

New Delhi: A historic third term for Prime Minister Narendra Modi -- that's what exit polls are predicting as the seventh and the last phase of Lok Sabha election concluded this evening. Only one, though, has carried the NDA across its dream score of 400 of 543 Lok Sabha seats. The BJP, too, has been placed far short of its 370-seat target. The INDIA bloc, five exit polls predicted,

will fall massively short of the 285 seats predicted by Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge this evening. An aggregate of seven exit polls indicates that the NDA will get 361 seats, the INDIA bloc will get 145 seats. The BJP's individual score will be 311 seats and the Congress 63, up from the 52 seats it won in the last general election. The maximum number of seats predicted for the

NDA was 371-401, in the exit poll by India TV-CNX. It predicts the Opposition bloc will get 109-139 seats. It is followed by Jan ki Baat, which is predicting that the NDA will get 362-392 seats and INDIA 141-161 seats. The lowest score for the NDA comes from Dainik Bhaskar -- 281-350, and a corresponding higher score for the INDIA bloc, 145-201 seats.

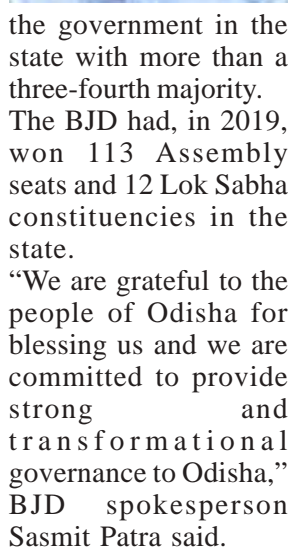
All exit polls, though, are unanimous about NDA's improved performance in the south and in Bengal. In Andhra Pradesh, the alliance with Chandrababu Naidu paid off, they predict, with the NDA expected to get 18 of the state's 25 seats. Karnataka is also expected to vote overwhelmingly for the BJP, despite its preference for the Congress at the state



Banerjee's party could get just 19 of the state's 42 Lok Sabha seats. In neighbouring Odisha, the BJP can do even better, winning 15 of the state's 21 seats and confining Naveen Patnaik's Biju Janata Dal -- once the unquestioned choice of the people -- to the margins. The BJP will also continue to dominate bastions like Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Assam and the national capital. Arvind Kejriwal's Aam Aadmi Party -- and ally Congress -- could again fail to win a single seat in Delhi, exit polls predict. The two parties, however, are expected to do so well in Punjab, where

they had a friendly contest. Of the state's 13 seats, the Congress is expected to win 5 and AAP, 4. Some change is also expected in Bihar, which had given 39 of its 40 seats to the NDA in the last election. The Opposition alliance, spearheaded by Tejashwi Yadav's Rashtriya Janata Dal, is expected to prise off 7 seats. The Opposition could also pick up three of 10 seats in Haryana and a few in Rajasthan -- states where they scored a duck in 2019. In Maharashtra, the state that proved one of the hardest to read, the Opposition can scoop up more than one-third of the seats, exit polls indicate. The counting of votes will take place on Tuesday.

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Senior BJD leader Kartik Pandian Saturday claimed that the ruling party in Odisha would win more than 115 of the 147 Assembly seats and secure 15 of the 21 Lok Sabha constituencies in the state. His claim comes on a day when the state's fourth and final round of elections is underway. Taking to X, Pandian said, "The BJD is winning 85 Assembly seats after 3rd phase polls and with the 4th phase today, it will end up winning more than 115 seats out of a total of 147 and 15 Lok Sabha seats out of 21." The bureaucrat-turned-BJD leader also said that the party will form



Earlier, the opposition BJP claimed that it would win over 75 Assembly seats and form a government in the state, besides winning above 16 Lok Sabha constituencies in Odisha. The counting of votes will be June 4. During the election campaign, Prime Minister Narendra Modi urged the people of Odisha to attend the swearing-in ceremony of the BJP government in the state June 10. The BJD claimed that it would form the government for the sixth consecutive time and party president Naveen Patnaik would take the oath June 9.

Bhubaneswar(KCN): A voter turnout of 62.46 per cent was recorded till 5pm Saturday in six Lok Sabha constituencies and 42 Assembly seats of Odisha where polling is underway in the third phase of the simultaneous elections. Among the six Lok Sabha constituencies, Jagatsinghpur recorded the highest voter turnout at 65.93 per cent while Bhadrak logged the lowest turnout at 58.21 per cent till 5pm. Besides, Mayurbhanj recorded a voter turnout of 64.17 per cent, Balasore 61.91 per cent, Jajpur 62.92 per cent and Kendrapara 62.02 per cent, the EC data

showed. It can be mentioned here that Manoranjan Sahoo, an assistant teacher deputed as a booth level officer at Oleichandanapur in Jajpur district, complained of uneasiness and was taken to a local hospital where he was declared dead, they said. Similarly, an elderly man also collapsed while standing in a queue in a polling booth in Iswarpur in Nilagiri Assembly segment in Balasore district. He

was taken to a hospital, where doctors declared him dead, they said. Both deaths were suspected to have been caused due to heatstroke, officials said. Two persons were injured in separate

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The death toll in the explosion of a stockpile of firecrackers in Odisha's Puri mounted to nine after three of the injured people died, a senior official said Saturday. A total of 21 people are currently undergoing treatment in various hospitals in Puri, Bhubaneswar and Cuttack.

A total of 30 people were injured in the explosion that happened during Lord Jagannath's 'Chandan Yatra', a ritual, on the night of May 29. According to information received from the Health & Family Welfare Department, three injured people died since late Friday night, the official said. "The total death toll rose

to nine. Presently 21 patients are under medical treatment in different hospitals," the official said. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has ordered an inquiry into the incident and announced an ex-gratia amount of Rs 4 lakh to the next of kin of each deceased. The Puri collector has taken steps for the payment of ex-gratia, the official said.

