## The Apostle of Dalits Dr. B.R Ambedkar

Dr. B.R Ambedkar was popularly known as Babasaheb Ambedkar and everyone knows that he was one of the architects of the Indian Constitution. He was an economist, very well known political leader, eminent jurist, Buddhist activist, philosopher, historian, orator, writer, social reformer who campaigned against social discrimination against the untouchables. He is also called as the chairman of the Drafting Committee of the Indian Constitution. Ambedkar was born on 14th April, 1891 in Mhow in Madhya Pradesh. He was born in a family of Mahars, the largest untouchable caste at that time. His father Ramji Maloji Sakpal was a social worker and a subedar in the British Indian Army. His mother was Bhimabai Sakpal. He had a tough childhood as he belonged to a family a poor dalit caste. They were considered to be untouchables and were subjected to socio-economic discrimination. Even in school, Ambedkar and other untouchable children were victims of segregation and inferior treatment. He received his early education in a near by village school. He graduated from

Elphinstone college Bombay in 1912 and then joined one of the best league college, Columbia University, USA, where he was awarded a Ph.D degree. Later he furthered his studies from the London School of economics. He also joined a Bar course and completed his law degree from Gary's Inn, a

at the Kalaram temple, Nashik, Maharashtra is another landmark in the struggle for human right and political and social justice. On 24th May 1956 on the occasion of Buddha Jayanti he declared in Bombay that he would adopt Buddhism as it was the only way for the untouchable to gain equality. Dr. Ambedkar

provide for freedom, equality and abolition of untouchability and remedies to ensure the enforcement of rights. For his contribution towards the betterment of the Indian social and political set up, his birth date is celebrated as a public holiday known as "Ambedkar Jayanti " .



premier institution of law in London. Being an Indian jurist, economist, politician and social reformer Dr. Ambedkar influenced dalits in various ways. With the slogan of Educate-Agitate-Organise, the social movement led by Dr. Ambedkar aimed at the annihilation of the caste system and the reconstruction of the Indian society on the basis of equality among the human beings. In 1927, he led a March at Mahad, Maharashtra to establish the right of the untouchables to drink water from the chavdar Lake that was traditionally banned for them. This marked the beginning of anti caste and anti-priest movement. The temple entry movement launched by Dr. Ambedkar in 1930

had the view that only political power cannot be a panacea for the ill of the depressed classes. At that time Gandhi ji opposed a separate electorate for the untouchables as he feared that such an arrangement would divide the Hindu community. Gandhi ji started fasting. As a member of the Viceroy's Executive council from 1942 he was instrumental in bringing about several legislative measures to protect the rights of labourers and workers. One of the greatest contribution of Dr. Ambedkar was in respect of fundamental Right and Direct Principles of state policy enshrined in the Constitution of India. As per his suggestions the fundamental Rights

Today, many public institutions are named in his honour, such as The Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Open University in Hyderabad, B.R Ambedkar Bihar University etc. Dr. Ambedkar was also honoured with the greatest civilian award "The Bharat Ratna " posthumously in April 1990. He died in his sleep on 6th December, 1956 at his home in Delhi. He made an immense contribution in uplifting the standard of the Indian Society. He fought all his life to remove discrimination, degradation and deprivation from the society.

