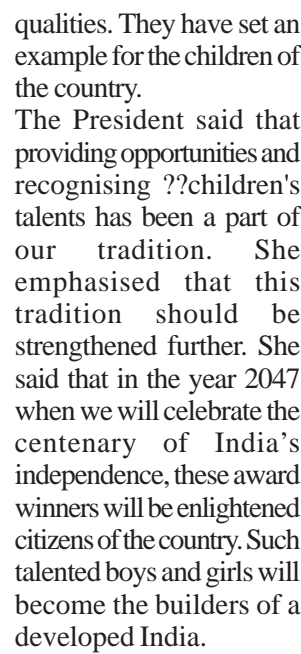

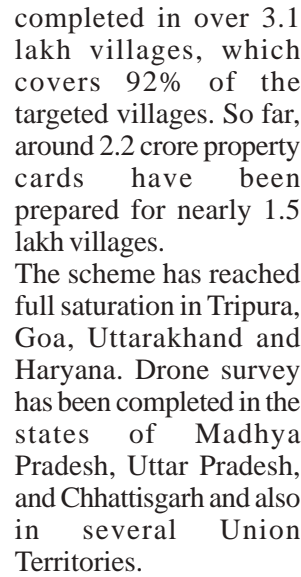

New Delhi, Dec 26(KCN): Indian Coast Guard (ICG) today successfully rescued nine Indian crew members from a sunken vessel, MSV Taj Dhare Haram, located approximately 311 km west of Porbandar, Gujarat in Pakistan's Search and Rescue Region (North Arabian Sea). The search and rescue mission, carried out under challenging sea conditions, showcased exceptional collaboration between the Maritime Rescue Coordination Centres (MRCCs) of Mumbai and Karachi, Pakistan. The vessel, which had set sail from Mundra, Gujarat, and headed to Socotra, Yemen, was battered by rough seas and onboard flooding. The distress call was detected by an ICG Dornier aircraft during a routine surveillance flight, prompting immediate action by the MRCC, Mumbai & ICG Regional Headquarters (North West) in Gandhinagar. ICGS Shoor, already on patrol nearby, was dispatched at top speed to the scene, while MRCC Pakistan alerted vessels in the area. After an intense search, the crew was located onboard a life raft, taking refuge after abandoning the vessel. The rescue operation was completed at around 4 PM, just before the vessel sank completely. All crew members were safely brought aboard ICGS Shoor, where they were provided medical assistance and declared in good health. The sailors are now en route to Porbandar Harbour.



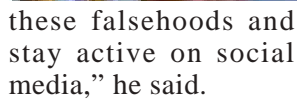

Talcher Fertilizer Back On Track



Bhubaneswar(KCN): The much awaited Talcher Fertilizers plant has been back on track with completion of over 60 percent of work for early commissioning of the plant, which will benefit lakhs of farmers from Odisha and other states. The Union government has undertaken the revival of the Talcher unit of M/s FCIL, located in Angul district. Accordingly, a joint venture company named Talcher Fertilizers Ltd. (TFL) has been incorporated for setting up a coal gasification-based Ammonia Urea Plant of 12.7 LMTPA capacity, which is first of its kind in India. According to official sources, the TFL has given contracts for coal gasification and ammonia urea packages to Wuhuan Engineering Company Ltd (WECL), China in September, 2019. The project was delayed December, 2019 onwards, after COVID-19 pandemic strikes immediately across the globe, having its epicenter at Wuhan, affected the progress of the project in a severe manner till May, 2020. Later, multiple waves of COVID-19 pandemic struck India which resulted in enforcement of lockdown at local levels thereby impacting the progress of project schedule, the sources

