New Delhi, (KCN): Speaker of the National Assembly of the United Republic of Tanzania and President of Inter-Parliamentary Union, Dr Tulia Ackson called on

the President of India, Smt Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan today (July 24, 2024). Welcoming Dr Ackson to India, the President congratulated her for

being elected as the President of Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) for 2023-26. The President said that India has been a member of the IPU for

a long time. Our parliamentarians are active participants in its various committees, including the Executive Committee. She appreciated IPU for

providing a forum for parliamentarians to discuss important global issues. She expressed confidence that as IPU President, Dr Ackson will further strengthen understanding and dialogue among member countries, and work towards upholding the values and objectives of the IPU, while using it as a platform to raise issues of relevance to the Global South.

The President said that India and Tanzania have traditionally enjoyed close and friendly relations. The Indian community in Tanzania serves as an important bridge of India-Tanzania friendship. She also fondly recalled her wide-ranging discussions with President Samia Suluhu Hassan during her State Visit to India in October 2023.

'Motion Of Thanks' To Guv Address: CM Majhi Outlines 'Vision 2036' For Developed Odisha

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi today highlighted the significance of safeguarding and promoting Odia Asmita (identity) through language, literature, culture, and heritage.

"The government will set up a Rs 200 crore corpus fund to establish Odia Asmita Bhawan, and develop institutions such as the Odisha Translation Academy and the Palm Leaf Manuscript Museum to achieve this, Majhi announced while welcoming the Governor's address in the State Assembly.

The CM presented a vision for a developed Odisha by 2036, considering the next five



years as critical for laying the groundwork for this objective. The government aims to position Odisha at the forefront in the context of a developed India by 2047.

Majhi emphasized the government's focus on the people, referencing the fulfilment of four key commitments made to Odisha's citizens on Day

1 of the new government took charge.

The CM reaffirmed the government's dedication to fortifying democracy by honouring public opinion and addressing complaints through an established system. With resolve and persistent efforts, the government is determined to realise the aspirations of the people of Odisha, Majhi

stated.

As part of the Subhadra Yojana scheme, women will be granted Rs 50,000 each, with the initiative slated to commence on September 17, coinciding with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's birthday, he added.

Aligning with the National Education

Policy 2020, the state government plans to introduce a state-specific education policy to render higher education more attainable in Odisha, including disciplines such as law, medicine, and engineering, the CM conveyed.

Furthermore, 800 state-run schools will be transformed into PM Shri schools, and skill development initiatives will be localized to provide the youth with skills pertinent to the industry.

The government has pledged to fill 150,000 government posts, prioritizing vacant positions in the sector. It is committed to filling 65,000 of these posts over the next two years.

Odisha estimated to grow at 8.5% in 2023-24: Economic Survey



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha's economy is estimated to grow at 8.5 per cent in 2023-24 as per advance estimates in comparison to 7.9 per cent growth in 2022-23, according to Economic Survey Report 2023-24. The report tabled in the state Assembly Wednesday said the growth, however, was concentrated in the industry sector and services sector. The Per Capita Income of Odisha is Rs 1,61,437 in 2023-24 (AE), which is 12.4 per cent less than India's per capita income

of Rs 1,84,205.

The survey report said while Odisha's per capita income since 2015-16 has grown at a CAGR of 12.1 per cent, still Odisha ranks 11th among 17 major states in the country.

According to NITI Aayog, the multidimensional poverty headcount ratio in the state has declined from 29.3 per cent in 2015-16 to 15.7 per cent in 2019-21.

More than 62 lakh people escaped multidimensional poverty in the State between

2015-16 and 2019-21.

However, Odisha ranks 6th among the major 17 States with a high incidence of poverty headcount, the Economic Survey report said.

The agriculture and allied sectors are estimated to grow by 3.5 per cent in 2023-24 which contributed 20.4 per cent to the Gross State Value Added (GSVA).

The state, the report said, needs to take measures towards crop diversification to enhance productivity and farmer's income.

Decision on future of KALIA scheme soon: Odisha Agriculture minister in Assembly

Bhubaneswar, (KCN): A decision on the future of the Krushak Assistance for Livelihood and Income Augmentation (KALIA) scheme will be taken soon, said Deputy Chief Minister and Agriculture Minister, Kanak Vardhan Singh Deo in the Assembly on Wednesday.

Replying to a question of BJD MLA Goutam Buddha Das on the fate of the scheme, Singh Deo said, "A high-level discussion is underway over the KALIA scheme and a decision over the future of the yojana will

be taken soon."

In his question, Das asked whether the present BJP government will continue to provide monetary assistance to small and marginal farmers of the State under the scheme or not? If the saffron party has plans to continue with the scheme, then has the government taken any decision to increase the assistance?

It is worthwhile to mention here that while there are more than 45,67,000 beneficiaries of the KALIA scheme, 29,73,980 farmers are availing benefits of the

Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi Yojana in the State.