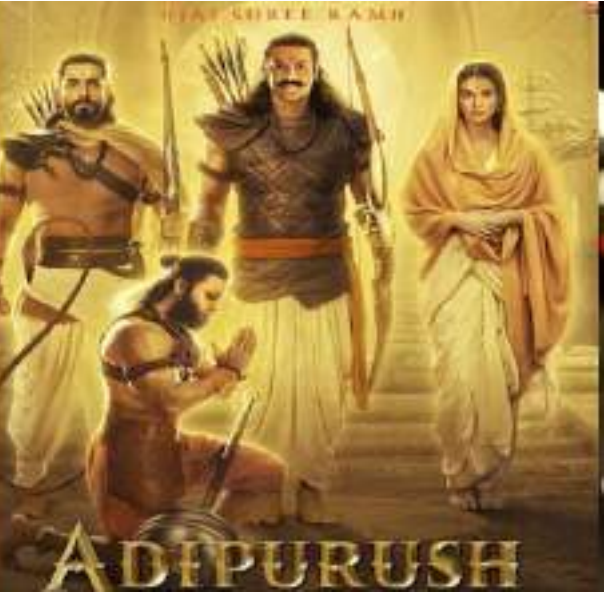

Over the decades, Ambedkar Jayanti has become a commemoration with several meanings— a celebration that captures the ecstasy, frenzy, unwavering love, aspiration, assertion, inspiration and pleasure of struggle with which Ambedkar’s followers connect. On April 14, his followers recommence their pledge to wrestle with the daily discrimination. They call it ‘Knowledge Day’. In 2021, British Columbia declared it as ‘Equality Day’. The significance of a thinker and statesman, or an iconoclast, revolutionary confronting injustice, is judged by time. Their thinking and actions set a benchmark for a timeless time. Dr B.R. Ambedkar is one of those radical thinkers, social reformers who remain significant for future generations for he was ahead of his time. Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar stands taller. He was an eminent figure in Indian history as well as a jurist, economist, politician and social reformer. He became a well-known voice against the injustices of India’s caste system, fighting for the advancement of Dalits

and other underprivileged groups. He dedicated his life to fighting for the rights of women and labourers as well as to ending societal prejudice against untouchables, or Dalits. Ambedkar has been associated with helping to draft the Indian Constitution, which embraces the values of justice, liberty, equality, and brotherhood. Ambedkar’s unwavering fight against social injustice and support of the rights of marginalised castes have had a significant impact on the development of social reforms and policy in India. His legacy acts as a guiding light, inspiring ongoing initiatives to build a society that is more just and inclusive. Celebrated on April 14th annually, Ambedkar Jayanti, also referred to as Bhim Jayanti, honours the memory of Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar, the first Law Minister of Independent India and the principal architect of the Indian Constitution. Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar gave the message of equality, freedom, fraternity, and justice to the country and the world, which is very important for humanity. Often referred as ‘Father of Indian Constitution’, will celebrate his 134th birthday on Sunday, April 14, 2024. Dr. Ambedkar received India’s highest civilian award, the Bharat Ratna, in 1990 as a posthumous honour and the year 1990–1991 was

proclaimed as the “Year of Social Justice.” A m b e d k a r Remembrance Day became more widely recognised as a result of these changes, and it was informally observed as a holiday in various states. Ambedkar was born on April 14, 1891, in Mhow, Madhya Pradesh, which is now known as Ambedkar Nagar. In school (Satara and Bombay), college (Bombay), service under the Maharaja of Baroda (briefly in 1913 and again between July and November 1917) and study abroad (Columbia University, the London School of Economics, Gray’s Inn, the University of Bonn), he exhibited a scholarly orientation, a commitment to the life of the mind and trained intellectual gifts that no other national figure in Indian politics could match over this century. By the time he finished his formal studies in the early 1920s, Dr Ambedkar had acquired qualifications that surpassed the M.A., Ph.D., M.Sc. (Econ), D.Sc. (Econ), Barrister-at-law he had added, by right, to his name and title; the young man had been through a real-life educational experience which most people (including the most renowned scholars) do not manage to acquire in a lifetime. Today Ambedkar’s views has got more relevance as democracy is sliding in India.



Democracy is not a form of government but essentially a form of society. It is incompatible and contradictory with isolation and exclusivity, leading to a distinction between the privileged and the underprivileged. Babasaheb’s commitment to democracy and constitutional morality is the first thing that strikes the mind as we commemorate Ambedkar Jayanti. Democracy was a ‘way of life’ for him, not just a political tool to gain power and rule the masses. For Ambedkar, a democratic society is a prerequisite for a democratic form of government. He expressed this concern in many speeches about democracy as a form of government. Ambedkar theorised substantive democracy, wherein a ‘social and economic democracy’ would breathe life into