said. Further, the progress of the project has been impacted due to backlog in procurement, construction and equipment erection, they said. As on October 31, 2024, the overall progress of the project stood at 63.75 percent. As regards the Outside Battery Limit (OSBL) Packages, the overall progress is 73.95 percent. The OSBL Packages like OSBL Pipe rack, Plant lighting, Renovation of non-plant buildings, Boiler-1 & Raw water treatment plant & DM Water Plant are in advanced stage of completion, the source informed. Because of above mentioned reasons, the project could not be commissioned by the targeted timeline of September, 2024. The progress of the project is regularly reviewed by the JV partners and TFL Board and all efforts are being made by TFL for completion of the project. TFL is also conducting regular VCs with WECL, China Engineering team to resolve the pending engineering issues. Also, since July 2024, TFL has started deducting Mutually Agreed Damages (MAD) from bills of WECL under the existing contract provisions due to slow progress and delays in project completion. On completion of the project, the production of urea in the country will increase by 12.7 LMTPA and will assist in ensuring adequate and timely supply of fertilizers to the farmers in and around Odisha. Also, in addition to the socio-economic development in the region, the setting up of the project will also open up direct and indirect employment opportunities, they said.

Rs 2 crore assistance by Allu Arjun, makers of ‘Pushpa-2’ for family of stampede victim

Actor Allu Arjun, producers and director of ‘Pushpa 2: The Rule’ have announced Rs 2 crore for the family of the woman who was killed and her son who was critically injured during the premiere show of the movie at Sandhya Theatre December 4.

Allu Arjun’s father and well-known producer Allu Arvind made the announcement on Wednesday after meeting Sri Teja, who is undergoing treatment at KIMS Hospital.

Allu Arvind told media that the cheque was handed over to Dil Raju, chairman, Telangana State Film Development Corporation.

Allu Arvind said to support the boy and his family, the film unit decided to give financial assistance of Rs 2 crore. While Allu Arjun has



given Rs 1 crore, Mythri Movies, the producers of the movie have extended assistance of Rs 50 lakh. Film’s director Sukumar has also given Rs 50 lakh to the family. Allu Arvind said they

spoke to doctors and were happy to know that he is recovering.

Allu Arjun had announced Rs 25 lakh for the family two days after the incident. He had also assured all support to the

family including treatment expenses of the boy.

Sri Tej’s father Bhaskar had said Tuesday that he received a demand draft of Rs 10 lakh from Allu Arjun.

Bhaskar said that the actor’s manager is also in regular touch with the family to get updates on the boy’s condition. The family is receiving support from both the Telangana government

and Allu Arjun. Bhaskar said Minister for Roads & Buildings and Cinematography Komatireddy Venkat Reddy gave them a cheque of Rs 25 lakh.

The boy’s father said after 20 days, they noticed some body movement.

“He also opened his eyes but did not recognise any of us,” he said.

A woman named Revathi died and her son Sri Tej was critically injured in the stampede at Sandhya Theatre.

Actor Allu Arjun was arrested in the case December 13 and was released on interim bail the next day.

The Chikkadpally Police, which registered a case of culpable homicide not amounting to murder, interrogated Allu Arjun for more than three hours Tuesday.

'Rautu Ka Raaz' Review: Nawazuddin Siddiqui film has the right amount of thrill

'Rautu Ka Raaz' Review: The film highlights Nawazuddin Siddiqui's role in a thrilling cop drama, set in a small Uttarakhand village. Some films run on good storylines. Some, on star power. But when you see Nawazuddin Siddiqui headlining a project, and that too, a cop thriller, you can't help but take note.

That's where Zee5's latest offering, 'Rautu Ka Raaz' comes in. Set in the small, picturesque village of Rautu Ki Beli, the film is about a lazy murder investigation with sharp twists and even sharper turns. Let's decode if the film is worth your time.

Rautu, a small town in Uttarakhand, has witnessed no murders in the last 15 years. As a result, policemen in the village are extremely laid-back.



One fine morning, a sleepy Nawazuddin Siddiqui (SHO Deepak Negi) gets a call from Rajesh Kumar (sub-inspector Dimri) about the murder of a warden at a boarding school for the visually impaired. What they initially took for a natural death, turned out to be a never-ending rabbit hole with suspects, murders, disturbing incidents, politics and power. Nawazuddin Siddiqui leads the ship by

playing the rowdy SHO Deepak Negi. By rowdy, we don't mean the typical Bollywood masala film rowdy. He is intelligent, witty, knows when to say no, can get things done, disobeys seniors by standing firm on his grit and is unabashedly himself. He surely takes the bigger piece of the cake. Nawazuddin's comic timing, dialogue delivery, and demeanour have always taken him places. Thankfully, that

continues in 'Rautu Ka Raaz' too.

