"Sometimes Governments Last Only A Day": Mamata Banerjee's Reminder

Kolkata(KCN): Riding high on her party's big win against the BJP in West Bengal, Trinamool Congress chief Mamata Banerjee has dropped a strong hint that the INDIA bloc could take over the reins at the Centre soon, saying that governments "sometimes last only for a day". Speaking after a Trinamool Parliamentary Party meeting on Saturday, a day before the oath-taking ceremony of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his ministers, Ms Banerjee also said her party will not be attending the event because the government is being formed "illegally and undemocratically". PM Modi and the BJP are having to depend on allies this time - especially Chandrababu Naidu's TDP and Nitish Kumar's JDU - because the party has managed to win only 240 Lok Sabha seats in the just-concluded elections, falling short of the majority mark by 32. Taking a dig at the BJP for the situation it has found itself in after achieving majorities on its own twice since 2014, the Bengal chief minister said, "Those who spoke of 400 (Lok Sabha seats) could not get even a



simple majority on their own. Don't think just because INDIA has not staked claim (to form a government), nothing will happen. We are waiting and watching because things change. Ultimately, it will be a new INDIA government, but let them be for a few days. Sometimes, governments last only for a day... Anything can happen, who knows if this government will last even 15 days?" The INDIA alliance managed to clinch 232 Lok Sabha seats, thanks to a resurgent Congress and a strong showing by allies like the Samajwadi Party, Trinamool Congress and the DMK. The Trinamool is the fourth largest party in Parliament and INDIA bloc members make up four of the top five, but the alliance is still far short of the number

needed for a majority. That - and even the letters of support to the BJP from NDA allies - has not stopped INDIA bloc leaders from hinting that they can form a government. Even Congress leader Mallikarjun Kharge had said after an alliance meeting on Thursday that the INDIA alliance will take appropriate steps at the appropriate time to "realise the people's desire not to be ruled by the BJP". Keeping up her attack on the BJP, Ms Banerjee said that laws that have been passed using "brute force", including the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), should be cancelled. On the oath-taking ceremony on Sunday, she said, "We cannot give them best wishes as they are forming a government illegally and

undemocratically. They will try and break parties again. But they will break from within as many people are unhappy... We have not received an invite for the swearing-in ceremony and we will not go." Inviting all INDIA bloc members to Kolkata for a meeting, the Bengal chief minister pointed out that the state voted in each of the seven phases of the Lok Sabha elections between April 19 and June 1. "The election process cannot go on for two months. We demand this change in the interest of the people," she said. The Trinamool Congress has won 29 of the state's 42 Lok Sabha seats, up from 22, while the BJP's tally went down from 18 in 2019 to 12 this time. At Saturday's party meeting, Ms Banerjee was elected the chairperson of the Trinamool Congress Parliamentary Party. Sudip Bandyopadhyay will be the party's leader in the Lok Sabha with Kakoli Ghosh Dastidar as the deputy leader. In the Rajya Sabha, the party will be led by Derek O'Brien again and first-time MP Sagarika Ghosh will be the deputy leader.

Bhadrak: 108 Ambulance Catches Fire As Oxygen Cylinder Explodes, None Hurt

Bhadrak(KCN): A 108 Ambulance vehicle, ferrying a road accident victim, caught fire after the oxygen cylinder exploded near Betada Bazar on Jamujhadi-Basudevpur road in Bhadrak district. On Saturday afternoon, a truck collided with a bike near Betada Bazar. The locals called the 108 emergency services and the seriously injured victim was rushed to the hospital in the ambulance. However, while the 108 staff were providing oxygen support to the victims, the cylinder exploded and the



ambulance burst into flames. Fortunately, all managed to alight before the ambulance caught fire and the accident victim was taken to in another private vehicle. Meanwhile, Basudebpur fire brigade reached the scene and doused the flames, but by that time, the emergency vehicle was completely burnt.

