ODRAF Dousing Forest Fire



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Shri Nanda is continuously monitoring forest fire in Sanctuaries and Tiger Reserves and other Wildlife Habitats. For timely

extinguishing of wildfire in Simlipal Tiger Reserve (STR), the State Wildlie Organization has deployed ODRAF personnel to assist in fire fighting inside the jungle. "Till Saturday, Simlipal sanctuary had received fire alerts for 115 points this year & all were extinguished by our green soldiers in time before it could cause any damage in scorching heat," Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF) wildlife, Susanta Nanda informed on

X. Fire breaks out at 18 points in the north and 25 points in south of Similipal sanctuary. A 25-member team of Odisha Disaster Rapid Action Force (ODRAF) and Fire Service department engaged to douse the flames, informed STR Deputy Director Sai Kiran said. He termed the fire as manmade and said the situation is under control. The staff are in readiness to combat any eventuality and STR is in safe hands, he said.

Sambalpur University: Assistant Professor suspended over offensive social media posts



Bhubaneswar(KCN): The authorities of Sambalpur University Saturday suspended Rajat Kumar Kujur, an Assistant Professor of Political Science and Public Administration Department for indiscipline. As per the order of the Chancellor, the varsity's registrar has put Kujur under suspension. Kujur was accused of misbehaving with PG council chairperson and posting offensive posts against her on social media. Following the allegation, an inquiry was ordered. Based on the findings, the suspension of Rajat Kujur was recommended. During the suspension period, he is not allowed to the office of the PG Council Chairperson, a notification issued by the varsity stated. Further, the authorities have also restricted his entry into the administrative building, any PG department/section or library. He has been barred from attending any meeting of the varsity during the suspension period. However, he will get a subsistence allowance at a rate equal to leave salary, the notification added.

Jaundice outbreak in GCE, Keonjhar



Keonjhar(KCN): As many as 18 students at a hostel of the Government College of Engineering (GCE), Keonjhar were diagnosed with jaundice and admitted to Keonjhar district headquarters hospital, reports said Saturday. While some of them have been taken home by their

parents, the rest are under treatment at the hostel, sources said. After the incident, a medical team visited the hostel where the cases were reported. The team took samples of water being supplied to the hostel and inspected the quality of food being provided to the students

in the hostel. "Water samples have been sent to Bhubaneswar for examination. Some students have been taken home by their parents after they complained of health complications and others are under treatment at the hostel," said GCE Principal

Trilochan Sahu. Sources said some days back, one student was found suffering from jaundice by the hostel authorities. Subsequently, 17 students developed symptoms related to jaundice. Chief District Medical Officer, Keonjhar Dr KC Prusty said, "Out of the total 12 blood samples collected from the hostel, one has been found to be positive in the hepatitis test so far. Among the rest, jaundice was detected in five samples and the rest six were diagnosed with mild jaundice. No such evidence was found in the water samples during the examination".

Summer Vacation From 25 APR

Bhubaneswar(KCN): With mercury crossing 45 degrees Celsius mark yesterday, the State Government announced summer vacation for all school students of the State from April 25. The schools run by government, private and aided ones will remain closed in entire Odisha from April 25, State Information and Public Relation Department said in a tweet today. The schools will function in the morning hours from 6.30 AM to 10.30 AM for three days from tomorrow (April 22 to 24). Earlier, the state had ordered closure of all schools in the state for three days from April 18 to 20 after a severe



heatwave situation during which the temperature rose to above 45 degrees Celsius in the state. Today Till 2.30 PM, the highest temperature of 43.6 degrees Celsius was recorded at Jharsuguda and Keonjhar while six other places recorded a maximum temperature of above 40 degrees Celsius. Those places are, Hirakud (41.8), Rourkela (41.8),

Sambalpur (41.7), Bhubaneswar (41.6), Chandbali (41.6) and Balasore (40.5). In a bulletin, the IMD said day temperature would be 40°C or above at many places over the districts of interior Odisha and likely to be above normal by 3 to 5°C over some districts during the next 2 days. However, due to likely interaction of middle

tropospheric westerly trough with lower level moist air from Bay of Bengal, Meteorological conditions becoming favourable for moderate thunderstorm activity with lightning, gusty surface wind, wind speed reaching 40 to 50 kmph and scattered to Isolated rainfall over the districts within next 3-4 days, it said. The Met Department has issued Heatwave Orange Warning (be prepared) Mayurbhanj, Keonjhar, Boudh, Nuapada, Sundargarh, Bargarh, Dhenkanal, Jajpur, Bhadrak, Sonepur, Bolangir, Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Sambalpur, Jharsuguda, Angul, Khurda, and Cuttack districts for tomorrow.

