Cave Didis: Transforming poultry farming support in Odisha's villages

Bhubaneswar(KCN): In the past, Sabita Mohanti would find herself idle after completing household and field chores. Now, she eagerly responds to calls for help from fellow women poultry farmers in her community, signifying the positive change sweeping through Odisha's villages. Once just a homemaker, Mohanti from Mayurbhanj district's Mituani village today has a new identity. She is one of the 200 Community Agro-Vet Entrepreneurs, or Cave Didis as they are popularly known, revolutionising life in villages in the state's Keonjhar and Mayurbhanj districts by providing vital assistance to women engaged in poultry farming. The 37-year-old, who

has studied till Class 12, has found not just a new identity but also a sense of purpose and empowerment. "Poultry farming has always been a part of our community but initially awareness was limited. It was when respected individuals visited our village and suggested that I could become a 'Cave Didi', extending assistance to others, that I felt empowered to make a difference," Mohanti told Gaon Connection. She oversees a flock of more than 80 chickens, extending her care not only to her own but also to others' poultry. This transformative wave is fuelled by the Hatching Hope Global Initiative, implemented by Heifer International, which aims to uplift tribal women and

farmers involved in poultry farming. The dedicated Didis working across villages in the Keonjhar and Mayurbhanj districts are making a meaningful impact in the everyday lives of women engaged in poultry farming. Like it is for Jayanti Mahato, in Mohanti's village Mituani, who raises chickens for a living. Earlier, her poultry would often fall ill, resulting in financial losses. However, the Didis, who also rear chickens, are always available to help. "Now, whenever the chickens fall sick, a single phone call brings Didi to our aid. They offer us valuable insights," the 32-year-old said. Launched in November 2018 in Mayurbhanj



district, the Hatching Hope initiative seeks to enhance nutrition and income levels by promoting increased backyard poultry farming and consumption of poultry products. Recognising the affordability and accessibility of chicken

and eggs as rich protein sources, the Hatching Hope Global Initiative has left a significant mark worldwide. The initiative particularly benefits from the invaluable support of the Cave Didis, who offer essential training and vaccinations for the poultry.

Since its inception, the project has contributed to a 33.31 per cent growth rate in egg production over the last five years, making a substantial impact on the availability of protein sources in the region. In collaboration with partners, Hatching

Hope facilitates the connection of poultry farmers with essential resources for the success and sustainability of their businesses. "The project, initiated in 2018, has been ongoing for three years, benefiting nearly 30,000 Adivasi families in Odisha," Akshay Biswal, the state coordinator for Hatching Hope in Odisha, told Gaon Connection. Andhra Pradesh leads the country in egg production, accounting for 20.13 per cent of the total production, followed by Tamil Nadu (15.58 per cent), Telangana (12.77 per cent), West Bengal (9.94 per cent), and Karnataka (6.51 per cent). Discussing the Cave Didi project, Biswal said,

"The Animal Husbandry Department has appointed veterinary doctors at the district and block levels. So, we provided training to Cave Didis in every village who already have knowledge of vaccination and other basics." Collaborating closely with the Animal Husbandry Department, Heifer ensures that Cave Didis receive continuous training. Said Dr Soumya Ranjan Khatua, a poultry expert from the department, "We have regular meetings with Cave Didis. We distribute vaccines and medicines, enabling them to treat the chickens effectively." He added, "For instance, in a case of chicken mortality in a particular area, we specifically trained Cave Didis there to prevent further losses."

Rival party leaders greet each other during election campaigning

Berhampur(KCN): Morning walkers in Odisha's Berhampur were surprised to see the leaders of ruling Biju Janata Dal (BJD) and opposition Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) exchanging sweet words when they met during a campaign at the MKCG Medical College Ground here. The leaders of different political parties have now adopted a strategy to start election campaigning early in the morning from parks and playgrounds where people gather for their morning walks and daily exercise. The people in the medical college ground were amused to see BJD's Berhampur assembly constituency candidate and party's Ganjam district president Ramesh Chandra Chyapatnaik and BJP's Berhampur



Lok Sabha seat candidate Pradeep Panigrahy campaigning at the medical college ground. Both the leaders were accompanied by their supporters. When Chyapatnaik and Panigrahy came face to face, being junior in age, Panigrahy greeted Chyapatnaik with folded hands. The supporters of both

the leaders, who were shouting slogans against each other stopped when two senior leaders greeted each other. However, when BJD supporters raised Jai Jagannath slogan the BJP supporters responded by chanting Jai Sri Ram. Both Chyapatnaik and Panigrahy were arch-

rivals in the Ganjam district politics. However, Panigrahy respects Chyapatnaik as a senior leader as he had worked under him. Panigrahy the Gopalpur MLA was expelled from BJD in 2020. Elections to the Berhampur Lok Sabha and Berhampur Assembly segment will be held May 13.

