On the challenges of data leak in courts, the CJI said the safety of a person, the stigma attached to an accused, the threat to perception of a witness will be compromised if the privacy of the stakeholders is not protected.

"We must inspire public confidence in securing the privacy of our citizens to gain an overall efficiency and trust in the criminal justice system. Technology holds the key to a futuristic court system," he said.

Mahanadi boat capsized death toll rises to eight, government ends search operation

Sambalpur(KCN): The toll in the Mahanadi river boat capsized in Odisha's Jharsuguda district rose to eight with the recovery of six more bodies Saturday, an official said Saturday. The search operation, which had been ongoing since Friday evening, came to an end after the recovery of a male child's body from Hirakud reservoir in the Mahanadi river, the official said, adding that among the victims were five women and three children. The deceased, all hailing from Anjoripali village of

Kharsia in Raigarh district of Chhattisgarh, were identified as Radhika Nishad (40), Teras Bai Rathia (60), Radhika Rathia (35), Ghasneen Bai Rathia (40), and Lacchinin Bai Rathia (40), while the children were identified as Kunal Rathia (9), Nabin Rathia (7), and Tikeswar Rathia (7). Personnel of the Odisha Disaster Rapid Action Force and Fire Services, who launched a search operation immediately after the boat capsized on Friday, recovered six more bodies from the



Mahanadi river by engaging five scuba divers, an official said. "Five scuba divers fitted with underwater cameras in their headgear joined the search operation and

spotted the bodies," the official said. Revenue division commissioner (RDC) Srikanta Prusty, Jharsuguda district collector Aboli S Naravane and SP Smit

P Parmar were camping by the river bank to supervise the search operation.

The incident occurred on Friday afternoon when around 50 passengers were returning in the boat after visiting a temple in Patharseni Kuda in Odisha's Bargarh district. The boat capsized as it was about to reach Sarada Ghat in Rengali area in Jharsuguda, a police officer said. Rajkumar Gavel, an official from Chhattisgarh government, said around 50 people were

returning after a picnic from other side of the river when the mishap took place. Loknath Meher, the Motor Vehicle Inspector (MVI) of Jharsuguda district, said, "The boat lacked registration and was deemed unfit to operate. Additionally, it did not have any life jackets onboard. Despite being designed to accommodate only 20 people, it carried 50 people, ultimately resulting in the mishap." Local fishermen rescued

40 passengers and brought them to the bank, he said. Meanwhile, the Chhattisgarh administration has made arrangements for the transportation of bodies, sources said. Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik conveyed his condolences and declared an ex-gratia payment of Rs 4 lakh to the next of kin of each deceased.

Dharmendra Pradhan meets Agniveer aspirants in Odisha's Sambalpur



New Delhi(KCN): Union Education Minister and senior BJP leader Dharmendra Pradhan Saturday met Agniveer aspirants in Odisha's Sambalpur from where he is contesting the Lok

Sabha polls. Pradhan said he spent the morning with the aspirants enquiring about their preparations and motivated them. "A morning well spent with #Agniveer aspirants

in Sambalpur," Pradhan wrote on X sharing a video from his meeting with the youngsters. He also took a scooter ride after he met with aspiring Agniveers. The two-time Rajya

Sabha is seeking a return to the Lower House of Parliament with the BJP fielding him from Sambalpur in his home state. He had made his Lok Sabha debut in 2004 from Deogarh in Odisha.

Lower Suktel: Distress of the displaced

Bolangir(KCN): Once the Lower Suktel Dam comes up, thousands of acres of farmland in this perennially drought-prone district will be irrigated. The drinking water woes of many towns and villages in the district will be a thing of the past. Economic development will blossom with accelerated growth, and Bolangir will be transformed from a backwards to a developed district. Harping on such development, the government promised to make all kinds of arrangements for the displaced people of 29 villages under the project-affected Loisingha and Bolangir blocks. Pinning their faith in the government, thousands left their homes and ancestral lands. However, since the day they left their villages, life has become miserable for them. As irony would have it, those who gave up everything they had to alleviate the water woes in the district, are now unable to get even a handful of water in the scorching summer season. The oustees are now living a life of struggle in Lower Suktel Temporary Rehabilitation



