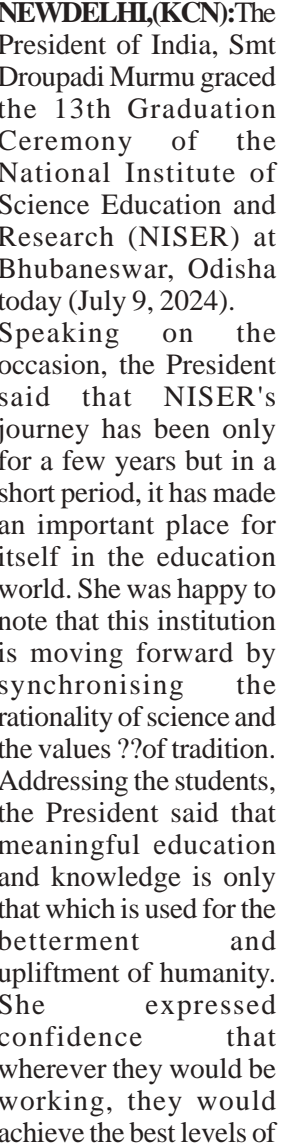

Similarly, due to the advances in the field of Generative Artificial Intelligence, the problem of deep fake and many regulatory challenges are coming to the fore. The President said that experiments and research in the field of Fundamental Science often take a lot of time to get the results. Many times breakthroughs have been achieved after facing disappointment for many years. She told students that they may go through such a phase at times when their patience is tested. But they should never be discouraged. She advised them to always remember that developments in fundamental research prove to be extremely beneficial in other areas as well.

active politics. Since then, he has not looked back, winning the assembly elections four times since 2000. Majhi has served as the BJP whip in the Odisha Assembly and won over voters with his strong connection to the state. His significant victory margin of 11,577 votes over his rival, Mina Majhi, is a testament to his popularity. A vocal critic of the Biju Janata Dal (BJD) government, he has actively engaged in debates on policy and issues both within the Assembly and in public forums. Mohan Charan Majhi embodies the essence of a grassroots leader who ascended through sheer hard work and determination. His political journey began humbly as a sarpanch, and his relentless commitment saw him rise to become an MLA and the BJP Adivasi Morcha secretary, earning accolades for his dedication to his community's welfare. commitment to public service. Despite expectations that Majhi would be chosen as a minister following the BJP's electoral victory, his appointment as Chief Minister came as a pleasant surprise. The Transformation and Commercialization of Private Schools in Jammu and Kashmir

According to the law of the land, private schools are not supposed to be commercial enterprises. In Jammu and Kashmir, these schools are designated as non-profit organizations, mandated to serve society. However, the reality on the ground tells a different story, as private schools in the Kashmir Valley have increasingly become lucrative businesses. This shift has been driven by individuals with profit motives entering the education sector, thereby turning it into a commercial entity. As a result, economically disadvantaged families have suffered greatly. Currently, there are nearly 1.25 million students, from nursery to 10th grade, enrolled in private schools across the Kashmir Valley. The majority of these students come from modest backgrounds, with parents who are determined to provide the best possible education for their children. Unfortunately, private school owners have exploited this noble aspiration. Many schools impose admission fees under various pretexts, with the most common tactic being to label these fees as "advance fees." This clever maneuver helps them evade punitive measures from authorities who would otherwise penalize them for charging illegal admission fees. Furthermore, numerous private schools disregard the guidelines set by the

Fee Fixation and Regulation Committee (FFRC) by charging fees that far exceed the prescribed limits. Parents often feel powerless against these schools, which are adept at using their influence to suppress any dissent. Additionally, almost all private schools charge annual fees, despite only a few having these fees regulated by the FFRC. Educational experts argue that annual fees are against legal norms, as court judgments have consistently ruled that charging beyond tuition fees is illegal. These annual fees often include charges for facilities such as libraries and laboratories, which are rarely utilized by young children, especially those in pre-nursery and nursery classes. The malpractices of private schools extend beyond excessive fees. Many of these institutions operate as trusts, meaning the income generated should be reinvested in the school. However, school owners often circumvent this by fabricating loans. They claim to have borrowed money from family members and repay these loans using school funds, effectively diverting the income into their personal accounts. This practice exploits the charitable status of these schools, which are exempt from taxes. In addition, several private schools underreport the number of enrolled students and collect monthly fees in cash. This approach enables them to withdraw cash without scrutiny from the FFRC. Some prominent schools include members from the judiciary, bureaucracy, and journalism on their boards, ensuring protection when faced with legal or regulatory challenges.