Income Tax Appeals before CIT(A)/ JCIT (A) PART 4

24. Whether the assessee can take additional ground not specified in the grounds of appeal in Form No. 35 filed before CIT(A)/ JCIT (A): Section 250(5) specifically empowers the CIT(A) or Joint Commissioner (Appeals) to allow an appellant at the hearing of the appeal to go into any ground of appeal not specified in the Memorandum of Appeal. This power to allow a new or additional ground of appeal to be raised at the hearing is subject to the CIT(A)'s/ JCIT(A)'s being satisfied that the omission of that ground from the form of appeal was not willful or unreasonable as also held in the case of Ramgopal Ganpatrai & Sons Ltd. v. Commissioner of Excess Profits Tax 24 ITR 362 (Bom). If the CIT(A) has exercised his discretion

arbitrarily and not judicially in refusing to entertain additional grounds, the discretion would be open to correction by a higher authority - Manjushree Plantation Ltd. v. CIT 131 ITR 307 (Mad.). The Supreme Court has dismissed the SLP filed by Department in [1983] 144 ITR (St.) 50. 25. Can assessee file an appeal if A.O. refuses to grant stay of demand without even giving him an opportunity of being heard: If the A.O. fails to discharge his duties of giving an opportunity of being heard or his order refusing to grant stay of demand is arbitrary or unjust, the assessee may file a writ under Article 226 of the Constitution of India in jurisdictional High Court, urging for grant of stay of demand. The CIT (A) may also grant stay of demand. It is advisable to approach the concerned CIT or CCIT or ITAT before moving to the High

Court.

26. Whether a deduction or exemption can be claimed before CIT(A) or ITAT which was not claimed before A.O. and whether powers of CIT (A) or ITAT are co-terminus with that of the A.O.: The CIT(A) or ITAT can permit assessee to claim deduction not claimed before ITO when relevant materials are on record - CIT v. Motor Industries Co. Ltd. 229 ITR 137 (Kar.). Similarly, Kolkata Bench of ITAT in the case of Kandi Industrial (P) Ltd. v. DCIT [2006] 100 ITD 462 (ITAT-Kol) held that if assessee is entitled to certain relief, deduction or benefit, assessee should not be denied or deprived of it, even if claim pertaining to same is made for first time before Tribunal during pendency of appeal before it. Also refer CIT v. B G Shirke Construction Technology (P) Limited [2017] 79 taxmann.com 306 (Bombay)/[2017] 246 Taxman 300 (Bombay); CIT v. Britannia Industries Ltd. [2017] 83 taxmann.com 365 (Calcutta), Principal CIT, Bengaluru v. Karnataka State Co-operative Federation Ltd [2021] 128 taxmann.com 1 (Karnataka). 27. Power of CIT

(A) is coterminous:

In this context the following decisions are relevant- In CIT v. Kanpur Coal Syndicate [1964] 53 ITR 225(SC) it was held that the AAC has plenary powers in disposing of an appeal. The scope of his power is co-terminus with that of the ITO. He can do what the ITO can do. In Jute Corporation of India Ltd. v. CIT [1991] 187 ITR 688(SC) it has been held that the declaration of law is clear that the powers of the AAC is coterminous with that of the ITO and if that is so, there appears to be no reason as to why the appellate authority cannot modify the assessment order on an additional ground even if not raised before the ITO. In CIT v. Nirbheram Daluram [1997] 224 ITR 610(SC) also the same views have been reiterated. Also refer: Income-tax Officer, TDS v. Tata Teleservices Ltd. [2022] 134 taxmann.com 323 (Delhi - Trib.). 28. Whether CIT (A) is required to give an opportunity of being heard to the A.O. before deciding the appeal: In the case of ITO v. Ace Engg. Co. [2009] 308 ITR (AT) 1 (Amritsar) it was held that when the

