

New Delhi,(KCN):The President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu has sent her greetings to all fellow citizens on the eve of New Year 2024.

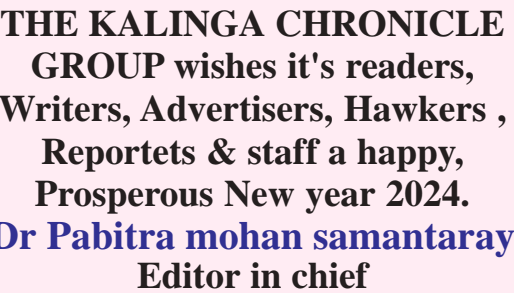

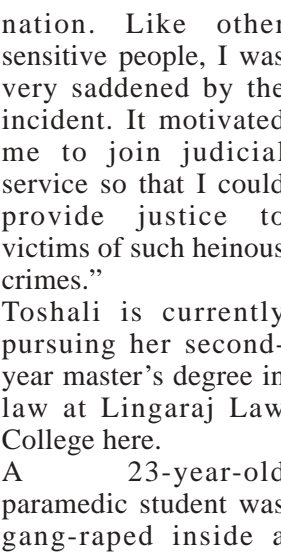

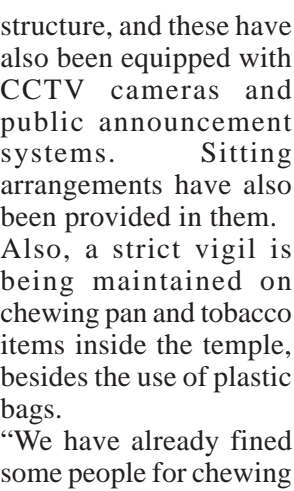
Toshali, who hails from Berhampur, cracked the OJS Exam, 2022 conducted by the Odisha Public Service Commission (OPSC). The result was declared December 27 this year.

Toshali, the daughter of a retired judicial officer, told PTI, "I was in class 11 when the Nirbhaya case shook the entire

Puri(KCN): The famed Jagannath temple in Odisha's Puri will open its doors to devotees at 11 am, in a bid to handle the rush on New Year's Day. It was decided that the rituals of the temple will be completed on time Sunday so that the doors are closed at 11 pm, and could be opened again two hours later at 1 am, district collector Samarth Verma said. Lakhs of devotees visit the temple January 1 every year to seek blessings of the sibling deities — Lord Jagannath, Lord Balabhadra, and Goddess Subhadra. “We expect that about 3-4 lakh devotees will visit the temple on New

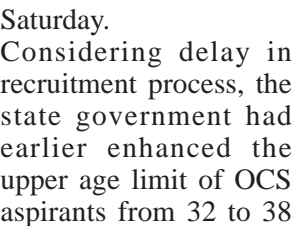

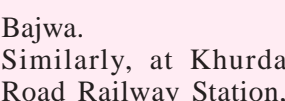

Pakistan poll panel rejects nomination papers of PTI bigwigs, party cries foul

Islamabad(KCN): Nomination papers of top leadership of the Pakistan Tehreek-e Insaf (PTI) for the February 8 general elections failed to clear the scrutiny after which the party cried foul, local media reported. PTI founder Imran Khan's nomination papers from NA-122 (Lahore) and NA-89 (Mianwali) were rejected due to his conviction in the Toshakhana case and some pending dues, Dawn reported quoting Isakhel Assistant Commissioner Ghulam Murtaza as saying. Murtza said that he got



this information from Additional Deputy Commissioner (General), who is the returning officer of NA-89. Nomination papers of PTI Vice Chairman Shah Mahmood Qureshi, PTI leader and former Punjab province governor Parvez Elahi, party leader Hammad Azhar, and party's women wing leader Amara

Niazi were also rejected. Most of the nomination papers were rejected due to defaulter of utility and other pending bills, Dawn said quoting sources. Though the PTI candidates failed to clear the scrutiny in initial phase, till January 3, they can approach an appellate tribunal against the

decision of the respective returning officer, who in turn can adjudicate on these appeals till January 10. Crying foul after the poll panel rejected nomination papers of party bigwigs, party chairman Gohar Khan posted on X: "The state machinery is in full swing against PTI's candidates, whose proposers and seconders or they are being openly harassed, assaulted and pushed back from ROs' offices." PTI secretary general Omar Ayub said: "If this pre-poll rigging continues unabated, the transparency of the election process is and will be called into question."

