AIIMS Bhubaneswar Launches Special Unit to Manage Heat Stroke Patients

Bhubaneswar, (KCN): In response to the prevailing scorching heat wave in the state, AIIMS Bhubaneswar has taken proactive measures to address the potential rise in heat stroke cases by establishing a dedicated Heat Stroke Unit. Executive Director Dr. Ashutosh Biswas emphasized the necessity of this unit in light of the intense heat wave conditions. The unit, equipped with necessary medical facilities and staffed by doctors from various departments, aims to provide prompt and effective treatment to individuals suffering from sunstroke. Dr. Biswas advised the public to avoid exposure to direct sunlight whenever possible and to take precautionary measures such as



carrying an umbrella, a wet towel, and a water bottle when outdoors. The Heat Stroke Unit, located within the Ayush department, comprises

six beds and has been operational since last week. Medical Superintendent Dr. Dillip Kumar Parida reported that the unit has already

treated over fifteen patients. An emergency meeting involving heads of the General Medicine, Trauma & Emergency, and Ayush departments was conducted to strategize and ensure efficient management of heat stroke cases. Assistant Professor of General Medicine, Dr. Srikanta Behera, has been appointed as the nodal officer of the Heat Stroke Unit. Adequate stock of medicines and Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS) has been maintained, and medical staff remain vigilant to respond to any emergency situations. AIIMS Bhubaneswar reaffirms its commitment to safeguarding public health and urges individuals to prioritize their well-being during this period of heightened heat exposure.

AI Camera Surveillance To Safeguard Similipal Forest Against Fire And Poachers



Mayurbhanj(KCN): The Similipal Tiger Reserve (STR) is now under AI (Artificial Intelligence) supervision. As per the forest department, 5 tower-based 6 AI cameras are being used experimentally in Similipal forest to monitor forest fire, wild animal movements and to track down the activity of poachers. For the last two days, Similipal forest has

been burning. However, the authorities said that all animals are safe in the forest. A total of five AI camera towers have been urgently set up across the entire Similipal sanctuary. Additionally, it has been announced that these AI cameras will be positioned in the burning forest areas, including Satkoshiya. The tower-based AI technology is used for getting immediate

information on forest fires and to douse them quickly. Equipped with high-resolution cameras capable of moving 360 degrees, these towers detect activity up to 15 kilometres away. As a result, forest fires and illegal hunting of wild animals will become easier to detect. The cost of each AI tower installation is Rs. 2.5 crore. This system also

facilitates the provision of real-time data and transmission related to the forest fire. To address manpower needs, the Regional Chief Conservator of Forest (RCCF) has assigned 505 fire squads across different wildlife divisions within the Mayurbhanj district. Furthermore, 733 air blower machines have been employed to aid in extinguishing the fire.

Salman Khan teaches democracy to Indians (and Pakistanis) in Tiger 3. Let that sink in



What if someone told you that the latest Salman Khan actioner can give you a ready reckoner on why democracy is better than dictatorship? Maneesh Sharma's Tiger 3 is not just the popcorn-and-patriotism entertainer you always expected it to be, the latest Bhai film also expounds the idea that democracy needs to be protected against people who declare themselves to be the sole custodians of the country, making you hopeful for the future of Indian movies. For many decades now, star-driven action films in India have been all about seeking revenge. It could be for the death of the hero's beloved, or any other woman; it could be some childhood trauma that has scarred him for life and he is now looking for comeuppance; or, it could be all about seeking retribution for one's country. The last one has been frequently revisited in our films and has appealed to the masses. The idea of patriotism, however, has changed a fair bit in our movies and in 2023, this was particularly evident. The year started with Shah Rukh Khan's Pathaan where a Pakistani agent, played by Deepika Padukone, had the crowd cheering for her when she joined forces with SRK's Indian agent to save humanity. A few months later, in Jawan, Shah Rukh gave a rousing monologue where he spoke directly to his fans about the importance of voting for the right candidate. The film did not shy away from taking shots at the corrupt troika of bureaucracy, politics and business. And the year ended with Salman Khan in Tiger 3 where his main mission was to save Pakistan from the evils of dictatorship.

