‘Soil Testing Programme’ for Farmers by Tata Steel Foundation and IFFCO 110 farmers participated in the two-day event



Bamnipal, (KCN): A two-day ‘Soil Testing Programme’ for the farmers of Bamnipal region organised by Tata Steel Foundation (TSF), in collaboration with Indian Farm Forestry Development Cooperative (IFFCO), successfully concluded at Bamnipal Housing Complex of Tata Steel on Wednesday. The soil testing was conducted through a ‘Mobile Soil Testing Van’ as part of ‘World Day to Combat Desertification and Drought’ celebrations aimed at educating farmers about the impact of soil health

on agriculture and sustainable soil management practices. 110 farmers from the two blocks namely, Danagadi and Harichandanpur from Bamnipal region participated in the programme. During the programme, soil health testing was conducted on 110 soil samples from over 500 acres of farmland, and health reports for over 50 samples of soil were distributed to the farmers. Each report was explained in detail, providing the correct dosages of nutrients and fertilizers required for optimal soil health.

The programme focused on creating awareness among farmers on the importance of evaluating the five critical soil health parameters, namely phosphorus (P), potassium (K), pH levels, soil salinity (EC), and organic carbon content. The event included a comprehensive discussion with farmers, field inspections of various croplands, and demonstrations of soil sampling methods. Apart from this, an awareness session was conducted on the benefits of adopting bio-fertilizers. Furthermore, IFFCO's ‘Mobile Soil Testing Van’,

equipped with an in-built lab, played a vital role in educating the farmers on soil health and conducting on-the-spot analyses for proper demonstration. The workshop concluded with the distribution of soil health cards among the farmers. Cannes Film Festival: 7 Indian Films Set To Make A Mark At International Platform

The 77th edition of the Cannes Film Festival is set to be held in the French Riviera from May 14 with India set to make its mark on the canvas of the prestigious film festival, considered one of the world's biggest film festivals.

Seven films from India will be a part of the festival. One of the films, and India's big hopes comes in the form of the Malayalam film 'All We Imagine As Light'.

The film, directed by Karan Kandhari, is about a wife who navigates the challenges of married life in a slum. Having suffered oppression, she aims to seek revenge.

'In Retreat', directed by Syed Maisam Ali Shah, tells the story of a man who returns to his hometown after many years. The film is set to be screened under the Association for the Distribution of Independent Cinema Section.

The final film on the list is 'The Shameless' directed by Bulgarian director Konstantin Bojanov.

The film's story is set in India, and it has been shot across Nepal and India.

'The Shameless' follows the story of Rani, an Indian sex worker, who goes on a pilgrimage to a remote temple, where she confronts her past, including a love affair, who is imprisoned for murder in Bangalore. The film will be screened under the Un Certain Regard section.

In appeal many a times the assessee needs to adduce Additional Evidence in appeal. We are dealing with some Frequently asked questions with the help of relevant decisions on the issue.

1. Under what circumstances CIT(A) can admit additional evidence or a fresh-evidence?

As per section 250 read with Rule 46A, the CIT(A) or Joint Commissioner (Appeals) may admit additional or fresh evidence which have not been produced before the A.O., in the undermentioned

circumstances:

- [i] where the A.O. has refused to admit evidence which ought to have been admitted or
- [ii] where the appellant was prevented by sufficient cause from producing the evidence which was called upon to produce by the A.O. or
- [iii] where the appellant was prevented by sufficient cause from producing before the A.O. any evidence which is relevant to any ground of appeal, or
- [iv] where the A.O. has made the order appealed against without giving sufficient opportunity to the

appellant to adduce evidence relevant to any ground of appeal.

