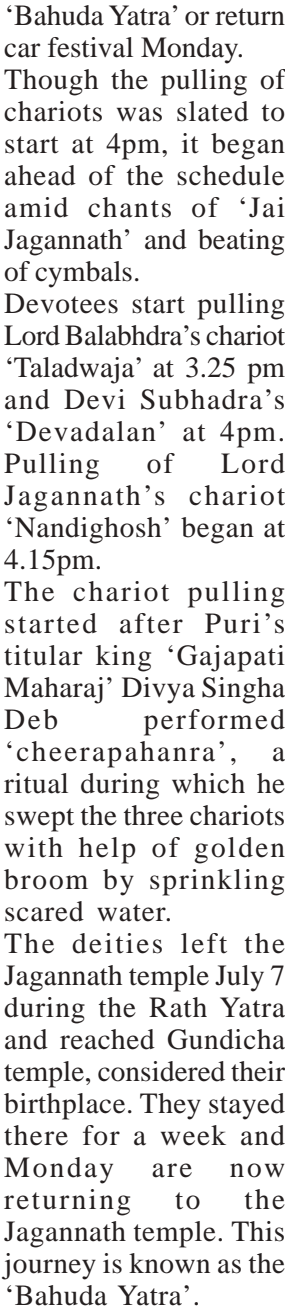
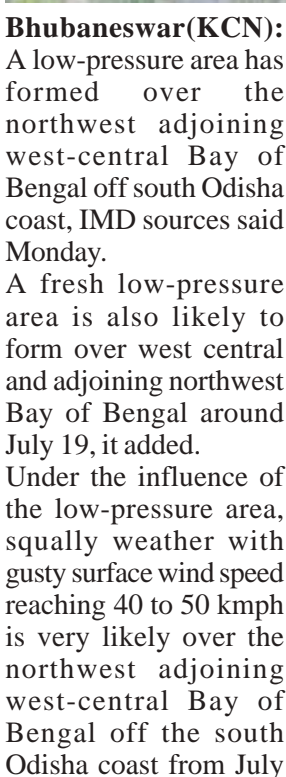


Low-pressure forms over Bay of Bengal; likely to trigger heavy rainfall in Odisha



Earlier, the trinity was ceremonially taken to their respective chariots from the Gundicha Temple in the presence of lakhs of devotees. A total of 180 platoons (1 platoon comprising 30 personnel) of police force and 1,000 officers were deployed to maintain law and order and crowd management during the 'Bahuda Yatra'. Additional Director General of Police (Law & Order) Sanjay Kumar said adequate security arrangements have been made and the entire temple town is under CCTV surveillance. Around five lakh people are expected to congregate for the festival. The deities will remain seated on the chariots in front of the 'Singha Dwar' (Lion's Gate) of the 12th-century shrine Monday night. The 'Sunabesha' (golden attire) ritual, in which the deities are decked in gold jewellery, will be performed on chariots July 16.



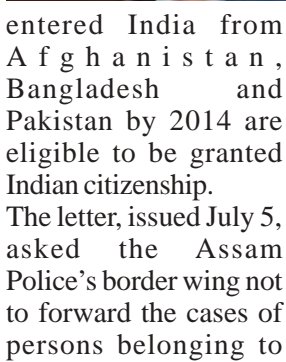

IMD sources said light to moderate rain/thundershower is very likely to occur at most places over the districts of south Odisha and at many places over the districts of north Odisha during the next five days. Heavy to very heavy rainfall (7 to 20 cm) is very likely to occur at one or two places over the districts of Koraput,

Malkangiri, Nabarangpur and Rayagada while heavy rainfall (7 to 11 cm) is very likely to occur at one or two places over the districts of Ganjam, Gajapati, Rayagada, Kandhamal, Kalahandi, Nayagarh, Malkangiri and Koraput. The IMD has issued yellow warnings for Koraput, Malkangiri, Rayagada, Gajapati, Ganjam, Nabarangpur, Kalahandi and Kandhamal districts where under the influence of the low-pressure area, heavy to very heavy rainfall (7 to 20 cm) is very likely to occur till July 20.