The film shines, thanks to its stellar star cast. Everyone is perfect in their respective parts. There's Rajesh Kumar as sub-inspector Dimri, carrying on the film's weight with his acting prowess and remarkable bro-code with Nawazuddin's character. This duo will make you believe in good cops.

Other supporting actors such as Atul Tiwari and Narayani Shastri (warden) do a decent job with their limited screen presence. 'Rautu Ka Raaz' has nothing that you have never seen. However, it is real. And it gets more wholesome as you near the second half. The film introduced real-life visually impaired characters, who make blink-and-miss appearances, maintaining credibility.

The Cost of the Dreaded Ivory Trade



Introduction
Elephants are considered a keystone species because they play a crucial role in maintaining the balance of ecosystems. Elephants eat a variety of fruits and plants, and their digestion helps disperse seeds over large distances. This supports plant biodiversity and forest regeneration. They successfully modify their environment by knocking down trees, digging waterholes, and creating paths through dense vegetation. These actions create habitats for other species, such as birds, insects, and smaller mammals. During dry seasons, elephants dig into the ground to access water, creating waterholes that benefit other animals and plants in arid areas. Elephant dung enriches the soil with nutrients, promoting the growth of plants. Their waste also supports insect populations, such as dung beetles. By trampling and grazing, elephants prevent grasslands from becoming overgrown with woody plants, ensuring that open savannas thrive and

support grazing species like antelopes and zebras. Elephants are a symbol of biodiversity conservation and attract ecotourism, which provides economic benefits to local communities and supports conservation efforts. By maintaining the balance of ecosystems, elephants indirectly support humans, ensuring clean air, water, and food resources for people and wildlife alike. Protecting elephants, therefore, has a ripple effect on the overall health of our planet. Link between gloval elephant poaching and ivory trade
Elephants are central to the ivory trade because their tusks are made of ivory, a highly valued material used to make ornaments, jewelry, and other decorative objects. Elephants are the primary source of ivory, harvested from their tusks. This demand has led to widespread poaching of elephants, especially in Africa. Despite international bans on ivory trade (e.g., CITES), illegal poaching persists due to high market demand, primarily in Asia. In some cultures, ivory is seen as a status symbol or has religious significance, driving the trade. Additionally, poverty in some regions pushes individuals into poaching for financial gain. Consequences of the Ivory Trade
Decline in Elephant Populations
The African elephant population has dramatically declined due

to poaching. Some regions have seen local extinction of elephants. Elephants are keystone species, meaning their loss disrupts ecosystems. They help maintain biodiversity by spreading seeds and shaping landscapes. Tourism-dependent economies suffer when elephant populations dwindle. Wildlife tourism often provides significant revenue to countries. The ivory trade fuels corruption, organized crime, and sometimes even armed conflicts, as criminal networks profit from illegal ivory trafficking. Efforts to stop poaching and trade require significant resources, collaboration between nations, and stricter enforcement of bans. Killing elephants for their tusks raises moral and ethical issues about human responsibility toward other species. Addressing the ivory trade involves enforcing bans, reducing demand, providing alternative livelihoods for communities, and supporting conservation initiatives. Decimation of global elephant populations
The global elephant population has significantly declined over the past century, primarily due to the ivory trade. Elephants have been hunted for their tusks, which are highly valued in the production of ornaments, jewelry, and other decorative items. Here's an overview of the impact of the ivory trade on