Before admitting any additional evidence CIT(A) has to -

1. record reasons, for its admission in writing.
 2. allow a reasonable opportunity to the A.O. to examine the evidence or document or to cross-examine the witness produced by the appellant or to produce any evidence or document or any witness in rebuttal of the additional evidence produced by the appellant before admitting any fresh evidence stated above.
- Failure to do so will amount to violation of Rule 46A - Enzen Global Solutions (P.) Ltd. v. ITO [2022] 144 taxmann.com 2 (Bangalore - Trib.). However the above requirements are not applicable in case CIT(A), using his powers u/s 251(1)(a)

read with Rule 46A(4) directs for the production of any document, or the examination of any witness to enable him to dispose of the appeal or for any other substantial cause including imposition of penalty u/s 271 or the enhancement of the assessment or penalty. Such enhancement may be made by the CIT(A) on his own motion or on the request of the A.O. as provided in Rule 46A(4) - United Cores (P) Ltd. v. ACIT 16 CCH 0229 Del. Trib, DCIT v. MKV (ARMOURS) (P) Ltd. 41 CCH 0365 (Luck). Further it is obligatory for the CIT(A) to verify of the assessee's claim and the explanations put forth which were never before the AO in the ex parte assessment proceedings - ACIT v. Raffi Baig [2015] 43 CCH 0187 (Bang. Trib).

Where the additional information is relevant for calculation of real

income, the CIT(A) should accept the additional evidence - Pr. CIT v. Daljit Singh Sra 80 taxmann.com 271 (P & H).

2. Where assessee furnishes additional evidence before CIT(A) without proper application for admission of the same, can CIT reject the same merely for want of proper application?

If the CIT(A) found that the assessee has furnished evidence without an application for admission of additional evidences, the CIT(A) should direct the assessee to file the additional evidences along with application for admission of the same and after accepting the same, he should call for remand report from AO - Pabitra Mohan Samal v. ITO [2020] 114 taxmann.com 403 (Cuttack - Trib).

Where assessee due to his wife's illness was prevented from producing evidences before Assessing Officer in

support of its claim, Commissioner (Appeals) could not refuse to admit such evidences for want of an appropriate application under rule 46A - Padam Lal Dua v. ITO [2016] 76 taxmann.com 354 (Delhi - Trib.)/[2017] 162 ITD 524 (Delhi - Trib.).

3. Can an assessee produce additional or fresh evidence before ITAT?

Generally, the parties to the appeal shall not be entitled to produce additional evidence whether oral or documentary before the Tribunal. But if the Tribunal requires any document to be produced or any witness to be examined or any affidavit to be filed to enable it to pass orders or for any other substantial cause, or, if the I.T. authorities have decided the case without giving sufficient opportunity to the assessee to adduce evidence either on points

specified by them or not specified by them, the Tribunal (for reasons to be recorded) may allow such document to be produced or witness to be examined or affidavit to be filed or may allow such evidence to be adduced.

It has been held by the Rajasthan High Court in the case of CIT v. Rao Raja Hanut Singh [2001] 117 Taxman 613 (Raj.) that it is well settled that production of additional evidence at the appellate stage is not a matter of right to the litigating party but within the discretion of the court, which is to be exercised judiciously after following Rule 29 of Income-tax (Appellate Tribunal) Rules, 1963.

The question whether discretion has been exercised judiciously or not cannot obviously be ordinarily a question of law unless it can be disputed or found that in exercising that discretion the Tribunal has ignored some well-settled legal principles in the matter of

exercise of such discretion or has acted so grossly or arbitrarily that no authority trained and disposed to adjudicate the rights of the litigating parties as a judicial or quasi-judicial Tribunal would exercise discretion in that manner. Similar view has been expressed in the case of Virbhadra Singh (HUF) v. Pr. CIT [2017] 86 taxmann.com 113 (Himachal Pradesh). In the case of Dr. Prannoy Roy v. Deputy CIT [2018] 93 taxmann.com 328 (Delhi) it was held that Tribunal cannot accept additional evidence without complying with provisions of rule 29 of Income-tax (Appellate Tribunal) Rules, 1963.