duty of deciding an appeal is imposed, those whose duty it is to decide it must act judicially. They must deal with the question referred to them without bias, and they must give to each of the parties the opportunity of adequately presenting the case made. However, where in view of coercive measures for recovery of tax, assessee advances the date of hearing and the notice of such advancement is given to A.O., it cannot be said that A.O. has not been given proper opportunity - ITO v. Veto Electropowers 8 ITR (Trib.) 76 (Jai.). 29. What should be done if the assessee is not satisfied with the order of CIT(A): If the assessee is not satisfied with the order of the first appellate authority i.e. CIT(A), a second appeal before the Income-tax Appellate Tribunal can be filed. As per section 253 (as amended by the Finance Act, 2023), a taxpayer aggrieved by the following orders may appeal before the ITAT within 60 days of receipt of relevant order - a. an order passed by CIT(A) u/s 154, 250, 270A, 271, 271A, 271AAC, 271AAD, 271AJ or 272A. b. an order passed

by Joint Commissioner (Appeals) u/s 154, 250, 270A, 271, 271A, 271AAC, 271AAD, or 271J. (w.e.f. 1.4.2023) c. an order passed by an assessing officer u/s 115VZC(1) d. an order passed by Pr. CIT or CIT u/s 12AA, or u/s 12AB or 80G(5)(vi), or 263, or 270A, 271, 272A or an order u/s 154 amending any such order e. an order passed by PrCCIT/CCIT/PrDGIT/DGIT/ PrDIT/DIT under sec 263, 272A or order u/s 154 amending any such order. f. an order passed by an assessing officer u/s 143(3) or 147 or 153A or 153C in pursuance of the directions of the Dispute Resolution Panel or an order assed u/s 154 in respect of such order; g. an order passed by an assessing officer u/s 143(3) or u/s 147 or u/s 153A or sec. 153C with the approval of the Pr. CIT or CIT as referred to in sec. 144BA(12) or an order passed u/s 154 or 155 in respect of such order. h. an order passed by the Principal CIT / CCIT/ CIT/prescribed authority under sub-clause (iv) or (v) or (vi) or (via) of clause 23C of section 10. Even prior to the amendment it was held that such orders are

appealable before Tribunal - Dev Bhumi Industries v. CIT [2016] 75 taxmann.com 247 (Himachal Pradesh). 30. Appeal before ITAT by the Department: As per section 253(2), on being directed by the Pr. CIT or CIT, the A.O. may also file appeal before the ITAT against an order passed u/s 154 or u/s 250 by the CIT(Appeal) or w.e.f. 1.4.2023 by Joint Commissioner (Appeals). Section 253(8) provides that the Central Government may make a scheme by Notification for the purpose of providing faceless appeal to the ITAT u/s 153(2) so as to impart greater efficiency, transparency and accountability. The Finance Act, 2022 has amended Section 253(9) to provide that the Central Government shall issue direction that any of the provisions of the Act shall not apply or shall apply with such exceptions, modifications and adaptations as may be specified in the Notification, provided that no direction shall be issued after 31.3.2024. 31. Whether an order passed by first appellate authority can be rectified: Yes, any order passed under the Income-tax Act by CIT

(A) can be rectified u/s 154(1) in case of any mistake apparent from the record. It may be mentioned that as per section 154(1) any income-tax authority referred to in section 116 is entitled to rectify its order and clause (c), (cc) and (d) of section 116 covers CIT (A). It may also be noted that - a. CIT (A) may make an amendment of its own motion or, b. shall make such amendment for rectifying any mistake which has been brought to its notice by the assessee or by the Assessing Officer. However, if any amendment has the effect of enhancing an assessment or reducing a refund or otherwise increasing the liability of the assessee, it shall be made only after satisfying the requirements as per section 154(3), which are- (i) giving notice to the assessee of the authority's intention to do so; and (ii) allowing the assessee, a reasonable opportunity of being heard.