Gopabandhu Hostel boards protest over various problems



Keonjhar(KCN): Day after the students of Ananya ladies' hostel staged a demonstration over drinking water problems, a similar protest by boys has become a headache for Dharanidhar University administration. Inmates of Gopabandhu Hostel of the university in Keonjhar

have protested in front of the main gate for a long time for the fulfilment of their long-time demands. They said that due to non-availability of clean drinking water and unhygienic environment in the hostel, they are facing problems. The students have complained that only two toilets are

functional when there are around 2,000 students living in the hostel. During rainy days, water leaks from the roof into the room due to a lack of maintenance. "We will continue protesting until these problems are not solved immediately," they said.

"Efforts will be made to solve this problem immediately," the university officials said. Narendra Sahu, Registrar of DDU said, "Money has already been deposited with the Public Works department. But they are delaying to execute the maintenance work."

Income Tax Appeals before CIT(A)/ JCIT (A) PART 3

14. Whether tax on buyback of share is appealable: Computation of the total taxable income, includes the demands raised under all heads and it also includes the demand of tax on buyback of shares u/s 115QA on the ground that the liability u/s 115QA is also a liability of tax under the Income Tax Act as there is no reason why the scope of expression 'where the assessee denies his liability to be assessed under this Act' be restricted and confined to issues arising out of or touching upon assessment proceedings either u/s 143 or section 144. As such the same is appealable u/s 246A - Genpact India Pvt Ltd. v. DCIT [2019] 111 taxmann.com 402 (SC).

15. Whether an appeal can be filed on declaring a return as invalid u/s 139(9) and thereby denying refund to assessee: Where Assessing Officer treated return as invalid u/s 139(9) because of

mismatch between figure of income shown in return and that in Form 26AS, order passed by him was akin to an order refusing refund u/s 237 making it appealable u/s 246A(1)(i) - Deere & Company v. DCIT (International Transaction) [2022] 138 taxmann.com 46 (Pune - Trib.).

16. Whether Appeal can be filed against an order passed by A.O. giving effect to the appellate order: An order giving effect to the appellate order bears the same characteristic as the original order against which appeal was filed. An appeal is nothing but continuation of the original proceedings and hence, an order passed to give effect to the findings of the appellate authority cannot be different in nature. Hence, Appeal can be filed against such order - CIT v. Industrial Machinery Manufacturing P. Ltd. [2006] 282 ITR 595 (Guj.).

17. If Status of assessee is changed while passing order u/s 143(1), can the assessee file an appeal: The Status of an assessee cannot be changed u/s 143(1). As such the said order shall be treated as order u/s 143(3) and assessee is entitled to file an appeal against such order u/s 246A - CIT v. Kay Kay Family Trust 278 ITR 620 (All.); CIT v. Asha Family Trust 148 Taxman 578 (All.)

18. If any appeal which is supposed to be filed before a particular CIT(A), but by mistake it is filed with another CIT(A), what should be done: An application should be made before CIT(A), where appeal has been wrongly filed, requesting for transfer of the same to concerned C.I.T.(A), who is having proper jurisdiction. In such cases even the CIT(A) himself can transfer the appeal without any application from the appellant. It may be noted that now a days most of the appeals are filed under Faceless Scheme.

19. Whether CIT(A) can pass an order in case the proceedings before settlement commission abates u/s 245HA: In an appeal against the order of assessment in respect of which the proceedings before the Settlement Commission

abates u/s 245HA, the Commissioner (Appeals) can w.e.f. 1.4. 2008 confirm, reduce, enhance or annul the assessment after taking into consideration the following -

(a) The material and other information produced by the assessee before the Settlement Commission.

(b) The results of the enquiry held by the Settlement Commission.

(c) The evidence recorded by the Settlement Commission in the course of proceedings before it.

(d) Such other material as may be brought on his record.

20. Time limit for disposal of appeal by CIT (Appeals) or CIT (Appeals): W.e.f. 1.6.1999, the CIT(A) and w.e.f. 1.4.2023 Joint Commissioner (Appeals), where it is possible, may hear and decide such appeal within a period of one year from the end of the financial year in which such appeal has been filed. Prior to this there was no time limit. However, one could have made a petition for early disposal, specifying the reasons for hearing on priority. Further CBDT vide its Instruction No. 20/2003 dated 29/12/2013 has suggested to pass appellate orders within 15 days from the date of last hearing. It has

reiterated the same in its instruction No. F No.279/Misc 53/2003, dated 19.06.2015.