Tiger 3 is an Indian film with an Indian hero at the center of its story but strangely enough, India has no stake in the story of this film. The many times when Tiger is asked as to why he cares about what's happening in Pakistan, he comes up with a rather flimsy excuse, a reason he repeats many times in the film. It makes you wonder why Maneesh and Salman zeroed in on this subject for the third Tiger installment. In the film, the protagonist asks his crew, who are stand-ins for the audience, a question that immediately tells you about the central idea of this film. 'Democracy or dictatorship?' asks Tiger and his crew responds in unison, 'democracy.'

It is a rather strong statement when one of the most successful movie producing studios in the country decides to make a film where a choice as simple as this, at least for Indians who have been living in a democracy for over 75 years, needs to be reminded to the audience. The makers actually had to spell out why the need to have fair elections is essential and why democracy is better than having a dictator, the villain of this story, who might pretend to have good intentions. They underline that complete control in the hands of one person can't be good for the health of a nation.

What comes to mind when you hear the word “veterinarian?” yes for the general public the classical view of a veterinarian is a person qualified in the field of veterinary science and their job responsibilities are mainly related to the prevention, cure or alleviation of pain and treatment of animals, especially domestic animals and for more elite mass veterinarian is the local practitioner who takes care of their family pets and other companion animals. No question, these roles are very important for a veterinarian but the contemporary roles undertaken by veterinarians go far beyond these visible tasks, their roles and responsibilities have a huge impact on both human and animal health in general and also on the overall health of the planet. In order to recognise the tiresome efforts of veterinarians globally every year, the last Saturday of April is celebrated as World Veterinary Day. The day commemorates the duties that the veterinarians perform for the society, and the responsibilities they are entrusted with. This year, the World Veterinary Day will be celebrated on April 27. The World Veterinary Association (WVA) was founded in 1959 in Spain’s Madrid. It was the WVA which came up with the World Veterinary Day in the year 2001. The WVA unites veterinary professionals globally, including national and international associations of veterinarians working in different spheres of veterinary medicines. The World Veterinary Association (WVA) announced that this year’s World Veterinary Day will celebrate veterinarians as essential workers in their communities. The official theme, “Veterinarians are essential health workers” honors veterinarians and all do to keep their communities safe and protected. As we all know the world becomes intricately inter-connected and more complex, so are the various obligations and responsibilities that veterinary professionals. Different dimension of

the veterinarians work often remains invisible to the society, in this world veterinary day let’s try to understand what are the real contributions of veterinarians to the society in large. Veterinarians are first responders to human disease outbreaks, did you know the majority of emerging infectious diseases in people originate from animals (zoonotic diseases) and the very recent COVID-19 pandemic is no exception? At this very moment, veterinarians are working all over the globe to diagnose diseases in animals, conduct surveillance and recognize foreign animal diseases. Veterinarians conduct millions of tests and handles hundreds of samples daily to ensure our existing mechanism responsible for health and wellbeing can rapidly respond in emergencies. Many veterinarians are deployed and several veterinary laboratories were leveraged assist health departments to provide human COVID testing during the pandemic. Veterinary professionals also share responsibilities for biosecurity, this is a joint effort that must be shared by all who have obligations for animals and/or animal products, both farm and companion animals. The conventional barriers that nature provides can no longer be relied upon to exclude dissemination from country to country. In this view, the veterinarian is a sentinel for the early detection of, and early response to, accidental or deliberate introduction of exotic diseases. The veterinarian is, in fact, a key line of defense that society counts on against agro-terrorism and bioterrorism. According to WHO, around 60% of all infectious diseases in humans are zoonotic, meaning they originate from animals. In the face of emerging infectious diseases combined with climate change, the One Health approach has become increasingly important. Therefore, monitoring and controlling zoonotic diseases is crucial to preventing devastating impacts on both human and animal health. One Health approach has highlighted the vital role played by veterinarians in safeguarding public health and promoting animal health and welfare. This is because vets are uniquely positioned as the only doctors who can recognize and address zoonotic diseases that

can impact both animals and humans. Especially in India, where agriculture and animal husbandry are major contributors to the economy, Veterinarians are playing their vital role safeguarding public health by promoting animal health and welfare. Veterinarians are leaders in food safety, epidemiology and public health, Veterinarians are