political democracy. His quest for a meaningful democratic society led him to explore the concept of ‘constitutional morality’. Ambedkar’s oft-quoted reference to constitutional morality is from his speech in the Constituent Assembly on November 4, 1948, when he was responding to criticism of the draft Constitution. In a speech at the Pune District Law Library in 1952, Ambedkar described adherence to ‘constitutional morality’ as one of the prerequisites for the successful functioning of democracy. According to him, the Constitution contained only the skeleton whose flesh was found in constitutional morality. He equated constitutional morality with constitutional conventions in England. Ambedkar also considered democracy

as a revolutionary instrument to change the social order. For him, democracy was not just a rule of the majority but a way of life in which minorities should have a sense of security— a guarantee that no one would hit them below the belt. There must be no tyranny of the majority over the minority. The minority must always feel secure that it will not be hurt or double-crossed although the majority is running the government. In a constitutional democracy, we must adhere only to constitutional methods to achieve social and economic ends. Individuals must not lay their liberties at the feet of others— this is what constitutional morality is all about. Democracy cannot only be a form but must exist in substance. Political democracy is meaningless if there is no

social democracy. For Ambedkar, social democracy comprised liberty, equality and fraternity. A parliamentary democracy based on adult suffrage will only create political equality— one man, one vote. The objective should be of one man, one value. Democracy is often defined as ‘government by the people, for the people and of the people’. It is also defined as ‘government by discussion’. However, these definitions are inadequate in an unequal society. Democracy, according to Ambedkar, should lead to social and economic changes in people’s lives without bloodshed. Dr Ambedkar pointed out in his famous speech to the Constituent Assembly, “India is today entering a life full of contradictions, where there will be equality in politics, but inequality in socio-economic life. How long can we continue this life full of contradictions?” Will we be able to survive? It is certain that if we remain deprived of social democracy for a long time, our political democracy will also be in danger.” As far as economic democracy is concerned, economic inequality between the upper castes and Dalits is continuously increasing. Today’s situation is such that the rich are becoming richer and the

poor are becoming poorer. The unequal distribution of wealth and resources is widening the chasm between the rich and the poor. Income and wealth inequality is higher than that of British Raj. Between 2014-15 and 2022-23, the rise of top-end inequality has been particularly pronounced in terms of wealth concentration. By 2022-23, top 1% income and wealth shares (22.6% and 40.1%) are at their highest historical levels and India’s top 1% income share is among the very highest in the world, higher than even South Africa, Brazil and US. This is the irony is that the government becoming despotic, authoritarian and oppressive. Further, hatred is created against minorities. India is considered as flawed democracy and electoral autocracy. Media is subverted either through veiled threat or allurements. India is placed abysmally at 161 positions out of 180 countries in the 2023 World Press Freedom Index, according to the latest report released by global media watchdog Reporters Without Borders (RSF). Ruling class does not adhere to constitutional morality. Oppositions are ignored while dissents are curbed. There is one types of undeclared emergency. Festivals have been created due to the culture and ethics of sharing happiness every moment. Practically speaking, a person should always remain happy. Therefore, in Indian tradition, Teej festivals take place almost every day. All the Hindi dates are Ekam, Dooj, Teej, Chauth, Panchami, Chhath, Saptami, Ashtami, Navami, Dashami, Ekadashi, Baras, Teras, Chaudas and Amavasya or Purnima. Everyone has some festival or the other throughout the year. No day is inauspicious in our culture. It is even mentioned in the scriptures that whenever Brahma created this universe, there is a festival on that day. Chaitre Masi Jagad Brahma Sasarj Prathamme Ahani, Shukla Pakshe

Samagretu Tu Sada Suryodaye Sati. According to this verse mentioned in Brahma Purana, Lord Brahma had created the universe on the first sunrise of Chaitra month. It was called Gudi Padwa. The creation of Gudi symbolizes the creation which is the foundation of our existence. The yellow-red colored silk clothes represent the social fabric with which this world is bound. Colors reflect that joy and liveliness and yellow and red colors represent that sensitivity which have longer wavelength. Restraint, symbols of gratitude, mango and its leaves work to ensure continuity and purity of life. Flowers are planted because it is our basic nature to bloom like flowers. An earthen pot is also placed on top which is a symbol of the sky and infinity. A doll made of this is hoisted at the door so that we remember that we are the descendants of that infinity. It is depicted in Brahma Purana which is a sacred Hindu scripture that Lord Brahma recreated the entire world on this day.

