

JD(U), YSRCP, BJD demand special category status for Bihar, AP, Odisha in all-party meet



New Delhi(KCN): Congress leader Jairam Ramesh Sunday said that in the all-party meeting ahead of Parliament session, the JD(U) and the YSRCP demanded special category status for Bihar and Andhra Pradesh respectively but "strangely" the TDP kept quiet on the matter. BJD leader Sasmit Patra told reporters that his party demanded special category status for Odisha.

In a post on X, Ramesh, who was present at the meeting said, "In today's all-party meeting of floor leaders chaired by

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, the JD(U) leader demanded special category status of Bihar. The YSRCP leader demanded special category status for Andhra Pradesh. Strangely, the TDP leader kept quiet on the matter." In another post, the Congress leader said, "How the political climate has changed! In the all-party meeting of floor leaders, the BJD leader reminded the Defence Minister and BJP President JP Nadda that the BJP's manifesto for the 2014 Assembly

elections in Odisha had promised special category status to the state." Ramesh's post on social media came when the meeting was still underway. JD(U), a key ally in the ruling NDA had recently passed a resolution demanding special category status or package for Bihar. Though leaders from Andhra Pradesh had been demanding special category status for the state, the demand has again gained momentum post Lok Sabha polls.

Pottangi MLA Kadam appointed as leader of Congress Legislative Party in Odisha Assembly



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Congress Sunday appointed Pottangi MLA Rama Chandra Kadam as the leader of the Congress Legislative Party (CLP) in the Odisha Assembly.

Congress general secretary KC Venugopal has intimated Odisha in-charge Ajoy Kumar about the announcement in a letter Sunday.

Basudevpur MLA Ashok Kumar Das and Rajgangpur MLA CS Raazen Ekka have been appointed as the deputy leader of CLP and the party's chief whip in the Assembly, respectively.

Notably, the budget session of the Odisha Assembly is scheduled to commence Monday.

Meanwhile, Congress in another major decision Sunday

dissolved the Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee, various executive committees, frontal organisations and the Congress committees at the district, block and mandal levels.

"Congress President has approved the proposal of the complete dissolution of the Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee, including the President, PCC, its office bearers and executive committee, District/ Block/ Mandal Congress Committees, Frontal Organisations,

Departments and Cells, with immediate effect," read a Congress statement. The current DCC presidents have been asked to serve as acting presidents till the appointments of new presidents by the party. Many party workers and senior party leaders in the state had of late openly advocated for the removal of Congress state president Sarat Pattanayak from his post following the party's poor performance in the recently held general elections.

Heavy rain lashes Odisha, over 7,000 affected in Malkangiri



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Several districts of Odisha have been affected by heavy rain over the past three days due to the impact of a depression over the Bay of Bengal, an official statement said Sunday. More than 7,300 people of Malkangiri district have been most affected by heavy rainfall during that period, it said.

Under the impact of the depression over the Bay of Bengal, the districts of Nabarangpur, Koraput, Khurda, Nayagarh, and Malkangiri received heavy rainfall July 19. Similarly, July 20, Malkangiri, Koraput, Rayagada, Gajapati and Nabarangpur districts received heavy rain, while Nuapada, Subarnapur, Boudh, Malkangiri, Bolangir and Angul received heavy rain July 21.

Due to the heavy rain, several roads and bridges in Malkangiri

district were submerged, the office of the Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) said in its statement. The SRC office said 1,045 villages under 111 panchayats in the district were also affected, and the local administration has so far evacuated 121 people from the low-lying areas to safe shelter homes. Three relief camps have been opened in the districts to provide food and shelter to affected persons. The water is

receding, and normalcy is being restored, it said. The SRC has asked the Malkangiri collector to prohibit the movement of vehicles on submerged roads and bridges till the water recedes. The local police and local officials have been instructed to be at those sites to regulate traffic. Damage to public and private properties shall be enumerated immediately after receding of the water, the statement said. The emergency

Since Saturday, Nuapada district has received an average rainfall of 96.1 mm, followed by Sonepur (73.6mm) and Boudh (66.5mm).

