In 1876 demand to open Entrance class was submitted before education

committee by Trilochan Suar/Supkar alias Brahma. Subsequently in 1885 Permission were granted to have an entrance at Sambalpur. In 1850 when no one of Sambalpur can think above giving education to their Sons, Trilochan Suar/Supkar alias Brahma not only think but also dare to admitted his two daughters in the "Sambalpur Public School" which is presently renamed as Chandra Shekhar Behera Zilla School. After lighting the lamp infront of Maa

After Mukesh Khanna, Kumar Vishwas takes a dig at Sonakshi; Congress reacts

Poet Kumar Vishwas has made an indirect sly comment about veteran Hindi film actor Shatrughan Sinha and his daughter Sonakshi Sinha and said that "the 'Lakshmi' of your house is taken by someone else." Vishwas was speaking at a poetry event in Meerut, Uttar Pradesh, where he made the comments.

He said: "Teach your children about the Ramayana, otherwise, it might happen that your house is named 'Ramayana', but the 'Lakshmi' of your house is taken by someone else."

A clip has now gone viral, where he is seen making the comment, which seems to be satire on Shatrughan as his Mumbai residence is named 'Ramayana'. His daughter Sonakshi recently married her boyfriend of seven years Zaheer Iqbal.

Congress leader Supriya Shrinete has come out in support of the Sinhas and criticised Vishwas's comment. She asked Vishwas that if he had a daughter in his own home, would he make such derogatory comments about "someone else's daughter".

Taking to X, she wrote in Hindi: "Kumar Vishwas ji, not only did you make a disgusting remark about Sonakshi Sinha's interfaith marriage, but you also revealed your true thoughts about women. 'Your words, 'Otherwise, someone else will take your home's Lakshmi away' — do you think a woman is an object that anyone can just take away? How long will people like you continue to treat women as property of their father and then their husband? 'The foundation of marriage and



companionship is equality, mutual trust, and love. No one 'takes' anyone away. And in 2024, you are questioning someone's upbringing just because they marry someone of their own choice?!" She questioned Vishwas if a woman doesn't have the right to marry whoever she wants.

"Or will self-appointed guardians of religion decide who eats what, who wears what, who loves whom, and whom they marry? And by the way, no one should be questioning upbringing when your own bouncers beat up a respected doctor—this is your failure if such things happen under your watch." She added: Neither

Shatrughan Sinha ji nor his successful daughter Sonakshi need your certification, but your comment on a girl 17 years younger than you exposes your narrow thinking. Neither Lord Ram nor the Ramayana belong to anyone's inheritance, nor does any associated name." "You, who give sermons about other

people's children reading the Ramayana and Gita, forgot that in the Ramayana, there is mutual love. Had you truly studied it, you would understand love. You are eager to be a storyteller of Ram Katha, but you have none of Lord Ram's grace and decorum." She urged him to apologize, "realizing your mistake, to both a father and his daughter." Supriya Shrinete also shared a video message of the same and said: "Your recent distasteful comment on Sonakshi Sinha's interfaith marriage was not just a cheap jibe but it also revealed your deeply ingrained misogynistic mindset..."

Recently, actor Mukesh Khanna, who played "Shaktimaan", had taken a dig at Sonakshi. However, he was later schooled by the actress.

I meet people who say they have watched Gangaajal 40-50 times, so I don't really think there's any need to release it in theatres again," he mentioned. When asked about the update on the sequel of

his films, Prakash Jha said, "We are working on Raajneeti 2, the script is being written. We are also working on the Gangaajal sequel, work is in progress on its script too. The police-society dynamics always have issues, and that makes for a good film. While we do make films for entertainment, it sometimes does leave an impact on the people, and that's quite a great thing." He also admitted that they are also thinking of making a film on Sunanda Pushkar, which according to him is an 'interesting subject'. Jha also shared that a capsule of new episodes of Ashram will also drop soon. Talking more about the

show, the filmmaker said that while they always believed in the show, they never expected the web series to gain so much popularity. While Ashram 3 gained love, it also garnered protests from different sections of religious groups. Addressing the same, Jha said, "Honestly, it's a constant process. When we say something at home, it sometimes evokes different reactions, and sometimes it's also taken out of context. Similarly, a content piece may not be taken the same way by everyone, and there would be dissent but one needs to keep working on it."