Recognition that healthy and productive livestock make important contributions to food production, income generation, job creation, economic growth, and poverty alleviation is often overlooked or taken for granted. Yet, on average, livestock contribute some 40 percent of agricultural GDP. In this regard, farm-oriented veterinary professionals are doing

community leader and change agent in disseminating the latest technology to the farmers and act as a missing link between the scientist in the lab and the farmers in the land/farm. Veterinarians are critical in training the next generation of veterinarian, as faculty members, veterinarians fulfil the mission of teaching, diagnostic or

to a report by Research and Markets, the veterinary market in India is expected to grow at a CAGR of 7.5% between 2020 and 2025. One of the key drivers of growth in the veterinary sector is the increasing trend in demand for animal products. With a growing population and rising income levels, the demand for animal products is increasing every year.. Another factor driving growth in the veterinary sector is the rising awareness about animal health. With a growing emphasis on food safety and quality, there is an increasing focus on ensuring the health and well-being of livestock. Additionally, the growing pet population in the country has led to a greater demand for veterinary services, including preventive care, diagnostics, and treatment. To meet this ever increasing demand the Indian Veterinarian battles enormous odds every day to provide medical care to our livestock and companion animal. According to a report by the National Sample Survey Organization (NSSO), there is a shortage of around 55,000 veterinarians in the country. This ratio is amongst the lowest in the world (1 vet per 5350 animals) and is indicative of the severe stress that vets face in caring for them. Experts say it is common for good vets to work long hours and burn out. The report also highlights the inadequate infrastructure, with only 31% of the veterinary hospitals and dispensaries having the required facilities for treating animals. Additionally, the report states that around 40% of the veterinary professionals in the country are not trained to handle emergencies, which is a significant concern in a sector where timely treatment can mean the difference between life and death. Given that India has traditionally been an agriculture driven economy, the ability of our vets to care for cattle and farm animals (cows, buffalo, goat, sheep etc) has been considered of prime importance by the Government. This is why the Veterinary curriculum is predominantly focussed on large animal care while small animal care (dogs, cats, birds and other companion animals and more) has not been given attention. With the changing scenario of modern life style and urbanisation veterinarians are

presented with more numbers of case related to exotic pets and different wildspecies, critical skills to handle all these species is not being taught in most undergraduate veterinary colleges which pose a major challenge for vets working in field conditions. Veterinarians in India needs a lot of support in delivering the right quality of care to our livestock and companion animals. Think of how a human doctor is assisted by trained nurses, physios, radiologists, and so many other medical professionals. Similarly, veterinary doctors also require help from vet nurses, physios, radiologists, anaesthesiologists, etc. Professionals who are qualified in specialized aspects of veterinary health care which is not there. This leads to added pressure on our doctors and general practitioners, reducing the quality of care and increasing the risk of burnout. This fact is perhaps well known to every pet parent who has faced health issues or travelled abroad with their pets. Veterinary technology in India is shambolic and inadequate, and is not comparable to the more advanced countries in the world. And by technology, I do not mean sophisticated procedures like MRI, Ultrasound or Laparoscopy. DNA testing is still not available except in few research labs for disease screening. Local clinics in India do not even have reliable blood test devices or x-ray machines, posing severe challenges to our vets. It is so bad in fact that multiple countries across the world (European Union, Australia, Malaysia etc)