The exploitation extends to private school teachers as well. School owners often maintain two sets of records: one for the labor commission, which shows inflated salaries, and another for internal use, which reflects the actual, lower salaries paid. Teachers receive their salaries in cash, avoiding bank transactions to prevent the labor commission from discovering the underpayment. Land grabbing is another issue. Several missionary schools around Lal Chowk occupy government land. These schools collectively rent 214 Kanals of prime land, valued at approximately Rs. 3,250 Crores, for a nominal annual rent of Rs. 39,375. The Urgency of Implementing Reforms The commercialization of private schools in Jammu and Kashmir has reached a critical point. The laws designed to ensure these schools operate as non-profit organizations are being routinely flouted, leading to widespread exploitation of both parents and teachers. The situation demands immediate action from the government to restore integrity and fairness in the private education sector. The NEP 2020 provides a comprehensive framework for educational reform, including provisions to ensure that children from poor backgrounds receive free education. However, the successful implementation of this policy requires strict enforcement and oversight. An independent audit of private school finances and operations would help identify and address the numerous violations currently taking place. The government must also take steps to protect the rights of private school teachers, ensuring they receive fair wages and benefits. This would involve stricter monitoring of payroll practices and enforcement of labor laws. Additionally, addressing

the misuse of government land by private schools would help ensure that public resources are used appropriately and for the benefit of society as a whole. Furthermore, the role played by budget private schools has been significantly overlooked. Budget private schools have been crucial in meeting the educational needs of numerous children throughout the Valley, especially in underserved communities. These institutions often serve families unable to afford the high fees of traditional private schools or lacking access to quality government education. They play a vital role in democratizing education and addressing gaps in educational access. These schools have shown impressive resilience and innovation, adapting to local demands and offering affordable education without sacrificing quality. Their efforts in enhancing literacy rates and improving educational outcomes deserve recognition and should be further explored in public discussions. In conclusion, the current state of private schools in Jammu and Kashmir represents a significant departure from their intended role as non-profit organizations serving society. The commercialization of education has led to numerous injustices, affecting parents, students, and teachers alike. It is imperative that the government takes decisive action to enforce existing laws, implement the NEP 2020, and conduct thorough audits of private school operations. Only through these measures can the integrity and fairness of the education system be restored, ensuring that it serves the best interests of all members of society.

Kolkata, (KCN): Small-scale aquaculture plays a pivotal role in the economies of rural communities, particularly in the biodiversity-rich region of the Sunderbans. Rooted in local traditions and values, this sector sustains livelihoods and contributes to sustainable rural development. By efficiently utilizing local resources and family labor, it generates wealth, diversifies livelihoods, and enhances social harmony. Recognizing the potential of small-scale aquaculture, especially in backyard fish farms and community ponds, ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (CIFRI) has been providing fisheries inputs since 2019. With the help of local NGOs, FPOs, and SHGs, ICAR-CIFRI has invested Rs. 7000 per person, supplying 8 kg of IMC fish seed (Rohu, Catla, Mrigal), 105 kg of CIFRI Cage-grow fish feed, 20 kg of lime, and necessary medicines. The main objective is to support

the livelihoods of vulnerable communities through scientific fish farming. These measures made fish culture profitable and increased their fish consumption levels. During the focus group discussions, several concerns were raised, including issues with poor water quality and fish diseases in specific areas of Uttar Sonakhali. Beneficiaries also requested medium-sized fish feed pellets. Pond renovation efforts, particularly dyke strengthening, are critical to addressing seepage problems. Seepage allows agricultural runoff, often laden with medicines and pesticides, to enter the ponds, leading to increased mortality in the aquatic ecosystem. Beneficiaries have expressed the need for additional training programs focused on disease management and water quality issues to effectively mitigate these challenges. Silt chokes Bhatrajore dam in Kalahandi

Bhawanipatna(KCN): The famed Bhatrajore dam in Junagadh block of Kalahandi district that ensures the livelihood of thousands of farmers and supports habitat for hundreds of species of flora and fauna is getting choked. According to reports, the landmark dam that irrigates farmlands in both Kharif and Rabi seasons is getting buried in the absence of any efforts to unclog it. The garden adjoining the dam is home to many rare butterfly and bird species, reports said. Sources said the Forest department has identified the dam for

eco-tourism and has spent lakhs of rupees in improving the surroundings. However, no effort has so far been made to desilt the dam which is creating resentment among the locals. According to information, the construction of the dam began in 1958 and it was completed in June 1963. Initially, this dam was under the jurisdiction of the Minor Irrigation Department. However, from June 12, 2001, it was handed over to the Upper Indravati Project. Since then its upkeep has been envisaged under the



