One Nation One Election bill be sent to Parliament panel, PM suggested: Amit Shah

New Delhi, (KCN): Union Home Minister Amit Shah told the Lok Sabha that the government was ready to send the One Nation One Election (ONOE) bills to a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) for a broader consultation, saying it was suggested by Prime Minister Narendra Modi himself.

Shah's statement came amid an uproar in the Lok Sabha as Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal tabled the Constitution (One Hundred and Twenty-Ninth Amendment) Bill, 2024, and the Union Territories Law (Amendment) Bill, 2024, to enable simultaneous polls. The bills were eventually introduced in the Lok Sabha with 269 voting in favour and 198 against.

Fence sitters like Jagan Mohan Reddy's YSRCP have also backed the legislation that would enable simultaneous elections to the Lok Sabha as well as state assemblies.

to the welfare of farmers and the poor.” The warning follows reports of disruptions at several procurement centres due to millers’ reluctance to sign agreements with district administrations. Earlier in the day, Minister Pujari visited the shrine of Devi Bhandara Gharani and offered prayers. He was also accorded a warm reception by the district RIP unit.

13 towns in Odisha record minimum temp below 10 degree Celsius

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Thirteen towns in Odisha recorded minimum temperature below 10 degree Celsius with G Udayagiri in Kandhamal district being the coldest place in the state at 4.7 degree Celsius, the Met office in Bhubaneswar said Tuesday.

The minimum temperature at Rourkela was 5.7 degree Celsius followed by Similiguda in Koraput district at 7.2. Phulbani recorded a minimum temperature of 7.5 Celsius, Sundargarh 8.6, Keonjhar 8.9, while Angul, Bhawanipatna, Kirei, Chiplima and Nabarangpur recorded 9 degree Celsius respectively and Bhadrak 9.5, it said.

The twin cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack recorded minimum temperature of 13.6 degree Celsius and 12.5 degree Celsius respectively.

NCERT textbooks to cost less from 2025, new books for classes 9-12 by 2026: Dharmendra Pradhan

New Delhi(KCN): NCERT textbooks for some classes will cost less from next year, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan announced Tuesday.

The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), which currently prints five crore textbooks a year, is working to augment capacity to 15 crore from next year, he said.

The minister also informed that the new textbooks, according to the updated curriculum for classes 9-12, would be available from the 2026-27 academic session.

“In the next academic year, NCERT will publish 15 crore quality and affordable books... Currently, it publishes nearly five crore textbooks. Earlier, there were concerns about demand and supply about the textbooks. However, that will be addressed now,” Pradhan told reporters.

“Since the volume of printing of books is going to be high, the prices of textbooks for some classes will be reduced. However, the price will not be increased for any class to ensure there is no financial burden on parents,” he added.

The minister informed that the process of updating textbooks,



according to the new National Curriculum Framework (NCF), was underway. “The process is on and textbooks for classes 9-12 will be ready by the 2026-27 academic session,” he said. “New textbooks have been made available for seven out of 15 grades, with textbooks coming out for four more grades in the next academic year. Textbooks for arts, physical education, and wellbeing (classes 3-8) and vocational education (classes 6-8) are being developed. Textbooks are being prepared in all scheduled Indian languages and made accessible via online platforms,” the minister said. Pradhan informed that the number of schools affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) had more than doubled, rising from 14,974 in 2014 to 30,415 in 2024. “Admissions, transfers

DIGI-EXAM system, policy to allot centres, transition to CBT: Centre's panel lists exam reforms

New Delhi(KCN): A DIGI-EXAM system to check impersonation, multi-stage and multi-session testing, test centre allocation policy, setting up secured test centres in each district and mobile testing centres in rural and remote areas are among the recommendations made by the Centre's high-level panel on exam reforms. The report by the seven-member panel headed by former Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) chief R Radhakrishnan was made

public Tuesday. The panel noted that there was a strong case for transition from pen-and-paper based tests to Computer Based Test (CBT) as the preferred methodology while the challenges in reaching out to underserved areas could be network, test infrastructure and competent human resources. The panel recommended the introduction of a DIGI-EXAM system on the lines of DIGI-YATRA to ensure that only the candidate writing the exam joined the

intended programme. “Essentially, multi-stage authentication of the candidate’s identity is envisaged which makes use of Aadhar and biometrics and AI-based data analytics,” it said. The panel noted that the National Testing Agency (NTA) outstretched itself to accommodate diverse requests from many test indenting agencies for handling end-to-end operations of tests. “The NTA should primarily conduct entrance examinations. Enhancing its scope for other

