WESTERN MEDIA'S VITUPERATION AGAINST RAM TEMPLE

Amid shouts of “Jai Shriram” and hysterical sloganeering in spiritual composure, the city of Ayodhya witnessed a truly religious event on January 22. The consecration of the Ram Temple at Ayodhya triggered an intense churn of political discourse in India and abroad. There have been numerous write-ups appearing in international dailies questioning the overwrought mobilization by an elected government that stood in unison with the cultural sensitivity of a 'militant majority' in a country that was known, in real sense, for its secular values. Further accusing a particular community and the government at the centre, the vituperative media went on calling the event at Ayodhya a blot on India's existence as a civilization and therefore, should have been sidelined and neglected as the chronology of Ayodhya's journey to this stage of consecration was deeply dampened in blood and hatred. Extreme critical views

on the ‘Hindu triumphalism’, as that is what they call it have appeared in the Washington Post, the Guardian and the Time. The new majoritarian momentum, according to them, has been in emergence in India ever since the Modi regime began to hold the reins of the country and the latest event, the temple consecration was its orchestration. They have only one remark to be made with vociferous malignity that a violent Hindu majoritarianism had almost swallowed the secular essence of India. The country of 1.4 billion is almost at the brink of a doom with its poor minority, especially the Muslims being tortured, bullied and deliberately alienated by an aggressive militant Hindu majority with the support of the present authoritarian government. The saffron surge, as per the western media, is threateningly growing everywhere and the Muslims are vacating areas where such forces intensify their presence. The government under Prime Minister Narendra Modi has no Muslim representation and the most populous state Uttar Pradesh is governed by a Hindu extremist monk Yogi Adityanath. Cries of Jai Shri Ram became a warmongering call in almost all cities and the

situation is grim with a shadow of animosity hovering over the habitually amiable and secular Muslim population. A Muslim woman journalist who went to report the Ayodhya event was forced to wear a Hindu bindi and she had to leave the event before it culminated, reports the Time magazine. So Ayodhya temple, as the narrative goes, will remain a huge monument of Hindu supremacy symbolizing its violent militancy. In another article the Time refuses to accept the Hindu claim on the historicity of the temple and its remnants buried under the mosque that existed before 1992. It calls the demolition of the controversial structure in 1992 an explosion of Islamophobic violence by a Hindu mob numbering at least 75000 people. Purely blaming the Hindus for the riots that followed after the demolition of the structure which killed about 2000 people, the western media pronounced its judgment on the Hindu majority. A violent Hindu nationalism had catapulted the Modi era to its rise in India in 2014 and Modi surreptitiously watered and furthered this majoritarian aggression. He could that people believed to have existed in the



his second term in 2019 and the national election 2024 and the temple consecration will be a shot in the arm, a plank that Modi will launch his political gimmickry, the narrative accuses. This being the intellectual acrimony with which the western media handles the Indian sensitivity of Ram, what remains to be seen by them is the reality. The real aura, the ideal that Lord Ram upheld as he ruled his kingdom, has undoubtedly been a part of India's social discourse for generations through the great epic Ramayana. There hasn't been a speck of doubt with which you would study the glory of Ram. Centuries of agitation for a temple that people believed to have existed in the

place of the controversial mosque with archeological evidence accentuating the claim scientifically, the woke media reflect, as usual, their negation calling it a framework of the oppressive Hindu majority. The country's apex court had unequivocally quashed the claims raised by the opposite side and pronounced its verdict favoring a temple at the disputed site. But outrageous on everything that India represents through its cultural legacy, more inflammatory remarks on the consecration and the Prime Minister's statements were tossed by the western media. For instance, let us examine the viciousness in what the Guardian reports. It says, “While the Congress and other opposition parties