University, established in the 5th century AD in the ancient Magadh Empire (modern Bihar), was famous all over the world. Ten thousand students from all over the world studied here. As the world's first residential university, the grandeur of Nalanda University attracted scholars from all over the world, including China, Korea, Japan, Tibet, Mongolia, Sri Lanka and South East Asia. Subjects like medicine, Ayurveda, Buddhism, mathematics, grammar, astronomy and Indian philosophy were taught at Nalanda. Aryabhata, the pioneer of Indian mathematics and inventor of zero, was one of the eminent teachers

Every stage of development can be reached only by climbing the ladder of education. If we want to see India as a developed country by the year 2047 on the occasion of completion of 100 years of independence, then this is possible only due to education but it is not so simple and easy. For this, a lot of work will have to be done for the universities of the country. Government universities will have to be energized. All the states will have to compete to strengthen the structure of their respective universities. The condition of education and government universities in the country from primary education to post-graduation is very worrying. Education has been ignored in the seventy years after independence. Adequate provisions for education were not made in the budget. This is the reason why our government universities and other higher institutions

lagged behind. In our country, private universities are continuously expanding, earning money but on the contrary, universities funded by UGC are lagging behind. The infrastructure of most of our universities is not strong. They lack world-class smart class rooms. There is a lack of good auditoriums, libraries, academic blocks and excellent labs. economy and culture also become strong." If we look at the developed countries, we will find that they became economic and cultural leaders only when they became educational leaders. Today, students from all over the world want to go to those countries and study. Once such a situation used to exist in our institutions like Nalanda and Vikramshila." Modi has a vision, he is doing extensive work and is restoring the country's glory. The period in which we are living now is a period of revolutionary, glorious and big positive changes for India. The whole world is accepting our culture. People are inclined towards India's glorious and ancient culture. Even the youth who were attracted towards western culture are adopting our culture again. Cloudburst Triggers Floods In Arunachal Pradesh, Rescue Ops Underway

Arunachal Pradesh (KCN): Following a cloudburst, several areas of Arunachal Pradesh's Itanagar city have been inundated, causing significant damage to residents' property. Reports indicated that numerous houses and vehicles have been damaged due to the floodwaters. The capital complex witnessed incidents of landslides affecting both vehicle and house premises. Denizens are urged to remain vigilant and cautious amid the inclement weather conditions. Authorities have been monitoring the situation closely. Efforts are underway to assist affected residents and manage the aftermath of the natural disaster. The



local administration has been taking all the necessary steps. The state of Arunachal Pradesh has been witnessing continuous rainfall. Earlier on Tuesday, the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Capital Itanagar announced the

immediate closure of the road from Nirjuli to Banderdewa due to severe damage caused by continuous rainfall in the Karsingsa area. A portion of the road has slid down, and a culvert has been washed away, rendering the route impassable.

After a thorough site inspection by the District Administration, Police, and Highway Department, it was decided to close the affected road segment and divert all traffic via Gumto. Notably, several landslide incidents have

been reported in many places in the state of Arunachal Pradesh following heavy rainfall. It is noteworthy that the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a weather forecast, stating that heavy rain is very likely to occur at isolated places in Arunachal Pradesh in the next five days. For the next seven days, IMD has forecast that light to moderate rain is very likely to occur at most places in Arunachal Pradesh. Meanwhile, the southwest monsoon has marked its arrival in Maharashtra in regions like Navsari, Jalgaon, Amravati, Chandrapur, and in different regions like Bijapur, Sukma, Malkangiri, Vizianagaram, and Islampur.

