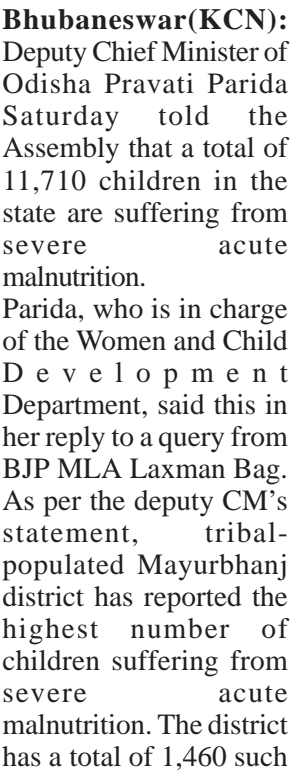

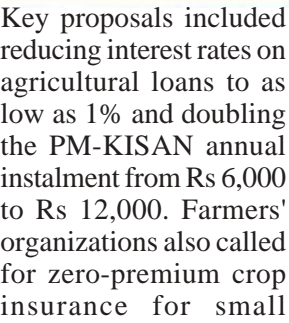

BJD MLAs stormed the well of the House and raised slogans, forcing Speaker Padgaonkar to adjourn the session until 11:30 am. When the proceedings resumed, further disruptions led to another adjournment, until 4 pm.

Bolangir(KCN): Over 30 schoolchildren fell ill Saturday after consuming their mid-day meals in Odisha's Kandhamal and Bolangir districts, according to sources. In Kandhamal district, several students at Simanbadi Upper Primary School in Kandhamal's Daringbadi began throwing up and complained of severe stomachaches after eating rice and egg curry during lunch, a source informed. Following the incident, school

authorities rushed over 20 students to Simanbadi Government Hospital. Doctors suspected food poisoning, the source added.

Headmaster of Simanbadi Upper Primary School Bideshi Nayak stated, "I think the SHG engaged in supplying mid-day meals may not have followed standard food preparation procedures".

In another incident at Government Project UP School in Dengapadar, under the Muribahal

block of Bolangir district, more than 10 students fell ill after eating their mid-day meal.

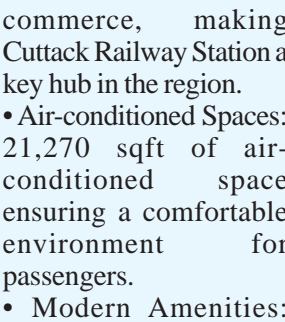

AIIMS Bhubaneswar Tests 8,518 Individuals, 31 Test HIV Positive in Last Three Months

Bhubaneswar, (KCN): Over the past three months, AIIMS Bhubaneswar's Integrated Counselling and Testing Centre (ICTC) has tested 8,518 individuals for HIV and provided counselling services to 8,538 people. Out of those tested, 31 individuals were found to be HIV positive, and 27 of them have been linked to the Anti-Retroviral Therapy (ART) Centre (ARC). This reflects

AIIMS Bhubaneswar's ongoing commitment to the prevention, diagnosis, and care of individuals affected by HIV. Dr. Ashutosh Biswas, Executive Director of AIIMS Bhubaneswar, emphasised the vital role of HIV Counselling and Testing Services (HCTS) as a key entry point for HIV prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and care. "Our efforts are aligned with national goals, and we aim to



expand awareness and ensure timely treatment for those diagnosed with HIV," Dr. Biswas stated. As part of the World AIDS Day celebrations, AIIMS Bhubaneswar organised a series of events to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS, including an awareness programme held at the OPD foyer for the public. The

programme, supported by the Department of Community Medicine and Family Medicine and the Department of Transfusion and Blood Bank, in collaboration with the Odisha State AIDS Society, centered around the theme "Take the Rights Path: My Health, My Right". The event attracted esteemed dignitaries, medical

professionals, staff, and community members. The event also featured a free HIV testing camp and voluntary blood donation camp, with around 45 individuals taking the opportunity to get tested. Informative leaflets and booklets on HIV/AIDS prevention

and care were distributed, and free condoms were handed out to promote safe practices. AIIMS Bhubaneswar continues to lead the charge in HIV surveillance and epidemiology, being one of the eight Regional Institutes for HIV