How Anglo-Indians Celebrate Christmas and Maintain Identity

Despite their Indian heritage, the Anglo-Indian community proudly asserts its unique identity, a vibrant tapestry woven from both Indian and European threads. Numbering around two lakh across India, with approximately two thousand residing in Delhi, this community stands out for their consistent use of English, often the language spoken within their own homes. Christmas holds a special significance for Anglo-Indians, and the annual Christmas dance is a highly anticipated event. Every year on December 26th, members of the community gather at the Frank Anthony School in Delhi for a lively dance that stretches from the evening into the early hours of the morning. As writer and Anglo-Indian community figure, late Keith Flory used to say, "It's always fun to be a

part of it. With Delhi is so vast, these events provide a rare opportunity to reconnect with friends and family." The Anglo-Indian community also boasts a remarkable legacy of accomplished individuals, including Oscar Stanley Dawson (ex-Chief of the Indian Navy), Roger Binny (former Indian cricketer), Leslie Claudius (hockey legend), actress Diana Hayden, Wilson Jones (billiards world champion), Denzil Keelor and Trevor Keelor (IAF heroes of the 1971 war), and quizmaster and MP Derek O'Brien, among many others. The Anglo-Indian community's journey has been one of constant adaptation and evolution. Teacher and community member, Sydney Reberio, observes, "While we are becoming more and more Indian, the urban Indian middle class is turning western. Now, we don't mind dancing to Hindi film songs, a shift from perhaps 15 years ago." This demonstrates a dynamic interplay between cultural influences. Understanding Anglo-Indian Heritage The Anglo-Indian identity

is rooted in a history of mixed lineage, dating back 300 years to the colonial era. In the 18th century, the British East India Company encouraged its employees to marry local women, even offering financial incentives for each child born from these unions. However, by the late 19th century, with the arrival of more British women following the construction of the Suez Canal, such mixed marriages became less common. Following India's independence, many Anglo-Indians faced the difficult choice of whether to stay or leave. Many left in the 1950s and 1960s, mainly for Canada, Australia, New Zealand, and the UK," recounts Brother Solomon of Delhi Brother Society (DBS) Despite this emigration, the Anglo-Indian presence in India remains, particularly in cities like Kolkata, Delhi, Chennai, and Mumbai. It was DBS that established the St. Stephen's College in Delhi. It has recently opened St. Stephen's Cambridge School in Delhi-Haryana border. While often associated with other Indian cities,



the Anglo-Indian community in national capital has a long and rich history, even preceding the city's establishment as the capital. As employment opportunities increased, many Anglo-Indian families migrated to Delhi, initially settling in areas such as Mori Gate, Kashmere Gate, and the railway colony of Kodia Pull, where many found work in the railways. Notably, M. Gatlin, a member of the 1928 and 1932 Indian hockey squads, hailed from Mori Gate. The community's influence expanded alongside Delhi's growth as a capital. Many Anglo-Indians secured jobs in government departments like the Post and Telegraph, Railways, and Customs. They then established themselves in newer

areas like Chelmsford Road, Atul Grove Road, Janpath Lane, and Connaught Place. Who was their mentor? Frank Anthony was the mentor of the Anglo Indian community. He was from Jabalpur though settled here in Delhi. He was also a member of the Constituent Assembly. "Frank Anthony established the Frank Anthony School in South Delhi. Its junior school ran from the same place where the Gidney Club is located, until 1975. He was elected president of the All India Anglo-Indian Association in 1942. He opposed the partition of India on the grounds that it would endanger the interests of minority communities. When the future of India was being decided by British, Hindu, and Muslim leaders, he presented the