SONEPUR-KHAMBESWARPALLI RAIL SECTION OF KHURDA ROAD-BALANGIR RAIL LINE PROJECT COMMISSIONED.



Bhubaneswar,(KCN): The newly-laid Broad Gauge Rail Line of 10.50kms between Sonapur and Khambeswarpalli of Khurda Road-Balangir Rail Line project has been completed and commissioned. Commissioner Railway Safety (CRS) inspected this newly laid Rail Line on 29th December 2023 and given his sanction for commissioning of the section. CRS has inspected the

safety parameters of the newly laid Railway Track, Signalling System, Bridges and declared 10.50 km line fit of the on-going 301 km Khurda Road-Balangir Rail line project. A team of senior Railway officials of East Coast Railway assisted CRS during the inspection. Altogether, 152.805 kms rail line work has been commissioned out of 301kms. The Railways

has been constructing the line from both the sides, i.e, from Khurda Road and Balangir for early completion of the project. East Coast Railway is committed to developing Railway infrastructure in the region and working dedicatedly to complete the project at the earliest. Hon'ble Prime Minister had earlier dedicated two sections of the line from Balangir up to Jhartarbha. Hon'ble Railway

Minister Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw consistently monitors the progress of this project in Odisha and the ministry has given priority for early completion of Khurda Road Balangir Rail Line project. 1. Deductions permitted from undisclosed income declared by assessee Sheth Developers [2012] 25 taxmann.com 173 (Bombay)/[2012] 210 Taxman 208 (Bombay)(Mag.), the Bombay High Court held that Builders receiving undisclosed income in course of its business, is entitled to benefit of deduction under section 80-IB(10). The plea of revenue that in view of section 69A benefit of deduction u/s 80-IB(10) would not be available to assessee was not well founded. ACIT v. Mahalaxmi Infraprojects Ltd (2018) 63 ITR 671 (Pune) (Trib), In case of Survey in an Industrial undertaking, additional income was offered as non-genuine purchases. Tribunal held that additional income had been assessed in hands of assessee from same nature of business. Hence assessee was eligible to claim deduction u/s 80IA(4) of the Act. Followed Sheth Developers 25

taxmann.com 173 (Bom)(HC). 2. No Power of confinement or arrest In L.R. Gupta and Ors. v. Union of India and Ors. [1992]194 ITR 32 (Delhi), the Counsel for assessee submitted that the ingredients of Section 132(1) were not satisfied in the present case and the authorisation which was issued was liable to be quashed. It was further contended by the learned Counsel that the respondents were also in error in passing orders under Section 132(3) in respect of the jewellery. The Court agreed that the respondents had no jurisdiction to prevent the assessee from attending to his work in Court. However, his statement could be recorded. The Court held that, in the present case, no reasonable person could have come to the conclusion that the ingredients contained in Clause (a), (b) or (e) of Section 132 were attracted, therefore, the Court issued writ of

mandamus quashing the impugned authorisation and also the further action which had been taken by the Income Tax Department pursuant to the said authorisation including the seizure of all documents, cash and jewellery. No. 187/3/2020-ITA-I, dated 13th August, 2020 prescribing the “Income-tax Authority” for the purpose of exercise of power of survey u/s 133A of the Act, the CBDT has directed that: - i) the verification surveys by the International Taxation

