cultural institutions and had acquired a rich and varied experience about life. Hota started his literary career by writing poems. Mostly rhymed pieces on traditional themes, his poems were compiled in 1966 in a book entitled Madhuchhanda. But he gave up poetry and began writing stories from 1972, and published 12 story-collections (a total of about 180 stories).

Five Labourers Killed, Over 25 Injured As Pick-Up Van Overtakes In Odisha's Kalahandi

Golamunda (KCN): A pick-up van ferrying about 50 labourers overturned near Dokiripada under Golamunda police station limits in Odisha's Kalahandi district on Sunday evening. According to sources, the workers hailing from Aatigaon village under Junagarh police station limits had come to work in the agricultural fields in the

Boraguda area in Golamunda today. In the evening, on the way back from work, the pick-up vehicle in which they were travelling lost balance and turned turtle on the road, leaving some workers trapped underneath. About five persons died on the spot and 25 others, who sustained critical injuries in the mishap, have been shifted to the district

headquarters hospital. Meanwhile, others with minor injuries are being provided medical assistance at Dharmagarh and Junagarh hospitals, sources said. More than 50 workers including some minors were travelling in the pick-up vehicle. Golamunda police reached the spot and have started an investigation.

Income from Business or Profession Part -1

1. Income chargeable under the head “Income from Business or Profession”: The following types of income are chargeable to tax under the head “Income from Business or Profession”, under section 28:

(a) profits and gains of any business or profession;

(i) a n y compensation or other payments due to, or received by any persons specified in section 28(ii); any person, by whatever name called, managing the whole or substantially the whole of the affairs of an Indian company, at or in connection with the termination of his management or the modification of the terms and conditions relating thereto;

(ii) any person managing the whole or substantially the whole of the affairs in India of any other company, at or in connection with the termination of his office or the modification of the terms and conditions

relating thereto;

(iii) any person holding an agency in India for any part of activities relating to the business of any other person, at or in connection with the termination of the agency or the modification of the terms and conditions relating thereto;

(iv) any person, for or in connection with the vesting in the Government, or in any corporation owned or controlled by the Government, under any law for the time being in force, of the management of any property or business;

(v) W.e.f. asst. year 2019-20 any person at or in connection with the termination or the modification of the terms and conditions, of any contract relating to his business;

(b) income derived by a trade, professional or similar association from specific services performed for its members;

(c) profits on sale

of a license granted under the Imports (Control) Order, 1955;

(d) cash assistance received or receivable by any person against exports under any scheme of the Government of India - Sec. 28(iib);

When DEPB is sold by a person, his profit on transfer of DEPB would be the sale value of DEPB less its face value which represents the cost of the DEPB and not the entire sum received by him on such transfer; DEPB is chargeable as income under clause (iiib) of section 28 in the year in which such person applies for DEPB credit against the exports whereas the profit on transfer of DEPB by that person is chargeable as income under clause (iiid) of section 28 in his hands in the year in which he makes the transfer- Topman Exports v. CIT [2012] 342 ITR 49 (SC). The above view has been reaffirmed in Vikash Kalra v. CIT 345 ITR 557 (SC).

(e) any duty of customs or excise repaid or repayable as drawback to any person against exports under the Customs and Central Excise Duties Drawback Rules, 1971;

(f) any profit on the transfer of the Duty Entitlement Pass Book Scheme being Duty Remission Scheme,

under the Export and Import policy formulated and announced u/s 5 of the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulation) Act, 1992;

(g) any profit on the transfer of Duty Free R e p l e n i s h m e n t Certificate, being Duty Remission Scheme, under the Export and Import policy formulated and announced u/s 5 of the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulation) Act, 1992;

(h) W.e.f. Asst Year 2024-25, the value of any benefit or perquisite arising from business or the exercise of a profession, whether convertible into money or not in cash or in kind or partly in cash and partly in kind [section 28(iv)].

Prior to the amendment by Finance Act 2023, the said section read as under:

the value of any benefit or perquisite, whether convertible into money or not, arising from business or exercise of a profession.

(i) profits and gains of managing agency;

(j) income from s p e c u l a t i v e transactions; and

(k) Interest, salary, bonus, commission, remuneration etc. due to or received by a partner of the firm, if the same has been allowed as expenses in

the case of the partnership firm.

(l) W.e.f. asst. year 2003-04 as amended w.e.f. asst. year 2017-18 any sum received or receivable in cash or in kind under an agreement for not carrying out any activity in relation to any business or profession or an agreement for not sharing any know- how, patent, copyright, trademark, licence, franchise or any other business or commercial right of similar nature, or information or technique likely to assist in the manufacture or processing of goods or provision for services. [section 28(va)].

The above is also known as Non compete fee.

(m) any sum received under a Keyman insurance policy including the sum allocated by way of bonus on such policy.