case of the Anglo-Indian community before Mahatma Gandhi, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, and Jawaharlal Nehru. He was nominated to the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Seventh, Eighth, Tenth, and Eleventh Lok Sabha," informs Brother Solomon George of Delhi Brother Society and prominent member of Protestant Christian community of Delhi. He is closely connected with local Anglo Indian communi Key Landmarks and Achievements Today, landmarks like the Gidney Club in Connaught Place and the Frank Anthony School in Lajpat Nagar stand as key pillars of the Anglo-Indian community in Delhi. The school, founded in 1959 by esteemed community leader and long-time Lok

Sabha member, Frank Anthony, serves as a center for education and community gatherings. "Anglo-Indians are known for their openness. They readily embrace intermarriage and take pride in their dual heritage. Social grace, refined manners, and a love for music and club life are often considered defining aspects of their culture," says Brother Solomon George, who also works as a priest in Church. Community Life and Legacy The Gidney Club, established in the 1930s, remains a vital social hub, hosting birthday parties, meetings, and casual card games for its members. Professor Sydney Rebeiro, an English professor at Delhi University, notes that Anglo-Indian women were pioneers in the workforce, frequently employed as secretaries, teachers, nurses, stenographers, and telephone operators. He emphasizes the preference for Anglo-Indian women in such roles, largely due to their proficiency in English. Professor Rebeiro's own mother, Mary Isaacs Rebeiro,

was a trailblazer, becoming Independent India's first woman postmistress, initially at Mori Gate and later at the GPO in Kashmere Gate. The community's deep connection to Delhi is also evident in their emotional attachment to St. James' Church at Kashmere Gate, also known as Skinner's Church. This historic church, built in 1836 by Colonel James Skinner, an Anglo-Indian himself, stands as a testament to their enduring legacy within the city. Skinner's father was a Scot, Lieutenant-Colonel Hercules Skinner, while his mother was a Rajput. This makes it perhaps the first church built by an Anglo Indian. the Baba Saheb Bhimrao Ambedkar Shikshaarth and Charitable Trust. Chief Minister Saini described the life of Maharaja Surajmal as both inspiring and exemplary for the younger generations. He stated that Maharaja Surajmal's name is held with immense pride and honour among the rulers who stood strong against the Mughals in North India. At the young age of 14, Maharaja Surajmal assumed control of the administration of the Bharatpur state and went on to expand it through numerous victorious battles. The Chief Minister further emphasized that Maharaja Surajmal expanded the Bharatpur state significantly through his foresight, courage, and bravery. His kingdom stretched from the Ganga in the east, to Chambal in the south, Agra in the west, and Delhi in the north. Rather than relying on warfare, Maharaja Surajmal ensured peace and security for his people through diplomacy. His strategic brilliance was evident



when he turned the cannons of Abdali aimed at him through his efficient strategy. C M Saini stated that his primary goal is to ensure the welfare and upliftment of farmers, labourers, people belonging to scheduled castes and backward classes, and the overall development of the state. He emphasized that it is the government's duty to protect the honour and self-respect of every citizen. The government has drawn inspiration from the great personality of Maharaja Surajmal ji, and in his footsteps, has implemented numerous public welfare policies. The Chief Minister

With the formation of the government, 24,000 youth have joined government jobs, and to date, 1.71 lakh youth have been given government jobs.