Colony at Kusmel under Loisingha block. The oustees recall the humble yet easy life they were living in their villages. Residents of Banchhorpali, Gadashankar, Duguripali, Podhamunda, Koindapali and Bijapati under Loisingha block had never known such scarcity of water with Suktel river flowing nearby. They had their own wells and ponds in their backyard and tube wells in their houses. But today, they are living a miserable life after being displaced. Their new address is Lower Suktel Temporary Rehabilitation Colony in Kusmel about 15km from the district headquarters of Bolangir. For the past nine months, 32

homeless families have been living there in temporary houses with tin roofs. In the absence of any source of drinking water, they have to walk every morning and evening about one-and a-half kilometres to Phatabahal village to collect water. In the scorching summer now, they have to visit Phatabahal at least six times every day. Women of the houses and some schoolchildren walk the long distance every day to collect water. The tube well in the rehabilitation colony has run dry adding to their woes. Despite repeated demands to supply water through tankers, the administration has remained silent. The displaced have alleged that they have been cheated. Neither the

administration nor the politicians lend an ear to listen to their grief. With the mercury rocketing, the temporary tin houses are turning unbearably hot with temperatures beyond 44-45 degrees Celsius making life difficult. People are living under the trees all day instead of staying in temporary houses. The administration assisted up to Rs 5 lakh to the displaced families before they were rendered homeless. They were promised homestead land, pucca houses, and guaranteed employment. However, it appears, all such hopes of the helpless oustees have fallen victim to the administration's dementia. The children of the displaced have not seen blackboards for the last nine months.

hurt by Team India's progress at the 2023 Men's Cricket World Cup. The film's daily collections dropped below the Rs 20 crore

the cat was out of the bag about Shah Rukh Khan's cameo. SRK reprised his role as Pathaan in Tiger 3, which is the fifth installment in YRF's Spy Universe. Mirzapur actor Isha Talwar says artistes should be given medals as survival is 'really hard': 'There's self-doubt, pressure to make it big'

What doesn't kill your spirit, makes you a movie star. Actor Isha Talwar, best known for starring in the Amazon Prime Video series Mirzapur, says being in the film industry can be a daunting task as artistes battle insecurity, competition bitterness and the pressure to succeed at all cost.

Isha started her film career with the 2012 Malayalam movie Thattathin Marayathu and continued to work in the industry, along with Tamil and Telugu films, before she appeared in Salman Khan's Tubelight in 2017. Post that, her Bollywood appearances included Kaalakaandi, Article 15, Sharmaji Namkeen.

She finally got her breakthrough success with Mirzapur in 2020 and followed it up with this year's Saas, Bahu Aur Flamingo. Isha is now gearing up for her next, Chamak. The Sony LIV musical thriller is set in Punjab and is gearing to release on December 7.

In an interview with Indianexpress.com, Isha Talwar talks about how she has stopped chasing the constant need to "make it big" as per the worldly standards, the move to reinvent herself and join an acting course and why actors need to be applauded more

often for surviving in the industry.

You entered the industry in 2012 with a Malayalam film. What has the decade taught you?

The learning is interesting. I got a lot of exposure because of South cinema. It is a different market, my foundation was set there. Everybody who is in films should be given a medal, because it is hard. The amount of self-doubt an artiste lives with, add to it the pressure... It is self-inflicting pressure though, of wanting to

make it big, where there is a set definition of 'making it'. I have stopped chasing that now.

Where you at some point?

When I came here, of course I was chasing it. When I didn't get it, I made me think what I was chasing. Now I do it more for the love of it, not so much for 'I have to be successful'. That unnecessary pressure is off my head, but it is not like I am less ambitious today. Our chips are made for competition, which I don't like anymore. I don't want to

compete with other people. It is not a race. Acting is a natural form of expression, so everyone will be different. I don't feel competitive anymore. Yes, I want things for myself. I want to do more. I am greedier with time. I have spent seven months learning acting from Kerala. It has been a re-set for me.

After you broke out with Mirzapur, you still had to wait over a year for work. Have the years in the industry prepared you for its ups and downs?

Yes. Life is unpredictable, you can't

do anything about it. But yes, over a period of time, you make peace with it, the nature of the industry. This understanding comes after many years. You know the industry is unpredictable, but to live through it takes time. It took me some time.

Did it help that your father was from the industry, so you at least knew that this is a gamble?