Meanwhile, in the Assembly, pandemonium continued to hit the proceedings with the Speaker Surama Padhy adjourning the House several times today. The Speaker adjourned the house till 11.30 am after BJD MLAs staged a walkout alleging 'lack of action' against Odisha Governor's son for allegedly assaulting an ASO. On the other hand, Congress MLAs created a ruckus alleging Odisha being neglected in the Union Budget 2024.

Rs 10,586 Cr Budgetary Provision For Odisha In 2024-25: Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw

Bhubaneswar(KCN): In a significant move to enhance the railway infrastructure in Odisha, Indian Railways has allocated a budget of Rs 10,586 crores for the financial year 2024-25, informed Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw at a press meet at Rail Sadan on Wednesday afternoon.

This substantial budgetary provision represents a remarkable 12.5-fold increase compared to the average annual investment of Rs 838 crores during the 2009-14 period.

The considerable increase in funding is aimed at accelerating various developmental projects, including the construction of new tracks and the



electrification of railway lines. Between 2009 and 2014, an average of 53 kilometers of new tracks were laid each year. This figure has now tripled, with an average of 183 kilometers of new tracks being laid annually from 2014 to 2024. Additionally, the electrification of railway lines has seen a fivefold increase, from

29 kilometers per year during 2009-14 to 146 kilometers per year between 2014 and 2024. Odisha has achieved 100% electrification, showcasing the success of these initiatives.

Currently, there are 40 ongoing projects in Odisha focused on laying new tracks, doubling and multiple lines covering a total of

4,017 kilometers with an estimated cost of Rs 54,434 crores. These projects are crucial for improving connectivity and enhancing the efficiency of the state's railway network.

A key aspect of the development plan is the transformation of 59 stations in Odisha into Amrit stations. This initiative aims to modernize and upgrade

the facilities at these stations, providing passengers with an improved travel experience. The selected stations are: Angul, Badampahar, Balangir, Baleswar, Balugaon, Barbil, Bargarh Road, Baripada, Barpali, Belpahar, Betnoti, Bhadrak, Bhawanipatna, Bhubaneswar, Bhubaneswar New,

Bimlagarh, Brahmapur, Brajrajnagar, Chatrapur, Cuttack, Damanjodi, Dhenkanal, Gunupur, Harishanker Road, Himgir, Hirakud, Jajpur Keonjhar Road, Jaleswar, Jaroll, Jeypore, Jharsuguda Junction, Jharsuguda Road, Kantabanji, Kendujhargarh, Kesinga, Kharlar Road, Khurda Road Junction, Koraput Junction, Lingaraj Temple Road,

Mancheswar, Meramandali, Muniguda, Pariposh, Paradeep, Parlakhemundi, Puri, Raghunathpur, Ralrakhol, Rairangpur, Rajgangpur, Rayagada, Rourkela, Sakhi Gopal, Sambalpur, Sambalpur City, Soro, Talcher, Talcher Road, and Titlagarh Junction.

Furthermore, since 2014, Indian Railways has constructed 427 rail

flyovers and under-bridges, which are essential for enhancing safety, reducing congestion, and improving travel times for passengers.

This comprehensive development plan underscores Indian Railways' commitment to transforming Odisha's railway infrastructure, ensuring better connectivity, and providing a superior travel experience for all passengers.

East Coast Railway General Manager Parmeshwar Funkwal along with Principal Heads of various Departments of ECoR and all the Divisional Railway Managers had graced the video conferencing of Hon'ble Railway Minister's Media Brief at their respective headquarters.

Begum Hazrat Mahal: The Revolutionary Queen of Awadh

Begum Hazrat Mahal was one of the few women who challenged the British during the revolt of 1857. Her maiden name was Mumtaz Ali Khanum. She was born at Faizabad, Awadh. Later in life, she performed a mut'ah marriage with Nawab Wajid Ali Shah.

Awadh was annexed by the British East India Company in 1856 and Nawab Wajid Ali Shah, the last Nawab of Awadh was sent into exile to Calcutta. Hazrat Mahal decided to stay back in Lucknow along with her son Birjis Qadir.

After the absorption of Awadh, a rebellion broke out at Meerut and the banner of revolt was raised in Lucknow which spread rapidly to other towns of Awadh. Lucknow was the only place where the English did not leave the Residency building and faced the rebels until they were able to regain their lost power.

Hazrat Mahal was one of the primary figures in bringing about this uprising. "She has excited all Oudh," says Russell. Her closest allies were Nana Saheb and Maulvi Ahmad ullah Shah. Outram and Havelock arrived from Kanpur to relieve the British Garrison in the Residency of Lucknow. After a few encounters with the rebels, Outram

was able to occupy Alum Bagh (a garden in the suburb of Lucknow) on September 23, 1857.

The victory of the English in Kanpur was another setback to her plans. In the month of November Sir Colin Campbell, Commander in Chief of the British Forces along with a small reinforcement arrived at Lucknow. Begum faced the enemy in a fierce fight but her position grew weaker. In spite of the resistance put up by the Begum, the English Commander was able to escort the besieged garrison out of the residency to Alum Bagh during which a few British officers were killed and wounded.