elephant populations:
1. Historical Decline: In the early 20th century, there were an estimated 10 million elephants in Africa alone. The rise in the ivory trade caused drastic declines. Between 1979 and 1989, Africa's elephant population halved, dropping from approximately 1.3 million to 600,000. Today, estimates suggest fewer than 415,000 African elephants remain in the wild, and the Asian elephant population is critically endangered, with fewer than 50,000 individuals.
2. Impact of the Ivory Trade: The demand for ivory surged in the mid-20th century, particularly in Asia, where ivory is used for traditional carvings and ornaments. Despite international bans, illegal poaching remains rampant. It's estimated that tens of thousands of elephants are killed annually for their tusks. Forest elephants in Central Africa have seen population declines of over 60% in just the past decade due to poaching.
3. Conservation Efforts and Challenges: In 1989, the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) banned the international trade in ivory. However, demand

persists, fueling illegal markets. In addition to poaching, habitat loss due to human expansion and climate change exacerbates the problem. Governments, NGOs, and local communities have implemented patrols, tracking systems, and awareness campaigns to combat poaching, but enforcement remains uneven.
4. Future Outlook: Without strict enforcement of anti-poaching laws, continued education about ivory alternatives, and sustainable conservation efforts, the survival of elephants remains at risk. While some countries have reported stable or slightly increasing populations, the overall global trend points to a decline. Current global status of illegal ivory trade
The illegal ivory trade remains a critical issue globally, fueled by demand for ivory in markets across Asia, despite international efforts to curb it. The Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) bans international trade in elephant ivory, yet enforcement challenges persist due to weak regulations, corruption, and demand loopholes. Several advancements and strategies are being implemented to combat this trade: Recent developments, such as the use of Raman

spectroscopy, enable rapid, non-invasive identification of illegal ivory. This technology can differentiate between elephant ivory (illegal) and mammoth ivory (legal), a distinction often exploited by traffickers. The EU and other regions have introduced stricter rules to close domestic ivory markets. While some progress has been made, legal ivory markets in countries like Japan and parts of Asia provide cover for laundering illegal ivory. The illegal ivory trade contributes to an annual loss of around 8% of the world's elephant population, endangering species survival. Poaching continues to thrive in regions with weak governance and high poverty levels. Although global attention and enforcement efforts have increased, challenges like high demand, legal loopholes, and insufficient funding for enforcement highlight the need for a more unified international approach. Future of the elephants from the context of ivory trade
The future of elephants in the context of the ivory trade is complex, tied closely to global conservation efforts, government policies, and public awareness. The demand for ivory has led to widespread poaching, particularly in Africa. Estimates suggest that tens of thousands of elephants are killed annually for their tusks,

severely threatening the animals. African elephants (both savanna and forest species) have seen significant population declines. Forest elephants, in particular, have suffered an 86% decline in some regions over 30 years due to poaching. In some regions, such as parts of Asia, ivory remains a status symbol or is used in traditional crafts, fueling demand. The Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) banned international ivory trade in 1989. While this helped reduce trade, enforcement gaps and legal loopholes remain. Countries like China, the U.S., and the U.K. have implemented domestic ivory bans, reducing demand. However, some countries, such as Japan, still allow domestic trade. Many nations have increased anti-poaching efforts, using technology like drones and GPS tracking, as well as better-equipped ranger teams. Challenges of elephant conservation
In some regions, corruption and limited resources hinder anti-poaching and trafficking enforcement. In communities near elephant habitats, poverty can push people toward poaching as a source of income. Beyond poaching, elephants face threats from habitat loss due to agriculture, mining, and infrastructure development. If current

trends in ivory bans and conservation continue, elephant populations could stabilize and even recover in some regions. Continued investment in education, tourism, and community development programs could provide sustainable alternatives to poaching. Without stronger international cooperation, enforcement, and habitat protection, elephants could face localized extinctions, especially in areas heavily affected by poaching and habitat loss. Increasing awareness and advocacy have proven effective in reducing demand for ivory. Campaigns showing the ecological importance of elephants and their suffering due to the trade have shifted public attitudes, particularly in consumer countries. Conclusion
The future of elephants depends heavily on the success of coordinated global efforts to combat the ivory trade, protect habitats, and involve local communities in conservation. While progress has been made, sustained action and vigilance are essential to ensure these iconic animals survive and thrive.