Additional Chief Secretary of the Revenue and Disaster Management Department, Satyabrata Sahu, who is also the Special Relief Commissioner (SRC), has started a probe into the incident. Meanwhile, Puri Police said it registered a suo motu criminal case and an investigation is underway.

New Delhi(KCN): Senior leaders of the INDIA bloc met here Saturday to discuss their strategy for the counting of votes June 4, even as the TMC and PDP skipped the meeting. Senior leaders of the Congress, Samajwadi Party, CPI-M, CPI, DMK, JMM, AAP, RJD, Shiv Sena (UBT) and NCP (Sharad



Venugopal were also present at the meeting. “June 4th will mark the beginning of a new dawn for India. In today’s meeting of INDIA bloc leaders, DMK will be represented by our party Treasurer and leader of DMK’s Parliamentary Party, Thiru. T.R. Baalavali,” DMK supremo and Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin had said in a post on ‘X’. Kharge had earlier said this was an informal meeting where they would only discuss what

kind of preparations they should have on the day of counting and how people should be alert, whether it is about the EVMs or the use of Form 17C. The meeting was only for discussing the counting preparations and the Congress has already told its state units to be alert about Form 17C, he had said. The seventh and last phase of Lok Sabha elections is underway Saturday, including in Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal.

New Delhi(KCN): An approximate voter turnout of 59.15 per cent was recorded Saturday in the seventh and final phase of the Lok Sabha polls with incidents of violence between TMC and BJP supporters reported in Sandeshkhali region of West Bengal, and complaints of EVM glitches and rigging at some booths lodged. Polling was conducted in seven states and the Union Territory of Chandigarh for 57

constituencies, including Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh from where Prime Minister Narendra Modi is seeking a third consecutive term in the Lok Sabha. Voting was held amid a severe heatwave in all 13 seats of Punjab and four of Himachal Pradesh, 13 constituencies in Uttar Pradesh, nine in West Bengal, eight in Bihar, six in Odisha and three in Jharkhand, besides Chandigarh. Polling for the remaining 42 assembly constituencies in Odisha

and bypolls to six assembly seats in Himachal Pradesh also took place simultaneously. Saturday's voting marked the end of the marathon polling process that began April 19. The assemblies of Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh and Sikkim also went to polls. The BJP-led NDA is seeking a rare consecutive third term in office. The Opposition INDIA bloc is trying to upset the NDA apocalyptic by putting up a joint fight in some states

Several exit polls, which were aired after the 6.30 pm deadline set by the Election Commission, predicated a comfortable majority for the BJP-led NDA. Leaders of several INDIA bloc parties met in the evening to take stock of the opposition's preparations leading up to the June 4 counting of votes, and claimed they will get more than 295 seats, enough for them to form the next government.

BJP Leader Alleges Booth Capturing By BJD Workers In Odisha's Salipur

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Tension erupted on Saturday in Odisha's Salipur assembly seat under Kendrapara Lok Sabha constituency after the Bharatiya Janata Party MLA candidate Arindam Roy alleged booth capturing by some ruling Biju Janata Dal (BJD) workers at a booth in Malasasan village under the segment. Speaking to media

persons, Arindam Roy said, "When I reached the booth, I was shocked to see that some eight to ten youths gathered inside the booth. They were directing a woman by holding her hand to press a particular party's button on the EVM. Upon being asked, they identified themselves as polling agents. This is a clear case of booth capturing. When I

objected to this, some BJD workers reached the spot and engaged in a brawl." Some alleged workers of BJD reportedly attacked BJP polling agent, Sanjay Rout, and four other party supporters with sharp weapons and wooden sticks at the booth in Malasasan village. The injured BJP workers were later rushed to a nearby hospital for



treatment. Arindam Roy also claimed about receiving such allegations of booth rigging from at least six more booths in the assembly segment. The BJP candidate stated that he would bring these incidents to the notice of the additional district magistrate (ADM) and sub-divisional police officer (SDPO). The BJP workers demanded re-polling at the particular booth

following rigging by BJD workers. The BJP leader Arindam Roy has urged the district administration of Cuttack to take stringent action against the guilty. Meanwhile, the Cuttack district administration rubbished the allegations of booth capturing in the Salipur assembly segment. the parties clashed 150 metres outside the booths. The presence of the candidate has aggravated the situation. The report of the attack with 'paniki' isn't true. The report of booth capture is completely false," said Cuttack DM on its official X handle. Voting is underway for six Lok Sabha constituencies and 42 assembly segments of the state for the final phase of polling.

ICAR-CIFRI Journey ensuring the sustainability of River Haldi

Kolkata,(KCN):The Haldi River is a prominent waterway in West Bengal. The Haldi River is a secondary river that runs through the PurbaMedinipur and joins the Hooghly River. The KeleghaiRiver meets the Kansai River near Tangrakhali, which is located in the Tamluk district. The confluence of the two streams is referred to as the Haldi River. The river in question is the final significant tributary to join the Haldi and Hooghly estuaries before the latter empties into the ocean. In May 2024, the NMCG team from ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (ICAR-CIFRI), Barrackpore under the leadership of Dr B.K.Das, Director undertook a comprehensive assessment to evaluate the ecological management of the river and the influence of human activities on it. The researchers examined many facets of fish diversity, distribution patterns, ecological traits, and alterations in community structure during the investigation. For the analysis, five sampling sites were chosen in West Bengal: Haldia ferry ghat, Balughata, Teropara lock gate, Teropekhyia, and