The highest rainfall of 154.4mm was recorded in the Athmallik block of Angul district. Meanwhile, the depression weakened into a well-marked low-pressure area and lay over interior Odisha and adjoining Chhattisgarh at 8.30 am Sunday. It is likely to move towards Chhattisgarh and weaken gradually into a low-pressure area, the IMD said in a bulletin. Under its impact, heavy rainfall (7 to 11cm) would occur at some places over the districts of Nuapada, Bolangir, Subarnapur, Boudh, Bargarh, Sambalpur, Deogarh, Jharsuguda, Sundargarh, Nabarangpur, Kalahandi, Koraput, and Malkangiri Sunday.

Odisha: All party meeting held ahead of budget session



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Leaders of various parties Sunday attended an all-party meeting convened by the state government ahead of the budget session of the Odisha Assembly, which will start Monday.

The budget session will commence with the address of Governor Raghubar Das.

"Detailed discussions held on the suggestions made by the leaders of all the political parties during the meeting to ensure the smooth conduct of the current session of the 17th Odisha Assembly," said Speaker Surama Padhy who chaired the all-party meeting.

"The new government's first session is going to begin Monday. We hope that the house will run smoothly under the leadership of Chief

Minister Mohan Charan Majhi and the guidance of Speaker Padhy," Parliamentary Affairs Minister Mukesh Mahaling told the media persons. Meanwhile, Chief Minister Majhi and Deputy Chief Minister KV Singh Deo in a rare gesture of statesmanship went to

the residence of former Chief Minister and Leader of Opposition (LoP) Naveen Patnaik Sunday and requested him to attend the all-party meeting.

"Today morning, Chief

Minister Mohan Charan Majhi met the LoP Naveen Patnaik at his home and invited him to participate in the all-party meeting.

Chief Minister Majhi also urged Patnaik to attend the Assembly

session regularly and offer his constructive suggestions to the government," Parliamentary Affairs Minister Mukesh Mahaling said.

Though the LoP skipped the meeting, the Chief Whip of Biju Janata Dal and former Speaker Pramila Mallik attended the meeting. Mallik told reporters, after the all-party meeting, that the leaders deliberated on how to run the house smoothly and peacefully. However, the leaders from the opposition Congress and Communist Party of India (Marxist) skipped the all-party meeting. Notably, the election for the Deputy Speaker post is scheduled to be held July 24 while the BJP government will present its first budget for the 2024-25 financial year in the Assembly July 25.

The budget session will continue from July 22 till September 13.

Congress seeks LS Dy Speaker's post for opposition, raises NEET issue in all-party meet



New Delhi(KCN): The Congress Sunday sought the Lok Sabha Deputy Speaker's position for the opposition in the all-party meeting convened by the government ahead of Parliament session, and raised the issue of paper leaks, including of the prestigious NEET, sources said.

They said party leader Gaurav Gogoi said the opposition should be allowed to raise issues in Parliament after Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju sought cooperation from

every party for the smooth running of the two Houses. Samajwadi Party MP Ramgopal Yadav, sources said, raised the issue of the Uttar Pradesh government's controversial directive to eateries on the kanwariya route to display the owners' names.

The YSR Congress spoke about the TDP government's alleged targeting of its leaders in Andhra Pradesh and sought the Centre's intervention.

The meeting is being

chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and was convened by Parliamentary Affairs Minister Rijiju. Separately, Congress leader Jairam Ramesh

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will present the Union Budget Tuesday during the session beginning

Monday. A united opposition is set to corner the NDA government on issues ranging from the NEET paper leak case to railway safety. The session begins Monday and will have 19 sittings till August 12 when the government is expected to present six bills, including the one to replace the 90-year-old Aircraft Act, and also get Parliament's nod for the budget of Jammu and Kashmir, which is under central rule. Sitharaman will also table the Economic Survey in Parliament Monday.

Kiren Rijiju Seeks Cooperation From All Parties For Smooth Functioning Of Parliament

New Delhi(KCN): A meeting of the Government with Floor Leaders of all Political Parties has been held under the Chairmanship of Rajnath Singh, Union Minister of Defence today, before the commencement of the Budget Session of Parliament, 2024. The Defence Minister welcomed all in the first meeting of the floor leaders of both the Houses of Parliament after the constitution of the 18th Lok Sabha.