Arvind Kejriwal Approaches Supreme Court Against High Court's Stay On Bail



New Delhi (KCN): Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has approached the Supreme Court, challenging the Delhi High Court's pause on his bail in a corruption case related to the liquor policy case till a petition by the Enforcement Directorate is heard. The Central agency had challenged the bail granted to Mr Kejriwal hours before he was to leave Tihar jail. On Friday, the high court said till it heard the agency's petition, the trial

court order for bail will not take effect. Mr Kejriwal's lawyers have sought a hearing tomorrow. Mr Kejriwal was arrested by the ED on charges of money laundering. The agency has alleged that the Chief Minister got money from the liquor lobby for framing the excise policy and it was used to fund his Aam Aadmi Party's election campaign in Goa. He has been in jail since March 21 except for a brief interim bail granted

by the Supreme Court ahead of the general election. In its latest petition, the ED argued that the trial court's order granting bail to Mr Kejriwal was "perverse" and had serious procedural irregularities. The court's order was flawed, it said, since it was based on wrong information. "On wrong facts, wrong dates, you come to a conclusion that mala fide," Additional Solicitor General (ASG) SV Raju, representing the ED, had said. Mr Kejriwal's wife, Sunita Kejriwal said his bail order was challenged even before it was uploaded on the court's website. "Even before the bail order was uploaded, the ED went to the high court to get it stayed. Dictatorship has crossed all limits in the country," she said.

Men Arrested From Bihar Handed NEET Paper To 30-Odd Students: Sources

Patna (KCN): The three men arrested in Bihar in connection with the alleged paper leak of the medical entrance exam NEET, had copies of all the question papers and the answer sheets, said sources in the HRD ministry after the police sent in its investigation report. So far 13 people have been arrested in Bihar in connection with the case. The police found photocopies of admit cards of four NEET candidates, an iPhone 15 Plus and One Plus mobile from them. After questioning the men -- Sikandar Yadvendu, Akhilesh Kumar and Bittu Kumar -- the police found they circulated the papers and answer sheets among the four candidates. The conspiracy involved the arrested men, and a few others -- Sanjeev Singh, Rocky, Nitish and



Amit Anand, sources said. The questioning of the candidates revealed that besides them, 25-30 other candidates also received the question paper and the solved answer sheets. The arrested men said they had charged each candidate ? 30 to 40 lakh to help them pass the exam, sources said. The Central Bureau of Investigation has now taken over the probe into

the alleged paper leak after a complaint was filed by the HRD ministry. They have filed a case of fraud and criminal conspiracy and are expected to take charge of the people arrested in the case as well. The ministry has also asked the CBI to inquire into the role of public servants, if any, connected with the

holding of the exam and the "larger conspiracy", sources said. Student protests have been raging across the country after allegations of multiple irregularities including cheating and impersonation surfaced following the declaration of results. The students have been demanding the exam be rescheduled for everyone and not the

1500-odd students who received grace marks. This, however, has not been accepted by the government and the re-test for 1,563 candidates, who had initially received grace marks, is being held today. The matter has snowballed into a huge political row with the Opposition backing the protesting students.

Odisha CM Orders Strengthening River Embankments To Tackle Floods

Four technical committees asked to submit reports within 100 days

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Saturday held a meeting with the senior officials of the Water Resources Department to review the preparedness of possible flood management during the current monsoon season. In the review meeting, Majhi directed the departmental officials

to immediately strengthen all the weak river embankments; remain alert during floods and take necessary measures to tackle the deluge. Besides, the Chief Minister reviewed the details of the ongoing works under various schemes of the Water Resources Department and directed the officials to complete the projects within the stipulated



time. Further, CM Majhi today ordered the formation of four technical teams to fulfil the poll promises including formulation of policies for better flood control and management, Mahanadi river rejuvenation and review of rule curve, formulation of water conservation policy, improvement of inland

waterways and timely removal of silt from the reservoirs. The members of the four technical committees have been directed to submit a report within 100 days. In this review meeting, Development Commissioner and ACS of Water Resources Department Anu Garg, and other senior officials were present.