Narghat railway bridge in PurbaMedinipur District along the Haldi River. Upon study, it was determined that the water of the Haldi River had a somewhat alkaline character, with a pH range of 8.12-8.55. The alkaline pH of the region might have resulted from the release of alkaline chemicals from the Haldia industrial region or rainfall flowing over embankments containing high levels of soluble alkaline substances. Furthermore, the quantity of Dissolved Oxygen (DO) was determined to be within the ideal range of 3.4 to 3.6 ppm. The turbidity of water in the Haldi river varied from 3.44 to 45.7 NTU. It can be concluded that the river environment

provided a conducive habitat for the fish to thrive. Fish species such as Mystusgurio, Ompokpabda, Notopterusnotopterus, Ailiacolia, Coliadussumeri, Penaeus monodon, Setipinnaphasa, Glossogobiusguris, Latiscalarifer, Scylla olivacea, Systomussarana, Chanda nama, etc. are mainly found in the stretches. The Haldi River offers a variety of fishing techniques, including gill nets, surface bag nets, and hook-and-line methods. The optimal fishing periods are between October to January, particularly when employing bag nets. Although there was industrialization in the surrounding area, the study revealed that no heavy or

small industries were located near the sample areas. The substrate, predominantly composed of clay, offers an optimal habitat for a wide range of aquatic organisms. Nevertheless, NMCG emphasized the farming techniques used by the farmers in Nandigram for mud crab fattening. The Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute played a pivotal part in this investigation, offering vital observations on the variety of fish species, fishing techniques, and general health of the river. CIFRI's ongoing efforts guarantee the comprehension and preservation of these aquatic marvels for future generations.

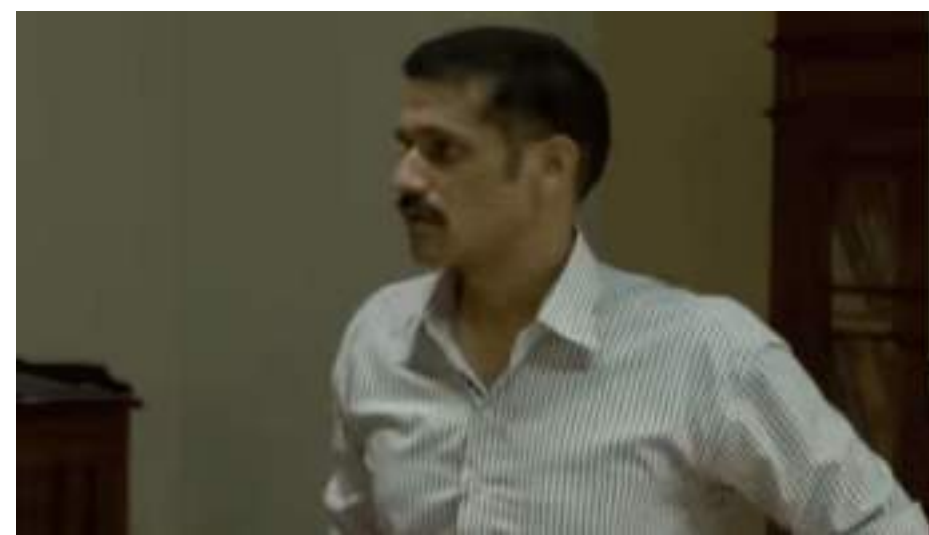
Talvaar Turns 8: Revisiting Exceptional Performance Of Sohum Shah, Who Played Investigative Officer

Challenges of saving biodiversity

The United Nations has declared 2021-30 as the Decade of Ecosystem Restoration. People around the world face the challenge of reviving their natural ecosystem, hence it is a matter of worldwide concern.

India is a biodiversity rich country. Despite covering 2.4 percent of the world's area, it is home to 7-8 percent of all the world's recorded species (45,000 plant species and 91,000 animal species). Four of the world's 34 biodiversity hotspots are in India. Similarly, India is included among the 17 mega-diversity countries of the world. Thus, biodiversity not only forms the basis of ecosystem functioning, but it also provides the basis of livelihood in the country. In such a situation, conservation of biodiversity in India becomes inevitable. Many measures have been taken to conserve biodiversity such as establishment of 103 national parks, 510 wildlife sanctuaries, 50 tiger reserves, 18 biosphere reserves, 3 conservation reserves and 2 community reserves.

A National Biodiversity Action Plan has been prepared for the conservation of

biodiversity, which is consistent with the Global Biodiversity Strategic Plan 2011-20. It was accepted at the meeting of the Convention on Biological Diversity in 2010. The Biodiversity Act was prepared in the year 2002 to conserve biodiversity and related knowledge in India. A three-tier institutional structure has been formed for the implementation of this Act. At the highest level, under Section 8 of the Act, the National Biodiversity Authority was constituted in the year 2003, whose headquarters is in Chennai. It is a statutory body, whose main role is regulatory and advisory in nature.

State Biodiversity Authorities have also been established in the states. Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs) have been formed at the local level. According to NBA data, 26 states of the country have constituted State Biodiversity Authorities and Biodiversity Management Committees. In the year 2016 the number of BMC was 41,180, which increased to 74,575 in the year 2018. 43,743 BMCs have been formed in

Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh alone. The objective of these committees is to conserve the country's biodiversity and related knowledge, to facilitate its sustainable use, and to ensure that the benefits arising from the use of biological resources are shared fairly and equitably among those most likely to contribute to its conservation, utilization and involvement in management.