In his opening address, Union Minister for

Parliamentary Affairs, Kiren Rijiju informed that the Budget Session of Parliament will commence on Monday, the 22nd of July, 2024 and subject to exigencies of government business, the session may conclude on Monday, the 12th of August, 2024. The Session will provide 16 sittings spread over 22 days. Minister also informed that this Session will mainly be devoted to the financial business relating to the Union Budget for 2024-25 which will be

presented to Lok Sabha on Tuesday, the 23rd of July, 2024. However, essential legislative and other business will also be taken up during the session. The Economic Survey of India will be laid on the table of the Houses of Parliament on Monday, the 22nd of July, 2024. The Budget for the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir for 2024 will also be presented on the 23rd of July, 2024. Tentatively 6 items of legislative business and 3 items of financial business have been

identified for being taken up during this session. The Union Minister for Parliamentary Affairs further stated that the Government is always ready to discuss on the floor of the House, any issue as permitted under Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business by respective Presiding Officers. He also requested all party leaders for active cooperation and support for the smooth functioning of the two Houses of Parliament. The meeting was also attended by Union

Minister for Health & Family Welfare and Ministry of Chemicals & Fertilizers, Jagat Prakash Nadda, who is also Leader of the House in Rajya Sabha, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of the Ministry of Law & Justice and Minister of State in the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, Arjun Ram Meghwal and Minister of State in the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs and Minister of State in the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Dr L. Murugan.

Sarangi also held a meeting regarding the security arrangement with Bhubaneswar DCP, Police Commissioner, vigilance Director and other senior police officials. As per sources, proper arrangements have been made to ensure a smooth flow of traffic during the period.

Bad Newz box office Day 2: Vicky Kaushal film outperforms Munjya, earns Rs 18 crore



After giving actor Vicky Kaushal his biggest opener, "Bad Newz" swiftly entered its first Saturday and added a decent figure to its box office collection. The romantic-comedy began its run at the ticket counters by earning Rs 8.3 crore on Friday, July 19. On its first Saturday, July 20, the film witnessed over 16 per cent growth. As per industry tracker Sacnilk, Bad Newz earned Rs 9.75 crore (early estimates) on Saturday, bringing its total box office collection to Rs 18.05 crore within two days. The overall

Hindi occupancy of the film was 26.81 per cent, with maximum footfall coming from the night shows.

Bad Newz is expected to

continue its upward trajectory even on Sunday to end its first weekend with an impressive total. The film will face its real test on Monday.

Commenting on the film's strong start at the box office, film trade analyst Taran Adarsh wrote on X (formerly Twitter), "A strong start was on the cards thanks to the impactful trailer + hugely popular song [#TaubaTauba], but the

best part is, the strong start, coupled with positive feedback, has set the stage for a solid weekend total."



15. Whether search warrant is required to be served: Search warrant is required to be shown to the person being searched and his signature is obtained confirming the fact that it was shown to him. The search warrant is not required to be served on the person being searched - Subir Roy v. S.K. Chattopadhyay [1986] 158 ITR 472 (Kolkata), Southern Herbals Ltd. v. DIT (Investigation) [1994] 207 ITR 55 (Kerala).

16. Whether authorized officer can issue a blank search warrant: The High Court of Punjab and Haryana in the case of Jagmohan Mahajan v. CIT [1976] 103 ITR 579 (P&H) held that a search carried out on the basis of a blank warrant is illegal. Further in this case R.S. Narula C.J. observed - "The most serious content of the warrant of authorisation

is the name of the person whose premises, are sought to be searched. The warrant in this case was admittedly blank in that regard when it was issued under the signature of the Commissioner. The Commissioner has in the instant case acted in a more high-handed manner as held in the case of John Wilkes v. Wood [1763] 19 State Tr. 1153; 98 ER 489. I am unable to congratulate the Commissioner for his betraying the confidence reposed in him by the drastic provision of section 132 and throwing all sense of propriety and responsibility to the winds on mere suspicion or pretense." Similar view has been expressed in the case of Manmohan Krishan Mahajan v. CIT [1977] 107 ITR 420 (P&H).

