

Supreme Court Takes Up Doctor's Rape-Murder Case, To Hear Matter On Tuesday

New Delhi(KCN): The Supreme Court, on its own, has taken up the rape-murder case of the Kolkata doctor that has shocked the country and thrown the medical fraternity in a turmoil. A three-judge bench led by Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud will hear the matter on Tuesday.

The case is already being heard by the Calcutta High Court, which, during a hearing last week, ordered that the probe be transferred to the Central Bureau of Investigation or CBI, overriding Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's Sunday ultimatum to the state police. If the police were unable to solve the case by Sunday, the CBI will take over, she had said.

The case went to the High Court after the



woman's parents, and a few others, unhappy with the police investigation, filed an appeal. The court made its displeasure with the police and the administration clear. Questions have been raised against the police handling of the case since the beginning -- including the delay in allowing the women's parents to see the body, the postmortem report, and the prompt arrest of a civic volunteer, making it an open and shut case. On and off the record,

doctors have commented that the extent of the woman's injuries indicate the involvement of more than one attacker. There have also been reports that the police cremated the body in a hurry, which the Kolkata Police have denied. The state's Opposition BJP has been alleging that the police is involved in a massive cover-up to protect the guilty. Their allegation got a boost after a midnight attack on the hospital on August

15, as the statewide women's "Reclaim the Night" demonstration was on. With the attackers wrecking the emergency department, the BJP said it was another attempt at obliterating evidence. In a social media post today, Leader of the Opposition Suvendu Adhikari claimed that the viscera of the doctor was "changed" by the Kolkata Police. He also alleged tampering of other evidence. The 31-year-old doctor was murdered early on the morning of August 9. After a 36-hour shift, the second-year postgrad had gone to an

empty seminar room alone on Thursday night to get some rest. The hospital has no on-call room. Apparently she had dropped off to sleep there. Her partially clothed body, bearing multiple injuries, was found there the next morning. The prime suspect is Sanjoy Roy, a civic volunteer with Kolkata Police who was stationed at the police outpost at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital and had access to all departments. He was arrested on basis of CCTV footage that showed him entering the building where the doctor was found murdered. A Bluetooth headset found next to the woman's body was seen on his neck in the CCTV footage. It was found to be paired with his phone as well.

Lightning strikes in Odisha claim six more lives; CM Majhi announces ex-gratia

Bhubaneswar(KCN): At least six people were killed and many injured in separate lightning strike incidents in five different districts of Odisha on Sunday. Expressing deep sorrow over the lightning-related deaths in the state, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi announced ex-gratia of Rs 4 lakh (each) for family of the victims. As per the information received so far, two people have died in Kendrapada, while one death each took place in Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur and Sonepur districts during the day. The Chief Minister wished the injured a speedy recovery and said that the state government would bear the expenses for the treatment of the injured persons. The new casualties occurred a day following the deaths of nine individuals due to lightning strikes across Odisha. The Chief Minister had announced an ex gratia of Rs 4 lakh for each of the deceased's next of kin.

SIM box racket: Odisha Police gets five-day remand of accused



Speaking to reporters, Bhubaneswar DCP Prateek Singh said, "We requested a 14-day remand for Raju Mandal, but the court granted five days."

During questioning, Mandal allegedly revealed that he was operating SIM boxes from multiple locations in the city, including another site in Cuttack, which police will investigate.

"We are reaching out to his family to learn more about his background and

whether he had any accomplices," Singh said, adding, "Our primary focus is determining whether the SIM boxes were used for cybercrime, terrorist activities, or to create fake telephone exchanges."

A special team has been formed to investigate the SIM cards used by Mandal. Police plan to coordinate with West Bengal police and send a team to Mandal's hometown for more information.

"Mandal used to run the show on behalf of a Bangladeshi national identified as Asadur Jaman from a leased property in Bhubaneswar, ensuring the functionality of UPS, internet and other services," police commissioner of Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Commissionerate Sanjeeb Panda said Saturday.

Four die as fear of unknown disease grips Odisha's Rayagada

Rayagada / Chandrapur(KCN):

Fear of an unknown disease has gripped the Rayagada district after four persons died within a span of just 10 days at Jubagudi village of Hanumanapura panchayat under Chandrapur block in Rayagada district.