Surveillance in India. The institute's coverage includes the states of Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, and Chhattisgarh. AIIMS Bhubaneswar will also host the 19th round of HIV Sentinel Surveillance (HSS) in January 2025. While India has the second-largest HIV epidemic in the world, with approximately 24.67 lakh people living with HIV (PLHIV), the country has made significant progress in ART coverage, which stands at 68%. Odisha, with 52,000 PLHIV, has an HIV prevalence rate of 0.14%, with ART coverage at 49.7%. These statistics highlight the need for sustained

efforts to ensure the continued prevention, treatment, and care of people living with HIV. During the event, experts such as Dr. Dillip Kumar Parida (MS), Dr. Binod Kumar Patro, Dr. Anupam Dey, Dr. Bijayani Behera, Dr. Binod Kumar Singh, Dr. Ansuman Sahu, Dr. Dhritiman, and Pravasini Pradhan of KNP+ (The Kalinga Network of People Living with HIV/AIDS) engaged the audience in enlightening discussions on the routes of HIV transmission, the importance of routine testing, and the critical role of community involvement in tackling the HIV/AIDS crisis.

Bala was speaking to Fever FM when he said Alia trusted him with making a film that could work at the box office, and he should have delivered that performance. The director appreciated the 31-year-old and said she made a choice by starring in his film and the rest was his responsibility.

"She is the first choice for everyone. She could have been on any other film set, but Jigra, during that time. So she has to make that choice. And she has trusted me with that choice. So it is my

responsibility to deliver box office, because we are in the business of filmmaking also," he shared.

Bala added that he now wants to assess where things have gone wrong. He went on to say that it's a director's responsibility to justify an actor's time. He continued, "So that is why I need to analyse. Kuch toh hua hai na (Something has happened, right)? Something has happened where people have stayed away, something that they have not bought, something that

they didn't feel the need to come to the theatre. If at all any other actor decides to give their time, his or hers, then you know, make it worth it."

Jigra, which was released during the Dussehra weekend, opened at around Rs 4.55 crore nett in India. While it performed decently during the first weekend, the collections witnessed a drastic drop from its first Monday. After its 10-day run, it only collected Rs 27.30 crore nett at the box office.

The film, which was a prison-break action drama, also marked actor Vedang Raina's big Bollywood debut. Meanwhile, Vasan Bala deactivated his Twitter account after receiving hate for Jigra's performance. In an interview earlier, he mentioned that he didn't consider box office as a film's success parameter.

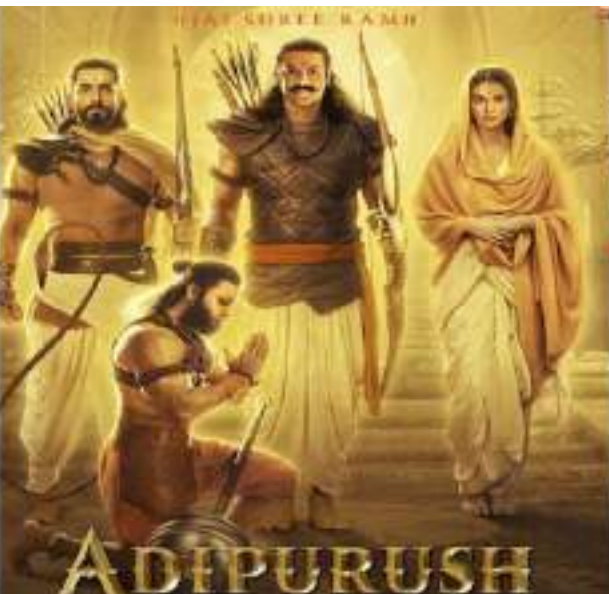

Save the Endangered Fishing Cat

The fishing cat (*Prionailurus viverrinus*) is listed as "Vulnerable" on the IUCN Red List, with populations facing a continuing decline due to habitat destruction, poaching, and human-wildlife conflict. The Sunderbans, a unique mangrove ecosystem spanning West Bengal (India) and Bangladesh, is one of the most crucial habitats for this species. Here's the current status of fishing cats across the region:

West Bengal (India)
Habitat: The Sunderbans of West Bengal offer an ideal environment for fishing cats due to the extensive wetlands and dense mangrove forests.

