

Cool weather only for 24 hours; IMD predicts rise in day temperature in Odisha

Bhubaneswar,(KCN): Several parts of Odisha experienced rainfall and thunderstorm activities in the past 24 hours. Heavy rainfall was also reported from some districts, disrupting normal life on Wednesday. The rainfall activities have considerably brought down the temperature, providing much-needed respite to people from the hot conditions. However, such cool weather will only prevail in Odisha for the next 24 hours only as the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted a sharp increase in the maximum or the day temperature in the state.



As per the IMD, there will be no large change in maximum temperature (day temperature) during the next 24 hrs following which there will be a rise by 8-10 degrees Celsius at most places over the

districts of Odisha. Similarly, no large change in minimum temperature (night temperature) during the next 24 hrs and a rise by 3-5 degrees Celsius in the subsequent 4 to 5 days is expected

at most places over the districts of Odisha, said IMD in its bulletin. Orange Warning (Be Prepared): Heavy rainfall very likely (7cm to 11cm) at one or two places likely over districts of

Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Khordha, Nayagarh, Gajapati. Yellow Warning: Thunderstorm with lightning very likely to occur at one or two places over the districts of Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Khordha, Nayagarh, Ganjam, Gajapati, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Angul, Dhenkanal, Boudh, Kandhamal, Rayagada, Koraput, Malkangiri. Light rain or thundershower very likely to occur at one or two places over the districts of Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Dhenkanal.

Yet to decide whether to fight alone or go along with BJD in Odisha: Amit Shah

New Delhi,(KCN): Amid the ongoing speculations over a possible BJP-BJD alliance, senior BJP leader and Union Minister Amit Shah on Wednesday said that the national party is yet to take the final call on a coalition with the BJD in Odisha. "We haven't decided yet on an alliance with BJD. Our party President will take a call on that. We are going to increase our strength in Odisha. BJP's Assembly and Lok Sabha seats will increase in the state. Love of people of Odisha for PM Modi is immense," said Shah at a private news channel's event in Delhi. Shah further said that the BJP will shatter all the



mathematics of the political pundits by winning more Lok Sabha and Assembly seats in Odisha. On being asked if the BJP could form the government in Odisha, Shah said, "Anything can happen but first let's see if we will fight alone or go along with the BJD... If we go alone, we will fight to form the government." Earlier on Tuesday, Odisha BJP MLA Pradipta Naik said that the

Bharatiya Janata Party is ready to fight in all the 147 Assembly and 21 Lok Sabha seats in Odisha. "The alliance can happen if only the BJP's central unit, Prime Minister and National President want. Here in Odisha, nobody has the right to compromise with BJD. The BJP is ready to fight elections on its own and has already started its preparations," said Naik. Naik further said that whatever the state leaders decided in the recently concluded meetings, it will be apprised to the Central leadership. "Our National President and State president will take a call on the alliance matter," he added.

Remove Unauthorised Political Ads: Poll Body To States As Model Code Sets In

New Delhi(KCN): Cracking the whip, the Election Commission on Wednesday asked state governments to take down all unauthorised political advertisements from government, public and private properties and send a compliance report in the next 24 hours. In a letter to the Union Cabinet Secretary and the chief secretaries of all states and union territories, the EC said that despite its letter

issued on March 16 when the model code of conduct for the Lok Sabha elections and four assembly polls came into force, it has received complaints alleging that unauthorised political advertisements are still being displayed in many places across the country. The Congress had recently raised the issue with the poll panel. "All unauthorised political advertisements, in the form of wall writings, posters, papers or



defacement in any other form, cutouts, hoardings, banner flags were ordered to be removed in a time-bound manner from public spaces like

railway stations, bus stands, airports, railway bridges, roadways, government buses, electric/telephone poles, municipal/local bodies'

building and a strict compliance in this was to be ensured," it reminded the governments. The Commission said it has taken a "serious note" of the non-compliance or partial-compliance of its instructions. It directed all state and union territory governments to "immediately remove all unauthorised political advertisements and ensure full compliance of its instructions".

Putin, Zelenskyy Invite PM Modi After Elections: "See India As Peacemaker"

New Delhi(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke to Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy hours after speaking to Russian President Vladimir Putin. The Prime Minister's conversation with the two leaders comes in the backdrop of Putin's reelection as President and no sign of a de-escalation in the Russia-Ukraine war. Sources told NDTV that the two leaders said they see India as a peacemaker. Sources said both Zelenskyy and Putin have invited Prime Minister Modi to visit their countries after the Lok Sabha elections. Prime

Minister Modi last visited Russia in 2018. Prime Minister Modi discussed ways to strengthen India-Ukraine partnership and reiterated the nation's people-centric approach and calls for dialogue and diplomacy for the resolution of the ongoing conflict. The Prime Minister said India would continue to do everything within its means to support a peaceful solution. Meanwhile, President Zelenskyy appreciated India's continued humanitarian assistance to the people of Ukraine. The two leaders agreed to remain in touch.