21. Under what circumstances CIT(A) can admit additional evidence or a fresh evidence: As per section 250 read with Rule 46A, the CIT(A) or Joint Commissioner (Appeals) may admit additional or fresh evidence which have not been produced before the A.O. in the undermentioned circumstances:

a. where the A.O. has refused to admit evidence which ought to have been admitted or

b. where the appellant was prevented by sufficient cause from producing the evidence which was called upon to produce by the A.O. or

c. where the appellant was prevented by sufficient cause from producing before the A.O. any evidence which is relevant to any ground of appeal, or

d. where the A.O. has made the order appealed against without giving sufficient opportunity to the appellant to adduce evidence relevant to any ground of appeal.

Before admitting any additional evidence CIT(A) has to -

1. record reasons, for its admission in writing.

2. allow a reasonable opportunity

to the A.O. to examine the evidence or document or to cross-examine the witness produced by the appellant or to produce any evidence or document or any witness in rebuttal of the additional evidence produced by the appellant before admitting any fresh evidence stated above. Failure to do so will amount to violation of Rule 46A - Refer Enzen Global Solutions (P) Ltd. v. ITO [2022] 144 taxmann.com 2 (Bangalore - Trib.).

However the above requirements are not applicable in case CIT(A), using his powers u/s 251(1)(a) read with Rule 46A(4) directs for the production of any document, or the examination of any witness to enable him to dispose of the appeal or for any other substantial cause including imposition of penalty u/s 271 or the enhancement of the assessment or penalty. Such enhancement may be made by the CIT(A) on his own motion or on the request of the A.O. as provided in Rule 46A(4) - United Cores (P) Ltd. v. ACIT 16 CCH 0229 Del. Trib, DCIT v. MKV (ARMOURS) (P) Ltd. 41 CCH 0365 (Luck). Further it is obligatory for the CIT(A) to verify

of the assessee's claim and the explanations put forth which were never before the AO in the ex parte assessment proceedings - ACIT v. Raffi Baig [2015] 43 CCH 0187 (Bang. Trib.).

Where the additional information is relevant for calculation of real income the CIT(A) should accept the additional evidence - Pr. CIT v. Daljit Singh Sra 80 taxmann.com 271 (P & H).

22. Where assessee furnishes additional evidence before CIT(A) without proper application for admission of the same, can CIT reject the same merely for want of proper application: If the CIT(A) found that the assessee has furnished evidence without an application for admission of additional evidences, the CIT(A) should direct the assessee to file the additional evidences along with application for admission of the same and after accepting the same, he should call for remand report from AO - Pabitra Mohan Samal v. ITO [2020] 114 taxmann.com 403 (Cuttack - Trib.).

Where assessee due to his wife's illness was prevented from producing evidences before Assessing Officer in support of its claim, Commissioner (Appeals) could not

refuse to admit such evidences for want of an appropriate application under rule 46A - Padam Lal Dua v. ITO [2016] 76 taxmann.com 354 (Delhi - Trib.)/[2017] 162 ITD 524 (Delhi - Trib.).

23. Whether CIT(A) can set aside the order of the A.O.: A. The Finance Act, 2001, w.e.f. 1.6.2001 has amended section 251 and omitted the express power of setting aside of an assessment order, as such CIT(A) has no express power of setting aside an assessment order. But recently in the case of Union of India v. Umesh Dhaimode [2002] 176 CTR (SC) 97; [1998] 98 ELT 584 (SC), the Supreme Court has held that the power to annul includes the power to remand the case. Though this is a case under Customs Act, but the then language of section 128(2) of Customs Act is identical with the language of section 251(1)(a) of the Income-tax Act, as such the view may be taken that the CIT(A) still has the power to set aside assessment. However, prior to 1.6.2001 the CIT(A) had express power to set aside assessment u/s 251(1)(a).

There are basically 7 chakras in the body, these are considered to be the center of all the powers of the universe. Upanishads say, Yat pinde tat brahmande, that is, whatever is in the body is in the universe. These seven chakras symbolize seven days of seven different seven powers, the eighth power Mahagauri is considered to be the chakra present above the head above the body and on the ninth day the power is accomplished in the form of Siddhidatri. Each chakra is known for its positive and negative

aspects. Both Navratri falls at a time of the year when there is a change in seasons, which indicates that the best of human beings should be expressed by accepting this sacred change through knowledge, meditation, spiritual practice, fasting etc. and by making physical and mental adjustments. Could. Basically the Goddess is one but she appears in nine important forms for the salvation of her children. Just as a mother plays all the roles for her children, sometimes angry like a father, affectionate like a sister, cooperative like a brother, along with being in countless forms of affection, similarly Adi Shakti also assumed nine main forms. Has happened. During the nine days of Vatsalya, the Mother Goddess is pleased by offering various offerings.

