**Cuttack (KCN):** Centenarian freedom fighter & the President of the All India Freedom Fighters Association Nilamani Samal passed away at the age of 101 while undergoing treatment at SCB Medical College and Hospital (MCH) in Cuttack City after suffering a massive brain stroke.

According to the reports, Samal was first admitted to Jajpur DHH and was brought to Cuttack SCB for treatment. Samal had blood clots in his brain. As his condition was critical, he was admitted to the ICU.

SCB Superintendent Dr. Sudashushekar Mishra said he was kept under 24-hour observation. Chief Minister's Office was looking into the treatment of Samal.

Under the direction of Suresh Chandra Mohapatra, the health department was



supervising the treatment. Under the direction of the health secretary, Shalini Pandit, an expert committee was formed from SCB, Cuttack, for the treatment of Samal. The committee consisted of 4 expert doctors. The committee was formed under the chairmanship of Saroj Kumar Tripathi, professor of the department of medicine. Professor of Neurosurgery Sanjeev Kumar Mishra, Associate Professor of Neurology Dr Kaliprasan Swain and Associate Professor of

Cardiology Dr Deepak Ranjan Das were members of the committee. Born on February 23, 1932, in Balipadia village under the Badachana block of Jajpur district, Nilamani Samal joined the freedom struggle at the age of 15 years. The 101-year-old freedom fighter is the president of the All India Freedom Fighters Association. He has been conferred with the President's Award twice and also felicitated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik.

To widen the World Odia Language Conference being held in Bhubaneswar, there is a need to hold it in all ULBs of the State. He has suggested that the

following programs could be adopted for this organization in his letter. For wider awareness & portrait/painting portraits of famous poets, writers and linguists who have contributed to the development of Odia language and culture may be placed at prominent places in urban self-governing bodies. Programs can be organized to increase the number of Odia researchers, scholars and intellectuals in the local area. Debate and Essay competitions can be organized among school and college students. In view of the proper organization of the conference, the “Odia Asmita Rath” can be circumambulator in the various wards of the urban self-governing bodies. Emphasis can be placed on writing signboards/billboards/hoardings in Odia.

Besides Intach members, historians, students and persons with a keen interest in history and culture gathered at the Mukteswar Temple Complex early in the morning set out on a walk on the Temple Trail. ## Bigg Boss Tamil 7: Vanitha Vijaykumar Allegedly Attacked By Evicted Contestant Pradeep Antony's Supporter



Popular south actress and former Bigg Boss Tamil 3 contestant Vanitha Vijaykumar has reportedly been attacked by a man who claimed to be a fan of actor Pradeep Antony, the evicted contestant of the ongoing Bigg Boss Tamil Season 7. Vanitha took to her X (formerly known as Twitter) handle and

dropped a shocking photo of her injured face. Her post showed her injured eye, and visibly swollen and discoloured face. The actress, in a series of posts, alleged that she was attacked by a mysterious man in the middle of the night and suspects a 'Bigg Boss Tamil 7' connection. She alleged that the attacker

was apparently unhappy with the fact that she supported the red card issued to Pradeep in the Kamal Haasan-hosted reality show. 'Bigg Boss Tamil' season seven is currently in full swing on Vijay TV and Disney Plus Hotstar. Vanitha's daughter Jovika is also one of the contestants. Vanatha,

who reviews the show on a daily basis, had a late-night dinner and went to park her car at her sister's place when the unfortunate incident happened. "Ni support vera (You escaped) and hit me hard on my face and fled away. I was in so much pain bleeding in my face and yelling. No one around was around I am I called my sister to come down she urged me to go report this incident to police but i told her I lost trust in the process (sic)", she further wrote. She continued, "I took first aid and left home with rage and not able to identify my attacker. He laughed like a lunatic which haunts my ears. Taking a break from

everything as i am not in a physical condition to appear on screen. For those who support disturbed ppl danger is just a feet away (sic)." Vanitha, who has been active on social media, continues to express her thoughts and comments on the controversies around the 'Bigg Boss 7 Tamil'. Actor Pradeep Antony recently got expelled from the Bigg Boss Tamil 7 over reportedly his inappropriate behavior towards female co-contestants. Ever, since his exit from the show, the actor has been hitting the headlines for his social media posts. "It is my personal space which I use to share my happiness with my friends. It is not that I

don't consider you my friend but I'm not in a place I can trust and let anyone inside my life. My Instagram page has photos of friends and family. I feel social media is a mix of positives and negatives and it can tend to attack you on a very personal level. I can take criticism well, but I don't want my friends and family's privacy to be attacked. I'll share the portion of my life I want to share with the public on Twitter on whatever platform I feel comfortable with, but certain things I only want to share and enjoy with my very close ones and not be judged. I hope you understand my situation," he shared.

## Astarang Port: Legal Triumph Sparks Hope Amid Land Acquisition Struggles

**Bhubaneswar ,(KCN):**The proposed Astarang Port project in Puri of Odisha is witnessing a ray of hope as legal matters that once cast a shadow have now been vacated. The Astarang Port project, a venture valued at several billion rupees, has triumphed over a major roadblock—land acquisition challenges. Previously shrouded in uncertainty due to vehement opposition from local residents regarding land acquisition, resettlement, and compliance with new construction regulations, the project is now on a more favorable

trajector. Rewinding to December 2013, during the UPA government in India, efforts to secure new land for the port gained momentum and became operational in January 2014. However, a critical stipulation emerged, stating that a government project in a region can only proceed if 80% of the locals agree. The lack of unanimous consent became a significant roadblock. In the absence of a village council and facing opposition from seven villagers in the proposed port area, a legal battle ensued. The case has now been settled in



court in 2021. Minister of Commerce and Transport in Odisha, Tukuni Sahu, has provided updates in the ongoing Assembly session, highlighting that land acquisition for the port is still in progress. For the development of the port, the Navyug Engineering company of Hyderabad secured a contract with

the state government in December 2008. The ambitious project aimed to acquire 5,064.965 acres of land, with 3,332.255 acres belonging to local residents and 1,732.710 acres being government-owned. The construction of the Astarang Port held promises of job opportunities for 10,000 workers. Additionally, a

planned railway line spanning 50 kilometers from Khurdha to Sakshigopal and Astaranga aimed to facilitate the efficient transportation of goods. As part of the project, the Puri district administration identified 15 revenue villages for land acquisition. The Astarang Port project, though once marred by significant hurdles in land acquisition, now stands as a beacon of hope for the Astarang block as well as Odisha. The legal battle is over, signaling a new chapter for this ambitious coastal developments.
