Odisha: IMD predicts lightning, hailstorms, rain over next two days



Bhubaneswar(KCN): IMD Bhubaneswar Saturday predicted that moderate thunderstorm activity with lightning, hailstorms and heavy rainfall is likely in some districts of Odisha April 7 and 8. Meteorological sources have attributed this prediction to the expected interaction between the trough aloft in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies and the hot and humid air from the Bay of Bengal. Consequently, Odisha is likely to experience rain, thunderstorms, lightning, and gusty winds, the IMD said. The IMD also advised the people to monitor the weather closely and seek safe shelter during thunderstorm activity to protect themselves from lightning and hailstorms. Light to moderate rain

and thundershowers are expected in a few places in the districts of north Odisha and one or two places in the districts of south Odisha. Hailstorms are likely to occur in one or two places in the districts of Angul, Keonjhar, Dhenkanal, Jajpur, and Cuttack, as per the IMD bulletin, which has issued Yellow Warnings. According to the weather office, thunderstorms accompanied by lightning and gusty surface winds reaching 40-50 kmph are expected in one or two places in the districts of Angul, Dhenkanal, Jajpur, Keonjhar, Cuttack, Khurda, Boudh, Mayurbhanj, Deogarh, and Nayagarh. The IMD bulletin said that the strong winds may damage plantations, horticulture, and standing crops, and cause partial damage to vulnerable

structures due to strong winds and rain. Meanwhile, the Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) has imposed restrictions on outdoor sports activities in the state during peak hours. The SRC has directed the Director of Sports and Youth Services to restrict outdoor sports activities due to the prevailing heatwave conditions in many parts of the state. As per the current synoptic situation, there is a south-to-south-westerly wind prevailing at lower levels over the state. Warm nights have been observed in one or two places in the Bolangir district of South interior Odisha, while dry weather persists in the rest of the districts of Odisha. The maximum temperatures have risen significantly in a few places in coastal Odisha and appreciably in one or two places in interior Odisha. Some areas in coastal Odisha have experienced temperatures markedly above normal and appreciably above normal in a few places across the districts of the state.

Former Odisha Minister Raghunath Mohanty Quits BJP

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Former minister Raghunath Mohanty resigned from the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in Odisha. He tendered his resignation letter to Odisha BJP president Manmohan Samal today. Raghunath Mohanty, the former five-time MLA from Basta in Balasore district, had joined the BJP after resigning from the BJD in 2019. He fought the 2019 polls from Basta on BJP ticket but lost to BJD's Nityananda Sahoo. Mohanty was first elected to Odisha Legislative Assembly from Basta under Lok Sabha Constituency in 1990 Elections ticket. He retained the seat in 1995, 2000, 2004 and 2009 elections.

Berhampur / Jajpur(KCN): At least four persons were killed and 15 others injured in two separate road accidents in Odisha, police said Saturday.

Two members of a 'Danda nata' (folk art) group were killed and 15 others injured when the pickup in which they were travelling overturned at Sompur square in Ganjam district Saturday morning, police said.

The injured persons were rushed to Hinjili hospital. Seven of them were later shifted to MKCG Medical College Hospital

in Berhampur as their condition deteriorated. Three of the seriously injured persons have sustained head injuries, hospital sources said.

The deceased have been identified as Sainda Jena (60) and his son Muna Jena (27), residents of Simulua village in the

district. They were returning home after visiting a relative's house on a motorcycle. A tipper rammed their vehicle at around 9 pm Friday. While the father died on the spot, the son succumbed to injuries at the Jajpur District Headquarters Hospital.

Odisha govt appoints new DMs of Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur



Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Odisha government has appointed two IAS officers as district magistrates of Cuttack and Jagatsinghpur after the Election Commission of India approved their posting, an official said. Arindam Dakua, a 2011-batch IAS officer was appointed as the new District Magistrate of Cuttack replacing Vineet Bharadwaj, while Anupam Saha, a 2012-batch IAS officer, replaced Parul Patwari as Jagatsingpur District Magistrate Friday, the official said.

April 2, the Election Commission of India had ordered the Odisha government to transfer Bharadwaj and Patwari, along with six other IAS officers, to non-election-related posts with immediate effect.