Fishing cats are adept at living in this environment, thriving near water bodies and wetlands.

Population Trends: Recent studies suggest that while fishing cats are present in the region, their population has faced a decline due to habitat fragmentation caused by human settlements, agriculture, aquaculture (shrimp farming), and deforestation.

Conservation Efforts: The West Bengal government, along with local NGOs and wildlife organizations like the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) and the Fishing Cat Project, is working on conservation initiatives, including habitat protection, awareness programs, and mitigating human-wildlife conflict. Camera trap surveys and community engagement have been crucial in tracking populations and reducing threats to fishing cats.

Habitat Loss: Rapid expansion of human settlements, aquaculture (especially shrimp farming), and conversion of wetlands into agricultural fields are major causes of habitat destruction.

Human-Wildlife Conflict: Fishing cats often prey on poultry and fish from farms, leading to retaliatory killings by locals.

Poaching: Though illegal, poaching for pelts and the pet trade is a concern.

Climate Change: Rising sea levels and increased salinity in the Sunderbans, a consequence of climate change, threaten the mangrove ecosystem,

further reducing suitable habitats for the fishing cat.

Conservation Outlook
Despite ongoing threats, there is hope for the fishing cat's survival in the Sunderbans. Continued research, strong conservation action, and collaborative efforts between India and Bangladesh are critical for the long-term survival of this species in the region. Additionally, involving local communities in conservation efforts will play a key role in reducing human-cat conflicts and ensuring that fishing cats and humans can coexist.

For instance, Vitamin C helps to strengthen our immune system and protects the body from colds and coughs. In winter, we get plenty of oranges and "mousambi" (sweet lime). Here are some beauty tips with winter fruits:

1--Grapefruit
Grapefruit is rich in minerals, antioxidant, and has high water content. It also keeps the skin's outer layer hydrated. Vitamin C and many antioxidants present in it protect the skin from environmental hazards.

. Grapefruits are also rich in lycopene, a chemical that helps keep the skin smooth and protects it from UV rays. Grapefruit is an ideal ingredient to add to your diet and products to help achieve a glowing, bright complexion. They can change dry flaky skin into hydrated, radiant skin.

Grapefruits have a natural compound, lycopene, which helps reduce redness and swelling, and may balance your skin tone. You add it to your salad or even make some guacamol

2-Strawberries
Strawberries are those juicy red berries that almost everyone loves. Applying strawberries topically on your skin can make your skin healthy and glowing. Strawberry is Rich in vitamin C and

antioxidants, that provide immunity to the skin cells and make them better prepared to deal with environmental changes. Strawberries help hydrate your skin. The vitamin C present in strawberries helps brighten and nourish your skin. It helps ensure soft and supple skin.

Strawberries also contain ellagic acid, which fights against sun

damage. Strawberries are seasonal fruits available during the winter in India. Add fresh strawberries to your cereal bowl or milkshake to reap the benefits of this fruit for glowing skin.

3--Lemon
We all know that lemon is a rich source of Vitamin C, which is needed in winter. As a cosmetic ingredient, lemon can be used in various ways, but avoid using it undiluted, as it

can be harsh on the skin. However, on areas where the skin is thicker, like elbows and knees, rub lemon halves and wash off with water. Over a period of time, it cleanses and lightens skin colour. Lemon can also be used as a hand lotion. Mix it with rose water and rub it into the skin of the hands. For rough hands, rub granulated sugar and the juice of a lemon together on the hands, till the sugar dissolves. Then rinse off with water. Done regularly, it will help to improve the skin

texture. Add lemon juice to "tea water" for a hair rinse, to make the hair silky and shiny. Boil used tea leaves in enough water and cool the liquid. Add the juice of one lemon and use it as a last rinse. Lemon peels can be dried and powdered and used in face packs and scrubs.

4--Oranges
Oranges may be used in hair packs. The rind of oranges are said to contribute to hair luster

after shampoo. It helps to restore the normal acid-alkaline balance and reduces oiliness. It is also rich in Vitamin C. Makes the hair shiny and silky. After your shampoo, add the juice of 2 oranges to half a mug of water and use as a last rinse. Leave on for 2 minutes and then rinse with plain water.