(n) the fair market value of inventory as on the date on which it is converted into, or treated as, a capital asset determined in the prescribed manner- Sec. 28(via) w.e.f. asst. year 2019-20. Refer Rule 11UAB for valuation.

(o) W.e.f. asst. year 2010-11, clause (vii) was inserted in section 28 to provide that any sum whether received or receivable in cash or kind, by reason of any capital asset other than land or goodwill or financial instrument being demolished, destroyed, discarded or transferred

shall be chargeable to income tax under the head ‘profit and gains of business or profession’, if the whole of the expenditure on such capital asset has been allowed as a deduction u/ s 35AD.

(p) in the case of an undertaking which develops, develops and operates or maintains and operates an industrial park/SEZ notified in accordance with the scheme framed and notified by the Government, the income from letting out of premises/developed space along with other facilities in an industrial park/ SEZ is to be charged to tax under the head ‘Profits and Gains of Business’ - Velankani Information System Pvt. Ltd 35 taxmann.com 1 (Karn); CBDT Circular No. 16 dated 25/04/2017.

(q) If letting out of properties was the business of the assessee, then its income would be chargeable to tax under the head ‘profits and gains of business or profession - Rayala Corporation (P) Ltd. v. ACIT [2016] 72 taxmann.com 149 (SC): 386 ITR 500 (SC); Chennai Properties & Investments Limited v. CIT [TS-238-SC-2015].

2. Type of compensation for termination or modification of agreement will be taxed u/s 28(ii)(e): As per section 28(ii)(a), (b), (c) and (d) compensation or any payment, due to or received by, any person in connection with termination or modification of management agreement, or agency agreement or in connection with vesting in government of the management of any property or business, was taxable under the head business or profession. However, there are certain compensation received for termination or modification of agreements which are capital receipt and are not covered by section 28(ii)(a), (b), (c) and (d) mentioned above. For example, a hotel company had entered into an agreement to manage a hotel for a particular period and thereafter it had a first right for taking ownership of the hotel. The hotel company by way of a supplementary agreement relinquished its first right of taking over the ownership of the hotel and received compensation. It was held that the said compensation was a capital receipt -Oberoi Hotel (P.) Ltd. v. CIT [1999] 103 Taxman 236 (SC).

Similarly, Parle Soft Drinks had entered into an agreement with Coco Cola as per which it had a first right of bottling within the territory of Pune and Bangalore. But Coco Cola in complete breach of its agreement

went ahead with the bottling in Bangalore. The case of breach of agreement was filed by Parle and finally Coco Cola settled the matter by paying a compensation of Rs. 16 crores. It was held that the compensation is capital receipt -CIT v. Parle Soft Drinks (Bangalore (P.) Ltd. [2017] 88 taxmann.com 24 (Bombay) [Revenue’s SLP dismissed by the Supreme Court [2018] 97 taxmann.com 136 (SC)]. In order to tax such compensations section 28(ii)(e) has been inserted to provide that w.e.f. asst. year 2019-20 any compensation received in connection with the termination or modification of a contract is taxable. This amendment may bring into the tax net the transactions of Oberoi Hotels as the same may be on account of modification of an agreement. But the amendment may not bring the compensation received by Parle into the tax net as the compensation was for breach of terms of contract and not for termination or modification of the contract.

The event had a holy outset with Ganga arti. Shri G. Asok Kumar, IAS, Director General of the National Mission for Clean Ganga, Ministry of

Jalsakti, Govt. of India; Dr. Sandeep Behera, a Senior Biodiversity Consultant at NMCG; Sri Saurav Barik, SDO, Barrackpore; Dr. Basanta Kumar Das, Principal Investigator of the project and Director of ICAR-CIFRI, a group of fishermen, and other project team members and officials of ICAR-CIFRI formally honoured the occasion with their presence. It commenced at Du

Paisar Ghat, Barrackpore, West Bengal. 1,00,000 native Sarana (Sar Puti) were released into the Ganga River with the goal of restoring the riverine stock. 30 fishermen took part in the ranching programme. Mr. G. Asok Kumar, the Director General of the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), gave an overview of the targets of Namami

Gange initiative and emphasised its recent accomplishments. He also mentioned the difficulties that can come up in the future. Haldwani On Track For Normalcy, Schools To Open But Not In Riot-Hit Area