The six IAS officers who were transferred were: IGP (central range) Ashish Singh, Cuttack DCP Kanwar Vishal Singh, Rourkela SP Mitrabhanu Mohapatra, Angul SP Sudhansu Sekhar Mishra, Khurda SP Jugal Kishore Banoth and Berhampur SP Saravana Vivek Kumar. The state government has appointed Sanjay Kumar Kaushal as the new IG (Central) range in place of Ashish Singh.

DIG of Police, Vigilance, Prakash R has also been transferred and posted as Cuttack DCP replacing Kanwar Vishal Singh, while DIG of Police, Intelligence in-charge Security Wing, Brijesh Kumar Rai, has been appointed as Rourkela SP, replacing Mitrabhanu Mohapatra. DIG of Police, SIW, replacing Sudhansu Sekhar Mishra will be the new SP Vigilance and

Jugal Kishore Kumar Banoth will be AIG of Police, headquarters.

Saravana Vivek M was posted as SP vigilance. A General administration department said Vineet Bhardwaj will be Director-cum-Additional Secretary in Drinking Water and Sanitation department while Parul Patwari was appointed as the State Project Director, Odisha Education Programme Authority.

Puri Jagannath Temple Additional Chief Administrator Samartha Verma, a 2011-batch IAS officer, has been appointed as Additional Secretary in the Works department while Subhankar Mohapatra, a 2018-batch IAS officer, has been appointed as Director in the Rural Development department.

Insider-outsider debate is unwarranted

insider or outsider. This debate is unnecessary because everyone who is an Indian is an insider. But a few leaders in this country love to create controversies and survive only because of such baseless debates.

It may be recalled that several time chief minister of Gujarat and 2014 Lok Sabha candidate Narendra Modi was also called an outsider by vested interests. It's another matter that voters gave a damn to them. Similarly, a controversy was created when Arun Jaitley had contested from Amritsar in 2014. The Congress had raised this bogey even at that time.

Surprisingly, this question was raised by a party which had fielded an outsider as early as in 1952 when

the first Lok Sabha election was held. A Malyali, C. Krishnan Nair, was selected for a Delhi seat. He was endearingly called Delhi Gandhi. Nair had played an important role in establishment of the Delhi Development

Authority (DDA). He had also won the Lok Sabha elections held in 1957. The same Congress which had given ticket to Nair had made Sucheta Kriplani, who was born in Ambala and belonged to a Bengali family, its candidate for New Delhi seat. Later, Sucheta ji had become chief minister of the biggest state of the country, Uttar Pradesh also. Sucheta's husband was a famous freedom fighter Acharya Kripalani who was an MP from Bhagalpur and later

from Sitamarhi in Bihar. He was a Sindhi. Shri. S.M. Banerjee was a long-time MP from Kanpur. A Bengali-speaking Banerjee had migrated from Bengal to Kanpur. He was a famous labour leader.

Clearly, those who have asked insider/outsider question do not know that every Indian citizen has an equal right to live anywhere or contest elections from anywhere. George Fernandes, after Kriplani, is another example. He hailed from the South, joined labour movement in Mumbai, but had made Bihar his second home. Biharis too did not consider him an outsider and treated him like their own. He used to speak Bhojpuri and

Maithili, two local dialects with ease. The people of Bihar sent George to the Lok Sabha several times from Muzaffarpur, Bihar. He won the Lok Sabha elections from Mumbai as well.

The country has hardly seen a labour leader like George--a simple man with casual look--dishevelled hair, unironed dress (kurta-pyjama) and ordinary chappal. But as a speaker he was sharp and logical. He used to always do homework and come prepared for a debate in the House. A man of international standing, he had given tough time to treasury benches. The caste equations did not favour him but he had won one election after another with ease.

In 1962 as well as in

1967, Bihar sent a Marathi to the Lok Sabha. He was from Pune. There have been many other such leaders in the Rajya Sabha, but rarely in the Lok Sabha. Limaye's childhood was spent in Maharashtra. He completed his education from there. But he chose Bihar to contest elections. For the first time, he reached Parliament by winning the election from Munger in 1962. In 1964, the Socialist Party and Praja Socialist Party were merged and the United Socialist Party was formed. Madhu Limaye went to the Lok Sabha for the first time on USP ticket. In 1973, Limaye won the election from Banka in Bihar.