Begum Hazrat Mahal often called meetings to encourage soldiers, asking them to be



brave and fight for the cause. She wrote letters of instruction for the movement and is reported to have appeared on the battlefield on February 25, 1858, mounted on an elephant. Alum Bagh was attacked by a force sometimes led by

Maulvi Ahmad ullah Shah and at other times by the Begum in person but the British succeeded in defeating the rebel force.

In March, British started operation against Lucknow under the command of Sir Colin Campbell. The

force included 3000 Goorkhas sent by Jung Bahadur, Maharaja of Nepal for the capture of Lucknow.

By March 19, 1858, Moosabagh, Char Bagh, and Kesar Bagh were captured by the British.

Under adverse circumstances, Begum with her followers, her son Birjis Qadir and Nana Saheb escaped to Nepal. The Nepalese authorities were hesitant to give asylum to the rebels and in a strongly worded letter on January 15, 1859, General Budri wrote "if you should remain or seek asylum within my territory and frontier, the Goorkha troops will most certainly, in pursuance of the treaty agreed upon by both the high States, attack, and make war on you..."

Nepalese authorities later changed the decision and an asylum was given to her on the conditions that she did not hold any communication with the rebel leaders or with the people of India. She faced difficulties in Nepal where her son fell sick. The Lieutenant in charge of her at Noakote (Nepal) observed that Begum had plans to flee from Nepal as well. According to a letter by Col. Ramsay, there were five routes by which rebels could pass over the range of the hills.


After the escape of Begum, the British declared that the rebels and their leaders must submit themselves for conspiring against the Government. It was added that the lives of those who did not murder British officials



would be spared and this was applicable to all, from Begum down to those of the lowest rank amongst them. Begum did not agree to this and instead of surrendering, she asked for assistance from Nepalese authorities for the purpose of armed retaliation. Despite the terms offered by the British authorities that "the Begum Hazrat Mahal will receive all the considerations which are due to her as a woman and a member of a Royal house, Begum Hazrat Mahal did not surrender to them.

After the outbreak was quelled, the Queen of England issued a proclamation to appease the people of British India. As a response to this, Begum Hazrat Mahal issued a

counter-proclamation and warned the people not to have faith in these promises "for it is the unvarying custom of the English never to forgive a fault be it great or small." The Begum tried to come back to India in 1877 but orders were issued, whereby any request made by either Birjis Qadir or his mother to enter British India would not be entertained. The Government of India put up a condition that if they did enter the territory of the British Government they would not receive any assistance or allowance from the Government and would be under the surveillance of the magistrate of the district in which they might take up a residence.



Anurag Kashyap returns to children's film with 'Little Thomas'



Filmmaker Anurag Kashyap is returning to the children's film genre after 17 years with his new production, 'Little Thomas'. It is set to premiere at the Indian Film Festival of Melbourne.

Filmmaker Anurag Kashyap, known for his globally acclaimed titles like 'Gangs of Wasseypur' and 'Kennedy', is ready with his next production venture 'Little Thomas'. The film is headlined by Gulshan Devaiah and Rasika Dugal, and also features child artist Hridansh Parekh.

'Little Thomas' is set to have its world premiere at the upcoming Indian Film Festival of Melbourne (IFFM). Besides Kashyap, the film is backed by Ranjan Singh, Rajnikant Oza, Charu Oza, Anushka Shah and Kabir Ahuja.

In 'Little Thomas', Kashyap was impressed by the vision of the National Award-winning director Kaushal Oza, who made his feature directorial debut with the film. It follows the tragicomic efforts of a seven-year-old boy to bring his parents together and have a little brother.

Kashyap said, "I had seen Kaushal's short 'The Miniaturist of Junagadh' and liked it. Then I read 'Little Thomas' script and understood his vision for it. He wanted to make a genuine children's film while creating a world from a kid's perspective. The honesty of his approach has helped make the film."

Set in the Goa of the 90s,

the film follows Thomas, the only child of his parents, who desperately wants a little brother. "One day, he is told that to get a baby brother his parents will have to kiss. Since his quarrelling parents won't kiss any longer, little Thomas takes it upon himself to make them do the yucky act!" the film's synopsis reads. The film will also mark Kashyap's return to children's films after his animated directorial 'Return of Hanuman' (2007). "Yes, it's been a while. Maybe I was waiting for a good children's film script to come my way. It's a difficult genre actually, to make an authentic children's film, so one has to ensure that it's a good script before making it," the filmmaker added.