Upper Indravati Project. The 671-meter-long dam irrigates around 1713.37 hectares of land in both Kharif and Rabi seasons. Water from the dam reaches up to 10.2 km by the south channel, while its left channel carries

water up to 4.2 km. The minimum water level in the dam has been recorded at 223.113 meters, while the maximum is at 225.552 meters. Generations of fishermen from many villages have benefited

from the 61-year-old dam. However, no de-siltation has been carried out in the reservoir since its inception. As a result, not only has the dam been getting filled by slush every year, but its water

retention capacity is also decreasing gradually. At many places inside the dam, plants and shrubs have appeared and islands are showing up above water level. It is said that if remedial steps were not taken urgently, the

irrigation system, fish population and natural beauty around the dam would be severely affected in the coming days. It is worth mentioning here that the people of Baxitulasipali, Meriabandhali, Charbhati, Dedar, Junagarh NACs and Kaleigaon panchayat of Junagarh block depend on this dam for their daily drinking water needs and irrigation purposes. It is alleged that while both the Forest Department and the Indravati authorities are trying to improve the dam's surroundings, they are silent on the contentious

issue of de-silting the dam. Indravati South Canal Assistant Executive Engineer, Nelson Tadingi said a DPR of Rs 4.11 crores has been prepared and sent to the government for the 'environmental improvement' of Bhatrajore dam. "Once approved, the work will begin," he said. However, he made it clear that right now there are no proposals for the de-silting of the dam. Locals meanwhile, demanded that the government should focus more on removing silt from the dam than beautifying its surroundings

Policeman performs Lord Jagannath's ceremonial chariot sweeping ritual in Odisha's Dharmasala

Jajpur(KCN): The annual Rath Yatra of the holy trinity — Lord Balabhadra, Lord Jagannath, and Devi Subhadra — at Dharmasala, a small town in Odisha's Jajpur district, is unique as the ceremonial sweeping of chariots, known as 'chhera pahanra', is performed by none other than the inspector-in-charge (IIC) of the local police station. This year, IIC Tapan Kumar Nayak performed the ceremonial sweeping on the chariot. He was escorted to the Jagannath temple at Bhalukhai in a specially decorated vehicle from his police station, located about 2 km from the shrine. Clad in royal attire, the inspector received a warm welcome along the road. "Nayak ascended the chariot and conducted the traditional sweeping ceremony of Lord Jagannath's chariot with a golden-handled broom, amidst chants by priests.



The IIC holds a significant role as the primary servant of Lord Jagannath in this context," a priest said. "It is a great privilege for me to serve the Lord," said Nayak after performing the ritual. Similarly, the Rath Yatra in Gadamadhpur, an erstwhile kingdom in Jajpur district, drew considerable attention, with a woman member of the royal family performing rituals on the chariot. Aparna Dhir Singh Bharadwaj, 46, and a descendant of the Gadamadhpur royal family, performed the 'chhera pahanra' and other

ceremonial rituals of the deities. Aparna has been performing these rituals for the past five years, introducing a change in the 400-year-old tradition of her family. Following the demise of her father Raja Birabara Krunshaprasad Dhir Singh in 2012, and with no male successor, Aparna was crowned as the queen and has since taken on the responsibility of performing these rituals. The Rath Yatra in Gadamadhpur follows the Puri code. After completing the rituals of the three deities and the ceremonial procession of

'pahandi bije', the trinity are enthroned in the chariot, which begins its procession at 5 pm. Thousands of devotees from the area gathered at the royal temple to participate in the festivities. The annual journey of Lord Jagannath, Devi Subhadra, and Lord Balabhadra at Chhatia in the district is noteworthy due to the longest chariot procession in the state. The three chariots are pulled from Chhatia to Badaghumuri, covering a distance of about 12 km, including 8 km along National Highway 16. A large number of devotees participate in pulling the chariots all the way. After the 'pahandi' of the three deities, the chariot pulling begins in the afternoon and reaches the Mausima temple by evening. Many police personnel also participate to ensure the chariots reach the destination swiftly along the National Highway.