boycotted the ceremony, they have failed to mount an effective challenge to Mr Modi's dangerous majoritarianism and have at times succumbed to its dominance.” The paper, with its colonial calculative approach further estimates that the Modi regime, if repeated for the third time, would rewrite the country's constitution, giving way to a dangerous and violent Hindu India emerging from the laments of a disconsolate minority. We need to know the level of animosity towards the Hindu population that plays its ugly game in India and abroad. For almost 80 percent of India's Hindu population, the consecration moment was one of the holiest. An event that they believe would be

remembered for centuries. Ayodhya would receive the best spiritual makeover throughout this revamping process and millions around the city, irrespective of their religious affinity would be benefitted both socially and economically. The wait for a magnificent temple in the birthplace of their highly venerated Lord was a moment of joy, which was both spiritual and socially elevating. Disregarding the legitimacy of India's legal process, media across various countries began to spit hate against the temple and the Hindus. Alarming, there is a visible repugnance to the Indian state, especially to its Hindu heritage. To stretch it further, what causes them to be seriously abhorrent about is the political triumphalism of the Hindu majority which the proponents of wokeism in the west and elsewhere think would successfully pull India giving it a powerful position. Modi is regarded as a persona non grata, who they think is the product of this majoritarian triumphalism that has been in power since 2014. The Hindus after the temple inauguration are expected to shoot their support for Narendra

Modi and the western media's unwillingness to accept his rise once again is the principal reason behind their slanderous narratives. Undoubtedly, Ayodhya is going to remain relevant throughout the battle readiness of Modi and his party. That is the threatening aspect that his opposition including the Congress was fearful about. A huge thrust in Modi's popularity was evident as the country joyfully danced in tune with his call for celebrating Ayodhya. Nullifying his severe spiritual austerities for the temple consecration as political gimmickry, the opposition parties lost their chance to join the cultural euphoria that would set the momentum for 2024. Denying India's inclusive majoritarianism outrightly, not only the western media but the naysayers in India also will lose the chance to keep pace with the rise of 'political Hinduism' consolidating its power. This has been a reality that began to vividly lit up India's political horizon with a saffron radiance.

BRAUSS, SSSM, reviews Pradhan Mantri Khanij Kshetra Kalyan Yojna (PMKKKY), finds it a diverse basket of prospects

The Pradhan Mantri Khanij Kshetra Kalyan Yojana (PMKKKY) has been implemented by the District Mineral Foundations (DMFs) of the respective districts using the funds accruing to the DMF. The overall objective of PMKKKY scheme is to implement various developmental and welfare projects/programs in mining affected areas, and these projects / programs will be complementing the existing ongoing schemes/projects of State and Central Government; to minimize/mitigate the adverse impacts, during and after mining, on the environment, health and socio-economics of people in mining districts; and to ensure long-term sustainable livelihoods for the affected people in mining areas. In high priority areas – at least 60% of PMKKKY funds to be utilized under the heads like : Drinking

water supply; Environment preservation and pollution control measures; Health care; Education; Welfare of Women and Children- Special programmes for addressing problems of maternal and child health, malnutrition, infectious diseases, etc.; Welfare of aged and disabled people; Skill development; and Sanitation. In other priority Areas, up to 40% of the PMKKKY to be utilized under the heads such as, Physical infrastructure; Irrigation; Energy and Watershed Development; and any other measures for enhancing environmental quality in mining district. As per the data shared by Ministry of Mines, Government of India, out of the 2,52,995 projects sanctioned under PMKKKY at the national level, the Government has completed 2,40,000 projects so far. Till September this year, Rs. 63534.07 crore stands allocated and Rs. 47,500 crores have been spent. As per the latest figures of Ministry of Mines, District Mineral Foundation (DMF) has