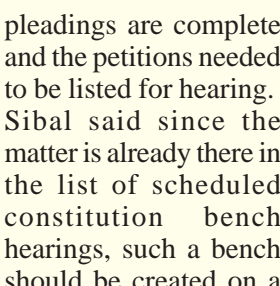
Hindu, Sikh, Buddhist, Parsi, Jain and Christian communities who entered India prior to December 31, 2014 directly to the Foreigners Tribunal (FT). Majumdar stated that such persons should be advised to apply on the citizenship portal for

consideration of their application by the Indian government. “However, this facility will not be available to people who entered into Assam from Afghanistan, Bangladesh or Pakistan after 31st December, 2014 irrespective of their religion. Once detected, they should be forwarded to the jurisdictional Foreigners Tribunal for further action,” he said. Addressing a press conference Monday, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma

said the letter was issued as per norms. "It was a statutory order. There is nothing objectionable in that and it was as per law," he asserted. Sarma also said anyone coming to Assam in 2015 or later will be deported back to their country of origin. According to the Assam Accord, names of all foreigners coming to the state on or after March 25, 1971 would be detected and deleted from electoral rolls, and steps would be taken to deport them.

New Delhi(KCN): The Supreme Court Monday agreed to consider a suggestion for setting up a constitutional bench to hear pleas challenging the validity of passage of laws like the Aadhaar Act by the Modi government as money bills allegedly to bypass the Rajya Sabha where it was a minority. The BJP currently has 86 MPs and the ruling NDA 101 in the 245-member Rajya Sabha where the majority mark is 123. The passage of bills like the Aadhaar Act and even amendments to the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) as money bills,

apparently to circumvent the Rajya Sabha when the NDA did not have a majority there, has been at the centre of a major political and legal row. Congress general secretary in-charge of communications Jairam Ramesh is one of the petitioners who have challenged the passage of the Aadhaar Act of 2016 as money bill under Article 110 of the Constitution. Senior advocate Kapil Sibal told a bench comprising Chief Justice of India (CJI) D Y Chandrachud and justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra Monday that the



priority basis.
“I will take the call when I form the constitution benches,” the CJI told him.
Later in the day, the Congress welcomed the top court’s decision agreeing to consider

setting up a constitution bench to hear the pleas. The party hoped a final verdict would come before Chandrachud retires in November this year. Earlier, the top court had said it would constitute a seven-judge

bench to consider the issue of validity of passage of laws like the Aadhaar Act as a money bill. A money bill is a piece of legislation which can be introduced only in the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha cannot amend or reject it. The Upper House can only make recommendations which may or may not be accepted by the Lower House. A bench headed by the CJI had earlier said all pending seven-judge bench matters will be listed October 12 last year for procedural directions. In November 2019, a

five-judge bench of the apex court had referred to a larger bench the issue of examining the validity of the passage of the Finance Act, 2017 as a money bill.

“The issue and question of Money Bill, as defined under Article 110(1) of the Constitution, and certification accorded by the Speaker of the Lok Sabha in respect of Part-XIV of the Finance Act, 2017 is referred to a larger Bench,” it had said.

The five-judge bench had then struck down in entirety the rules governing the appointment and service conditions of the

members of various tribunals that formed part of the Finance Act. Earlier, another bench of the top court, while upholding the constitutional validity of PMLA, had kept the issue of passage of the amendments to it as a money bill open for adjudication by a larger bench. In the Aadhaar judgement, the top court had upheld the validity of passage of the law as a money bill. However, Justice Chandrachud, the present CJ, had penned a dissenting judgement and called designating the Aadhaar legislation as a money bill a "fraud on the Constitution".