17. Whether search warrant can be issued in the name of the minor, legal heir of deceased person or a non-resident

living in India: There is no bar for issue of a search warrant in the name of minor or the legal heir of a deceased person or a non-resident living in India at the time of search provided the conditions in section 132 are met. If the Investigating Officer has reason to believe that the incriminating documents may be found in the residence of the employee of the person to be searched, he may issue warrant in the name of the said employee and can conduct search in the residence of the employee along with the search operation of the employer.

18. Rights of the person against whom the search is conducted: As per the ground rules framed for search and seizure by Union Government, the following are the rights of the person to be searched:

- i. To see the warrant of authorisation duly signed and sealed by the issuing authority.
- ii. To verify the identity of each member of search party.
- iii. To have at least 2 respectable and independent residents of the locality as witnesses.
- iv. To have personal search of all members of the party before the start of the search and after conclusion of the search.
- v. To insist on a personal search of a

female by another female only with strict regard to decency.

- vi. To have a copy of the Panchnama together with all the annexes.
- vii. To put his own seals on the packages containing the seized assets.
- viii. Women having the occupancy of an apartment to be searched, have right to withdraw before the search party enters, if according to custom, they do not appear in public.
- ix. To call a medical practitioner, if he or any family member is not well.
- x. To have his children permitted to go to school after the examination of their bags.
- xi. To inspect the seals placed on various receptacles sealed in course of search and subsequently when reopened by continuation of the search.
- xii. To have the facilities of having meals etc. at the normal time.
- xiii. To have a copy of any statement before it is used against him in an assessment or prosecution proceeding.
- xiv. To have inspection of the books of account etc. seized or to take extracts therefrom in the presence of any of the

Authorised Officers or any other person empowered by him.

- xv. Income Tax authorities have no power of arrest.
- xvi. To object by way of filing a petition to the approval given by the CIT for Retention of Books and Documents beyond 180 days from the date of seizure.
- xvii. In addition to above, the person raided has also the following rights:

- a) Right of presence: He is entitled to be present during search - rule 112(8)
- b) Right to worship: He is entitled to observance of his worship at the usual time even if a search takes place during the time of such worship.
- c) Right to leave the spot of search: One is entitled to attend to his normal business or profession but this is subject to the fact that the assessee has to be present during the course of search for furnishing information or replying to questions regarding the acquisitions of the articles or the books of account found during the course of the search. After answering such questions or making his statement one can leave the spot of search. However, in some cases, the refusal to permit the assessee to leave the premises has been the subject of a major

controversy. The decision in the case of L.R. Gupta v. Union of India and others [1992] 194 ITR 32 (Delhi) is quite relevant in this context. In fact, in the case of L.R. Gupta, Delhi High Court observed that not permitting the assessee to attend the court amounts to confinement in the house or arrest of a person for which there is no provision under the Income-tax Act. SLP has been granted by the Supreme Court and reported in [1992] 194 ITR (St.) 239. In this context, the recommendations of The Chelliah Committee were as follows: "Since the Income Tax Department does not have the power to arrest and the ground rules announced on the floor of the Parliament in 1987 specifically lay down that the income tax authorities shall have no power to arrest, the general practice of the search party preventing an assessee whose premises are searched from leaving the building to attend to his work must be discontinued. After the person has made the statement required, he should be allowed to leave".

d) Right to have his statement recorded properly: The searched person has a right to insist on recording in his statement u/s 132(4) that a particular asset or a document, whether seized or not, was found in a particular room or almirah or a container normally used, either by him or a particular member of the family and about the ownership of the articles. If the statement is not properly recorded, he may state his qualifications at the place where he is asked to sign. If such an opportunity is not given to him by the officers at that time, he may, at the earliest, after the search, bring it to the notice of the Assessing Officer and Assessing Officer so as to safeguard his position for the purpose of explaining the assets etc., in course of assessment. The raided person may also decline or object to the recording of the statement at a late hour of the night or in the early morning, on health grounds or on grounds of mental and physical exhaustion as, under such condition, he may not be able to recollect facts or furnish categorical replies. In spite of objection if a statement is recorded, he may insist on recording his objection. If a statement recorded in respect of a particular event from somebody

else is put to him, he has a right to insist for a copy of that statement before he furnishes his reply. In this connection the observations of the Supreme Court in the case of Suraj Mall Mohta & Co. v. A. V. Visvanatha Sastri & another [1954] 26 ITR 1 (SC) are relevant.