Insider, outsider issue was, fortunately, not raised in other countries like

Mauritius, Trinidad, Guyana, Kenya, Fiji, and Britain. In the caribbean country Guyana, Cheddi Jagan of Indian origin had become President in the 60s. After that, Indians like Shivasagar Ram Gulam (Mauritius), Navin Ram Gulam (Mauritius), Mahendra Chaudhary (Fiji), Vasdev Pandey (Trinidad), S. Ramamathan (Singapore), Rishi Sunak (Britain), Kamala Harris (America) have become Prime Minister, Vice President and President of different countries. Recently, an Indian citizen, Tharman Shanmugaratnam, was elected President of Singapore.

So, we have to come out of castes, language, religion, gender etcetera. It is

because we have members in parliament from Africa to Europe and America and New Zealand. This means that Indians who had gone to far off countries in search of employment are now deciding the fate of those countries.

The list of MPs outside is long. To mention a few, Meva Ramgovind (South Africa), Parminder Singh Marwah (Uganda) and Sonia Virdi (Kenya). Sonia, in fact, is the first Asia-origin woman MP in Kenya. Canada which has many migrants from Punjab and Haryana has also several MPs of Indian origin. Therefore, the only lesson to now learn is, stop insider-outsider debate--without delay.

I always wanted to meet Gouraprasad when I became a cultural administrator in 1990 after joining NBT, but he vanished from public life in early 1990s when new cinema came in Odisha. Our chance meeting was almost accidental.

It was 1991, I was doing a Meet The Author Programme at Bhubaneswar in collaboration with Odisha Sahitya Akademi on the occasion of National Book Week. The authors featured were Ramanakanta Rath, Binapani Mohanty and Haraprasad Das. It was the first ever such programme in Odisha and I was thrilled, my heart was full with tension and anxiety. We were to travel by train only those days from Delhi and the only good train was Neelachal Express. My ticket was on wait-list and it did not confirm.

But I had to go. I boarded the train with full fear and anxiety. No 2nd AC

compartment was there in Neelachal Express, it was First Class only. 4 people were to be in one coupe. I found place in one and sat there. Soon the conductor came and checked the ticket. He had to adjust one of their officers who was travelling to Allahabad. He asked me to de-board or to go to the general compartment, brought his officer and put him on the seat. Suddenly, one of the co-passengers asked the Conductor, "Does this man to whom you have now put here possess a confirmed ticket?" The conductor replied that it is his prerogative to allow or disallow. "No," the co-passenger strongly objected. All others supported him. He brought me from outside the coupe and allowed me to sit on his berth. He said to the Conductor, "This young man has a valid ticket, we all will adjust him as we adjust your officer." So strong and impressive was the voice that the Officer had to advise the conductor to agree to it.

The train was moving. I was grateful to this gentleman, for without his intervention I had no

other way to get down or to go to a general compartment to find a place to stand. I was looking at his face, it looked familiar. The tea vendor came, we took tea. Time passed, we reached Allahabad. The railway Officer got down. We were 5 in the coupe, 4 with confirmed ticket and I, with a unconfirmed one. I was struggling in me to recognize the gentleman. He was looking like Gouraprasad Ghosh. The gentleman was observing me for last few hours. He asked me, "You look to be tense, but why? We all will adjust you. One of us will sleep on the floor. No, this is not the reason. I was just finding similarity of your face with Gouraprasad Ghosh." He asked, "No, I have seen his films." I uttered.

He laughed and laughed. Oh my God, so hearty was the laugh, and so intimate! "Good that there are still some people who can recognize me. I was all those years feeling sad that people have forgotten me. Dear I am Gouraprasad Ghosh." He said.

Like Sarat Pujari, Gouraprasad was matinee idol of my adolescent days. We

discussed many things. I had seen his film 'Kaa', it got a national award. Gouraprasad went to Delhi to sign papers for national telecast of 'Kaa' by Doordarshan. The concerned officer wanted bribe and he was disheartened. Some how, 'Kaa' was nationally telecast.