Yes, but when you are dreamy eyed, you are not thinking about these things. You think how you are going to be the next superstar. I never

focused on such things. Eventually when you get five-six slaps from life, you go like, 'Oh damn, this s**t also happens.' No one prepares you for it, you just find out.

What are you craving for right now?

Chamak feels like a new beginning of sorts, because usually people play bhabis and bahu later. But for me that came in first and now I am going in this space of younger women. Somewhere that image of being a rooted actor, someone who is doing more UP, Rajasthan roles was clinging to me. If not for anything else, Chamak's character is definitely closer to my age group.

Yes that and Saas Bahu and Flamingo just reinforced that. Madhuri and Bijli, as much as I love them, I also want to do a Jasvinder Kaur in Chamak. Which is why it feels like a new beginning. I do feel new. My new year has come in a bit early. There is a tendency to get bitter if you spend too much time, too many idea of what needs to happen. But the acting course has ensured that I am back to square one and I want to chase some really cool things from here on now.

Like Mahavira, one who practices Kayotsarga becomes healthy-hearted, becomes light and can lead a happy life by being absorbed in expansive meditation. I sent a post card letter way back in 1981 to Dr Bansidhar Panda , the first known industrialist of international fame from Odisha seeking an appointment. He was the first highest qualified Metallurgy Expert from Odisha.He was then Chairman, IMFA Group of Companies. I was not hoping a reply as many such letters to many people remained unanswered by then. A week later I got a reply from the then Manager, Public Relations of IMFA to come for a personal talk to IMFA office at B o m i k h a l , Bhubaneswar on a specified date and

time.The letter was signed by non others than Dr Panda. The date approached. I reached IMFA office. I was asked to sit in a room. Then, somebody came with a cup of tea. After a few minutes I was asked to go to a specific room.It was the room of Manager, Public Relations. - 'So, you wrote to Dr Panda ', the gentleman asked. - Yes Sir.. He looked at me with affection and said, 'You look to be very young. How old are you?' - ' I am 20 Sir',I said. - Then you are under age . Minimum age for a job is 21 now.(It was till Rajiv Gandhi made it 18 in 1986) By that time I understood that they are considering me for

a job in IMFA.I gave him my CV. Then he said,' Your qualification is just graduation and you are under age. But I find from your CV that you will be 21 next month.We can then appoint you as a clerk in our PR Department.' - Clerk? I am already an Editor in a Publishing House . I bluntly refused and came back. Later I came to know that he wanted to appoint his brother in law there. Dr Panda was in their plant site at T h e r u b a l i . I returned. Since my post card was to appreciate him and not for a job , I was not disturbed at all. Some days after I met Dr Panda in a meeting at Bhubaneswar. - 'So, are you joining us,' he asked. - No Sir,I don't want to be a clerk.

Then I told him,'Sir,please do something to promote Odia Literature and Culture.I wrote you a Post Card for that.' In due course IMFA instituted an award for promotion of Odia Literature and nominated Dr N i t y a n a n d a Satpathy as its Secretary. I joined Odisha Education Service and later NCERT from where I came to NBT.My uncle Sarat Chandra Mahapatra had edited a book and the first copy was to be presented to the then President of India Dr Shankar Dayal Sharma . A function at Rashtrapati Bhawan was organised for the purpose. I was sent by my uncle to invite Dr Panda who had a suite in Quatab Hotel to attend this programme. He saw my card and looked at me in an

affectionate eye. - 'You are the same boy.What are you doing in Delhi ?' Dr Panda asked. - ' I am now an Editor with NBT Sir,' I replied. 'Our Manager, Public Relations has retired. Why don't you join us ', Dr Panda said. 'Thank you Sir. But, time has brought me to a great height. My father was an Editor and I always wanted to be that. It is not possible for me to accept your offer. IRAN-ISRAEL WAR- THE LOOMING THREAT OF SOCIAL UNRES