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AI has enhanced the potential reach and flexibility of academicians

This article is an attempt to look at how universities can encourage the ethical and transparent use of artificial intelligence tools to support learning while guarding against misconduct. Generative artificial intelligence (AI) has stirred great debate and discussion across higher education. Opinion pieces, blogs and social media feeds are full of questions with no clear answers, yet educators are having to grapple with AI concerns in their classes. AI-generated text is widely accessible and constantly evolving, so educators must figure out how to adapt and what to adopt. AI technology has the potential to revolutionise and elevate the educational journey for students by introducing personalised learning experiences tailored to individual needs. It presents avenues for

enhancing accessibility in education. Nevertheless, it is imperative to address potential ethical issues that accompany its integration, which raise questions including: what is the potential impact on academic integrity? Will technology encourage cheating? To what extent should AI-generated data or tools be allowed for university teaching and learning? How do we adapt our teaching in a world where the majority of people can turn to technology for a response? These issues are not novel. Plagiarism, cheating and academic integrity have been at the heart of ethical discussion for years. Unfortunately, AI tools have become associated with academic dishonesty. Technological use has been increasingly embraced by teachers over the past 10 years as more information and instruction is delivered online, with mixed success. Such tools have enhanced the potential reach of educators and increased flexibility in instructional delivery but there remain challenges

associated with varied computer access and skills, increased isolation and self-direction. AI-generated text is the latest shift in higher education, prompting us to reflect on what learning means now and in the future. AI enhances the availability of information and can handle complex tasks, analyse large volumes of data and make decisions with minimal human involvement. So, when applied to teaching and learning, the key question is: when does the use of AI or technology become a violation of the learning process? The use of AI and other technological tools does not inherently hinder learning; the critical factor is how to use the technology while maintaining academic integrity. Information generated by AI can be inaccurate or misleading, meaning it will fabricate research, fake a source, not attribute authors for their work, and obscure students' comprehension of subject matter. This can undermine the educational process. Despite the limitations, it is important to explore the potential



of technology to enrich students' productivity and learning experience. Instead of taking a punitive stance, educators should model responsible use of new technology and show how AI can support learning, demonstrating potential structures, approaches or perspectives. In academic writing, syntax, grammar use and maintaining originality and clarity are paramount. However, at times, selecting the

appropriate words and structure can be a hurdle. This is where tools like Quillbot and Grammarly step in. These help students to enhance their written work by improving the expression of language and correcting spelling, grammatical errors, punctuation blunders or a word word phrasing. Tools like ChatGPT-3 and GPT-4 can also assist with effective writing. Students can be asked to assess the tool's

response to a major question or concern in their discipline. This allows them to employ critical thinking skills to determine the quality and depth of the AI response. In this regard, an effective approach has been initiated by Prof. Sunil Goyal, Dean, School of Social Sciences and Management Studies & School of Agriculture and Rural Development, under the guidance and directions of Dr.

Ramdas G. Atram, Vice Chancellor, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University of Social Sciences (BRAUSS), Dr. Ambedkar Nagar (MHOW), Madhya Pradesh, which involves engaging students with generative AI to elucidate theories linked to real-life occurrences. For example, we at BRAUSS have asked our students to use generative AI to examine the Syrian migrant crisis using a specific migration theory. The Ramayana is one of the two major Sanskrit epics of ancient India and an important text of Hinduism. There are 52 sites on the Ramayana Trail in Sri Lanka.

"No Warranty For Modi's Guarantee': Revanth Reddy On Congress's Chances

New Delhi(KCN): Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has expressed confidence his party the Congress will win 14 of the 17 Lok Sabha seats in the state. Mr Reddy became Chief Minister in December 2023 after the Congress defeated K Chandrashekar Rao's Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS). "Every medicine has an expiry date," Mr Reddy told reporters in Karnataka's capital Bengaluru during an informal interaction, adding Prime Minister Narendra Modi will lose the Lok Sabha elections 2024. The Chief Minister did not tell whether his confidence comes from the party winning the assembly election in the southern state.



The BJP and its ideological mentor R a s h t r i y a Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) have been against the well-being and development of southern states, the Chief Minister alleged. "There is no warranty for Modi's guarantees," Mr Reddy said.

He dared the Opposition BRS to win even a single seat in the Lok Sabha elections. The BJP may stand to gain from the votes that the BRS will lose, but the Congress will still be able to take at least 14 seats, Mr Reddy said. He said the Congress

party, unlike the BJP and the RSS that have been discriminating against southern states, has always been inclusive by appointing leaders from these states to key cabinet and party positions, even when the Congress had swept the Hindi heartland.