Actor Gulshan Devaiah, who made his debut in Anurag Kashyap's 'That Girl in Yellow Boots' and went on to collaborate with him on projects like 'Shaitan' and 'Huntern', describes Little Thomas as a film that 'puts a smile on my face'. "It's a sweet, cute film, and I am thrilled it's going to be showing at IFFM. The most special thing about Little Thomas is its story and the beautiful innocence in its world. Rasika is a wonderful actor, who I've admired for a while now. She's very professional and dedicated to the craft. I was lucky I got to work with her," Gulshan said. Calling Little Thomas 'a beautiful and lyrical story' about the simple life of a Goan family, actor Rasika

Dugal said, "I was drawn to the script of 'Little Thomas' because I felt it was a beautiful and simple story yet wasn't simplistic. Technology has given us so much to play within filmmaking that sometimes, I feel the soul of a film gets drowned in the razzmatazz." She added, 'Little Thomas' was not doing any of that. It was committed to its narrative without any unnecessary frills. Also, the script had an interesting sense of humour, which I enjoyed very much. I am delighted that the film is premiering at IFFM, and it will first be watched by the kind of audience that a festival like IFFM always attracts - a discerning audience with an ample appetite for fun. I am looking forward

to how they will respond to our film." Director Kaushal Oza, an alumnus of the Film and Television Institute of India, shared that the team auditioned over 700 kids to find Thomas and the gang. He added, "Everyone has been a seven-year-old once in their lives. When we grow up we miss the innocence of the times we were kids. I wanted to capture the innocence and imagination that we had then and yearn for now. Everyone who read the script loved it, but producing a film like this is a challenge. When this team of producers read the script - they laughed, they cried - they backed it to the hilt. Also, casting the kids was the biggest challenge."

'Bad Newz' box office Day 4: Vicky-Tripii's film shows massive drop on Monday

'Bad Newz' collected approximately Rs 3.5 crore on its first Monday, which was around a 68 per cent drop from its Sunday collection. 

Dealing with Monsoon Hair Problems

The air in the monsoon contains heavy moisture, leading to an increase in humidity and stickiness. This increases the probability of dandruff, hair fall and other problems too that causes hair follicles to swell, leading to increased

hair fall. If not taken care of immediately, hair fall increases by 30% during the monsoon months due to the changes in the climatic conditions. How your hair reacts to the rainy season depends on your hair type. People with dry hair may face visibly drier and duller hair, or those with oily hair may see even greasier strands.

Since humid air has a much higher quantity of water molecules, the hair strands absorb much more water than they usually would on non-humid days. The constant swelling and shrinking caused by hair strands absorbing and losing water damages the hair's structure, making it brittle and prone to breakage.

Say goodbye to hair woes with these herbal tips and hello to pleasant rainy days!

1--- Oil Therapy --- Sticky dandruff is another problem to contend with. The scales, along with oil and sweat secretions, tend to stick to the

scalp. Rich conditioners and hair styling products can also lead to a build-up on the scalp. For sticky dandruff, hot oil therapy is useful. Heat sesame seed oil or olive oil and apply it on the scalp with cotton wool, rubbing gently to dislodge the flakes. Then dip a towel in hot water, squeeze out the water and wrap the hot towel around the head, like a turban. Keep it on for 5 minutes. Repeat the hot towel wrap 3 or 4 times. This helps the hair and scalp absorb the oil better. Leave the oil on overnight. Next morning, apply the juice of a lemon on the scalp and wash your hair after 20 minutes. You can also add 5 drops of Tea Tree Oil to a mug of water and use it as a last rinse.

2 --- Coconut Oil - The best source of moisturising your hair during monsoon is coconut oil. The use of natural coconut oil nourishes the scalp strengthens hair roots, and provides a protective

layer against external damage. Massage the scalp with slightly warm oil for about 15 minutes, let it sit for about an hour/overnight and then wash it off with lukewarm water. Follow this up with Conditioner to give your hair a deep herbal conditioning with the goodness of Ayurveda. If you are

more frequently during the Monsoons. Use less shampoo and rinse well with water. Then, have a tea water and lemon rinse for silky and shiny hair. Include lean meats, fish, egg, dal, beans, fruits, sprouts, vegetables and whole grains. Consult your doctor before making changes in the diet. Vitamin C, Zinc, Omega 3 fatty acids are all necessary for healthy hair growth. Vitamin C is available in oranges, lemons, tomatoes, papaya, grapefruit, cabbage and cauliflower. Zinc is plentiful in seafood, mushrooms, green leafy vegetables and wholegrain cereals. Omega 3 fatty acids are essential fatty acids, available in fish, plant and nut oils, and seaweeds. Cut down on aerated drinks, fried foods, and too much salt and

sugar. Dull, lifeless hair can be a sign of a poor diet. Take a small bowl of sprouts daily. Sprouts contain amino acids, which are very beneficial to the hair. Include fresh fruits, raw salads, leafy green vegetables, whole grains and curd in the daily diet. Drink 6 to 8 glasses of water daily. Drink freshly extracted juices of fruits and vegetables, adding enough water to them. Add the juice of a lemon to a glass of water and have it first thing in the morning. Ask your doctor to prescribe vitamin and mineral supplements. Another problem is that of bad odour from the scalp during the humid season. Wash your hair at least four times a week. Rinse thoroughly with water. For a fragrant hair rinse, add the juice of a lemon and half a cup of rose water to a mug of water and use it as a last rinse after washing the hair.