charges will henceforth be conducted by them with the approval of the CCsIT (International Taxation) concerned and where there is no CCIT (International Taxation), with the approval of CCIT (International Taxation). ii) the verification surveys by the TDS charges will henceforth be conducted by them with the approval of CCsIT (TDS) and where there is no CCIT(TDS), with the approval of Pr. CCsIT. iii) any survey action u/s 133A of the Act by the Central charges will be conducted after the approval of CCIT (Central)/DGIT (Investigation) and in collaboration with the investigation wing. The Order on 18th September, 2020 also states that before approving any survey action, Pr. CCsIT/ Pr. DGsIT/CCsIT/DGsIT must ensure that all the other possibilities are exhausted and the survey action has to be resorted to only as a last resort. 4. Whether survey can be converted into search In Vinod Goel (Advocate) v. UOI [2001] 118 Taxman 690 (P&H)/[2001] 252 ITR 29 (P&H), it was held that on basis of documents collected during search and seizure of premises of RKAK and RKC, authorities felt satisfied

that petitioner had nexus with some property dealing and resultantly a survey was conducted at petitioner's premises. Again, on basis of incriminating documents collected during survey, survey was converted into search and seizure for which Addl. Director gave authorisation. In view of fact that documents recovered during previous search established nexus between business of RKAK and RKC with petitioners, search and seizure carried out at premises of petitioner should be held to be in continuation of previous search. When sufficient number of incriminating documents were recovered during survey of petitioner's premises and concerned officer recorded in warrant his satisfaction that required documents would not be produced in case of summons issued under section 131, on ground of mere presence of some defects in warrant, it could not be said that conversion of survey into search and seizure was illegal. 5. Sealing of business premises In Shyam Jewellers v. CCIT [1992] 196 ITR 243 (Allahabad), it was held that business premises of assessee cannot be sealed off either under section 133A or section 132.

When there was no information before Chief Commissioner at time of passing authorization order that assessee was in possession of undisclosed money, bullion, jewellery or other valuable article, such a vague and general order could not be treated as an authorization order in law and no proceedings on basis of such an order could have taken place. It was held that initiation of search proceedings and passing of assessment order under section 132(5) were invalid and liable to be quashed. 6. Recording of Telephone Conversation / Statements 24.1 In S. Pratap Singh v. The State of Punjab AIR 1964 AIR 72 (SC), 1964 SCR (4) 733, it was held that rendering of the taperecorded conversation can be legal evidence by way of corroborating the statements of a person who deposes that the other speaker and he carried on that conversation or even of the statement of a person who may depose that he overheard the conversation between the two persons and what they actually stated had been tape recorded. How much weight to be given to such evidence will depend on the other factors which may be established in a

particular case. 7. Other cases on Tape recorded conversation/ statement a) Yusufali Esmail Nagree v. The State of Maharashtra 1968 AIR 147 (SC) b) Ram Singh v. Conclusion An admission in statement under section 132(4) is vital and the department may make addition in income based on such statement unless successfully retracted. However, in order it to be effective, the retraction should be made properly and at the earliest possible opportunity and establishing the situation as to how the facts stated in statement mistaken on facts or in law and if necessary to prove that the statement was recorded with coercion and pressure. According to World Bank, if 2022 was a year of uncertainty, 2023 is the year of inequality. For countries hopeful to bounce back from the devastating losses of the COVID-19 pandemic, the battle has been made tougher by the compounding threats of climate change, fragility, conflict and violence, or food insecurity, to name a few—that make it difficult for economies across the board to fully recover. These polycrises have made development work more complicated. A polycrisis- a time of great disagreement, confusion, or suffering that is caused by many different problems happening at the same time so that they together have a very big effect. A global polycrisis occurs when

crises in multiple global systems become causally entangled in ways that significantly degrade humanity's prospects. The climate emergency, Covid-19, two ongoing wars that heightened geopolitical tensions, artificial intelligence, record numbers of migrants, and deep uncertainty about the future are examples. The Israel-Hamas War, and the dreadful humanitarian crisis it has fashioned in Gaza, has brought the Israeli-Palestinian conflict back to the forefront of foreign-policy discussions. Meanwhile, the Ukraine War has continued to rage, with no end in sight. While hot wars undermine security across the Middle East and Europe, the risk that the “new cold war” between the United States and China could turn scorching. The rule based international order has almost extinct with UNO being emasculated. Several shocking earthquakes, numerous instances of gun violence in the United States and the imprisonment of a popular ex-Prime Minister in Pakistan — 2023 was an eventful year which saw natural disasters and man-made conflicts test nations and citizens globally.