do not accept Indian tests for their formal processes with regards to pet relocation, and require parents to get the tests done from accredited labs in the UK or elsewhere. We may be biased but veterinary profession is truly the greatest profession, over the years veterinary professionals have played significant and contributory roles in animal and human health and welfare, biomedical research, food quality, food safety, food security, ecology, research and development of pharmaceuticals, remedies, vaccines, and toxicology, also as educators, trainers, and policymakers, and also interlinked with wildlife conservation efforts and the protection of the environment and biodiversity. As challenges have risen, veterinarians have found ways to adapt given that their knowledge and training makes them multifunctional professionals for instance during the Covid-19 pandemic, Vets even doubled up as human physicians and supported doctors in delivering necessary care for everyone in India. Despite the challenges they face on day to day basis, your vet is still doing their best and helping out in whatever way they can. And even if at times you are unhappy with your vet for whatever reason, please never be rude. As normal citizen one cannot even begin to comprehend what our Vets go through on a daily basis. Nexttime when you visit your veterinarian, tell him or her “thank you!” They truly deserve it.

Veterinarians are also an integral part of the Armed Forces, Veterinarians serve in the Indian Armed forces, (Remount and Veterinary Corps). Here, veterinarians provide animal care for military working dogs, horses, mule, camel and other animals as and when required. They also conduct research in some of the advanced research centres of defence forces (Defence Research and Development Organisations). Veterinarians are community leaders and change agents, How many of you know a veterinarian who is serving in a field condition act as a

clinical service, and research to develop new veterinary graduates needed to maintain our livestock development, preserve our food supply chains, and ensure animal health. In addition to this veterinarians perform multifarious role and have got their presence across many fields. They are employed in animal welfare, zoologic medicine, aquatic animal medicine, aerospace medicine (shuttle astronauts), animal shelter medicine, sports medicine, animal-assisted activity and therapy programs, and wildlife medicine. There are veterinarians involved in local, state and federal governments, working with legislators to shape laws that protect prevention of cruelty to animals, animal welfare and well-being of animals. The Veterinary sector in India plays a crucial role in maintaining the health and well-being of the country’s livestock population, which is estimated to be around 536 million. India is one of the leading producers of milk (1st), Chicken meat (7th), and eggs (3rd) in the world (FAOSTAT, 2023) and the livestock sector contributes significantly to the country’s economy. According to the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Government of India, the livestock sector contributes 4.11% to the GDP and 26% to the agricultural GDP of the country. The veterinary sector in India has shown significant potential of growth in last decade. According

Man Has No Control Over Wife's Property, Says Supreme Court

New Delhi(KCN): A husband has no control over his wife's 'streedhan' (woman's property) and while he may use it during the time of his distress, he has a moral obligation to return it to his wife, the Supreme Court has reiterated while directing a man to pay ₹ 25 lakh to a woman in return for her lost gold.

The woman in this case claimed that 89 sovereigns of gold were gifted to her by her family at the time of marriage. Additionally, after the wedding, her father gave a cheque for ₹ 2 lakh to her husband.

According to the woman, on the first night of their marriage, the husband took custody of all her jewellery and entrusted the same to his mother under the garb of safekeeping. She alleged that all the jewellery was misappropriated by the husband and his mother to discharge their pre-existing financial liabilities. The Family Court, in 2011, held that the husband and his mother had indeed misappropriated the appellant's gold jewellery and that she was entitled to recoup the loss caused to her by the said



misappropriation.

The Kerala High Court, while partly setting aside the relief granted by the family court, held that the woman had not been able to establish misappropriation of gold jewellery by the husband and his mother.

The woman then moved the Supreme Court against the high court order.

A bench of justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta said 'streedhan' property does not become a joint property of the wife and the husband, and the husband has no title or independent dominion over the property as its owner.

"Properties gifted to a woman before marriage, at the time of marriage or at the time of bidding farewell or thereafter are her streedhan

properties. It is her absolute property with all rights to dispose at her own pleasure.

"The husband has no control over her streedhan property. He may use it during the time of his distress but nonetheless he has a moral obligation to restore the same or its value to his wife," the bench said, while referring to an earlier judgment on the issue.

The top court said matters of matrimony can rarely be said to be simple or straightforward hence, human reaction according to a mechanical timeline before the sacred bond of marriage is severed is not what one would expect.