Though Mr Reddy criticised Asaduddin Owaisi's AIMIM of allegedly colluding with the BJP to polarise voters during election season, he admitted that in a city as Hyderabad where terror groups have tried to radicalise young Muslims, the presence of a political party as AIMIM helped in containing radicalisation. Mr Reddy recently campaigned in Kerala too. He said the BJP will likely be restricted to a maximum of 20 among the 130 seats in the southern states. In the northern states, the BJP's numbers will decrease from what it had got in 2019. The elections are being held in seven phases. Votes will be counted on June 4.

BJP Poll Candidates Face Farmers' Protest In Punjab During Campaigning

Chandigarh(KCN): The farmers on Sunday protested against BJP candidate Dinesh Babbu in Batala and party leader Arvind Khanna in Barnala in Punjab as the party leaders continued to face their wrath over their unmet demands. The BJP candidates and leaders have been facing protests from the farmers who have shown them black flags when they were campaigning for the Lok Sabha polls. Party candidates Hans Raj Hans from Faridkot seat, Taranjit Singh Sandhu from Amritsar and Preneet Kaur from Patiala have already witnessed the anger of the farmers. In Fatehgarh Churian in Batala, a group of farmers on Sunday raised slogans against Mr Babbu, who is the BJP nominee from Gurdaspur Lok Sabha seat.

Police even tried to stop the protesters from heading towards the venue where Mr Babbu and the BJP supporters were holding an election related programme. One of the protesters at Fatehgarh Churian said they will continue to oppose the BJP leaders. Reacting to the protest, BJP candidate Babbu said it was only his party which can resolve their issues while the other political outfits will "use" them for their vested interests. "We are with the farmers and I am also a farmer. Their issues can be resolved through dialogue," said Mr Babbu. BJP leader Arvind Khanna faced the farmers' protest in Barnala where he had gone to campaign. A heavy police force was deployed and barricades were raised.



One of the woman protesters slammed the BJP government for not allowing the farmers to go towards Delhi and using "force" against them. Another protester said they came to hold the

protest against Mr Khanna in a peaceful manner but the police personnel did not allow them to move towards the venue. Mr Khanna, however, alleged that it was not

farmer outfits but the workers of the AAP who were "orchestrating" such protests. "The farmers are either in their fields (for wheat harvesting) or mandis (for

selling wheat). These outfits are the people of (chief minister) Bhagwant Mann and these are not farmers," alleged Mr Khanna, adding that the Modi government stands

by the farmers. Meanwhile, BJP candidate from the Amritsar Lok Sabha seat Taranjit Singh Sandhu, who has also been facing farmers' ire, said he belongs to a farming family. He said he emphasised on increasing the income of the farmers. "I am campaigning and I will continue to do so," he said. The farmers under the banner of Samyukta Kisan Morcha (SKM) have already said they will oppose the BJP and will ask the people to "punish" the saffron party in the upcoming Lok Sabhapolls. The farmers owing allegiance to various farm outfits are upset with the BJP-led Centre for not accepting their demands, including a law on minimum support price.

They were also angry over not being allowed to head towards Delhi, forcing them to camp at Shambhu and Khanauri border points of Punjab and Haryana. The SKM (Non-Political) and Kisan Mazdoor Morcha (KMM) are spearheading the 'Delhi Chalo' march by the farmers to press the government to accept their demands which include that the Centre should give a legal guarantee of Minimum Support Price (MSP) for the crops. The farmers have been staying put at the Shambhu and Khanauri border points between Punjab and Haryana since February 13 when their march was stopped by the security forces. The polling for the 13 Lok Sabha seats in Punjab will be held in the last phase on June 1.

