

Odisha CM Majhi visits Suando village after opening of all four gates of Puri Jagannath temple



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Thursday asserted that each promise made by the BJP in its election manifesto is 'Modi's guarantee' and that his government would solve issues affecting common people in villages. Majhi made the assertion while visiting the

birthplace of Utkalmani Gopabandhu Das, an icon of the state, in Suando village in Puri district.

"We are concerned with the problems faced by people in rural areas as they were neglected during the previous government," Majhi told reporters.

Earlier in the day, Majhi

and his team had visited Puri where all four gates of the Jagannath temple were opened. Three of the gates were shut since the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020.

Majhi said the promises made by the BJP in its manifesto would be fulfilled in the next five years.

The BJP, in its election

manifesto, has promised a minimum support price (MSP) of Rs 3,100 for every quintal of paddy, piped water connection to all the households and pucca houses for the poor, among others.

The chief minister, accompanied by his deputies KV Singh Deo and Pravati Parida and

some other ministers, paid floral tributes at the statue of Utkalmani Gopabandhu Das. They met the villagers and discussed the issues faced by them. Majhi said his government would bring a 'Sambrudha Krushak Niti' within 100 days for the overall development of the farmers.

No evidence of paper leak in NEET-UG, corruption unfounded in NTA: Dharmendra Pradhan

New Delhi(KCN): Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan Thursday rejected allegations of paper leak in the medical entrance exam NEET-UG, saying there is no evidence to substantiate the claims and added that the government is ensuring no student is at a disadvantage.

The results of the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test-Undergraduate (NEET-UG) were announced by the National Testing Agency (NTA) June 4. "There is no evidence of paper leak in NEET-UG. The allegations of corruption in NTA are unfounded, it is a very credible body. It conducts exams for more than 50 lakh school students annually, besides exams at the higher education level," Pradhan told reporters after taking charge as Union education minister for the second time.

His comments came on a day the NTA told the Supreme court that the decision to award grace marks to 1,563 candidates in NEET-UG for admission to MBBS, BDS and other courses was cancelled and they would be given the option to take a re-test June 23.

"If these candidates do not wish to take the re-test, then their earlier



marks, sans the grace marks, will be given for the purpose of results. The grace marks that were awarded earlier were not at the whims and fancy of NTA but were based on a Supreme Court formula, there is a basis to those calculations. If there are certain anomalies, those will be rectified and we will ensure that no student is at a disadvantage," Pradhan said.

The NTA has come under criticism amid allegations of irregularities and inflation of marks in the medical entrance exam. The education ministry last week set up a four-member panel to review the grace marks awarded to 1,563 students to compensate them for "loss of time" due to delay in starting the examination at certain centres.

"The panel was headed by former UPSC (Union Public Service Commission) chairman

Pradeep Kumar Joshi and included the National Medical Commission (NMC) secretary, besides others. Each and every grievance has been reviewed and then only the panel made its recommendations," Pradhan added.

The Supreme Court Tuesday noted that the sanctity of NEET-UG, 2024, had been affected, a charge denied by the NTA. The top court, however, refused to stay the counselling process for admissions.

"If the candidates, out of the 1,563, do not wish to take up the retest then their earlier marks, sans the grace marks, will be given for the purposes of the results," the Centre informed the apex court on Thursday.

"The results of the retest will be declared on June 30 and counselling for admissions in MBBS, BDS and other courses will start on July 6," it said.

Odisha CMO to temporarily operate from the State Guest House

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The State Guest House is the temporary address of the office of Odisha's new Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi. With the permanent office of Chief Minister Majhi yet to be readied, the first floor of the guest house has been transformed into his temporary office.

A day after being sworn in as the BJP's new Chief Minister of Odisha, Mohan Charan Majhi, his Council of Ministers and other party leaders visited Srimandir and sought the blessings of Lord Jagannath and His siblings. In their presence, the four gates of Srimandir were opened for the devotees. On his return from Puri, he went straight to the State Guest House. There he met several government officers and leaders of different parties. Housing and Urban Development Secretary, Government of Odisha, G Mathi Vathanan also met the CM and had a brief discussion with him.

Ajit Doval Reappointed NSA, PK Mishra to Stay Principal Secretary To PM

New Delhi(KCN): Ajit Doval has been reappointed as the National Security Advisor and PK Mishra as the Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister with effect from June 10, the government said today.

In statements announcing the appointments, the government said they will be "co-terminus with the term of the Prime Minister or until further orders, whichever is earlier". This means that the officials will be in their posts until Narendra Modi is the Prime Minister, or until further orders.