"Don't Go To Manipur": US State Department Revises India Travel Advisory

Washington: The US has asked its nationals not to travel to Manipur, Jammu and Kashmir, the India-Pakistan border, and parts of central and eastern parts of the country where Naxalites are active. In a revised travel advisory for India, the State Department said it has updated to reflect information on the northeastern states. "Exercise increased caution in India due to crime and terrorism. Some areas have increased risk," it said. Overall India has been placed at Level 2. But several parts of the country have been placed on Level 4: Jammu and Kashmir, India-Pak border, Manipur and parts of Central and East India. "Do not travel to: The union territory of Jammu and Kashmir (except the eastern Ladakh region and its capital, Leh) due to terrorism and civil unrest; within 10 km of the India-Pakistan border due to the potential for armed conflict; portions of Central and East India due to terrorism and Manipur due to violence

and crime," said the State Department. In addition, it recommended Americans to reconsider travel to the northeastern states due to terrorism and violence. "Indian authorities report that rape is one of the fastest growing crimes in India. Violent crime, such as sexual assault, has happened at tourist sites and other locations. Terrorists may attack with little or no warning. They target tourist locations, transportation hubs, markets/shopping malls, and government facilities," the travel advisory said. The US government has limited ability to provide emergency services to US citizens in rural areas. These areas stretch from eastern Maharashtra and northern Telangana through western West Bengal. The US government employees must get special authorization to travel to these areas, it said. Placing Manipur at "Level 4: Do Not

Travel", the State Department said: "Do not travel to Manipur due to the threat of violence and crime. Ongoing ethnic-based civil conflict has resulted in reports of extensive violence and community displacement. Attacks against Indian government targets occur on a regular basis. US government employees travelling in India require prior approval before visiting Manipur." Similarly, terrorist attacks and violent civil unrest are possible in the union territory of Jammu and Kashmir. "Do not travel to this state (with the exception of visits to the eastern Ladakh region and its capital, Leh). Violence happens sporadically in this area and is common along the Line of Control (LOC) between India and Pakistan. It also occurs in tourist spots in the Kashmir Valley: Srinagar, Gulmarg, and Pahalgam. The Indian government does not allow foreign tourists to visit certain areas along the LOC," it said.

The Foreign Secretary will travel on from India to the ASEAN Foreign Ministers' meeting in Laos where he will advance UK economic partnerships and unveil new cooperation on climate and health.

Kendrapara villages suffer due to illegal prawn gheries

Kendrapara(KCN): The Centre issued a notification in June this year declaring 205 villages in Kendrapara and adjoining Bhadrak districts as eco-sensitive villages. However, the mushrooming of prawn gheries has posed serious threats to the survival of 147 of the villages in this district. Over 10,000 prawn gheries have illegally mushroomed in Mahakalpara, Rajnagar and Rajkanika blocks of this district, sources stated here, Tuesday. The most affected is the Mahakalpara block where illegal prawn farms have come up on hundreds of acres of land in Badatubi locality. These are adversely affecting the environment of 147 villages including Banapada, Bhuinpur, Gogua, Ishanipala, Haripur, Kajalabandha, Kalatunga, Kakatpur, Koriapala, Narasinghpur, Maladiha, Paunsiapala, Ratapanga, Sankhachita, Sasan, Singarpur, Tantiapala, Benakanda,

Telanga and Panikhia. The toxic chemical effluents discharged by these gheries are not only polluting the environment but also harming human habitats, wildlife and marine creatures. Aviators and motor pumps used in these gheries are producing deafening sounds disturbing the natural tranquility and affecting wildlife inside the Bhitarkanika Wildlife Sanctuary. Various types of pesticides used in gheries are now harming marine as well as animal life, locals pointed out. The district administration's silence on this issue is quite surprising as it has repeatedly been pulled up by the Orissa High Court. Sources informed that the Odisha government's endeavour in promoting brackish water aquaculture is aiding in the development of illegal prawn gheries. Locals alleged that the illegal mushrooming of prawn gheries is in complete violation of the Environment Protection



Act 1986. Pratap Kumar Mohanty, the district convener of Odisha Suchana Adhikar Avijan (OSAA) said that the Orissa High Court has been repeatedly issuing orders for demolition of prawn gheries since 2017. It has even appointed advocate Mohit Agarwal as the Amicus Curiae in the matter. Initially armed with the high court order, the district administration issued notices to the

prawn farmers and launched a demolition drive. However, suddenly the drive was suspended and no proper reason was ordered. Many alleged that the officials of the district administration are in collusion with the illegal prawn farm owners and look after their interests only. Environmentalist Lakshmidhar Swain alleged that the illegal mushrooming of prawn