20. In this context it may be noted that the Task Force on Direct Taxes chaired by Dr. Vijay Kelkar in para 3.27 of its final report had recommended that -

- a. The CBDT must issue immediate instructions to the effect that no raiding party should obtain any surrender whatsoever.
- b. Where, a taxpayer desires to voluntarily make a disclosure, he should be advised to make so after the search.
- c. All cases where surrender is obtained during the course of the search in violation of the Instructions of the CBDT, the leader of the raiding party be subjected to vigilance enquiry.
- d. All statements recorded during the search should be video recorded.

Regional languages should get attention in courts

languages should also be kept in mind in the process of studying law. Laws related to regional issues should also be taught in our universities. He said, suppose a person from a neighboring village comes to the legal aid center of your university and tells about his land related problem. But if the student does not know the meaning of Khasra and Khatauni then how will the student help that person. Therefore, regional languages should be kept in mind while studying law. Reiterating his point, the Chief Justice said that I am not saying that English should be removed from legal education, but regional languages should also be adopted along with English. Throwing light on diversity, he said, our country is full of diversity. Be it on the basis of language or region. It is known that in many countries of the world, legal education and legal proceedings are conducted in regional languages, which not only increases the access of all citizens to the legal system, but they also start aspiring to become lawyers and judges. Today it is well known that English dominates the study of law. As the documents are also in English, English prevails in the hearing also. Generally the decisions are also written in English. There

is some scope for local languages in the lower courts, but English is used in the Supreme Court, High Courts, Special Courts and Tribunals. If we talk about the provisions related to language mentioned in the Indian Constitution, then Article 348 (1) of the Indian Constitution provides that all proceedings in the Supreme Court and every High Court shall be in the English language, unless Parliament by law otherwise provides. Article 348(2) provides that the Governor of a State may, with the previous consent of the President, use the Hindi language or any other language used for the official purposes of that State in the proceedings of a High Court whose principal seat is in that State. Can authorize the use of. Further, the decision of the Central Cabinet Committee dated 21 May 1965 provided that any proposal relating to the use of a language other than English in the High Court would require the consent of the Hon'ble Chief Justice of India. If we talk about those High Courts, where regional languages are used. Let us tell you that the use of Hindi in the proceedings of the Rajasthan High Court was authorized in 1950 under clause (2) of Article 348 of the Constitution. The use of

Hindi was authorized in the High Courts of Uttar Pradesh (1969), Madhya Pradesh (1971) and Bihar (1972) in consultation with the Chief Justice of India. If we look at the historical perspective of Indian courts, we will find that before the arrival of the British in India, the courts used local languages for judicial proceedings. But, after the establishment of British rule, English became the language of the courts. English was the language of the rulers and the educated elite and was used to maintain control over the people. After independence, the Constituent Assembly of India recognized the importance of regional languages and adopted a policy of promoting them. This resulted in the inclusion of regional languages as official languages of the country. Today, 22 languages have been given the status of regional languages in the Indian Constitution. However, the language of the courts remained English, which became a symbol of elitism and a barrier to access to justice for many.