Neroli, which is orange flower oil, has been used in both skin and hair care. Neroli oil is used

in aromatherapy due to its calming and anti-stress benefits. It can be added to carrier oils (i.e. pressed oils like olive oil, almond oil, sesame seed oil etc) to make hair oils. It has to be diluted and added in the correct proportion to the carrier oil. It is said to calm the mind and is useful in stress related hair problems, like hair loss.

5--Banana
Banana, one of the most popular fruits, packs quite a punch in terms of nutrition and health benefits. It is one of the richest sources of potassium and also contains Vitamin C and B6. Bananas are beneficial for both skin and hair treatments. Its potassium content helps to soften both dry hair and dry skin. Bananas can be made into a pulp and added to both face and hair packs. Bananas help hair that has been damaged by repeated colouring and other chemical treatments. Bananas can be made into a pulp and applied on the hair like a pack. Leave it on for 20 to 30 minutes and then wash

and nourishes the hair. It also reduces oiliness. Keep orange peels and simmer them in water over a low fire. Cool and strain. Use the water to mix hair packs. For example, a protein pack may be made using lentils and egg white. The lentils should be soaked in water overnight. Next morning, grind the lentils, add egg and the orange-peel water, to mix into a pack for the hair. It cleanses, reduces oiliness and adds body and shine. Orange juice can be used to rinse the hair

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off. Egg yolk or curd may be added to mashed bananas and applied as a hair pack. If the hair is very dry, add one teaspoon pure glycerin or honey to the banana pack. Almond oil may also be added to the banana hair pack.

6--Avocado
Avocados are excellent for skin care, as they boost cell renewal. It contains Vitamin B and C, which help to build new cells and strengthen the immune system. It also has Vitamin A and E, which keep the skin soft and smooth. In fact, Avocado juice or oil can be very nourishing for the skin and hair. The protein and oil contents of avocado strengthen and nourish the hair. For home hair care, mash the avocado, add honey and a little lemon juice. This can be applied on the hair as a pack. In fact, it can also be applied on the face. Wash it off after half an hour.

7 - - Pomegranate (Anaar)

Union Health Minister launches 100-Days intensified TB Elimination Campaign from Haryana

Chandigarh (JAG MOHAN THAKEN), December 7- In a decisive step towards eliminating TB in India, Union Health and Family Welfare Minister, J.P. Nadda on Saturday launched the 100-day intensified nationwide campaign from Panchkula district in Haryana. The campaign will be implemented in 347 districts across the country. Haryana Chief Minister, Nayab Singh Saini, Health Minister, Kumari Aarti Singh Rao were also present on this occasion. Addressing the countrymen during the national-level event at Panchkula, J.P. Nadda said that under this campaign, the focus will be on TB-prone districts, and high-risk groups, ensuring comprehensive testing to prevent its

spread. Lauding Haryana's consistent focus and efforts on further strengthening healthcare infrastructure, Nadda said that due to the dedicated efforts made by the present state government, the number of medical colleges in Haryana has increased from 6 in 2014 to 15 today, with plans to establish one in every district under the leadership of Chief Minister, Nayab Singh Saini. He said that even the MBBS seats have increased from 650 in 2014 to 2,185, while postgraduate seats have increased from 243 to 889. The Union Minister said that India had only six AIIMS in 2014, compared to 22 today, with one under construction in Rewari,

Haryana. J.P. Nadda further shared that under the Ayushman Bharat Scheme, 1.22 crore Ayushman cards have been issued in Haryana, facilitating 18.5 lakh hospital admissions. Haryana has spent Rs. 2,700 crore providing free healthcare to the underprivileged under this scheme, which is a commendable achievement, he said. Nadda said that the central government gives free treatment up to Rs. 5 lakh for senior citizens above 70 years under the Ayushman Bharat Scheme. Haryana has issued 70,000 Vay Vandana cards as part of this initiative. Neonatal screening has risen from 63 percent to 85 percent, and institutional delivery has increased from 80 percent to 94



percent. Comprehensive immunization has improved from 79 percent to 92 percent. J.P. Nadda said that Prime Minister, Narendra Modi envisions making India TB-free before achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030. With

renewed energy and momentum, this campaign has been initiated today. He said that there is a significant reduction in TB cases, with the decline rate improving from 8.3 percent in 2015 to 17.7 percent now. The World Health Organization has