Tips to Crack the GATE Exam Without Coaching
Cracking this exam without coaching is challenging but achievable; the main steps to break this exam without proper coaching are as follows:

Get an Overview

It is an online exam conducted only once yearly, around the first-second week of February. The dates for 2023 are out on the official website. It is held jointly by the India Institute of Sciences and IITs under the Ministry of Education. It consists of a single paper with 65 problems, adding up to 100 marks a candidate must solve in 3 hours. A package of multiple-choice questions and Numerical questions can be seen. The first section consists of 10 aptitudes, reasoning and language questions. Rest 55 questions revolve around core engineering concepts.

This exam is famous for its innovative approach

to testing each candidate. Getting a hold of the entire engineering syllabus for a 3-hour examination is not a cakewalk.

Gather Your Tools

Get a comprehensive idea of the current syllabus and get familiar with it. A smart way is to get limited and appropriate books that cover the entire syllabus. Rather than reading multiple books, get a hold of the same books multiple times. You can gather these resources online or offline but stick to one. Not just this, try to solve as many previous year question papers as possible. Try to get an idea of repeated patterns and topics. This small step will accelerate your preparation two to three times.

Mock tests are yet another effective way to increase your chances. There are easy-to-access test series available for free or at

nominal charges. These mock tests are beneficial in identifying your strengths and weaknesses. Try to figure them out and work on both of these points. Plan Out Your Strategy
At this point, each of us knows the exact time left for the exam. We are done with what, when and where. Now, we must focus on how to crack the exam. Keeping in mind all our strengths and weaknesses, make a schedule and work each day uniformly. Keep a daily journal and note your progress.

Try to work on accuracy and then jump onto your problem-solving speed. Sharpen your skills each day. A detailed analysis will tell you the topics that hold more weight and try to build a schedule around those topics.

An appropriate advice would be to try to cover the entire syllabus at least once by the end of the year so that you can revise as much as

possible in January.

Disciplined Execution

This is probably the most critical and challenging step. You might execute your plan



flawlessly, but doing it continuously for weeks and months challenges you. The discipline to get going each morning is hard to achieve, but once you find it, you have done half the job. Once you have completed a disciplined approach, try to grow each day; nothing can stop you. There will be days when you feel like giving up, but those are the days when you

strike back with your full potential.

Try to make a small group of 3 – 4 friends and make a note of each other's progress.

Healthy competition can help you to achieve more. Also, problem-solving and aptitude skills are enhanced in a healthy group discussion.

Tips to Ponder

Make sure to adapt to a proper routine, including a healthy sleep routine of six to seven hours

Do not linger around on various resources; try to stick to limited material and master it

Suit yourself to long stretches of 3 hours, especially during the morning when the exam takes place

Try to give as many

mock tests as possible, and that too in online mode.

Never underestimate the role of these mocks. Prepare and attempt these sincerely

Working on your weaknesses is necessary but do not leave behind your strengths. Instead, try to sharpen them from time to time

Most of the questions in the GATE exam are based on concepts, So

stick to the conceptual manner only. Shortcuts might cost you a lot in the main exam

Revision has to be categorised daily, weekly and monthly. This will help you to cover the syllabus intelligently

Time management during the preparation and exam hours is very crucial. One must get a hold of it

Try to make simple and concise notes. Do not just add important stuff; only add the data you mostly forget

It would be ideal if you covered the entire syllabus by the beginning of January.

Do not stay under pressure for too long during your preparation while attempting the exam

Dos

Stick to the concepts that will help you for a long time and effectively
There is no limit to practising the number of

questions; practice as many as possible

Sincerely, attempt mock tests, and an overall analysis of your mistakes is even more critical

Make sure to leave all topics intact; try to cover each case or at least hover over the minor ones

Previous year question papers are a blessing. These are the best resources available out there

Don'ts

Procrastination is a sweet poison, do not consume it. Never sleep upon anything. Manage to finish your chores on time
Do not skip language practice. It might not take a lot of time and energy
Don't break the consistency; even if you get off the track, try to collect yourself as soon as possible