been constituted in 644 Districts spread across 23 States of India. In Madhya Pradesh, till November 2023, out of the 13,800 projects sanctioned under PMKKKY, the Government of Madhya Pradesh has completed 6,064 projects so far. Till September this year, Rs. 4912.4 crore stands allocated and Rs. 1259.2 crore has been spent. As per National Mineral Inventory as on 01.04.2020(P), Madhya Pradesh hosts the country's 90% diamond, 29% molybdenum, 23% copperore, 12% manganese and 19% rock phosphate ore resources. Important mineral occurrences in Madhya Pradesh are: bauxite in Annuppur, Balaghat, Guna, Jabalpur, Katni, Mandla, Rewa, Satna, Shahdol, Shivpuri, Sidhi & Vidisha district; copper in Balaghat, Betul & Jabalpur district; diamond in Chhatarpur and Panna district; iron ore (haematite) in Betul, Gwalior, Jabalpur & Katni district; limestone in Balaghat, Chhindwara, Damoh, Dhar, Hoshangabad, Jabalpur, Jhabua, Khargone, Katni,

Mandsaur, Morena, Narsinghpur, Neemach, Rewa, Sagar, Satna, Sehore, Shahdol & Sidhi district; manganese ore in Balaghat, Jabalpur and Jhabua district; and vermiculite in Jhabua district. Other minerals that occur in Madhya Pradesh are: gold in Jabalpur, Katni & Sidhi district; graphite in Betul & Sidhi district; lead-zinc in Betul and Chhindwara district; molybdenum in Balaghat district; potash in Panna district rock phosphate in Chhatarpur, Jhabua & Sagar district; and sillimanite in Sidhi district. The principal minerals produced in Madhya Pradesh are Bauxite, Copper Concentrate, Copper Ore, Diamond, Iron Ore, Limestone, Manganese Ore, Minor Mineral, and Phosphorite. The value of Minor Minerals production is estimated at Rs.3702 Crores. The number of reporting mines for Mineral Conservation & Development Rules (MCDR) minerals in the state is 263. There is increase in production in Iron Ore (80.72%),

Phosphorite (16.19%), Copper Ore (9.08%), Limestone (8.77%) and decrease in Diamond (-98.09%) and Bauxite (-3.71%) as compared to the previous year. A study was taken up by Prof. Sunil Goyal, Dean, School of Social Sciences and Management Studies (SSSM) & School of Agriculture and Rural Studies, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar University of Social Sciences (BRAUSS), Dr. Ambedkar Nagar (MHOW), Indore, Madhya Pradesh to analyse the PMKKKY in the context of the recently notified rules on the District Mineral Foundation (DMF). The PMKKKY and Central Rules on DMF were released within a day of each other– September 16 and 17. Both combine to make real the policy of the central government on sharing mining benefits with some of the poorest people of the country living on India's richest lands. While the DMF rules mandate contribution to the DMFs by mining lease-holders, the PMKKKY lays out the roadmap for delivering development for the mining-affected areas and communities.

While analysing the DMF Contribution Rules, these were found to be a significantly watered-down version of what was proposed in the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment (MMDR) Act, 2015 – a reduction in contribution to 10 per cent instead of one-third by lease-holders of mines that were leased after 12 January 2015 and 30 per cent instead of equal royalty for older mines. This means that less funds will be available for developmental work in mining-affected areas. In his study, BRAUSS Dean Prof. Sunil Goyal is of view that this will undermine the objectives of the DMFs and will dash hopes of mining-affected communities across the country. The PMKKKY has been aligned to DMF to facilitate the implementation of the scheme. The scheme will be implemented by the DMFs by using the funds accrued to them. On analysing it was also found that PMKKKY is a “diverse basket of prospects” – it has both positives as well as loopholes. The positive recommendations

include providing definition of directly and indirectly-affected areas that is crucial for development, involvement of Gram Sabha for identifying affected people use of DMF funds, taking into account long-term concerns, requirement of approval of Gram Sabhas for PMKKKY plans and projects to be rolled out in scheduled areas, mechanisms of transparency and accountability. However, the study finds the scheme to be vague and limited in several aspects. Certain provisions of fund utilization, such as for building large infrastructure, putting in place environmental pollution control measures, staffing, purchasing vehicles etc., are misplaced which may lead to significant misuse of funds and hurt the spirit with which DMF has been instituted. It also restricts the possibility of community involvement limiting the role of Gram Sabhas, particularly in areas outside scheduled areas. States must act now, and properly. After the notification of DMF contribution Rules and