Both Mr Doval and Mr Mishra will be assigned the rank of a cabinet minister in the table of precedence during their term in office, the statements said.

The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has also approved the reappointment of Amit Khare and Tarun Kapoor as advisors to the PM, in the Prime Minister's Office, for



two years with effect from June 10. They are being appointed "in the rank and scale of Secretary to Government of India".

The appointments reflect the trust the Prime Minister has in these officers, especially Mr Doval and Mr Mishra, who have been in their very important posts for many years now.

Mr Doval, a former director of the Intelligence Bureau, is one of the Prime Minister's most trusted aides and has been the National Security Advisor since 2014. The 1968-batch IPS official, who belonged to the Kerala cadre, was the first policeman to be decorated with the Kirti Chakra, the second-

highest peacetime gallantry award behind Ashok Chakra.

As the man in charge of the national security establishment, which includes all anti-terror and intelligence outfits, he is among the most powerful officers in the country.

PK Mishra took over as the principal secretary to the Prime Minister in 2019, replacing Nripendra Misra. A Gujarat cadre IAS officer from the 1972 batch, Mr Mishra was serving as the Additional Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister before that. He holds a PhD in Economics/Development Studies from the University of Sussex in England.

Postal department recruitment fraud: CBI conducts searches at 67 locations in Odisha

New Delhi(KCN): The CBI is conducting searches at 67 locations in Odisha in connection with an alleged recruitment fraud in the postal department, officials said Thursday. The CBI action comes on an year old complaint from the postal department alleging 63 candidates of the Gramin Dak Sevaks Exam allegedly submitted fake certificates.

Over 204 officials, including 122 officers

from the CBI and 82 personnel from other departments, swooped down at various premises in Kalahandi, Nuapada, Rayagada, Nabarangpur, Kandhamal, Kendujhar, Mayurbhanj, Balasore, and Bhadrak with an objective of uncovering the interstate organised gang responsible for providing these fake certificates.

"These certificates were

allegedly issued by the

Board of High School and

Intermediate Education,

Allahabad; West Bengal

Board, Kolkata; Jharkhand Academic

Council, Ranchi; among

others. The complaint suggests alleged involvement of an interstate racket in creating and supplying these forged certificates in collusion with the candidates," a CBI spokesperson said in a statement.

The searches are taking place nearly an year after the CBI registered an FIR on a complaint

from the postal department alleging 63 candidates of the Gramin Dak Sevak Exam, 2023 (Odisha Circle) submitted forged or fake 10th pass certificates.

The postal department was recruiting for 1,382 posts of Gramin Dak Sevak (GDS), for which it had invited online applications January 27, 2023 keeping the minimum qualification to be 10th pass from a recognised board, with proficiency in the local language being mandatory.

The aspirants were required to submit online their certificates and mark sheets on a centralised server, they said. "Selection was automated based on the marks secured in the

10th standard. Selected candidates were informed via SMS and email and asked to report to the verifying authority within 15 days for document verification prior to their appointment," the CBI spokesperson said.

The verification of certificates by the Odisha postal circle showed that 63 candidates from various postal divisions, including Baleswar, Mayurbhanj, Kalahandi, and Barhampur, had submitted forged or fake 10th pass certificates.

National Anthem Made Compulsory Across All Schools In Jammu And Kashmir

Srinagar(KCN): The School Education Department of Jammu and Kashmir has directed all schools in the Union Territory to start the morning assembly with the national anthem.

The Principal Secretary to the Government, School Education Department, through a circular directed all schools to make the morning assembly uniform across the Union Territory.

"Morning assembly should begin with the National Anthem as per standard protocol," the circular, issued on Wednesday, read.

The department said the morning assemblies have proved to be an invaluable ritual in instilling a sense of unity and discipline among the students.

"They (assemblies) serve as platforms to nurture the values of moral integrity, shared community and mental tranquility. However, it has been observed that such a significant ritual/ tradition is not being carried out uniformly across various schools of JK UT," the circular, which suggested 16 steps for the schools to follow.

The department suggested inviting guest speakers, creating awareness about




environment, and against the drug menace, as some of the steps for schools to include in the morning assemblies.

