for all - the largest domestic ivory market in the world is globally significant, Pepper said.

"It's a game changer and could be the pivotal turning point that brings elephants back from the brink of extinction," she said.

While the international market in ivory has been closed since 1989, legal domestic markets have continued in many countries around the world.

A surge in the killing of elephants over the past seven years has seen populations across Africa shrink by a third, according to the recently published Great Elephant Census.

7K burden on treasury

Bhubaneswar (KCN): The State Exchequer is all set to be burdened with at least Rs 7000 crore additional load if the Supreme Court's Ruling on 'equal pay for equal work' is implemented in the state, experts said.

The Supreme Court on Oct 27 reiterated that 'equal pay for equal work' is a constitutional principle and is needed to be made applicable to those engaged as daily wagers, contractual employees, who perform the same duty as the regulars.

With the verdict, around 2 lakh temporary and contractual employees in the State government are hopeful of getting salaries on par

with their regular counterparts.

The legal experts said that the SC ruling on 'equal pay for equal work' is applicable across the country under article 141 and 142 of the Indian Constitution and should be implemented in Odisha like Punjab and

several school teachers are appointed on contract basis.

While the regular and permanent employees working in various departments of the government are enjoying different facilities including medical facility, pension, gratuity, PF and Government quarters during their job period, the employees appointed on contract and temporary basis are deprived of those facilities. But Imrul dropped a regulation offering allowing Broom and Williamson to embark on their 179-run stand for the second wicket.

Broom's 97 was at a run-a-ball rate and included one six and 12 fours, while Williamson faced 116 deliveries for his 95, which included one six and nine fours.

He was left five runs short of what would have been his ninth ODI century when Jimmy Neesham came in at the fall of Broom's wicket to hit a rapid 28 to end the match.

In the final few overs, Neesham toned down his lusty hitting in an apparent attempt to let Williamson reach his milestone.

But after a mid-wicket conversation with his captain, Neesham was evidently told to finish the match, which he did with a boundary off the next ball.

The series now moves on to three T20s to be followed by two Tests.

I'm a team player, says Manchester United striker Ibrahimovic

MANCHESTER(KCN): Veteran Swedish striker Zlatan Ibrahimovic's recent flurry of goals has helped power Manchester United's resurgence but he says he is not content because he hasn't created many chances for his team-mates.

The 35-year-old, who United manager Jose Mourinho claimed earlier this week is set to sign an extension to his year-long contract which he agreed to when he joined in July from Paris Saint Germain, told MUTV he is not happy with just having three assists to his name thus far.

"When I scored (in the Boxing Day 3-1 win over Sunderland) it was 50 (goals in 2016)," he said.

"That is not one of my objectives because if a player starts to focus only on scoring goals it means he's focusing only on himself.

"Like I said, I'm not here to focus on myself because I'm here to help my team-

mates win. The goals come in the second wave — the first wave is my team, the collective part that I want to win with them.

"If the collective does well, the individual will do well and I prefer to have it that way.

"If you know the way I play my game, I'm the one who scores or tries to help my team-mates score."

One of Ibrahimovic's three assists, though, will remain long in the memory for one of the goals against Sunderland.

His cross found Armenian midfield dynamo Henrikh Mkhitaryan who converted it with a spectacular 'scorpion kick'.

"That was perfect because I said to myself 'if I put it a little behind him he can do the backheel' - exactly like we have been training for these couple of weeks and it worked," said Ibrahimovic.

"I was the one

jumping higher than everybody else when we were celebrating! I was super happy, especially for Micki. I know how it feels to score a goal like that.

"I'm happy they (the officials) didn't give it offside because a goal like that has to be (a) goal."

Ibrahimovic, who enjoyed a good relationship with Mourinho when they were together at Inter Milan in Italy, said he intended to improve his number of assists.

"I haven't had many assists so far and that is part of my game that I've been missing here in my six months at United," said Ibrahimovic, who retired from the national team after a disappointing Euro 2016 having hit 62 goals in 116 appearances over 15 years.

"At my other clubs I've been scoring goals but I've also done a lot of assists.

"I'm happy to give an assist because for me it is just like you have scored yourself.