The National Biodiversity Authority is performing its role well for the conservation of biodiversity in the country. According to the NBA implementation of the National Biodiversity Action Plan is challenging. People's participation plays an important role in its successful implementation. MS Swaminathan Research Foundation's Community Farming Biodiversity Center in Wayanad district of Kerala provides an excellent example of how strengthening local self-governance can integrate biodiversity conservation into local development plans. India's National Biodiversity Authority has recently set new standards in improving the livelihoods of villagers

with the help of the United Nations Environment Programme.

India has been at the forefront in establishing comprehensive legal and institutional mechanisms to achieve the goals of the Convention on Biological Diversity. The Convention's third objective of making genetic resources available to people and fair, equitable sharing of benefits is being implemented under the Biological Diversity Act 2002 and Rules 2004. The National Biodiversity Authority is globally recognized for its work in implementing the provisions of the Convention. To expand its reach and operationalize benefit sharing provisions, a network of people's biodiversity registers and biodiversity management committees is created at the national level.

A big project Biodiversity Management Committees, formed under the 2002 Act, are local level statutory bodies that require the participation of at least two women members through a democratic selection process. These committees help in facilitating access and

consent of proposed users such as researchers, private companies, governments etc. to biological resources. This ensures sustainable use and conservation of available resources through biodiversity registers and decisions on conservation and sustainable use of biological resources. The title of the project is Focus on Strengthening the Implementation and Access to Biological Diversity Act and Rules and Benefit Sharing Provisions.

The project aims to create better access to biological resources, assess their economic value and better share their benefits among local people. It is being run in 10 states of the country namely Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Sikkim, West Bengal, Goa, Karnataka, Odisha, Telangana and Tripura. Very few people would know that India has many attractive global centers of biodiversity. For example, Sikkim has 422 species of birds and 697 species of butterflies, four and a half thousand species of flowering plants, 362 species of plants and a rich variety of beautiful orchid flowers.

Countless species of animals and plants make the Himalayas a precious storehouse of biodiversity. Thousands of small and big glaciers, precious forests, rivers and waterfalls present here prepare suitable ground for this. The Himalayas are divided into several zones, with the Central Himalayan region particularly home to this biodiversity. In the state of Uttarakhand situated in the Central Himalayas, 7000 important species of plants and 500 species of animals are present. Today there are many threats to biodiversity in the Himalayan region. There are many reasons for this, including humid climate change, deforestation, frequent uncontrolled fires, drying up of water streams, poor forest management and lack of awareness among people. This is why many species are facing existential crisis. One such plant species is Orchid. Efforts are being made in Uttarakhand for the last few years to save it.

The Orchid plant is one of the oldest plants in the world, which is known for its beautiful flowers and invaluable contribution to the environment. There are

more than twenty-five thousand species all over the world and in the Himalayas, they are found at an altitude of 700 meters to about 3000 meters. About 250 species of orchids have been identified in the state of Uttarakhand, but most are on the verge of losing their existence. Biologists say that at least 5 or 6 species are on the verge of extinction. The orchid itself, growing either in the ground or on trees such as oaks and pines, makes pollination possible or easier for many plants. A nutritious and popular Ayurvedic product like Chyawanprash uses at least 4 species of orchids, which are found in the high Himalayan regions. For the last two years, researchers of Uttarakhand Forest Department have preserved more than 100 species of orchids in the areas of Gori Valley and Garhwal division of Kumaon. Biodiversity and Scheduled Tribes

The United Nations has declared 2021-30 as the Decade of Ecosystem Restoration. People around the world face the challenge of reviving their natural ecosystem, hence it is a matter of

worldwide concern. Obviously, we India people also cannot stay away from this. India's biodiversity is also being put under undue pressure due to very fast economic growth and ignore to integrate environmental concerns into development planning. In such a situation, every level of conservation initiative is welcome. Especially keeping in mind that there is a direct and deep relationship between biological wealth and human existence. It is noteworthy that these centers of biodiversity also include about fifty percent of India's population which lives below the poverty line. These include most of the Scheduled Tribes people, who reside in the forests and maintain a special bonding with it. There is an interdependent relationship between them. These people are the natural guardians of biodiversity.

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"Protecting children from tobacco industry interference"

World No Tobacco Day is an annual global event observed on May 31st, dedicated to raising awareness about the detrimental effects of tobacco use on health and advocating for effective policies to reduce tobacco consumption. As we approach World No Tobacco Day 2024, it's crucial to reflect on the progress made in tobacco control efforts, acknowledge the challenges that remain, and renew our commitment to promoting a tobacco-free world.

31 May is the World No Tobacco Day (WNTD). This year, once again, WHO and public health champions from across the globe will come together to raise awareness about the harmful influences of the tobacco industry on youth. Protecting children from tobacco

industry interference This theme of WNTD 2024 is focused on advocating for an end to the targeting of youth with harmful tobacco products. This discourse provides a platform for young people, policy-makers and tobacco control advocates globally to discuss the issue and to urge governments to adopt policies that shield young people from the manipulative practices of the tobacco and related industries. Although cigarette smoking has decreased over the years due to phenomenal efforts by the tobacco control community, more must be done to safeguard these vulnerable groups.

According to 2022 data, worldwide, at least 37 million young people aged 13–15 years use some form of tobacco. In the WHO European Region, 11.5% of boys and 10.1% of girls aged 13–15 years are tobacco users (4 million). To keep making billions of dollars in revenues, the tobacco industry needs to replace the millions of customers who die and those who quit tobacco use every year. To achieve this goal, it works to create an environment that promotes uptake of its products among the next

generation, including lax regulation to ensure its products are available and affordable. The industry also develops products and advertising tactics that appeal to children and adolescents, reaching them through social media and streaming platforms.