Expats review: Nicole Kidman leads an excellent ensemble in Prime Video's evocative miniseries

Women are at war with their husbands, children at war with their parents, and men at war with themselves in *Expats*, the ambitious new miniseries on Prime Video, created and directed by Lulu Wang. The director burst onto the scene with her masterful 2019 film *The Farewell*, a semi-autobiographical drama about a young American woman reconnecting with her Chinese roots over a short trip to the mainland. Based on the novel by Janice YK Lee, *Expats* provides a peek inside the (privileged) lives of several similarly unmoored characters, as they struggle to hold on to their identities in contemporary Hong Kong — a melting pot of cultures currently experiencing major upheaval. Wang doesn't ignore the political backdrop against which this story of deception and despair is set, as she weaves a compelling human drama around a rather pulpy plot that revolves around the

disappearance of a small child. Often, *Expats* feels like it's in conflict with itself, juggling two tonally disparate narratives — a delicate story about grief and forgiveness, and a thriller not unlike *Big Little Lies*, with which it shares star and executive producer Nicole Kidman. Kidman plays Margaret, a wealthy American woman who lives with her husband and their children in a fancy apartment complex. Her neighbour is Hilary, an Indian-American trapped in a loveless marriage to an Englishman named David. Uniting Margaret and Hilary through the most unfortunate of circumstances is Mercy, a young Korean-American running away from her past by taking up odd jobs in Hong Kong. At a boat party one day, Mercy's easy bond with Margaret's kids gets her hired as their babysitter. Soon afterwards, they go shopping at a night market, where Margaret

leaves the youngest of her three children, Gus, in Mercy's care. But due to a momentary lapse in concentration, Gus wiggles away from Mercy, and is instantly consumed by the sea of humanity around them. This is the show's inciting incident in many ways, but Wang shows it only in episode two. *Expats* takes a *Big Little Lies* approach in episode one, setting up scandalous interpersonal dynamics and then working its way backwards. Why, for instance, is there a wall between Margaret and Hilary? Why does Margaret recoil in shock

the second she lays eyes on Mercy at a fancy cocktail party? And why does her husband, Clarke, break down in tears on his own birthday? It's all a little camp, admittedly. But the tone shifts in episode two, yanking the high drama back down to earth. By the time the show's standout episode — number five — rolls around, you're hooked. This is what Wang is building towards. At an hour and 40 minutes long, and framed in a more cinematic aspect ratio, episode five offers not only a more grounded narrative, but also a shift

in perspective. It's presented through the point-of-view of several house maids who were until then only background players. These characters are expatriates as well, having landed in Hong Kong from countries like the Philippines and Malaysia, with a fraction of the resources that their bosses came with. We learn that Hilary is actually Harpreet Kaur, and that she hasn't forgiven her abusive father for the violence that he inflicted upon her mom. These are emotionally caged characters, and often, the show dramatises their inner turmoil by trapping them inside physical spaces. Almost an entire episode, for instance, is dedicated to Hilary and her visiting Punjabi mother locked inside a lift, forced to unpack past trauma over a box of 'pinnis'. We learn that Hilary is actually Harpreet Kaur, and that she hasn't forgiven her abusive father for the violence that he inflicted upon her mom.

I love theatre more because the budgets are not so extravagant, it gives you a different insight into different stories, and it kind of expands your mind when you watch a play. As far as earning your bread and butter out of theatre is concerned, well, it depends on how lavishly you want to earn. But yes, for an

actor, film, and television is more rewarding than theatre.

So what else is happening on the career front apart from the play?

I have done two web series. I decided to get back to acting after my daughter went to college. Fortunately, I am getting good offers too for acting rather than the run-of-the-mill like 'Beta tumne khana khaya' type roles. I started with theatre and then did TV and then films. So for me, the medium doesn't matter at all. Talks are on for films and TV shows too but it is too early to say anything. I want to get fully active again in acting - that's the plan!

Natural Ways to Lighten Dark Underarms



The underarm area rarely gives us any trouble but are major cause of embarrassing and frustrating during summer season. Dark underarms sometimes forces us to stop

wearing favourite sleeveless top or going out for a swim?

The skin in this area is very sensitive and is susceptible to a variety of problems like rashes, pigmentation, infection, ingrown hair, and even pimples due to use of skin products which contains chemicals. The excessive use of deodorants causes discoloration and dead cells accumulate in the underarm area and cause darkness. Darkening of the skin under the arms is

common. This may be caused by reaction to antiperspirants, deodorants or some hair removal creams. There can be a reaction to alcohol or certain perfumes in deodorants. Shaving can also cause darkening of the skin. The other reasons may be perspiration, sun-exposure or hereditary factors. Dark skin under the arms poses a problem where clothes and grooming are concerned, making it impossible to wear sleeveless or strappy dresses.

The good news is that regular use of herbal remedies can lighten and brighten dark underarms in few months time. Home remedies for lightening under-arm skin colour:

Waxing is the best option, as it removes hair by the roots. As such, it is said to weaken the follicles over a period of time and thus discourage hair growth. The lemon and sugar mixture used by most beauty parlours also helps to lighten skin colour. Ready-to-use wax and waxing strips are also available, but getting your waxing done at a beauty

parlour may give better results.