When the earth was submerged during the Matsya incarnation of Lord Vishnu, Brahma again did the work of creation on this auspicious day. Brahma Puja has special significance on this day. This replication of creation and God's mercy opens new dimensions for us, hence it is also called Navasamvatsar. Bhaskaracharya had calculated the time keeping this date in mind. Time is not in anyone's hands but it was calculated on the basis of the movement of the Sun and the Earth and was made in a convenient position so that the importance of time can be felt in life. The Panchang also originated from here as part of an unprecedented process of calculation. Since then it has become popular to look into the future by doing astrological calculations on the basis of various positions of the planets and stars, to identify and warn of inauspicious signs and to take remedies for them. Gudi Padwa is the occasion



which marks the victory of the Shakas over the Hunas. The story behind Gudi Padwa and according to the Shalivahana calendar, the Huns were defeated by King Shalivahana on this day. The legend states that Satya Yuga started on the day of Gudi Padwa. Vikram Samvat is the basis of Indian calendar and time determination. Which started from Ujjain city of Madhya Pradesh. This calendar was released during the reign of King Vikramaditya, that is why it is also known as Vikram Samvat. After the victory of Vikramaditya, when he ascended the throne, he announced the waiver of

all the debts of his subjects and also released the Indian calendar, which was named Vikram Samvat. It is also described in the Vedas, the oldest scriptures of the universe. The description of Navasamvat i.e. Samvatsars is given in mantra number 45 and 15 of 27th and 30th chapter of Yajurveda respectively. When the form of nature changes and new creation gets a role, like after autumn, new forts appear on trees and old leaves fall under the same tree and become fertilizer for their parent and parent tree and keep them alive and new forts develop. This message is also

given to the people that they should always be grateful for this loan. In life, we also have birth givers and nurturers, repaying our debt to them is the most important aspect of life. As old age homes are increasing in our society, it shows that we are not able to live in harmony with nature. The direct result of this is that stress, depression, frustration, pressure, anger and insensitivity are increasing in our society. Gudi Padwa is also related to crops. In the month of Chaitra, both the crops and the immense hard work done along with them come out ripe. There is

a fragrance in the drops of sweat and it is visible in the heaps of crops. Unique gratitude towards Mother Earth is expressed only through the festival of Gudi Padwa. This period is also associated with Lord Ram. Ram ji was crowned on this day and later Yudhishtir was also crowned on this day. The Gudi Padwa festival, celebrated as Ugadi in the south and Cheti Chand in the north, usually occurs between late March and early April. The dates of Holi, Mohalla, Vishu, Vaishakhi, Chetichand, Chitrea Tiruvija etc. all fall around this new year. Satyayuga is considered to begin from this day. On this day Lord Vishnu took the incarnation of Matsya. From this day onwards the day starts becoming longer than the night. The Konkani community in Goa and Kerala celebrates it with the name 'Samvatsara Padvo'. In Karnataka this festival is known as 'Yugadi'. In Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, 'Gudi Padwa' is celebrated with the name 'Ugadi'.

Kashmiri Hindus celebrate this day as 'Navreh'. In Manipur this day is called 'Sajibu Nongma Panba' or 'Meitei Cheiraoba'. Chaitra Navratri also starts on this day. Novelty and newness are part of our unexpected curiosity. And in the form of New Year, nature comes forward as a part of our nature. New crop, new work fills us with new confidence. Indian culture embraces innovation in such a diverse way that its joy brings out the various conflicts within us. To go away from negativity and evils, some medium is needed and festivals help us a lot in this. It is during festivals that our minds melt and things start happening that we had not even imagined. Mutual anger, disagreements and differences start getting suppressed in that joy. There is superiority, intimacy and joy outside.