Truck Dashes Into 'Mo Bus' In Cuttack, 16 Injured, Hospitalised

Cuttack(KCN): As many as 16 persons sustained injuries after a truck dashed into 'Mo Bus' on the National Highway in Cuttack on Saturday. The mishap occurred near Pratapnagari. Ending Child Labour: A Worldwide Mission for Sustainable Development



Child labour persists as a grave violation of children's rights and a significant impediment to social and economic development worldwide. Defined by the International Labour Organization (ILO) as work that deprives children of their childhood, right to education, health, a nurturing environment potential and dignity which inflict severe physical, emotional, and psychological harm on them, it is a multifaceted issue deeply entrenched in poverty, lack of education, and societal inequalities. Forced into hazardous work conditions, these children endure injuries, illnesses, and stunted growth, compromising their future prospects. Moreover, the psychological toll of exploitation can lead to trauma, low self-esteem, and perpetuation of the cycle of poverty. The worst forms of child labour involve children being enslaved, separated from their families, exposed to serious hazards and illnesses and/or left to fend for themselves on the streets of large cities – often at a very early age. Understanding the root causes of child labour is

crucial for developing effective interventions. Poverty stands as the primary driver, forcing families to rely on children for additional income. Additionally, lack of access to quality education perpetuates the cycle, as illiterate parents often prioritize short-term economic gains over long-term benefits of education. Social and cultural factors also play a role, as traditional norms and practices may condone child labour or prioritize boys' education over girls'. Discrimination, particularly against marginalized groups, further exacerbates vulnerability to exploitation. International bodies, governments, and NGOs have made strides in combating child labour through policy reforms, advocacy, and direct interventions. ILO's fundamental conventions on child labour, namely: the Minimum Age Convention, 1973 (No. 138), and the Worst Forms of Child Labour Convention, 1999 (No. 182) entail concrete legal obligations for action by ratifying ILO member States and are both nearing universal ratification. This apart, Article 23(1) of Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) states that everyone has the right to work, but specifically exempts children from exploitative or hazardous work that interferes with their education or harms their health and

development. Similarly, Article 32 of United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) emphasizes the right of the child to be protected from economic exploitation and from performing any work that is likely to be hazardous or to interfere with the child's education, or to be harmful to the child's health or physical, mental, spiritual, moral or social development. Besides, many countries have enacted laws that regulate child labour, setting minimum age requirements for employment, limiting working hours for children, and prohibiting hazardous work. These laws often include provisions for compulsory education up to a certain age to ensure that children have access to schooling and are not forced into the workforce prematurely. Illustratively, India has enacted several laws to address child labour, including the Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986, which prohibits the employment of children below the age of 14 in hazardous occupations and regulates their working conditions in non-hazardous industries. The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009, mandates free and compulsory education for children aged 6 to 14, aiming to prevent child labour by ensuring access to education. Despite significant efforts in recent years, child labour remains a pervasive issue affecting millions of

children globally. According to the International Labour Organization (ILO), an estimated 152 million children are engaged in child labour, with nearly half of them engaged in hazardous work that jeopardizes their health, safety, and well-being. The COVID-19 pandemic has further exacerbated the situation, pushing vulnerable families deeper into poverty and forcing children into exploitative labour to support household incomes. According to the most recent estimates released in 2021, 160 million boys and girls between 5 and 17 years are in child labour. They are often deprived of education and of the potential for a bright future with decent work. 79 million are in hazardous work that directly endangers their safety, health and moral development. According to the Census of India 2011, there were approximately 10.1 million child labourers aged 5-14 years in the country. The National Sample Survey Organization (NSSO) conducted a survey in 2009-2010, estimating the number of child labourers in India to be around 4.35 million. Child labour affects children of various age groups, but it is more prevalent among older children. Many children start working at a young age and continue throughout their adolescence. The