People protest botched drain work in Keonjhar




Keonjhar(KCN): The lack of a proper drainage system is making the lives of residents miserable in this town. The faulty mechanism to clear water during the monsoons is putting the lives of people under a lot of stress. Locals alleged that not only are government funds being wasted, but at the same time they are being forced to face torrid times. Locals pointed out that the construction of drains has been carried out in a faulty manner. Hence efforts to rectify those mistakes are not giving any results. On the other hand, funds allotted for the rectification are going to waste, they added. Meanwhile, with

Rath Yatra being celebrated Sunday, the drain work has hampered the smooth movement of traffic in the town. One such example is evident from the drain under construction near Gandhi Street in this city. The Public Works Department (PWD) had allotted the responsibility to a private company to construct the drain and a fund of `10 crore had been allocated. However, unnecessary delays in the construction of the drain are adding to the woes of the people, locals said. Sources pointed out that initially the drain was given a 'V' shape. Later the construction company realised that it would be better if the drain was

straight. By the time, the fault was detected a lot of money had already been spent. And by the time the rectification process started, the rains had arrived. Locals stated that the entire area has now turned into a slush-filled zone with vehicles regularly getting stuck in the mud. They pointed out that the area has become accident prone and police are struggling to control the traffic. "If the drain had been straight, water could have flown out easily. As it was 'V' shaped, the water stagnated inside the drain and overflowed. We have repeatedly pointed this issue to the engineers involved in construction work. However, no one

listened to us," alleged locals Pintu Sharma and Anil Shankar. They added that if the work is done in such an arbitrary manner it will just be a waste of a large amount of money and the main problem of draining out of water will never be solved. Other locals pointed out that the fault lies with the engineers as they decided to construct a 'V' shaped drain. "Now after so many months, they have realised that they had gone wrong and have decided to rebuild the drain. But it is the people who are suffering," the locals added. "We have laid special emphasis on a proper drainage system. The present problem has arisen because of delay in work. The contractor has been asked to complete the road within 15 days. We are hopeful that the problems will soon be resolved," said Bikram Murmu, assistant engineer of the PWD department.

"My man is talking with cricket board in Bangladesh and I already signed few commitments as a consultant for some different teams and different counties and different franchises so I have to fulfill those commitments and after December hopefully I will be more free and yes everything is, very positive and looking forward to catch up with you guys again" Mushtaq told Cricbuzz on Monday. "I had a really good time and I think they had great bunch of guys and can challenge any team I believe that and before I signed I did my work with

all the cricketers of Bangladesh and I think they are very talented, all they need is to have a belief and confidence and they can challenge any team and I believe they can change that environment and hopefully can be a very good team specially with white-ball cricket," he said. "I already made some commitments before I signed with Bangladesh that runs till the World Cup and I am looking forward to having a great time again." The BCB echoed the same sentiment and revealed that they are having positive negotiations and hence they are not looking for any other



alternatives apart from Mushtaq at the moment. "According to the communication we had with Mushtaq we wanted specific number

of days from him but he could not give that because he had previous commitment like he had an agreement with

England Cricket Board while there are other commitments as well and due to that we had made the agreement with him till T20 World

Cup," BCB chief executive Nizamuddin Chowdhury told reporters at the Sher-e-Bangla National on Monday. "I spoke with him even today (July 8) and he had prior engagements till December which included the England U19 job," he said. "We are talking with him on long term basis and we provided him with the FTP that is locked till 2027 and he is looking at it and will get back to us soon. In the last press conference our board president said that we are keen to have him and because we are getting positive response from him we are only thinking about him (as spin

consultant)," he said. "After December when we will have him on a long term basis we would like to have him for a specific amount of days and he can work elsewhere when he is not engaged with us," he added. If Mushtaq cannot make time before December, in that case, he will miss Bangladesh's tour of Pakistan, India, South Africa and West Indies. However, he is likely to be part of the Bangladesh contingent that will take part in the upcoming ICC Champions Trophy 2025, scheduled to be held in Pakistan.

