

Devotees start arriving in Puri ahead of Jagannath Temple Heritage Corridor project's inauguration

Puri(KCN): A large number of devotees from across Odisha and the country started arriving at this seaside pilgrim town Tuesday, a day ahead of the much-awaited grand opening of the ‘Srimandir Parikrama Prakalpa’ (SPP) or Jagannath Temple heritage corridor project. The entire pilgrim town has been beautifully adorned with flowers, decorative lights, and graffiti, presenting a spectacular look. The ‘Maha Yagna’ which started on Makar Sankranti Day entered the second day Tuesday and will culminate Wednesday afternoon with Gajapati Maharaja Dibyasingha Deb scheduled to offer ‘Purna Ahuti’ (final pouring of ghee on the havan fire) between 1:30 and 2:30pm. Soon after that, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik will dedicate the project to devotees. Brahmins and Vedic scholars are chanting different Vedas at different gates of the 12th-century Jagannath Temple. The Rig Veda is chanted at the Singh Dwar (lion gate or the main entrance), Yajur Veda at the southern gate, Sama Veda at the western gate and Atharva Veda at the northern gate. To witness this event and have a darshan of Lord Jagannath on this occasion, a large number of devotees thronged the temple. Starting from the early morning, the devotees made a beeline on the Grand Road to visit the 12th-century



shrine. Chairman 5T (transformational) initiative and Nabin Odisha, VK Pandian, Chief Secretary Pradeep Kumar Jena and DGP in-charge Arun Sarangi visited Puri Monday and reviewed the preparedness and security arrangements made for the inauguration of the Parikrama Project. Pandian held a review meeting with district administration, senior servitors of the temple and other senior officials Monday evening and sought cooperation from all for the success of the January 17 event. Sri Setu (bridge), Shri Jagannath Ballav Parking, Shri Marg (road) and other projects are almost ready, Jena said. The invited guests from outside the state will start

arriving in Puri Tuesday. Accommodation for them has been arranged for their stay in different hotels and other facilities, he said. The Chief Secretary said the Sri Setu on the way to Puri will be opened to the public after its inauguration by the Chief Minister on the day. The DGP said 80 platoons (one platoon comprising 30 personnel) of police force will be deployed for the inauguration of the heritage corridor project. Besides, around 100 supervisory officers, 250 sub-inspectors and ASI rank officials will also be engaged in security duty, he said. A four-layer security deployment will be in place. All associated arrangements have been made from traffic arrangements to security

for VIPs, security of devotees, smooth darshan by devotees, etc, the DGP told reporters. He said that four bomb disposal teams, anti-sabotage teams, and three canine squads have been deployed to search for suspected objects and sanitize the area. Meanwhile, the Odisha government has planned to make arrangements for 10,000 people from different parts of the state to daily visit the Jagannath temple Puri for a period of a month from January 22. In a letter, state Panchayati Raj secretary SK Lohani asked all district collectors to ensure smooth movement of the devotees to Puri. He asked the collectors to make requisitions for an adequate number of buses for the movement of devotees while elaborate plans have been made at the transit camps for their comfortable stay. The Rs 800-crore project will ensure expansive, unobstructed corridors around the Meghanada Pacheri (outer wall) of the Jagannath temple and will provide the devotees excellent visual connection with the 12th-century shrine. It will also provide amenities to the pilgrims and strengthen the safety and security of the temple and devotees. The project is one component of a massive initiative worth over Rs 4,000 crore to transform Puri into a world heritage city, another official said.

Subsequently, at 11 am, he will address a party meeting of around 6,000 in-charges of ‘shakti kendras’, each comprising two to three booth-level areas, at Marine Drive here. He would return to Delhi by evening, the sources said.

Odisha govt extends deadline to apply for BSKY Nabin Card by 10 days

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Odisha government Tuesday extended the deadline for submission of applications for Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana (BSKY) Nabin Card by 10 days, according to a notification. The application process, which started January 6, will now



continue till January 26 instead of January 16, it said. Eligible persons can register themselves on bskynabin.odisha.gov.in to get benefits of the newly launched healthcare scheme, it added. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik launched the BSKY Nabin Card December 29 to provide cashless healthcare facilities to people of rural areas in private hospitals. All rural families of the state, except government employees, income taxpayers and those not covered under BSKY, will be eligible for the ‘BSKY Nabin Card’. They will be entitled to cashless healthcare of Rs 5 lakh per annum, and the coverage for women would be up to Rs 10 lakh in empanelled private hospitals both inside and outside the state.