majority of child labourers are in the age group of 10-14 years, although children as young as 5 years old are also engaged in work. Child labour affects both boys and girls, but there are gender disparities in the types of work and sectors in which they are engaged. Girls are often involved in domestic work, agriculture, and informal sectors, while boys are more likely to work in industries such as manufacturing, construction, and transportation. In spite of progress, significant challenges hinder the eradication of child labour. Enforcement of laws remains weak in many regions due to corruption, inadequate resources, and lack of political will. Moreover, globalization has created complex supply chains where child labour often hides, making oversight difficult. Cultural norms and traditions also perpetuate the acceptance of child labour in some societies, posing additional barriers to eradication efforts. Governments must enforce existing laws and enact stronger legislation to protect children from exploitation. This includes stricter penalties for violators and mechanisms for monitoring and reporting incidents of child labour. Investing in education is crucial for breaking the cycle of poverty and reducing the demand for child labour. Awareness campaigns targeting parents, communities, and

employers can change attitudes towards child labour and promote alternative solutions. Poverty alleviation programs, vocational training, and access to microfinance can provide families with sustainable alternatives to child labour. Economic empowerment enables parents to afford education and meet their basic needs without relying on their children's labour. Companies must uphold ethical labour standards throughout their supply chains and conduct regular audits to identify and address instances of child labour. Consumers can also advocate for ethical sourcing practices by supporting companies that prioritize child rights. Mobilizing communities to take ownership of the issue fosters sustainable solutions tailored to local contexts. Empowering grassroots organizations, involving religious and community leaders, and providing support services for at-risk families are essential components of community-based approaches. There is no contradiction between the elimination of child labour including hazardous work by children above the general minimum age for work on the one hand and the promotion of youth employment on the other. This overlapping age group who are still "children" below 18 years of age are also in the younger age range of "youth" whose employment should be

promoted. The ultimate goal for these adolescents must not just be getting them out of hazardous work, but also ensuring their transition into decent youth employment with appropriate protection of their occupational safety and health. While the world comes together to observe the World Day Against Child Labour on June 12th every year, the theme for World Day Against Child Labour 2024 revolves around the urgent need to "Protect Children from Exploitative Labour in Agriculture." Agriculture remains one of the sectors with the highest prevalence of child labour, accounting for a significant proportion of child labourers worldwide. This year's theme underscores the importance of addressing the root causes of child labour in agriculture, including poverty, lack of access to education, and inadequate social protection systems and will focus on celebrating the 25th anniversary of the adoption of ILO Convention No. 182 calling all remaining member States that have not done so to ratify Convention No. 138. The World Day will also be an opportunity for reminding all stakeholders to improve their implementation of the above two fundamental ILO Conventions on child labour. To mark this occasion, governments, civil society organizations, employers,

and workers' associations are encouraged to organize various initiatives and activities aimed at raising awareness, advocating for policy reforms, and mobilizing resources to combat child labour. These initiatives may include awareness campaigns, policy dialogues, capacity-building workshops, and community outreach programs targeting vulnerable populations in rural areas where child labour in agriculture is prevalent. By addressing the root causes of child labour, investing in education and social protection, and enforcing laws and policies to safeguard children's rights, we can create a world where every child is free to enjoy their childhood, pursue their dreams, and realize their full potential. Let's seize this opportunity to renew our commitment to the eradication of child labour and build a future where no child is forced to sacrifice their childhood for economic survival.

Cancer on the Rise Among Young Adults: Causes, Prevention, and Action



As we unfold new frontiers in science and technology, promising breakthroughs and unprecedented achievements, we are also confronted with an equally pressing reality: the alarming rise in deadly diseases. At a press conference following the a meeting of the extended Congress Working Committee (CWC), party general secretary

KC Venugopal said CWC members unanimously requested Gandhi to take the Leader of Opposition role. "Rahul Gandhi said he would take a decision on it very soon," Venugopal said.

This will be the first time that the Congress, since its ouster from power in 2014, will get the post of Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha. It failed to get the position in the past 10 years as its tally was below the requisite

10 per cent of total seats in the House, both in 2014 and 2019.

Venugopal also said the party's leaders and workers are charged up and asserted that the CWC sentiment is that the Congress' revival has begun. The CWC adopted two resolutions, one hailing the role of Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge, Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra for the party's performance in

the Lok Sabha polls.