The deceased were identified as Rajendra Dibaka, Anumal Dibaka, Nilu Dibaka and Dharmi Dibaka in the village. Meanwhile, eight persons have reportedly been afflicted with the disease by Saturday.

The patients first

experienced diarrhoea and vomiting and then small nodes or lumps developed on their bodies resulting in death, villagers said. The sudden death of four persons has sparked panic and scare among the villagers with the numbers of affected persons increasing in the village.

On being informed, a medical team rushed to

the village and started treatment of the affected persons. Apart from water samples, the team also collected the faecal samples of the affected persons for examination, the Chief District Medical Officer (CDMO) Dr Lal Mohan Routray said. Jubagudi village is situated at about 27 km distance from Chandrapur block. Over 100 families including 19 tribal households reside in the village. However, scare of the unknown disease has gripped the village for the last few days.

A villager Rajendra Dibaka was the first person to get affected.

He experienced diarrhoea and vomiting and later developed lumps on his body.

He was admitted to the district headquarters hospital in Rayagada where he underwent treatment and returned home. However, he died soon after.

Similarly, three other persons Anumal Dibaka, Nilu Dibaka and Dharmi

Dibaka having similar symptoms died within a span of 10 days. Villagers alleged that they are yet to be provided with proper medical care and treatment despite the death of four villagers. They said some of the patients have resorted to traditional herbal medicine as except for an AYUSH doctor there are no more doctors to provide them treatment. The CDMO said a medical team reached the village and started treatment of the afflicted persons after his department was informed. Moreover, doctors at the Chandrapur community health centre (CHC) have been directed to provide proper medical care to the afflicted persons in Jubagudi village. "The reason behind spread of the disease and other details can be ascertained only after the reports on examination of faecal and water samples are available to us," he said.

Odisha vigilance arrests three including GST officer on graft charge



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha vigilance Sunday arrested three persons including a commercial tax and GST officer on the charge of bribery, evasion of taxes and causing loss to the government, officials said.

Binay Bhushan Tripathy, an assistant commissioner of enforcement unit, Jajpur along with two private persons Jyoti Pattnaik and Md Golam Sad has been arrested for evasion of taxes and misappropriation of government money over Rs 5.85 lakh, the vigilance officials said.

According to the vigilance, Tripathy had intercepted one goods vehicle carrying scrap worth Rs 8.89 lakh at Revena in Jajpur district in May this year. He detained the vehicle at a dhaba on the NH and demanded Rs 2.5 lakh bribe from the owner to release the vehicle. However, when the bribe demand was not met, in contravention to the laws of GST, Tripathy, with an ulterior motive, illegally sold the entire scrap to another scrap dealer, and realized nominal tax and misappropriated Rs 5.85

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AMENDMENT TO THE PROHIBITION OF BENAMI PROPERTY TRANSACTIONS ACT, 1988

1. The Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Act, 1988, marked a significant legislative development in combating Benami transactions. It defined Benami transactions as any property transfer in which the consideration was paid by someone other than the property's holder. This Act was relatively limited in scope and lacked comprehensive rules and enforcement mechanisms. It empowered the Government to acquire Benami property but did not specify the procedure for confiscation. Then in 2016, the Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Amendment Act significantly expanded the scope of the original Act. It expanded to 72 sections from 9 sections, defined various aspects of

Benami transactions, provided exceptions, and outlined procedures for confiscation. The amendment also introduced new offences and penalties. Notably, it included both the transfer of title and possession of Benami property within its ambit.

2. The Amendment Act defines Benami Property Section 4(8) as "any property which is the subject matter of a Benami transaction and also includes the proceeds from such property" and Benami Transactions Section 4 (9) as-

(A) a transaction or an arrangement—

(a) where a property is transferred to, or is held by, a person, and the consideration for such property has been provided, or paid by, another person; and

(b) the property is held for

the immediate or future benefit, direct or indirect, of the person who has provided the consideration...."

3. Further, the Amendment Act also defines the Benamidar as "a person or a fictitious person, as the case may be, in whose name the benami property is transferred or held and includes a person who lends his name."

4. Prohibition of Benami Property Transactions Act, 1988, has been amended by the Finance (No.2) Act, 2024. The amended provisions will apply with effect from the 1st day of October, 2024. These are summarized here.