People in a democratic setup won't tolerate arrogance: Dharmendra Pradhan takes dig at Odisha govt

Bhubaneswar(KCN):Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan targeted Biju Janata Dal (BJD)-led Odisha government on Tuesday saying, the people of the state would teach a lesson to the party for its arrogance. He was speaking at a programme (Misran Parba) held at Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) office in Bhubaneswar. Accusing the Odisha government of covering up the Mamita Meher murder case, Pradhan said, “Your big officers and politicians tortured the girl. Then they buried her body in the field. As if that was not enough, you murdered the accused in jail too. There is no answer to that till now.” “The Police were beaten up in the police station in Bhatli area. Chief



Minister, you are the Home Minister, but you do not have an answer to it. People in a republic will not tolerate arrogance. From Ravana to Kansa and Duryodhan, nobody could survive with arrogance and ego. Time will come when people will teach them a lesson,” he said. “Odisha is amongst the top three states in atrocities against

providing rice free of cost to the people, the state government is taking the credit for it,” he said while speaking to reporters on the sidelines of Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra at Mahulapali in Sambalpur. “The Odisha government is taking credit for it by hanging posters with the state government logo and some photographs of the leaders. Such posters are found at retail outlets. This is sheer cheating. Such deceit should not be done in a democratic system,” he alleged. Pradhan, however, claimed that the people have understood such cheating and will increasingly repose their faith in Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Sulia Jatra Begins In Bolangir



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Tribals of Khairguda village under Tusura police limits in Odisha's Bolangir district celebrated the annual ‘Sulia Jatra’ on Monday by sacrificing animals on Tuesday morning. Marching in processions with traditional weapons, they reached the Sulia shrine to perform the animal sacrifice. Hundreds of tribals from different areas of the state arrived in Khairguda village to participate in this annual ritual. This year, the

tribals are celebrating Sulia Jatra with pomp and gaiety as the apex court has given some relief to them for animal sacrifice. The rituals began after ‘Nisi Puja’ was conducted by the tribal residents. As per rituals, the tribals, holding weapons, took out a rally. Later, they worshipped gods and goddesses with ancient rituals, and thousands of birds and animals including goats, sheep, buffaloes, ducks, pigeons, and roosters

were sacrificed at Bada Khala in Khairguda and Sana Khala in Kumuria village amid tight security arrangements. People believe that offering the blood of animals and birds to Sulia, their traditional deity, brings a good harvest resulting in prosperity and happiness to their families and the community as a whole. To maintain the law and order situation during the festival, two platoons of police force have been deployed.

Odisha BJP questions delay in transfer of IAS, IPS officers serving at one place for over 3 years

MODEL CHARITY LITERACY WORKSHOP



Bhubaneswar, (KCN): The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has demanded the implementation of the recommendations made by the Election Commission of India (ECI) in Odisha to ensure free and fair elections. A delegation of the state BJP met the Chief Electoral Officer on Tuesday and alleged that the state government is not enforcing the recommendations of the ECI ahead of the upcoming elections. The BJP pointed out that the ECI issued a letter to the state government on December 1, 2023, instructing it to transfer the officers who have been working at their respective places for over three years to ensure free and fair elections. “About 20 days have passed since the ECI issued this letter. To date, the state government is giving no indications about the implementation of ECI recommendations and has not even initiated the process to transfer officers,” said BJP leader Lekhashree Samantasinghar, adding that the last date for completing the transfer process has been fixed on January 31. She also alleged that there are over 10 districts where Collectors have been serving for more than five years while the list of IAS and IPS officers who have not been shifted from their last posting for years is long too. The BJP leader said that there is a provision of a transit period of seven days for the officers from the day of receiving the transfer order. “With only a few days left to the deadline, when these officers will be issued transfer orders, when will their transit period start and when will they report at their new place of posting,” she asked. “What is the hidden agenda of the government for not transferring these IAS and IPS officers despite a clear transfer policy and instructions from the ECI,” the BJP leader asked. No comments have been received from the concerned authorities in this regard.

