**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** President Droupadi Murmu Thursday said that if justice is not delivered on time, then it is equivalent to not getting justice. Addressing the gathering, after inaugurating a judicial court complex here, Murmu said the poor suffer the most due to the culture of adjournment. "They (poor) have neither the money nor the manpower to come to the court frequently," she said.

The President expressed confidence that all stakeholders will give priority to find a way to avoid the culture of adjournment in the interest of the common people.

Murmu said that language is also a barrier



for common people. They do not understand what the lawyer is arguing for them or what opinion the judge is giving. The President said she was happy that court judgments are now being translated into Odia and Santhali languages and these translated judgments are available on the websites of the Supreme Court and the

Orissa High Court. Murmu said that today, women-led development is being emphasised. She stated that like in other fields, women's participation should increase in the judiciary also. She noted that currently, Odisha Judicial Service has 48 per cent female officers. She expressed confidence that the number of female

officers will increase in the coming days. The President said that how ordinary citizens interact with the judicial system without fear is an important issue. Often people get nervous before lawyers and judges. It is necessary to have a sensitive environment in courts so that they can express themselves freely. The

## Fadnavis sworn in as Maharashtra CM; Shinde, Ajit Pawar take oath as his deputies

**Mumbai(KCN):** BJP legislature party leader Devendra Fadnavis was sworn-in as the new chief minister of Maharashtra while allies Eknath Shinde and Ajit Pawar took oath as deputy CMs at a grand ceremony in Mumbai Thursday evening.

The event, attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, several Union ministers and chief ministers of various

states besides thousands of supporters of the BJP-led Mahayuti, took place at the Azad Maidan ground nearly two weeks after the results of the assembly elections were declared November 23. Fadnavis, 54, elected from Nagpur South West constituency, became chief minister for the third time.

Governor C P Raghavakrishnan administered the oath of



office to Fadnavis and his two deputies.

**BJD dissatisfied with Centre over Polavaram project, warns of dire impact on Odisha's Malkangiri dist**

**New Delhi(KCN):** The Biju Janata Dal (BJD) Thursday said it is not satisfied with the Centre's response over the potential submergence of Odisha's Malkangiri district due to the Polavaram project in Andhra Pradesh.

A delegation, comprising present and former MPs, senior leaders and MLAs met officials of the Jal Shakti and Tribal Affairs ministries, the Central Water Commission (CWC), and the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST) over the last three days to press for urgent action.

Multiple delegation members also alleged that the Centre is under pressure from Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister

## Renewable Energy Capacity in West Bengal Sees 25% Growth Over Last Three Years

## All India Bank Officers' Confederation Declares Intensified Struggle for Resolving Key Banking Issues

**Kolkata (ABHIJIT SETH):** The All-India Bank Officers' Confederation (AIBOC), the largest trade union representing supervisory cadres in the banking industry, has resolved to escalate its efforts to address pressing concerns affecting its members. In a recent press release, AIBOC emphasized that the delay in resolving key issues is adversely impacting the morale and well-being of banking professionals, further jeopardizing the operational efficiency of Public Sector Banks (PSBs).

AIBOC has expressed deep concern over the acute shortage of regular employees in PSBs. With increasing workloads, employee attrition, and limited recruitment, bank officers face immense pressure, leading to precarious work conditions. The confederation has called for immediate recruitment to ensure a sustainable workforce and alleviate the burden on existing staff. This, they argue, is essential for maintaining the resilience and functionality of the banking sector. Despite

years of negotiations and recommendations by the Indian Banks' Association (IBA), the implementation of a five-day work week remains pending. AIBOC stresses that this policy is critical for achieving work-life balance for bank employees, who often endure long hours under high stress. The confederation has urged the government to expedite formal notification of this long-standing demand. Instances of physical and verbal assaults on bank officers during duty continue to rise across the country, despite advisories from the Department of Financial Services (DFS), Government of India. AIBOC has strongly urged the government to implement robust measures to safeguard bankers against harassment, ensuring their safety and dignity at work.

The confederation is

resolute in its demand for scrapping the National Pension Scheme (NPS) and reinstating the Defined Benefit Pension Scheme for employees who joined post-2010. AIBOC argues that the current pension scheme lacks security and dignity, depriving retired bank employees of a peaceful retirement. The restoration of the defined pension system is seen as a necessary step toward ensuring fairness and equality. The confederation has voiced strong opposition to DFS directives related to employee performance reviews and premature retirements. With PSBs already facing staff shortages due to limited hiring, such directives are perceived as adding unnecessary stress to an already overstretched workforce. AIBOC has called upon the DFS to respect the autonomy of PSBs in managing their internal workforce matters.

