

High drama unfolds on Parliament premises as Oppn, BJP MPs jostle; Rahul accused of pushing Sarangi

New Delhi(KCN): Plumbing new depths of political animosity, rival MPs screamed and shoved in the forecourt of Parliament Thursday in unprecedented scenes of unruliness, capping three days of acrimonious debate inside the House over preserving the dignity of B R Ambedkar.

Two BJP MPs were hospitalised with injuries as Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi became the centre of the ruling party's accusations, including one by a woman MP who said he misbehaved with her NDA leaders filed a police complaint against him for "attempt to murder, physical assault and incitement".

The sordid incident perhaps without parallel started in the morning as BJP and opposition MPs marched towards each other over Union Home Minister Amit Shah's comments on Ambedkar. As the two groups came closer, tempers and voices rose, soon

resulting in a melee. Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said he was pushed so violently that he lost his balance and sat down. "Now they are the ones who are accusing us of shoving them," the 82-year-old said.

However, the more apparent injuries were sustained by BJP's Balasore MP Pratap Sarangi, 69, who had to get stitches in the temple. His colleague Mukesh Rajput was also injured in the head.

The Congress vehemently denied the charges. Party general secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra said Rahul Gandhi and the others were protesting peacefully, but were prevented from entering Parliament by BJP MPs carrying "sticks", it said. The BJP MPs were seen carrying placards pinned to sticks. "BJP MPs stopped, threatened and intimidated me," Rahul Gandhi said. The Congress also filed a complaint against the

BJP in the Parliament House police station. Both sides also complained to the respective Chairs in the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha against each other. The scuffles and the controversy served to unite the opposition in defending Rahul Gandhi. National Conference leader Omar Abdullah said he knew Rahul Gandhi and he would not push anyone.

The trouble broke out minutes before both Houses were to convene at 11 am.

A number of MPs of the ruling BJP-led National Democratic Alliance were protesting at the steps of Parliament's 'Makar Dwar', an entrance and exit reserved for lawmakers, against the Congress' alleged insult of Ambedkar, while MPs from the Congress and its allies were demonstrating over Union Minister Home Amit Shah's remarks on Ambedkar and accused the BJP of slighting the

architect of the Constitution. BJP MPs claimed that Gandhi tried to push his way inside Parliament through the middle of the stairs where they were standing, ignoring a side passage, and caused injuries in the ensuing jostling. However, some opposition MPs claimed that the BJP members refused to give way to Gandhi who was heading to the Lok Sabha to attend the House proceedings. BJP member Nishikant Dubey accused Gandhi of pushing Sarangi. "Are you not ashamed Rahul, you are resorting to

rowdy behaviour ('gundagardi'). You pushed an old man," a furious Dubey told Gandhi. "He pushed me," Gandhi countered Dubey, walking off after having a cursory look at Sarangi, who was being attended to by fellow BJP members. Sarangi was later wheeled off to an ambulance. "Rahul Gandhi pushed an MP, who fell on me and I got injured," he told reporters as BJP members squatted at the Makar Dwar raising slogans against the Congress. Hitting out at Gandhi,

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said appropriate action would be taken in the matter. "Parliament is not a place to show physical strength. It is not a wrestling ring," he said. Dubey told reporters, "I am a four-time MP, I have seen something like this for the first time. I have never seen Congress leaders barging into the BJP's protest or BJP members doing the same when Congress protests. Why did the Congress disrupt the BJP's protest today? This shows that their only aim is hooliganism." A number of ruling

alliance MPs, including Union ministers, met their injured colleagues in the hospital as the incident blew up into a major row.

Both Houses witnessed massive uproar amid 'Jai Bhim' chants from both sides and were adjourned without witnessing any transaction.

Congress MPs met Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla and submitted a

Konyak on the incident and she also met him in his chamber. "I am looking into it. She was literally in tears," he said in the House.

The Congress and other opposition parties have seized on a part of Home Minister Amit Shah's reference to Ambedkar in his Rajya Sabha speech Tuesday to target the BJP and demand his resignation.

Shah, defended by Modi and other senior members of the BJP and its allies, has accused the Congress of distorting his speech. The BJP has instead cited the alleged insults to Ambedkar and neglect of his legacy during the long years of the Congress' rule to launch its counter-protest.

In a letter to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, Kharge claimed he was pushed by BJP MPs, lost his balance and was forced to sit on the ground, injuring his knees that have already undergone surgery. He has demanded an inquiry into the "attack".

