National Institute of Technology (NIT), Tiruchirappalli is the only non-IIT in the top ten list. Among management colleges, the Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Ahmedabad has retained its top spot, followed by IIM Bangalore and IIM Kozhikode. Two IITs — Bombay and Delhi — have also figured in the top ten list for management courses. In pharmacy, Jamia Hamdard rose to the top spot from its second position last year while

the National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research, Hyderabad slipped to the second rank. BITS Pilani has retained its third position in the category. Delhi University's Hindu College and Miranda House have switched positions in the colleges category with the former bagging the top spot. St Stephen's College is in the third position among colleges.

Similarly for law, the National Law School of India University, Bengaluru followed by the National Law University, Delhi and NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad have retained first, second and third spots

respectively. For Architecture and Planning, IIT Roorkee has been announced as the best, followed by IIT Kharagpur and NIT Calicut.

Among medical colleges, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi has bagged the top position followed by PGIMER, Chandigarh and CMC Vellore at second and third spot.

Among the dental colleges, Saveetha Institute of Medical And Technical Sciences, Chennai and Manipal College of Dental Sciences retained the top two positions while the third rank has been bagged by Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences, New Delhi.

For research, IISc Bengaluru has been acknowledged as the best followed by IIT Madras and IIT Delhi at second and third spot.

In a newly introduced category for state public universities, Anna University in Chennai has bagged the top spot, followed by Jadavpur University in Kolkata and Savitribai Phule University, Pune.

## No landless in the State after 5 years: Odisha Revenue Minister

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** There would be no landless people left in Odisha after five years, said Revenue Minister Suresh Pujari on Monday. While replying to the queries of media persons, Minister Pujari said his government won't stop after providing land pattas to the landless and homeless people. Rather, they would be provided a complete package like a pucca house under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, toilets under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, clean drinking water under Ghar Ghar Nal Ghar Ghar Jal



programme, gas cylinders under Ujjwala Yojana and electricity.

"The beneficiaries have been divided into three categories. We will provide land patta measuring four decimals to all the landless rural poor beneficiaries whose annual income is below Rs 1 lakh. Those who are living on government land will be given four

decimals of the same land, provided it shouldn't be a disputed land. In case of a disputed one, they will be given four decimals of land at a nearby undisputed land," said the Minister. "Similarly, we have also started a programme to identify those poor landless people who are living in urban slums and give possession certificates to them. The possession certificate is being given by the Municipal Corporations. Our efforts are underway to put the Revenue Department's seal on them," he said.

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** The IIT-Bhubaneswar claimed to have developed a technology to accurately predict rainfall, particularly in cases of downpours, with an adequate lead time.

Between June 13 and 17, 2023, Assam experienced severe flooding due to heavy rainfall. ## Kolkata doctor's rape-murder case: Cease work on, Mamata vows CBI probe if police fail to crack case by Sunday



**Kolkata(KCN):** West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee vowed to transfer the alleged rape and murder case of a woman physician inside a Kolkata hospital to the CBI if the police failed to solve it by Sunday, amid public outrage.

Supporting the cease work by junior doctors at that hospital, interns and postgraduate trainees at other state-run medical establishments across the state vowed to continue their agitation, now in its fourth day, until the culprits are brought to justice.

Banerjee's promise, however, did not placate the protesting students, who criticized the chief minister for setting a seven-day deadline to address the alleged rape and murder of a fellow doctor. They demanded a judicial inquiry, capital punishment for the culprits, adequate compensation for the victim's family and stronger security measures at hospitals.

A two-member team of the National Commission for Women (NCW) this afternoon arrived in Kolkata and is scheduled to meet city Police Commissioner Vineet Goyal and the family members of the victim.

The body of the woman post-graduate trainee, who was allegedly raped and murdered inside a seminar hall of RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, was found on Friday morning. Junior doctors began a cease work from the evening that day. A civic volunteer was arrested on Saturday in connection with the case and was sent to 14-day police custody. At least three Public Interest Litigations (PILs) were also filed before the Calcutta High Court, demanding that the investigation be transferred to the CBI. A division bench,

agency's effectiveness. She also emphasized the need for the case to be tried in a fast-track court, underscoring the severity of the crime.