The risk of catastrophic war in the Middle East is real. Israel is to blame for the escalation that saw Iran launch 300 drones against it Over the weekend. Israel's bombing of the Iranian consulate in Damascus, which killed 11, was a direct attack on Iranian territory under international law. It was lawless act which the British government has yet to condemn. It was also a middle finger raised to Israel's allies in the US-Led bloc, since Washington has urged Israel to avoid action likely to turn its genocidal assault on Gaza in to a wider regional War. Israel's motivation for such recklessness has nothing to do with any alleged Iranian threat. Not one life was lost in Iran's

retaliatory action to the destruction of its consulate , making foreign secretary David Cameron's attempt to portray it was disproportionate absurd. Cameron says the matter would have been very different, the drones not been shot down by Israel but also by the United states, Britain and France

The combines with its own effective defence system and as many analysts have pointed out , Iran choosing a form of retaliation that gave hours 'notice and guaranteed almost all its drones would be shot down. That is not to portray Iran's theocratic regime as motivated by humanitarian or anti-imperialist concerns, but to recognise the reality that there is only one country in the region currently trying to set it on fire—and that country is Israel. Benjamin Netanyahu is not having a good war but is even more frightened of peace. Six months in, Israel has killed more than 34, thousand

Palestinians, most of them women and children but it has not militarily defeated Hamas. The bloodbath has outraged almost the whole UN, seen even the US, fearing for its ability to maintain its traditional middle Eastern alliances, decline to veto a ceasefire resolution and derailed the normalisation of Israel's relations with Arab states, a diplomatic priority of recent years. Thousands of Israeli citizens on the streets, protesting for a deal to see them returned and for elections. But the only argument to postpone the elections when the country is at war. Britain and the US, which have armed Israel to the teeth, can stop doing so. An end to the flow of arms would stop the Israeli war machine in its tracks: an avowal that we recognise its attempts to start a war with Iran and will not support it in any such conflict would force it to draw back.

Drone technology demonstrated in sewage-fed bheri for ecosystem management by ICAR-CIFRI

Kolkata (KCN): ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute has organized an awareness cum demonstration program on 'Application of Drone technology in Inland Open Water fisheries' at 4 No Bheri and Sardar Bheri, Kolkata, West Bengal on the 16th and 17th of April 2024, respectively. The program was organised under the ICAR-ATARI drone project to create the awareness among the fish farmers about the potential applications of drone technology in automating various activities of fish farming aiming to precision fisheries. Drone (UAV- Unmanned Aerial Vehicle) based application has great potentials to monitor and manage some of the most pressing problems faced by agriculture. In Inland



open water fisheries also, drone technology can be effectively used for precise and periodical monitoring of waterbody health status, spraying of insecticides, disinfects, medicine and feed distributions over large water areas with less time, input material and human resources. At 4 No Bheri, a total of 32 farmers including 14 women and 18 men participated in the programme, while at Sardar Bheri 48 farmers including 18 women and 30 men participated in the programme. The

program was led by Dr. B.K. Das, Director, ICAR-CIFRI, Barrackpore. He addressed the gathering and enlightened the fishers on several areas such as sustainable fish farming, fish disease and health management, application of drone-based technology for evenly spraying of liquid medicine, disinfects and feed distribution to reduce time and manpower and management of exotic fish in East Kolkata Wetlands. He also

assured the farmers that CIFRI will provide the drone based technology and other facilities in near future for better management of the wetland fisheries. Later, Dr. S. Samanta, HoD, FRAI Division, ICAR-CIFRI addressed the gathering and motivated the farmers on ecosystem management of the wetland area and better management practices in the fish production system. Dr. Chayna Jana, Scientist interacted with fishers and highlighted the role of the different advanced

technologies like drone based application in fisheries and ecosystem management. The technology could be effectively used to map different wetlands of the regions and apply medicine, disinfects, feed when necessary in a very short span of time. Dr. Vikash Kumar, Scientist sensitized the fishers about the sewage-fed fisheries and the outbreak of various diseases in fish. He also provided various management options to control diseases in fish. Mr. Kausik Mondal, Technical Assistant demonstrated the drone technology for spraying CIFAX, a fish medicine and broadcasting feed material all over the wetlands. The program was coordinated by Mr. Asim Kumar Jana and the research scholar Meghnath Halder.