Products such as electronic cigarettes and nicotine pouches are gaining popularity among youth. It is estimated that 12.5% of adolescents in the European Region used e-cigarettes in 2022 compared to 2% of adults. In some countries of the Region, the rates of e-cigarette use among school children are 2–3 times higher than the rates of cigarette smoking. The industry wilfully sells a deadly dependency to young people, therefore WNTD 2024 calls on the governments and tobacco control community to protect current and future generations and to hold the tobacco industry liable for the harm it causes.

The consequences of youth tobacco use are dire. Nicotine is highly addictive, and early exposure increases the likelihood of dependence in adulthood. This dependence can lead to



a range of health problems, including: Respiratory illnesses: Tobacco use damages the lungs, increasing the risk of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), asthma, and lung cancer. Cardiovascular disease: Tobacco use is a major risk factor for heart attacks, strokes, and other cardiovascular complications. Cancer: Tobacco use is not just linked to lung cancer but also increases the risk of cancers of the mouth, throat, esophagus, bladder, and pancreas. Mental health issues: There is a growing body of evidence linking tobacco use to

depression, anxiety, and other mental health conditions.

Beyond the immediate health effects, youth tobacco use poses a significant economic burden on healthcare systems. Early intervention and prevention efforts are crucial to protect future generations and ensure a healthier tomorrow. Raising Awareness: World No Tobacco Day serves as a platform to raise awareness about the harmful effects of tobacco use on health. Through educational campaigns, media outreach, and community events, the public is informed about the various diseases and conditions caused by

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Bengal's Bank BachaoDeshBachao Manch Criticizes SBI's Restrictive Policies on Employee Financial Choices

Kolkata, (ABHIJIT SETH):

Bank BachaoDeshBachao Manch, a civil society forum advocating for banking stakeholders' rights, has criticized the State Bank of India's (SBI) new restrictions on its employees and their dependents. These restrictions prevent them from opening Demat accounts outside the State Bank Group, as stated in an internal circular issued on May 27, 2024. The forum sees this as an example of restrictive HR policies, similar to the existing limitations on employees under the National Pension System (NPS), which compel them to invest solely in the SBI Pension Fund. The circular requires employees and their wholly dependent family members to get prior written permission from their controller (not below the rank of Chief General Manager) before opening Demat or Trading accounts outside the State Bank Group. Additionally, employees must submit quarterly statements of their Demat/Trading accounts for verification, and any breach of these instructions is considered misconduct, subject to disciplinary action.

Employees must also obtain post facto permission for continuing with existing Demat/Trading accounts outside the State Bank Group within six months of the circular's issuance or close such accounts within this period. The forum argues that these restrictions infringe on employees' rights, noting that limiting NPS choices impacts their ability to maximize retirement benefits. For example, while the SBI Pension Fund has yielded returns of 9.28% since inception, alternatives like the LIC Pension Fund and UTI Retirement Solutions have shown slightly better returns at 9.37% and 9.32%, respectively. The lack of choice in investment options affects employees' financial well-being. By restricting employees to the SBI Pension Fund, the bank limits their potential for higher returns available from other funds, thus compromising their future financial security. Bank BachaoDeshBachao Manch opposes these new restrictions and views them as a direct infringement on employees' rights. The

organization is committed to exploring all available legal avenues to challenge SBI's decision and aims to ensure fair and transparent practices within the organization. The Manch believes that such restrictive policies undermine employee morale and restrict their financial autonomy. The organization calls for a review of these policies, urging SBI to adopt a more employee-friendly approach that respects individual financial choices and promotes a fair working environment.

Bank BachaoDeshBachao Manch's criticism of SBI's restrictive policies reflects broader concerns about employee rights and financial freedom. By challenging these measures, the Manch aims to protect employees' interests and ensure that banking practices remain transparent and fair. The ongoing efforts to mobilize public opinion and explore legal avenues demonstrate the organization's commitment to advocating for fair treatment within the banking sector.

ICAR-CIFRI combating Churni's survival hindered by Black Water

Kolkata, (KCN):

The Mathabhanga River comes from the Padma River in Bangladesh and upon entering Indian territory, it divides into two sections, namely Ichamati and Churni, in Majhdia. The Churni River spans a distance of 56 km and merges into the Bhagirathi River near Payradanga, Ranaghat. An unfortunate consequence of the polluted rivers in the Bengal delta is the decline in fish variety and production in the sensitive river ecology. To tackle the ecological strain on fish species, the NMCG team from ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (ICAR-CIFRI), Barrackpore conducted a comprehensive survey to evaluate the ecological management



of this river and the influence of human activities on it. The investigation included a selection of five sampling locations along the river: Rabonbore Ferry Ghat, Ranaghat, Kalinarayanpur Foot Bridge, Aranghata Ferry Ghat, Ismail Fakir Ghat, Jafarnagar, and ShivnivasGhatnear Churni Resort. In March 2024, the team investigated the same regions and documented the existence of black water with a foul smell contaminating the river. The fishing activity was halted as a result of the previously reported contamination. There have been no reports of fish catching in the Rabonbore region, except

for shrimp fishing. The water in the river around Rabonbore and Kalinarayanpur was more transparent compared to the three sample points farther upstream, where black water has begun to contaminate the river. During April 2024, fishermen from Aranghata reported the occurrence of fish species such as Labeo ro hita, Labeo calbasu, Notopterusnotopterus, and other catfish in countable numbers. However, these fish were almost unavailable in May. It suggests that the river is not receiving sufficient time to recover,

and the contamination of black water is causing significant damage to the ecosystem of river Churni. Approximately 30,000 fishermen hailing from 120 villages along the riverbank are deeply displeased with the national and state administrations for evading their obligation to address the issue. The research revealed that the water of the Churni River had a very alkaline character, with a pH range of 7.56 to 8.22. Furthermore, the analysis revealed that the Dissolved Oxygen (DO) level fell within the range of 0.6 to 2.5 ppm, suggesting that the river water is of low quality

and detrimental to the riverine ecology. Consequently, it necessitates focused efforts to combat water pollution and its ecological impact. This is crucial for enhancing the health of the riverine ecosystem and attaining environmental sustainability. As part of its ongoing efforts to promote sustainable development goals, ICAR-CIFRI is actively raising awareness among people at various sites along the river bank. They aim to educate them about the negative implications of destructive fishing practices, the usage of plastics, and chemical contamination.