It is noteworthy that along with starting engineering education in regional languages in the country, efforts are being made to start medical education in

regional languages along with English. Therefore, now steps will have to be taken towards editing law studies in regional languages. In fact, all the developed countries of the world have given utmost importance to their mother tongue and local language. For this reason, mother tongue and local language were made the medium of education of our country. This also includes those countries whose mother tongue is not English. Russia, China, Japan, Germany and France instead of giving importance to English language, made their mother tongue the medium of education. But due to the continuation of English language in India, the importance of local languages started decreasing. As it is not unfair to learn English, but it is completely unfair to give it a place above the mother tongue. However, an attempt has been made to overcome this shortcoming in the new Indian education policy. In this, importance has been given to mother tongue and local language. So that Indian languages will get protection. Indian languages can be given due importance from school education to higher education. Let us tell you that a national institute, Indian Institute of Translation and Interpretation, will be established for all Indian

situation, the big question is how to maintain the existence of languages? For this, there is a need to give preference to local languages. Also, there is a need to improve our mentality towards local languages. Today, a class is growing in the country and the world which takes pride in speaking the English language, this thinking has to be changed. Along with this, the need is being felt in school education today to develop such curriculum which supports multiple languages simultaneously. There is also a need to include chapters promoting the use of ancient languages in the school curriculum. Without this, it will not be possible to reduce the threat looming on the existence of regional languages.

It is noteworthy that the Supreme Court of India has also taken steps to promote the use of regional languages. As the Supreme Court ruled in 2017, all high courts must use regional languages in their judgments. The Court also directed that translations of judgments should be made available in regional languages to promote better access to justice. But, we also have to understand that despite efforts to promote regional languages in the courts, many challenges exist. If we throw light on the challenges, one of the biggest challenges is the lack of infrastructure and resources for translation and interpretation services. In fact, it becomes difficult to provide services in regional languages due to lack of trained translators and interpreters. Another challenge is the resistance of the legal community towards the use of regional languages in the courts. Some lawyers and judges consider English to be the language of the legal profession and oppose any attempts to change the status quo. This resistance may make it difficult to implement policies promoting regional languages in the courts. But to overcome all these challenges, we have to make a better action plan and strategy. So that regional languages not only get importance in the courts, but also ensure their usefulness.

Resentment in Kandhamal: Delay in supply of ginger, turmeric seeds to farmers

Daringbadi(KCN): learnt.

Production of world-famous Kandhamal turmeric and ginger is at stake with farmers in the district turning their backs on organic cultivation of the much sought-after spices. Such a situation has arisen because the farmers sometimes do not get loans for the cultivation, whereas many a time there is an inordinate delay in providing the seeds. Furthermore, the Horticulture department in Daringbadi does not take any step to provide the farmers proper training on cultivation of ginger and turmeric, it is



While arrangements are made by the department to identify the farmers and supply them with free seeds for cultivation of ginger and turmeric, the process has suffered a long delay this year like every other year in the past. Samson Digal of Mundanaju village under Kirikuti panchayat and Amarendra Pradhan from Karipanga village of Simanbadi panchayat have alleged inordinate delay in distribution of seeds. This has spread apprehension among the cultivators regarding a successful yield.

Furthermore, the rain has played a spoilsport for the farmers who have received the delayed seeds as too much rain during plantation may affect the cultivation of ginger and turmeric. Doubting whether they will get a good harvest, some of them are selling the seeds in the market at

throwaway prices in order to earn some bucks.

While the market price of ginger is up to Rs160 per kg, the farmers are selling the ginger seeds at Rs120. Some others are taking to plantation half-heartedly after delayed arrival of the seeds.

As per sources,

It is assumed that the farmers have already completed plantation of turmeric long before the delayed distribution of seeds. Consequently, leftover turmeric and collected from the forest is being sold to the traders, who are exporting the raw spices to Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh from here. Awareness will be created among the farmers about proper utilisation of turmeric and ginger seeds being provided to them from

the department," said Sunil Behera, overseer of Horticulture department, in response to a query. He also warned that action will be taken against those farmers who are found to have received seeds and sold those instead of cultivating.

It is pertinent to mention that a total of 453 quintal turmeric seeds were provided to 278 farmers in the month of May. Similarly, out of 326 quintal ginger seeds reserved to be distributed, 186 quintals has been distributed to 278 farmers in the first phase and, the distribution of 140 quintal ginger seeds to 200 farmers is underway in the second phase.

Five timber smugglers held from Similipal Sanctuary

Baripada(KCN): The Forest department arrested five persons for felling valuable trees for timber in Similipal Sanctuary, and forwarded them to a court in Mayurbhanj district, Saturday.