"I have told the police that if there is any such doubt against anyone — the victim's friends and others — should be questioned," she said. The police commissioner, who accompanied Banerjee to the victim's residence, assured the public that the investigation was proceeding with all due urgency.

"All those who were near the place of occurrence and have a connection or involvement are being called and will be summoned if they haven't been yet. We are certain that if there are other culprits, they will be arrested within the next four to five days," he said. A two-member team of NCW met senior police officials at the Kolkata Police Headquarters and discussed the situation.

## 22 Killed Due To Heavy Rain In Rajasthan, Heavy Waterlogging In Bengaluru

**New Delhi/Jaipur (KCN):** Eight people were killed in Rajasthan, roads were blocked and normal life was brought to a halt in different parts of the country on Monday as rain wreaked havoc.

Heavy rainfall has created a flood-like situation in Karauli and Hindaun of Rajasthan, where 22 people died during the past two days in rain-related incidents while overflowing dams and rivers continued to paralyse daily life. Disaster relief forces have rescued about 100 people in Karauli and Hindaun. Schools remained shut in Jaipur, Sawai Madhopur,

Bharatpur, Dausa and Karauli districts following predictions of heavy rainfall.

"A flood-like situation has risen in Karauli and Hindaun town and National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) teams have evacuated about 100 people," disaster management department joint secretary Bhagwat Singh said.

The bodies of five people who were swept away in Jaipur's Kanota dam on Sunday evening were pulled out. However, two more people drowned while taking a bath in the Galta Kund.

A 30-year-old man in Dausa was also killed on Monday after being washed away in the Moroli dam, officials said.

In Bengaluru, peak-hour traffic jams and inundated roads in several areas, especially in the northern and eastern parts, particularly inconvenienced officegoers and schoolchildren.

Areas such as Outer Ring Road between Nagawara Junction and Hebbal, and Veerasandra on the Electronics City Road, parts of Hosur Road and Bannerghatta Road, were severely affected, official sources said.



Heavy waterlogging was witnessed in Marathalli, Karthik Nagar and Kalyan Nagar, Puttenahalli, Varthur Kodi, Panathur Main Road, among others. Some houses and

residential layouts in low-lying areas were affected by waterlogging and water gushing into the premises, officials said. Several underpasses were also inundated. Deputy Chief Minister

weather station, recorded 12.9 mm rainfall. The Lodi Road observatory recorded 13.6 mm rainfall, Palam 10.5 mm and Najafgarh 30 mm between 11.30 am and 5.30 pm, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said. A public works department official said 10 complaints were received regarding waterlogging but most had been resolved.

Waterlogging at Mundka affected traffic on both carriageways of Rohtak from Tikri Border to Peeragarhi. The Delhi Police urged commuters travelling from Bahadurgarh to Peeragarhi to take Harodha-Najafgarh route

or UER-II and then Najafgarh-Nangloi Road to reach Peeragarhi.

Traffic was also affected at MB Road due to waterlogging.

In Himachal Pradesh, the State Emergency Operation Centre said 66 roads were closed in Shimla, 58 in Sirmaur, 33 in Mandi, 26 in Kullu, five in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti each and four in Kangra district. It added that 221 power and 143 water supply schemes were also disrupted on Monday.

At least 110 people have been killed in rain-related incidents and the state suffered losses of about ₹ 1,004 crore between June 27 and August 12, officials said.