Devi Shailputri
Worship of Mata Shailputri, the first form of Mother, on the first day of Navratri "Vande Vaishchitlabhay, Chandraradhkrit Shekharam. It is done with the mantra Vrisharudhaan Shuldharan, Shailputri Yashasvinim (I worship Maa Shailputri, who wears the crescent moon on her forehead and rides on a bull, for the desired benefits). On this day, offering pure cow's ghee at the feet of Mother Goddess brings blessings

of health.

Devi Brahmacharini
On the day of Dwitiya Tithi, worship of Mother Brahmacharini, the second form of Shri Durga, "Dadhana Karpadmaabhyam, Akshamalakamandlu. Devi Prasidatu Mayi, Brahmacharinyanuttama.. (That is, the one who has Akshamala in one hand and Kamandal in the other hand, may such an excellent Brahmacharinirupa Maa Durga bless me.) This is done with the mantra. To please the Mother Goddess, sugar is offered to her. Offering sugar to the Mother Goddess on this day increases the lifespan of all the members of the family.

Devi Chandraghanta
The third form of worship of Chandraghanta is "Pindjapavararudha, Chandakopastrakairiuta. Prasadam Tanute Mahyam, Chandraghanteti Vishruta.. (i.e. May Mother Chandraghanta, riding on the best lion and equipped with Chandrakadi weapon, shower her blessings on me.) is done with the mantra. While worshipping Mother Goddess, she is offered milk or sweets made from milk or kheer. By offering bhog one gets relief from sorrows and attains ultimate happiness.

Goddess Kushmanda
Fourth day: Worship of Mata Kushmanda "Surasampurnakalash, Rudhiraplutmev Ch.

Dadhana hastapadmaabhyam, Kushmanda shubhdaastu me.. (i.e. May Mother Kushmanda, the radiant one who holds the pot filled with nectar and has lotus flowers, prove to be auspicious for us in all our tasks) is recited with the mantra. After worshipping, Malpuas are offered to him on this day. By offering Malpua, Mother Goddess gets pleased, develops intelligence and also increases the power of decision making.

Goddess Skandamata
Worship of Mother Skandmata on the fifth day "Simhasanagata Nitayam, Padmashritakardvaya. Shubhadastu Sada Devi, Skandamata Yashaswini." (Skandamata, who is riding on a lion with Kartikeya, holding a lotus in her two hands and Varamudra in one hand. May such mother Skandamata grant me auspiciousness i.e. well-being) is chanted with the mantra. Is. Banana is offered to the mother. Offering banana keeps the body healthy.

Goddess Katyayani
Worship of Mother Katyayani on Shashthi Tithi "Chandrasojjwalkara, Shardulvarvahana. Katyayani Shubham Dadyat, Devi Danavghaatani." (meaning, may Mother Katyayani, resplendent like the moon, Shardul, that

is, riding on a lion and destroyer of demons, be auspicious for all of us) is recited with the mantra. On this day, honey is given as offering to the Mother Goddess. Offering honey increases the power of attraction.

Goddess Kalratri
On Saptami Tithi, worship of the Kalratri form of Mother "Ekveni Japakarna, complete naked Kharasthita. Lamboshthi Karnikakami, Tailabhyaktsharirini Vampadollsalloh, Latakantakabhushana. Vardhanamurdhadhava K r i s h n a , Kaalratribhayankari.. (The complexion of Maa Kaalratri is black like night but she is the destroyer of darkness. This form of Maa Durga, the destroyer of evils and demons, looks very terrible but gives auspicious results, hence Maa "She is also called "Shubhankari". Maa Kaalratri has round eyes like the universe. Flames of fire keep coming out from Maa's nostrils with every breath. Maa carries a sword, an iron weapon, Abhayamudra and Varamudra in her four hands. The vehicle is riding on Gardabha) is chanted with the mantra. On this day, jaggery is offered to the Mother Goddess. In this way, by worshipping the Mother Goddess, one gets relief from the grief that comes to her and the troubles

that come suddenly are also reduced.

Goddess Mahagauri
On the day of Ashtami, worship of Mahagauri, the eighth form of Mother Goddess, "Shwete Vrushe Samarudha, Shwetambardhara Shuchih. Mahagauri shubham dadyat, Mahadevpramoddad.. (Mother Mahagauri, who rides on a white bull, wears white clothes, is extremely pious and pleases Mahadev with her devotion, may Mother Mahagauri bless us all) is recited with the mantra. On this day, coconut is offered to the Mother Goddess. By worshipping the Mother in this way, the wishes of those who are childless are fulfilled.