Odisha: Congress releases candidates list for 2 Lok Sabha, 13 Assembly seats

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Congress Saturday released a fresh list of candidates for two Lok Sabha seats and 13 Assembly constituencies of Odisha. The party has replaced candidates in one Lok Sabha and three Assembly constituencies for which nominees had been announced earlier. The Congress has replaced Mohan Hembram with Binod

Bihari Nayak at the Keonjhar Lok Sabha seat. Similarly, the party has fielded Sarat Kumar Pradhan in place of Manoj Kumar Acharya on Kantamal Assembly segment under K a n d h a m a l Parliamentary constituency. Sanjay Kumar Mandal has replaced Bipin Bihari Swain at Kabisuryanagar Assembly seat under Aska Parliamentary

constituency. The party also nominated Krushna Sagaria for Jayadev Assembly segment under Bhubaneswar Lok Sabha seat in place of Jayant Kumar Bhoi. Congress has fielded Dulal Chandra Pradhan on the high profile Sambalpur Lok Sabha constituency where Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan from Bharatiya Janata Party and the



Biju Janata Dal heavyweight Pranab Prakash Das have already hit the

campaign trail. Debokanta Sharma has been fielded by the Congress from Aska Lok Sabha

constituency. In another major development, the party has fielded Shidharth Routray,

the elder son of expelled senior leader Suresh Kumar Routray, on Nimapara Assembly segment in Puri Lok Sabha constituency. Congress also fielded former BJD MLA Sipra Mallick who joined the party April 18 from K e n d r a p a r a A s s e m b l y constituency. Meanwhile, Amita Biswal, Manoj Kumar Pradhan and Gyan Ranjan Patnaik have been nominated from Jharsuguda,

Khandapada and Pipili Assembly constituencies, respectively. The party has so far declared the names of candidates on 136 out of 147 Assembly constituencies and 19 of the 21 Lok S a b h a constituencies. The party also left two Assembly seats in Sundargarh district, Biramitrapur and Bonai constituencies, to the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha and CPI-M, respectively.

CS Asks For Enforcement



Bhubaneswar(KCN): In view of the upcoming general elections-2024 in the state, another coordination meeting of the State Level Enforcement Committee was held today under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Pradeep Kumar Jena at Lok Seva Bhawan. The meeting was attended, among others, by Additional Chief Secretary, Revenue & Disaster Management and Forest & Environment, Satyabrata Sahu, Additional Chief Secretary, General Administration and Public Grievances, Surendra Kumar, Additional Chief Secretary Home, Deo Ranjan Kumar Singh, Principal Secretary, Excise, S K Lohani, Principal Secretary, Commerce and Transport, Usha Padhee, Transport Commissioner Amitabh Thakur. The meeting was attended by the Chief Commissioner of GST, Sanjay Kumar Singh, Director General of Police, Arun Sarangi, Commissioner, Transport, Amitabh Thakur, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief of Forest Force, Odisha, Debidutta Biswal, PCCF Wildlife Susanta Nanda and

others. In the meeting, the Police Administration has so far held the law and order situation in the state, in the context of the peaceful conduct of the elections, infiltrators and extremists. Information about the action taken by the police to deal with the activities was presented. In various criminal cases, the police provided information about the activities taken so far, seizure of arms, ammunition etc. since the announcement of elections, steps being taken in liquor and narcotic cases. Police deployment in various districts, strict vigil at police check posts, excise check posts, forest department check posts, etc., infiltrators indulging in anti-social activities, illegal drug smuggling and illegal cash. The meeting emphasized on keeping a close watch on transactions. In view of the general

elections, the concerned police administration, excise department, forest department, commerce and transport department for strict adherence to the model code of conduct. The heads of various departments have been directed to coordinate and take action. In the meeting, the excise department has taken a decision so far regarding the seizure of illegal drugs. The principal secretary of the department gave information about the activities. Similarly, the GST Commissioner presented information related to the action taken against the defaulters of the Goods and Services Tax Act. He informed that regular inter-state coordination meetings are being held in this regard and joint raids are being conducted in coordination with the Departments of Commerce and Transport.


SUMUM On Organ Service

Bhubaneswar(KCN): For the second time in nine months, multiple organs retrieved from a brain dead patient at the SUM Ultimate Medicare (SUMUM), a quaternary care hospital here, were flown to other cities on Monday for transplantation providing a new lease of life to two critical patients. The liver and heart were retrieved from Krushna Chandra Mahabhoi, a CRPF jawan, who was pronounced brain dead in the hospital on March 23

night. The 48-year-old patient, who had suffered kidney failure and was on dialysis, was admitted into the hospital on March 20 and was undergoing treatment in the ICU, hospital sources said. His condition deteriorated subsequently leading to subdural haemorrhage. The treating team conducted an Apnea test on Sunday morning which confirmed he was brain dead. The family members of the patient then decided