Do not gather unnecessary material; stick to limited resources and master them

Climate Change: A Threat to Justice and Human Development



Climate change is the defining issue of our times, threatening to disrupt the existing way of human life. This global phenomenon is dignified to substantially alter the human situation, affecting nearly all aspects of life, from food security and water availability to energy sources and biodiversity. When discussing climate change, we often use the terminology of emissions, carbon footprint, temperature rise, and low-carbon economy/technology. These technical terms reflect the deep connections between ecology and technology. However, the study of climate change transcends individual disciplines, encompassing law, economics, science, international relations, ethics, and philosophy. At the heart of this complex issue is equity, which must become the focal point of all discussions on

tackling climate change. Climate change threatens to cause irreversible changes in the Earth's atmosphere, jeopardizing the right of future generations to enjoy the planet's resources. Our responsibility extends beyond current communities; it encompasses a duty towards future generations. Climate justice demands equity among contemporary societies and between present and future generations. Intergenerational equity implies that each generation must leave the planet and its resources in a state that ensures comparable equity for future generations. This concept is underpinned by three principles: options, quality, and access. The first principle, 'options,' emphasizes conserving the diversity of natural resources to meet the future needs of upcoming generations. The second principle, 'comparable quality,' relates to maintaining the quality of the environment and natural resources. The third principle, 'equal

access,' ensures that future generations have the same access to these resources as the present generation. These principles guide us to view the Earth's atmosphere as a common resource to be shared among contemporary communities and across generations. The equal rights of future generations inherently limit the right of the present generation to access and enjoy the Earth. Climate change threatens the realization of numerous human rights, resulting in widespread injustice. It poses the greatest threat to human development in contemporary times. Human development is fundamentally about creating growth opportunities, but climate change threatens to curtail these opportunities. Described as a 'human tragedy in the making,' climate change could lead to catastrophic effects on human life if the international community fails to take decisive action. A human rights approach to studying climate change is normatively relevant as it focuses on human suffering caused by climate

change to foster cooperative political will to address the issue. Furthermore, the impacts of climate change are felt differently across the globe. Developing countries are particularly vulnerable due to their geographic and economic circumstances, which limit their ability to mitigate and adapt to these effects. This asymmetry in climate change impacts leads to profound injustice. Compounding this is that these vulnerable communities have contributed the least to the anthropogenic causes of climate change. Thus, climate change mitigation and adaptation strategies may also result in human rights violations and further injustices if not carefully designed and implemented. Climate change threatens the right to self-determination and impedes human development on a community level. On an individual basis, it adversely affects fundamental rights such as life, health, food, safe drinking water, and housing. Climate change reduces the carrying

capacity of certain regions, exacerbating both the frequency and intensity of natural hazards like coastal storms, intense heat waves, droughts, and cyclones. The average rise in global temperature and melting ice caps will cause sea levels to rise. Together, these effects make some areas uninhabitable, leading to human displacement. Discerning the human impact of climate change is challenging because numerous other factors, such as economic resources and policy decisions, influence it. Environmental degradation often combines economic scarcity and political inertia to diminish quality of life. Frequent exposure to natural hazards can make living in certain areas untenable due to the high rehabilitation costs after storms, cyclones, or floods, which burden communities and individual households. In developing countries, many people depend on fragile ecosystems for their livelihoods. Climate change increases the frequency and intensity of coastal storms, threatening these

coastal communities' homes, food, and livelihoods. Forced migration due to uninhabitable conditions presents a significant challenge, especially in overpopulated regions like Southeast Asia. This demographic shift can lead to unrest in receiving communities as competition for already scarce resources intensifies. Thus, climate change often creates a causal nexus where its effects exacerbate poverty and inequality. For instance, water scarcity can reduce agricultural productivity, leading to food shortages. This scenario diminishes farmers' income and causes malnutrition and further economic decline in affected regions. The effects of climate change are more acutely felt in developing countries due to their limited resources. For example, most farmers in India rely on rainfall for irrigation. Many farmers lack resilience to climate variability; a failed monsoon can push