examinations may be considered after the capacity of the NTA is augmented," the panel said in its report. Suggesting restructuring of the NTA, the committee recommended 10 specific verticals, headed at the director level. The verticals will be related to technology, products and operations, test security and surveillance. "The NTA needs to be manned with internal domain-specific human resources and a leadership team with domain expertise, proven

experience and skill sets who should take charge of the testing process in the future,” it said. The committee also noted that the NTA should have an “empowered and accountable” governing body with three designated sub-committees to oversee test audit, ethics and transparency; nomination and staff conditions; and stakeholder relationships. “Multi-session testing, spread over typically a few days to a couple of weeks could be adopted, especially when registered participants exceed say, two lakh.

How to change a tire should be included in driving lessons?



Is it essential for all new drivers to learn how to change a flat tire? Why not indeed? It is an essential aspect of driving. Discover how to change a tire, check the oil, and fill the windscreen washer reservoir...essential skills like these. I saw a driving instructor showing a student how to change a flat tire on a street in Brampton. This question popped into my mind. Is this included in the syllabus, or was the teacher particularly diligent? When I started my driving lessons in 1992, they never taught me how to change a flat tire. If not the instructor, the father might need to teach their children how to change a tire, oil, spark plugs, and perform basic

maintenance on a vehicle long before they reach driving age. Changing a tire represents an opportunity for self-sufficiency rather than merely a task imposed on an individual. No parent desires to see their young children stranded on the side of the road, reliant on a phone call or the goodwill of strangers, when they are fully capable of addressing the situation themselves. It is not necessary to be a rocket scientist in order to change a tire, and since I spent my childhood seeing other people doing it, the process soon became a piece of cake for me. Tire replacement will be beyond the capabilities of the vast majority of the younger generation. Also, tires that are worn unevenly can lead to significant damage to the vehicle. Driving a vehicle with worn-out tires poses a significant safety hazard and increases the likelihood of accidents. A legal limit exists for tire tread depth, below which driving is prohibited without replacement. Take a

look at this. Some preventative measures you can take include maintaining the correct tire pressure and rotating the tires every six months. This will ensure your tires remain in good condition and will extend their lifespan as intended by the manufacturer. Low mileage does not guarantee that tires will have a long lifespan. No. Tires can deteriorate when left in a lot for extended periods. Inspect the tread at least once every three months to ensure it wears evenly and does not become bald. The quality of the ride is closely linked to the state of the tires. Absolutely! Hats off to that instructor! That information would benefit both new candidates and current drivers who need insight into what others might not know. All licensed drivers should undoubtedly possess the necessary knowledge to change a tire. This includes understanding essential safety measures prior to beginning the task, such as selecting a safe location away from

traffic, ensuring the ground is level, fully engaging the handbrake, putting the car in gear, using wheel chocks when necessary, and positioning warning signs. They should be familiar with the operation of the jack, wheel brace, spare tire, and warning triangles, as well as how to properly store and retrieve these items. It is crucial to have knowledge of jacking points, ensure a solid base and upright jack, loosen the wheel nuts slightly before raising the vehicle, and verify stability while changing the tire. Drivers must also know the correct order for removing the nuts, how to store them securely, and where to place the damaged tire for safety. Checking the inner hub of the spare tire for cleanliness, employing techniques to lift the heavy spare, and fitting the nuts correctly (to prevent cross-threading) using fingers are all important steps. The proper sequence and amount of tightening with a wrench before lowering the vehicle, as well as final tightening