Drug case: Court junks plea of Nawab Malik's son-in-law to de-freeze bank accounts

Mumbai (KCN): A special court here has rejected a plea of NCP leader and Maharashtra ex-minister Nawab Malik's son-in-law Sameer Khan seeking the de-freezing of his bank accounts blocked by the Narcotics Control Bureau in a drug-related case. The NCB is in the process of identifying and seizing the "illegally

acquired" properties under the NDPS (Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances) Act. In such a case, the application cannot be allowed, the court said in its order of March 12. The NCB had arrested Khan January 13, 2021, for alleged possession of drugs. He spent six months in jail

before securing bail from the special court set up for cases under the NDPS Act. In his latest plea moved before Special Judge A V Kharkar, Khan said that the money in these bank accounts has no links with the narcotics trade. While his tenants deposit their annual rent in these accounts, he is unable to get any

income from these legitimate sources due to the freeze, Khan said. The NCB opposed the plea, saying they are investigating the matter and identifying the "illegally acquired" properties in connection with this case under the provision of the NDPS Act. The court accepted the federal anti-drug

agency's submission and rejected Khan's plea. The NCB has claimed Khan had conspired to procure, sell, purchase and transport 194.6 kilograms of ganja. It has booked Khan and others for dealing with commercial quantities of the drug, a crime that carries a maximum punishment of 20 years.

Ram Navami celebrations pass off peacefully

Rourkela(KCN): With the district administration making elaborate security arrangements to tackle any unpleasant situation, Ram Navami celebrations in Sundargarh district remained peaceful. Contrary to other areas in the district, the procession was taken out Thursday in Rourkela. "This is the tradition we have been following from the beginning," said one Shankar of Daily Market Akhada. A total of 15 akhadas participated in the procession here which starts from Bisra Chowk and continues till Udit Nagar. The celebration was continuing peacefully when the report was filed. To maintain law and order,

the district administration has deployed over 15 platoons of men in uniform, sources said. The atmosphere was electrifying as over 30,000 people were present on either side of the nearly 3-km stretch to witness the procession. Delicacies and drinks were being offered to all. "We are ensuring that all akhadas abide by the guidelines given by the administration. We can do this because of our good relation with all the participating akhadas," said Satyananda Mohanty, a former scribe and member of the integration forum. Goldi Singh, a member of another akhada said, "The Model Code of Conduct is in



force and we have promised that everything will go as per the instructions of the administration." The procession was

held Wednesday at Rajgangpur during which 24 platoons of police force were deployed by the administration. Given

the town's records of communal tension, more than 30 officers of DSP and IIC ranks were pressed into service. A huge statue

of Lord Hanuman measuring 15 feet in height was taken around the town and was immersed Thursday in the artificial pond created by the

Rajgangpur Municipality. At Biramitrapur, five platoons of police personnel were present with 15 officers

pressed to control the situation Wednesday. The administration was extra cautious because of the communal tension that had gripped the town a few days back during a religious celebration. However, everything went off peacefully. Biramitrapur SDPO Susant Das said, "We took adequate measures to manage law and order in the town. Besides, the organising committee and members of all communities assured that they would help in maintaining peace." Five akhadas were participating in the celebration. In other parts of the district like Bonai and Talsara, the celebration was peaceful and passed off without any issues.

Trinamool to receive major jolt next week: Suvendu Adhikari

Kolkata: The leader of the opposition in the West Bengal Assembly, Suvendu Adhikari, on Saturday predicted a major jolt for the ruling Trinamool Congress next week.

Speaking at an election rally in Malda, Adhikari said the jolt will be such that the entire Trinamool will be imbalanced next week.

Although Adhikari did not give any detail about the nature of the 'jolt', his prediction has gained significance given the scheduled developments in the Calcutta High Court on Monday.

On Monday, a special division bench of the high court is scheduled to pronounce its verdict in the case related to the alleged irregularities in the recruitment of teaching and non-teaching staff in the



state-run schools by the West Bengal School Service Commission (WBSSC). Also scheduled on Monday is the crucial hearing on the voice sample test of Sujay Krishna Bhadra, one of the prime accused in the school

jobs case.

After a long wait of over three months, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) April 18 received the report of Bhadra's voice sample test from the Central Forensic Science Laboratory

(CFSL) in Delhi. The ED is likely to present the report before the court Monday.