According to World Bank, rising economic inequality in many countries, especially the rich ones, in recent decades has emerged as an important topic of political debate and a major public policy concern. Widening economic disparities and related anxieties are stoking social discontent and are a major driver of the increased skepticism about public institutions, political polarization, and populist nationalism that are so evident today. Small developing economies face unique challenges, including heightened vulnerability to external shocks. According to UNO, inequalities are not only driven and measured by income, but are determined by other factors - gender, age, origin, ethnicity, disability, sexual orientation, class, and religion. Of course, super-rich outstrip their extraordinary grab of half of all new wealth in past decade. Billionaire fortunes are increasing by \$2.7 billion a day even as at least 1.7 billion workers now live in countries where inflation is outpacing wages. The report shows that while the richest 1 percent captured 54 percent of new global wealth over the past

decade, this has accelerated to 63 percent in the past two years (2019-21) according Oxfam report -2023. Oxfam India's 2023 report, accurately titled “Survival of the Richest “, chooses to contend with this concept. Their report instead claims that resources are not scarce in India, or in the rest of the world. Instead, it is the inequitable distribution of resources that creates scarcity in the first place. The richest 1 per cent in India now own more than 40.5 per cent of the country's total wealth, just 5 per cent of Indians own more than 60 per cent of the country's wealth while the bottom half of the population together share just 3 percent of wealth, While extreme poverty in middle-income countries has decreased, poverty in the poorest countries and countries affected by fragility, conflict, or violence is still worse than before the pandemic. The persistence of poverty in these countries makes other key global development goals much harder to achieve. Nearly 70 crore people around the world today live in extreme poverty, meaning they live on

less than \$2.15 per day. India's poverty rate at 11.9 per cent in 2021 also remained higher than the 2018 level of 11.09 per cent. In fact, since 2019, the number of people below \$3.65 a day, or \$6.85 a day have slightly increased in world and in India too. The world produces enough food to feed all of its 800-crore people, yet 82.8 crore people go hungry every day. Of those 82.8 crores, the World Food Program estimates that over 40 percent are facing acute levels of hunger. 230 crore people — 29.6 percent of the global population — don't have adequate access to food. Over 12.2 crore more people are facing hunger in the world since 2019 due to the pandemic and repeated weather shocks and conflicts, including the war in Ukraine, according to the latest State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World (SOFI) report published jointly by five United Nations specialized agencies. India stands in a group of 40 countries where the scale of global hunger has been termed as ‘serious’. India ranked 111th out of 125 countries in the Global Hunger Index 2023, While the rate of undernourishment in India stood at 16.6 percent and

under-five mortality at 3.1 percent, the prevalence of anaemia in women aged between 15 and 24 years stood at 58.1 percent. As per the index, India also has the highest child wasting rate in the world at 18.7 percent, reflecting acute undernutrition. Wasting is measured based on children's weight relative to their height. As with most crises, it's the world's poorest countries that are getting hit the hardest. Many of these countries, already in debt distress, find themselves even more squeezed for resources. The world's poorest face the risk of debt crises as borrowing costs surge. The increase in costs shifted scarce resources away from critical needs such as health, education, and the environment. The IMF has raised concerns about the long-term sustainability of India's debts. It cautioned that general government debt is likely to exceed 100 percent of India's gross domestic product (GDP) in the near future. India's public debt-to-GDP ratio shot up from 75 per cent in 2019-20 to 88.5 per cent in 2020-21 has declined to 81 per cent in 2022-23 as against target of 60 percent. However, the problem is that interest payments swallow nearly half of