Odisha Congress MLA urges district admin to shut liquor shops on Ram Mandir consecration day



Bhubaneswar (KCN): Senior Congress leader and Jeypore MLA Taraprasad Bahinipati on Tuesday urged the district administration to close liquor shops and bars across the district on the Ram Mandir consecration day. On January 22, Lord Ram's magnificent temple in Ayodhya will be consecrated and the Ram Lalla's idol will be installed in the sanctum sanctorum of the temple. As per sources, several related activities will take place across the Koraput district and people will remain immersed in religious fervour. So Jeypore MLA Taraprasad Bahinipati requested the district administration to close all the bars and liquor shops on January 22. “I would like to urge the district Collector to close liquor shops across the district on the day when the Ram Mandir will be consecrated in

Ayodhya. If the liquor shops will remain open, people will make nuisances,” said the lawmaker. Soon after Taraprasad requested the district administration, his archrival and former Jeypore MLA and BJD leader, Rabinarayan Nanda made a similar request to the district administration. “I would like to request the district administration to take steps to avoid any kind of untoward incident on that day. I would also like to request people to refrain from drinking alcohol and having non-veg foods on that day. The district administration should take necessary steps in this regard,” said Nanda.

BJD leader Nalini Pradhan faces protest during Gond Samaj programme in Angul

Angul, (KCN): The alleged rift in the ruling BJD in Athmallik came out in the open when party leader Nalini Pradhan faced stiff opposition while attending a programme organised by Gond Samaj on Tuesday. According to sources, ‘Nalini Go back’ slogans were raised against Pradhan when he was on his way to attend the programme. The protestors accused him of hijacking Athmallik BJD party and not allowing MLA Ramesh Sai in party programmes and making derogatory remarks against Gond



Samaj. “We heard once Nalini Pradhan made a derogatory remark against the Gond community. That is why we opposed him and raised slogans against him,” said Tarani Sen Nayak of Gond Samaj. Explaining about the situation, Nalini said, “There was no issue in the programme. MLAs of the district have arrived in the programme, so I accompanied them. The locals might have some other issues. But we offered prayers at the shrine and revealed the message of the CM.” “I have no knowledge regarding the incident. Ramesh Sai was not present in the programme. Ramesh Sai had invited Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan to the programme, which we are not in support of,” said Angul district BJD President Mahendra Bastia.



5 Films That Emphasise POCSO Act, Highlight Grey Side Of Humanity

Narratives around sexual assault are no stranger to the audience, they depict the ugliness of human greed and selfishness. However, there are films that continue to haunt you even after you finish watching them. Films like Sirf Ek Bandaa Kaafi Hai or Kahaani 2 portray horrific tragedies which not only give shivers but also open floodgates to discussions and debates. These films paint a realistic picture of the justice process. Although loaded with repulsive scenes, they act as a powerful tool for social change providing relief to the victims and their families. While POCSO act safeguards the interest of minors, films like these justify the provisions of the act creating awareness about under-reported crimes and abuse.

Let's have a look at such films which bring forward the POCSO act and reign supreme due to their unapologetic storytelling:

1. Sirf Ek Bandaa Kaafi Hai [ZEE5]

Inspired by true events, 'Sirf Ek Bandaa Kaafi

Hai' is a courtroom drama directed by Apoorv Singh Karki, starring Manoj Bajpayee in and as lawyer P.C. Solanki. It is the story of an ordinary man - a high court lawyer who single-handedly fought an extraordinary case against the country's biggest god man and successfully ended up prosecuting him for the rape of a minor under the POCSO act. The film educates the audience about the POCSO [Protection Of Children from Sexual Offences] act while the trial for justice continues in the courtroom. Through Nu's case of sexual assault, it highlights the key features of the act and the legal framework. Sirf Ek Bandaa Kaafi Hai will surely make you aware of a few facts that were not known to you.

2. Kahaani 2: Durga Rani Singh [ZEE5] Kahaani 2 revolves around a woman named Vidya Sinha and her daughter Mini. Vidya works as a school librarian in a small town and leads a seemingly



ordinary life. However, their lives take a dark turn when Mini goes missing. As the investigation unfolds, it is revealed that Mini has been kidnapped and is being held captive. Vidya, determined to find her daughter, teams up with a police officer, Inderjeet Singh. As they dig deeper into the case, they uncover a shocking truth - Mini has been sexually assaulted. They encounter various challenges and obstacles as they navigate the legal system and fight for justice, exposing the grey side of humanity at the same time revealing the harsh realities faced by innocent children.

Am I Next [ZEE5] Am I Next is a heart-wrenching tale of a 14-year-old teenage rape survivor Honey Kohli's court battle for justice and the right to abortion. It has layers such as media sensationalism, a dishonest defense lawyer and the rapist Aman's father trying to brush off the matter. The story raises ethical questions about why the survivor must pay the price and is a momentous expression of hope for society. The film explores the legalities of a minor

rape victim's right to abortion and the POCSO act.