New Delhi (KCN): The situation in Uttarakhand's Haldwani is slowly returning to normal after Thursday's violence. Thirty people have been arrested in the matter and the district is still under security blanket. Tomorrow, schools in the district will open and the administration is making all-out efforts to restore normalcy. The riot-hit area, Vanbhulpura, though will remain under the stern eyes of the administration. Schools will remain closed and curfew will stay in place. A platoon of paramilitary forces reached the area

today and four others are on way. Five people died and more than 250 people were injured during Thursday's violence after an illegal madrasa and space for namaz in Malik's Garden was demolished by the local municipal corporation. The civic team and police had gone to the area with a court order. But they were met with massive protests by local residents, who hit the streets and threw stones. Many vehicles including four JCB machines of the Municipal Corporation were set ablaze by the mob. Around 50

policemen -- besides administration officials, protesters and journalists -- were injured. The city was placed under curfew. Shoot-at-sight orders were issued against rioters and internet services completely shut down. As tension spiked in the area, people started migrating. At present most houses stand empty and locked. Main accused in the case Abdul Malik is on the run but the police said he would be arrested soon. Malik had allegedly built the illegal structure whose demolition triggered the violence. Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami has reiterated his determination to deal sternly with those involved in the violence. "Action is continuously being taken against the rioters and unruly elements involved in the Haldwani violence."

New Delhi: In the middle of his latest Ranji Trophy fixture for Bengal on Saturday, Akash Deep got the news he was hoping would come sometime in the future. India announced their squad for the last three Tests against England and the Bengal pacer had been drafted in to replace Avesh Khan.

"I was hopeful that in the near future I might get a Test call-up if I keep performing but I didn't expect that it would come by the third match itself," Akash told PTI.

The call-up comes as a reward for Akash's toil in the domestic circuit, where he has 103 wickets in 29 matches for Bengal since making his

debut in 2019. He also benefited from performing right when it mattered as he impressed with 11 wickets in the two unofficial Tests against England Lions last month.

Akash Deep was also with the ODI squad on India's recent tour of South Africa, and took away valuable lessons despite not making his debut.

"Inswing is my stock delivery, but at this level, you need to have outswinging and reverse swing and more importantly need to control the swing," he says. "I was in the ODI squad in South Africa and realised that more than skill, at this level, it is

more about mental strength of being able to execute plans under pressure," Akash said.

The 27-year-old finds himself at a stage in his career that he always envisioned for himself, but the road to this point has been rather rocky. When he was 15 and aspiring to play the game, life wasn't as simple as picking up the bat or ball for the youngster.

"In Bihar [suspended by the BCCI at the time], there was no platform and especially from the place where I came from, Sasaram, playing cricket was a crime.

"Lots of parents would ask their children not to mingle with Akash as he only plays cricket and



your studies would go for a toss. But I don't blame them. What would you have achieved playing cricket in a place like that? You would be wasting time and not

even become a cricketer, and also ignore academics. Your future would be ruined and they were worried. So, were my parents," Akash revealed.

Akash's father hoped his son would rather make a career in a field more conventional. "Appear for Bihar police constable's exams or at least try for state

government's Class IV staff [peons], my father used to say. He would fill up those government job application forms and I would go for exams and come back submitting blank forms. In my mind, while cricket was my passion, I just wanted to be happy and never thought about making it a career."

Tragedy however, changed his life in a span of six months. "My father and my brother died within six months. I had nothing to lose, and the motivation was that I had to take care of the family," Akash Deep said.

"I would play proper leather-ball matches for my club, but initially there was no money. So three

to four days a month, I would play tennis-ball matches around the district and earn Rs 6000 per day. So I would earn 20,000 per month, which helped me run my expenses," he added.

In Rajkot, Akash will walk into a dressing room with a familiar face already there in fellow Bengal pacer Mukesh Kumar.

"This is a matter of pride that myself and Mukesh bhai will be in the Indian dressing room together in a Test team," Akash Deep said. "Bengal is our state and it has given us everything. This national call-up is my way of showing my gratitude to Bengal."

Maxwell's record ton powers Australia to series win

New Delhi: Glenn Maxwell smashed his way to an unbeaten 55-ball 120, a record-equalling fifth century in the format as Australia beat West Indies by 34 runs in the second T20I at the Adelaide Oval on Sunday (February 11). Maxwell's feat put him at level with Rohit Sharma for the most centuries in T20Is and helped Australia to post the highest-ever T20I total in their country. With early wickets lost in pursuit of a big chase, West Indies were never really in the hunt. Rovman Powell (63 off 36), Andre Russell (37 off 16) and Jason Holder (28* off 16) all threw their bat around but could only help in limiting the margin of defeat. Roller-coaster start for Australia
Earlier in the day, Australia got off to a bumpy start after being put into bat as Josh Inglis fell early after a scratchy



start to his innings. However, skipper Mitchell Marsh set the tone with an ultra-aggressive cameo to create momentum into the innings. David Warner played second fiddle to his captain as the partnership flourished but the pair fell in the space of eight deliveries to give West Indies some respite.

surface with short square boundaries, the carnage was only about to start. Maxwell took a few balls to get in before hitting top gear. Such was the level of Maxwell's dominance that his 82-run stand with Marcus Stoinis had the latter contributing just 16 of those.