# Sundargarh towns face drinking water shortage

**Rourkela (KCN):** Residents of Bonai, Lahunipara and other localities in the Sundargarh district have always suffered due to a lack of supply of drinking water. Currently, they are very peeved at the tardy manner in which work is going on for the construction of various drinking water projects by the Rural Water Supply and Sanitation (RWSS) department. The RWSS department had earlier stated that a water supply system would be built which will ease the crisis in the entire Bonai

Assembly constituency. However, it has yet to materialise. Bonai suffers from a perennial crisis as the groundwater level is shrinking rapidly. However, residents of the constituency have no idea when the project will be completed. This is because of the absence of information regarding the project. There is no timeline providing information regarding the beginning and end of the project, the cost involved and when water supply will start. The RWSS department also began construction



of projects at various places including Jhumkiband, Lahunipara, Lathikata, Bonaigarh and Kuanrunda under Biramitrapur municipality. However, no one knows when they will be operational. A drinking water project is being constructed at Jhumkiband just adjacent to the Brahmani River. Huge water tanks are visible at the site, but those have remained dry since 'time immemorial', some residents said sarcastically. It should also be pointed here that all the projects are being handled by a single company. This has raised

doubts as to whether it can handle so many projects simultaneously. "May be, this is the main reason for the delay in completion," opined some residents. They added that despite seeking information from officials of the RWSS department regarding the projects they have not got any satisfactory answers. Even though top officials of the RWSS were unavailable, a junior engineer pointed out that the projects were delayed due to some 'internal issues'. "Those have been sorted and work on projects will pick up pace soon," he said.

## Non-functional FASTag holds up LaccMI bus at Keonjhar



**Keonjhar (KCN):** The Odisha government launched the LAccMI (Location Accessible Multimodal Initiative) bus scheme to provide easy and affordable transportation to people from all strata of society. However, a bus operating under the scheme got stuck at the Banajodi toll gate under Sadar block on NH-20 for more than three hours Friday. The reason for which the vehicle remained stranded was peculiar indeed; the FASTag of the bus failed to pay the

fare required at the toll gate. The bus (OD 09 AB 1066) was travelling from this town with stops at villages under Palashapanga, and Raikala panchayats before terminating at Handibhanga panchayat. Students belonging to different schools, teachers, and job holders of various other professions were travelling on the bus. The bus got stranded at around 6.00 am at the toll gate. The driver repeatedly tried to contact higher-ups over the mobile, but there was

no response. Many people got tired of waiting and disembarked the vehicle. They availed of other means of transport to reach their respective destinations and in the process had to shell out excess amount of money. Those who continued to wait finally breathed a sigh of relief when the problem was solved and the bus resumed its journey after approximately three hours. Sources here pointed out that 63 LAccMI buses are plying through various

panchayats and villages in this district. However, no proper timetable has been issued regarding the services. As a result, many people are not being able to avail the benefits LAccMI bus services offer, the sources added. "If people were aware of the bus timings in various panchayats, they would have benefitted," locals pointed out. "OSRTC and RTO should take necessary steps to publish a proper timetable so that passengers can conveniently travel," they added. Gourav Jena, district transport manager, OSRTC Keonjhar, blamed the server problem as the main reason for which the bus got stranded. "Many times due to server problems, the necessary amounts from the fast tags are not deducted at various toll gates. We will take appropriate steps to ensure that the problem is solved," he said.

## DDU ladies' hostel inmates protest over water shortage




**Keonjhar (KCN):** Facing acute water shortage continuously, residents of the Ananya Ladies' Hostel under Dharanidhar University (DDU) here organised a sit-in protest in front of the gate. They demonstrated against the varsity administration for its failure to provide water by holding empty buckets and bottles. The students said that despite lodging complaints about

the crisis, no remedial measures have been taken by the university authorities. "There has been an acute shortage of water (both drinking and other purposes) for a long time in the hostel. Despite repeated complaints, nothing has been done. Till the issue is resolved, we will continue our protests," said a protesting inmate. Officer on Special Duty (OSD)- cum-Vice-

Chancellor of DDU, Pratap Kumar Mohanty along with Registrar Narendra Kumar Sahu and other officials visited the hostel in an attempt to pacify the boarders. The inmates, however, were adamant. They pointed out that they have to walk more than a kilometre to get drinking water. The students, however, called off the strike when the OSD assured them that

the water crisis would be resolved on a war footing. He also promised that till the crisis is solved, water will be supplied to the hostel through tankers. To ease the problems of the inmates, Mohanty immediately contacted a drinking water supply company and asked it to send a tanker. Sahu meanwhile blamed the district administration for the shortage in water supply

**Hosur:** TVS Motor Company sales was at 302,982 units in May 2022. The year-on-year growth is not comparable due to the low base of sales in May 2021 because of the localised lockdown imposed by the Government of India during that period.