4.1 Amendment of Section 24 of the Prohibition of Benami Property Transactions Act, 1988:

a) Time Limit for making submission by benamidar or the beneficial owner: Section 24 of the PBPT Act, 1988 relates to notice and attachment of property involved in Benami transaction. The existing provisions of section 24(3) of PBPT Act do not provide for any time limit for a benamidar to furnish a reply to the notice issued under sub-section (1) or a beneficial owner to file

submissions on copy of said notice given to him under sub-section (2). Now sub-section (2A) has been inserted to provide a maximum time limit of 3 months from the end of the month in which notice is issued under sub-section (1) for the benamidar or the beneficial owner to file their explanations or submissions.

b) Increase in Time Limit for provisionally attachment by Initiating Officer: The existing provisions of sub-section (3) and sub-section (4) of section 24 provide for a time limit of 90 days from the last day of the month in which notice under sub-section (1) is issued for the Initiating Officer to provisionally attach the property or to pass an order for continuing the provisional attachment or revoking the provisional attachment or deciding not to attach the property, as the case may be. Now amendment has been made in these sub-sections (3) and (4) of section 24 of the PBPT Act, 1988, has been passed.

c) Increase in Time Limit for drawing up a statement of the case: The existing provisions of sub-section (5) of said section 24 allow for a time period of 15 days from the date of attachment order to the Initiating Officer to draw up a statement of the case and refer it to the Adjudicating Authority. Now the said sub-section has been amended to increase the said period of 15 days to one month from the end of the month in which the order under sub-clause (i) of clause (a), or under sub-clause (i) of clause (b) of sub-section (4) of the said section 24 of the PBPT Act, 1988, has been passed.

d) The amendments will take effect from the 1st day of October, 2024.

4.2 Insertion of Section 55A in Prohibition of Benami Property Transactions (PBPT) Act, 1988 by Finance (No.2) Act, 2024:

a) Penalty of rigorous imprisonment and fine: As per section 53(2) of the PBPT Act, 1988, the offence of benami transaction is punishable with a penalty of rigorous imprisonment for minimum one year to

under sub-section (1) of the said section is issued.

c) Increase in Time Limit for drawing up a statement of the case: The existing provisions of sub-section (5) of said section 24 allow for a time period of 15 days from the date of attachment order to the Initiating Officer to draw up a statement of the case and refer it to the Adjudicating Authority. Now the said sub-section has been amended to increase the said period of 15 days to one month from the end of the month in which the order under sub-clause (i) of clause (a), or under sub-clause (i) of clause (b) of sub-section (4) of the said section 24 of the PBPT Act, 1988, has been passed.

d) The amendments will take effect from the 1st day of October, 2024.

e) The amendment will take effect from the 1st day of October, 2024.

maximum seven years along with fine extending to 25% of the fairmarket value of the benami property. This penalty is the same for a benamidar or a beneficial owner or any person who abets or induces any person to enter into a benami transaction. Due to same quantum of penalty & prosecution as is imposable in the case of beneficial owner and abettor, benamidars do not come forward to give evidence against the beneficial owner. Further, many benamidars being of poor means and illiterate, imposing on them the same penalty as the beneficial owner of such a benami transaction could be disproportionate in nature. Alternatively, if such benamidars were to become approvers, it would help in gathering clinching evidence and details about benami properties and result in convictions of the beneficial owners, thus strengthening the regime.

b) Furthermore, various other laws of the land provided for a tender of pardon/immunity from prosecution/reduced

penalty in cases where the witness assists in the due process of law.

c) Now by Finance (No.2) Act, 2024 a new section 55A has been inserted in the PBPT Act, 1988, to provide that the Initiating Officer may, with a view to obtaining the evidence of the benamidar or any other person as referred to in section 53, other than the beneficial owner, tender to such person immunity from penalty for any offence under section 53, with the previous sanction of the competent authority as referred to in section 55, the immunity shall be deemed to have been withdrawn, and any such person may be tried for the offence in respect of which the tender of immunity was made or for any other offence of which he appears to have been guilty in connection with the same matter and shall also become liable to the imposition of any penalty under this Act to which he would have otherwise been liable.

d) The amendment will take effect from the 1st day of October, 2024.

e) This amendment will take effect from the 1st day of October, 2024.