the PMKKKY, it will now depend on the states as to how they frame their DMF Rules. With considerably reduced contribution coming to the DMF following the DMF contribution Rules now, it is important to make sure that the money is used for the right purposes and people in mining-affected areas benefit optimally. The PMKKKY guideline gives some positive direction to the states to develop their DMF Rules. But it is also crucial to take account of the loopholes in the PMKKKY and make necessary improvements. The study has also strongly stated that it is also important to ensure that DMF remains an inclusive institution of the people and for the people, a vision with which it has been discussed over the years and instituted.

CII Lauds Interim Budget 2024 as a Blueprint for Resilient Growth and Inclusive Development

Kolkata (ABHIJIT SETH): The interim budget for the fiscal year 2024-25, presented by Smt Nirmala Sitharaman, Minister of Finance and Corporate Affairs, has garnered positive reactions from industry leaders, with Mr Chandrajit Banerjee, Director General of the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), expressing his views on the strategic and growth-oriented aspects of the budget. Mr Banerjee highlighted the budget's focus on capital expenditure (capex) as a key driver for economic growth. The CII had advocated for continued emphasis on capex, and the government responded by allocating Rs 11.1 lakh crores for capex, marking an 11.1%

The rural economy is set to receive a boost through initiatives like post-harvest infrastructure creation, Atmanirbharta mission in oilseeds, dairy development, and support for fishing and

aquaculture. The creation of 1 Lakh patti dis underscores the government's commitment to empower women and enhance inclusion. These measures, according to Mr Banerjee, not only provide economic security to vulnerable sections of society but also contribute to expanding the Indian consumer market. The emphasis on consumption-led growth enhances the resilience of the economy, a crucial factor in the face of global uncertainties, be they economic, political, or geopolitical. India's sustained high growth coupled with inclusivity positions it well for the future, aiming to achieve



developed nation status by 2047. Mr R Dinesh, President of CII, lauded the budget's prudence and substance. He commended the government for achieving a fiscal deficit of 5.8% of GDP for FY24, surpassing the projected

5.9%. The fiscal consolidation for FY25, at 5.1% of GDP, exceeded expectations, instilling confidence that India is on track to achieve a 4.5% fiscal deficit by FY26. In an environment marked by global uncertainty, Dinesh emphasized the

importance of macroeconomic stability driven by prudent fiscal management. The budget's substantive proposals were acknowledged, including the Rs 1 lakh crore fund for promoting new-age technologies and research and development (R&D). Dinesh highlighted the importance of state-level reforms and the focus on strengthening the ecosystem for electric vehicles, manufacturing, and EV charging infrastructure. The provisions for MSMEs, including credit facilitation, technology adoption, and regulatory support, align with the goal of making India a global manufacturing hub. The industry reactions from the Eastern region echoed the

positivity. Shiv Siddhant Kaul, Chairman of CII Eastern Region, appreciated the budget's emphasis on the poor, women, farmers, renewable energy, and tourism. Suendra Kumar Behera highlighted the positive trajectory for infrastructure development, women's empowerment, healthcare support, and small business support. The announcement of a 1 lakh crore corpus for innovation with a 50-year interest-free loan received praise for encouraging private sector participation in R&D and innovation. "Not A Single Word On Unemployment": Priyanka Gandhi On Interim Budget