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Thursday said he was praying for the speedy recovery of BJP's Balasore MP Pratap Sarangi, claiming that he got injured because of the 'irresponsible and objectionable' behaviour of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi in Parliament. Majhi said "such actions" of Gandhi were not only "unacceptable" but also an insult to the "sacred house of democracy".

"Due to irresponsible and objectionable behaviour of Rahul Gandhi in Parliament, our senior party leader and Lok Sabha MP from Balasore Shri @pcasarangi ji got injured. Such actions of Rahul Gandhi are not only unacceptable but it is also an insult to the sacred house of democracy," he said in a post on X. "I pray for the speedy recovery of Shri @pcasarangi ji and strongly condemn such

acts in Parliament. This type of violence has no place in a democracy," he added.

Body of class 11 girl student found hanging in hostel bathroom

Bhawanipatna(KCN): The body of a class 11 girl student was found hanging in her hostel bathroom in Odisha's Bhawanipatna town Thursday, police said.

When her hostel inmates found the bathroom locked from inside in the morning and no one was responding, they informed the hostel authority. Later, with the help of local police, the door was broken open and Tofali's body was found hanging from the shower pipe tied with a towel, a police officer said.

None should play politics over melee in Parliament: BJD



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha's main opposition party Biju Janata Dal (BJD) Thursday said there should be no politics over the alleged physical alteration between MPs of the Congress and BJP in Parliament earlier in the day. The BJD, headed by former chief minister Naveen Patnaik, said that the incident has belittled the glory of Parliament. Stating that it is the duty and responsibility of all to upkeep the dignity of Parliament, BJD

spokesperson Lelin Mohanty said that there is no place for violence in democracy. "Realising the importance of non-violence, BJD president Naveen Patnaik has proposed that the word - 'Ahimsa' should be included in the Preamble of the Constitution," Mohanty said. The regional party demanded that action be taken against the persons responsible for Thursday's incident in

Parliament. "There should be no politics over this incident. No one is above the law, be him/her an MLA, MP or son of a governor," the BJD said. The words 'son of a governor' alluded to Odisha Governor Raghubar Das's son Lalit Kumar who allegedly assaulted a Raj Bhavan official in Puri July 7.

Now when government is giving the mantra to everyone to be self-reliant, it will be appropriate for the country's economy that the banks should also make efforts to become self-reliant with transparency from now on.

To make them self-reliant, the government should also relax the restrictions imposed on its behalf so that the dependence of banks on the government can be reduced.

One more fact has been observed that fixed deposits are decreasing in banks, so it is necessary that banks provide additional facilities to lure the

customers.

After considering all discussed above, it is also a fact that banks will have to bear additional expenses for providing additional facilities. That's why there is a need for such a product which can provide a win-win feeling to both i.e. to customers as well as to the bank after absorbing the burden of increased expenses.

1) Fixed deposit of 10000/- should be mandatory for this product and deposit facility in multiples of 1000/- can be given.

2) A zero balance savings account and a loan account will automatically be opened as soon as the term deposit account starts.

3) At the time of fixed deposit, complete KYC will cover all these three accounts.

90% to 95% maximum of the fixed deposit amount which in turn provide an upper hand to bank management.

5) Now zero balance savings account will have to be offered under this facility to the depositor who in turn use it like his ordinary savings account. That means any type of dividend, pension, salary, etc. can be deposited directly in the savings account and withdrawal from this should be similar to general SB a/c.

6) Arrange to issue savings account cheque Book as per RBI rules.

7) Similarly, Debit ATM card should not only be issued free of cost, but also keep it free from annual fees. The rest conditions will remain same as in ordinary SB a/c i.e. as per RBI rules.

8) SMS facility will be provided free of cost

9) Whenever a customer issues a cheque for payment which is excess than SB balance then that will absorb first SB balance and thereafter remaining amount will be utilised out of overdraft limit

10) Whenever any amount gets deposited in a savings account then after utilising OD balance rest will appear as SB balance

11) As regards interest, SB a/c gets credit of same as per savings account rules and FD will be dealt as per agreed terms subject to

RBI rules.

12) OD interest will be calculated on product basis @ 1% or 2% more than FD interest and the same will be debited to SB a/c every month


The above are some major minimum points besides banks are free to frame out few more to have transparency as there is still a lot of space in the above proposal.

Cold storage woes cripple agriculture

Kendrapara (KCN): Lack of cold storage units has significantly impacted the agrarian prosperity of this district while the infrastructure bottleneck has forced the people to rely on imports from neighbouring states throughout the year. The absence of cold storage facilities has also rendered the Potato Mission initiative of the state government ineffective.