Two Kumki elephants return to Similipal from Satkosia

Keonjhar(KCN): Two Kumki (trained) male elephants — Mahendra and Rajkumar — deployed in Satkosia sanctuary under Angul district for the last five years have returned to Kendumundi area of Similipal sanctuary in Mayurbhanj district, their home base. The tuskers were carried on two Hyva trucks on NH-49 through Keonjhar district with protection. Forest officials of Mayurbhanj, Keonjhar and Angul forest divisions along with an elephant expert and veterinary team escorted the elephants to Kendumundi, sources said. Forest officials took special measures for their transportation during summer. Besides provision of sufficient food, the animals were



bathed through water cannons by the Fire department at different places on their way in Mayurbhanj and Keonjhar districts. Divisional Forest Officer, Keonjhar HD Dhanraj said, "The two elephants are 'kumki' as they have been trained. After spending five years

in Satkosia sanctuary under Angul forest division, they have now returned to their home station." According to sources, the two trained elephants of Similipal sanctuary along with their Mahouts (handlers) had been taken to Satkosia sanctuary

around five years back to monitor the Royal Bengal tigress 'Sundari'. The tigress had spread panic in the area, pouncing on livestock and attacking people. After Sunderi was shifted, the two kumkis remained there for years.

BeMC politics: BJD tries to keep flock united after poll defeat



Berhampur(KCN): Apprehending defection and horse trading following the poll debacle, Biju Janata Dal (BJD) is keeping a close watch on its 36 corporators in Berhampur Municipal Corporation (BeMC), sources said Friday. BJD has gone on the defensive after its drubbing by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in the recently concluded Lok Sabha and Assembly elections. The crumbling of the BJD fort in Ganjam district has sparked concern among its leaders who now fear that the ruling BJP might poach its corporators or the latter might defect to the saffron party. Chatters are abuzz over the course of the future

politics in Ganjam district. The debacle of BJD has given rise to new political equations in the southern district. While 36 wards of BeMC are under Berhampur Assembly segment, rest six wards come under Gopalpur Assembly segment. In the 2022 civic body elections, BJD won in 30 wards out of the total 42 wards of BeMC. While BJP secured victory in seven wards, the Congress won in one ward and Independents in four wards. Four corporators from BJP and two Independents defected to BJD before the general elections held this year. As a result, the number of BJD corporators rose to 36 in the civic body.

Sources said the BJP candidate for Berhampur Assembly constituency won by defeating his nearest BJD rival by a big margin of 18,000 votes. This has altered the political equation in BeMC. Meanwhile, two years have passed since the civic body election and formation of an elected council of BeMC. As per Orissa Municipal Corporation Act, the opposition can move no confidence motion against the mayor and the ruling council, two years after the formation of the council. While the BJP candidate wrested from BJD the MLA seat from Berhampur Assembly constituency, the saffron

party has also formed the government in the state. Apprehending foul play and horse trading, the defeated BJD candidate and party's district president Ramesh Chandra Chyau Patnaik has launched efforts in advance to plug the loopholes and prevent any defection. During a discussion he informed that the party is keeping a track on the movements of its 36 corporators. Notably, BJP had launched a tirade against the BJD before and after the civic body elections here. The BJP candidate and their campaigners tried to attract voters during the Assembly election by highlighting corruption and irregularities in the BeMC. BJP had also organised several demonstrations and agitations in front of the BeMC office before the 2024 elections. Meanwhile, the BJP candidate for Berhampur Lok Sabha segment and the party candidate from Berhampur Assembly constituency have won with good margin of votes. This has concerned the BJD leaders, workers, and the elected party corporators of BeMC.