commended India's progress in reducing TB prevalence and mortality rates, which have dropped by 21.4 percent in the last 10 years. The union Health minister shared that many new strategies were adopted to make TB services patient-friendly and

decentralized. He said that today early detection of TB has become possible because of the network of over 1.7 lakh Ayushman Arogya Mandirs across the country. He said that by increasing the number of laboratories from 120 in 2014 to 8,293 laboratories today, a significant step has been taken to scale up diagnostic services across the Country. He said that with the over 1.17 crore TB patients have received Ni-kshay support of Rs 3,338 crore. Besides this, the state government has recently increased the Ni-kshay poshan amount from Rs. 500 to Rs. 1000 and added energy boosters for the nourishment support for TB patients, said Nadda. The union Health minister

said that to make this campaign successful, public participation is the key and we can make the TB Free India campaign successful only by ensuring active participation of public representatives and making people aware. During the program, Union Health Minister Nadda, Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, and other dignitaries flagged off 10 Ni-kshay vehicles for Haryana and unveiled the poster for the 100-day intensive TB elimination campaign and launched IEC materials for public outreach. Besides this, Ni-kshay Mitras were also honoured, and Ni-kshay nutrition kits were distributed. TB champions who have successfully recovered from the disease were also felicitated.

"No Proposal For BRICS Currency:" S Jaishankar After Trump's Tariff Warning

D o h a / N e w Delhi(KCN): No decision has been taken to start a new currency to compete with the US dollar, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has said in Qatar, where he has gone to attend the Doha Forum. Mr Jaishankar's comments came a week after US President-elect Donald Trump demanded that BRICS member countries, which include major emerging economies such as India, Russia and China, commit to not creating a new currency or supporting another currency that would replace the dollar. Trump had threatened to apply 100 per cent tariffs if BRICS members start a de-dollarization policy, or move away from the US dollar.



"We had a good relationship, a very solid relationship with the first Trump administration, yes there were some issues mostly trade related issues, but there were a whole lot of issues on which Trump was very international, and I remind people that it was actually under Trump that the QUAD was restarted," Mr Jaishankar said.

He also noted the personal connection between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President-elect Trump, which has contributed to the strong bilateral ties between the two countries. "There is a personal relation between PM Modi and Trump... Where the BRICS remarks were concerned, we have said

that India has never been for de-dollarisation, right now there is no proposal to have a BRICS currency. The BRICS do discuss financial transactions... The US is our largest trade partner, we have no interest in weakening the dollar at all," he added. While warning BRICS members to not commit to creating a new currency or supporting

another currency that would replace the US dollar, Mr Trump had said they can go find another 'sucker'. "We require a commitment from these countries that they will neither create a new BRICS currency, nor back any other currency to replace the mighty US Dollar or, they will face 100 per cent tariffs, and should expect to say goodbye to selling into the wonderful US economy," Trump wrote on his social media platform, Truth Social. "They can go find another 'sucker'. There is no chance that the BRICS will replace the US dollar in international trade, and any country that tries should wave goodbye to America," the US President-elect had said.

Aruha hill turns mound of misdeeds

Jajpur(KCN): Despite many efforts taken by the state government to contain rampant plunder of minor minerals, there has been no let-up in illegal quarrying and smuggling of black stone, murrum and soil from Dharmasala tehsil area in Jajpur district. It has been over a year since the state government established the office of the deputy director of Minor Minerals department in Jajpur district as part of its move to curb the smuggling. However, this has failed to stop the illegal mining and smuggling of minor minerals. Instead, the illegal practice, depriving the state's exchequer of huge

earnings, has only flourished over the years. The Jajpur district administration has directed for deposit of penalty and closure of the quarries after mining of black stones beyond the permissible limit was proved at Aruha black stone mines under the Dharmasala tehsil. However, some unscrupulous miners continue to extract and smuggle murrum from the area. The murrum is being used for the establishment of a crusher unit named 'Mass', located about 300 metres from Tarakasuni Primary School in Aruha panchayat. Similarly, the Jajpur Road-Cuttack rail route lies at a distance of



200 metres from the under-construction crusher unit. Reports said that there are five black stone mines on Aruha hill and the state government has prepared a cluster mining plan for the area. However, it has comfortably ignored the presence of a school and the rail route near it

before preparing the cluster mining plan. This has left the local residents surprised as they questioned the wisdom of the district administration in permitting the establishment of a crusher unit which is likely to cause deafening noise and will lead to air pollution in the area.