The simple meaning of protection is not only the physical protection of the person but also her emotional, creative, spiritual, mental and ideological protection. Defense is a commitment to establish the affection that is part of belonging. The sister keeps her brother bound in this love that it is the brother's responsibility for his all-round security, for this the thread of protection of the thread is tied as a resolution. Tilak is applied because God listens to the prayers of sisters quickly and they apply tilak to their brother to ensure that he becomes successful. After this, some grains of Akshat are also applied on that tilak. Akshat is a symbol of perfection, and also of love that never decays. Brothers are truly complete and their love is never ending. Then the coconut is given in the

sea. There is also a tradition of offering coconuts to please Varuna, the deity of the sea. This is why the beaches of Mumbai become filled with coconuts for this one day. In Rajasthan, there is a custom of tying Ram Rakhi and Chuda Rakhi or Lumba. Ram Rakhi is tied only to God, while Chuda Rakhi is tied in the bangles of sisters-in-law. In Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Maharashtra, and Odisha, South Indian Brahmins refer to this festival as Avani Avittam. On this day, after bathing at the river or ocean, they perform Tarpan for the sages and wear a new sacred thread. In the hilly regions of Nepal, the Brahmin and Kshatriya communities tie Raksha Bandhan from the hands of their guru and siblings. However, Indian-origin Nepali people living in the southern border tie Rakhi from their sisters like Indian brothers.

Raksha Bandhan is a festival that strengthens relationships through bonds of affection and love. This is why, on this occasion, it is common not only for sisters to tie Rakhis to brothers but also for other relationships to engage in the tradition of tying (or Rakhi). The guru ties a protective thread to the disciple, and similarly, the disciple ties it to the guru. In ancient India, when graduates completed their education and left the Gurukul, they would

tie a protective thread to receive blessings from their teacher, who would tie the thread back, wishing that the knowledge gained would be utilized appropriately in their future life so that the student successfully upholds the dignity of the teacher along with their own knowledge. Following this tradition, even today, before any religious ritual, the priest ties a protective thread to the host, and the host ties it back to the priest. In this way, both bind each other in their respective bonds to uphold each other's respect.

The festival of Raksha Bandhan has been a cultural measure for social and familial unity. After marriage, a sister moves to her in-laws' home. As an excuse, every year she ties rakhi not only to her brothers but also reaches out to relatives from far and wide, thus renewing her bonds. This leads to the mutual connection (meeting) of two

families and clans. The festival is also used as a form of unity among various classes of society. In this way, the broken link can be revived. During the Indian freedom struggle, this festival was also used for public awakening. Shri Rabindranath Tagore, while opposing the partition of Bengal, began politically using the Raksha Bandhan festival as a symbol of mutual brotherhood and unity among the residents of Bengal. In 1905, he published his famous poem "Matribhumi Vandana," in which he wrote - "O Lord! May the soil, rivers, air, and flowers of my Bengal be sacred; O Lord! May every sibling of my Bengal be united, undivided, and one in spirit."


When Rajputs went to battle, women would apply kumkum tilak on their foreheads and tie a silken thread on their hands. This was done with the belief that this thread would bring them back victorious. Another famous story associated

with rakhi is that of Queen Karnavati of Mewar, who received prior information about an impending attack by Bahadur Shah on Mewar. Unable to fight, the queen sent a rakhi to Mughal Emperor Humayun, seeking protection. In another account, Alexander's wife tied rakhi to her husband's Hindu enemy, Purushottam, and made him her sworn brother, pledging not to kill him during battle. During the war, respecting the rakhi tied to his hand and the promise made to his sister, Purushottam spared Alexander's life.

There are numerous literary texts that provide a detailed description of the festival of Raksha Bandhan. When we see elderly parents looking for support and moving into old age homes, we question our own progress and development. One potential solution to this problem could be for children to tie a Rakhi on their parents, taking on the lifelong responsibilities that come with it. This way, we can address a major societal issue. By broadening our understanding and not considering Raksha Bandhan merely as a festival for siblings, we must appreciate its significance in various contexts. In essence, it is a festival that strengthens relationships through bonds of love and affection. This method of

bonding distinguishes Indian culture from other cultures worldwide. If sisters tie Rakhis to one another and brothers do the same, we can tackle such issues effectively. This festival can also play a crucial role in breaking down the walls of communalism and classism. All it takes is an effort. Today, as we talk about celebrating Raksha Bandhan in a new way, we need to extend our consideration beyond society, family, and the nation to the environment that needs protection. On this auspicious occasion, we should collectively pledge to tie a thread of affection around a tree and take responsibility for its protection. The worship of trees stems from mankind's self-interest, which has perpetually been sustained selflessly by nature. Thus, we should also do something for its protection on this day. According to traditions, as sisters tie the Rakhi, they chant the following mantra: "Yen baddho Bali Raja, Danavendro Mahabali: Ten tvam anubadhami, rakshye ma chal ma chal." This translates to: "With the protective thread that bound the mighty King Bali, I bind you. May you never waver from your vows."