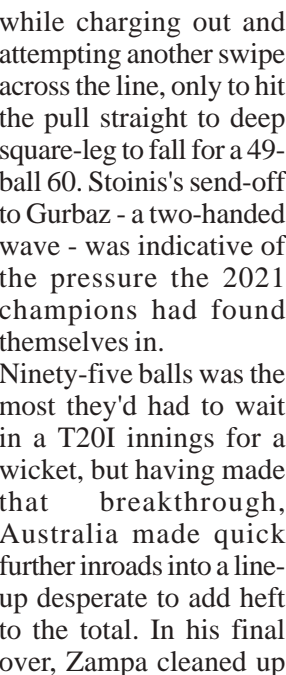

New Delhi: Afghanistan came close twice - in 2022 and 2023 - but at the third time of trying, they got their big moment under the dazzling lights of the Aronos Vale Ground in St Vincent by downing World Cup royalty Australia with an outstanding all-round performance. This win for the ages was set up by a third century stand of the tournament between openers Rahmanullah Gurbaz (60) and Ibrahim Zadran (51), but the biggest flex came from veteran Gulbadin Naib, who returned figures of 4 for 20 in the defence of 148. Among his scalps was that of Glenn Maxwell, who was the only Australian standing between Afghanistan and arguably their greatest win in T20 World Cup history. In the first two phases of the game. At the 15-over mark, Afghanistan were 109/0 while Australia were tottering at 108/6. Afghanistan lost their way at the death on what was a tricky, tacky surface but were able to

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PowerPlay - all bowled by spinners - fetched Afghanistan exactly a run-a-ball 24 as the Afghan openers opted for risk-averse methods to reinforce the foundations through the middle overs. They were sprightly in their running between the wickets and were helped along in their budding partnership by some uncharacteristic Australian fielding benevolence. Marcus Stoinis missed a catch on his bowling followthrough to reprieve Zadran while Matthew Wade missed a stumping -- off Zampa -- that would have dismissed Gurbaz. Either side of that slip, Gurbaz hit Zampa for a straight six and another misfield in the deep from Agar allowed him to pick up another four. At 109/0 after the 15th over with Gurbaz on 52 and Zadran on 49, Afghanistan were well placed to get to 160 or more with a good final push. The final flourish, however, didn't come. Gurbaz slapped Stoinis for his fourth six in the 16th over before falling



Azmatullah Omarzai with a slider and then produced a short-ball from a front-arm release that got big on Ibrahim Zadran, who ended up splicing it to short third-man.

Cummins then returned with his bag of cutters and exploited the slowish track to great effect. He dismissed Rashid Khan with the last ball of his third over and then had Karim Janat and Gulbadin Naib slogging to fielders in the deep at the start of his final over to complete hat-tricks in successive games.

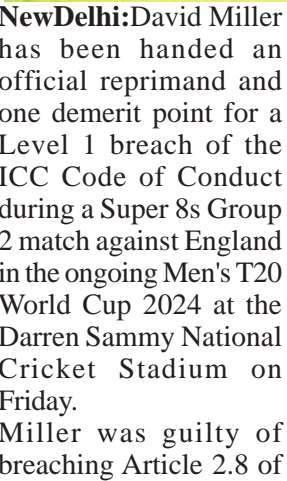
There were two more drops from Australia's fields and a Hazlewood over costed 15, allowing Afghanistan to inch towards 150. It was Naveen-ul-Haq and not the chart-topping Fazalhaq Farooqi that opened the bowling for Afghanistan and the change-up proved astute. Naveen generated significant movement, in the air and off the pitch, and with his third delivery, cleaned up Travis Head with a ball that curled away from his around-the-wicket angle. Naveen then deceived

Mitchell Marsh with a slower ball that the Australian captain looked to hit over mid-off on length but only managed to sky it to the fielder. David Warner fell in the sixth, top-edging a sweep off Mohammad Nabi, as Afghanistan began to make their score seem more than it was by restricting their powerful opponents to their lowest PowerPlay score of the tournament.

Maxwell and the in-form Marcus Stonis set about rebuilding Australia's innings and 37 runs came in the first four post-PowerPlay overs. At 70/3 after 10 overs, Australia were well placed in the chase. It was then that the veteran seam-bowling all-rounder entered the attack. With his third delivery, he broke the partnership with a short ball that got big on Stonis, who top-edged an attempted pull. Nabi trapped Tim David LBW in his next over but between those two strikes, Maxwell struck two sixes and raced to a 35-ball 50, invoking the ghosts of Mumbai, 2023.