New Delhi: Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Friday alleged that there is neither any vision nor any plan to create new jobs in the Centre's Interim Budget and said the "biggest misfortune" is Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman did not say a single word on unemployment. She also claimed that the BJP-led government has failed to curb inflation and unemployment, and its Interim Budget has disappointed every section of the society. In a post on X, the Congress general secretary said the two biggest troubles that the people of India are facing are unemployment and inflation. "What measures were taken in the central government's budget to deal with these two problems?" she asked. "Unemployment has broken all records. Big institutes of the country



such as IIMs and IITs are facing the challenge of placements. There is neither any vision nor any plan in the budget to create new jobs and deal with unemployment. The biggest misfortune is that the finance minister did not say a single word on unemployment," Mr Gandhi said. Similarly, the general public, struggling with inflation, was also disappointed with this Interim Budget, she

claimed. "The poor and middle classes have been waiting for relief for the last ten years. No tax relief was given to the middle class. The BJP government, which has failed to curb inflation and unemployment, has disappointed every section of the society," she said. In another post on X, Ms Gandhi alleged inflation is increasing day-by-day and women bear the

maximum brunt of it. "On the other hand, crimes against women are increasing and they are discriminated against at the workplace also," she said. "According to the government agency Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS), female temporary workers are paid 48 per cent less than men for the same work. At the same time, permanent women workers get 24 per cent

less money than men. Amidst these circumstances, the most unfortunate thing is that nothing was said in the (Interim) budget to remove these anomalies," she said. The Congress on Thursday said the Interim Budget presented by the government lacks both accountability and vision, and questioned how many of the promises made in the last ten years have been fulfilled. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced a ? 11.11 lakh crore spending on infrastructure and vowed to continue reforms as she resisted resorting to populist measures in Modi government's last Budget before the general elections, instead choosing to stay on the path of cutting deficit while bolstering measures for focus groups.

Not A Single Person Died Of Hunger In Last 10 Years: Minister In Parliament



New Delhi (KCN): Not a single person died of hunger in the country in the last 10 years, Union minister and BJP leader S P Singh Baghel has claimed, while accusing the Congress of not taking measures to eradicate poverty. Speaking during a debate on the Motion of Thanks on the President's address, the

Minister of State for Health hit out at former prime ministers Indira Gandhi and Rajiv Gandhi. Baghel said while he acknowledges Rajiv Gandhi to be an "innocent prime minister", he would also characterise him as an "incompetent" one because it was his duty to prevent corruption

and ensure that theft did not occur under his government. Hitting out at former prime minister Indira Gandhi, he said despite giving the slogan of 'garibi hatao', poverty could not be eradicated by her Congress government. "If any responsible individual has deceived this country, it is the

late Indira Gandhi who gave the 'garibi hatao' slogan. If poverty had vanished, who are the 80 crore people we have inherited and to whom Modi Ji is providing five kilograms of rice and wheat?" Baghel said. He said not a single person out of 140 crore Indians has died of hunger in the last 10 years. "Because they get 5 kg of rice for free, and it has been mentioned in the budget that a guarantee has been taken for the next five years as well," he said. Lauding the government for banning triple talaq, he said now, saying "talaq" three times will not work; you had to go to court for it". He also hit out at the opposition and said his party would come back in May with over 400 seats.

Man Arrested For Killing Son, 14, Over Complaints From School: Police

Pune: A man was arrested in Maharashtra's Solapur for allegedly killing his 14-year-old son with a sodium nitrate-laced drink due to frustration and anger over his behaviour, a police official said on Friday. Accused Vijay Battu (43) has claimed he was angry as there were constant complaints from school about Vishal Battu, while other issues included the victim watching explicit content on his phone, neglecting studies and picking fights with his sister, Inspector Ajay Jagtap of Jodhavi police station said. "On January 13, Vijay and his wife Kirti lodged a missing person complaint after Vishal did not return home. His body was discovered on the same day by the road near Tuljapur Naka, after which an accidental death case was registered."

Doubt Congress Will Get "Even 40 seats" In Lok Sabha Polls: Mamata Banerjee

Kolkata (KCN): In a scathing attack, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Friday challenged the Congress to take on the BJP in the Hindi heartland states and said she has doubts whether the grand old party will secure "even 40 seats" in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections. Ms Banerjee also criticised the Congress's Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra, which traversed through the state's six districts, comparing it to a "mere

photo opportunity" for "migratory birds" who have descended upon the state. "I proposed that Congress contest 300 seats (across the country where BJP is the main opposition), but they refused to heed. Now, they've arrived in the

state to stir up Muslim voters. I doubt whether they will secure even 40 seats if they contested 300," Banerjee asserted. Speaking during a dharna in Kolkata to demand the clearance of the state's dues by the Centre, Ms Banerjee reiterated that her party was willing to form an alliance with the Congress for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections in West Bengal, but highlighted that it was the grand old party which declined her offer.