It also credited the Rahul Gandhi-led Bharat Jodo Yatras for its good performance. The CWC resolution also said the people's verdict was not just a political loss but a personal and moral defeat for Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who had sought a mandate in his name.

The Congress has emerged as the second-largest party in the Lok Sabha, improving its tally to 99 from 52 in the 2019 elections.

At a meeting of party MPs, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge proposed Sonia Gandhi's name as the chairperson of the parliamentary



party. The proposal was seconded by Gaurav Gogoi, K Sudhakaran and Tariq Anwar.

Earlier, the Congress Working Committee (CWC) unanimously urged Rahul Gandhi to take on the mantle of the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha and he told the party's top brass that he will take a decision on it "very soon".

Chandrababu Naidu's TDP To Get 4 Ministers, Nitish Kumar's JDU 2 In Modi 3.0: Sources

New Delhi (KC): Chandrababu Naidu's TDP will be getting four portfolios in the new cabinet led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, while the JDU will get two berths, sources have said. Three of the four TDP leaders who may find a place in PM Modi's new cabinet are - Ram Mohan Naidu, Harish Balayogi and Daggumalla Prasad. Nitish Kumar's Janata Dal (United) has proposed the name of two senior

leaders - Lalan Singh and Ram Nath Thakur. Lalan Singh was elected to the Lok Sabha from Bihar's Munger, while Ram Nath Thakur is a Rajya Sabha MP. Mr Thakur is the son of Bharat Ratna recipient Karpoori Thakur.

The decision was taken at a National Democratic Alliance (NDA) meeting to decide on the cabinet berths ahead of the government's swearing-in tomorrow.

According to sources, TDP had sought four portfolios and the post of the parliamentary speaker after winning 16 Lok Sabha seats in Andhra Pradesh. JD(U) had asked two cabinet berths after winning 12 seats.

Mr Kumar and Mr Naidu emerged as kingmakers after the BJP secured only 240 seats, falling short of the 272 needed for a majority government. The NDA

clinched 293 seats in the 543-member Lok Sabha, marking a significant victory, and Prime Minister Narendra Modi will take oath for a third consecutive term on Sunday. The coalition negotiations are a throwback to an era before 2014 - when PM Modi swept to power with an outright BJP majority - in which alliance partners haggled for positions and benefits.

Overconfidence led to Ray's downfall

Rourkela(KCN): Despite the saffron wave sweeping Odisha, BJP's Rourkela MLA candidate Dilip Ray lost to BJD's Sarada Prasad Nayak. It was an unexpected result keeping in mind that Ray indeed was a heavyweight candidate and had emerged victorious in many elections before this one. Political analysts, however, have their own opinions on the result. Some said that Ray was 'overconfident' while others pointed out that his 'camp had taken Sarada

lightly' and did not campaign the way it should have. Many of them thought that Sarada won't be a match for Ray due to the latter's popularity and money power. Little did they realise that Ray's popularity had waned in the past few years in this constituency. Sources close to Ray also pointed out that this time there were too many people who were giving orders and opinions in the Ray camp. They pointed out that this led to a 'disjointed' campaign and in the end Ray suffered because of

it. It was a case of too many cooks spoiling the broth, they added. However, an insider to the Ray camp stated that strife within the local unit of the BJP here led to Ray's defeat. "Once Ray's name was announced as a candidate, many of them started working for the BJD," the insider said on condition of anonymity. "In fact many of them even voted for the BJD," he added. Orissa POST had reported this issue May 10. Another Ray camp insider said that Nihar Ray's rebellion was

a key factor in Ray's loss. Nihar had filed his nomination after BJP announced Ray as its candidate. Even though he did not win, the votes Nihar got were enough to upset Ray's appellation, the person opined. However, above all, it was the mistake of taking Sarada lightly which played a pivotal role in Ray's defeat, many including the BJP cadres opined. "Many of them (Ray camp) thought that they would end Sarada's political career. They failed to assess the pulse of the people and so

lost," said a political analyst. "There were large chunks of voters, especially in Bondamunda locality who did not like Ray as a candidate and hence did not vote for him," he added. In the end Nayak emerged victorious with 64,660 votes as against Ray's 61,108. Congress candidate Birendra Nath Pattnaik may have got only 8,751 votes, but then it was enough to spoil Ray's party. Also the decision of the Marwari community here to desert Ray was another reason for his downfall, others opined.