checks for torque, are also vital. The final steps before gathering the warning sign are to visually inspect the spare tire's pressure, pack up the tools, and handle the flat tire. Learning how to change a tire during a driving lesson could be beneficial for several reasons. Practical Skills: Changing a tire is a basic car maintenance skill that helps drivers manage emergencies efficiently. It fosters independence and assurance while driving. Safety Awareness: Teaching this skill enhances awareness of vehicle safety and the need for preparedness during breakdowns. It prompts drivers to routinely check their vehicle's condition. Concentrate on Driving Abilities: A driving lesson mainly assesses driving skills. Some argue that practical maintenance skills, though important, should be part of the driving lessons scope. schools or online tutorials. Including tire-changing in driving lessons could boost practical knowledge and safety. Changing a tire on a car usually takes 30 minutes to an hour, depending on a few factors: Experience Level: An experienced individual may finish the task in 15-30 minutes, whereas a beginner could take longer. Also depends on tools available. The right tools (jack, lug wrench, and spare tire) can make the process quicker. Rusted or stuck lug nuts may require extra time for removal. Also, it's very impotent changing a tire in a safe, flat area is faster than on the roadside or in hazardous weather. It's wise to give yourself extra time if you're not familiar with the process. If you know what you're doing, it's easy. Ideally, teach and test principles verbally. Owning and driving a car involves more than just starting it, shifting gears, moving, steering, accelerating, decelerating, and stopping. Just as anyone licensed to carry a gun

must comprehend more than just loading, aiming, and pulling the trigger, so too does driving a vehicle. Vehicles, guns, and their users need licenses for a reason. Motor vehicles, similar to guns, can be deadly weapons. "Licensed" should signify thorough teaching and testing. It pertains to the handling, upkeep, storage, and secure operation. Not every driver needs to be a mechanic. Every motorist should know how to recognize when something is wrong and have an idea of how to fix it. They should also know when to call a mechanic. Having a flat tire while driving may result in a number of major problems, including the following: When you continue to drive on a flat tire, you run the risk of causing permanent damage to the tire, which will render it hard to fix. Wheel damage may occur when the weight of the vehicle presses directly on the wheel rim, without the cushioning effect of the tire. This can cause the wheel rim to get damaged. A flat tire may have a

substantial impact on the vehicle's handling, which can result in a loss of control over the vehicle. This, in turn, contributes to an increased likelihood of being involved in an accident. It is possible for a flat tire to increase the distance that must be travelled in order to bring the vehicle to a halt, which may make the situation more hazardous in the event of an emergency. In the event that the tire is damaged or only partly inflated, there is a possibility that it could blow out while the vehicle is being driven. This can result in an abrupt loss of control of the vehicle. Risks to Safety Driving on a flat tire may be dangerous not just for the driver but also for other people who are using the road. If you have reason to believe that your tire is flat, it is recommended to pull over in a safe location and examine the tire. If necessary, you should replace or repair the tire before continuing to drive.

Self-confidence helped the famous handicapped writer Suresh Chandra 'Sarvahara.'



Suresh Chandra 'Sarvahara' was born on 22 February 1961 in the city of lakes, Udaipur (Rajasthan). He tells in his autobiography that "Initially his life was going on in the hope of a better future, albeit in poverty, when a thunderbolt struck the family. At the age of four, I got a high fever. When the fever did not subside for three to four days with home remedies and I started stumbling while standing, the family members got worried. Gradually, the right side of the body and the neck stopped working. It was an attack of paralysis. Later, indigenous treatment was done in the government research laboratory of Udaipur itself, due to which some activity came in the neck, but there was no special benefit in the right hand and leg. This fatal

disease took away the freedom of my childhood forever. While running, my feet suddenly stopped. After two and a half years, our family came to Chhipabaraud tehsil of the Kota district due to father's appointment. After some time, Mother also got appointed as a teacher in the same government higher primary school. It was a matter of good fortune for me that when I turned seven, my mother started taking me to school in her lap for the purpose of teaching me something. Sometimes mother would make me sit in one place and forget about it. Later, when she remembered, she would make me sit in the designated classroom. This was a girls' school, so I used to remain shy. I passed the examinations till seventh standard in the first division from this girls' school. Here, all the classmates and teachers behaved affectionately and cooperatively towards

me. Due to sitting in the same position for hours in one place, the left leg, along with the right leg, became stiff and doubled. The right hand became inactive, but the speed of writing with the left hand started increasing gradually. I was admitted to Government Higher Secondary School, Chhipabaraud, in Class IX. In 1978, I passed the Class X examination in the arts stream with 78% marks, and in 1979, I passed Class XI with 79% marks. In Class XI, I secured ninth position in the merit list of the Board of Secondary Education, Ajmer (Rajasthan). I completed my studies

in the light of the chimney and lantern. I took admission in Kota College for higher education. Living alone with my father in a damp rented room, not having proper arrangements for food and water, and the stench of open drains outside, my health started deteriorating and I was afflicted with tuberculosis. As I was not well for a long time, I passed my graduation examination as a student myself. Then I passed my postgraduate examination in the Sanskrit subject in the first division. After this, in my free time, I passed the Rajasthan Administrative