According to sources, the government is providing incentives for the construction of private cold storage facilities, but exorbitant energy bills have deterred young entrepreneurs from investing in this critical infrastructure. Entrepreneurs like Swaraj Samal, and intellectuals including Ashish Kumar Senapati, Radhakanta Mohanty, Prashant Kumar Nayak, and Rajesh Kumar Behera, have emphasised that cold storage units are crucial for sustaining the agricultural economy. The gravity of the problem can be gauged from the fact that only 49 out of 129 cold stores in



the state's 314 blocks are operational. The infrastructure crunch is severely affecting the state's agricultural economy, said sources. In Kendrapara, industrialist Rabi Sahu built a cold storage at Shyamasundarpur in 1985 with a bank loan. It was operating for nearly 15 years but later it was shut down due to pending electricity bills. The cold store had initially provided stimulus to potato cultivation in the district, but after its closure, the cultivation declined. Currently, local agricultural produce cannot be preserved, resulting in year-round dependence on

vegetables imported from other states to meet the district's demands. Vegetables like potatoes, onions and bananas are being imported, which are often toxic, but consumers are forced to purchase them. If cold storage facilities were established, small agro-industries like tomato sauce and potato chip manufacturing units could also thrive. Despite government incentives, high electricity bills remain a major hurdle for sustenance of the cold stores that are essential for ensuring fair prices for farmers' produce. Subsidies and streamlined processes, such as single-window clearance for loans, can encourage

Kaptipada IIC attacked by sand smugglers

Udaala (KCN) : Inspector-in-charge (IIC) of Kaptipada police station Prakash Kumar Rath sustained injuries after he was allegedly attacked by sand smugglers in Mayurbhanj district Wednesday. Whatever happened today, gives us confidence ahead of MCG Test - Rohit

New Delhi: While the third Test of the Border-Gavaskar Trophy ended in a dull draw at the Gabba, talking points were rife about various sub-plots in the series thus far. The five-match series is locked at 1-1 with two games left and both sides have areas to address on, more so India. Amongst them is the dip in form for skipper Rohit Sharma who has looked a pale shadow of his usual self in this series. The 37-year-old, who missed the first Test due to paternity leave, has only managed 19 runs across the three innings since his return to the side. Since his century in the Dharamsala Test against England in March this year, Rohit has only gone past fifty once in 13

innings. During this phase, he has been dismissed in single digits nine times and the fragile nature of his stints at the crease has been more concerning than the lack of runs. Rohit was honest in admitting his extended lean patch but maintained that it wasn't an emotional baggage for him just yet.

"Yeah, I have not batted well. There is no harm in accepting that," said Rohit at the post-match press conference. "But I know what's in my mind. How I am preparing myself. All those boxes are very much ticked. It's just about spending as much time as possible [batting]."

"Which I am pretty sure I am just there. As long as my mind, my body, my feet are moving well, I

am pretty happy with how things are panning out for me. Sometimes those numbers can tell you that it's been a while since he has got big runs. But for a person like me, I think it's all about how I feel in my mind. What kind of prep I am having before each game. And how I am feeling about myself. That's the most important thing."

"And I am feeling good about myself, to be honest. Yeah, runs are obviously not showing that. But inside it's a different feeling."

Rohit's words could come across as those of a veteran who is trying to hold his own amidst a crisis at the fag end of his career. However, given the way India have managed to cling on in the series despite having

performed well below their potential suggests that this could be the team's generic method to cope with pressure. Having been bowled out for a paltry total on the opening day of the series in Perth, the visitors roared back to record a gargantuan win at the



Optus Stadium. While they were outplayed at the Adelaide Oval, India managed to get themselves out of trouble at the Gabba with vital batting contributions even as inclement weather played a major role. Rohit underlined the fighting mentality of his

side and lauded the team's ability to soak up pressure in a stoic manner. "This thing has been, in our team for a while now, that we don't give up easily, whatever the situation. We want to keep fighting. Even when we bowled in the second

innings, we had the same intensity that we wanted to bowl them out for 60-70 runs because we knew they would play their shots and look to score quickly. That gives you opportunities and we get some as well. But we didn't have enough time to chase 270-280 in 50 overs."

Ultimately, 13 deliveries were all that were bowled before rain had the final say. It wouldn't be wrong to say that bad weather worked massively in India's favour, given how far behind in the game they were after the first innings had ended. That said, Australia were also a bowler short after Josh Hazlewood's mishap on the fourth morning of the game, leaving the neutrals with a bit of 'what could have been'. Rohit on his part felt that it could have been anybody's game.