India's revenues, with interest payments rising over 40 percent of revenue. Around the world, threats to liberal democracy, open societies, and the rule of law have raised alarm bells such threats may well be particularly acute in a deeply polarized US, especially as Donald Trump prepares to challenge Biden in the 2024 presidential election. But democratic deterioration is just one dimension of the “polycrisis” that the world now faces .The world is getting influenced by pro-rich and pro corporate rulers. The global economy was projected to grow by 1.7 percent in 2023 and 2.7 percent in 2024, with the sharp downturn in growth expected to be widespread. Forecasts in 2023 were revised down for 95 percent of advanced economies and nearly 70 percent of emerging market and developing economies. The economic outlook for developing economies has darkened in 2023. The first four years of the 2020s have proved to be among the weakest in three decades. However, it is predicted that India will be witness one of the highest GDP growths. But India's growth estimation is not

beyond doubt and is not reflected wellbeing of people. India is abysmally placed behind at 138 in per capita GDP and 132 in in human development Index out of 191 countries. Inflation scares, food inflation, unemployment, rising suicide, and criminal activities regressive tax regime have hurt Indians more. Households borrowed more to fulfil their consumption needs. Household financial savings, hit a 47-year low, dropping to 5.1 percent of GDP in 2022-23 from the previous year's 7.2 percent showing rising financial distress of people. In this situation, hoping for a better new year means electing pro-people regime in 74 countries that will undergo electoral battles. India is likely to see keenly contested election too where voters should have to elect democratic and pro-people regime. They should not forget how 146 MPs were suspended during winter session undemocratically. Now, time is to save democracy from onslaughts of oligarchy and crony capitalism. Ganjam farmers bring turnaround in paddy farming with SRI method

Berhampur(KCN): SRI (System of Rice Intensification) method of paddy cultivation can help check climate change and benefit the farmers as it consumes very less water in comparison to other methods of cultivation. This is because SRI method does not require continuous flooding for rice cultivation. Taking up paddy cultivation in SRI method helps reduce the possibility of global warming by 29 per cent as it results in 25-70 per cent reduction in discharge of methane and carbon dioxide to the atmosphere. This method also produces more panicles during the harvest, reduces the

crop harvest period by at least 10 days, and requires a minimum amount of seed, water, and chemical fertiliser for the crop.

Moreover, paddy cultivation is rain and storm-tolerant and helps in increasing the fertility of the farmland. As a large volume of water is required for rice cultivation, farmers conventionally depend on rainfall to raise their crops. However, due to a change in climatic conditions, it has become a difficult task for the farmers to supply enough water to their farmlands for the growth of the paddy crops. Farmers have been failing to start their cultivation in time



due to a lack of water every year. Even if they manage to sow seeds, seedling death comes back to haunt them due to a lack of irrigation facilities. Lack of irrigation results in reduced output for farmers, which is why they are withdrawing from rice cultivation in most cases. Distraught

farmers look for financial assistance from the state government but they are often left high and dry.

As a result, in Ganjam district alone hundreds of acres are left uncultivated. In this situation, the district project management unit under the

Berhampur Forest department is laying stress on the SRI method of cultivation and drawing the farmers towards it. This has come as a relief for the distressed farmers fed up with crop loss and reduced output in the traditional method of cultivation. SRI method of

cultivation is being implemented in the district with the support of the state government, the Green Climate Fund, and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). This has helped many farmers in becoming self-reliant and financially independent. Farmers think that this new method is helping them raise their crops without hassle. However, there is significant difference between the SRI and traditional methods of paddy cultivation. In this method, eight to 10-day-old paddy saplings are transplanted within a distance of 25 cm on