them into poverty. Climate change makes weather patterns more unpredictable, heightening uncertainty and risk for these communities. Frequent exposure to natural hazards raises the cost of living, as communities must repeatedly invest in rehabilitation after each disaster. This financial burden strains communal resources and individual households. Furthermore, a significant number of people in developing countries depend on fragile ecosystems for their livelihoods. Coastal communities in India, for example, face severe threats from increased storm frequency and intensity, jeopardizing their homes, food security, and livelihood. Climate change thus forms a vicious cycle where environmental degradation, economic vulnerability, and social instability are interlinked. The impact on agricultural productivity due to water scarcity illustrates this cycle. Reduced agricultural output leads to farmers losing

income, food shortages, and malnutrition, further weakening economic activity in the region. Thus, climate justice is not merely about mitigating emissions and technological solutions; it is about ensuring that all people, now and in the future, can thrive in a healthy and sustainable environment. Climate change is a multifaceted threat that undermines human rights and development. Its impacts are disproportionately felt by those in developing countries, where limited resources and economic vulnerabilities compound the effects of environmental changes. Resolving climate change requires a holistic approach that integrates environmental, financial, and social policies to mitigate its impact and promote resilience in vulnerable communities.

EDUCATION, FAMILY, SOCIETY- WHAT MAKES LITTLE MINDS DISRUPTIVE



A good friend of mine from the village days, having had a few years of extensive teaching experience in one of the remotest areas of India, has recently narrated his personal service anecdote. And I, with curiosity pouring in from all sides, have listened to him but of course with grave concern and intense perplexity. His anecdotal summary does not have to be written in detail here, but the essence of it was all about how the young generation has dangerously been tuned into an alarming level of arrogance, vengeance and hostility. This, according to him, was instrumental in pushing societies through the harsh domains of disruption. Though his experience was personal, he had witnessed such occasions multiple times.

While an ideal paraphrasing of thoughts has been exchanged between both of us, the question that surfaced was about how the society is looking at such negative transformation among the young minds. Even if I consider his experiences as confined to a particular locality, wrapped under the situational volatility of a society that underwent perennial dismemberment from the mainstream, it demands a genuine and compassionate approach to know its emasculative effects on the country. When children enter the teenage years, what turns calamitous about their life is the intensity of pressure they receive from the parents and society that subsequently crushes them hard. Aspirational parents and centers of competitive examinations frequently inject the venom of excellence into the children's veins that the former concocted with their crazy mindset. And children, with an unquestionable ability to

survive in this atmosphere of complexity that has been designed by the illusory ideas of some elders, begin to shrink intellectually and deviate from the dreams that have grown with them all through the corridors of schools and colleges. Situations have sweepingly changed well before the new dawn of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and this outlook on excellence has been primitively driving the young minds towards certain harsher moments of an intellectual crisis. This has mainly been due to the ethical framework that we traditionally built around the process of education which indeed got dismantled today, and the idea that education is a lifelong process and it cannot be a mere breadwinning exercise, was dispelled. Intense commercialization and the influx of Artificial Intelligence in its various forms have helped the world shrink into an accessible size. Radical human interventions in the life of people through various means have

essentially curtailed their living space that they once used with intense involvement and affection. Many reasons can be ascertained in connection with this transition. So, what, as per the changing tendencies, should be treated as an essential prerequisite? The first thing, as per my observation, is to revive the basic aspects of an ideal social relationship, its absence at present, is creating distress everywhere. Invariably, to a large extent, this was neglected and the ramification of it began to surface everywhere, stretching from the families to societies and beyond. Parents, being surmounted by aspirational thoughts began to deviate from the basic congeniality and the family atmosphere almost everywhere turned out to be mechanical. An alarming revelation under the RTI provides staggering statistics of suicide among students in the national capital. It tells that a total of 1294 students under 18 years died by suicide between