In land of hockey, star player Dilip Tirkey aims at scoring winning goal for BJD

Sundargarh: Hockey India president, former India captain and star player Dilip Tirkey aims at scoring a winning goal in the electoral field as the Biju Janata Dal's (BJD) Lok Sabha candidate from Odisha's Sundargarh constituency, where hockey is not just a sport but a way of life. Tirkey – who was also Rajya Sabha MP till 2018 — contested the Sundargarh seat in 2014 and lost to BJP's Jual Oram. Ten years later, the star who helped put the tribal-dominated area on the world hockey map is confident the result will be different this time and voters will back not just him but Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik who has made such a significant contribution to promoting the sport.

"A lot has changed in the last 10 years. A lot of development work has been done in Odisha, be it in education, health or sports," Tirkey, who has played more than 400

international matches for India, told PTI in an exclusive interview.

"The Odisha government has changed the image of the state by making it a sporting hub of the country with high-performance centres, state-of-the-art training facilities and hosting big tournaments. The sports-loving people of Sundargarh and Odisha will not forget this while voting," the 46-year-old added.

Tirkey, the first from Odisha to play for India seniors in 1995, is a household name in hockey-loving Sundargarh. Seeing a boy from Saunamara village in the district play for India and captain the national team was a game-changer. He was the first to make it big globally. Since then, Sundargarh district has produced several players such as Lazarus Barla and Birender Lakra who have represented India at the World Cup and

Olympics.

"Odisha has made itself a strong presence in the world sports map in the last decade. The world's largest hockey stadium, Birsamunda Stadium, has been built in Rourkela and last year the Men's Hockey World Cup matches were also successfully held there," Tirkey said.

He didn't contest in 2019, when Oram returned as MP from Sundargarh, and was a member of the Rajya Sabha from 2012 to 2018. Hockey, in Tirkey's view, is an emotional pivot in his constituency which goes to the polls May 20. "There is a lot of enthusiasm among hockey players in Sundargarh. To further promote hockey in remote areas, 17 astro turfs have been installed in 17 blocks of different districts. Apart from this, many centres have also been built for indoor sports," said the ace full-back who has played

three Olympics and three World Cup tournaments. Over the years, the Patnaik-led Odisha government and hockey have become intertwined. Besides the many facilities, the Odisha government in 2018 became the main sponsor of the Indian teams, signing a Rs 100 crore deal for five years. In 2021, it renewed the contract for 10 years for an undisclosed sum after India won bronze at the Tokyo Olympics. Hockey is meshed into the cultural heritage of every household in Sundargarh, earlier known for its mineral resource reserves like iron ore, manganese and limestone.

The Khasi Cup, a local village tribal hockey tournament, is evidence of the deep-rooted love for the sport. Khasi in Odiya means goat and the winning team is awarded one.

Umpire Tanveer Ahmed not to officiate in India series



Dhaka:The Bangladesh Cricket Board confirmed on Saturday (April 20) umpire Tanveer Ahmed will not officiate in the five-match T20I series against India Women's team. Tanveer was a protagonist in the acrimonious 2023 series between the two sides that saw India skipper Harmanpreet Kaur suspended for two matches after her altercation with the umpire in the final ODI. Harmanpreet smashed the stumps with her bat and had a heated

exchange with the umpire after being given out leg-before. Later in the presentation ceremony, she lashed out at the officiating in the game. Cricbuzz learnt that BCB decided not to include Tanveer to prevent him from being targetted again by the visitors. "I think if he is included in the upcoming home series against India women's team there is a possibility he can again be at the receivers end considering Indian women cricketers might target him and we don't want that to happen and

as a result we decided not to include him for the series involving Bangladesh and India women's team," a BCB official told Cricbuzz on request of anonymity. However, the board's umpire's committee chairman Iftexhar Ahmed Mithu told Cricbuzz that the decision was made so as to have Tanveer feature in the home series against Zimbabwe that follows the assignment against India. "Yes, Tanveer is not included in the list of match officials for the home series against India women's team as we want him to be involved in the home series against Zimbabwe and both the series will be played side by side," said Iftexhar. Bangladesh have already reached Sylhet for preparation while their counterparts are expected to arrive on April 23 to take part in the series.