In Big Show Of Unity, INDIA Bloc Held Strategy Meet Ahead Of Counting Day

New Delhi(KCN): The INDIA bloc held a crucial strategy meet as the Lok Sabha elections draw to a close. The meeting was held at the Delhi residence of Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge. Mamata Banerjee's Trinamool Congress was the only absentee -- the Bengal Chief Minister said she was skipping it in view of the last phase of the Lok Sabha elections in the state and relief operations for Cyclone Remal that passed through the state earlier this week. While the official reason cited for the meeting is to devise a

strategy to ensure smooth counting at state and district levels, sources indicate the focus is on keeping the flock together. The point is crucial ahead of results in the event of the NDA winning by narrow margins, confided Congress leaders. The party is expecting the NDA to get no more than 260-270 seats, which leaves it short of majority mark by just a few seats. Swaraj India chief Yogendra Yadav has predicted no more than



270 seats for the NDA, which leaves it short of the majority mark by just two seats. But the alliance wants to stick together even if it does not have the numbers. In a post on X, formerly Twitter, ahead of the

meeting, Mr Kharge said, "The fight is still not over, and the leaders and workers of all the parties are extremely alert... We have fought the Lok Sabha Elections 2024 with all our might and are confident of a positive outcome, as the

people of India have supported us". The exit poll is expected this evening, and the Congress, which initially refused to join in the discussions thereafter, has reversed its decision. While the Congress said it considers exit polls entirely avoidable, given the counting will take place within days, the BJP has called it a tacit acceptance of defeat. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, meanwhile, concluded his 45-hour meditation retreat at the Vivekananda Rock Memorial in Tamil Nadu's Kanyakumari and is heading back to Delhi.

Brahmaputra Water Level Rises After Heavy Rain In Assam, 3.5 Lakh People Affected

Guwahati (Assam)(KCN): The water level of the Brahmaputra River has been rising following incessant rainfall in many parts of Assam and other neighbouring states in the past couple of days.

The water levels of the Kopili River, Barak River, Katakhal River, and Kushiya River are above the danger mark. The flood situation in Assam is still grim as over

3.50 lakh people in 11 districts have been affected.

A local resident Bikash Kumar Shah said, "The river water has increased due to constant rainfall. I had to close my ferry. I opened it today."

Another local resident Bittu Kumar expressed, "There is nothing to worry about as such. But all the shops were closed due to flood-like

conditions." Meanwhile, in response to the ongoing flood situation in Barak Valley in Assam, an additional team from the first Battalion of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) has been deployed to the region. The team was airlifted from Guwahati's Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International (LGBI) Airport to Silchar Airport in the Cachar district of Assam.

Poultry biz goes haywire in Odisha's Kendrapara

Kendrapara(KCN): With the lone chick-producing farm located inside the veterinary hospital here lying closed for the last 12 years, poultry business in Kendrapara district has slipped into the hands of big companies.

These big companies, who own or control everything except the farms, call the shots in the poultry business. Poultry meat is sold for around Rs 220-350 per kg in hundreds of shops spread across the district. However, poultry farmers have failed to make any gains as they earn only peanuts from the business due to large-scale interference of big companies. Despite the demand for poultry meat witnessing a sharp rise in the state, the farmers

here have failed to reap any benefit.

In the absence of administrative control, the farmers have no way other than depending on these big companies for their survival. Owing to administrative apathy and lack of foresight, an incubator purchased for Rs 11 lakh and a generator to maintain uninterrupted power supply have been gathering dust with no effort being made for the revival of the defunct chick-producing centre established at an investment over Rs 1 crore.

As much as 97 per cent of the poultry meat consumed by people is produced by a farmer under contract with a big company. These poultry farmers are the last



independent link in the company-owned supply chain. In this scenario, the company owns every link of a product's supply chain from start to finish. This has happened as the state government has failed to regulate the big companies.

Sources said the state government is providing loans to women self-help groups (WSHGs) and youths to run poultry farms. Loans are provided through banks under its ambitious Mission Shakti scheme. This has encouraged

women and youths to start poultry businesses. However, poultry farmers have been trapped by these big companies who are supplying them with poultry feeds, chicks and medicines. As a result, the farmers, instead of making profits, are facing losses. The situation has remained unchanged despite a rise in the price

of poultry meat all over the state. This has disappointed those who have started poultry farms to earn a livelihood. Poultry farmers Kalia Samantaray of Indupur, Subhasis Jena of Kansar village, Ramakant Mallick of Pakhar village and Sheik Hassan of Barimula village alleged that the state government has no role in regulating

the market price of poultry products leaving the rein in the hands of the big companies. It is alleged that big traders from Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and only a couple of local firms have monopolized the poultry trade in the state. The companies sign a contract with the independent farmers while the latter spend only on the construction of farms, houses, water and power supply and manpower required to run a farm. In exchange, they supply farmers with poultry feeds, chicks and medicines on time. After raising the chicks, the farmers get only Rs 3-5 per kg of poultry meat irrespective of the market price at that time as they cannot sell their products in the market directly. Company employees collect the fully-grown chickens and sell them

both outside and inside the state. These companies charge exorbitant prices for their products if the farmers are unwilling to sign an agreement with them. In such a scenario, poultry farmers have asked the state government to intervene and bail them out of this situation.