"Divorce, majorly, in Indian society is still considered a stigma, and any delay in

commencement of legal proceedings is quite understandable because of the attempts made to have the disputes and differences resolved; more so, in a case of the present nature, when the appellant was faced with the imminent prospect of termination of her second marriage.

"Even otherwise, the appellant did not present before the Family Court a time barred claim. Doubting the bona fide of the appellant, on facts and in the circumstances, was thus not called for," the bench said.

The top court said the very concept of marriage rests on the inevitable mutual trust of the spouses, which conjugality necessarily involves and to assume that the woman from day one did not trust the husband is rather improbable.

"The High Court, thus, failed to draw the right inference from facts which appear to have been fairly established. That apart, we have neither been shown nor do we know of any binding precedent that for a claim of return of streedhan articles or money equivalent thereof

to succeed, the wife has to prove the mode and manner of such acquisition.

"It was not a criminal trial where the chain of circumstances had to be complete and conclusively proved, without any missing link. Undisputedly, the appellant had brought to the matrimonial home sufficient quantum of jewellery, which she wore during the marriage and as is evidenced from photographs," the bench said.

The apex court said the woman had successfully initiated action towards recovery of money in lieu of 89 sovereigns of gold, which in the year 2009 was valued at ₹ 8.90 lakh.

"Mere upholding of the decree of the Family Court at this distance of time, without anything more, would bring about injustice to her. Bearing in mind the passage of time, the escalation in cost of living, and in the interest of equity and justice, we deem it fit in exercise of power conferred by Article 142 of the Constitution of India to award to the appellant a sum of ₹ 25,00,000," the bench said.

Hemant Soren's Wife Kalpana To Contest Bypoll From Gandey Assembly Seat

Ranchi(KCN): The Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) on Thursday announced that Kalpana Soren, wife of jailed former chief minister Hemant Soren, will contest the bypoll from Gandey assembly seat. The seat in Giridih district fell vacant following the

government came to power in 2019.

Hemant Soren was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate on January 31 in connection with a money laundering case linked to an alleged land fraud, subsequent to his resignation as chief

in Odisha's Mayurbhanj district and obtained her engineering and MBA degrees in Bhubaneswar. Hemant Soren's arrest had sparked speculation that his wife would assume leadership.

However, a family rift emerged, with his sister-in-law, Sita Soren, openly



resignation of JMM MLA Sarfaraz Ahmad.

The bypoll to the Gandey assembly seat is scheduled for May 20 along with the parliamentary elections in the state.

The party also announced the candidature of Samir Mohanty, the sitting MLA from Baharagora, from Jamshedpur Lok Sabha seat.

Ms Soren had embarked on a political journey at the 51st foundation day celebration of JMM in Giridih district on March 4, claiming that a conspiracy had been orchestrated by opponents ever since the Hemant Soren coalition

minister

After the ruling JMM-led alliance proved its majority on February 5 and her husband made a fiery speech in the assembly, Ms Soren had taken to X to announce that the "fight against injustice and oppression will continue".

Previously considered a frontrunner for the position of chief minister but facing opposition from Sita Soren, she declared, "I have fought, and I will continue to fight! We have won, and we will win!"

A homemaker with MTech and MBA qualifications, Ms Soren completed her education

opposing any move to make Kalpana Soren the chief minister.

Sita Soren had questioned Kalpana Soren's political inexperience and objected to her potential candidacy, dismissing it as BJP propaganda. Hemant Soren had also dismissed speculation of his wife contesting from Gandey, labelling it BJP's fabrication.

Speculations regarding Kalpana Soren's candidacy arose following the resignation of ruling JMM's Gandey MLA Sarfaraz Ahmad in December, with the BJP claiming it was to facilitate her contesting the polls.

19,000 Teachers "Likely To Be Eligible": Bengal School Service Body

Kolkata(KCN): The West Bengal School Service Commission on Thursday claimed that it had provided the Calcutta High Court lists of around 5,300 appointees from the 2016 school recruitment panel whose appointments were suspect, and stated that the remaining 19,000-odd teachers were "likely to be eligible".