For dark skin under the arms, mix gram flour (besan) with yogurt and a pinch of turmeric into a paste. Apply three times a week on the area and wash it off after half an hour. Yogurt contains lactic acid and helps to remove the dead cells

water after 15 minutes. Rice flour can be mixed with yogurt and used as a scrub under the arms. Apply the paste and leave on for 15 minutes. Then moisten the area and rub it gently on the skin, washing off with plain water. Rice flour helps to remove the dead cells along with their contained pigment.

Potato juice may be applied under the arms daily to make the skin colour lighter. Apply and leave on for 20 minutes. Wash off with plain water. Mix baking soda with

water into a paste and apply under the arms daily. Leave on for 5 minutes and wash off with water. Sesame seed (til) oil mixed with coconut oil can be applied and massaged daily. Sesame seed oil has SPF and helps in cases of sun-damaged skin. Coconut oil contains vitamin E, which benefits the skin and helps to lighten the skin colour.

You need to have at least 70% marks with Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics as main subjects. You will be required to clear the Psychological Tests, Group Discussion, and Personal Interview. This exam is conducted by SSB. When you complete the 4-year

Ms Rai is the wife of Sikkim Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang, whose party, Sikkim Krantikari Morcha (SKM), swept the recent elections, winning 31 of 32 Assembly seats as well as the lone Lok Sabha constituency in the state.

Mr Tamang is in Arunachal Pradesh to attend the swearing-in ceremony of Pema Khandu, who is returning as chief minister. Ms Rai, who was contesting the Assembly elections for the first time, had won with a margin of 5,302 votes. She had secured 71.6 per cent of the votes polled, second only to Chief Minister Tamang, who had got 72.18 per cent

of the votes in Soreng-Chakung.

While the reasons for her decision are not known, newly elected Speaker Mingma Norbu Sherpa, also from the SKM, accepted her resignation on Thursday. The Namchi-Singhthang constituency is now vacant. The development comes three days after at least two people died in flash flood in Namchi district.

Be Ready To Contest 225-250 Seats Maharashtra Polls: Raj Thackeray To MNS Workers

Mumbai (KCN): MNS chief Raj Thackeray today asked the party workers to be prepared to contest 225-250 out of the 288 seats of the Maharashtra assembly in the coming elections, a senior party leader said.

Talking to reporters after a meeting here, MNS leader Bala Nandaonkar said party functionaries will visit different regions of the state and give a report to Thackeray about election preparations. The Maharashtra Navnirman Sena or

MNS had declared support for the BJP-led NDA during the Lok Sabha elections. Raj Thackeray also campaigned for the NDA though his party was not in the fray anywhere.

"Raj Thackeray asked party workers to be prepared to contest 225 to 250 seats in the assembly elections," Nandaonkar said. Asked if the MNS would form alliance with the ruling Mahayuti coalition of the BJP-Shiv Sena-NCP or contest on its own, he said, "We are not holding any discussions right now.

And with whom we are going to hold talks?" "We have contested elections on our own till now. We will see what happens in the future, but if we have to prepare for the polls," Nandaonkar said, adding that every party has to expand.

Formed in 2006, the MNS contested its first assembly elections in 2009 and bagged 13 seats. Its performance in the 2014 and 2019 state polls, however, was lackluster with the party

bagging only one seat each time. Sandeep Deshpande, another party leader, said that at the meeting Thackeray noted that the Opposition's Maha Vikas Aghadi -- of which the Shiv Sena (UBT) is a part -- got anti-Narendra Modi votes in Muslim-dominated areas, but did not get much support in Marathi-speaking areas.

"So Marathi-speakers were angry with Uddhav Thackeray because he joined hands with the Congress and NCP (SP)," Deshpande said quoting Raj, implying that the MNS could get their votes.

For Elimination, Not Eligibility: Kanimozhi Underscores 'NEET Exit' Demand

New Delhi: Tamil Nadu has always done well with its own system of medical recruitment exam and should be exempt from the NEET-UG 2024 (National Eligibility cum Entrance Test), the ruling DMK's MP Kanimozhi told NDTV today amid headlines generated by the all-India exam over allegations of paper leak. Calling NEET an "elimination examination" and not an "eligibility exam", she said the state has been suffering a lot since it was introduced. "We don't have doctors in rural areas... the healthcare system is suffering because NEET was brought in,"



she added. Earlier today, the Centre told the Supreme Court that the scorecards of 1,563 NEET candidates who were given grace marks for a wrong question will be scrapped and they will be given an option to take a retest. The re-test will be held on June 23 and the results will be declared on June 30. Union Human Resource

Development minister Dharmendra Pradhan has asserted that there was no paper leak and the Centre's new decision will not place any student at a disadvantage.