## Training programme for Odisha MLAs on August 17-18; JP Nadda to share insights



**Bhubaneswar (KCN):** Around 60 first-time MLAs in the first government of BJP in Odisha will receive training on what should be their roles and how they will face a strong Opposition like BJD. The training workshop for the MLAs in the Odisha Legislative Assembly will be held on August 17 and 18. While Union Ministers Dharmendra Pradhan and Jual Oram impart training on August 17, Union Health Minister JP Nadda will share key

points with the participants on August 18. Minister Nadda will teach the first-time MLAs about what should be their roles in the House, how to counter the Opposition, how to give importance to local issues and what should be their behaviour in the House. The Union Minister will also give tips to other legislators including those of the Opposition BJD party on House management and rules relating to the Assembly. "An orientation

programme for MLAs in Odisha Assembly is going to be held on August 17 and 18. Union Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju, Health Minister JP Nadda and some senior MLAs of Odisha Assembly will take part in the programme," said Mukesh Mahaling, Odisha Parliamentary Affairs Minister.

"They may discuss topics like the requirement of the Centre, the party's organisation here and how better services can be provided to people with the coordination between the state and the Centre. They may also discuss about the Rajya Sabha seat," said Sukant Panigrahi, BJP MLA.

## Naveen Patnaik urges continued Central support for UNESCO Kalinga Prize

**Bhubaneswar (KCN):** Former Odisha Chief Minister and Leader of Opposition in the Assembly, Naveen Patnaik has urged Union Minister for Science & Technology, Jitendra Singh to continue supporting the UNESCO Kalinga Prize, an international award given to individuals for contributions towards the popularisation of Science.

Patnaik on Monday wrote a letter to the Union Minister seeking his intervention for the continuation of the Central government's support for the award. Notably, the Central government has recently informed the Kalinga Foundation Trust through email that various awards instituted by science ministries/ departments and their autonomous institutes are being rationalised.

Therefore, it will not be possible to support the coveted prize in its present form. "UNESCO Kalinga Prize is one of the prestigious international awards in the



field of Science. It was instituted by the legendary Biju Patnaik and, since its inception in 1952, has so far been awarded to 72 great scientists including 7 Nobel laureates, such as Louis de Broglie, Julian Huxley, Bertrand Russel, Karl von Frisch, Arthur C. Clarke, Fred Hoyle and Sergei Kapitza among others," wrote Patnaik in the letter shared on X. He further mentioned that the UNESCO Kalinga prize was made possible with a generous grant of 1000 pounds to Unesco, Paris, from Kalinga Foundation Trust in the year 1951 of which 'Biju Babu' (Biju Patnaik) was the Founder President. Patnaik asserted that UNESCO Kalinga Prize is the only international award from India in the

field of popularisation of Science. Patnaik also stated that this award has been a highly coveted prize and has also become a symbol of Odia identity at the international level over the years.

The veteran leader noted that it was decided when Atal Bihari Vajpayee was the Prime Minister in 2002 that the Department of Science and Technology, the Government of India, Odisha government and Kalinga Foundation Trust will act as the Partners/ Donors for the prize and share the expenses of UNESCO Kalinga Prize in the ratio of 6:4:4.

"However, I am now pained to learn that the Ministry of Science & Technology has decided to stop supporting this Prize. The 'Kalinga

## Manoj Prabhakar-Sultan of Reverse Swing & Gusty batter



When Brene Brown, American author, and podcast host wrote these lines, she may have Manoj Prabhakar in mind, "Creativity, which is the expression of our originality, helps us stay mindful that what we bring to the world is completely original and cannot be compared." Manoj Prabhakar was the man who evolved the art of reverse swing bowling in Indian Cricket. He is the original Sultan of Reverse Swing to be seen on the horizon willow game in the country. Besides the originator of the Reverse Swing, there were plenty of his achievements which should have secured him in the fond recesses of cricketing memories. The phenomenon of reverse swing tends to happen when the ball gets older. Reverse swing is often seen as a new phenomenon in cricket. In fact, it has been a part of the game for over five decades, but it's only hit the headlines in the relatively recent past. A reverse swing occurs

when the ball moves in the same direction as the smooth or shiny side. This is contrary to conventional swing where the ball moves in the opposite direction. To give the ball the best chance of swinging later in the innings, bowlers must continue to polish one side. The phenomenon of reverse swing tends to happen when the ball gets older. The man who is largely credited with inventing reverse swing is the former Pakistani bowler Salim Mir who briefly played domestic cricket in the late 1960s and 1970s. Pakistani fast bowler Sarfraz Nawaz is said to have pioneered the technique from that point onwards.