A fight for women's rights

Madhu Charan, a daughter of Rajasthan, is fighting against discrimination against women at the government level. For several decades, unmarried women in Rajasthan were being denied the right to become workers and assistants in Anganwadi centers. The Women and Child Development Department had made it mandatory for women applying for these posts to be married. Unmarried women could not even apply for it. Madhu fought a long legal battle in the Rajasthan High Court against this discrimination and won, but the government is still imposing conditions.

When applications were sought for the appointment of Anganwadi worker in Gudgi village of Balotra district in the year 2019, Madhu also applied but she was denied work saying that she is not yet married. On this, Madhu knocked the door of the High Court. After a legal battle that lasted for about five years, the Rajasthan High Court gave a verdict in favor of Madhu on 4 September 2023. In this decision, the High Court declared the condition of women being married as illegal and unconstitutional, calling it illogical and a violation of the rights of unmarried female candidates. However, the government argued in the High Court that if an unmarried girl is appointed in the Anganwadi center, then after marriage she will go somewhere else, which will disrupt the work of the Anganwadi center, but the court did not accept this

argument. The High Court made a strong comment in the decision and said that "The Rajasthan government has started a new chapter of discrimination between unmarried women and married women. Which is illegal and arbitrary. Considering a candidate ineligible for public employment just because she is unmarried is illogical. This is discriminatory and comes under the category of violating the fundamental rights given by the Constitution." The Women and Child Development wanted to appeal against the court's decision because the government advocate had advised to appeal. The department would have appealed but before that the matter came to the notice of the state's Deputy Chief Minister Diya Kumari. The Deputy Chief Minister gave

instructions to employ unmarried women by complying with the order of the High Court. On this, the government on 28 February 2024 approved the amendment in the rules and selection conditions for unmarried women to become Anganwadi workers and assistants in the state. On this, the selection conditions were amended by the department, making all women eligible to apply for the posts of Anganwadi workers and assistants. But the unfortunate situation is that despite this victory, the struggle of Madhu and thousands of women like her has not stopped yet. In fact, the Women and Child Development Department has accepted unmarried women as eligible under the court's decision but has imposed a new condition. The department is asking women to sign an

affidavit, in which it is written that if in future the woman will not be a resident of the concerned village due to marriage or any other reason, then she will automatically resign from the honorarium service and her honorarium service will be considered over. Now the department is ready to appoint Madhu as Anganwadi worker in compliance with the court's decision but she is being asked to submit an affidavit as mentioned above. Madhu is not willing to give this affidavit. Madhu says that the Women and Child Department does not seem to intend to comply with the decision of the Rajasthan High Court. Therefore, I do not accept this affidavit and signing it. The attitude of the department is anti-women. I will continue to fight against it. Madhu has questioned the state government and the Women and

Child Department about this new condition. Madhu has said in a letter sent to the department that when such a condition is not imposed while giving work on honorarium or contract to men in any government department, then why is it being imposed on women? This question is not of Madhu alone, but of thousands of women of the state who have been deprived of jobs for many years just because they are not married. The format of the affidavit is like imposing a new condition in a way. There is a huge number of single women in the country including Rajasthan, who are living a lonely life due to social neglect and social cultural reasons. Many women are forced to live an unmarried life due to reasons like not getting married due to some circumstances, not being able to get

married due to illness or disability etc. If we look at the census data, the number of single women in India has increased by 30 percent between the years 2001 and 2011. There are seven crore women in India who are either not married or are living as divorced or widows. This number is 12 percent of the population of our country. According to the report of a survey conducted by the National Forum for Single Women Rights (NFSWR) in seven states including Rajasthan, the condition of single women is worse in the states of North India as compared to the South. According to this report, single women in rural areas have to constantly grapple with social prejudices and struggle for survival. Single women are not only victims of physical and financial insecurity, but they also often have to face open discrimination. This is

a class of single women who are victims of circumstances. It is unfortunate that in our society the identity of women has been linked to men. Single, unmarried women are not seen in a positive light. Often their character is maligned. The kind of negative environment that exists in society towards single women is not seen towards single men. On one hand, governments claim to run welfare schemes for single women, while on the other hand, they are being denied jobs due to being unmarried. Madhu's struggle is against such discrimination and injustice, which should be appreciated.