Apprehending severe sound and air pollution, over 100 students and their guardians have sought the intervention of the district Collector, demanding to save them from the problem which is likely to impact their health and studies. Peeved over the development, locals have

written to the district Collector demanding closure of the illegal black stone quarry and crusher unit and necessary action for violation of norms. They have also forwarded copies of their complaints to the deputy director of Minor Minerals department, the secretary of Steel and Mines department and the regional officer of State Pollution Control Board (SPCB) at Kalinganagar in the district. According to the complaints, the district administration is yet to collect the penalty that was levied on the concerned leaseholders following satellite mapping held earlier. However, surprisingly,

the district administration has registered a certified case against one of the three leaseholders while the names of two of them have been excluded by allegedly showing them undue favour. It has been alleged that this is in direct contravention of the norms for environmental clearance. According to the complaints, two of the quarries BSQ-2 quarry no-1/16-17 and 34/21-22 are situated at a distance of about 300 metres from the primary school. Moreover, three of the quarries BSQ no-1 quarry no-35/21-22 and quarry no-36/21-22 lie at a distance of about 200 metre from the railway line. The presence of the quarry might endanger

the railway line anytime as residents expressed concerned over its security. This apart, four stone crushing units are in operation near these quarries on plot number 2733, 2594, 2704 and 2705 for which the students have been seriously affected by the deafening sound and air pollution emanating from the units. Residents Nirmal Nayak, Harihar Sahu, Pratap Rana, Anand Behera, Pramod Behera, Anam Behera, Sahadev Rana, Mohan Nayak, Chittarnjan Jena and over 100 others have demanded a proper probe into these irregularities and sought stringent action against the wrongdoers.

with the assistance of Chandipur Police, conducted raids at Chandipur and Jhampura Chhak. They fined 10 violators and collected penalties from them. Additionally, shopkeepers at food stores, tea stalls, and variety stores were sensitized about the

prohibition of openly selling tobacco products. This raid operation, conducted under the National Tobacco Control Program, will continue, as confirmed by the officials. The senior officials involved in the operation emphasized that this enforcement is a part of a sustained initiative to protect public health. They stressed the importance of strict adherence to tobacco control regulations. To ensure compliance, a multi-departmental task force will maintain strict monitoring and enforcement measures. Regular enforcement operations will be carried out with severe penalties for violations, according to Dr. De, who reiterated the administration's commitment to this effort.

Shami yet to get all-clear from NCA; continues to be with Bengal team



Harshit Rana threw the offside before registering a hundred off only 111 balls - the quickest-ever in a day-night Test as he powered Australia's lead at a rapid pace. Even against the second new ball which was India's biggest weapon, he started off whipping and clipping Bumrah and Siraj as they missed their lines for crucial boundaries. India had a brief injury scare during this period when Bumrah was down clutching his groin but went on to bowl again. But the wicket finally came to Siraj who yorked Head and followed it up with an exchange of words with the batter. It brought an end to a frustrating period of play for India where they were made to toil for every wicket. R Ashwin who had been their best bowler through that period despite being hit for a couple of sixes by Head had got Mitchell Marsh caught behind and saw Head being put down

on 76 by Siraj. But it was amid Head stepping it up in the company of Alex Carey (15) where they put on 74 off just 80 balls before the latter was out caught behind. The lead swelled past 150 before Siraj wrapped up the tail early into the third session leaving India with the toughest conditions to bat in a day-night Test.

KL Rahul was the first to go being surprised by a short ball from Cummins and pulling it to the 'keeper. Yashasvi Jaiswal started confidently until he nicked behind the first ball from Bolland, who proceeded to nick off Virat Kohli too soon after. Starc added salt to the wounds getting a ripping incoming delivery to flatten Gill's middle stump. Rohit Sharma had a torrid stay in the middle being hit on the helmet first ball and surviving an LBW call as Starc overstepped. But even