A reverse swing is an occurrence which can get that ball to move as it gets older. It was first pioneered in Pakistan in the early 1970s. Imran Khan used it sparsely, while Wasim Akram and Waqar Younis helped it to become more widely known in the 1980s and beyond.

In recent times, fast bowlers have struggled to extract reverse swing for reasons beyond their control. However, Manoj Prabhakar claims "Can't make the

ball," known for his ways and means to make the ball swing menacingly. He has provided stature and standing to the reverse swing and says, "Reverse swing is an art, a combination of science and skills." Prabhakar advises the bowlers to be more accurate when exploring ways to get the batsman out. "You have to bowl a decent length, and of course, the line becomes important once you see the form of the batsman. If you bowl on a spot that irritates the batsman, you have won the battle. Reverse swing is not the only method to get the batsman out. You should be able to control your swing and possibly develop a good yorker."

Manoj Prabhakar was a regular in the Indian side in the early 1990s. Bowling was his strongest suit; swung the ball prodigiously both into the batsman and away, mixing things up with deceptive slower balls in between and on his day he could be a formidable with the new ball. He once bowled Kepler Wessels for duck in consecutive Tests (only ducks in Wessels scorecard). Prabhakar made his debut as a useful lower-

order batsman and later promoted to open the innings against England in 1992-93. During his stint, India won only one of Prabhakar's first 23 Tests, then 10 of his last 16. He played 39 Tests for India and in 21 of them, he opened together the batting and the bowling. He has distinction to be the first Indian to perform the feat of opening both batting and bowling on his debut. During India

England 1984-85 Delhi Test, after he had put in a ravenous effort as the lower order batter in the first innings, regular opener Anshuman Gaekwad suffered an ankle injury, opening gate for Prabhakar to open with skipper Sunil Gavaskar when India batted a second time. Iqbal Siddiqui is the only other Indian player to have started proceedings with the bat and the ball on debut in his only Test. Siddiqui hit the winning runs in his only ever Test match to

date, a record he shares with Australian player Jeff Moss. While scanning through record books for those both opening batting and bowling reveals horde of names like Vinoo Mankad, Pankaj Roy, ML Jaisinha, Rusi Surti, Abid Ali, Budhi Kunderan, Eknath Solkar, Sunil Gavaskar, Mohinder Amarnath, Dilip Vengsarkar, Arun Lal, Iqbal Siddiqui, Sanjay Bangar, Irfan Pathan and Virender Sehwag

Manoj Prabhakar played 39 Tests for India. In 21 of them he opened both the batting and the bowling. In spite of the cricket world being graced time and again by the likes of Mudassar Nazar and Trevor Bailey, it remains an all-time record for such versatility. But his adieu from international cricket ended in ignominy when he was hit all over the park at Delhi's Ferozeshah Kotla

against Sri Lanka in the 1995-96 World Cup. It led to his axing and subsequent retirement from Indian cricket.

Manoj Prabhakar was a gutsy batsman who had a nasty blow on his nose from the Windies pacer Courtney Walsh at Mohali in 1994-95. He batted from top to lower middle order and as a bowler cultivated the art of prodigiously swinging the ball.

He was a creative bowler who defined the face of Indian bowling in the nineties. He opened both the batting and bowling for India in a record 21 Tests. Despite everything, Prabhakar is remembered for the wrong reasons. The inside story of match-fixing involving a superstar of Indian cricket remains a secret between the scribe and Manoj to be told on another day. Manoj Prabhakar's momentous contribution has been well summed up in the words of HW Janson, Russian Empire-born German-American professor of History of Art book, "Originality is what distinguishes art from craft. It is the yardstick of artistic greatness."

## Sheikh Hasina's Stay In India Will Not Hurt Ties: Bangladesh Government Adviser



Dhaka: A key adviser of Bangladesh's interim government on Monday said that deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina's extended stay in India will not hurt bilateral relations and Dhaka will always try to maintain good relations with New Delhi.