Ms Kanimozhi, however, argued that while the NEET works for city students who are able to take advanced coaching, it places rural students of

Tamil Nadu at an immense disadvantage. "Everything cannot be centralised," she told NDTV in an exclusive interview. "Our doctors are doing very well all over the world and in Tamil Nadu. So many of our students, who should have rightfully got into medical colleges and especially students from underprivileged families and rural areas, are the worst sufferers," she said. With former Chief Minister M Karunanidhi building a Medical College in every district of Tamil Nadu, Ms Kanimozhi said those are the ones that should be taken out of the NEET system.

The party has passed a resolution in the assembly and sent it to President Droupadi Murmu for approval. The matter will also be raised in parliament once it begins, she said. When the NEET results were declared on June 4, as many as 67 students were found to have scored an unprecedented perfect 720. Six of them were from a centre in Haryana's Faridabad, raising suspicions of irregularities. Students started raising questions on the National Testing Agency (NTA), which conducts NEET, demanding a thorough investigation.

Ex Bureaucrats Amit Khare, Tarun Kapoor Reappointed Advisors To PM

New Delhi (KCN): Former bureaucrats Amit Khare and Tarun Kapoor have been reappointed as Prime Minister Narendra Modi's advisors in the Prime Minister's Office from June 10, the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances, and Pensions said in a press release.

The appointments have been made in the "rank and scale of Secretary to Government of India" for two years on a contractual basis, it said. Amit Khare is a 1985-batch retired Indian



Administrative Services officer of the Jharkhand cadre, while Mr Kapoor is

from the 1987 batch of the Himachal Pradesh cadre. Mr Kapoor was a former petroleum secretary and Mr Khare has served as Secretary

Badaghagara reservoir goes dry; water supply disrupted

Keonjhar(KCN): The drinking water supply to households in Keonjhar town has been severely disrupted after the reservoir created by Badaghagara dam on Machhakandana river in Keonjhar district dried up this summer season.

As a result, residents of the town have been going through horrid times as taps in their homes have stopped supplying drinking water. This has sparked resentment and anger among the town's inhabitants. This has come at a time when extreme heatwave and humidity this summer

season has made life intolerable for people. The situation might go out of hands if the heatwave sees no let-up and the area does not get rainfall in the coming days.

Badaghagara dam was built on the Machhakandana river in pre-Independence period when the former royals used to rule the district.

After construction of the dam, river water was lifted from the reservoir and supplied as drinking water to the residents in Keonjhar town. However, with passage of time, the water



retaining capacity of the reservoir has declined. It went completely dry this year leading to disruption in drinking water supply to the town households. Residents have failed to meet their drinking

water needs with a minimum water supply in their homes. The problem is not for a day or two but has been persisting for a long period due sharp decline in water level in the dam's reservoir.

The problem is mostly acute from Ward No. 1 to Ward No. 7. The residents in these wards are passing through a difficult time due to lack of drinking water supply to their households and are now dependent on

the tube wells in the area. However, getting even a bucket of water from the tube well is not an easy task as there is always a long queue of people waiting for their turn to fill water. Furthermore, most of

Nayak of Ward No. 7 said that he had never seen the river and the reservoir go completely dry in his life time. When contacted, Executive Engineer Narad Rath of Public Health and Engineering department said the department has been using a diesel motor pump to lift water from the reservoir after water level declined one and half months back due to lack of rainfall. He warned that it will be impossible to supply water to the households in coming days if the area does not experience rainfall soon.

Higher education goes haywire in Jharsuguda

Jharsuguda(KCN): Higher education has gone haywire in the industrially rich Jharsuguda district due to alleged apathy of the state government in establishment of government colleges. The district needs robust institutions for spread of higher education; however, the state government has not established a government college in the district yet. Furthermore, it is yet to accord government status to any existing college in the district. This has led to students being deprived of higher education. While well-off guardians are able to send their wards to Sambalpur, Bhubaneswar or elsewhere and admit them in major colleges for study, students belonging to marginalised communities and lower middle-class households are unable to get such scope of study.