Berhampur(KCN): In the village of Bipilingi of Chhatrapur in Ganjam district, Bharat Reddy's journey from barren land to flourishing orchard is a testament to his perseverance. What began as a challenging endeavour for Reddy has now blossomed into a thriving guava and citrus farm, thanks to collaboration with the Tata Steel Foundation (TSF). Initially when he was working on barren lands, Reddy's dream of developing a fruit orchard seemed distant. However, with TSF's assistance, he successfully planted

1,100 guava trees and 150 citrus trees, transforming his one-and-half-acre land to a

kilogram in the local market has significantly boosted his family's income. He has earned an additional income of Rs 22,000 by selling guava only and is now waiting for the citrus harvest. This remarkable achievement is further underscored by the variety of guava he cultivates—Taiwan Pink—known for its resilience and rapid productivity, maturing in just 11 months. The success of Reddy's orchard symbolises more than just agricultural yield; it represents sustainable growth and enduring prosperity



SHGs jittery over fate of Mission Shakti

Baripada(KCN): Members of women self-help groups (SHGs) in Mayurbhanj district have become self-reliant and financially independent by undertaking various livelihood programmes under the Mission Shakti scheme, a report said. However, the SHG members and residents of the district are in utter apprehension over possible abolition of Mission Shakti programme after Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) stormed into power by gaining majority in the recently concluded elections. They are now in a dilemma whether the new BJP government will continue with the schemes and programmes launched during the last 24 years of the former BJD government or abolish them. The possibility of scrapping the BJD schemes or replacing them has started haunting the SHG members while they are anxious about the approach of the new government that would be formed soon. This has pushed them into distress. Reports said sabai grass cultivation,



manufacturing of sal leaf products, collection of minor forest produce, raggi cultivation and livestock farming have not only provided them a livelihood but made them financially independent. The district has around 47,175 women SHGs in 26 blocks with a membership strength of around 4,71,750. There are 2,909 groups in Badasahi block, 1,180 in Bahalda block, 1,708 in Bangiriposhi block, 1,950 in Baripada block, 2,075 in Betanoti block, 1,014 in Bijatala block, 1,105 in Bisoi block, 1,321 in Gopabandhu Nagar block, 909 in Jamda block, 1,442 in Jashipur block, 2,328 in Kaptipada block,

1,924 in Karanjia block, 1,207 in Khunta block, 1,489 in Kuliana block, 1,268 in Kusumi block and 2,161 in Morada block. Similarly, there are 1,445 SHGs in Rasagovindpur block, 1,093 in Rairangpur block, 1,238 in Raruan block, 1,422 in Saraskana block, 1,436 in Shamakhunta block, 1,002 in Sukruli block, 1,693 in Suliapada block, 1,679 in Thakurmunda block, 855 in Tiring block and 1,368 in Udala block. In order to strengthen the Mission Shakti programme and ensure its proper implementation, the state government had created district level federations,

block level federations, gram panchayat level federations and engaged Bank Mitras, though with nominal remunerations. The state government had even announced to pay pension to the women SHG members. However, some observers, who were having a close watch on the functioning of the scheme, said the scheme lost its direction as a few unscrupulous SHG office bearers started doing politics while there were reports of pilferage of funds which in turn cost the BJD government dearly.

Consequently, the votes of the women members went in favour of BJP. Meanwhile, the residents are also apprehensive on continuation of Aahaar scheme, LAccMI bus service, Nua-O scholarship, BSKY and other host of schemes launched by the BJD government. On the other hand, BJP has promised to launch Lakhpati Didi scheme where every women will get a voucher of Rs 50,000.