gheries is in complete violation of the guidelines of the Central

Empowered Committee (CEC) formed by the Water Resources and

Forest departments, Coastal Aquaculture Authority (CAA) and Orissa High Court. The environment in these 147 villages have turned toxic due to rampant use of prawn feed, medicines and chemical fertilizers, Swain pointed out. Local intellectual Lakshmikanta Nayak said the use of sub-standard motor pumps and aviators has resulted in 11 mishaps in the prawn gheries in the last three years. The accidents have claimed lives of one person each from Rajkanika and Rajnagar blocks while several others have suffered serious injuries. When contacted,

subcollector Rabindra Kumar Pradhan said the eviction drive against the illegal prawn gheries has not stopped. He said recently illegal gheries on more than 170 acres of land in Mahakalpara and Rajkanika blocks have been demolished. Moreover, the concerned tehsildars in each tehsil are identifying the illegal prawn gheries and demolishing them systematically, Pradhan informed. He added that efforts are on to put a curb on illegal prawn farming so that the environment can be protected.

DMF lifeline for Sundargarh youths



Sundargarh(KCN): The district mineral foundation (DMF) is playing a prominent role in training youths of this district and then helping them to get employment, a source stated here Tuesday. It has been going on for the past few years after the DMF realised that more and more youths of the district are migrating to other states for work. Hence the DMF decided to embark on a mission of skill development for the youth. Once the youths are trained, they can get jobs with companies in this mineral-rich district, sources said. In the past few years, a large number of youths have benefitted from the scheme and now have lucrative jobs, the sources added. To achieve its goal of

providing jobs to youths, DMF (Sundargarh) tied up with various partners to identify and train talented youths for employment in various blocks of this district. The DMF on behalf of the district administration has signed agreements with reputed educational institutions like the State Institute of Hotel Management at Bolangir, Central Institute of Plastic Engineering and Technology at Rourkela, Central Tool Room Training Centre in Bhubaneswar and the Micro Small and Medium Enterprises institutes in this town and Kalunga. The DMF takes care of all the costs including the course and hostel fees of the youths selected. Once their training is complete, DMF helps them in getting a suitable job. A total of 54 youths underwent skill-

development training at the Central Tool Room Training Centre. Out of them, so far 26 have got jobs in FY 2023-24. Similarly, 260 of the 480 youths, who underwent training at the Central Institute of Plastic Engineering and Technology, have also been employed by various companies. The DMF entered into a partnership with the State Institute of Hotel Management in 2021. Those selected to the institute were trained in various skills including food services, housekeeping and attending to guests in hotel rooms. Out of the 50 who received training, 39 have got jobs in hotels both in Odisha and outside the state. The Micro Small and Medium Enterprises institutes here and in

Kalunga provide training in various subjects including fashion designing, nursing and taking care of senior citizens and courses on telecom technology. Out of the 870 trained, 288 have got jobs. Many of the youths who have benefitted from the schemes launched by the DMF are getting salaries ranging from Rs 15,000 to Rs 50,000 per month. Many other trained youths have gone in for self-employment and started small businesses on their own. Some of them are indeed doing well, sources pointed out. The DMF has become a beacon for many youths in this district. The work being done by DMF has been appreciated at all levels in this district.

Govt evacuates over 10,000 people ahead of missile test at ITR

Balasore(KCN): Over 10,500 people from 10 villages residing around the testing range Launch Complex-III of the Integrated Test Range (ITR) would be evacuated, Wednesday for a missile test, official sources said, Tuesday. The shifting of residents would begin at 4 AM and

they would be lodged in four earmarked temporary shelters till the completion of the testing procedure, official sources said. This was decided at a meeting held here under the Chairmanship of district Superintendent of Police Sagarika Nath. She said for the evacuation and other duties 22 sections of the

police force and 10 officers would be deployed. The compensation to the registered evacuees would be paid through the bank accounts. The district administration has established a control room to monitor the activities. The number of residents who would be temporarily shifted in the 3.5-kilometer

India confirm semifinal berth as Shafali, bowlers lead rout of Nepal

New Delhi: India finished their league assignments with a 100 percent win record by registering a crushing 82-run win over Nepal in Dambulla on Tuesday (July 23), thus confirming their semifinal spot. Pakistan, who beat UAE earlier in the day, were also confirmed as the second semi-finalist from Group A. Shafali Verma's robust 48-ball 81 and her 122-run opening stand with Dayalan Hemalatha (47 off 42) set the platform for India's batting performance that did taper off after the openers fell. However, the total of 178 still proved to be far too many for Nepal as Deepti Sharma (3-13) and Radha Yadav (2-12) starred with the ball for India. The difference: Experience and skills

across departments. Despite resting regular captain Harmanpreet Kaur and Pooja Vastrakar, India still had enough in the tank to outclass Nepal comfortably. The gulf in class and experience was visible, as India were barely tested. To their credit, Nepal with their limited resources and inexperience, put on a fight. Especially with the ball as they prevented India from posting a bigger total than they eventually did, more so after the century opening stand. But those minor moral victories were all that Nepal could muster as India eased past them. Stand-in captain Smriti Mandhana decided to give the other players a chance to get a hit in the middle. It meant a new opening pair for India as Dayalan Hemalatha