The commission also said it believed that the 19,000 teachers, whose appointments also stand cancelled due to a high court judgment, might have met the necessary

qualification criteria laid down by the appointing authorities.

Talking to reporters, state SSC Chairman Siddhartha Majumdar said, "We submitted before the court lists of candidates where anomalies in recruitment were found. These lists were based on two specific irregularities in recruitment, namely Optical Mark Recognition (OMR) sheet

manipulation and rank jumps. The total number of such candidates for Groups C and D and teachers for classes 9-10

and 11-12 was around 5,300." The claim came in the aftermath of a judgment of a high court special bench on Monday, scrapping all 25,753 appointments made through the recruitment process of State Level Selection Test-2016 (SLST) in West Bengal government-sponsored and aided schools.

The court also directed that a section of those recruits will have to return salaries drawn by them along with 12 per cent per annum interest.

BJP Gets Notice In Delhi, PM's Inheritance Tax Jibe In Madhya Pradesh

New Delhi(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in Madhya Pradesh's Morena Thursday afternoon to campaign for the BJP, ripped into the Congress on the inheritance tax row, and restated controversial remarks about Muslims and the opposition party's alleged plans to "redistribute wealth to infiltrators".

The remarks came hours before a significant first by the Election Commission in Delhi; the poll panel issued notices to BJP boss JP Nadda and his Congress counterpart, Mallikarjun Kharge, on complaints by each other accusing Mr Modi and Rahul Gandhi of hate speech and Model

Code violations.

The EC's show-cause notice did not mention either the PM or Mr Gandhi, or even Mr Kharge, in the context of the alleged hate speeches. It did, however, attach copies of the complaint in its notices and, for the first time, held party bosses responsible for their star campaigners' speeches. Essentially, the EC said it required Mr Nadda and Mr Kharge to ensure BJP and Congress star campaigners must follow its guidelines on "a higher quality of discourse".

Speaking in Morena, the PM alleged the Congress wanted to re-impose the inheritance tax abolished by Rajiv

Gandhi. Mr Modi said the former Prime Minister did so to save the majority of the wealth of his mother, ex-Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, from going to the government. "After benefitting from it... the Congress now wants to impose it on the people of the country", he claimed.

"If the Congress comes to power... it will snatch over half of your earnings via inheritance tax," he continued, taking a swing at senior Congress leader Sam Pitroda. "An adviser to the opposition party's 'shehzada' ('prince', a standard jibe at Mr Gandhi) has suggested imposition of inheritance tax..."

"The wealth you got by working hard and



enduring hardships will be looted from you if a Congress-led government is formed... (but) as long as BJP is there, it will not allow such designs. Modi is a wall between you and the Congress' plan to loot you," the Prime Minister thundered.

He claimed also that the Congress wants to "confiscate people's jewellery and small-

savings by conducting an X-ray of their properties and valuables". The reference was to a comment by Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday, when he said the Congress, if elected, would conduct a national caste survey, which will include an economic report, to "find out how much injustice was done".

The comments echoed

those he made first in Rajasthan's Banswara - which triggered the Congress' complaint - when he declared his rivals would "not even leave your 'mangalsutra'..."

"Congress manifesto says they will calculate gold with mothers and sisters... and then distribute... Manmohan Singh's government had said Muslims have first right on the country's assets... it will be distributed to those who have more children... it will be distributed to the infiltrators..." he claimed. In his Morena speech the Prime Minister also referred, again, to the Congress' manifesto as being "influenced" by the Muslim League. Earlier he had called it a "Muslim

League imprint", drawing a fierce retort from the Congress, for whom Mr Kharge said, "They themselves were with the Muslim League. Their ideologue formed a government with the Muslim League in Bengal..."

Mr Modi's remarks provoked a furious response from the Congress, which accused the Prime Minister of lying to divert voters' attention from genuine issues. Rahul Gandhi posted on X that Mr Modi had been left worried by reports of a poor showing in the first phase.