Subordinate Services Examination and the Rajasthan Public Service Commission examinations for the post of college lecturer but could not get selected in the interview due to severe physical disability. Through the employment office, Kota, I was selected for the post of Accounts Clerk in Western Railway, Kota Junction, on 11 September 1987. The workplace was ten kilometers away from the residence. The arrangement for commuting was made through autorickshaw. In the office, I used to sit and get down by holding the handle of

a chair that was open from one side. Though this service in the railways was not to my liking, it was necessary for livelihood. Hence, considering work as worship, I did my work with full dedication and devotion. Gradually, I passed the departmental examinations and got promoted to the post of Section Officer (Accounts). I could have passed more examinations in the future, but for them I had to go elsewhere, which was beyond my capabilities. Due to performing my duties well, I got full support from colleagues and officers. Whatever

additional work was given to me, I completed it without complaining. Due to excessive workload, there was slackness in writing work, but the hobby of writing remained. Somehow, I passed the MA (Hindi) examination while being in service. While in railway service, he received several awards at divisional and headquarters level. Due to the untimely death of my elder sister-in-law in 2008 and my nephew in 2009, my mind was disturbed. I was also getting physically weak, so after completing 22 years of service, I took voluntary retirement on 31 October 2009. Being unmarried, I do not have any special responsibility, so the pension amount is enough for me. So far, my 25 poetry collections have been published. These include ten poetry collections for children and fifteen for adults. My poems keep getting published from time

to time in magazines published from different parts of the country. Many literary institutions of the country have honored me with various Saraswat awards in recognition of my creativity. Now, I keep studying and writing while staying at home. I believe that a person should keep trying to move ahead in life by fighting with adverse circumstances according to his abilities. One should drink the poison of bitterness in life and keep distributing the nectar of good behavior to others. When one path is closed, one must keep looking for other options with a positive attitude."

Healthcare system needs improvement: Senior Cardiologist Dr. Srinivas Ramaka

He assured the gathering that their concerns would be conveyed to the university administration for resolution. During the event, former Chairman of the Indian Council of Historical Research, Prof. Y. Sudershan Rao, proposed establishing a center for advanced research on the university campus. Prof. M. Kishtiaiah suggested organizing a family get-together in the serene atmosphere of Medaram forest, while several pensioners recommended holding KURTA meetings twice a year. LOSSES INCURRED TO THE FARMERS DUE TO 'DANA' CYCLONE

Kolkata, (KCN):In a written answer to the unstarred question raised by Lok Sabha MP Shri Ananta Nayak in the House today regarding whether the Government is aware of losses incurred to the farmers due to 'Dana' cyclone that recently struck the eastern coast of India, whether the Government has sent any Central team to access the losses incurred to the farmers due to Dana Cyclone, whether the Government has announced any financial assistance for the farmers of affected States and if so, the

details thereof; and the other measures taken by the Government to provide relief to the farmers of Odisha and West Bengal, the Union Minister of State for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Shri Ramnath Thakur stated that the data regarding losses incurred to the farmers due to any disaster including cyclone is not maintained centrally. However, as per the information received from the State Government of Odisha, 87,855 hectare of cropped area was affected to the extent of

33% and above due to 'Dana' cyclone. Shri Thakur added, in the wake of 'Dana' cyclone of October 2024, an Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) was constituted on November 11, 2024 for on-the-spot assessment of the affected areas of Odisha, without receiving a memorandum from the State Government of Odisha. The team visited the state from November 24 to 26, 2024. The Minister pointed out that as per the National Disaster Management Plan (NDMP), the primary responsibility of

disaster management including damage assessment and providing relief measures on ground level, rests with the concerned State Governments. The Central Government provides requisite logistics and financial support to the efforts of the State Governments. The State Governments provide financial relief to the affected people in the event of 12 notified natural disasters which include cyclones, from the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF), already placed at its disposal, in accordance

with approved items and norms of Government of India. However, in the event of disaster of a 'severe nature', additional financial assistance is extended from the National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF). The financial assistance provided under SDRF and NDRF is by way of relief and not for compensation. Based on the report of the IMCT, the additional financial assistance is considered by the Central Government, as per the established procedure, he said.