Odisha CM Inaugurates Dialysis Centers At 16 Sub-District Hospitals



Bhubaneswar(KCN): With the motto "Every life is precious" and to reduce the financial burden of kidney patients, today, Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on Thursday dedicated 16 new dialysis centers at different Sub Divisional

Hospitals, CHCs and DHH, Khordha under free dialysis service. As many as 32 dialysis centres will be opened at the sub-district level under the 5T initiative across the State. Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister said that along

with free treatment in government healthcare centres, more than 4 crore people are provided free-of-cost treatment through Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana and BSKY Nabin Card. This has eliminated the problem of people worrying

Odisha was the first state in the country to provide this service. In the first phase, this service was started in all district headquarters hospitals. Now in the 5T

initiative, it has been extended to sub-district hospitals. 32 dialysis centres will be opened at the sub-district level, the CM said. He further said that the State Government would spend Rs 50 crore annually to provide free dialysis services to the patients. Expressing that all life is precious to him, the Chief Minister said that government healthcare centres are being transformed. The work is underway to provide better services under the Ama Hospital programme. There are free medical facilities for the rich and poor. This programme will help us to achieve the goal of "Sustha (Healthy) Odisha, Sukhi (Happy) Odisha, the CM expressed.

PM Modi To Launch Power Projects Worth Rs 28,978 Cr In Odisha On Feb 3

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi will dedicate to the Nation, NTPC Darlipali Super Thermal Power Station (2x800 MW), NSPCL Rourkela PP-II Expansion Project (1x250 MW) and lay the foundation stone of NTPC Talcher Thermal Power Project, Stage-III (2x660 MW) with a total investment of Rs 28,978 Crore on 3rd February 2024. Addressing the media persons today at Bhubaneswar, Sudip Nag, Regional Executive Director, (Eastern Region I & II), spoke on the upcoming developmental power projects to be flagged off by the Prime Minister of India. Located in the Sundargarh district of Odisha, Darlipali STPP is a pit-head Power Station with Supercritical (highly efficient) Technology and supplies low-cost power to its beneficiary states, such as Odisha, Bihar, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Gujarat and

Sikkim. The 250 MW project of NTPC-SAIL Power Company Ltd was established in Rourkela Steel Plant (RSP) to provide reliable power for the steel plant which is vital for economic growth. Further, NTPC is developing the Talcher Thermal Power Project, Stage-III within old TTPS plant premises in the Angul district of Odisha, which was taken over by NTPC from the Odisha State Electricity Board in the year 1995. The old TTPS plant was decommissioned after completing more than 50 years of service to the Nation. The upcoming plant will have highly efficient Ultra Super Critical Technology-based units and approximately three times the capacity of the old TTPS plant. While 50% capacity from this project is dedicated to the state of Odisha, other beneficiary states such as Tamil Nadu, Gujarat and Assam will also get low-cost power from this pit-

head station. This project is being constructed with all modern environmental features like efficient electrostatic precipitator, Flue gas desulphurization, bio-mass cofiring, and covered storage space for coal and will thus help in lesser Specific Coal Consumption and CO2 emissions. Besides creating direct and indirect employment opportunities in the region, these projects have contributed to the improvement of physical infrastructure such as approach roads, drainage, transportation and communication facilities. Various development initiatives are also being undertaken by NTPC in the surrounding villages in the fields of education, drinking water, sanitation, health, women empowerment, rural sports, etc. NTPC has also set up a Medical College cum Hospital in Sundargarh, Odisha.