Post dad's demise, youth vows to popularise puppet dance


Champua(KCN): Setting yet another example of preserving the dying traditional art forms of Odisha, Arjun Singh of a sleepy village under this block in Keonjhar district has taken a pledge to help 'puppet dance' (Kandhei Nacha in Odia) thrive following the untimely demise of his father Munibar Singh, a popular puppeteer of the region. Puppetry in Odisha has served as a medium of entertainment for the general public, not only in rural areas but also in urban setups. After the untimely demise of his father Munibar of Tiansi village, Arjun has kept his promise made to his father by embracing this traditional art form and



using it as a source of livelihood for his family. According to sources, after Munibar's death, his son Arjun upheld the traditional art form and never let it lose popularity. Arjun has gained considerable experience by assisting his father in various puppet dance events, and eventually, he established himself as an ace puppeteer in the region. He has taken the

responsibility of 'Jai Jagannath Kandhei Dance Art Institute', founded by his father. Arjun is leaving no stone unturned in the growth and popularity of puppet dance and he performs numerous puppet plays based on mythological stories like 'Kala Kahnei' and 'Kansa Badha', bringing wooden puppets to life. He portrays various characters through these puppets to

entertain the audience, especially children and the elderly. Arjun maintained that the gradually disappearing puppet dance could further prosper if the government provided some further support. He also mentioned that the income generated from the puppet shows held in different locations is insufficient to meet the needs of the family as his family members also assist him in the profession. So, his family has to depend on farming as well. While mythological stories serve as a medium of social change, creating awareness through traditional puppet dance about these stories is his ultimate goal.

NEWDELHI:angladesh skipper Najmul Hossain credited his bowling unit for holding their nerves in the middle overs against Sri Lanka as it helped them start their ICC T20 World Cup campaign on the right note in Dallas on Saturday.

Bangladesh opted to field and it looked like they were on the verge of paying the price for it after the powerplay when Sri Lanka put up 53 for two and looked set to pose a challenging total before their bowling unit regrouped to restrict them to 124-9, courtesy three wickets from Rishad Hossain and Mustafizur Rahman.

"I did not have any doubt even when they were doing good (in the powerplay) as I always had the faith (in my bowling unit) and the game is like that one or two wickets can help us to make a comeback and the way our bowlers are performing

in the last couple of series I was very confident about them and they did that," Najmul told reporters following their win. "I think we did not get a good start but later the way everyone was calm, they showed good character. We know the batting was not good but on such a wicket and in pressure game things like these will happen and it was a very important match for them. They tried a lot but at the end of the day we got two points and that is why I am feeling good," he said. Najmul also admitted that this has been the most high-pressure match he has played so far in his career given the brewing rivalry between these two sides. "You can say that and I felt that way (on the pressure) and even from the last two days we all knew. Personally I felt I did not play such a high pressure match



before but we could win the game. We all knew how important this match is for us," he said.

Even though the batting unit didn't click once again, Najmul refused to point fingers and insisted that the set

batter should bat for a longer period to help the team cross the finishing line. "I don't think we need to have lot of worries (regarding the batting) and I would say this because it was a pressure match and at the end of the day we

want to win and if we are talking about results we got two points. All the batsman know that we have not batted well but everyone wont bat well everyday like Hridoy played well and Riyad bhai ended the game while Litton after

a while gave a good start and so there are some good things and what I hope is that whoever gets set he should win the game for us like I don't feel that everyday all the seven batsman of the team will play well," said Najmul.