Would want Steve Smith opening the batting if I'm the opposition: Tim Paine

New Delhi:Former Australia captain Tim Paine has said that he would want Steve Smith to be opening the batting if he is the opposition after the Australian star's uneasy start to life in his new role. Smith, who took over the role as opener after David Warner's retirement, has struggled to hit the ground running so far. Recently, Australia coach Andrew McDonald came out in support of Smith and said he would be opening against India when they come down under for the tour later in the year. Speaking to ESPN, Paine said Smith as an opener would be the preferred option for the opposition as it gives them the best chance of getting him out. "I look at it, that if I was



playing against Australia, where would I prefer Steve Smith to bat? If I'm the opposition, I want him opening the batting. I want my best bowlers at their freshest with a brand-new ball. I was in that Ashes in 2019 and

went to England with him in another one and when he was at his best batting at four you just felt he couldn't get out," Paine said. "I would love to see him succeed as an opener, I think he can, there's no doubt about that, he's

good enough to bat anywhere, but as an opposition player I want him at the top of the order because that gives me the best chance of getting him out," he added. What's Steve Smith's record as an opener for

Australia? Smith hasn't had the best of transitions into his new role after two series. The star batter has scored 171 runs so far in 8 innings with an average of 28.50. In the recently-concluded series against New Zealand, Smith could only score 51 runs in two matches with his best score being 31. Despite his lacklustre run, Smith had earlier said that he doesn't find opening any different from his time at No.3 or 4. "It's fun, but honestly I don't see it as anything different. I batted at three for an extended part of my career and I batted at four, where I've been in inside of two overs. It's really nothing that new to me," he explained.

Aryna Sabalenka plays down Indian Wells shock exit, eyes Miami comeback

New Delhi:World No. 2 Aryna Sabalenka opened up about her shock fourth-round exit at Indian Wells Masters, saying she did not feel comfortable with the conditions in the tournament. The Australian Open champion said she is already looking forward to doing well at the Miami Open later this month, saying she would be hoping to make a mark at her "second home". World No. 23 Emma Navarro clinched the biggest victory of her nascent career when she downed Sabalenka in the women's singles fourth round 6-3, 3-6, 6-2. It was a momentous victory for the 22-year-old as it propelled her into

the spotlight and the quarterfinals of the tournament. Sabalenka, known for her powerful gameplay and resilience, found herself outmanoeuvred by the young American's tenacity and strategic play. Despite rallying in the second set to level the match, Sabalenka couldn't maintain her momentum, ultimately succumbing in the decisive third set. "I'd say that this year Indian Wells I didn't feel my best on these courts. I tried to adjust. We tried to work on a couple of things, make sure I'm there and I'm fighting for the title," Aryna Sabalenka said on Thursday. "We did our best and we'll learn. We'll work a



little bit more on the movement and hopefully I'll be ready for Miami," she said, expressing her love for the Miami Open, starting March 21. Ukrainian Aryna Sabalenka, who resides in Miami, will be keen on putting the Indian Wells setback behind and improving on her quarter-final finish from

last year when she plays in Florida next week. Aryna Sabalenka began the season by winning the Australian Open but lost to Dona Vekic in the second round of a WTA 1000 tournament in Dubai in February before losing to Emma Navarro in Indian Wells. Sabalenka had a terrific season in 2023 in which

she won the Australian Open, reached the semi-finals of Roland Garros and Wimbledon before making the final of US Open. Having set her sights on adding more laurels in 2024, Sabalenka said the defeats in Dubai and Indian Wells are only a blip and that she is hungry as ever for major titles. "It's not like I won Australian Open at the beginning of the year and the year is done. I'm always hungry for wins and always want to do well and bring my best tennis," Sabalenka said. "I'll keep working and hopefully at the end of the year I'll think about this year as the best year of my career."

UEFA Champions League: Atletico Madrid down Inter Milan, Dortmund go past PSV



New Delhi:Atletico Madrid overcame a 1-0 deficit and defeated Inter Milan on penalties to make it to the quarterfinals of the UEFA Champions League, while Borussia Dortmund downed PSV Eindhoven 2-0 on March 13, Wednesday. This would complete the Round Of 16 matches for the campaign as Atleti and Dortmund joined the likes of Manchester City, Arsenal, Real Madrid and Barcelona in the next round. In a thrilling

encounter that kept fans on the edge of their seats, Atletico triumphed over Inter in a nail-biting penalty shootout, securing their spot in the Champions League quarter-finals. The intense round-of-16 battle concluded with a 2-2 tie on aggregate, leading to a decisive shootout where Atletico emerged victorious with a 3-2 scoreline.