AIBOC has raised

concerns about increasing intervention by the DFS in the internal governance of PSBs. Excessive micromanagement, the confederation claims, has exacerbated industrial relations issues. AIBOC urges the DFS to respect labour practices and issue advisories reaffirming the autonomy of individual bank managements in upholding fair labour policies. The confederation has demanded the immediate appointment of Employee Directors and Non-Workmen Directors on the boards of banks. Despite clear legal mandates and judicial directives, these appointments remain pending, undermining inclusive governance and adherence to statutory norms. AIBOC has called for urgent action to address this lapse.

Frustrated by the lack of

concrete responses from the Indian Banks' Association (IBA) and the government, AIBOC has decided to intensify its agitation. The West Bengal State Unit of AIBOC, under the leadership of Secretary Shubhajyoti Chattopadhyay, has resolved to take determined action to achieve justice for banking professionals and safeguard the financial ecosystem. The confederation emphasizes that the resolution of these issues is not just crucial for the well-being of bank officers but also for the sustainability and stability of the nation's banking sector. AIBOC's intensified struggle reflects its commitment to securing the rights and dignity of its members.

# Rohit, Rahul and the other variables around India's XI in Adelaide

**New Delhi:** Rohit Sharma had you at Arey. As he did the bunch of Indian media personnel huddled behind his net at the Adelaide Oval. Even if his message to them was a bit sterner in nature. The Indian Test captain had walked out to bat alongside Rishabh Pant a good hour before India's scheduled nets session on Tuesday, three days out from the second Test. There he'd played and missed at a couple before edging a couple of deliveries from the reserve Indian fast bowlers, like is the case with most batters facing the pink ball in the greenish Adelaide Oval nets pitches. It's not like those recording their clips from behind Rohit were being noisy or even doing something to distract him. But the senior batter still felt bothered by their presence. In a few seconds, they'd been asked by the team security to step aside. Rohit probably was trying to suggest that 'there's

nothing new to see here' with his characteristic Arey. But it was also a sign of how keen he was to use the handful of sessions he'll get to acclimatise with facing a pink ball. Along with getting himself into a series after having missed the opening Test in Perth, he'd got his chance in Canberra over the weekend, but he hadn't lasted too long before being dismissed. And though there were a couple of nets sessions at the Manuka Oval, Tuesday was Rohit being determined to get his batting rhythms in order, firstly with Abhishek Nayar in tow, before having the other coaches get involved later in the evening when he showed up to bat in the tricky twilight period against his team's premier fast bowlers. By the time he walked out to resume his batting preparation on Wednesday, the focus had shifted entirely from simply getting clips of

Rohit batting to trying to figure out where he'll be batting come Friday as he returns to lead the Indians in the Border Gavaskar Trophy. And also, what that could mean for KL Rahul despite his very impressive outings in Perth.

Whether it involved zooming in to see how much of the new-ball he was facing in the nets to also who he was sharing the net with. On Tuesday, Rohit had largely spent his time during training pairing up with Pant, as if to suggest they could be in the middle-order. Especially with the other pairings supposed to suggest that KL Rahul will continue as opener alongside Yashasvi Jaiswal and Shubman Gill coming in at No 3 with Virat Kohli of course sticking to No 4.

The order was flipped of course on Wednesday with Rohit accompanying Jaiswal to the nets and starting his session by facing the new-ball.

Maybe that had to do with Rahul having been tied up with the press conference or maybe it was a sign that the Indians are indeed not sure yet of which way they'll go. Even if Rahul did admit that he'd been informed about where he'd be batting at the Adelaide Oval. Adding to the intrigue was the fact that Rahul spent most of his interaction with the media talking about his philosophy around

opening the batting and how comfortable he was doing it. To put that into context, most questions he had to contend with did have to do with his views on being an opener again in his career. What then you wonder could lead to Rohit potentially dropping himself down the order after having spent the last few years quite successfully at the top of the order—despite his disappointing returns this calendar year. Considering the tempo at which the captain has been starting most of his innings of late, coming down the order for the pink-ball Test might not be the worst decision, now that Rahul and Jaiswal have shown great skills in seeing off the new-ball. But then the argument could be whether Rohit can set the tempo for the Indian innings like he's wanted to in Test cricket while batting at 5 or 6.