Foreign Affairs Adviser Md Touhid Hossain made the remarks when asked whether bilateral ties with India would be affected if Ms Hasina's stay in India gets prolonged.

"This is a hypothetical question. If someone stays in a country why the relations with that particular country would be affected? There is no reason for that," he said, emphasising that bilateral relations are a big matter. Ms Hasina, 76, resigned and fled to India last week following widespread protests against her government over a controversial quota system in jobs.

Mr Hossain said bilateral relations are a relation of interest and friendship is also of interest. "Friendship does not exist if the interest is hurt." He said the two sides - Bangladesh and India - have interests and they will follow those interests. Mr Hossain said the relationship between the two countries "is not influenced by the presence of one individual in a country" while "India has its interests, and Bangladesh has its interests".

The adviser said they will "always try to maintain

good relations" with India.

Earlier, he briefed the diplomats stationed in Dhaka, including Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Pranay Verma, on the situation in Bangladesh and sought their support.

"We believe that all our friends and partners in the international community would continue to support the interim government and the people of Bangladesh as they work towards a new future. The adviser informed the diplomats that the government has taken quick and decisive measures to restore law and order and bring back normalcy across the country.

Representatives from all diplomatic missions in Dhaka, including UN agencies, attended the briefing while they inquired about security measures, the Rohingya issue, and the current situation.

"We can assure that the safety and security of the diplomatic and consular premises and persons will remain one of our core priorities," Hossain said, adding the interim

government remained sensitized to the need to ensure the protection of all foreign citizens.

Mr Hossain said that the government would remain focused on a smooth transition to "inclusive and pluralistic electoral democracy as soon as possible".

During his first press briefing at the foreign ministry on Sunday, Mr Hossain was asked about the possibility of bringing home Ms Hasina. He replied that the matter falls under the jurisdiction of the law ministry while his office would respond only if that ministry makes any such request.

"Our policy is to maintain good relations with all countries while protecting our national interests," said Mr Hossain, whose position is equivalent to a minister's.

"We intend to maintain smooth and positive relations with all ... including India and China," said Hossain, who previously served as a deputy high commissioner to India. When asked about the interim government's approach towards India, Mr Hossain said both countries share a strong and deep bond.

"(But) it is important that people feel India is a good friend of Bangladesh...We want that, we want to advance the (Dhaka-Delhi) relation towards that direction," he said.

## Army Soldier Stripped, Assaulted In Police Custody In Rajasthan, Probe Ordered: Cops



Jaipur: An army soldier was stripped and assaulted in police custody here, Rajasthan minister Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore said on Monday after he visited the Shipra Path police station where he rebuked the cops over the alleged incident and raised the matter with the Director General of Police.

A sub-inspector and three constables have been shunted out and an inquiry has been ordered, DGP U R Sahoo told PTI.

The DGP said that the police had raided an illegal hookah bar the previous night where they arrested some people and the soldier was among them.

"One sub-inspector and three constables have been

shunted to police lines by the Jaipur police commissioner and an inquiry has been ordered," the DGP said.

Rajasthan's Sainik Kalyan minister Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore, who has served in the Army, reached the police station and questioned the conduct of the cops.

"A very sad incident came to my knowledge where a

great sadness and it shows the disgusting mentality of those two-three persons who did this," he said and expressed confidence that Rajasthan Police will take strict action against such elements.

"It is written in the medical report that he was assaulted by people. An Indian army soldier has been caught and beaten up by five police personnel, that too without any reason. So strict action is necessary against those who are breaking the law in the police department," he said.

Mr Rathore said he spoke to the Director General of Police who assured him of action.

# Situation dire for elephants in state despite rise in population

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):**

Although there has been an increase in the elephant population in Odisha, the state still accounts for many jumbo deaths years on. According to the All Odisha Elephant Census, 2024, pachyderm population in the state went up to 2,098 – an increase of 122 in the last seven years. However, as per reports, the state lost at least 27 elephants in three and half months – between April 1 and July 15 – this year due to a host of reasons, like electrocution, animal-human conflict and train hit, among others.