higher studies. The entire course will be operated through hybrid-mode. In the first year, around 75 students have been admitted in its three main centres at Kolkata, Delhi and Bangalore. All these students however will constitute a single class-room. Teaching assistants are being provided for each course at all the centres. The students will be physically present in each centre. The teacher will lecture in one of the centres with the other centres connected by video conferencing.

MEs can raise funds through IPO route boosting its credibility

Kolkata (PARTHA ROY): SMEs across India are perpetual need of fund to run their operations as well as expansion.

CII Eastern Region organised 10th Capital Market Conclave on 14th August 2024 to deliberate and discuss on scope and opportunities to expand Capital Market and ease fund crunch for various sectors of Indian industries including MSMEs, NGOs through IPO route.

The central theme of the conference was "Capital Markets - Catalyst towards Developed India".

Government of India is focusing on SMEs for job creation as well as to boost economic growth. Government's vision is to transform India into developed nation by 2047. The access to capital has always been a challenge for SMEs. But now the SMEs are increasingly being listed on NSE and BSE. As on June end 2023, a total of 780 SMEs are listed on both the exchanges i.e. in NSE and BSE together. These

companies have raised around Rs. 11,000 crores over the period and had the market capitalisation of more than 1.6 lakh crores, said by Mr Shekhar Chaudhary, Director, Financial Markets Division, Department of Economic Affairs, Government of India, at the Conclave. Mr Chaudhary highlighted that in the Union Budget 2019-20, Government had proposed to create a Social Stock Exchange (SSE), to help realising the Social Welfare objectives, so that the social enterprises can raise capital in the form of equity, debt or as units like mutual fund. The idea of the Social Stock Exchange was to stimulate the ecosystem of philanthropic outcome in India in a transparent and regulated manner. So far, a total of 9 NGOs raised a total of Rs. 12 crores on the SSE. Further, around 100 NGOs have registered with NSE and BSE, which are being hand-held by the exchanges to prepare their fund-raising documents for subsequent listing on their SSE platform.

Mr Chaudhary further stated that recently, Indian economy has witnessed growing number of unicorns in the startup ecosystem, which has also come up with IPOs and made an important landmark in the evolution of equity interest. The number of total IPOs in Capital Markets have increased by 66% in FY 2023-24 to 272 in number. The modern and resilient capital markets is the outcome of the consistent efforts of all the participants including exchanges, clearing corporations, stockbrokers, merchant bankers, investors and associations like CII. This journey has been marked with innovations and structural market reforms to achieve growth as well as the depth.

Mr Amarjeet Singh, Whole Time Member, SEBI, asserted that in mutual funds, the share of AUM from B30 cities has increased from 15% to 18% in last 5 years. West Bengal contributes 5% of the total AUM and the State is among the top 10 states in terms

of per capita penetration. However, Kolkata city ranks amongst the top 5 cities in total AUM contribution. He mentioned that Capital Markets have been key to India's economic development and in May 2004, India's total Market capital surpassed USD 5 trillion mark.

Ms Kamala K, Chief Regulatory Officer, BSE India, highlighted that all are working for a noble vision that Capital Market will play a role of catalyst in transforming India the developed nation by 2047. The technology combined with regulatory mechanisms has made the Capital Market grow leaps and bounds.

During the period from April to July 2024, SER achieved a commendable loading of



70.32 million tonnes of freight which is about 5.32% higher than the corresponding period of 2023-24. The General Manager added that in order to increase operational capacity, 155 km of doubling/3rd line work has been completed so far this year.