strode out to open with Shafali Verma. The latter was at her fluent best, stroking a couple of boundaries in the opening over to set the tone. Shafali seemed at ease with her gameplay but Hemalatha struggled for timing, at times trying too hard to muscle the ball. It meant that a few loose balls went unpunished, but India still managed a solid start to the game. If Nepal expected some respite with the field restrictions lifted, they were wrong as the innings gathered further momentum after the powerplay. Shafali continued to plunder boundaries at will and also slog-swept a maximum off Rubina Chhetry. Hemalatha also struck a maximum during this phase although she never managed to get any rhythm to her



innings. She even got a reprieve in the 12th over against Sita Rana Magar who eventually got the opener in her next over, caught at long-on. The dismissal had little effect on Shafali who smashed two boundaries off the next over to keep India's progress going.

It's not often that a run rate of over 9-runs-per-over at the death is considered satisfactory but given the match situation and opposition, Nepal did a decent job. It helped their cause that Shafali fell in the 16th over, stumped off a wild slog when a century

seemed there for the taking. Her dismissal caused a slowdown and if not for Jemimah Rodrigues' 15-ball 28, India would have had a bigger implosion in the death overs. Her deft touch with the bat gave a few boundaries to push the total past the 175-run mark. Given that India were poised for a 190-200 range total for most part of their innings, Nepal had done a decent job at the back end. The total, though, was still daunting. In-form opener Samjhana Khadka started the chase with a bang by flicking Renuka Singh over mid-wicket for a boundary first ball but the opener fell in the next over, castled by Arundhati Reddy. An over later, Kabita Kunwar perished to Renuka Singh. Nepal skipper Indu Barma and

all-rounder Sita Rana Magar picked up a few boundaries in the powerplay but the rate of score in general was too low to bother India. With a daunting total to chase, a weak powerplay meant that Nepal's chase was going nowhere. Their realistic ambition seemed to be to bat out the overs and the lack of intent allowed India's bowlers to dominate. Arundhati Reddy once again struck timber when she removed Sita Rana Magar while Deepti Sharma struck twice in an over to remove Rubina Chhetry and Kabita Joshy. Only three fours came during the middle overs as Deepti along with Radha Yadav put the squeeze on. Rubina, though, smashed a six before falling to Deepti. The cluster of wickets meant that Nepal

weren't going to avoid a heavy defeat. The game was over as a contest long back and it was only a question of whether Nepal would manage to bat out their overs or not. Bindu Rawal's unbeaten 19-ball 17 ensured that they did. She also struck three boundaries in the process, the only ones Nepal managed in the last five overs, as the innings meandered to a drab finish. Deepti and Radha helped themselves to a wicket each during this phase but Nepal's last-wicket pair managed to see off the stipulated 20 overs. Want to be as ruthless as we can as a batting unit - Pope

New Delhi, (KCN): After two fantastic victories that handed them a much-needed series win, England vice-captain Ollie Pope has called upon his batters to be 'more ruthless' in how they approach the game. "I feel that everyone has kind of grown into their roles and now there's a real hunger," Pope said in the lead-up to the third and final Test against West Indies in Birmingham. "There always is a hunger, but now there's an extra bit in that batting line-up and now we feel like we can go on to do even better things. "At the time it was about building confidence; now it's about hopefully we can keep becoming more



and more ruthless." The second Test at Trent Bridge was the first time England crossed 400 in both innings of a Test match. "We put on just over 400 in the third innings of the game and had we not done that it might've been a closer affair in the end," Pope said. "We want to be as ruthless as we can as a batting unit, but still

play the way we do because that's our natural game. But being ruthless is being part of Test cricket as well." Pope feels his team can maybe notch up "500 to 600" runs in three sessions on a good day. "I got asked on Day 1... 'Do you get told to play like that?'" Pope said. "No, we don't. It's just our natural games

and the way we go about it. Sometimes we might score 280-300 in a day but that's okay and probably because we're reading situations. There might also be a day where we go and get 500 to 600 at some point in the future as well. And that's a cool thing to have." Coming off a tough tour of India, where England's 4-1 series defeat belied their fight, this series must have come as a huge relief for Ben Stokes' team as they look forward to competing in an away Ashes next year. "There was obviously a lot said after the India series...", Pope said. "I think winning can become a habit and the

way we've gone about these two games is high class and that's shown in the results so far." Pope also reflected on his own batting. The 26-year-old scored his sixth Test century in the first innings in Nottingham, followed by a half-century in the second. He also had a fifty in the first Test at Lord's. "I actually felt I played better in the second innings [at Trent Bridge]," Pope said. "I got dropped twice in the first innings, one I actually creamed anyway. I didn't feel quite at my best but I felt pretty good. And I felt pretty good at Lord's last week as well so I'm happy to make it count in this game. Got that bit of luck and was able to cash in."