The Forest department has seized five logs of Champa tree, two large saws and three axes from them.

The accused were identified as Rajma Tudu and Mangala Marandi from Kumudabadi area under Jashipur police station limits, Gopinath Patra and Nane Soren from Asanabani area, and Sukanta Nayak from Basantapur area in the district.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of Forest Department officials



conducted a raid and arrested five persons for cutting Champa trees inside the Gudugudia range in the north division of Similipal Tiger Reserve, Friday. They have been charged under sections of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972 for illegally felling trees.

Notably, activities of poachers and timber smugglers are on the rise

in Similipal. As the sanctuary continues to be encroached upon, wild animals are increasingly straying towards bordering villages and towns. Large and valuable trees like sal, piasal, arjuna, banyan, peepal, neem, harida, and bahada are being cut down and the timbers are smuggled to

neighbouring states of West Bengal and Jharkhand. Police here frequently seize vans transporting timbers to other states.

Locals demanded the Forest department to intensify patrolling and closely monitor not just the entry points but also the active areas to prevent such illegal activities.

Ring road along river Ib remains a distant dream



Rourkela(KCN): The proposed ring road in the Sundargarh Municipality area remains a distant dream although there is a pressing need for the structure to tackle soil erosion along the banks of Ib River. Soil erosion along the Ib river banks is not a new phenomenon. In the last twenty years the process has only accelerated, and the river has eroded patches of land in many places. This has made the river banks dangerous for those living in the vicinity of the eroded portions and also visitors. Incumbent Sundargarh MLA Yogesh Singh had raised the demand for construction of the ring

road nearly twenty years back when he was in the Congress party.

In January 2021, the then chief minister Naveen Patnaik announced the construction of the road encircling Sundargarh town. The government move came soon after Singh joined the BJD. The ring road was supposed to be built for Rs 84 crore and the funds would have been made available from the District Mineral Foundation (DMF) pool. It is learnt that Singh had then taken some initiatives to push the proposal following the announcement. "No one knows what happened afterwards. The process slowed down and the

status of the file is not known at present," said a person versed with DMF functioning, while requesting anonymity. The announcement for the ring road had brought cheer to all. Everyone hoped that the foundation stone for the project would be laid at the earliest. Before the three-tier Gram Panchayat elections, foundation stones for two projects – one bridge-cum-barrage at Kudabaga and another barrage at Semina – were laid by Patnaik.

However, residents and retired soil conservation officials feel this may worsen the soil erosion on either side of the Ib River. "Once the water level increases, there is every possibility it will lead to large-scale soil erosion because of the structure of the soil. The ring road, along with concrete embankment, would have helped in keeping the soil intact," said a former official. Moreover, the road would have helped ease the traffic problems in the town to a large extent as a sizable portion of traffic could be diverted on this road. Vehicles to Rourkela would have taken this road instead of plying on the road going through the town, said the residents.

Kanwer, Patil's replacement, also had a good WPL 2024 as she finished as Gujarat Giants' leading wicket-taker with 10 scalps in eight games at 7.13. This is 26-year-old left-arm spinner's maiden India call-up, but she was already named amongst the travelling reserves for the Asia Cup. Kanwer had also made the cut in the India A squad for the upcoming multi-format tour of Australia, starting August 7.

India is my second home: Manolo Marquez wants success for millions of fans



New Delhi: The All India Football Federation announced on Saturday, 20 July that Manolo Marquez will be taking over the Indian football team. After the appointment, Marquez said that he wanted success for millions of Indian fans.

The All India Football Federation put an end to all speculations about who was going to take over as the next Indian football team head coach. On Saturday, 20 July, the AIFF named FC Goa manager Manolo Marquez as the boss of the Indian team. The regulatory body, which was lambasted by the previous manager Igor Stimac announced the

decision via an official press release.

Marquez, who is well versed with Indian football found success with Hyderabad FC in the Indian Super League.

After that, he was appointed as the head coach of FC Goa where he played a flamboyant style of football. Speaking via an official press release, Marquez called India his second home and said that he has always found a connect with Indian people and culture.