He further said that in the coming time, two lakh more youth will be given jobs without the need for Parchi and Kharahi (recommendation and bribes). Not only has the government established a corporation to protect youth from exploitation, but it has also ensured their future security through legislation. As part of this initiative, drones worth up to Rs 8 lakh are being provided free of cost. To date, free drones have been given to 100 women. "Vegetable Knife For Bypass Surgery": Jagdeep Dhankhar On No-Trust Motion

New Delhi: "Never use a vegetable-cutting knife for bypass surgery" - Rajya Sabha Chairperson Jagdeep Dhankhar declared Tuesday, in his first comments since the opposition's motion of no-confidence in his stewardship of the Upper House was junked for procedural irregularities. "Just look at the notice against the Vice President... (as Vice President, Mr Dhankhar is the de facto Chairperson of the Rajya Sabha) ... You'll be shocked. (Former Prime Minister) Chandrasekharji once said, 'Never use a vegetable cutting-knife for bypass surgery'," he said. "That notice wasn't even

a vegetable-cutting knife... it was rusted. There was haste. When I read it, I was astonished," Mr Dhankhar said at gathering of women journalists, "But what surprised me more was that none of you read it. If you had... you wouldn't have slept for days!" He also stressed the need for the right to expression, calling it "the definition of democracy", and held forth on the subject, saying "If expression is qualified, compromised, or made subject to coercion, democratic values are flawed. It is antithetical to democratic evolution." "Before you use your vocal cords... allow your

ears to entertain the other point of view. Without these two elements, democracy can neither be nurtured nor blossom," Mr Dhankhar said. The motion - filed in protest by the Congress after claiming Mr Dhankhar refused to allow its MPs to respond to attacks by those from the BJP - on the Sonia Gandhi-George Soros issue - was rejected on various grounds, including Mr Dhankhar's name being misspelt and the lack of a 14-day notice period. Deputy Chairman Harivansh declared the motion had been tabled to create a 'narrative' against Mr Dhankhar.

"No Discrepancy": Poll Commission Brushes Off Congress Allegation On Maharashtra Election

New Delhi(KCN): The Election Commission has brushed off Congress allegations in two key areas on which the party had sought a reply, insisting there is no discrepancy in the voter turnout figures or deletion from voter lists. On October 19, Maharashtra's Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi had met the Commission on multiple issues. The Congress - an ally in the Opposition alliance -- had complained about the inexplicable increase in voter turnout between the numbers of 5 pm and the final figures from the commission.

The Commission denied any discrepancy, and asserted that considering the 5 pm turnout as final is merely a misconception. While the voting officially ends at 5 pm in most places, those already at the polling booth are allowed to cast their votes however long it takes. But Odisha's Biju Janata Dal, which has also raised questions about the same issue yesterday, pointed out that prior to 2014, this discrepancy was minor,



mostly around 2 per cent. In the Lok Sabha and assembly elections held earlier this year, the discrepancy was much higher in most places. In the Chief Minister's constituency, it was over 30 per cent, the BJD had pointed out.

Regarding the Congress allegations of arbitrary deletion from voters' list, then Commission said a total of 8,00,391 voters' names were deleted this time. The figures indicate an average of 2,779 names per

constituency. The Commission said the Congress complaint of addition of 50,000 voters in 50 assembly constituencies of Maharashtra was "misleading" and "factually incorrect". In only five constituencies, the total addition were over 50,000 electors, the Commission said. The poll body said it is committed to a respectful, collaborative relation with all political parties, so critical for healthy democracy. IT said it welcomes suggestions for any improvement in the Electoral process.

'Ganjam Darshan' falters as buses gather dust at depot

Berhampur(KCN): To attract more tourists to Ganjam's scenic destinations, the district administration had introduced the 'Ganjam Darshan' bus service, assigning its operations to the Berhampur Development Authority (BeDA). However, the project failed to roll out as anticipated and the brand-new buses have been gathering dust at the City Bus Depot in Haladiapadar near Berhampur. Initially launched with much fanfare, the service faced a significant setback due to high ticket prices, which led to a decline in passenger numbers and ultimately rendered the project unsuccessful. As a result,

the buses have been left unused for an extended period, exposed to weather conditions at the BeDA office premises. Moreover, the BeDA and the district administration took no measures to reuse the buses by reviving the service. The 'Ganjam Darshan' bus service was inaugurated by former Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik December 12, 2022, with an aim of showcasing key destinations across the district to the tourists. The itinerary included stops at scenic and cultural tourist sites, with provisions for refreshments and lunch along the way. The bus service started operations a few days



after the inauguration and the first batch of tourists were from Sraddha Sanjeevani Ashram. Departing from Ramalingeswara

Park at 7am in the morning, the bus visited popular locations like the Tara Tarini temple shrine before taking a halt at the

Purushottampur Dak Bungalow for breakfast. Later, the bus took the tourists to Jaugarh, Nirmaljar and stopped at Bateswar for lunch.