4. Mardaani 2 [Amazon Prime Video]

Mardaani 2 is set in Kota, Rajasthan where a series of brutal rapes and murders shake the city. It revolves around Superintendent of Police Shivani Shivaji Roy who takes on a challenging case of finding a serial rapist targeting young girls. The film tackles the issue of brutal crimes against women as Shivani is determined to catch the perpetrator and bring him to justice. She faces various hurdles in her pursuit including societal apathy and the

challenging nature of the case. The film serves as a wake-up call, urging society to be vigilant and proactive in protecting children from sexual offences while highlighting the provisions under the POCSO act.

5. Highway [Disney+ Hotstar]

MAHATMA GANDHI- SPIRITUAL ESSENCE MANIFESTED IN POLITICAL MOBILIZATION



Mahatma Gandhi is an enigma which the present and the generations to come would look at as a sheer impossibility. A man in flesh and blood with the innocence and purity of a child held an empire on its toes with his overwhelmingly simplistic and powerfully invasive connection with the Indian public. He was definitely surrounded by an aura of versatility and his ability to embrace multiplicity was his profundity. He was nothing but this versatility fulfilled in the real core of his character that in a later part of his life made him the Mahatma of India. He, otherwise, was often seen from the angle of politics as a leader, who largely mobilized aspirations of generations of Indians to the terrain of a non-violent revolution that caught the British Raj by surprise. This fight against the colonial dominance was not momentary which began with the advent of Gandhi, but it remained active and solid irrespective of it being subdued by the colonial muscle power, visibly surfacing occasionally well before Gandhi came into the scene and the ripples of the agitation was the background that Gandhi began his mobilization. His entry into the scenario of discontent that ran across the country against the British Raj was instrumental in redefining this essential struggle for freedom. There stands Gandhi with his uniquely invented method of non-violent agitation against the domination of invasion. While wandering through the pages of India's pre-independent political history, you experience the spiritual impact of the Gandhi presence. You witness a silent but gradual transformation of a man who jumped into the mobilization of the nation's freedom struggle, into a spiritual being. Gandhi was of course a political persona, but he was a unique representation of someone who could deeply delve into the realm of spiritual greatness through his simple understanding of life. He thought life would never flourish into its actuality without truth and compassion. Turning these universal ideals into weapons of agitation Gandhi was probably raising his eminence as a leader into unassailable heights and the invariable momentum that he could channelize the country through was unique and

unprecedented. Was Gandhi a great soul or a normal human being? This understanding on the most popular man in India's freedom movement could be treated as a genuine assessment on the Mahatma. He was, indeed, a genuine being who otherwise could have manipulated his aura of greatness with unreliable facts and sophisticated illustrations. But throughout his autobiography, Gandhi chose to represent the common man in him with dim decoration. His mistakes and confessions inexorably take us to a deeper sense of understanding and self-discovery. They, urgently but silently, urge us to go with the inner voice of truth that if not excavated properly would lay hidden deep under the complexity and mishmash of life's daily ordeals. And to understand Gandhi with all the controversies he had left for his critics and his benign contribution to go beyond the legitimate thirst for freedom being applauded by his followers, he is an unmistakable source to tap inspiration from. Churchill's "Half-naked Fakir" still holds relevance in a world that is totally enmeshed in ruthless violence in the name of religion, region and expansionist political madness. There stands Gandhi, even after the country gained its freedom almost seven decades ago, with full relevance and ideological commitment, solidly representing the genuine aspiration of the common man. Impact of being spiritual Here, in this write-up, I would rather look at his personality from a spiritual angle. For various reasons I understand the momentum he created and catapulted, the momentum that later stormed into the minds of millions was substantially present in him in its miniscule form. It was essentially spiritual in nature. His delving into the agitation against the British had this spiritual endurance showering power and what he was successful in was the level of space he could utilize his spiritual essence for the political mobilization. Deriving from the combination of the Vedic wisdom and the Bhagavad Gita's Dharmic revolutionary theories, Gandhi intelligently chiseled an amalgam of personality out of him which in the first place was an imperfect common man and in the second a great soul, a Mahatma. Both found equal relevance and place and propelled the imagination of millions of Indians. From an individual to his family to his village to his nation, the idea that Gandhi envisaged for an average Indian was an ideal strengthening of his inner