"It's an honour for me to be the National Football Team coach of India, a country I consider my second home. India and its people are something I feel attached to and I

feel a part of since I first came to this beautiful country. I want to do my best to bring success to the millions of fans we have. I am very grateful to FC Goa for allowing us the flexibility to help the national team during the coming season while I am still the club's head coach. I'm grateful to the AIFF for this opportunity and we hope to do great things for football," Marquez said via the press release.

Aged 55, Manolo Marquez has extensive knowledge and experience of Indian football and coaching national team players, especially youngsters. Many national team players in the last few years were called up from his Hyderabad FC team.

Marquez has been coaching in India since 2020. He has coached two ISL clubs – his first stint was with Hyderabad FC (2020-23), before he switched over to FC Goa (2023-present).

Even as Bangladesh got going with a boundary off the first ball - with Dilare Akter hitting a full pitched delivery over the umpire's head - Sri Lanka were led by Udeshika Prabodhani and Inoshi Priyadarshini's double strikes, to leave Bangladesh reeling early,

with their top order back in the dugout. Ishma Tanjim and Rubya Haider were dismissed for ducks.

Following a slow start, Nigar Sultana looked to counter attack early on after the field restrictions were lifted. In the eighth over, she picked a couple of boundaries off Achini Kulasuriya. Chamari Athapaththu cleaned up Shorifa Khatun in the 11th over which pulled the momentum back in Sri Lanka's favour, and

slowed their progress for the rest of the phase. Sultana and Shorna Akter went on the offensive in the death overs. The latter took down Kavisha Dilhari in the 18th over, cracking three successive boundaries to propel Bangladesh past the 100-run mark. Nigar also joined in the offence in the last over of the innings, drilling Prabodhani through the long on and long off region for a couple of boundaries.

Despite striking the big

blow in the powerplay, the Bangladesh bowlers couldn't impose enough pressure on the Sri Lankans. Vishmi Gunaratne and Harshitha Samarakrama controlled the chase and paced it calculatively. The duo added 54 runs for the second wicket before the former was cleaned up by Nahida soon after she registered her third T20I half-century. She was especially severe against Sultana Khatun, who was clubbed for a couple of boundaries in the eighth over and then hit out of the park in the 11th. With victory in sight, Samarakrama cut loose in the 17th over. Shorna Akter was first swept for a boundary and then a couple of outside edges helped the batter find as many more fours. Bangladesh did manage to dismiss her for 33 eventually but that was merely a consolation as six balls later Dilhari lofted Marufa Akter for a four over extra cover to take the side over the line.

Bhaichung Bhutia to resign from technical panel over AIFF's coach hiring process

New Delhi: Bhaichung Bhutia has decided to resign from the AIFF technical committee, alleging that the panel was bypassed in appointing the new national men's team head coach.

Legendary footballer Bhaichung Bhutia announced on Saturday that he is resigning from the All India Football Federation's (AIFF) technical committee, alleging that the committee was

attended Saturday's meeting and asserted that the technical committee typically recommends the head coach of the national team. The legendary IM Vijayan heads the current technical committee. "I have been chairman of the AIFF technical committee in the past (2013 to 2017) and involved in coach appointments like in case of Stephen Constantine. It is the job of the technical committee to appoint successor of Stimac," Bhutia told PTI.

who have applied and recommend the suitable person to become coach. But this time, there was not even a single technical committee meeting to appoint successor of Stimac," Bhutia told PTI.

"If you are going to bypass the technical committee in the head coach appointment, why are we for. I said in the executive committee meeting that since the technical committee was not involved, there was no value of technical committee, then why are we for. So, I said I am resigning from technical committee membership."

Bhutia stated that a special committee, led by AIFF vice president N.A. Haris, was responsible for finding a successor to Stimac. "I

completely opposed the constitution of the special committee. There is a technical committee already in place and how come you formed a special committee to discuss the appointment of the coach?

"The process itself is wrong. The coaches are hired, fired and given extension by executive committee without having any discussion with the technical committee. The president proposes one or two names and the executive committee agrees to