Gaudiya dance, Bengal's own traditional classical dance.



Kolkata (Arindam Bhattacharya): The traditional Gaudiya Nritya of Bengal is one of the classical dances in India. This dance is more than two thousand years old. Which is also mentioned in Bharata's Natyasastra. Images of this dance are found in many ancient terracotta temple sculptures, ancient stone sculptures, metal sculptures and Daru (wood) sculptures during the pre-Pal, Pal and Sen eras of Bengal. Apart from this, Gaudiya Nritya can also be identified from many Bengali poems. The influence of Vaishnavism, Shaktatism and Shaivism can be seen in this dance. Bhava

Rasa literature of Bengal is related to Gaudiya dance. Nataraj of Bengal is called Nartyeswar. This dance is basically Nataraja Shiva-centric or Nataraj Krishna-centric. Dancing Ganesha and Vishnu are also seen in it. Images of Ganesh Vandana, Krishna Vandana etc. have been captured in their compositions. The costume of the Gaudiya dancers showcase Bengal's past. Gaudiya dance artist Dr. Mahua Mukhopadhyay has been working on this dance for 50 years. She said that the central government is responsible for protecting this traditional classical dance of Bengal.

Free Movement Limit On Indo-Myanmar Border Tightened To 10 Km, With Pass

Guwahati/New Delhi (KCN): The Centre has tightened the rules for movement of people from either side of the border in India and Myanmar, sources said. The new rules further restrict movements of people from 16 km under the free movement regime (FMR) to 10 km now, on either side. The FMR, which in its current form enables entry without visas and passports, began as a formal system in 1968 to allow tribes who share familial, social and ethnic ties on both sides of the border to keep in touch with their people. While the Centre has announced it would scrap the FMR, no official notification in this



regard was ever made, sources said. For Manipur, the Centre has asked the state to send two police personnel and two health officials to designated entry and exit points at the outposts of the Assam Rifles, the border-guarding and counter-insurgency force that operates under the Indian Army in Manipur. A total of 43 designated crossing points will be set up for holders of "border pass" issued by an authorised representative of the Assam Rifles, according to a letter sent by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) to the Manipur government. NDTV has seen the letter.

Police representatives will go to the places, where the Myanmar nationals have mentioned as their address of visit in India, to verify them. Any border pass holder found going beyond the 10-km zone or staying for more than seven days will be punished under India's laws, the rules say. In pilot mode, eight entry and exit points will be opened as soon as the two police and two health personnel are made available, and when the software to capture details of border pass holders is stabilised, the MHA said in the letter.

collectively known as Kuki, who are dominant in some hill areas of the state and who share ethnic ties with people in Myanmar's Chin State, have been fighting since May 2023 over a range of issues such as land rights, political representation, drugs trafficking, and illegal immigration. Indian and Myanmarese nationals were allowed to visit each other's territories up to 40 km without visas or passports after an agreement of sorts between the two neighbours in the 1950s. In 1968, India tightened the FMR with a new permit system. The rise of insurgency in Manipur, Mizoram, and Nagaland then sparked concerns over the FMR on the Indian side.

In 2004, India limited the FMR distance to 16 km from 40 km. In addition, instead of allowing people to cross from multiple points, only three places were allowed to be used as crossing points - Pangsau in Arunachal Pradesh, Moreh in Manipur, and Zokhawthar in Mizoram. In 2018, India and Myanmar signed the Agreement on Land Border Crossing, which added more regulations and harmonised the existing FMR. Manipur shares 400 km of the 1,640 km-long India-Myanmar border. Fencing on the mostly porous border has started. It is expected to take a couple of years to fence the entire length of the border completely.

The probe was supposed to have been completed on Tuesday and the PWD must have submitted a report. The issue is not just the Rs 54 crore spent on 'Sheeshmahal', which was from the government funds, but the expansion by getting eight government bungalows emptied," Mr Gupta alleged.