purity. This, according to him, was a composition of minute elements such as personal purity to national stability ultimately finding their meeting point in one collective purpose, which according to him was the most important, the wellbeing of a single national entity. He believed that this could not be possible with mere political understanding alone. That's why, I, in the first place, pronounced that Gandhi's persona is a blend of various qualities. But I firmly believe that the spiritual depth in Gandhi had actually separated him from the rest of the luminaries who spelled out their disagreements with the British. Interestingly, extreme spiritual power had turned leaders like Aurobindo into serious spiritual introverts while they liked their life to be lived in spiritual seclusion. Gandhi remained grounded and active and mobilized the mass; yet his spiritual effulgence shone bright and that gave him a saintly image. Even Nathuram Godse was not skeptical about Gandhi's spiritual strength. He accepted and probably revered this quality in Gandhi. Godse's reason to flush blood out of his skeletal body can't escape severe condemnation. But the assassin in him did not hesitate to touch the Mahatma's feet before he tested the accuracy of his weapon on the latter's chest. Going into a sequence of events that had gradually turned Gandhi a spiritual seeker as well as a political leader, what we hit upon is his familial traditions; a childhood that he had lived with listening to the stories of the epics and other texts must have undoubtedly put the seeds of spirituality in him. Profoundly rooted in the Vaishnava traditions of Hindu spirituality, the boy in him had grown into a seeker, which he knew would not have fully articulated into its actuality, if he had not brought its flavor into his non-violent revolution. He was deeply influenced by the Jain traditions and the Christian religious philosophy, especially the New Testament and the Sermon on the Mount. But the chief source according to Gandhi was Bhagavad Gita that he says had transformed him completely. Gandhi gave a series of lectures on the Hindu text which was later published under the title the Bhagavad Gita. Influence of Vivekananda and Sri Ramakrishna The impact of the teachings of Swami Vivekananda, the most prominent proponents of the Vedanta philosophy in Gandhi, was extremely deep and reflective. Vivekananda's literature on spirituality had actually given him a deeper insight on the civilizational background of India. Vivekananda's master Sri Ramakrishna

had equal influence on his developing an idea of spirituality. Both master and student had helped him define his spiritual thoughts and understanding and Gandhi never hesitated to express his veneration for these saints. Probably, Sri Ramakrishna had been instrumental in articulating Gandhi's spiritual understanding about other religions as well. Ramakrishna had passed him the key to enter into the spiritual domains of Islam and Christianity as the saint of Dakshineswar had practically lived the spiritual traditions that both Islam and Christianity proposed. This was the reason that Gandhi calls Ramakrishna the living embodiment of goodness. Ramakrishna's words were revelations of his own spiritual experiences, and they had depth and meaning, and they still remain mines of huge spiritual treasure. Gandhi had total acceptance to this fact that, Ramakrishna was a spiritual lighthouse that could enlighten and transform a critically virulent atheist in Vivekananda into a great admirer of Vedantic philosophy, who later would go hunting minds with his spiritual brilliance and cultural might and the distinction he was grown into was the result of the spiritual power that Ramakrishna blessed him with. Vivekananda's religious teachings, basically derived from the Vedantic philosophy, had consistently advocated the need of being and becoming fearless. Gandhi's ordeal with colonial forces must be seen from this angle too. Vivekananda believed that each soul is potentially divine, and the purpose of education was to discover the divinity in every individual. Gandhi on the other hand believed that any education system should aim at the development of the mind, body and soul. It is enlightening to note that Gandhi really wanted to meet Vivekananda when he visited Calcutta in 1902 as part of the annual meeting of the Indian National Congress. Gandhi was thirty-two and Vivekananda was thirty-nine. But Vivekananda, having decided to leave his physical body, was waiting for his final call to eternity. His health was so bad that Gandhi could not meet the young saint. The meeting of these great minds could have been one of the rarest of events that the historians would have recorded with great interest and earnestness. Interestingly, both Vivekananda and Gandhi picked up their basic lessons on Karma from religious texts such