Dunith Wellalage left out for New Zealand T20Is

New Delhi: Sri Lanka have left out spinning all-rounder Dunith Wellalage for the upcoming three-match T20I series in New Zealand, starting next week. It is the only change from the Lankan squad that faced New Zealand at home in their previous bilateral assignment. That series featured a 17-man squad for Sri Lanka who have named a 16-member touring party for the return T20I series.

Charith Asalanka continues to lead the side, which has a good mix of pace and spin in their team balance. All-rounder Chamindu Wickramasinghe, who debuted in the last series, retains his pace by being the lone seam-bowling all-rounder in the squad. It was arguably the competition for this spot



that saw Wellalage being left out, given the nature of conditions in New Zealand.

The prominent all-rounder in the squad, Wanindu Hasaranga leads the spin unit alongside Maheesh Theekshana and leggie Jeffrey Vandersay. Nuwan Thushara, Matheesha Pathirana and Asitha Fernando head the pace department with tall left-

arm pacer Binura Fernando being the support option. The first two T20Is of the series will be played on December 28 and 30 respectively, at the Bay Oval in Mount Maunganui, while the final game will be held at Saxton Oval, Nelson. Ashwin always more cerebral than emotional, except on his final day

New Delhi: R Ashwin almost tripped as he walked into the wrong room late on Wednesday afternoon in the bowels of the Gabba. He'd just emerged from the Indian dressing-room some 15 minutes after play had been called off on Day 5 at the Gabba. He tripped mainly because he spotted me, standing not too far away waiting to do my post-match radio interview with Mitchell Starc. He hadn't yet announced his retirement officially. But there had been enough signs for an hour or so that it was coming. And when our eyes met, I couldn't help but mouth "congratulations da" in his direction.

He nodded. Even flashed a brief smile, before nearly losing his balance on a protrusion near the door to the indoor nets, where unbeknownst to him, Ravi Shastri was conducting the post-

match presentations with the two captains. "Paathukoda (careful man)" I yelled out, to which he smiled again. A slightly wider smile this time. There was no time or space for words to be exchanged. They weren't required.

I could see he was emotional. Probably the most emotional he's ever come across or looked around a cricket ground. His eyes looked a tad puffy. How could they not? He was after all bringing an end to what he'd dreamt of doing throughout his life, before getting to live that dream for over 13 years. Playing cricket for his country. Not to forget achieving the kind of success few have while donning the India Test cap.

Ashwin did find the Indian team media manager eventually before accompanying him and Rohit Sharma



thinks than what he feels. Even if deep inside he's always remained an emotional man who doesn't mind wearing his emotions on his sleeve. But that's always been camouflaged or been overshadowed by the power of his mind, along with the expansive powers of curiosity and intelligence around his art form.

In Ashwin's hands, off-spin was the perfect blend of being an art and a science. It's not that there was no feel about the way in which he'd prise out wickets. But there was always a lot of thought, both in the way he worked on his own skills and in the way he worked out his opponents. And it stayed till the very end. For someone who prided himself on being the ultimate problem-solver with ball in hand, Ashwin always had questions. That was probably his greatest strength as a cricketer. It really came to the fore in my relationship with him four years ago as he set about plotting Australia's downfall during the Border-Gavaskar Trophy of 2020-21. If it wasn't something related to the form or fashion of some of his opponents, it was about the pitch or the curators, and recent history at a particular venue. He of course had access to all the stats and the numbers within his own dressing-room. But there was always scope for more information if you were Ashwin. If nothing, it was just the opinion of someone who'd been at ground

level to witness an innings or a spell or even a nets session at times that he sought in our conversations. How he stored all of it, I'd never know. His appetite for content was insatiable. And by the end of that particular series, I'd realised all the questions had come from him, despite me being the journalist. And that hunger for inputs remained the same till before what we now know to be his final Test and international match for India.

A couple of days before the Adelaide Test, he pulled me aside for a chat by the nets. The early part of our interaction was all match-related. About players in the Sheffield Shield and their performances. He also wanted to know where he could find highlights of the last Shield game that had been played at the Adelaide Oval prior to the Test. To see how the surface had behaved when Lloyd Pope had spun South Australia to victory over Victoria. Speak of leaving nothing to chance in terms of preparation. That was Ashwin to a tee. The chat then extended beyond cricket briefly though. He spoke about being in a "happy space" in life, about being very happy with his life, and everything he'd managed to achieve and overcome in his career. It was a happy moment. He then walked away to face some throwdowns from Gautam Gambhir before being informed by the head coach about being picked in the XI for the second Test in Adelaide. That'll probably be my abiding memory of Ashwin in his last two weeks as an international cricketer. He looked like a man at peace.