Goddess Siddhidatri
Worship of Mata Siddhidatri on the ninth day "Siddhagandharvayakshadyah, Asurairamarairapi. Sevyamana Sada Bhuyat, Siddhida Siddhidayini.. (May Mother Siddhidatri, who is worshipped by Siddhas, Gandharvas, Yakshas, Asuras and immortal gods and has the power to bestow siddhis, grant us all the eight siddhis) is recited with the mantra. Is. On this day, sesame seeds are offered to the Mother Goddess. It relieves the person from the fear of death and protects from untoward incidents.

There is no sense of giving behind worship, worship and offering because what can anyone give to the creator of the universe, but man humanizes the same divine power and expresses his feelings in a childish way like a game. Therefore, in every puja, it is part of the apology at the end that if we commit any mistake in this childlike game, please forgive us. The Goddess herself is so compassionate that she has taken so many forms that anyone can worship whichever form they like and can prove themselves to have those qualities. In the ancient scriptures, eight siddhis named Anima, Mahima, Garima, Laghima, Parapti, Prakamya, Ishitva, and Vashitva have been mentioned. These eight Siddhis can be achieved by the worship and grace of Mother Siddhidatri. In Hanuman Chalisa also, these eight Siddhis are mentioned and it is said that 'Ashta Siddhi Nav Nidhi Ke Daata, As Var Dinah Janaki Mata'. An international initiative was taken in 2022, to commemorate "World Quantum Day" on April 14th every year to sensitise and spread awareness.

Quantum Mechanics, the study of atoms and sub-atomic particles, has now advanced to such an extent that it has now moved to the engineering domain and is leading to novel and varied applications including production of mass consumption utility every day products. National Quantum Mission (NQM), conceptualized by the Prime Minister Science Technology Advisory Council (PM-STIAC) received Cabinet approval on April 19, 2023 with a total outlay of Rs 6003.65 Crore for a period of eight years. The Mission aims to seed, nurture, and scale up scientific and industrial R&D and

create a vibrant & innovative ecosystem in Quantum Technology (QT). This will accelerate QT-led economic growth, nurture the ecosystem in the country, and make India one of the leading nations in the development of QT and applications.

Highlighting importance of quantum technology in the digital economy and geopolitics for India Dr. Ajai Chowdhry, Chairman, MGB mentioned: "On this World Quantum Day, the nation's decision to embark on the National Quantum Mission and seize the opportunities presented by the quantum revolution is a source of immeasurable hope and delight. The imminent economic potential and consequential effects of quantum computing on worldwide digital economies are critical considerations for geopolitical strategies. The substantial financial investment of ₹6,000 crore in the National Quantum Mission will undoubtedly facilitate the advancement of research and innovation across numerous sectors, benefiting scientists, researchers, and startups throughout the country."

How Poll Body Is Trying To Increase Voter Turnout In Politically Crucial UP

Lucknow(KCN): The Election Commission of India has set up more than 200 polling stations within housing societies in the urban areas of Uttar Pradesh to increase voter turnout in the politically crucial state.

In an interview with the news agency PTI, state's Chief Electoral Officer Navdeep Rinwa said the poll body is targeting urban areas that have registered a low voter turnout in the past and expressed that Uttar Pradesh will secure the first position as far as voting percentage is concerned.

In the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, the voting percentage in Uttar Pradesh was a tepid 59.11 per cent.

"We have taken a number of important steps to ensure that all kinds of barriers that prevent voters from casting votes are removed. We have ensured that the polling station is located within a two-kilometre radius of every voter."

"Also in urban areas, we have undertaken a new initiative of setting up polling stations within gated communities and multi-storeyed housing societies where there has

been a low voter turnout in the past," Rinwa told PTI.

The senior official said 200-plus polling booths have been set up across the state, with Noida taking the lead.

"Uttar Pradesh has the maximum number of such polling stations and Noida has taken the lead in this regard. Ghaziabad, Lucknow, Kanpur, Bareilly and even Mathura will have such polling stations," Rinwa said.

Asked if the polling percentage in Uttar Pradesh will exceed 60 per cent this time, the CEO said, "I am confident that UP voters will score the first division and pass with flying colours." Rinwa highlighted that SVEEP (Systematic Voter's Education and Electoral Participation) activities are also ongoing in the state.

SVEEP is a flagship programme of the Election Commission for voter education, spreading voter awareness and promoting voter literacy. On the tepid voter turnout in 2019, Rinwa said, "To find out the reasons, we have taken

a bottoms-up approach for each assembly constituency.

"We have asked the EROs (electoral registration officers) and DMs (district magistrates) to prepare a Turnout Implementation Plan (TIP) -- an initiative of the ECI -- to identify the reasons for the low turnout in each assembly constituency and polling station. This is happening for the first time in the country," Rinwa said.