Rahul for the record faced the new-ball as much as Rohit has done over the last two days even if Rohit was overheard asking one of the reserve bowlers if he was indeed operating with a new-ball when he was asked not to during the latter half of his batting stint on Wednesday. While the opening quandary was fascinating in itself, Kohli was spotted indulging in a game within a game against the likes of Navdeep Saini and Mukesh Kumar. ## 'We would like to have a lot more communication with ICC about over-rate rule'

**New Delhi:** Ben Stokes, the England Test skipper, expressed his displeasure over the ICC's lack of communication with the players and urged the cricket governing body to re-evaluate the over-rate standards for the World Test Championship. Stokes' frustration stems from England's latest over-rate offence in the first Test against New Zealand as both teams were penalized despite the match finishing inside the fourth day. Both teams were docked three WTC points and the players were fined 15% of their match fees. The deducted points resulted in New Zealand moving down from fourth to fifth on the WTC points table. Meanwhile, England have had 22 points deducted so far as a result of their over-rate offences in this WTC cycle, including 19 in the 2023 Ashes.

"The most frustrating



thing, from both teams' points of view, is that the game finished early, there was a result. But I think the frustration actually stems back to last year in the Ashes where it was the first time I really brought it up to the match referee and the umpires," said Stokes. "I guess the most frustrating thing is that it's always an issue depending on where you are in the world and the style of cricket that's played. There's never an over-rate issue in Asia

because of how much spin is played.

"There's so many tactical decisions that you need to make, whether that be chatting with the bowler or field changes. As a captain, I like to change things quite a lot and the field could be completely different six balls in an over. But that's not taken into consideration. And getting told to just 'hurry up' isn't going to fix it, because we're out there playing a game. The times and the rules are the same wherever you

go in the world. From a player's point of view—and I'm not the only one who shares this opinion—we would like to have a lot more communication with the ICC around this," opined Stokes.

Stokes was particularly

irked by the non-response from the ICC in the matter. He also said he hadn't signed the over-rate chargesheet since the Lord's Test as a form of protest until he heard from the ICC, although he and New Zealand captain Tom Latham did accept

## Simmons pleased with Bangladesh's mental fortitude

**Dhaka:** Bangladesh head coach Phil Simmons applauded the sheer resilience shown by his side during their series-leveling win against West Indies in Jamaica.

Bangladesh came up with an aggressive brand of cricket led by Nahid Rana's five-wicket haul that helped them earn a slim 18-run lead in the first innings despite only putting 164 on the board. The batters then followed it up with an intent-filled innings headlined by Jaker Ali's sparkling half-century. It set up nicely

for the visitors' bowling attack who then demonstrated their class to earn a comfortable 101-run win at Sabina Park.

Bangladesh were able to take the game away from their opponents largely on the back of the counter-attack approach with the bat and the 268 runs that they managed in their second innings left the home team with a daunting victory target of 287. It eventually proved to be a bridge too far for the home side. "I loved the way the



batters came out with a positive attitude. They had a survival attitude in the first few games [since I took charge]. On the third day, you saw that they were saying, 'I have come to play the game'. I loved and enjoyed it," Simmons said after the game while chatting with the official broadcaster.

"I made sure that they know that it is the way we have to play from now on. The Test win is something that these young players were looking forward to. It is nice to see them come

back in their way after losing the first Test match. It's total joy for me," he said.

He seems to be getting better every game. You could see that there was more thought in his bowling here in every session," he said.

"I was even more impressed [with Rana in Jamaica] than I was in Sharjah where he made his ODI debut as for him to be so consistent on this wicket and hitting his lengths. At the end of the day yesterday, he was bowling in his mid-140s. We under-rated the young fast bowler's ability to assess the situation," he said

"I think when we had the delay [due to wet outfield on the first day] and the sun was out, as hot as I

felt in Jamaica for a long time, there was no question that we had to bat first. The wicket had dried out. We had to make the running in the Test match, as were down 1-0. The decision

to bat wasn't a difficult one. I think breaking it to the batters...It is a team that likes to bowl first to see what's there. Giving them the confidence that I believe in you, that you can bat first here, I think that led to how we batted in the second innings. We just needed to do better than the first innings," he said.

Simmons singled out

Jaker Ali's performance and appeared to be impressed with the way the wicket-keeper batter has been adapting to Test cricket. The West Indian