The General Manager stated that with a view to provide more amenities to the passengers, 20 lifts and 10 escalators have been commissioned at various stations during the current financial year. Rabada, Maharaj script series win in Guyana

New Delhi: The third day is known as a moving day in Test match cricket, the second match between West Indies and South Africa rapidly moved to a conclusion with the visitors clinching a 40-run victory in Guyana, and thereby sealing the series 1-0. Jayden Seales picked up six wickets as South Africa were skittled out early during the day, setting the hosts a 263-run target. However, the three-fers from Kagiso Rabada and Keshav Maharaj turned the contest on its head. Dane Piedt and Wiaan Mulder too picked up a brace in a thrilling finish as West Indies folded for 222 in reply.

A change in ball immediately brought about a change in

fortunes for West Indies as Jomel Warrican struck in the first over of the day. He trapped Wiaan Mulder in front with an arm ball which kept low, which the batter missed after going deep into the crease. Maharaj was gone for a pair - and his third consecutive duck - in the next over, chipping one off Jayden Seales to mid-wicket. Seales came back to castle Kyle Verreyne, picking up a five-fer as the West Indies continued their remarkable comeback in the morning session. Rabada was next to fall, nicking one to first slip while the resistant Nandre Burger too fell for naught as Seales took a brilliant reflex catch off his own bowling. Having withered away like a pack of cards on the third

morning, South Africa finished with 246 after losing their last-five wickets for just 23 runs. Kraigg Brathwaite and Mikyle Louis started off cautiously against Rabada and Burger, who started with good lines. Brathwaite stood tall to score a boundary through the covers off the backfoot against Burger. Rabada induced the edge of Louis which Mulder gobbled up at third slip. Keacy Carty continued his positive style of play, caressing a ball through covers overpitched by Burger. Carty and Brathwaite continued to find the boundary with some regularity before lunch, keeping the West Indies in the hunt at 43 for 1 at the session break.

A poor delivery by

Burger helped continue the run flow for the hosts as Brathwaite tucked it away off the pads for four. Mulder, who picked a four-fer in the first innings, dismissed Brathwaite LBW on 25. He struck



again few overs later and Carty dragged one on to the stumps with South Africa roaring back into the match. Kavem Hodge pulled three boundaries and even hit Rabada for two in an over. Soon Hodge started

targetting the pacer as he pulled the bowler for two boundaries in an over for the second time. But Rabada had the last laugh as he got Hodge to chop one onto his stumps, ending a positive innings. Dane Piedt picked up his

first as Athanaze's sweep only went off the top edge, which Markram at first slip caught easily. Jason Holder holed out to long-on for a duck as West Indies slipped to 104 for 6 close to tea. Gudakesh Motie and Joshua da Silva brought up a 77-run partnership as both played attacking shots against the spinners to bring the game back into the balance. But Maharaj dismissed Motie on 45 with an arm ball, trapped in front of the stumps. One brought two as da Silva was given out to a ball that straightened after pitching and suddenly the West Indies were eight-down.

Temba Bavuma pulled off a blinder, jumping in the air to catch the ball with his right-hand and send Shamar Joseph on his way, by 40 runs

giving Rabada his third. Warrican was resilient and even hit a four and a six to show that the fight was still there. But, Maharaj induced the inside edge which David Bedingham safely pouched at forward short leg to give South Africa a 40-run win.

Cricket at Youth Olympics - ICC says it can work with IOC

New Delhi: The International Cricket Council (ICC) has indicated that it might collaborate with the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to include cricket in the Youth Olympics in 2030. This basis of the ICC assertion stems from the Government of India's declaration last year that it intends to bid for the 2030 Youth Olympic Games (YOG) in Mumbai, apart from 2036 in Olympics.

William Glenwright, ICC's General Manager of Development, responded positively in an email to a certain Vivek Gopalan, stating, "It's a good idea and something we could look at." Gopalan's email and Glenwright's reply were



also copied to ICC CEO Geoff Allardice, Wasim Khan, Claire Furlong, and Chris Tetley.