Sources said the district has the oldest railway junction in the state and also contributes immensely to the state and Central exchequers. Moreover, the mineral-rich has no paucity of funds with crores of rupees lying unused with the District Mineral Foundation (DMF). Several seasoned



politicians have also represented the district in the state government from time to time. The district is a major business hub visited by entrepreneurs from across the country and outside. It is also well connected with various parts of the country after the establishment of the state's second airport five years back. However, the government's neglect highlights its apathetic attitude towards the district. Reports said Jharsuguda was carved out as a separate district from undivided Sambalpur in 1994 when the late Biju Patnaik was the Chief Minister of Odisha. The former CM had then assured to establish a government college in the district but the promise has remained unfulfilled. The district has three main colleges—Lakshmi Narayan College, Women's College and Brajarajnagar College which provide Plus II and Plus III courses. A long time has passed since the establishment of the separate Jharsuguda district but until recently, there was not a single college that provides post-graduation (PG) courses. After a student movement, PG courses were launched in five subjects at Lakshmi Narayan College recently. It was first started in the engineering school premises in the presence of former Chief Minister Rajendra Narayan Singhdeo, the then Jharsuguda MLA Murali Prasad Mishra, former Chief Minister Hemananda Biswal and thousands of people in 1969.

However, it has yet to receive government status. The Women's College established in 1982 is also yet to get government

recognition. The Brajarajnagar College is situated about 10 km from this district headquarters town. Established in 1978, it is now a fully-aided college but still lacks government status.

Similarly, the lone government engineering school in the district, established in 1955, is yet to be upgraded into a government engineering college. There are Plus II and Plus III colleges in four blocks of the district. Bhatalaida College, Basumati Science College at Samasingha, Jharianal College at Talamunda, Saheltikra College, Saligram Sakunia College at Talapatia, Indira Gandhi Women's College at Brajarajnagar and Dwarika Prasad Agarwal College at Bagmara only provide Plus II courses and lack good infrastructure. There are only two vocational colleges in the district. One of them is Kolabira Panchayat Samiti College and the other is Kirmira Sobhan Memorial College. There are three other private Plus II colleges. However, five blocks of the district are yet to witness any significant development in terms of college education.

Abandoned stone quarry turns into tribals' nightmare

Keonjhar(KCN): An unused stone quarry located close to Harichandanpur-Brahmanipal road near Bhalujodi village in Sagadapata panchayat of Harichandanpur block about 60 km from the district headquarters here has spread panic among the local tribals. About 10 years ago, a private firm excavated a 60-foot high hill and extracted stones for the construction of the Narapu-Brahmanipal road. After completing the road work, the firm left without filling the huge pit which is in complete violation of norms. The firm should have filled the pit and planted trees on it as per rules. Visiting the place has become a risky proposition now. The pit, now filled with rain water, has acquired the proportion of a lake. This manmade lake is over 60 feet deep and the turquoise

water is attracting hundreds of locals and visitors from outside. A stretch of the pool is used by the locals for fish farming and its water is used for irrigation. However, the possibility of accidents has grown manifold due to the lack of safety measures in and around this manmade lake. The spot witnesses frequent movement of animals as it is a forested area under the Anandapur Wildlife Division. It is alleged that many wild animals have drowned while drinking water from the lake. Neither a fence nor any warning sign has been installed around it by the administration for which many residents often visit the lake to bathe in it. The local children also dive into the lake for swimming. The tribals here are particularly worried because they are left to fend for themselves in a dangerous situation. If

the administration takes legal action against the concerned firm and decides to fill the pit, residents would be benefited. However, nothing is done to alleviate the fear among them. Locals said a big hill with lush green cover was present in the area. The livestock of the local villagers used to graze on the hill. However, the mining firm took the hill on lease and excavated it for stone mining. Villagers are worried because many of their livestock have fallen into the pit and died. Similarly, wild animals also move around in this area and there is every possibility of those falling into the pit leading to death, a local resident Madhab Murmu said. Locals alleged many of the villagers had their farmlands near the hill and the mining firm usurped

Nassau County stadium to get dismantled in six weeks

New Delhi: What will now happen to the Nassau County International Cricket Stadium and its challenging pitches? The answer is straightforward. The Pop Up Stadium, constructed in just 106 days, will take approximately six weeks to dismantle. That work actually began on Wednesday, right after the India-USA game concluded in the afternoon.

The Eisenhower Park, which housed the stadium and was transformed into a secure fortress for the games and spectators, will revert to its original state, with free public access to its muddy, grassy and dusty surfaces. The entries, strictly monitored and restricted for the last two weeks, will be free going forward.

As for the pitches, their fate is still uncertain. According to the International Cricket Council (ICC), it is up to

the Nassau County authorities. "If they want to keep them and handle the required maintenance, they can," said an ICC official.