Kolkata, (KCN): The Indian Sundarbans is combating tropical cyclones along with massive tidal surges. A large section of the Sundarbans population is engaged in fisheries and allied activities. said. The term "double engine" is used by BJP leaders to refer to the party being in power at the Centre as well as in a state. The chief minister along with BJP state president Manmohan Samal handed over the award to former minister Bimbadhar Kanhar, poet Kananbala Patnaik, senior journalist Rajaram Satpathy and social activist Rudra Narayan Mohapatra.

Nylon fence for wandering 'Zeenat'

Baripada / Kolkata (KCN): Apprehending that the marauding tigress 'Zeenat' may stray into the Rahamada village, flanked by Raikia and Bharadi hills, the Forest Department of West Bengal has set up nylon nets on three sides of the village. They have also erected fences around the houses close to forests. This has sparked fear among the residents as they apprehend that the animal might stray into the village to hunt goats for food. The forest personnel are planning to capture the big cat as soon as it enters the village. Villagers have stopped venturing into the forest to graze their livestock for fear of the animal. Purulia DFO Anjan Guha said the animal has started returning back on the route it had taken to reach Purulia. STR, field director Prakash Chand Gogineni said that the animal's return can be assured only after it returns back for 20 km to 30 km. Meanwhile, the tigress has stopped accepting live baits (goats) and was found killing the moving animals. The fully-grown big cat was last seen in



the thorny shrubs adjacent to a hill within the Bandwan forest range, "moving a short distance in the past couple of days," chief conservator of forests S Kulandaivel said. "We have put a nylon net over a 1-sqkm-area to prevent the tigress from entering nearby human settlements and informed local villagers about its presence at the current location for their safety," he said. He added, "The tigress has moved a short distance in the past two days, and its movement is constantly being tracked with the help of a radio collar." "Three tranquilising teams have been placed at strategic locations, while three live baits (goats) have been placed along the possible path of the animal," he said. However, the big cat

has not yet shown any intent to touch the bait despite several attempts. Forest squad members cannot go inside and face the wild animal for fear of attack and must continue the waiting game until it either gets caught or returns to the Similipal habitat. The half-eaten carcass of a goat found in a nearby spot triggered panic among the villagers as the tiger continued to evade forest personnel. The fencing was set up by personnel from Sundarbans Tiger Reserve, who have expertise in the matter, as tiger straying into human habitats from the mangrove forest is more common in villages there, Kulandaivel said. "Teams from Odisha Forest department are also monitoring the

movement of Zeenat," he added. "Smart cameras are being installed at various points in the area to monitor her movement and behaviour," chief wildlife warden Debal Roy said. The hilly terrain with thorny bushes has made it convenient for Zeenat to escape, with disruptions in the continuous transmission of signals from her radio collar, another forest official said. Zeenat had crossed over to West Bengal from Jharkhand six days ago, and after roaming in Jhargram and Paschim Medinipur districts for three days, she reached Purulia. She has shown no signs of heading back to her original habitat in Similipal so far. The tigress has covered over 100 km, roaming the forests at the tri-junction of West Bengal, Jharkhand, and Odisha.

Robbers set OGB branch afire



Simulia (KCN): Miscreants allegedly set afire the Purushottampur branch of Odisha Gramya Bank (OGB) at Balikhanda Bazaar under this police limits in Balasore district after reportedly looting cash and gold late Tuesday night, officials at the district administration said Wednesday. The incident came to

light when locals spotted a plume of smoke billowing out from the bank Wednesday morning and informed the bank officials and police. Soon after, three fire tenders from Ada and Charampa fire offices were rushed to the spot to douse the blaze. On being informed, a police team headed by B a l a s o r e

Superintendent of Police (SP) Raj Prasad, along with sniffer dogs, reached the spot Wednesday afternoon and began an investigation. The miscreants allegedly entered the bank after breaking the back window of the building, said the police. The robbers allegedly took away five CCTV cameras and hard

discs from the bank. "Details will be made public only after the investigation is completed," said Regional Bank Officer Sanjaya Kumar Behera. Meanwhile, the incident in the busy stretch has raised questions about the safety and security of residents and business establishments near the bank.