2014 and 2018. This number represents the situation in the national capital alone. The national data must be a hair-raiser with thousands of incidents being reported. The Supreme Court has directed the central government to make its point clear as to what has so far been done with respect to the implementation of Public Health Programme for prevention of suicides. The situation is alarmingly serious and it does not confine its effects in certain areas alone. Being the most populous country, India's demographic responsibility with democracy flourishing vividly, is large and it needs to set the situation alright, before the young generation is carried away by the notions of stress, distress and disappointment. In this instance, it is fair to say that there has been a distance engulfing between the parents and the children and the society too turned out to be ignominious and it disregards to dwell into what the young minds have to say. What is

missing in the families is an honest conversation. Mostly, the conversations in families are forceful monologues by parents on the children and the latter with fewer options and no spaces for them to make their voices heard, end up with a conclusion; that, the world around them is an ugly territory without a wind blowing to carry the voice of concern from the young and feeble minds. And the result is the statistics that I presented above. What makes children go astray? Should we blame the parents and the familial conditions as the principal reasons behind this perilous shift? Should society be not held accountable for what it has turned out to become? Or is it someone who our children are in company with? Or is it the mobile screens that the children find convenient to personally bury their intellect in? There are multiple and obvious reasons to blame. But with certainty one thing can be said; that the family atmosphere

these days seems to have been self-defeating and the parents frequently fail to sense those frail and inexcusable terrains their children intellectually and emotionally land. Families, where an ideal social behavior should have sprouted, became dry living spaces. And initiatives to cause distress begin from their aspirational intuitions and in most of the cases parents unknowingly take this rough ride and children often fail to catch-up with the pace. Families are known to be places where lessons of basic discipline are taught. But they often become spaces of confrontation and there develops discrimination among the members. While having a firm commitment to family and the welfare of its members, parents time and again go rude on children mostly due to the latter's inability to capture the gist of what the elders in the family dream about. Of course, the final impact of such menacing ways of implementing their

plans on the children brings domestic violence both physically and mentally. An aspirational society at large is often in contradiction with the self-designed dreams of the young minds and a generation gap is evident between the elders and the youth. And my friend, having come across such familial confrontations, where parents have broken up unconditionally while children are left to endure without being taught the lessons of survival, makes a rejoinder; that the necessary takeaway of the present situation holds all of us responsible for what we are creating for the future. Education, for a significant social change needs to be more coherent, emerging as a flow of a tributary of life, helping the children with adequate inner engineering to survive before they surrender to life's ordeals.

Kendrapara (KCN): Frequent ingress of tidal waves in seaside villages of this district is posing serious threats to the lives and properties of the residents. These waves are destroying farmlands and are also harming buildings and roads, locals informed Thursday. They stated that unless the embankments are strengthened the waves will cause major damages in future. The threat of tidal waves extends from Talachua panchayat in Rajnagar block to Batighar panchayat of Mahakalapada block. Locals said that the tidal waves have assumed threatening proportions and are affecting cultivation, the main source of income for people in this district. The situation is the same for Gajaria, Utikana, Keradagada, Padmanavapur, Gopalpur, Rajgarh, Gadadharpur and Baragaon areas. Locals said that the tidal waves may destroy the geotube wall built at Pentha coast under Mahakalapada sub-division. They informed us that sometimes the waves rise 40 metres above the embankments and surge into the villages. Similarly, the embankments of Brahmani, Kharasrota,



Gobari and Hansua rivers are also affected by the saline water of tidal waves, they added. Residents of some of the areas informed that on the last full moon day, the Patasala river swelled up and overflowed due to tidal waves. In the process, various varieties of crops were destroyed as the water flowed into farmlands. Locals informed that the Odisha government set up an office of the Coastal Embankment department at Aul in 2004. Competition for opening spot a 'good thing', says Gill

Messi in tears on the bench after being substituted in Copa America final

New Delhi: That was the phrase Shubman Gill used to describe India's 4-1 series win in Harare, a scoreline that belies the manner in which India lost the first match and barely does justice to the manner in which they dominated thereafter. But the turnaround witnessed in Harare also extended to Gill, who only weeks ago had been left out of the T20 World Cup squad. Picked to lead an inexperienced squad in Harare, Gill not only showed good tactical acumen but also shone as an opening batter, top-scoring with 170 runs at a strike-rate of 126 and sending a memo to the selectors that he's still up for it. His performance in Harare is surely going to add a lot of weight to his T20I resume. In fact, he presents a strong case after the retirement of Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma from the format and looks favourite to couple with Yashasvi Jaiswal at the top of the order, but there are challenges he will need to stave off.