Rinwa said, this time, more than 15.30 crore people across Uttar Pradesh would be exercising their franchise and the voting will be held from 7 am to 6 pm -- except in two assembly constituencies of Sonbhadra district, as it was earlier affected by Left Wing Extremism.

Sonbhadra shares its boundaries with Bihar, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh.

"Keeping this in mind, the polling timing of 7 am to 4 pm has been proposed to the ECI. The ECI is yet to approve the timing, as it is done phase-wise," he said.

Robertsganj (SC) Lok Sabha seat in Sonbhadra will go to polls in the seventh phase on June 1.

Those Against Nukes...: PM Tears Into INDIA Bloc Over CPIM Manifesto

Hoshangabad, Madhya Pradesh(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi hit out at the Opposition INDIA bloc today over one of its constituents being in favour of nuclear disarmament and said they cannot protect the country.

Addressing a rally in Madhya Pradesh's Pipariya in the Hoshangabad Lok Sabha constituency, PM Modi taunted Rahul Gandhi over his "will eradicate poverty with a single

stroke" remark, saying the country doesn't take him seriously. He also said the Congress always insulted Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar, but the BJP government honoured him. Without naming a party, the PM said a constituent of the INDIA bloc called for nuclear disarmament - referring to the CPI(M) manifesto.

He asked people whether, in today's world, the country needs nuclear weapons, especially when its enemies have so much

power with them.

"In the manifestoes of INDI alliance partners, several dangerous promises were made. One of its partner's manifesto said it will denuclearise the country," he said.

"We should have nuclear weapons to protect our country. Those saying otherwise, how will they protect India?" he said. Without naming Rahul Gandhi, PM Modi taunted him over his "will eradicate poverty with a single stroke" remark.

He said the Congress



"shehzada" made an announcement that people would laugh at, and added that the country does not take him seriously.

His grandmother (former PM Indira Gandhi), too, once gave the slogan "Garibi Hatao" and people know about it, he said.

"The Congress always insulted Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar, we honoured him," PM Modi said on the birth anniversary of the chief architect of India's Constitution.

Because of the Constitution given by Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar, a

tribal woman became the President of India, he said, referring to Droupadi Murmu's election to the country's top constitutional post.

"Today is a big day in history as today is the birth anniversary of Ambedkar Ji. It was because of Babasaheb's Constitution that a tribal family's daughter has become the country's President and a poor woman's son is seeking votes from you to serve you for the third time," PM Modi said.

He said the BJP government got an

opportunity to develop 'Panch Teerth' associated with Babasaheb Ambedkar, who was born in Madhya Pradesh's Mhow.

"The Congress is saying that if I become Prime Minister for the third time, the country will be in flames," he said.

"The INDI alliance is unable to decide which direction the country should move in," he said, adding, that the slogan "Phir ek baar, Modi sarkar" is resonating across the country.

'Is this development?' Neglected Odisha village threatens poll boycott

CUTTACK (KCN): Development has been a mirage for the villagers of Bondal under the Tangi-Choudwar block of Cuttack district.

Only 20 kilometres away from a town, Bondal village is inhabited by some 80 families. For the villagers, basic amenities are a distant dream, let alone the government schemes that seem to have made a detour to the village.

With no motorable road, an ambulance can't come to the village. Shifting a patient or a woman in labour to the hospital is always a herculean task for the villagers. There are instances when serious patients were shifted on

motorcycles.

About the drinking water facility, the least said the better. There is only one tube well in the village to meet the requirements of 80 families, forcing villagers to use water from a pond.

The wait for a pucca house seems unending. Hema Mallick and Sanatan Mallick are two eligible beneficiaries for a pucca house but they are yet to receive them. For a house, they have requested administrative officials to the local MLA, but to no avail. In 2020, Sanatan Mallick received the work order for his house. Meanwhile, four years have passed, and nothing has progressed.



The villagers' pent-up anger may find an outlet this election as they are determined to boycott polls.

"Six to seven years have passed since Cyclone Fani pulled down my house. I am still living in a dilapidated house. Is this the real picture of development?" rued Sanatan.

"In the absence of a road, neither ambulance nor fire tenders can reach our village. We experience a lot of difficulties when we have to shift a patient to hospital or when a house catches fire," said Abhisekh Mallick, a villager.

"When the election comes, leaders make a beeline with a list of promises. But after the election, they forget us. This time, we won't cast votes," said Mitu Mallick, a villager.

When contacted, Tangi-Choudwar BDO Hemanta Kumar Mohanta said, "After an enquiry, we will take appropriate steps."

SRC On Contingency Plan

Bhubaneswar(KCN): As the General Elections 2024 is going to be held in sunny May, Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) ACS Satyabrata Sahu has asked all Collectors to prepare a contingency plan for smooth conduct of the twin elections.