as he stuck on amidst Rishabh Pant's adventurous strokeplay at the other end, Cummins got one to sneak around his defence to hit the top of off. At 105/5, Australia's control over the game was as comprehensive as could be and ensured that the hard work done in a testing first session was not undone. Then, Marnus Labuschagne put away some indifferent form to fight his way to a half-century on a ground where he averages over 70. His partnership worth 65 with Travis Head for the fourth wicket helped them offset two early strikes by Bumrah. India's morning session was given a boost when Bumrah had Nathan McSweeney caught behind with a ball nipping away and soon after also had Steven Smith caught down the legside, putting Australia in a spot of bother at 103/3. Head was tested early with the round-the-wicket angle

by both Bumrah and Mohammed Siraj, but managed to see it through. Along with Labuschagne, he saw through that spell to cash in later. Harshit Rana was hit for four fours in an over as Australia cruised ahead after seeing past the initial threat.

But against the run of play, Labuschagne ended up cutting a delivery from Nitish Reddy to Yashasvi Jaiswal at gully. But his departure on 68 did not dent Australia much as Head marched on, getting to his fifth Test fifty against India and second on the trot in the series. It also ensured that Australia took the lead in the first session.

India had a close LBW call against Mitchell Marsh turned down on review with the third umpire controversially deeming that there was no conclusive evidence if Ashwin's ball had struck the pad or bat first. More replays shown by the broadcaster were indicative of the ball striking pad first but India ended up losing the review, capping off a frustrating morning session which was only exacerbated subsequently through the day.

Mohammed Shami is unlikely to fly to Australia anytime soon. Indications are that he has not yet received fitness clearance, and the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) is still undecided when he can be sent to Australia. Precisely, the exact dilemma is whether rather than when.

It is evident that Shami's fitness is under scrutiny. The Sports Science wing of the BCCI's Bengaluru-based Centre of Excellence is yet to submit an all-clear report to the BCCI. As reported by Cricbuzz on December 1, a team from the NCA went to Rajkot where he was playing in the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy (SMAT) to monitor his progress. Among those

on the Shami duty were a national selector (SS Das), the head of BCCI's Sports Science wing (Nitin Patel) and a Strength and Conditioning trainer (Nishanta Bardule). Shami represented Bengal in the National T20 competition, finishing with an impressive tally of eight wickets in seven games. More crucially, the 34-year-old pacer, returning after a year-long injury hiatus, is said to have made a strong impression with his bowling performances. But more than his bowling, the assessment was whether he would be able to withstand the gruelling workload of a Test match. Sources reveal that Shami is unlikely to fly to Australia immediately, despite his absence being felt in the ongoing Border-Gavaskar Trophy (BGT) series. The veteran pacer might be there for the final Test in Sydney, with the best-case scenario being his availability for the

Boxing Day Test at the MCG, starting on December 26. However, sources caution that this is an overly optimistic expectation, and it would not be surprising if he is not sent to Australia at all. Bengal have reached the knockout stage of the SMAT and they are up against Chandigarh in the pre-quarterfinals which will be played at Chinnaswamy Stadium in Bengaluru on November 9. Shami continues to be with the Bengal team and he is expected to feature in the knockouts of the SMAT. Shami was recently bought by Sunrisers Hyderabad for INR 10 crore in the Indian Premier League (IPL) mega auction in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. Should he regain full fitness, he will take part in the IPL after one year - he had missed the whole 2024 IPL season because of an ankle injury for which he had to undergo surgery.

New Delhi: More than two hours before the first ball would be bowled in the second men's T20I between South Africa and India on Sunday, St George's Park's gates remained firmly shut to civilians. But already around a thousand or so ticket-touting fans had lined up at the turnstiles. Most were wrapped up against the chill of the thin easterly breeze; the damp, win-the-toss-and-field wind that comes off the Indian Ocean and makes the ball swing at this ground. Above, grey ruled with impunity. But, unlike in Durban on Friday, the clouds were high and docile. From inside the home of cricket - the first Test played in South Africa, and the first outside Australia and England, was at St George's Park in March 1889 - came the strains of Jana Gana Mana. It was played once, twice, thrice. So was South Africa's unnamed composite national anthem. Thereby hangs what media muppets, social and mainstream, had tried to turn into a controversy.