I think that the game is not only for the openers because all the seven or eight batsmen have responsibilities and whoever gets set should end the game and I am hoping in the next game the openers will give a good start. Admitting that the win would boost their confidence, Najmul played down the chatter surrounding the wicket in New York, the venue against South Africa for their next game. "About the New York wicket we have seen that game between Sri Lanka and South Africa on TV. The whole team sat together and watched that game as we did not practice that day. We planned how we should play and there is the India-Pakistan match on the 9th that will give us another opportunity to see the wicket so we have some little idea about the pitch and we have to bat and bowl

according to the wicket that is prepared for our game," he added. Meanwhile, Sri Lankan pacer Nuwan Thushara, who picked 4-18, insisted they were 20 runs short. "The pitch was a difficult one and it was hard for the batters. We were just 20 runs short. If we could have scored those 20 extra runs, we could have won this match. But we did our best for 120 too as we wanted to win this match somehow. We played till the last ball thinking that we could win this match," said Nuwan adding that his stint with Mumbai Indians in the just concluded IPL helped him to keep his calm under pressure. "I think the ones (pitches) in India were very different, those had higher scores and it was hard to bowl there. So, I think it was easier for me to put what I learnt there to this match, as in how to handle the pressure and things like that," he concluded.

Rashid, Fazalhaq and Gurbaz rout undercooked New Zealand



NEWDELHI: Afghanistan produced a statement-making performance in Guyana in a rout of New Zealand, a team fancied to go deep pre-tournament, by 84 runs to take control of Group C, from where they are now heavy favourites to progress. Put in to bat, openers Rahmanullah Gurbaz (80 off 56) and Ibrahim Zadran (44 off 41) registered a second successive century stand to fuel Afghanistan's total of 159. Fazalhaq Farooqi and Rashid Khan then returned identical figures of 4 for 17 as an undercooked Black Caps side not only caved for 75 in the chase but also ended up losing a lot of ground on the Net Run Rate race. Fazalhaq struck with the first ball and struck two more times in his first spell as New Zealand floundered to 33/3 in the PowerPlay. With a growing asking rate to contend with, they kept sliding and folded in 15.2 overs. In the corresponding phase, Afghanistan enjoyed some luck but despite

not being over-aggressive in conditions that had some lateral movement and some two-pace behaviour, they set themselves up to score big by stitching a partnership and then applied scoreboard pressure on the Black Caps. Fortune was on Afghanistan's corner early in the contest as they raced to 21 after two overs with three boundaries being scored off Matt Henry's second over, two of them via edges. In the fourth over, a Mitchell Santner delivery even brushed the leg-stump but raced away to the fine-leg fence without dislodging the bails. Gurbaz was on 12 then and in the company of Ibrahim Zadran, he propped Afghanistan to a steady PowerPlay total of 44. Like Gurbaz, Zadran too was reprieved when Finn Allen put down a simple catch at deep square leg. New Zealand strangled their opponents through the first part of the middle-overs phase as Afghanistan's openers

went through a 27-ball period without scoring a boundary. However, Afghanistan enjoyed more of the rub of the green with Zadran first surviving a run-out attempt at the non-striker's end. In the same Lockie Ferguson over, Gurbaz survived after New Zealand failed to review an LBW decision. The Black Caps continued to be sloppy rusty on the field with even Kane Williamson putting down a catch. But the four overs post the PowerPlay brought Afghanistan just 11 runs. The tide turned in the 11th over when Michael Bracewell was taken apart for three sixes after conceding just six runs from his first two overs. Both Ferguson and Bould conceded a six each in the following overs. Mitchell Santner (0 for 24) stemmed the deluge a bit and Henry cashed in by having Ibrahim Zadran chop one onto his stumps, ending a 103-run opening stand. Azmatullah Omarzai

played a useful cameo at the death, hitting two sixes in a 13-ball 22. Gurbaz continued to motor past his half-century and hit a pair of fours against Ferguson before cashing in on Williamson's decision to bowl an over of Daryl Mitchell to cover for Bracewell by hitting the medium-pacer over long-on and long-off for two sixes, holding his pose on each occasion. Afghanistan were set for a total in the range of 170 but Trent Boult produced a stunning final over giving away just 3 runs. First, Rashid Khan was run-out with Gurbaz trying to get on strike. Boult then cleaned up the in-form batter for 80 with a searing yorker. Gulbadin Naib was the other batter to fall, miscuing a pull, as Afghanistan finished on 159.