Writing a letter to all Collectors, the SRC Shri Sahu said General Elections, 2024 has been declared by the Election Commission of India. During this period, there may be extreme heat wave conditions which challenge health and conduct of elections.

The IMD has issued seasonal outlook on temperature and rainfall for hot weather season during March to May, 2024. The maximum temperature is most likely to prevail over most of the parts of the State, ACS Shri Sahu said.

Similarly, the IMD has been issuing daily



bulletins during the Summer Season. He asked the Collectors to follow these bulletins daily for appropriate actions. They have been requested to take mitigation, preparedness and response measures. "Heat wave mitigation measures involve multi-sectoral and multi-

dimensional administrative approach such as provisioning of drinking water, temporary shelter, rescheduling of working hours, rescheduling of timing of schools/public educational institutions and providing better medical emergency services and public

health, etc. to reduce the negative impact of extreme heat wave conditions," the SRC noted.

As it is an election year, several rallies are going to be held. So, the collectors were instructed to take proactive measures with the help of concerned line Departments.

SRC Shri Sahu directed the Collectors to follow the detailed instructions that had been communicated in February on preparedness and precautionary measures to be taken in view of the Heat wave conditions, 2024. "Your personal attention is highly required for effective heat wave management in your district. Any untoward situation shall be brought before the undersigned for immediate intervention," he wrote to the Collectors.

BJD Holds Poll Talk



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Amid speculations over its pre-poll alliance with BJP, the Governing BJD today formally started holding meetings for the upcoming Lok Sabha and Assembly elections in the State. BJD President and Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik held two different meetings with the MLAs and senior leaders of Puri and Kendrapara Lok Sabha constituencies at Naveen Niwas on Monday.

Senior BJD leaders including Arun Sahoo, Rudra Maharathy, Sanjay Das Burma, Uma Samantaray, and Satyanarayana

Pradhan attended the Puri Lok Sabha segment which was held in the morning. However, Puri MP Pinaki Misra has remained absent in the meeting, which raises many questions.

the BJD in all Assembly constituencies under Puri MP seat, he said. The BJD boss has also asked to expedite the work to enhance interaction with the public. A detailed road map has been prepared to become closer to the voters, the BJD general secretary said.

In the afternoon, BJD top leadership held a meeting with the MLAs and leaders of Kendrapara parliamentary constituency. BJD leaders including Pratap Deb, Sashibhusan Behera, Dhruba Sahu, Pratap Jena, Arabinda

Mohapatra and Ansuman Mohnaty attended the meeting. The Chief Minister has discussed the organizational issues and chalked out a strategy to win all seats in the upcoming polls, a BJD leader said.

Meanwhile, State BJP President Manmohan Samal went to Delhi on Monday following a meeting of the party core committee and the election committee. Party sources said that he went to Delhi with the list of shortlisted candidates for the upcoming elections prepared in the election committee meeting.

However, the final list of candidates will be prepared once the candidates are shortlisted from the existing list. Moreover, the BJP Parliamentary Board will take a final call on who will be BJP's candidate from where.

However, participating in a complete IPL season may risk burnout before the ICC’s premier event in June. Head was aware of it. “I



think it is important for me to make sure that I'm mentally fresh throughout the IPL and continuing to work on my game, and making sure that I am ready for the World Cup when that time comes. But I am feeling like I am prepared and ready at the

moment," he added. Head's confidence was clear when he scored 62 off 24 balls in his first IPL match in seven years. The South Australian stated that his greater game understanding helped him make an immediate effect.

"It was nice to get some runs in the first game, and honestly, I didn't really have too many expectations. It's been a long time between IPLs for me, seven years, but I've learned a lot over that time and am a lot more mature now. "I feel like I understand my game a lot more. So, a lot of different feelings coming back and not trying to be too nervous or worried about results. I am just making sure that the things that I've done over the last few years are going to work and I best prepare myself to play well for the franchise," he said. However, Head noted

that the presence of Pat Cummins (captain) and Daniel Vettori (head coach) in the SRH dressing room helped him adjust to the new atmosphere. "Definitely having Pat and Dan, who I've worked closely with for Australia in the last few years, has helped me. It's a very relaxed environment. "Soon as I got my contract, I knew that I had the backing from those guys and they've confidence in my game," he said. A chat with Head will not be completed with his exploits against India last year with him terming the

World Cup final at Ahmedabad the biggest moment in his career. The left-hander made 120-ball 137, propelling the Aussies to a six-wicket victory and their sixth ODI World title. "I think the World Cup final was probably the biggest match of my career, regardless of whether I got runs or not. It was a huge moment. Obviously, I have not played in a World Cup before. "So, to have all the stuff that happened, making it to a final and then being able to contribute in the final makes it all so much better," he explained.