When contacted, Chief District Veterinary Officer (CDVO) Deepti Mohapatra said that the state government has launched various schemes providing subsidies for the benefit of the poultry farmers. They can enroll in these schemes and reap the benefit. However, no legal action can be taken as the farmers are entering into contracts with these big companies. However, efforts are on to revive the chick-producing centre, she added.

Decline in demand for local mango varieties hits tribals

Keonjhar(KCN): The drastic fall in sale of local mangoes and other seasonal fruits has affected the livelihood of tribals living in Keonjhar district. The tribals depend greatly on the sale of local variety of mangoes as it helps them earn handsomely and eke out a living during lean times. However, the lack of proper storage and marketing facilities has forced them to sell the mangoes at throwaway prices.

Also, the entry of hybrid mango varieties, which are grown with rampant use of fertilizers, has affected the sale of local ones. Locals said the state government should provide proper storage and marketing facilities for mangoes growing in this district. They added that the government can buy large quantities of the local mangoes and use those in various state-run



food processing units. The fruits can be used in making jam, jelly, juice and other products like pickles.

These days tribals, mostly women with their kids, can be seen waiting for hours under the scorching sun on the streets of villages and in urban markets to sell the fruits. "If we don't sell the mangoes, they will rot. Hence we sell the fruits at throwaway prices. We don't even earn enough to make for travel expenses from our village

to the market," said Sukumari Juang of Banspal area in this district. Senior residents of this district pointed out that due to falling income from the sale of food products, the lives of the tribals have been severely affected. The district officials should step in to help the tribals, they said, pointing out that rampant felling of trees has resulted in decreased production of the traditional varieties of mangoes. Furthermore, the

traditional mango orchards, called 'Amba Tota' in local parlance, are also fast vanishing from villages. Retired professor Bimabadhar Behera said, "Hybrid variety can never be a substitute for local mangoes. Hence, traditional mango trees should be protected. The government should initiate steps for the protection of local varieties of mangoes through preservation efforts and proper marketing."

Special summer measures for animals in RSP's zoo

Rourkela(KCN): With the scorching summer heat making life miserable here this year, not only human beings, but the animals also are tormented by the ongoing unprecedented heatwave.


The Horticulture department has been taking all necessary steps and precautions to protect the animals, birds and reptiles of Indira Gandhi Park Zoo and Deer Park of SAIL, Rourkela Steel Plant (RSP). Coolers have been installed in the enclosures of monkeys, macau and other avian species. Cool water is being sprayed over bear, deer and emus regularly through water tankers. Water pools have been dug inside the paddock for bear, deer and emus to bathe in. The normal summer care provided includes succulent feed and anti-stress formulations in drinking water to the primates,



deer and birds. Round the-clock water supply is ensured for all birds and animals. Flowing water has been arranged so as to avoid scum formation. Water is provided in ponds for wallowing animals. The dwellings are cleaned on a regular basis with medicinal disinfectants to prevent diseases. Water

tankers are provided for sprinkling water on the sheds of the animals on every alternate day to prevent excessive heat. All-out efforts are being made to avoid dehydration, sunstroke and other heat-related problems among the zoo dwellers. Special care is being taken for endangered and sensitive

species so they can get into the water anytime and keep cooling themselves off. Indira Gandhi Park Zoo is the second largest integrated zoo of the state which houses 135 animals and birds belonging to 23 species. It gets a footfall of around one lakh visitors annually

Almonds Food for Fitness

Bhubaneswar : Engaging in exercise promotes a healthful lifestyle, but even when performed correctly, exercise causes fatigue and muscle damage. Recovery from exercise is important because it leads to muscle gain and improved fitness over time. A new study involving people who exercise occasionally (less than three times per week) demonstrated that snacking on almonds reduced feelings of fatigue and tension, increased leg and lower back strength during recovery, and decreased muscle damage during the first day of recovery. David C. Nieman, DrPH, FACSM, Professor and Principal Investigator, Human Performance Laboratory, Appalachian State University, led this novel research, supported with funding from the Almond Board of California. Dr. Nieman's team wanted to see if an almond snack compared to a high-carbohydrate cereal bar snack would improve inflammation and recovery in adults engaging in 90-minute exercise sessions. "What we found tells us definitively that almonds should be added to sports nutrition strategies to help people recover better from exercise," explained Dr. Nieman. "Almonds are food for fitness. Carbs get most of the attention when it comes to fueling for exercise, but almonds offer a nutrition package, including good unsaturated fats, the antioxidant vitamin E, and proanthocyanidins (class of polyphenols, which are protective compounds in plants) that help explain the beneficial outcomes in our study." One serving of almonds (28g) has 13 g of good unsaturated fat and only 1 g of saturated fat.