NSO Surveys & Availability of Timely Data Help in Evidence-based Policy Making Opine Senior Statisticians of City

Kolkata, (KCN):The Regional Office of the National Statistics Office (NSO) under Union Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation, Kolkata is organising a two-day regional training camp for the NSS 80th round of its socio-economic survey in the city which started today. The subjects under coverage in this round are survey on Household Social Consumption: Health and Comprehensive Modular Survey on Telecom (CMS-T). The NSO will carry out the survey on health for a period of one year starting from January 1, 2025. CMS-T will be conducted by the NSO during January-March, 2025. Shri Siddhartha Kundu,



Additional Director General, Household Survey Division along with Shri Atanu Kumar Choudhury, DDG, NSO(FOD), EZ and Shri Sanjib Basu, DDG, Regional Office Kolkata inaugurated the camp today. He highlighted the importance of the health survey data in the compilation of National Health Accounts in his inaugural address. In his address, he emphasised the pivotal role of surveys in evidence-

based policy making. Highlighting the need for high-quality and timely data, he urged the participants to ensure rigorous standards in data collection and processing. Shri Diptarka Das, Deputy Director, Smt Satupa Ghosh, Assistant Director and other senior officers of NSO (Field Operations Division) are participating in the camp.

The survey on health aims to generate basic quantitative information on the health sector. Primarily, indicators on morbidity, hospitalisation rates, utilisation of both public and private health care institutions, proportion of institutional childbirth etc. will be attempted to be derived from this survey data with special emphasis on 'out of pocket expense' as well as on access to government financed

health insurance programmes. The Comprehensive Modular Survey (CMS) on Telecom will provide information on telecom-related indicators and ICT skills. The collected data will also be used for reporting of global indices by line Ministries/Departments. The survey will cover the whole of the Indian Union except the villages in Andaman and Nicobar Islands which are difficult to access.

Satellite survey flags land discrepancies

Sonepur(KCN): As the procurement of Kharif paddy began in Subarnapur district Tuesday, an increasing number of suspected land discrepancies have been reported following farmer registrations and subsequent satellite surveillance. During the 2023-24 Kharif season, more than 24,000 suspected land discrepancy cases were reported. After the government announced purchase price of Rs 3,100 per quintal of paddy, the number rose to 32,000 this year. By

Thursday evening, 27,698 of these cases had been flagged following field verification. Sources said the irregularities were revealed through satellite surveys, which identified registered lands that did not have paddy cultivation. Some areas, including barren plots, roads, ponds, and reservoirs, were falsely listed as cultivated for taking benefits of government paddy procurement. The majority of the suspected cases were received from Biramaharajpur,



Ulunda, and Binka blocks, where women's self-help groups (SHGs) were allegedly involved in

registering non-cultivated lands. For the 2024-25 Kharif season, approximately 80,000 hectares of land

in Subarnapur district have been reported as paddy cultivated. Around 68,824 farmers are registered with

Primary Agricultural Cooperative Societies (PACS) and women SHGs to sell their paddy.

However, allegations of fraudulent registrations surfaced, with claims that some individuals were attempting to sell paddy from non-cultivated lands at government rates. Revenue inspectors, agricultural staff, PACS secretaries, SHG leaders, and irrigation department employees flagged suspicious registrations during field inspections. Sources said due to limited staff to investigate thousands of hectares, some discrepancies remain

unresolved. To improve accuracy, the government conducted an additional satellite survey. After surveying 866 villages across six tehsils, 32,346 plots were identified as non-cultivated. Satellite data was cross-verified by 307 field staff, including PACS and SHG officials. By Thursday evening, 31,911 plots (99%) had been surveyed, confirming non-cultivation on several of them. Farmers involved in false registrations have been denied paddy sale tokens.

New Delhi: New Zealand completed the formalities on the fourth day as they clinched the Hamilton Test by 423 runs as the series ended 1-2. This was New Zealand's biggest-ever Test win in terms of runs, and was the perfect send-off for one of their veterans and stars in Tim Southee. The former captain clutched a stump as a memento as he led the team off the field in the second session after England had lost their ninth and final wicket. With the injured Ben Stokes choosing not to

bat, England were already a batter short as they started the day and the target of 659 was always going to be an imposing presence. Having already lost their openers on the previous evening, England began the day with Jacob Bethell and Joe Root taking the attack to the opposition. The duo lived by the sword and it paid off for a while albeit with a few close shaves. Root was put down by Tom Latham off Southee when he was on 19, but managed to put it behind as Bethell and he went