Two-Wheeler Total two-wheelers sales grew from 154,416 units in May 2021 to 287,058 units in May 2022. Domestic two-wheeler sales grew from 52,084 units in May 2021 to 191,482 units in May 2022.

## 'Should not be a one-trick pony' - Bumrah on his success mantra

**New Delhi:** Jasprit Bumrah has had a huge say in Mumbai Indians turning their fortunes around slowly in the IPL this year. Having lost their first three games, MI have bounced back by winning their last two. Even though both the games have been high-scoring, Bumrah has made the difference. He has been the only bowler across teams in both these matches to concede less than six an over.

He ended up picking up his second five-fer in IPL on Thursday (April 11) to condemn RCB to another loss. "So, when the first over was bowled, I saw Nabi bhai's ball was gripping a little bit, so I realised that it might not be a

straight, flat deck in the beginning," Bumrah said. "When the dew sets in, I guess the length ball will become better, so I kept that in mind. I wanted to stick to my strengths, I wanted to bowl a good, hard length. That worked today.

"I do my research, I see where the batter is strong. Sometimes the wicket is sticky, you don't need to always bowl a yorker. Sometimes you can use your bouncer, you can use your slower ball, so you don't need to use all tricks on one day. You have to understand where the game is going, what kind of a wicket (it is), there is no ego in this format. Even if you bowl 145 but if the wicket demands you to bowl

slower balls, you have to do that. Can't be a one-tricky pony where you just aim at the stumps and go hunting." Considering he picked five wickets despite the fact that his four overs are spread out throughout the innings in different phases, Bumrah said he is now used to that role. "I've been doing this for 11 years here, so I have now been used to being ready whenever the situation demands," he pointed out. "You use your experience, you keep an eye on where the game is heading, because what happened in the end, dew set in, so the wicket got a little better and the ball started skidding on. So all of these things, you



try to get involved in the game and you try to help others as well." Currently, the leading wicket-taker in the tournament, Bumrah is ahead of the pack by a fair distance given his economy rate is below

six in a season where bowlers have been taken for plenty. Bumrah has attributed that to his skillset and the amount of effort he puts in preparing himself for different challenges. "This format is very

harsh on the bowler," he noted. "So you have to have all kinds of skills. This is what I train for. That come this situation, I should have different options. I should not be a one-trick pony. I should just not rely on my vorker

because there will be days where my execution is off so I can rely on another delivery. So this is what I had worked on early on in my career as well. Everybody's doing their research, data and all of that comes in. So people start to line you up. So I wanted to have different skills so very happy that I could use it. "Bowling is tough because you will have to take a beating, you will have to have bad days to learn from it. What I have done in the past is that whenever I've had a bad day, whatever has not worked, next day with a calm mind, I've seen the videos. 'What does not work, why did it not work? What is the way I've been playing?' So all of these things,

you have to be with the curve because nowadays you just cannot come on the day and say 'okay, I'll do this, maybe this will work.' So you're hoping for success. For me, preparation is always the key. When you prepare hard, you put yourself under pressure in the nets, you bowl to batters who can hit big sixes. You bowl to them, you see how you react to stress, you see how you react to pressure. Then you find start finding answers so that is very, very important for me to keep pushing myself in training. Then on game day you have answers that, okay, when I had similar pressure in training, I had answers."