King, bowlers help WI off to winning start against SA

New Delhi: Brandon King-led West Indies got off to a winning start in the T20I series against South Africa in Kingston, Jamaica, securing a 28-run victory in the first of three T20Is. Despite missing some of their big names in the batting department due to IPL duties, skipper King made up for the absence with a 45-ball 79 that helped them post 175/5. Reeza Hendricks struck a 51-ball 87 but lack of support from the other end meant that South Africa were bowled out for 147. Matthew Forde and Gudakesh Motie bagged three wickets apiece. Asked to bat, West Indies were off the blocks quickly thanks to King who dealt in regular boundaries. Johnson Charles, who contributed only 1 in the opening stand

worth 36, was dismissed in the fourth over by Ottniel Baartman. But there was no stopping King as he brought up his 10th T20I fifty, off only 26 deliveries, to power West Indies to 64/1 in the powerplay. The captain struck six maximums during his stay while Kyle Mayers also cleared the fence regularly as West Indies crossed the 100-run mark in the 10th over. But West Indies lost regular wickets in the second half of their innings, with Andile Phehlukwayo (3-28) doing the bulk of the damage, as they slipped to 137/5 in the 15th over. Roston Chase scored a useful 32 not out but he took 30 deliveries for those runs as South Africa kept West Indies in check in the death overs with wickets, with only 32



coming off the last five. Baartman finished with 3-26. South Africa lost Quinton de Kock and Ryan Rickelton early in the chase, with Forde and Chase delivering key strikes. Matthew Breetzke struck three fours in an over off Akeal Hosein followed by a boundary off Shamar

Joseph but the pacer trapped him in front for 19, with South Africa at 46/3 at the end of the powerplay. Hendricks and Rassie van der Dussen tried to build a partnership but South Africa had a lot of work to do, having reached 77/3 after 10 overs.

Already having an upper hand in the contest, West

Indies gained further advantage thanks to a double-wicket over from Motie, who dismissed van der Dussen and Wiaan Mulder in the 11th. Hendricks brought up a fighting 32-ball fifty but wickets fell around him as Motie finished with 3-25 while Obed McCoy picked up two wickets to reduce South Africa to 108/8. Hendricks tried to keep the fight going but with 39 needed off the final over, South Africa were well behind and Forde helped himself to a couple of wickets to finish with 3-27. Brief scores: West Indies 175/8 in 20 overs (Brandon King 79, Kyle Mayers 34; Otttniel Baartman 3-26, Andile Phehlukwayo 3-28) beat South Africa 147 in 19.5 overs (Reeza Hendricks 87; Gudakesh Motie 3-25, Matthew Forde 3-27) by 28 runs.

India head coach Igor Stimac has named a 27-member squad for Sunil Chhetri's farewell match - FIFA World Cup 2026 Qualifier against Kuwait on June 6 in Kolkata. A total of 32 players had been camped in Bhubaneswar, with Phurba Lachenpa, Parthib Gogoi, Imran Khan, Muhammad Hammad, and Jithin MS being released. Stimac



said, "All of them were very professional and hard-working. The competition is really strong amongst them, especially in the positions of Jithin and Parthib. Parthib and Hammad suffered minor injuries a few days back and will need 7-14 days of rest." The remaining players

will continue to train in Bhubaneswar till May 29, when they will head to Kolkata. The Blue Tigers will face Kuwait at the Vivekananda Yuba Bharati Krirangan on June 6 before heading to Qatar on June 11 for their final two Group A fixtures. India are presently ranked second in the group, with four points after four matches. The top two teams in the group will advance to Round 3 of the FIFA World Cup Qualifiers and secure a spot in the AFC Asian Cup Saudi Arabia 2027.

Series loss to USA a wake-up call for Bangladesh - Shakib

New Delhi: Shakib Al Hasan, the veteran Bangladesh all-rounder, said the team's T20I series loss to the USA, who registered their first series win over a full-member team, is a wake-up call for them ahead of the 2024 T20 World Cup. Bangladesh's preparation for the global event did not begin on a good note as they went 0-2 down to the USA in the three-match T20I series, with a game still to be played. In a chase of 145 in the second T20I, they were on track having reached 106/4 in the 15th over before suffering a big collapse as they were bowled out for 138 in 19.3 overs. "Certainly it is

disappointing and we didn't expect it but we must give credit to the US team for the way they have played," Shakib said. "I think no one expected that we will lose two games. Any match you lose as a team is disappointing and you don't want to lose a game and obviously it is very disappointing. But having said that we have to play the World Cup and this series might be a wake-up call for us as we haven't played the way we want to play.

"It's a team game and everyone has to take the responsibility - you win as a team and you lose as a team. I don't want to blame any particular person or any particular

department. It's just that T20 is such a format you have to play very good cricket in all three departments to win against any team. There are no small or big teams in T20 cricket and that's why it is more exciting than any other format. And the proof of that is in the last two games the way US played." Despite the loss, Shakib insisted that they did not take the opposition lightly. "I don't think we took them lightly. In the first game maybe we couldn't do what we wanted to do and in the second game exactly the same thing happened - we couldn't execute the plans that we were supposed to do on the ground.



"In T20 every team is very much equal. I have seen the game between West Indies A and Nepal and they really played well and you are seeing games

between Ireland and Netherlands and they are playing very close matches. Pakistan lost to Ireland and in T20 it is anybody's game. It is on

the day who performs better, and so you cannot take anything lightly in T20 cricket because one or two overs can change the momentum of the

game and completely change the scenario of the game. That's why you are always up for the challenges and you cannot take anything lightly or anything for granted," he said. Shakib, meanwhile, wasn't too pleased with the facilities at the Prairie View Cricket Complex in Houston, saying rain and limited practice time hampered their preparations. The first day of practice could not take place due to rain and then Bangladesh didn't get to spend enough time in the nets during their training session.

"If we take this as a preparation series for the World Cup, in that

case we should have a lot more batting and bowling sessions and there should have been more facilities that we didn't get at all. I feel we had a proper net session for one day and even on that day the batsmen could not have required the batting session. And there was an optional day and the batsmen did not seize the opportunity," said Shakib. "For one day there was rain and we could not do anything on that day, while there are four grounds but we could train on only three pitches which I don't think is ideal. And I think these things could have been better," he said before insisting that it wasn't an excuse.