on a boundary-hitting spree. Their 104-run stand came in just 125 balls as both batters got to welcome fifties. But England's fun in the sun did not last long too after. Root fell LBW when he missed a sweep off Mitchell Santner, and Harry Brook was softened by Will O'Rourke, who had him caught in the slip cordon soon after. Bethell, on the other hand, kept up the counterattack, even picking up three boundaries in an O'Rourke over as he raced into the seventies. But the rush of blood cost



him as he hit the first ball of a new Southee spell straight into the hands of deep point. At 166/5, the wheels were coming off. Gus Atkinson and Ollie Pope kept up the attack with the bat until the latter missed a reverse-lap against Matt Henry to be bowled. Santner copped some punishment from Atkinson but had the last laugh as he had him caught attempting another big hit. Matthew Potts fell in similar fashion two balls later while Brydon Carse ran out to be stumped comprehensively giving Santner his fourth of the

England fetch handy first innings lead after South Africa's collapse Sammy appointed West Indies' all-format coach

New Delhi: Lauren Bell ripped through the South African lower order and returned four wickets as the hosts were bundled out for 281 in response to England's first innings total of 395 for 9 decl at the Mangaung Oval on Monday. England went to stumps on Day 2 on 31 for 1, holding a lead of 145 runs in the one-off Test. Resuming the day on 17 for no loss, South Africa lost opener Anne Bosch in the second over of the day, with Bell inducing an outside edge to the 'keeper. Nonetheless, Laura Wolvaardt and Annerie Dercksen ensured that the hosts didn't slip up. The duo stitched a 92-run partnership to enable a strong foundation for the hosts. Lauren Filer separated the duo eight runs short of the century stand by having Dercksen caught nine



runs short of her half-century, and a few overs later Sophie Eccelstone had Wolvaardt trapped legbefore on 65. Despite the double blow, England couldn't wrestle the momentum on their side. The veteran duo of Sune Luus and Marizanne Kapp kept control. In contrasting fashion, they stroked

their respective half-centuries en route a 99-run stand, which had turned the momentum in South Africa's favour. While Luus was largely conservative in her approach, Kapp found 11 hits to the fence, being especially attacking against the spin duo of Eccelstone and Charlie Dean.

Kapp's dismissal in the post-Tea session, however, triggered a collapse. Rayna Macdonald Gay, who had cleaned up Kapp, struck early in her next over, having Nadine de Klerk caught behind for a second-ball duck. Soon, even Luus's long vigil came to an end as she handed Jones her third

catch of the innings. Bell, on her return spell, ripped through the lower order, ending Chloe Tryon's short but entertaining stay on 20 and then following up by cleaning up Sinola Jafta and Nonkululeko Mlaba cheaply as South Africa stumbled from 237 for 3 to 281 all out. England got to bat 14 overs before stumps were called. They adopted an ultra cautious approach towards the end of the day's play, but lost first-innings-centurion Maia Bouchier in the process for a duck. Tammy Beaumont and Heather Knight went to stumps safely. **Brief scores:** England 395/9 decl (Nat Sciver-Brunt 128, Maia Bouchier 126; Nonkululeko Mlaba 4-90) & 31/1 lead. New Delhi: Daren Sammy, the former West Indies captain, has been named the head coach for all senior West Indies men's teams and will take charge of the Test side from April 1, 2025. Cricket West Indies announced on Monday (December 16). The announcement, made by CWI Director of Cricket Miles Bascombe, came at the quarterly press conference held in St Vincent. The 40-year-old Sammy was named the white-ball head coach in May 2023 while Andre Coley took over the reins of the Test

team at the same time, having been the interim red-ball head coach earlier. Sammy's white-ball stint began in June with the ODI series against the UAE. Coley, the former wicketkeeper-batter, started off with the home series against India in July last year. Under Sammy as the white-ball head coach, West Indies won the ODI series against the UAE, Bangladesh and twice against England. But they failed to make the final of the World Cup qualifier, hence losing out on a berth in the 2023 World Cup. The T20I side registered series wins against India, England,

and South Africa (twice), and also made it to the Super 8 stage of the T20 World Cup co-hosted by the USA and West Indies. Meanwhile, the Test team failed to register a single series victory. They lost series to India, England and South Africa while they drew with Australia and Bangladesh. Their best Test performance came against Australia at The Gabba in January 2024, as they bowled Australia out for 207 in a chase of 216. West Indies ended the 2023-25 World Test Championship cycle with only 2 wins from 11 matches, and suffered a total of 7 losses to finish at the bottom. Meanwhile, Cricket West Indies also named a new chief executive officer, with Chris Dehring set to assume the role from February 1, 2025. The position was left vacant when Johnny Grave stepped down from the position in October.