For starters, there's his Punjab teammate Abhishek Sharma, who came into the side on the back of a hard-hitting IPL and played exactly like that in the two opportunities he got at the top of the order. The second of those ended in a hundred, his first in international cricket and sat snugly into the style of play that India have been growing comfortable with. Then there's Ruturaj Gaikwad, who didn't get an opportunity to open but what he brings to the table was for everyone to see.

"It's a good thing that everyone's performing," Gill said of the four opening batters in the squad, all of whom feature in the top-five run-getters in the series. "It shows that everyone is hungry and nobody is ready to take it easy. For any country or board, that's always a good thing. "Anyone who got the opportunity grabbed it with both hands. The openers to bowlers to allrounders to spinners, everyone made a mark and I think the selectors have now seen everything and it's up to them to

name the squad for the next series (3T20Is, 3 ODIs in Sri Lanka)." While Gill's strike-rate was the least when compared to the three other potential opening batters in the squad - Jaiswal (166), Gaikwad (158) and Abhishek (175) - the India captain alluded to tacky pitches upfront and the need to play a certain way in order to set the game up for those who follow. "The wickets were a little challenging for the first 5-6 overs and the ball always did something in the powerplay, so we tried to lose a few

wickets upfront and then capitalize later," Gill explained. Gill's captaincy, though, is a huge green tick for him as India look to the future after the retirement of Rohit. "One thing about captaincy I feel is how much confidence you can show in your players. I try to do that and make them believe that if you try and execute the plans, the results will always follow," Gill said. "After losing the first match, we were under a bit of pressure. It's not easy to play back to back games and the series was planned in a way that there were two back-to-back games, a couple of days rest and then again back-to-back games. It's never easy playing a series like that but I think the way we came back after losing the first T20I was really remarkable. "I think going 1-0 down in the series and then the way we came back was truly remarkable. Seeing everyone hungry and so quickly adapting to the situation and assessing the conditions was truly spectacular to watch."

Shubman carries on MS Dhoni tradition, hands series trophy to debutants

New Delhi: Skipper Shubman Gill did not fail to carry on the long-going tradition of team India, as he handed over the side's Zimbabwe series trophy to debutants Dhruv Jurel, Abhishek Sharma, Tushar Deshpande and Riyan Parag during the celebrations. Sanju Samson was the star of the show for India as they defeated Zimbabwe by 42 runs in Harare on Sunday, July 14. India ended their Zimbabwe tour in the best way possible after Samson's 58 and a disciplined effort with the ball from Mukesh Kumar helped India secure the win and seal the series with a resounding 4-1 scoreline. Zimbabwe was once again left to rue their poor middle order

performance as the hosts were unable to chase down 168 runs in the end and got bundled out for 125. Specifically, this turned out to be a series for India where the side were able to implement youngsters like Abhishek and Riyan and their brilliant form in the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2024. After the loss in the first T20I, the young Indian



stars did receive a lot of flak on social media from fans, with some of the stars being labelled as IPL players. However, the likes of Abhishek Sharma, Ruturaj Gaikwad and Ravi Bishnoi stepped up to help them to seal the series easily. The arrival of the T20 World Cup squad members in Sanju Samson, Yashasvi Jaiswal and Shivam Dube added more steel to

the Indian squad, which ultimately proved to be too much for the hosts. Speaking at the post-match press conference, Shubman reflected on his side's performance throughout the series and how they came back from behind to glory. "Excellent series. The hunger that we showed after the first loss was phenomenal to watch. Lot of the players had long flights, they weren't used to the conditions. The way they adapted was remarkable. I have been there (Sri Lanka) once for Asia Cup, looking forward to go there and performing," Shubman said.