as the Bhagavad Gita and the Vedic lore. Vivekananda advocated Seva or service to the needy as the prime purpose of life. He believed that each soul is potentially divine. His visit to the US was an eye-opener on the perils that India had been reeling under. He is known to have rejected the luxuries that he was offered by people in that country. Both Gandhi and Vivekananda made no compromises when it came to displaying their love for India. They surrendered completely for the cause of its emancipation. When Gandhi chose spirituality to strengthen his political engagements, Vivekananda was completely spiritual. Wandering amid the affluence of the western world, Vivekananda was deeply distressed. He knew India was crushed by the colonial aggression and to discover solutions to bring its people from the shackles was his priority. He believed in the all-pervasive Brahman in everything and "jiva is siva" was the ideal he solidly propagated and that gave him a concrete reason to think deeper, speak vividly and propagate passionately on the essential spirituality of the Indian nation. He thought India would survive only if its deeper layers of spiritual essence were revived and protected. He almost singlehandedly handled the mission that his master entrusted with him. His journey to the west and America were mostly about to begin a mission that he perceived that in a future period would be instrumental in India's spiritual renaissance. This, according to him, was the basic requirement as India as a nation was not fully grown enough to politically handle the freedom if it fought and gained it then. He doubted the country's inner abilities to protect its freedom almost fifty years before it was actually set free. Vivekananda foresaw the trouble and believed in the spiritual brilliance of the country, and he knew if channelized in the right direction, it possessed power to shake away the burden of imperialism. Both Vivekananda and Gandhi possessed this profound thought. The thought of serving the country was their priority, an invariable blessing. Their conviction was deep and solid to the core particularly to revive the country both spiritually and politically. Gandhi's Rama Rajya was the ultimate result of this spiritually revived social establishment collectively fulfilling the aspirations of people without harming their essential coexistence; a living space where everybody was eligible for seva or service. While Vivekananda began to blow life into the theory of Seva, Gandhi had envisaged and turned it into a total practicality. To know the extent into which Gandhi held an

impact on the Indian populace is vivid here in this incident. Once in a Bihar village Gandhi and his colleagues were stranded in a train. An old woman came knowing that Gandhi was on the train. She was hundred and four. She was so elated when she said she considered Gandhi as an avatar just like Rama and Krishna. To the surprise of people surrounding Gandhi, she said she had maintained a temple which was dedicated to Gandhi. She believed that she would never die until she visited Gandhi. And when she came to know that Gandhi was seated in the train, she rushed to meet him. Satyagraha – The weapon of dissension Gandhi's mobilization against the British was noticed just because he chose a different path which was normal in essence and easy to practice. His non-violence got a prominent tool of mobilization called satyagraha and that got registered as a strategy for amicably articulating resistance. Going deeper into this style of peaceful uprising, you witness Gandhi's carefully articulated understanding of India's civilizational essence. India's civil characteristic has of course been an act of nurturing peace and harmony. Starting from different periods of invasion to that of the socially disproportionate challenges that it is made to suffer, the basic quality that was eminently visible in practice was this love for peace. This could be due to certain religious principles propagated by Indic religions that managed to exist after centuries of ruthless brutality of invasion. Cultural friction between the colonial masters and the common men was a reflection of resistance to the onslaught on the civilizational essence. But the resistance of all forms in India always undertook to maintain an invisible thread of desire that was

consistently strengthened by the twin principles of Satya (truth) and agraha (laying hold of). This desire to create a momentum with truth or satya as its driving force was the interactive ideal that the great epics in India reflected. Lord Krishna's attempts by peacefully negotiating with the arrogant Kauravas, who denied even a small inch of land to the Pandavas was a cue, an example in the epic that held truth the supreme. Though all paths to peace were dismantled by the irrational arrogance of the Kauravas, Krishna's initial attempts to establish peace between the warring cousins are to be seen as a diplomatic step to arrive at a solution against adharma with no acrimony taking center stage. Gandhi envisaged this golden idea of non-violence after his return to India in 1915. India began to politically boil by then and there was an urge to take the country with extreme nationalistic initiatives though violent they were. Gandhi's reaction to such a situation was unique and he suddenly understood the power of invoking the moral high ground of the people, which probably he thought would reduce British brutality. Essentially this understanding could not only attract millions of people to him but also minimized the radicalized momentum on the other side. Gandhi's non-violence was also instrumental in raising the conscience of the country towards its eco-spiritual and ethical characterization. Whenever the British used a brutal force against a peaceful non-violent resistance, the Raj was undoubtedly being questioned of its inability to deal with it. The Gandhian protests were strengthened by this questionable situation that he had actually put the British by being non-

violent. This gained him a noticeable reputation and he was hence a force that the British had to confront in a different way. Gandhi's gaining sympathy from his opponents had a negative impact as well. This was on the other hand seen as a depiction of weakness and a solid reason that many among the freedom fighters including Subhash Chandra Bose chose to maintain a distance from him. Surprisingly, Gandhi's depth in Gita was unquestionable, whereas critics question him for using the holy text as a philosophy of peace alone. For them, Gita is a reservoir of a great philosophy that pushed a devastated Arjuna into action even if it was violent. Lord Krishna had to amply bring narratives to convince the warrior prince to see life from various angles. But Gandhi's pressure tactics succeeded all through his life and ever since his death there were many occasions across the world that came to be known for following the Gandhian form of resistance, a mixture of pressure strategy gaining sympathy tactfully. But there were tremors of resistance to what the Mahatma propagated, and violent force was used to eradicate the impact of his method of resistance on 30 January 1948. But truth never gets eradicated; it may remain concealed under the dust of the brutal force of time. The desire to survive with full force was the power that Gandhi generated through Satyagraha, which was a political tool sharpened on a spiritual framework.