The opposition party promptly approached the Election Commission "to

highlight completely unprecedented and malicious allegations... clearly aimed at creating enmity between groups". The BJP had also filed a complaint against the Congress, alleging that Rahul Gandhi's speeches in Tamil Nadu's Coimbatore and Kerala's Kottayam, in which he spoke about the 'one nation, one election' idea and referred to the linguistic row between the southern states and the saffron party.

In its complaint to the EC, the BJP slammed Mr Gandhi as a "habitual offender" and also accused Mr Kharge of "grossly misleading voters by declaring the BJP is going to change the Constitution..."

Odisha: BJD gives tickets to Marndi couple, BJP to Singhdeo couple

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The ruling Biju Janata Dal (BJD) has given ticket to the Marndi couple to contest from the tribal-dominated Mayurbhanj district while the opposition BJP has fielded the Singhdeo couple from western Odisha's Bolangir district for the Lok Sabha and Assembly elections. Odisha's Revenue minister Sudam Marndi has been fielded by the BJD from the Mayurbhanj Lok Sabha seat while his wife Ranjita Marndi will be the regional outfit's nominee from



the Bangirposi Assembly segment. The 56-year-old tribal leader's Assembly seat Bangirposi has been given to his wife, who took voluntary retirement from

government service two months ago to contest from the seat on the BJD ticket. Sudam Marndi has been elected to the Odisha Assembly for the Bangirposi



five times and once to the Lok Sabha. BJD president Naveen Patnaik Monday named Marndi's wife Ranjita Marndi as the party candidate from the Bangirposi

Assembly segment which is presently represented by her husband. The BJD president has mostly adopted the 'one family one ticket' policy while

distributing tickets among aspirants, but the Marndis are the lone exception. "They were given tickets under certain political compulsion," a party leader said. Sources in the BJD said that there were as many as 10,000 aspirants for 168 party tickets (147 for Assembly and 21 for Lok Sabha) for the Lok Sabha and Assembly polls. The opposition BJP has also given party ticket to the Singhdeo couple from the Bolangir district. The saffron party has re-nominated its

Bolangir MP Sangeeta Kumari Singhdeo for the same Lok Sabha seat while her husband and senior party leader KV Singhdeo has been fielded from the Patnagarh Assembly segment. Sangeeta has been elected from the Bolangir Lok Sabha seat four times in the past. The Singhdeos hail from the Bolangir royal family. Though Congress has not given party tickets to any couple, the party has given ticket to a father and son and a father and daughter to contest the Lok Sabha

and Assembly elections in Odisha. While Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee campaign committee chairman and senior leader Bhakta Charan Das has been nominated from the Narla assembly segment, his son Sagar is the Congress candidate from the Bhawanipatna assembly seat. The Congress has nominated Bhujabal Majhi as the party candidate from the Nabarangpur Lok Sabha constituency and his daughter Lipika Majhi from the Dabugam Assembly segment.

Problems plague Joda's newly-built stadium



Joda(KCN): Hardly two months have elapsed since its inauguration. However, the walls of the newly-built multi-purpose indoor stadium here in Keonjhar district have developed cracks. Plasters are falling off the walls as well as the beams and ceiling, sources informed Wednesday. The gymnasium has been the worst affected with cracks appearing on

many portions of the walls. A visit to the stadium also exposed various other irregularities. Sportspersons and kids training at the stadium informed us that the water supply to the venue has been disrupted for more than a week now. As a result, they are facing a shortage of drinking water. They informed that they could

not train properly as there were no other means to quench their thirst. They pointed out that the grass lawn in front of the stadium has dried up due to the lack of watering in a proper manner. When contacted, the PWD engineer of Joda, Ramdas Marndi said that the motor pump has been sent for repair and water supply will resume after its installation. The walls

that have developed cracks will also be repaired soon. He, however, appeared evasive when questioned about the sub-standard work associated with the construction of the stadium. It should be stated here that the indoor stadium built at an expenditure of `8 crore was inaugurated virtually by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik in March this year.

Valuables razed in Excise office fire