And, evening came at Mughal Sarai. Gouraprasad ordered for food for all, opened his whisky bottle. We all took our pegs, too. Suddenly, one of our co-passengers (He was in Air Force and was travelling to Kharagpur) started crying. What he narrated was very touching, his wife has an extra marital affairs with his brother and he is not in a position to do anything than to tolerate. Poor fellow, fighting for the country and lost war at home, so painful. He wanted Gouraprasad to make a film on his plight and Gouraprasad agreed to it while consoling him. The Air Force Officer insisted to sleep on the floor and we had no other way than to agree.

We reached Cuttack. Gouraprasad got down. We did not meet again. One day I was at Cuttack, I met Sarada Prasanna Naik, my former colleague at SIET, Bhubaneswar. Sarada

Working On War Footing, 98% Pilots Have Signed New Contract: Vistara CEO



New Delhi, (KCN): Crisis-hit Vistara has said it hopes to stabilise its operations by this weekend, insisting that 98% of its pilots have signed the new contracts with the revised salary structure which had led to several of them calling in sick and causing flight cancellations.

The airline's CEO, Vinod Kannan, also apologised for the inconvenience caused to customers and acknowledged that some pilots have concerns regarding the contract.

"In the light of the recent disruptions in our network owing to various operational reasons, we acknowledge and are deeply concerned about the inconvenience this has caused to our

customers. We would like to again clarify that these disruptions were due to the cascading effect of a multitude of factors... Having said that, we acknowledge the inconvenience this has caused to our customers and sincerely apologise to them for the same," he said in a statement on Saturday.

Claiming that the full-service carrier has adequate crew for normal operations, Mr Kannan said the airline was challenged because it was operating "on a high utilisation".

"We are addressing this on a war footing. Hence, we are continuing to hire more pilots and are also carefully scaling back our operations slightly to provide much-needed resilience, and a buffer

in the rosters," the CEO said.

On the customer front, he said, "We have also deployed larger aircraft like our B787-9 Dreamliner and A321neo aircraft on select domestic routes to accommodate more customers, wherever possible. Furthermore, we are reaching out to all customers affected by the delays and cancellations over the last weekend, to offer relevant refunds and compensation."

Mr Kannan claimed that the airline's on-time performance has improved in the past three days and said that it hoped to stabilise its operations for the rest of April by this weekend.

"With reference to concerns being raised

regarding the new pay structure of our pilots, we would like to clarify that over 98% of pilots have signed the new contract. Having said that, we are aware that some pilots have some concerns and queries regarding the contract. We are engaging with them to clarify and resolve the same. However, this has not caused any visible spike in attrition amongst pilots," the CEO said.

The revised salary structure ahead of the airline's merger with Air India - both brands are under the Tata stable - has also caused consternation among the pilots. Under the new structure, salaries of junior co-pilots will go down from ₹2.35 lakh per month to ₹1.88 lakh because they will be mandated to fly only 40 hours instead of the earlier 70.

SLC pulls Hasaranga out of IPL 2024, writes to BCCI about his unavailability

According to sources familiar with the situation, SLC has written to the BCCI stating that the 26-year-old has to undergo rehabilitation and rest to heal his left ankle and will not be available for the season. He is believed to have been advised precautionary rest by an expert in Dubai whom he consulted a few days back. "I believe so," the player's manager, Shyam, told Cricbuzz. "Sri Lanka



Cricket has written to the BCCI informing them about his unavailability. He went to Dubai for medical advice and stayed there for three days. Given the current situation, the expert's advice is that he should rest rather than participate in the IPL this season." A few days ago, the manager told this website that Hasaranga would definitely show up for

SRH. Hasaranga's withdrawal raises some obvious questions about foreign players registering for the auction and pulling out later for inexplicable reasons. In this case, the SLC, which has authorised his withdrawal, had picked him for a Test series in Bangladesh which started on the very day the IPL had kicked off - on March 22.

Curiously, had Hasaranga not been plucked out of retirement and picked for the Test side, he would have been unable to lead Sri Lanka in the first four games of the T20 World Cup in June due to disciplinary action by the ICC. As previously written by this website there is a perception in the IPL that some foreign players skip the league if they don't get a good price in the auction. Hasaranga's previous price was INR 10.75 crores and after RCB had released him, his auction price plummeted to the base price of INR 1.5 crores at which SRH had purchased for this season. 