participating units from both navies conducted surface and anti-air exercises including weapon firing, seamanship evolutions and tactical manoeuvres. As part of Government of India's vision of SAGAR (Security And Growth for All in the Region), the Indian Navy has been proactively engaging with countries in the Indian Ocean Region towards enhancing regional maritime security. The Indian Navy and Royal Thai Navy have maintained a close and friendly relationship which has strengthened over the years. The conduct of maiden IN-

RTN Bilateral Exercise along with Indo-Thai CORPAT is a testimony to the growing bilateral relations between the two maritime neighbours and has enabled in enhancing interoperability between the two navies. The Indo-Thai Bilateral Exercise is being named as 'Ex-Ayutthaya', which literally translates to 'The Invincible One' or 'Undefeatable', and symbolises the significance of two of the oldest cities Ayodhya in India and Ayutthaya in Thailand, the historic legacies, rich cultural ties and shared historical narratives dating back to several centuries.

Indian Seaweeds Wheels can combat Climate Crisis : Cherry Blossom Founder

New Delhi, (KCN): While people have been finalizing the Global Climate Action plan during COP28 in Dubai, Professor Dinabandhu Sahoo from University of Delhi known as Cherry Blossom Founder of India was busy in spending all his time inside the coastal waters of Bay of Bengal and in the remote villages of Chilika Lake, Odisha to do something different and unique to combat the Climate Crisis. Sahoo designed a wheel similar to Ashok Chakra which represents India and Indian pride. This is called "Indian Seaweeds Wheel" which is having 24 spokes and 24 feet in diameter. Red Seaweeds Gracilaria which has multiple economic uses are tied to the spokes and

the wheels are submerged under water for 45 days. No fertilizers or chemicals are added. The biomass get automatically multiplied and harvested for sun drying and further value addition. Professor Sahoo, who is a former Vice Chancellor of the state university quit that lucrative position to create under water forests through seaweeds cultivation and artificial reef construction to fight the Climate Change through innovative methods. Why Seaweeds? Why not plant more trees on the Land? Because, Seaweeds absorb more Carbon dioxide than land plants. While temperate zone absorbs 12 tons of CO₂/hectare/year, tropical forests absorb 15-20 tons

of CO₂/hectare/year. Seaweeds absorb 20-48 tons of CO₂/hectare/year said Sahoo who was the First Indian student to visit Antarctica way back in 1987-88 and made two trips to Arctic. Besides, seaweeds are enhancing the marine biodiversity especially prawns and fishes, reducing acidification of ocean, reducing coastal pollution etc. Further, seaweeds are used as a source of food, feed, fodder, biofertilizer, biofuels and the extracts from seaweeds are used in tooth paste, ice cream, tomato ketchup, chocolates, textile printing, bio plastics, paper manufacturing etc. Globally, seaweeds is a US\$20 billion industry and the demand for seaweeds and their products are increasing



10% per year said the Ocean Explorer who has extensively travelled all the seven continents and five Oceans in search of seaweeds only. The whole world is looking for seaweeds based solutions to India for CO₂ sequestration and energy production. We have long coast line, good species diversity and good human resources. Thus, Sahoo is planning to put Indian Seaweeds Wheels in different coastal states with the help of local villagers and youth. He wants the help of the Government, private industries, start ups and CSR funds to promote this. Seaweeds cultivation can give a monthly income of Rs.10,000-20,000 from one hectare of water area. At the same time, he is

designing Artificial reefs and trying to place it at the bottom of the sea floor to not only enhance fisheries productivity but also to minimize the cyclonic impact in the coastal areas. Sahoo who was the former Director of Manipur based Institute of Bioresources and Sustainable Development (IBSD), Government of India and the Founder Director of Centre for Himalayan Studies, started a Cherry Blossom movement in India which led to successful Cherry Blossom Festivals. His sustained efforts led to planting of nearly 60,000 cherry Blossom trees and brought a Pink Revolution. Now Sahoo is working towards a Blue Revolution which will boost Blue Economy.