Otherwise, the ICC will relocate the drop-in pitches, prepared in Florida with imported expertise from South Australia, which have been the subject of much discussion over the past two weeks, to a place where they will be needed. The outfield, however, will remain at its current location.

There were plans to host a few Major League Cricket (MLC) games at the stadium, but the MLC authorities and their franchises were not too enthused by that prospect. While there may be a full-fledged cricket stadium going forward in the future, it is unlikely to be here. For the record, New York is the base for the Mumbai Indians team (MI NY) in the MLC, and the Ambanis are expected to

build a new stadium in the near future.

Easy to chase or defend?

The pitches, which have been the talk of the cricket world for the last two weeks, have left the community puzzled over whether they favoured defending or chasing. On June 9, India successfully defended a modest 119 against Pakistan, and later, South Africa managed to stave off the Bangladesh challenge against their none-too-formidable total of 113. A

day after that, Pakistan comfortably cruised to a target of 107 runs. However, on Wednesday, India struggled to chase 111 until Suryakumar Yadav and Shivam Dube secured the win for Rohit Sharma's side.

For the record, teams batting first have won three of the eight games played at the ground, while teams chasing have won five times. The average first-innings



total was 108, with India recording the most successful chase by reaching 111 for three against the USA. Canada posted the highest total batting first, 137 for seven against Ireland, and defended it well, winning the game by 12 runs. When asked about the pitch conditions, Arshdeep Singh remained non-committal, but Dube expressed a preference for chasing, effectively supporting Rohit

Sharma's decision to field first against the USA.

Was the 5-run penalty fair?

The big talking point of the game was the five-run penalty imposed on the USA team. India benefited from these free runs after the bowling side failed to start their over within the one-minute interval between overs for the third time. They were

warned sufficiently

before the punishment rule, under 'stop clock' was applied against the home team. The rule came into force in international white-ball cricket in December last year. For every breach after the second warning, five runs would be docked against the bowling side. India were 76 for three at the end of the 15th over, needing 35 runs in the last five overs. The penalty meant that the

target was revised to a required rate of exactly six runs per over in the final five. In a similar situation against Pakistan, India narrowly avoided the penalty.

The sanctions have stirred a debate on whether they were appropriate to award penalty runs and whether the quality of the contest suffered due to the emphasis on rapid game completion. The USA team said it was not the cause of their loss.

"I think there needs to be a pace of play. I think if you're dragging games out that should last three and a half hours, they're going for four and a half hours, that's a bit much.

The ICC are there to install rules and regulations. We as coaches and teams are there to follow those rules. If there's enough voices saying that it may be detracting from the game, I'm sure the ICC will act on it. I don't see it as a bad thing," said

Stuart Law, the coach of the USA.

"The game continues to move. When momentum is with you, you want to keep that momentum running quicker and put the opposition under pressure that way. So, it's neither here nor there. It didn't affect the result of the game, I don't think, as many people will suggest. But to lose five runs was crucial at that time. But, once again, it may have just taken us to the 19th or 20th over, rather than finishing in the 18th (19th)," the Australia further said.

The point of note is how the cricket world would have reacted if India, who won by six runs, were docked five runs in the game against Pakistan in those crucial moments on June 9. Or what if the World Cup winner were to be decided by the penalty on June 29 in Bridgetown, Barbados?

Gritty Suryakumar ticks the adaptability box

New Delhi: One lesser-known statistic about the Indian Premier League (IPL) is that teams taking more singles tend to lose the match. This has been noticeable apparently in recent years, with experts suggesting it may have been the case over the last four to five seasons, maybe since 2018. "The IPL stats say the team that takes the most singles loses most of their games," explains an IPL analyst. "What it means is that if you are not taking singles, you are scoring braces, threes or boundaries."

Much as the format here

was the same as the IPL, the Nassau County pitch in New York defies this phenomenon. The conditions here entailed

more endurance, more concentration, more rotation of strike, and, most importantly, more singles. On Wednesday, India scored 44 singles compared to the USA's 33 and won comfortably, by seven wickets, while chasing 111. The thinking behind this is no rocket science - if the wickets are in hand, the odd big overs would be inevitable, the treacherous nature of the surface notwithstanding. In the game against Pakistan, India took fewer singles than their opposition, but the Babar Azam-led side lacked the wickets to capitalize in the end. Conversely, against the USA, India had plenty of them, as Suryakumar Yadav and Shivam Dube displayed immense

patience and caution to overcome the challenging pitch conditions. The big overs inevitably ensued, 15 runs in the 17th, 11 in the 16th, and nine in the 15th. It was game-over for the USA. With an initial asking rate of just 5.5, prudence demanded calmness and composure. Regular

singles were enough to get the job done. The Indian think tank's strategy of maintaining a right-left batting combination also complimented the approach and facilitated efficient strike rotation. This clarity in approach ensured that the early loss of openers Virat Kohli and