According to the data presented in the Parliament, elephant deaths were reported from 15 forest and wildlife divisions this year, with Angul witnessing the

maximum fatalities of four jumbos during the period. Not just elephant deaths, as many as 1,701 humans in 16 states were killed by elephants from 2020-21 to 2023-24, and Odisha had recorded 148 such deaths in 2022-23 – the highest for the year in India, according to the data presented in the Parliament by the Union Environment ministry. Sangita Iyer, wildlife filmmaker and founder of Voices for Asian Elephants (VFAE) – an elephant conservation organisation that works for the safety of elephants in Odisha – said that the situation is very dire for elephants in the state despite a 6 per cent rise in their population. "Electrocution accounts for the maximum number of elephant deaths in Odisha. Poachers are still



using high-voltage power supply to kill elephants," she said. Iyer said to prevent human-elephant conflicts, VFAE, a California-based elephant conservation organisation, has planted over 50,000 fruit trees and dug seven large watering holes in

partnership with local conservation group 'Paribartan' in Balasore and Angul districts that can support around 210 elephants. Distressed elephants are entering villages for food and water by crossing major highways. This is

intensifying human-elephant conflict and has caused a staggering number of elephant deaths, she said.

"Restoring degraded habitats with favoured elephant plant species and creating waterholes in their habitats can

prevent them from crossing treacherous roads," she added. "Elephants are our protectors. If we can't protect them it will hamper our civilization. On 'World Elephant Day' all stakeholders must work together, accept mistakes, and try to find solutions before it's too late," she added. Talking to Susanta Nanda, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF), said that despite the rise in elephant numbers, Odisha doesn't have the space required to accommodate a large jumbo population. "Anything between 1,700 and 1,800 jumbos is our capacity. Population management is necessary, otherwise the deaths and human-animal conflict will continue," he said. Nanda said elephant deaths during the last five years have been within the range of 3-4.5% of the total population. "Death of elephants is a concern for us and we are taking measures to control it. We are planning to use Artificial intelligence (AI) to detect elephant movement. The trials will be conducted soon in Angul and Dhenkanal," he added.

## Hirakud Dam-Affected Families to Get 10 Decimals of Land: Minister Suresh Pujari

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** The Odisha government is set to address the longstanding demand of those displaced by the Hirakud Dam on the Mahanadi River in Sambalpur district. The government will allocate 10 decimals of land to each displaced family announced state Revenue Minister Suresh Pujari on Sunday.

Minister Pujari stated that by December 31 of this year, the displaced will receive land leases for 10 decimals per family as part of the Hirakud E m b a n k m e n t Scheme. Notably, families who relinquished their land and livelihoods due to the Hirakud dam project have sought rehabilitation for over seventy years. So



far, only 4,400 of the affected families have received loans while the dam on the river led to the submergence of 46 villages, with the displaced inhabitants resettled in 32 new villages.

Previously, in response to

the initiatives of West Odisha MLAs, Speaker Surya Narayan Patra recommended that the Revenue Minister convene a meeting with officials to address the concerns of those residing near the Hirakud

Dam. Meanwhile, the minister also assured that all homeless families will be provided housing and land leases under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) within three years.

## Odisha's first road tunnel nears completion, likely to be instrumental in Koraput & Nabarangpur's economic growth

**BHUBANESWAR(KCN):** Construction of Odisha's first road tunnel is in full swing. Twin tunnels are being built in Koraput district under Bharatmala Pariyojana of the Union government that will connect Raipur and Visakhapatnam.

As per sources, the project is expected to be completed by 2025. According to experts, the project will not only bring a thrilling experience for the tourists, but it will also play a great role in the economic development of Koraput and Nabarangpur districts. The twin tunnels are being built near Sunki ghat of Koraput district which is located 3,000 ft above sea level. While the length of one tunnel will be 3.42km, the other tunnel will stretch up to 2.8 km. One of the tunnels will connect Odisha to Andhra Pradesh. It will start from Sunki and end at Kandili. The other one will be in the opposite direction as it will start from Kurali and end at Amphavalli village. The work of the twin tunnels started in 2022 and it is expected to



be completed by next year.