The bus then left for Potagarh, Tampara Lake and reached Gopalpur beach by evening where the tourists were served snacks before returning to

Ramalingeswara Park in Berhampur by 6.45pm. The bus used to cover 165 kilometres for a ticket price of ₹950.

However, with rising fares from time to time, tourists expressed dissatisfaction, prompting the administration to add additional sites such as Biranchi Narayan temple at Buguda, Buddhakhola, Marada, Sarana Srikhetra, Singhasini, Taptapani, Ujjaleswar, Ghodahada dam, Maa Bala Kumari temple, Pati Sunapur and the Mahuri Kalua temple to the itinerary. Unfortunately, this expansion failed to revive the popularity of the tourist bus service.

The vehicles, now parked at the BeDA office, show visible signs of deterioration, including damaged tyres and peeling paint.

In addition to the 'Ganjam Darshan' buses, four buses were also introduced for trips to the hilltop Tara Tarini temple. These buses are also out of service now, gathering dust at the depot — a clear indication of the district administration's planning failure.

When contacted, Ramesh Hansda, secretary of BeDA said there are plans to reintroduce the bus service by floating a tender. Moreover, efforts are on to make the project successful, he added.

HC orders release of 6 MV Debi crew members



Paradip(KCN): Six among the 21 Vietnamese crew members aboard cargo ship MV Debi who have been detained at the Paradip Port since November 30 last year, were released by the Sunday evening following an order of the Orissa High Court Saturday. As per the conditions laid down by the court, six other crew members who arrived here boarded the ship in exchange for the released crew Sunday evening. The released crew will stay for two more days in the country, before subsequently returning to Vietnam, sources in the Customs department said. The remaining 15 crew members will be


released in phases in exchange of same numbers of sailors, a security officer said while adding that the clearance process is taking time due to foreign policy, legal restrictions and the court order. The clearance for the release of the crew was granted as per rules framed by International Maritime Organisation (IMO) which states that a sailor can stay for a maximum of nine months in ship, and has to unboard after completion of the period. Any period beyond nine months will take a toll on their physical and mental health. As per the directives issued by the Orissa High Court, a fresh group of 21 Vietnamese crew

members will replace them on the vessel.

Of the incoming crew, 11 members have already arrived in Paradip, while the remaining 10 are expected to join within a week. Medical examinations, Customs verifications, and immigration procedures for the new crew were completed by Saturday. MV Debi will, however, remain detained at the port. The vessel has been held at Paradip International Cargo Terminal (PICT), a private berth at Paradip Port, since November 30, 2023, after 22 packets of cocaine were discovered during loading of steel cargo. Customs authorities then reported that the seized drug were

valued at Rs 220 crore at the time. Since then, the ship and its crew, all Vietnamese nationals, have been put under detention. Initially docked at the berth, the vessel accrued berth occupancy charges, prompting PICT to file a complaint against the ship's owners in the High Court. The court later ordered the sale of the ship. However, the issue has not been resolved so far.

Later, the Customs department instructed the ship to remain in the anchorage area of the sea. The ship stayed in the anchorage area and occasionally docked at the berth to load food, water, and oil. On November 29, 2024, when the ship approached the berth, 21 sailors on board staged a protest. Since then, the ship has remained at the EQ berth. The primary reason for the protest was the sailors' demand to return home. The ship's owner is now making arrangements to send new crew members while facilitating the return of the current sailors to their homes.