The tone for Afghanistan's target defence was set as early as the first ball of the second innings as Fazalhaq Farooqi produced a beautiful inswinger to castle Finn Allen. That brought two batters with very little T20 cricket under their belt in the middle simultaneously. Williamson and Devon Conway couldn't land an immediate counter-punch and that was enough for Farooqi, fresh off a five-fer, to run the Black Caps ragged. He bowled an excellent slower ball that Conway chipped to cover. To Daryl Mitchell, Farooqi went around the stumps and got a delivery to straighten from the angle and

found the edge. Afghanistan could have had Williamson in the PowerPlay too but the New Zealand captain was reprieved on review by Umpire's Call after shuffling across and playing (and missing) around his pads to a ball from Naveen-ul-Haq that jagged back. Williamson didn't last long after the reprieve. Rashid removed his Gujarat Titans teammate with his first ball - also the first post-PowerPlay delivery - with the Black Caps captain guiding a length ball straight to the lone slip fielder. In his next over, Rashid cleaned up Mark Chapman and had Michael Bracewell trapped plumb before the stumps with the next ball. Rashid picked up a fourth wicket with the final ball of his spell when Lockie Ferguson chipped a tame catch back to the bowler. In between, Mohammad Nabi added two wickets of his own as Afghanistan didn't miss the services of the injured Mujeeb Ur Rahman, who missed the game. Fittingly, Fazalhaq returned to finish what he'd started by taking the final wicket as New Zealand folded with 28 balls to spare.

No reason why we can't beat USA and Pakistan: Stirling



NEWDELHI: Ireland captain Paul Stirling has called for his side to adapt to the conditions in the ongoing T20 World Cup quickly and play better cricket in order to reverse their fortunes. Ireland suffered a massive loss against India in their tournament opener and then went down for a second time to Canada on Friday. While Net Run Rate may not come into the picture for Ireland, Stirling first wants to focus on his side just improving and getting wins under their belt. "We've got two huge games," he said after the defeat. "Still massive every time you put on the shirt you want to go and win, but no reason why we can't go and beat USA and Pakistan. We need to play a hell of a lot better if we're going to want to do that. But different conditions, we know them slightly better and will certainly be given it as best a crack as we can. "I think we just want to play as good a cricket as we possibly can. I've sort of hammered for at least the last year that if we don't play our best cricket, we will not win games of cricket. So, we need to get back to our best for next week."

Having been giant killers themselves in the past, Stirling was asked if there is frustration in the Irish camp for not having taken the next leap in world cricket. "I wouldn't say it's frustrating, no," he remarked. "I think knowing from where we've come from - it actually doesn't surprise you. It's not a huge thing, it might be in different levels of the media, but we certainly know not to take anyone lightly from where we've come from and that's just what happened today. "They played better cricket than us for three hours and they won the game, simple as that. That doesn't really, for me, matter what their headline is, associate or full member or what, they just played smarter cricket, better cricket all day than us and they won." Jeremy Gordon, one of Canada's heroes with the ball, conceded that there was a personal satisfaction behind the win given how he fared in that opening game against the USA. "I think just coming back from obviously the first game where we thought we should have won that game," he said. "I feel like all three departments, we kind of

ticked today, so it's a magnificent win for us. I'm very happy obviously to contribute to the team success because I personally felt my over is what kind of gave it away the last game, so for me to come back and help the team get over the line to me, I feel like I've done a good job so I'm quite happy."

This win has given Canada confidence ahead of sterner tests against Pakistan and India, according to Gordon. "There's definitely a lot of confidence - so for us obviously, it's to do the basics right and to be disciplined," he said.

"It's not for us to get ahead of ourselves - basically just obviously appreciate the win, but then just go back to the drawing board keep working our games because like I said, it's going to be Pakistan and India. Those are obviously two of the better teams in the world currently so for us, it's again ticking the box in terms of being disciplined in all three areas; batting, bowling and fielding. I feel like if we do that, we might give a good account for ourselves in a day, and who knows what could happen."