Local residents are excited about the development as the road tunnel will further enhance the existing aesthetic beauty of Koraput.

"After the completion of the road tunnel, communication facilities will be improved in the area. In addition, the tourism potential of the area will also be enhanced," said Sheikh Ibrahim, a member of Koraput Vikash Parishad. "The customers will be greatly benefitted after the completion of the road tunnel as the transportation cost of the products will decrease," said T Kiran Kumar, a

businessman.

The six-lane road with 465 km of length from Raipur to Visakhapatnam is being built with an expenditure of Rs 16,000 crore. Its width will be 35 meters and 60 metres in forest and non-forest areas respectively.

# Test cricket the loser as pitch, weather win in Trinidad

**New Delhi:** If you want a snapshot of the Trinidad Test - without having to wade through all the empty hours of rain and the futile attempts to play live cricket on a dead pitch - you could do worse than revisit the events of the 28th over of South Africa's second innings on Sunday.

Tristan Stubbs torqued the first of them to deep midwicket for two runs and with that his first-half century in his fourth innings. As Jomel Warrican shuffled in with the next ball, Stubbs recast himself, momentarily, as a left-hander and essayed an arcing four over backward point. With Warrican's next effort, Stubbs tried to repeat the midwicket treatment, but the ball evaded his stroke and hit him on the pads. He was clearly outside the line of off stump when he was struck.

Ahsan Raza said not out, and even the appealing West Indians wouldn't have disagreed. So Kraigg Brathwaite's decision to send the call upstairs wasn't about taking a wicket. It was about buying time. As Joshua da Silva said loudly enough for all present, including the stump microphone, to hear: "The rain is coming soon."

South Africa were 282 in front. India chased 403 to win at Queen's Park Oval in April 1976. But they had Sunil Gavaskar, who scored 102, and his brother-in-law of not quite two years, Gundappa Viswanath, who made 112. In the 35 Tests at this ground since, only once have a team made as many runs in the fourth innings to win as South Africa were ahead when Brathwaite referred frivolously - in February 1998, when Brian Lara's team scored 282/7 to beat Michael Atherton's side.

The responsibility for bringing urgency to Sunday's play was South Africa's. This they knew. Consequently their runrate on the day, 5.95, was almost three runs faster than the 3.03 they reached in their first innings. Stubbs was central to that happening.

The human spaniel puppy needed no second bidding to impose himself on a situation designed with him front of mind. Stubbs hunted down his 50 off 42 balls, and scored 22 of his runs in fours and sixes; a bustling performance bursting with the ambition of youth - he turns 24 on Wednesday. Stubbs' innovative innings was ended by a delivery from Kemar Roach that didn't get up. It evaded the South African's muscular smear to midwicket and uprooted his leg stump. With that his partner, Temba Bavuma, turned on his heel and informed

Richard Kettleborough the innings was over. West Indies would need 298 to win - more than any team have scored in the fourth innings at Queen's Park Oval since Pakistan held on at 341/9, in search of 372, in April 1988.

Bavuma's hurry to get on with things and stay ahead of the rain was apparent from the fact that he did not change his shirt between innings: when he returned to the field the sweat he earned by his endeavour at the batting crease was amply visible.

Keshav Maharaj, who had faced fewer deliveries than his three on Sunday only six times. But it was also true that, since 2002, no opener has been dismissed in the first over more often than Brathwaite's dozen times. Six balls later Keacy Carty edged Kagiso Rabada into the ground and almost onto his stumps. In Rabada's next over only umpire's call - Kettleborough's - brought Carty a reprieve from being dismissed leg-before five minutes before the scheduled break for lunch. That was followed by the promised

rain, which halted play for 65 minutes.