Rohan Jaitley re-elected as DDCA president, defeats Kirti Azad by massive margin



New Delhi: Rohan Jaitley was re-elected as DDCA president, defeating Kirti Azad by a significant margin, while his camp secured key positions in the association. Kirti Azad had alleged corruption in DDCA's finances ahead of the elections. Seasoned administrator Rohan Jaitley won the Delhi District Cricket Association (DDCA) elections, defeating former India cricketer Kirti Azad. Rohan will retain the president's post and continue into his second term as the head of the state association. Rohan Jaitley secured

1,577 votes, while Kirti Azad managed only 777 votes out of the total 2,413 votes, as revealed during counting on Tuesday, 17 December. A minimum of 1,207 votes was required to win the election. Members from the Rohan Jaitley camp also secured victories in elections for other key positions. Shikha Kumar was elected vice-president, defeating Rakesh Kumar Bansal and Sudhir Kumar Agarwal by a significant margin. Ashok Sharma won the election for secretary, while Harish Singla emerged victorious

in the contest for treasurer. Amit Grover claimed the position of joint secretary. Kirti Azad, a member of India's 1983 World Cup-winning team and a Trinamool Congress MP, was expected to offer a strong challenge to Rohan Jaitley. However, he fell considerably short in the race for the president's post. Rohan Jaitley was first elected unopposed as DDCA president in 2020. He was re-elected a year later after defeating advocate Vikas Singh. Notably, the late Arun Jaitley, Rohan's father, also served as DDCA president between 1999 and 2013.

Greatest slip catch? Steve Smith redeem himself with stunning KL Rahul effort

New Delhi: Australia vs India, 3rd Test: Steve Smith dropped KL Rahul's catch in the very first delivery of Day 4 in Brisbane. However, he pulled off a sensational catch at first slip to dismiss the Indian opener later in the session. Steve Smith needed less than a session to redeem himself after dropping a sitter on Day 4 of the third Test between Australia and India in Brisbane. Smith, one of the finest slip fielders, had put down a simple catch on the very first delivery of the day's play, giving KL Rahul a reprieve on 33. Pat Cummins bowled the perfect line and length to start Tuesday's play, inducing a thick edge off KL Rahul's bat. However, Smith spilled a straightforward opportunity that could have jolted India early. Throughout the session, Smith appeared visibly hurt, with the TV cameras often panning



to him whenever KL Rahul struck a boundary and kept the Indian scoreboard ticking at the Gabba. However, Steve Smith redeemed himself spectacularly by pulling off what could be remembered as one of the greatest slip catches to end KL Rahul's innings. Although Rahul had added 50 more runs to his tally, Smith's catch

to dismiss the Indian opener came towards the end of the first session, delivering Australia a much-needed morale boost. Nathan Lyon bowled a delivery that spun sharply from outside off-stump in the 44th over. KL Rahul went onto his back foot to attempt a cross-batted cut shot despite being cramped for room. It produced a thick edge,

and the ball appeared to be flying past first slip. However, Smith, showcasing his lightning-quick reflexes, stuck out his right hand and held onto the ball. It was a stunning take, as Smith had minimal time to react to the edge. Moreover, the ball was dipping downwards, forcing Smith to dive low to his right to complete the catch.

KL Rahul was left in disbelief as he watched Smith pull off the incredible effort. The Indian opener departed for 84, just 17 runs short of a well-deserved century. Smith's catch also ended a 67-run partnership, providing Australia with a significant breakthrough. Smith looked more relieved than delighted even as Nathan Lyon and his teammates went over to laud the star batter for his sensational effort in the slip cordon. Thanks to the stunning effort, India went to Lunch on Day 4 at 167 for 6. India lost Rohit Sharma early in the day's play as Pat Cummins dismissed the India captain for just 10. Ravindra Jadeja remained unbeaten on 41 and Nitish Kumar Reddy was unbeaten on 7 as India trailed Australia's first innings total by 278 runs, still needing 78 to avoid the follow-on.