# All round Harmeet delivers series win for USA

**New Delhi, (KCN):** Harmeet Singh's fiery cameo of 34 for 17 deliveries followed by a devastating spell of 4 for 18 helped USA clinch an unassailable lead in their T20I series against Canada. Harmeet's fireworks at the death bolstered an otherwise meandering USA innings to a competitive 159. He found himself twice on the cusp of a hatrick, deflating the Canadians with a twin strike in the 4th over and then derailing their chase again with a double blow at a crucial juncture in the 15th over. Canada captain Saad Bin Zafar's all round efforts fell second best to Harmeet. Zafar returned figures of 1 for 21 in his 3 overs to go with his quickfire 29 off 18 deliveries. Opener Dilpreet Bajwa's half century kept Canada in the hunt until his dismissal in the 15th over with 68 needed in 34 deliveries. However, despite Zafar's breezy innings, the lower order failed collectively to provide a knockout punch, going down by 14



runs in the end.

The left hander dispatched Thaker over the square leg boundary, followed it up with a thumping six over long on along with a whack over extra cover. He combined with Shadley Van Schalkwyk to add 48 runs in 26 deliveries to seize back the momentum from Canada. Harmeet had Canada in all sorts by sending back Canada's batting lynchpin

Aaron Johnson and Pargat Singh off consecutive deliveries in the 4th over. Johnson played all over Harmeet's arm ball to get pinned in front while Pargat was left beguiled halfway down the track off a length ball that straightened enough after pitching.

Bajwa got going by whipping a couple of boundaries off his legs off Netravalkar. He added a 75 run stand with Nicholas Kirton to resurrect Canada from 15 for 2. The duo looked ominous and almost in control of the chase as Kirton clattered Nisarg over long on while Bajwa gloriously reverse swept Nosthus Kenjige over the third man fence. Taylor's golden arm had USA breathe easy, plucking out Kirton off a mistimed slog. Harmeet came back to castle a dangerous Bajwa in the next over, following it up by trapping Shreyas Movva dead in front of the next ball. With 66 needed of the final 5, Zafar kept Canada in the fray for a while but couldn't prevent the inevitable.

The DC bowlers - led by Kuldeep Yadav - tripped up LSG's top-order early before Ayush Badoni counter-attacked successfully. LSG's 167/7 was the highest total for a team after losing their first seven wickets for under 100 in IPL history. But this big effort was for nothing in the end. Delhi Capitals might be languishing lower in the points table, but Khaleel

Ahmed finds himself joint-third on the bowling charts for the season. He was instrumental in setting up the team's only other win this season against CSK - and was once again at hand in rocking LSG's top-order. Khaleel had the rub of the green as the umpire ruled in his favour for an LBW appeal after Quinton de Kock missed a full ball on the leg stump. The left-hander's stay was cut short by umpire's call. In his next over, he had Devdutt Padikkal out leg before too.

The match-up worked perfectly for DC as this was the fourth time de Kock fell to a left-arm

pacers and third instance for Padikkal. The left-arm wrist spinner lured Marcus Stoinis into a big, risky heave in his first over. The result was a leading edge to Ishant Sharma at backward point. LSG were left stunned just the next ball when he bowled a fabulous googly to an unsuspecting Nicholas Pooran and knocked back his stumps. KL Rahul, who had shown some intent early on, became Kuldeep's third wicket in the 10th over. It needed DC to review but Rishabh Pant was convinced of an edge, and was rewarded for it. He had Arshad Khan for company in an eighth-wicket partnership worth 73 off the last seven overs. Badoni took on DC's death-overs pacers Mukesh Kumar, Khaleel and Ishant Sharma as 39 runs came off the last three overs. Kuldeep meanwhile finished with figures of 3 for 20, including 10 dot balls. David Warner's dismissal in the fourth over did nothing to DC's run-chase as their 22-year-old Jake Fraser-McGurk marked his IPL debut with an impressive show. He and Prithvi Shaw went on a boundary-hitting spree, collecting 15 off Arshad Khan and 17 off Krunal Pandya to take DC to 62/1 in 6 overs.

Ravi Bishnoi pushed DC back with a one-run seventh over that included the wicket of Shaw - caught at deep midwicket. This brought DC along a period of lull as DC managed just 13 runs in 4 overs until the halfway stage, without a boundary scored. Rishabh Pant then turned it around by going after Bishnoi in the 11th over, giving him the charge for a straight six and a four. The DC captain also went after Stoinis before Fraser-McGurk dwarfed the equation by hitting three successive sixes off Krunal - over deep midwicket, deep extra cover and long off.