Odisha CM Appeals People To Celebrate Inauguration Of Srimandir Parikrama Prakalpa



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has urged everyone to dedicate themselves to the devotion of Lord Jagannath on the day of Srimandir Parikrama Prakalpa inauguration on January 17. The Odisha CM has asked people to Light diyas (earthen lamps), blow Conch shells, Offer Prayers, Do Kirtan, and sing devotional hymns, on the day of Parikrama

The Odisha University of Agriculture and Technology (OUAT) also submitted an application with GI Registry seeking GI tag for Kai Chutney of Mayurbhanj along with other unique items of the

state. It is a popular delicacy in these tribal dominated districts and has nutritional and medicinal value.

Scientists from the OUAT, Bhubaneswar also studied extensively on the unique food item and found vitamins and minerals in it. According to the experts, consumption of the red ants helps the tribals like an immunity booster to prevent diseases. Thousands of tribal families of these

districts depend on forest for their livelihood. They go into the forest to collect the insects from trees and then sell those in the weekly markets at about 20 rupees per cone. A sour chutney is then prepared with the insects and savoured with meals. Welcoming the tag, Sumantra Nayak, assistant professor of Dharanidhar University and a native of Thakurmunda village in Mayurbhanj district said, "It is a traditional food

supplement for tribal people of Mayurbhanj and Keonjhar districts. It was earlier a poor tribal's food. Now it has a GI tag, which will further popularise the lesser known delicacy." "GI tag to Kai Chutney is an honour to the neglected tribal communities. Other community people also eat Kai Chutney. After this recognition, it will be more popular," said Bimbardhar Behera, a tribal researcher from Keonjhar. "GI tag assigned to Kai Chutney is a great win for the tribal community. After getting the forest right, they got official recognition of their traditional food. It will indirectly preserve the forest and green vegetation as the red ants prepare their nest in the

leaves and nodes of the big trees, mostly Sal, Kusuma, and other species in the forest" said Dusker Barik, a social researcher.

However, the tribals have a belief that it has many medicinal values. While consuming it cures acidity, enhances eyesight, and keeps the body cool, it also works as a medicine for skin diseases and provides relief to joint pain, said Vaidya Bisarad Harekrushna Mohanta, a senior ayurvedic practitioner. Gobinda Munda, a red ant collector, said, "We know about the GI tag. But it is an age old tradition. We eat it as a food supplement and have a strong belief that it cures many diseases. From kids to elderly, all eat Kai mostly in the form of chutney

Guru Gobind Singh, born on 22 December 1666, in Patna, Bihar, was the tenth and last human Sikh Guru. He was a warrior, poet, and philosopher. In 1675, at the age of nine, he was formally declared as the leader of the Sikhs after his father Guru Tegh Bahadur was beheaded by Emperor Aurangzeb. His four biological sons died during his lifetime – two in battle and two martyred by the Mughal governor Wazir Khan. Among his notable contributions to Sikhism are founding the Sikh warrior community called Khalsa in 1699 and introducing the Five Ks (Kesh, Kanga, Kachera, Kara and Kirpan) the five articles of faith that Khalsa Sikhs wear at all

times. Guru Gobind Singh is credited with the Dasam Granth whose hymns are a sacred part of Sikh prayers and Khalsa rituals. He is also credited as the one who finalized and enshrined the Guru Granth Sahib as Sikhism's primary scripture and the eternal Guru.

His 358th birth anniversary will be celebrated on 17th January 2024 in this year. Every year on this day, gurdwaras are decorated and people visit to offer special prayers. Bhajans, Kirtans, and Ardas are organised in honour of his birth anniversary while langar is served throughout the day. Guru Gobind Singh Jayanti is an auspicious day among the Sikh community and is celebrated every year to pay tributes to the Sikh guru. The 10th Guru is an inspiration to millions of people all over the world for his thoughts against oppression and social discrimination. The son of the ninth Sikh Guru, Guru Tegh Bahadur, Guru Gobind Singh was actually named



Gobind Rai. As a child, he took lessons in Persian, Sanskrit and learned military skills in order to become a warrior. There were 52 poets and scholars in his court all over the country from different religions. He respected and loved poets and scholars. festival celebrated among the Sikhs. He abolished the Guru tradition prior to his death on 7th October 1708 and declared the Guru Granth Sahib, which is a holy scripture for Sikhs, as the permanent Sikh Guru.