wet farmlands. Maintaining proper distance during transplantation helps in the growth of the root. As a result, paddy saplings get more air, sunlight, and nutrients. Jute and long beans are sown along with paddy as green manure. The de-weeding machine is used every tenth day to clear weeds and unwanted shrubs on the farmlands. This helps in aeration of the soil and the weeds also act as organic manure for the crops. The cultivation is resilient to standing water and dampness on the farmland. The output is more where there is proper movement of air. When contacted, Ranjan Kumar Bhoi, the district coordination officer of

the Agriculture department said this year over 900 farmers in Chikiti, Rangeilunda, Khallikote and Ganjam blocks have taken up SRI method of cultivation which initially started with only 30 farmers on 10-acre land in 202-23 FY. Assisted by two voluntary outfits Lipika and Pallishree and supervised by 30 experts, an additional 870 farmers have taken up the cultivation this kharif season on 200 acre of farmland. The cultivation was initially started by training the farmers in 39 villages. An increase in cultivation in the coming days can help check climate change and benefit the farmers, Bhoi added.

Branch. However, even after 13 years of the incident the murder mystery has not yet been solved, members of the outfit said. "We have demanded a proper probe before the police and the government many times but in vein," they rued. "Bhagirathi's family has been waiting

for justice for the last 13 years and if the government does not take any step in this regard till January 3, bandh will be observed January 5," the outfit's office-bearer warned. The outfit appealed to all associations in the district to extend their support to make the bandh successful.

Cabinet Clears Awareness Plan

Bhubaneswar(KCN): With an aim to reach everyone through its development activities and schemes, the State Government has decided to undertake awareness activities about various schemes of Government in all Panchayats under "Ama Odisha Nabin Odisha" scheme. The State Cabinet headed by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has taken this decision here at its meeting held this evening. In order to carry forward the transformative journey of Rural Odisha, it is necessary to build upon the current initiatives to augment rural infrastructure leading to accelerated growth as well as to preserve the rich cultural heritage of the State, the Government has now decided to organise GP level awareness camp in 6794 GPs of the State under the Ama Odisha Nabin Odisha (AONO)

scheme, Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water Minister Pradip Kumar Amat said. Under the AONO intervention, inclusive development of rural Odisha will be prepared at GP level which will include development of the Primary Schools, Religious, Community Based Projects, Mission Shakti Gruha, and Miscellaneous including digital transformation projects, he said. Under the plan local felt need based projects shall be taken up by convening GP level meetings with local people/community organization/public representatives/line Department Officials and other stakeholders etc. The shelf of projects will be received from the inhabitants of concern GP, PRI Members, SHG members, members of various community organizations, line Department Officials etc. shall be compiled in

consultation with GP and shall be placed in the GP level meeting for finalization, the Minister said. After finalization, the plan will be submitted to the PR & DW Department for Government approval. The timeline for conduct of the GP level meeting will be from January 15 to 1st week of February 2024, he informed. Apart from finalization of the Plan in the GP level meeting, IEC activities will be taken up on various schemes of the Government for generating awareness among the people. Amat said Rs 3 lakh per GP for 6794 GPs will be provided for preparation of plan and IEC activities. The total requirement of funds will be Rs 203.82 crore for conducting these activities. Preparation of the plan is under the initiative of

'Ama Odisha Nabin Odisha'. For this, the approved budget Rs. 4000 Crore is enhanced to Rs 4200 crores, he added. The Cabinet has decided to extend the upper age limit for entry into government service is governed under the Odisha Civil Service (Fixation of Upper Age Limit) Rules, 1989 from 32 year to 38 years in addition to relaxable in case of ST/SC/SEBC/ Women and PwDs as prescribed by the Government from time to time. Muzumdar spotlights fielding, death overs as areas to improve for India

Shardul Thakur fine after injury scare at optional training

New Delhi: Missed opportunities and their inability to seize the key moments in the death overs proved costly for India, admitted head coach Amol Muzumdar, after Australia clinched a thrilling three-run victory in the second ODI at the Wankhede stadium on Saturday (December 30) to seal the series.