Mikyle Louis skied Rabada to midwicket 4.3 overs after the resumption. Another 8.5 overs after that, Maharaj had Carty taken low in the covers by Wiaan Mulder. West Indies were three down with 234 needed, and theoretically 46.1 overs were left in that match. Was South Africa's moment finally at hand, despite everything the weather and the surface had slung into their path? Maharaj asked the question for four more of his overs before taking a break. For the first time in the 116.5 overs they had faced in the match, the West Indians didn't have the left-arm spinner wheeling in from one end. He would be back after a respite of five overs, but by then it hardly mattered. The match had slipped away, as a contest and as something worth watching. That wasn't

New Zealand have also brought back off-spinner

Michael Bracewell who spent the last year and a half on the sidelines with Achilles and finger injuries. Bracewell joins up with Mitchell Santner, Ajaz Patel and Rachin Ravindra - all left-arm spinners - and off-spinner Glenn Phillips.

"It's always great when young guys force their way into squads through performance and I know Will and Ben are

really looking forward to the challenges of Test cricket in the sub-continent," New Zealand head coach Gary Stead said.

"Michael's had to show plenty of resilience to rehabilitate his injuries and force his way back into the BLACK CAPS across all three formats. His all-round skills, and ability to take the ball away from the left-hander make him a great asset, especially on what we expect will be turning wickets in India and Sri Lanka," Stead added.

New Zealand have all their best batters in place ahead of a busy period of Test cricket. After the two series in September, they play three Tests against India in the subcontinent across October and November before heading back and commencing their home

summer by hosting England for three Tests. With so much Test cricket to play in gruelling away conditions, Stead talked up workload management, including for his captain Tim Southee who may not feature in all the games. Kyle Jamieson, meanwhile, was not considered for selection as he continues his rehabilitation from a back injury. "Test tours to the sub-continent can ask some really tough questions of pace bowlers due to the nature of the pitches and the heat and humidity. While we're going over with an open mind around conditions, there is an understanding that all our bowling options may be needed across the different Tests. Tim and I have discussed this, and the need during these overseas tours to balance the work-loads of the pace-bowlers, including himself, to ensure the team is best served," Stead said.

## Paris Games closes out with star-studded show, Olympic flag passed to Los Angeles



**New Delhi:** Paris closed out two and a half extraordinary weeks of Olympic sports and emotion with a boisterous, star-studded show in France's national stadium, handing over hosting duties for the Summer Games to the next city in line: Los Angeles in 2028. Californian music icons Billie Eilish, Red Hot Chili Peppers, and Snoop Dogg performed for thousands of fans on Sunday as Paris closed the Summer Games that revitalized the Olympics, with the baton being passed to Los Angeles and Hollywood's dazzling IOC President Thomas Bach, joined by athletes and French swimmer Leon Marchand, extinguished the Olympic flame before officially declaring the 33rd Summer Games closed. The closing ceremony commenced with French

swimming sensation Léon Marchand collecting the Olympic flame in a lantern from the gardens overlooking the Louvre, beginning its journey to the stadium on the outskirts of Paris. Shortly after, flagbearers from each of the 205 Olympic delegations paraded into the stadium, led by French rugby star Antoine Dupont. Thousands of athletes followed, entering to rapturous applause and an energetic soundtrack. In contrast to the 2021 Tokyo Games, which were delayed by the COVID-19 pandemic and held without spectators, the atmosphere at the Paris

arena was one of unbridled celebration. Over 70,000 spectators joined athletes in singing along to Queen's anthem "We Are the Champions." French athletes crowd-surfed, while U.S. team members enthusiastically jumped up and down in their Ralph Lauren jackets. As per tradition, the medal ceremony for the women's marathon was followed by the playing of Greece's national anthem, honoring the country that hosted the first modern Olympics in 1896. Over 280 artists then filled the stadium, which was transformed into a globe representing all seven continents.

**Dhaka:** The Bangladesh Cricket Board on Sunday included Taskin Ahmed in the 15-player squad for the upcoming two-match Test series against Pakistan, scheduled to begin in Rawalpindi on August 21. Taskin, who had last played a Test in June 2023, had taken a break from red-ball cricket to prioritise his recovery following his shoulder injury, and recently desired to play red-ball cricket. The BCB insisted he can manage to play longer-version cricket.