Rohit Sharma did not hurt the cause and hinder the chase. Although the USA had their moments in the game, India remained in control throughout. On a perilous pitch, when big hits were difficult to execute, Suryakumar Yadav, who had scores of 7 and 2 in the previous two games, was quick to realize and read the conditions. It was not the 360 degree Surya one has known him as. He controlled the strike knowing fully well that longer boundaries would not permit his all-round shots. His unbeaten half century (50 not out off 49 balls) was the joint slowest in the Twenty20 World Cup. He would not have minded the dubious distinction. It did the job for the team.

New Delhi: India pacer Shardul Thakur has undergone a foot surgery, he revealed on his social media handle on Wednesday (June 12). Thakur posted a picture with his right leg in a cast after the surgery was completed.

It is understood that he had the surgery done in London after Thakur played through the IPL with the help of injections to manage his painful ankle. Thakur's surgery was done by the same physician who had

operated on Mohammed Shami earlier. Thakur is a centrally contracted BCCI player meaning all the expenses incurred for the same would be taken care by the board.

The pacer is not a part of the current Indian squad but featured in the IPL for Chennai Super Kings. The Indian domestic season is set to begin in three months time which could be the path for his return to cricket.


Thakur had previously undergone a surgery in 2019. He last represented India in a Test match in South Africa at the end of last year. His recovery time from this surgery is expected to be about eight weeks.



Rutherford special seals Super 8 spot for West Indies

New Delhi: West Indies sealed their place in the Super 8 stages of the 2024 T20 World Cup following a clinical win over New Zealand in front of a capacity crowd in Trinidad. West Indies stuttered with the bat for the major part of their innings before a Sherfane Rutherford special guided them to a fighting total of 149. New Zealand, already under the pump, couldn't do enough with the bat as they fell short by 13 runs. At the death with the bat for West Indies. Their innings just wasn't progressing anywhere as New Zealand appeared to roar back in style after that heavy defeat at the hands of Afghanistan. However, Rutherford turned on the heat in the final few overs to completely rattle New Zealand. Rutherford

dealt in sixes and was the lone man fighting for the home side as he smashed an unbeaten 68 that was clearly the difference between the two sides. Except for Glenn Phillips, no other batter in either team managed to cross even half of what Rutherford made. Trent Boult struck again in the first over of an innings. He has done so often in his career but this time he didn't have to produce anything special as Johnson Charles got a thick edge as the ball crashed into the stumps. Nicholas Pooran tried to take full toll of the fielding restrictions but Tim Southee, coming back into the XI, prised him out with a short ball and caused more damage by getting rid of skipper Rovman Powell. Sandwiched between



these two dismissals, Roston Chase mistimed one off Lockie Ferguson as the under-pressure NZ unit made a great start to the game. The returning James Neesham struck for New Zealand as the West Indies were reduced to 30/5. Akeal Hosein tried to break the shackles with a six but West Indies could muster only 49 at the halfway mark. Even Andre Russell's brief cameo didn't help matters as New Zealand brought back Boult to get rid of the big-hitting allrounder. Rutherford was only dealing in sixes at that point but the home team still needed something special from him in the final five overs to help them post a respectable total. From 30/5, West Indies managed to set New

Zealand a challenging target of 150 all because of one man. Rutherford took matters into his own hands at the death, farming most of the strike and smashing boundaries. With Boult, Southee and Ferguson bowling out before the 18th over, Kane Williamson turned to Daryl Mitchell and Mitchell Santner to finish the innings and Rutherford took full of that scenario to hammer 37 runs.

Any start compared to the one West Indies made would look better on the night. However, Joseph then came into

the attack in the final over of the powerplay and dismissed Allen with a short ball, much to the relief of the home crowd. Gudakesh Motie came in after the powerplay and struck thrice that left New Zealand in tatters. Kane Williamson first got a thick outside edge while attempting a cut and Rachin Ravindra hit one straight to deep midwicket. Motie made it three wickets in three overs when he

delivered one wide of the crease that turned away from the batter after pitching to crash into stumps. At 63/5, New Zealand's campaign was definitely sinking. New Zealand needed to find a Rutherford of their own to hunt this down at the death. Phillips was definitely the man they were banking on but losing Neesham off the first ball of the 16th over didn't help matters.