Phoebe Litchfield, Ellyse Perry and Alana King all capitalised on multiple reprieves to make crucial contributions that propelled Australia to a challenging total of 258 on a pitch that was helping the slower bowlers. India came close but a slew of wickets in the ending stages of the game meant that they weren't able to close it out.

Speaking after the match, Muzumdar admitted that fielding and fitness are areas they need to work on. "We're in the process of building it up. There's no doubt that our fielding was below par today. We dropped about six catches. It



always happens in a game. Even they dropped a few. But having said that, we still are a work in progress. If we get time post this series, I'm sure we'll try to spend a lot of time on fielding and fitness." Deepti Sharma was India's star with the ball as she finished with excellent figures of 5 for 38. However, she struggled with the bat later, scoring a 36-ball 24 not out, and wasn't able to take India across the line. India weren't at their best in the finishing stages, with

Pooja Vastrakar conceding 18 runs in the final over while the pressure of the chase got to them despite needing 35 off the last five overs. Muzumdar did not want to blame Deepti for the defeat but he did point out that India needed to get better in the death in both departments. "At the end of the day we can all sit and say 'oh, we missed out by three runs' but there were about 600 balls bowled in that. So we can always go back and talk about it in

hindsight. Yes, we fell short by three runs but I cannot name anyone for the defeat. It's just a collective effort. Probably just one more shot or one more stop in the field could have done the trick. "I think that didn't tilt the balance but I thought that just gave the momentum to Australia a little bit going into the dressing room," said Muzumdar about the 18-run final over. "That's one area where I feel we need to have a look in and improve ourselves

going forward, is the death overs, whether it is batting or bowling. We'll be working hard on that." Muzumdar, meanwhile, was lavish in his praise of Richa Ghosh who scored a career-best 96 in the match batting at No.3. "Richa, Fantastic knock, what a knock it was. Under pressure, at No.3 - a new position for her - and she's just proven why she is spoken about highly. Her talent speaks for herself. I think probably a hundred would have been an appropriate one for her. But unfortunately she got out. I think it was a special knock," said Muzumdar. "Richa is our No.3, we believe that she can be a good top order player. We believe in her talent and you've seen what kind of shots she can play. And if she can use the first 10 overs and then play according to the situation, that is the best spot for her. At least now we feel that Richa at No.3 will be a very good choice," he added.

New Delhi: Shardul Thakur is in perfect condition, according to information from the Indian camp in South Africa. The all-rounder, who sustained a blow to his left shoulder during a net session at Centurion on Saturday, is reported to be doing well. A source within the Indian team has confirmed that he is perfectly fine. It is understood that the Indian team's medical staff has not recommended any treatment, and Shardul did not undergo any scans either. Despite the injury, Shardul continued to bat soon after being hit. "There is no concern at all," emphasized the source. "No problems." The incident occurred during an optional training session at Centurion, where India lost the first Test inside three days. Shardul was reportedly facing throwdowns from a member of the support staff. Since it was an optional training session, only seven to eight players showed up for practice. Among them were



skipper Rohit Sharma, R Ashwin, Yashasvi Jaiswal, Mukesh Kumar, Prasidh Krishna, and KS Bharat, in addition to Shardul. All the coaches were of course there at the venue. The Indian team is scheduled to fly out of Johannesburg to Cape Town for the second and final Test on Sunday morning. While the lineup for the Test, starting at the Newlands Stadium on January 3, has not been indicated, it is unlikely that there will be a change in the wicketkeeper's position. Despite a challenging

time behind the stumps in the Centurion Test, KL Rahul is expected to continue as the wicketkeeper. The major question revolves around whether the team will persist with Prasidh Krishna, who made his debut in the first Test. The pacer's performance has come under scrutiny, and alternatives before the team management include Mukesh Kumar and Avesh Khan. Additionally, Ravindra Jadeja, who missed the first Test due to back stiffness, is believed to be available for selection.