New Delhi: Faf du Plessis scored a superlative 58-ball 100 to power the Texas Super Kings to 203/5 in 20 overs before Washington Freedom showed they were up for the tall chase by flying off the blocks. Travis Head and Steve Smith powered their side to 62/0 in just four overs to set the chase up, but rain arrived to sully an exciting fixture. There was no further play and the two teams had to share the spoils. Following their loss to LA Knight Riders just two days ago, the Super Kings made a statement start to their second fixture as du Plessis and Devon Conway added 109 for the first wicket in just 10.2 overs. Aaron Hardie became a swift second wicket but Marcus Stoinis arrived to keep du Plessis company while chancing his arms himself enroute to an 18-ball 29. The South African veteran was dismissed in



the 19th over but the Super Kings collected 60 runs off the last 30 balls to power to the season's first 200-plus total. Across the PowerPlay and the death overs, Marco Jansen was targeted by du Plessis who finished his essay with 12 fours and five sixes. Travis Head and Steve Smith were up for the steep task ahead of them, signalling their intent in the second over from Naveen

ul Haq where they combined to smash 17 runs. Smith took on the bowlers in the first couple of overs, while Head enjoyed a reprieve when Dwayne Bravo dropped a sitter at mid-on. The swashbuckling left-hander then punished the bowling side by coming down heavily on Hardie by smashed two fours and two sixes - both over deep square leg - in the fourth over. Only one delivery

was possible in the fifth over - a no-ball - before rain forced the players indoors and refused to relent. The teams thus, shared a point each. Brief Scores: Texas Super Kings 203/5 in 20 overs (Faf du Plessis 100, Devon Conway 39; Saurabh Netravalkar 2-33) vs Washington Freedom 62/0 in 4 overs (Travis Head 32*, Steve Smith 26*). No result due to rain.

Shastri calls for two-tier Test system at MCC event

New Delhi: Ravi Shastri has called for the introduction of a two-tier system for Test cricket. At the inaugural World Cricket Connects event, held at Lord's Cricket Ground on Friday, the former India coach said Test cricket can be more interesting if there is a method for promotion and relegation. "(Shastri) proposed a competitive Test structure with promotion and relegation to maintain interest," Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC) revealed. It released parts of the wide-ranging discussion. Another point put forth by Shastri was about managing Twenty20 cricket. The point has not been elaborated with the MCC stating, "Shastri also stressed T20 cricket's financial importance and

the ICC's role in managing the Future Tours Programme." Shastri had previously stated that there should not be any bilateral Twenty20 cricket in the ICC calendar and the world body should only hold the World Cup in the shortest format of the game. Shastri also highlighted the balance of power and economic realities in modern cricket, referencing England and Australia's former dominance being replaced by that of India. The cricketer-turned commentator and media expert also noted the importance of the BCCI sharing resources more generously. In the same discussion, Graeme Smith spoke about Test cricket's evolution, noting it is

primarily played by six nations and advocating for a strategic approach to its future. He cautioned against oversimplified solutions like creating dedicated windows for the format, something Pat Cummins, captain of Australia, has asked for. The MCC discussion brought together some of the most influential figures in the game 'to discuss, provide opinion and debate some of the major opportunities and challenges facing modern cricket.' The MCC said, "The debate generated a range of ideas for those attending to help shape the positive evolution of the game." Sanjog Gupta, Head of Sports at Star & Disney India, stressed balancing commercial interests with regulatory measures



and enhancing the overall fan experience to ensure the sport's sustainability. Ramiz Raja highlighted the difficulties faced by Pakistan Cricket Board, particularly because of its inability to play lucrative bilateral cricket against India and pointed out how

the success of Pakistan Super League (PSL) bolstered Pakistan's cricket economy. He questioned the current Test series scheduling and called for better stadium facilities and innovative formats like triangular series.

Andrew Strauss, the former England captain, noted the potential of the Olympics to introduce cricket to new audiences while Venky Mysore, CEO of Kolkata Knight Riders, spoke about the importance of pushing boundaries for growth,

stressing the need to globalise cricket brands and fan bases to create year-round engagement and new market opportunities. Greg Barclay, Chair of ICC, kicked off the event with a thought-provoking introduction on the state of the game, highlighting the unsustainable pace of the current cricket calendar and the looming challenge of balancing the sport's global growth with economic realities. "Barclay stressed the need for collaboration and compromise among cricket's leaders to navigate these challenges effectively," the MCC said. According to the MCC, attendees included chairs and CEOs from ICC full Members representing Australia, England, New Zealand, South Africa,

West Indies, and associate nations Scotland and Oman. The IPL had strong representation with the CEOs of the Rajasthan Royals and Kolkata Knight Riders, as well as some of the prominent names from the world of broadcast bringing the IPL to billions worldwide. Leaders from the Professional Cricketers' Association, Australian Cricketers' Association, SA20, and IL20 were also present. MCC's World Cricket committee members such as Kumar Sangakkara, Graeme Smith, Clare Connor, and Jhulan Goswami attended, along with cricket legends such as Kevin Pietersen, Brendon McCullum, Heather Knight, Barry Richards and Shastri.