Happily, they failed. When India's anthem was played at Kingsmead, the recorded audio cut out twice, and resumed twice. Suryakumar Kumar and his team looked bemused, but they did the sensible thing and kept singing; with and without accompaniment. After all, it wasn't as if they needed help. In an attempt to make amends for any perceived slight, the anthem was played in full again. Sensibly, again, the players sang once more. South Africa's anthem passed free of glitches. Kingsmead confirmed to Cricbuzz that they had not received a complaint from the Indians. Instead, SuperSport sources said, the visitors had a quiet word with the broadcaster. The playing of the anthems is not, of course, SuperSport's responsibility. And there this unremarkable matter might have died an unnoticed death and been buried in an unlabelled online wrinkle. It did and it was.

save for a smattering of headlines in India claiming the anthem had been "disrespected", that the start of the match had been "overshadowed", and that India's "furious" supporters deemed this "unacceptable". India fans who do feel this way will be considered shockingly immature by their peers, and rightly so. How much of the outrage was fact and how much faux can't be known, but the people who took offence probably argue that politics and sport don't mix. Closer to the truth is that notions of patriotism and sport shouldn't be mixed. Why is international sport encumbered with the irrelevant, artificial stuffiness of national anthems? Even so, there was reason for St George's Park to make doubly and triply sure that it brought its anthem A game on Sunday. Hence the repetitions in the hours before the match.

The gates were still closed and the anthems still playing when Ashwell Prince, who is commenting on the series, sidled past the



back of the crowd. Prince was born and raised in what was then called Port Elizabeth - now Gqeberha - and is still lazily referred to as PE. It was at St George's Park that he scored the first of his 45 first-class centuries: an undefeated 125 that took Eastern Province B to a seven-wicket win over Natal B in November 1996. The crowd noticed Prince's presence and a whisper of "Ashy P is in the house" rattled through the ranks. So there was no escaping the thronging selfie-hunters, and Prince

duly and patiently obliged. "Still big in PE," someone quipped at him. "Only big in PE," he retorted gamely. The last man in the scrum eagerly held up his phone only to discover the lens was the wrong way around. Prince waited for him to sort it out, and gently chided in Afrikaans: "Heelytd gewag, maar die camera is reversed!" (You've waited all this time, but the camera is reversed!). Just more than two hours later, after a drizzle had abated, the anthems had been flawlessly

delivered, and as the brass band were warbling through Eddy Grant's "Gimme Hope Jo'anna", Marco Jansen stood at the top of his run ready to start the match from the St George's Park Drive End. At the Duckpond End, Sanju Samson, the king of Kingsmead on Friday for his 50-ball 107, was coiled into a crouch. Jansen's third delivery swung wickedly through the air, seamed after pitching, and nailed the top of leg stump. It was the first time in three T20I innings that Samson had

not hit a century, and the first time in all of India's 240 T20Is that they had lost their first wicket without a run on the board.

There were 6,740 pairs of eyes in the stands and on the grass banks at that moment. They blinked, and when 8,146 pairs of eyes opened in the 15th, India were 87 for 6. Hardik Pandya, dropped twice in the 20th, batted in three of the four biggest stands of the innings for his 45-ball 39 not out. For the rest, only Tilak Varma and Axar Patel reached 20. No-one's strike rate touched 130.

On Friday, Samson struck at 214 and Varma at 183.33. Jansen's 6.00 was South Africa's only economy rate under eight, and four of the seven bowlers were in double figures. But not every pitch is going to be bespoke for T20 cricket, like Kingsmead's was, with an outfield to match. There was nothing wrong with the St George's Park surface, but recent rain had juiced it for seam bowlers. The grass on it was noticeably

green and the bounce fairly boomed. When the innings ended, with India having wobbled to 124 for 6, the 8,231 present no doubt thought South Africa had set themselves up for a simple victory. Never in the 87 T20Is in which they had fielded first for a full 20 overs had they failed to reach a target as low as Sunday's. Only once in the 84 games they have won batting first had India defended a total as low in a full innings, when they held Pakistan to a reply of 113 for 7 after being dismissed for 119 in Nassau County in the T20 World Cup in June this year.

Why the focus on the spectator figures? There was a clue in the Springbok shirts and caps many in the crowd wore. Twenty minutes after India's innings ended, the Boks kicked off against Scotland in Edinburgh. Millions of pairs of eyes would turn to them. Would the few thousand eyes gathered at St George's Park leave en masse?