to donate his organs and informed the hospital authorities accordingly. The hospital quickly got in touch with the State Organ and Tissue Transplant Organisation (SOTTO) in this connection following which the information reached the Regional Organ and Tissue Transplant Organisation (ROTTO) and National Organ and Tissue Transplant Organisation (NOTTO). When the organ viability was tested the patient's

liver and heart were found to be in good condition for transplantation. As per the allocation of organs made by NOTTO the liver was taken to Sir H.N. Reliance Foundation Hospital and Research Centre at Mumbai for transplantation on a patient while the heart was flown to Kolkata for transplantation on another patient under treatment at the Medica Superspeciality Hospital there.

Chasing a big target of 223, RCB were cruising at one point through fifties from Will Jacks and Rajat Patidar but Andre Russell removed them in the same over to twist the contest. RCB continued to stay in the

hunt through Dinesh Karthik, and a late cameo from Karn Sharma almost pulled it off. With three needed off the last ball, Mitchell Starc delivered a wide yorker and then Phil Salt produced an acrobatic run out to catch Lockie Ferguson well short on the second run, to give KKR crucial two points. Earlier in the afternoon, it was business as usual for the Knight Riders with the bat after being sent in by Faf du Plessis on a dry-looking surface.

For a change, Sunil Narine couldn't get going as RCB executed their wide line plans and yorkers precisely at him but couldn't do the same to his partner. Salt unleashed a 14-ball 48 to ensure that KKR got another riveting PowerPlay score to their list.

Narine's scratchy innings was put to an end by Yash Dayal with a deceptive slower ball that got miscued to long-off. Salt then narrowly missed out on his fifty as he holed

out to deep mid-wicket and his dismissal was soon followed by Angkrish Raghuvansh who fell to a blinder of a catch from Cameron Green at mid-wicket. The Australian then struck with the ball a few minutes later to get Venkatesh Iyer on the short ball. From 56/0, KKR slipped to 97/4 in the space of 25 deliveries.

Despite the fall of wickets, the high run rate prevalent allowed Shreyas Iyer and Rinku

Singh to play with minimal fuss. They still continued to find the fence, albeit with a tone of restraint in the partnership. Shreyas and Rinku were particularly aggressive against spin, using their feet to clear the ropes. The left-hander fell to Green who once again used a short ball to prise out a wicket. Shreyas did get to his first fifty of the season but he also perished to a lovely diving catch from Du Plessis at long-off.

It's not always that a

batter overshadows Andre Russell in finishing an innings off, with the West Indian also present at the crease. But Ramandeep Singh did just that, smashing a nine-ball 24 to propel the total past the 220-run mark at a time when RCB would have fancied to restrict KKR to much lower. Russell also got some runs but was nowhere close to his fluent self.

With such a big total to chase, RCB had no option but to go hard from the get-go. Virat Kohli set the

tone with a hook over fine leg against Harshit Rana in the first over. Mitchell Starc also got struck for a six in his first over by Kohli but the promise was cut short in Rana's second over. A high full toss saw Kohli checking his shot, only to lob it straight up for a return catch. The former RCB captain was adamant on a waist-high no ball but he had stepped out of the crease. The third umpire eventually sided with the bowler and Kohli had to walk off. After both RCB openers

Well early, the team needed somebody else to stand up. Known for his explosive gameplay at the top of the order, Will Jacks came to the party with Rajat Patidar also joining in. Both were severe on the pacers while Patidar looked equally at ease against spin. Boundaries started to flow, mostly in the form of sixes, and KKR were unable to put a lid on the scoring rate. The pair added 102 off just 48 balls to put the chase in cruise control for RCB.