Paris Olympics 2024, football: New Zealand report Canada to IOC after drone incident

New Delhi: New Zealand has raised a complaint about Canada to the international Olympic Committee after the women's football team's training was disrupted by a drone. The drone operator was found to be a member of the Canada women's football team. Canada and New Zealand will lock horns during the Olympics on July 25. New Zealand's Olympic Committee (NZOC) reported that their women's soccer team experienced a disruption during a training session due to a drone operated by a staff member from the Canadian team, whom they are set to play against in Group A on Thursday. The NZOC promptly reported the incident to the International Olympic Committee's (IOC) integrity unit. The NZOC said that a

drone was flown over the training session on July 22 and the incident was immediately reported to the police. This was followed by the detention of a support member of the Canada team, who was the operator of the drone. "On July 22, a drone was flown over the New Zealand women's football team training session in St Etienne," the NZOC said on Tuesday. "Team support members immediately reported the incident to police, leading to the drone operator, who has been identified as a support staff member of the wider Canadian Women's football team, to be detained." Following this, Team Canada issued an apology and launched an investigation into the matter. The Canadian Olympic Committee acknowledged the incident, specifying that it

involved "a non-accredited member of the Canada Soccer support team." They stated that they are currently "reviewing next steps with the IOC, Paris 2024, Canada Soccer, and FIFA." In a statement they released, the Canadian Olympic Committee said they stand for fair-play and are shocked and disappointed with what has happened. "The Canadian Olympic Committee stands for fair-play and we are shocked and disappointed. We offer our heartfelt apologies to New Zealand Football, to all the players affected and to the New Zealand Olympic Committee," they said in a statement. Canada and New Zealand will lock horns during the Olympics on July 25 in their opening match. Both teams are in Group A, which also has France and Colombia.

Morata and Rodri charged by UEFA for provocative Gibraltar chants

New Delhi: Spain's Alvaro Morata and Rodrigo Hernandez have been placed under investigation by UEFA's ethics and disciplinary committee on charges of singing provocative chants about Gibraltar during their Euro 2024 title celebrations. Spain's Euro 2024 winning skipper Alvaro Morata and Player of the tournament winner Rodri have been placed under investigation by UEFA's ethics and disciplinary committee for their chants about Gibraltar. The duo were spotted singing chants about Gibraltar being a part of Spain and not the UK during Spain's Euro title celebrations in Madrid on July 15. Celebrating their glory after Spain secured a 2-1 victory over England in the European Championship final held in Berlin, Morata and Rodri sang "Gibraltar is



Spanish" during a public celebration in Madrid. Gibraltar, a British territory at the southern tip of Spain, was the focal point of the chant. In response to the incident, Gibraltar's Football Association lodged a formal complaint with UEFA, prompting the appointment of an ethics and disciplinary inspector to determine if the chant violated any regulations. Upon the result of the initial investigation held

by UEFA, both Rodri and Morata face multiple charges that include breaching the basic rules of decent conduct, violating general principles of conduct, using sporting events for non-sporting manifestations, and bringing the sport of football into disrepute. It was only July 19, when UEFA reacted upon Gibraltar's initial complaint by declaring the investigation

procedure against the Spanish duo. On July 15, the day after Spain secured a 2-1 victory over England in the European Championship final held in Berlin, Morata and Rodri sang "Gibraltar is Spanish" during a public celebration in Madrid. Gibraltar, a British territory at the southern tip of Spain, was the focal point of the chant. regulations," the initial UEFA statement read. Upon this recent development, Gibraltar FA have also released a statement where they have welcomed the investigation on Rodri and Morata by UEFA. "The Gibraltar FA welcomes the announcement today that UEFA has decided to open formal disciplinary proceedings against Rodri and Alvaro Morata further to the complaint filed by the Gibraltar FA with UEFA. This is an important first step in order to establish the unlawfulness of the chant on the basis of the grounds put forward by the Gibraltar FA in its complaint," the statement read. It is yet to be disclosed about what kind of punishment the Spanish duo might be slammed with, which could range from a hefty fine to at least a double-match ban.

MCA elects its youngest-ever president as Ajinkya Naik defeats Sanjay Naik

Mumbai: Mumbai Cricket Association (MCA) has elected its youngest president as Ajinkya Naik (37) has defeated Sanjay Naik to take over the reins of the association. He won the election by 107 votes, getting a tally of 221 votes to Sanjay Naik's 114. Both the Naiks were incumbent office-bearers of the Association. Ajinkya joins the galaxy of individual stalwarts like Sharad Pawar, Vilasrao Deshmukh, Ashish Shelar, and Manohar Joshi among others. "Mr Pawar has been an inspiration and leader who went on to become BCCI and ICC head," Ajinkya said after the unexpected win against Sanjay. While Ajinkya



was the secretary of the association, Sanjay is the current vice-president. The election was necessitated because of the untimely death of president Amol Kale.