With Australia playing out three of Rashid's overs without giving the opposition captain, and talisman, a wicket, the onus was on the other end to turn into an attacking edge. Naib proved to be just that as he got Maxwell slicing a full ball uppishly to backward point, where Noor Ahmad took a sharp catch. At that stage Australia needed just 42 to win from 33. Rashid came back to bowl his final over in the innings' 16th. He struck with his first ball as Matthew Wade top-edged a sweep. The situation was now beyond even miracle-man Cummins, who swung across the line to a Naib delivery and was castled by one that kept low. It was the final nail in Australia's coffin and Afghanistan were almost home and dry to celebrate one of their greatest days in the sport. Euro 2024: Belgium get tournament back on track with 2-0 win against Romania

New Delhi: Belgium got their Euro 2024 campaign back on track with a comfortable 2-0 win over Romania in Cologne on June 22, Saturday. Belgium's win left Group E wide open as all 4 teams have equal points. A goal by Youri Tielemans after 73 seconds and a late one for Kevin De Bruyne gave Belgium a 2-0 win over Romania in an incredible, action-packed game on Saturday that set up a final round showdown with all four teams in Group E on three points. It was a Euro 2024 Saturday night special played in an astonishing atmosphere in Cologne, with the only mystery being how there were only two goals. It meant that, for the first time in European



play Romania, where four points could be enough to top the group but could also see a team eliminated. Romania and Belgium have the advantage with a plus-one goal difference. Slovakia are on zero and Ukraine on -2 - with those goal differences

the deciding factor should both games end level. "We were very relieved we won the game, it was very important to get three points," said Belgium coach Domenico Tedesco. "Romania gave us a bit more space than Slovakia but with the quality and quantity of our chances it

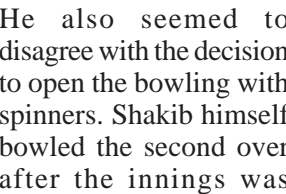
would have been good if we could have scored more early on - four or five goals tonight would have been possible." Belgium, still somehow ranked third in the world by FIFA, were unrecognisable from the sluggish side shocked by Slovakia in their opening game, pouring forward and full of energy from the first whistle. It paid dividends immediately as Romelu Lukaku held up the ball with his back to goal before rolling it into the path of Tielemans, who drilled home a crisp, low shot. Four minutes later Romania went close with a header by Radu Dragusin that Koen Casteels saved well, but it was a brief respite as Belgium ran the first-half show.

New Delhi: Bangladesh all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan seemed to disagree with the team management's decision to bowl first in the Super 8 contest against India in Antigua on Saturday (June 22).

"Personally if you ask me in the Caribbean it's one or two games - when England chased that 180. Other than that batting first has been the trend for most of the teams and they have been very successful. So, if you look at the stats, I think, yeah, ideally you would have batted first, but maybe the captain and coach thought otherwise," Shakib said

after the 50-run loss to India. Interestingly, Rohit Sharma said he would have batted first. Shakib tried to guess the rationale behind the decision at the toss. "We thought that we could restrict them in a reasonable way so that there is a score in our head and we know how we should go about when we bat. So maybe that's the reason we decided to field first," Shakib said. Asked if he was consulted about the decision being a senior player in the side, Shakib answered in negative. "No, I don't have any part or role in this." He went on, "These are

not the issues of experience or seniority. When there is a leader, a captain, it's his decision. If we would do well, the credit would go to the captain. If we did bad, we question the decision of the coach and captain. It's normal. It seems very reasonable to me. But that's how it goes. It's how the game is played. If you could see that we took two wickets in the first two overs, then you would think that it was a good decision. Since there were no wickets in the first two overs, naturally we thought that it would be better if we were batting first in this wicket."



opened by off-spinner Mahedi Hasan. Shakib, in fact, bowled two of the first four overs, of which three were sent down by spinners. "Well,

that's difficult for me to explain. It's the coach and captain's decision. They make the decision who to bowl, when to bowl. So, it's hard for me to in this