Earlier in the match, Messi went down with an apparent leg injury while attempting to kick the ball before it went out of bounds. He planted his right leg awkwardly and seemed to make contact with Colombia's Santiago Arias. Messi writhed in pain, clutching his lower right leg, and rolled over

several times. Trainers attended to him for a few minutes before helping him to his feet. He walked slowly towards the sideline but later reentered the game. Messi had been dealing with a leg injury and discomfort throughout much of the tournament, causing him to miss Argentina's group stage finale. He managed one shot attempt in the first half on Sunday. Earlier, the Copa America final between Argentina and Colombia was delayed by over an hour on Sunday after thousands of fans without tickets rushed security and attempted to force their way into the stadium, according to organizers. Video on social media showed security clashing with fans as they ran across concourses and tried to breach the gates of Hard Rock Stadium in

Miami Gardens, Florida. Police managed to close the gates and initiate a lockdown, resulting in scores of people stuck outside trying to enter before the match kicked off. Both teams were taken off the field as the chaos unfolded. According to reports, several people were ejected from the stadium by security staff, while some players reported that their families were caught up in the chaos and were unable to enter the venue, which is set to host matches during the 2026 World Cup. South American football's governing body CONMEBOL pushed the start time back three times: from 8:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., then to 8:45 p.m., and finally to 9:15 p.m., when the teams were able to line up for the national anthems and begin the match.

Samson, Mukesh star as India complete a 4-1 drubbing

New Delhi: Led by Sanju Samson's second T20I half-century and Mukesh Kumar career-best efforts, India registered a comfortable 42-run win over Zimbabwe on Sunday at the Harare Sports Club to complete a 4-1 win in the five-match series. After having posted 167 for 6, India bundled out Zimbabwe for 125. After having made an aggressive start in the run-chase, Zimbabwe's momentum was squeezed out in the middle overs through regular strikes. The hosts lost four wickets and failed to score at even run-a-ball during this period, a phase in which India found a steady 65-run partnership to lay the foundation of a late attack.

Yashasvi Jaiswal got the Indian innings going with two sixes off the first two balls, one of which was off a no-ball. Nonetheless, Zimbabwe struck back quickly. Jaiswal was cleaned up by Sikandar Raza in the opening over, and Shubman Gill and Abhishek Sharma joined him back in the dugout in the Powerplay itself after steady starts. With the top three blown away quickly, Sanju Samson and Riyan Parag steadied the Indian innings with a fairly conservative approach. The ball did nip around a bit as the Indian batters controlled their aggression. They didn't manage to find a four through the middle period, but did give the occasional every over.



Brandon Mavuta faced the brunt of this attack as he was carted for four sixes, including twice off successive deliveries by Sanju Samson in the 12th over.

Even as Sanju Samson was dismissed soon after scoring his half-century, Dube took over the mantle of the attack in the company of death-over specialist Rinku Singh.

Dube deposited a low full toss by Ngarava over long on and Rinku deposited Faraz Akram straight down ground for a six. Despite losing opener

Wessley Madhevere for a duck in the opening over, Zimbabwe kept a positive approach in the chase. Brian Bennett hit a couple of crisp boundaries off Tushar

Deshpande before becoming Mukesh Kumar's second victim in the powerplay. Tadiwanashe Marumani and Dion Myers took the attack to Ravi Bishnoi and picked up 16 runs in the last over of the Powerplay. India pulled the momentum back in the middle period with regular strikes. The spin trio of Bishnoi, Abhishek and Washington Sundar, along with Dube's medium pace proved too difficult for the Zimbabwe batters to put away. After the set batters, Marumani and Myers departed, Raza was sent back courtesy a direct by Dube from short fine. To complicate the chase further, Jonathan Campbell pulled Dube straight to the deep square leg fielder in the

next over, making it three wickets in as many overs, which derailed the chase. Faraz Akram went on the offensive against the Indian bowlers, but by then the requirements had pushed the target far beyond Zimbabwe's reach. Moreover, Mukesh Kumar returned to snap two more wickets in the death overs to ensure that Zimbabwe were bundled out with nine balls to spare.