Gopalan has contended that "There is a strong for cricket at Youth Olympic Games (YOG) while addressing the IOC session in Mumbai last October. Of late, however, the Indian Government's focus has shifted to bidding for the 2036 Olympic Games - a point the Prime Minister reiterated

during his Independence Day address from the ramparts of the Red Fort. The email to the ICC official advocates for the inclusion of cricket in the Youth Olympic Games (YOG) by presenting several arguments. It states, "All top sports, including Rugby Sevens, are part of the YOG. Why not Cricket? Including Cricket in the YOG would revolutionize grassroots cricket globally, especially among the ICC Associates." The age limit for participants in the YOG is between 15 and 18. The mail further notes, "Now that ICC has formed strong links with IOC and IOC recognizes that the

"cricket brand" can enhance the "Olympic Brand" it would not be a difficult task to convince IOC to include Cricket as a core sport in the Youth Olympics." Cricket has been included in the Los Angeles Olympics in 2028 for the first time since the 1900 Paris Games. Archery, Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Beach volleyball, Boxing, Canoeing, Cycling, Diving, Equestrian, Fencing, Field hockey, Football, Futsal, Golf, Gymnastics, Handball, Judo, Modern pentathlon, Rowing, Rugby Sevens, Sailing, Shooting, Swimming, Table tennis, Taekwondo, Tennis, Triathlon, Volleyball, Weightlifting and Wrestling are the disciplines that feature in YOG.

Dhaka: Bangladesh have received a blow ahead of the two-match Test series against Pakistan with their regular opener Mahmudul Hasan ruled out due to groin injury. BCB is yet to announce any replacement for Mahmudul. "We have received a mail regarding Mahmudul where it is stated that he sustained injury to his right groin and as a result he is being rested for three weeks," BCB chief physician Debasish Chowdhury confirmed to Cricbuzz on Saturday (August 17).

Trouble in Punjab Kings promoter group as matter reaches court

New Delhi: Trouble seems to be brewing inside the promoter group of the Punjab Kings franchise. Differences have come out in the open among the owners of the team and the situation has escalated to a level with Preity Zinta, one of the four owners of the Indian Premier League (IPL) franchise, seeking a restraining order against another promoter.

Sources from Chandigarh indicate that the Bollywood actress, who holds a 23 percent shareholding in the franchise through KPH Dream Cricket Private Limited, has filed an appeal in the State High Court, seeking to restrain co-owner Mohit Burman from selling a portion of his shares to another party.

Incidentally, Burman

holds the largest stake in the franchise, with 48 percent. Ness Wadia is the third owner in the promoter group, possessing a 23 percent shareholding, while Karan Paul, the fourth owner, holds the remaining six percent shares.

Preity's court appeal concerns Burman's reported plans to sell a part of his stake, which he denies. Burman, who is associated with the Dabur company, told Cricbuzz on Friday, "I don't have any plans to sell my shares." However, Preity's petition in the court claims that

Burman intends to sell 11.5 percent of his stake to a party based in the US. Her petition names it to be a firm called Tomales Bay Capital L.P.

According to the

internal arrangements among the owners, any stake intended for sale must first be offered to the existing group of promoters. The stake can only be sold to an outside party once the current promoters decline to purchase it. Most crucially, the offer to sell the stake cannot

be open-ended and it is always time bound. The seller can only wait only for a certain period of time for the partners before looking elsewhere. Sources in Chandigarh indicate that Preity had to involve the court due

to allegations that Burman is attempting to sell the shares to a third party, despite her timely exercise of pre-emptive rights. Her petition outlines the timeline of the issue, which was initially disclosed to the board members in April.

She highlights Article 19 of the association's bylaws, which pertains to the existing directors' right of first refusal (ROFR). She alleged in the court that after initially offering to sell the stake to fellow directors, Burman has

backed out but continues to seek a sale to the US company. If the sale goes through either way, the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) will become involved at some point, as the transaction requires the regulator's approval. The BCCI is entitled to receive five percent of the transaction value. Since the inclusion of two new teams in the IPL in 2022, the valuation of the franchises has gone up remarkably. On an average, a moderately successful franchise can command a value up to \$ 650-700 million dollars which could be between INR 5,300 crore and INR 5,800 crore. The 11.5 percent of that valuation would be in the approximate range of INR 540-600 crore but Cricbuzz understands that Burman has priced it at

\$ 85 million, or over INR 700 crores. With Burman categorically denying any plans to sell his shares, the future of the whole matter remains uncertain. Cricbuzz attempted to reach Preity for a comment but received no response. Wadia also did not reply to messages from the website. The case has been posted for a hearing on August 20. Punjab Kings have been one of the original eight teams of the IPL. Their performance has been underwhelming in the 17 years of IPL so far, having reached the final once and semifinal once. This website recently reported that the franchise has been looking for an Indian coach in place of Trevor Bayliss ahead of the big auction later this year.