Rybakina crumbled in

her first chance to serve out the match, however, as Azarenka got a break to get to 5-5 after she chased down a drop shot before her opponent sent a backhand volley into the net. Collins Obuya bows out after quarter-century career

NEWDELHI: Long-serving Kenyan all-rounder Collins Obuya today called time on a career spanning close to a quarter-century, announcing his international retirement following Kenya's final match at the African Games - a defeat to Uganda in the bronze medal match at Accra. Obuya's final innings for Kenya proved Bradmanesque in the least looked-for way, bowled for a duck by Cosmas Kyewuta in the first over of the match, though three consecutive half-centuries earlier in the tournament put the lie to any suggestion that, at 42 years old, his abilities were significantly diminished. Indeed his retirement seemed to take his opponents by surprise, but when he raised his bat in farewell after his final innings the realisation swiftly dawned and he was mobbed by the Ugandan side, who together with the Kenyans formed a guard of honour to



applaud him from the field. Obuya first pulled on a Kenya shirt more than 25 years ago, representing his country at the 1998 Under-19 World Cup. His debut for the senior team came two years later in a First Class match against a touring Pakistan A side, joining a side in the ascendancy and seemingly on course for Full Membership and Test Status. Playing alongside his elder brothers David and Kennedy as well as such legends of the Associate game as Steve Tikolo, Thomas Odoyo and Maurice Odumbe, Obuya was a key part of the Kenyan side that famously made a run to the semi-finals at the 2003 World Cup. Then still a specialist legspinner, Obuya's personal highlight came when claimed 5 for 24 against Sri Lanka at Nairobi (still his best figures in ODIs) including taking the wickets of Mahela Jayawardene, Kumar

Sangakkara and Aravinda de Silva in succession. His exploits earned him a place with Warwickshire the following summer, becoming the first Kenyan international to land a county contract. In England his bowling seemed to desert him, and Warwickshire released him after just one season, as a combination of injury and illness signalled the start of a difficult period in Obuya's career. Nonetheless he would force his way back into the national side as a batting all-rounder, a role

he would play for Kenya for another two decades. His proudest achievement with the willow would come at the 2011 World Cup, his unbeaten 98 against an Australia attack that included Mitchell Johnson, Shaun Tait and Brett Lee a rare highlight in what was otherwise a dismal tournament for Kenya. Indeed it was evident that the side were already in steep decline when Obuya took over the captaincy from Jimmy Kamande in the aftermath of that tournament, and the 2011 World Cup would prove Kenya's last appearance on the global stage to

Obuya led the side through the 2011-13 World Cricket League Championship, increasingly resuming responsibilities with the ball, but could not prevent the side slipping down the rankings as they were eclipsed by Ireland and a rising Afghanistan. Following a calamitous T20 Qualifier in 2012 that saw Kenya eliminated at the group stage, Obuya relinquished the short-format captaincy to Rakep Patel, and handed over the 50-over armband before the 2014 World Cup Qualifier. That tournament would see Kenya finally stripped of the "permanent" ODI status that the ICC had granted them in 1997, bringing an end to Obuya's recognised ODI career, which had spanned 12 years, 104 matches, 2044 runs and 35 wickets. It would be another decade before Obuya finally hung up his boots, however, having amassed well over 300 international caps for his country.

Mumbai's Ranji Trophy players to earn double from next season



NEW DELHI: The Mumbai Cricket Association (MCA) has decided to match the match fee its players get paid by the BCCI for the Ranji players. From next season, the Mumbai Ranji players' earnings will double with the most experienced player getting INR 1.2 lakh a day. The BCCI currently pays INR 60,000 per day to a player who has played more than 40 Ranji games, INR 50,000 to those who have played between 21 and 40 games and INR 40,000 for those who've played up to 20 games, with the reserves earning INR 30,000, INR 25,000 and INR 20,000 in the

With the MCA doubling the match fee, a senior Mumbai player will earn INR 6 lakh from a five-day Ranji game [knockouts] and up to INR 50 lakh from a season if the team reaches the final.

"The MCA proudly announces a groundbreaking initiative aimed at promoting the Ranji Trophy and fostering the growth of red ball cricket in the Mumbai Cricket jurisdiction," the MCA said after an Apex Council meeting where the initiative was proposed by association president Amol Kale.

The decision underscores the association's

continued commitment to red-ball cricket. Earlier this month, the MCA matched the prize money of INR 5 crore for its Ranji Trophy team, which lifted the trophy for the record-extending 42nd time."The initiative received unanimous support from the Apex Council, reflecting the collective dedication of MCA's leadership to the advancement of cricket at all levels. It is a testament to the progressive vision of our President and his deep-seated belief in the importance of red-ball cricket as a fundamental aspect of player development," said Ajinkya Naik MCA Secretary..