Indians on coming Thursday (April 18) and the reverse fixture against Royal Challengers Bangalore next Sunday (April 21) will wrap up their quota of five home games at the newly inaugurated facility at Mullanpur in New Chandigarh. As of now, Dhawan is expected to return in time for the team's next away match, in Kolkata on April 26.

Confusion arose when Curran walked out for the toss against RR, whereas last month at the pre-season captains' briefing in Chennai, on the eve of the IPL 2024 tournament opener, Jitesh Sharma had filled in for an ill Dhawan. Jitesh, who had turned up for an optional practice session on the eve of the RR clash, copped a blow to his forehead batting without a helmet in the spinners' nets. Bangar revealed the wicketkeeper-batter took the field on

Saturday despite 15 stitches to his eyebrow but that unfortunate incident wasn't quite the reason for the Punjab management to overlook Jitesh for captaincy duties. Incidentally, Jitesh was never officially the team's designated vice-captain. "Jitesh isn't the designated vice captain and I think maybe the impression could have been so because he attended the captain's seminar at the start of the IPL," Bangar clarified, adding that the management had zeroed in on Curran since the last edition to step in should such a need arise. In a similar situation in IPL 2023, when Dhawan was ruled out briefly after an on-field injury, Curran had led PBKS in three games with a win-loss record of 2-1. Bangar said the team sought continuity and had it not been for Curran's late arrival in India, he would have been on that flight to Chennai as well.

The thought was always to have Curran [stand-in] because he had led the team in the previous year as well. He was late to arrive from the UK and because he wanted to have few sessions, that's the reason we couldn't send him to Chennai for [briefing] and hence Jitesh was sent since the directive from the IPL [committee] was that a player has to attend... We were very clear in our minds that if at all there had to be an opening, Sam Curran would be taking over and will [fill in] as the team's captain." Despite failure to make any significant contribution with the bat, Curran delivered a twin-wicket 19th over in PBKS' defence of 147 when RR needed 20 off 12 balls. Curran finished the game with figures of 4-0-25-2.

The Kings are currently placed eighth in the ten-team table, with four wins in six matches.



NEWDELHI:In a fairytale debut, turning out for arch-rivals USA, former Canada captain Nitish Kumar slayed his former team with a sparkling innings of 64 off 38 deliveries in a four-wicket win for his side. Kumar might have had his emotions running high as he made an international comeback against a team he represented as a 17-year old in the 2011 World Cup. The innings was sensational under the mental space he would've found himself in. With his World Cup spot on the line, he not only braved that mental baggage which would've been duly amplified by some chirpy former teammates but rescued a reeling USA from 9 for 3. Kumar found support from senior pro Corey Anderson

as the pair stitched a 104-run stand to dig USA out of the early shambles in their chase of 169. Anderson came into his own with a timely knock of 55 in 48 deliveries after a cagey innings of 28 in the previous game. However, there was work to do after the fall of this valiant stand. With 27 needed of the final 17 it was down Nisarg Patel and Harmeet Singh to provide USA the knockout punch, which the pair wrapped up without breaking a sweat. Aaron Johnson got Canada to a rollicking start with a no look six over mid-wicket followed by an imperious off drive off Saurabh Netravalkar in the 1st over. Canada raced to 23 in 2 overs but were thwarted by a peach off an in by dipper from Netravalkar to clean up

Srimantha Wijeyeretne. Pargat Singh tried to redeem himself with a couple of neatly struck boundaries through the off side against Harmeeet Singh after falling to a first ball duck against the latter in the previous game. Pargat survived an edge off Shadley Van Schalkwyk but couldn't ride his luck as Van Schalkwyk trapped him in front off the next ball. Johnson and Thaker upped the ante against Nostush Kenjige in the 9th over, flaying him for a couple of powerful blows down the ground. In the next over, Nisarg Patel had Johnson hole out yet again in this series for 33. Nicholas Kirtton impressed with a string of boundaries in his short burst that ended with an ugly mix up with Thaker. Undeterred, Thaker hammered Harmeeet to the sight screen off the next ball. He clubbed Van Schalkwyk handsomely over long off before skying one the next ball. Bajwa got stuck into Usman Rafiq plundering 14 off the 18th over to get Canada motoring along at the death.

Florida resident Coco Gauff, who reached the Indian Wells semi-finals, will enjoy plenty of crowd support as she returns to Miami for the first time since her triumph at last year's U.S. Open. On the men's side, Carlos Alcaraz will also chase the final piece of the Sunshine Double after a successful title defence at Indian Wells where he beat reigning Miami Open champion Daniil Medvedev in a rematch of the 2023 California final.