In May last year, Prime Minister Narendra Modi met the Ukrainian President on the sidelines of the G7 summit in Japan's Hiroshima. This was the first in-person meeting between the two leaders since the start of the Russian invasion of Ukraine in February last year. Earlier today, Prime Minister Narendra Modi dialled Russian President Vladimir Putin, congratulating him again on his re-election to the top office. During their telephonic conversation, both leaders agreed to intensify efforts towards expanding the India-Russia 'Special and



Privileged Strategic Partnership'. "Spoke with President Putin and congratulated him on his re-election as the President of the Russian Federation. We agreed to work together

to further deepen and expand the India-Russia Special & Privileged Strategic Partnership in the years ahead," PM Modi said. India has stressed diplomacy and discussion

to resolve the conflict which began in February 2022 with Russia's full-scale invasion. The Ministry of External Affairs in a press briefing said, "India desires that there be discussion, there be diplomacy, there be constant engagements so that both sides can come together and find peace." Vladimir Putin won the Presidential elections, securing 87.17 per cent votes. The Communist Party of Russian Federation candidate Nikolai Kharitonov secured the second spot with 4.1 per cent of the votes while New People Party candidate Vladislav Davankov

stood third with 4.8 per cent votes. Putin has served four terms as Russian President. He was first elected President in 2000 and again in 2004, 2012, and 2018. He has effectively remained unchallenged in the polls and has strengthened his control over the Kremlin with another six-year term. The West has described the election as "incredibly undemocratic". Ukraine has urged the US Congress to unblock a \$60 billion aid package, which has been stalled due to political infighting. The delays have been a "shock" for Ukrainian

officials, Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba said in an online briefing for foreign media. US Defence Secretary Lloyds J Austin said, "Since the invasion, Russia has wasted up to USD 211 billion to equip, deploy, maintain and sustain its needless war on its neighbour," Austin said. "Putin's war of choice will cost Russia USD 1.3 trillion in previously anticipated economic growth through 2026." "If Putin is successful in Ukraine, he will not stop there," Austin said. "Our allies and partners are here because they understand the stakes."

My friendship with Mohan Jena was through Mangala Prasad Mohanty. Mangala was in JNU way back in 1990 when I joined NBT as its Odia Language Editor. One day he came with Mohan to my Katwaria Sarai residence. Then I understand that Mahan Jena is a friend of my classmate Kailash Mishra, President, Ravenshaw College who was from DSO. Mohan was also from DSO. Mohan has come to my place a number of times and he, Mangala and I had our dinner and drinks. He was a people's leader. But, I fail to understand why he joined BJD and later BJP. He was MP twice, but was unfit in today's political equation. Yesterday Mohan Jena left us forever for his heavenly abode. Tributes.

I am reminded of a story I read a year ago. A 60 year old gentleman was suffering from deep depression and his wife booked an appointment with a counsellor. The wife said... "He is in severe depression, please see to it..". The Counselor began his counseling by asking some personal things while the gentleman's wife sat outside. When you get to the school, locate your 'Class register' if it is still there, look up the names of your peers and try to get information about their current well being. Write down all the information you get about them and meet me after a month..! The gentleman went to his former school, found the register, and copied every name in it. There were 120 names in all. He tried day and night throughout one month, but was barely able to collect information on about 75-80 of his classmates. Surprise results ..!!! 20 of them were dead. 7 were widows/ widowers, 13 were divorced. 10 turned out to be drug addicts. 5 came out so poor that nobody could even connect with them.

6 turned out to be so rich that he couldn't believe it. Some were cancerous, some were paralyzed, some were diabetic, asthmatic, heart disease patients. A couple of them were in bed with injuries to the arm/leg or spinal cord. The children of some has turned out to be insane, vagabonds, etc. One was in jail. One person after two divorces was seeking for a third marriage. The counselor asked:- "Now tell me how is your depression?" The gentleman understood that he had no disease, he was not starving, his mind was perfect, he was not unlucky. He was lucky that his wife and children were very good and healthy. He was also healthy, he could afford three meals daily. His challenges paled in significance to that of others. That gentleman realized that, there's really a lot of sorrow in the world, and that he was very happy and lucky.

Grammys Reduce Nominees From 10 to 8 In Top 4 Award Categories

Grammys has announced to reduce the number of nominees in four of its award categories - Album, Song, Record of the Year, and Best New Artist - from 10 to 8, Variety reported on Friday. An announcement in this regard was made after the Recording Academy updated its rules and guidelines following its semiannual board of trustees meeting.

The number of nominees for those categories was increased from eight to ten in November 2021, just before the nominees for 2022 were announced -- a surprising and perplexing turn of events, given that such changes usually occur after the annual board meetings, Variety reported. While three new award categories were announced earlier this week, the reduction in the number of nominees in four award categories was announced on Friday. An Artificial Intelligence (AI)-related rule was also introduced, effectively stating that only human creators are eligible for awards; however, as with all things AI, the vast possibilities that the technology makes possible in this still-developing area necessitate an extensive series of caveats, Variety further reported. While Recording Academy CEO Harvey Mason Jr. stated at the time that the change was "an incredible opportunity for us to honour more artists and shine a light on more great music, and potentially offer a greater chance for more genres of music to be honoured", some speculated that it was done to ensure Taylor Swift received a best new album nomination for her album 'Evermore' and thus increase the chance that she would appear on the show and boost its rating, as reported by Variety.

Air pollution shortens life

Delhi is the most polluted city in the world, where people are losing 11.9 years of their life. 29 percent of pregnancy losses in the world are due to air pollution. 77 percent pregnancy loss occurred in India alone, while 12 percent cases were reported in Pakistan and 11 percent in Bangladesh.

A recent report on air pollution released by the University of Chicago has revealed worrying figures. In the report, the name of India is also included among the six countries around the world where air pollution is having the biggest impact on the lives of the people. According to the report, air pollution is reducing five years of life of the people of India, while if we talk about Delhi only, the situation is even worse. Compared to the World Health Organization's standard of five micrograms per cubic metre, the country's particulate air pollution is impacting on people's lives. Describing Delhi as the most polluted city in the world, the report said that air pollution is having the biggest impact on the health of the people living

here and their life is being reduced by 11.9 years. Between 2000-2016, a study was conducted by Lancet on the effect of air pollution on pregnancy in India, Pakistan and Bangladesh. Research revealed that pollution caused 29 percent of pregnancy losses i.e. abortions in all three countries. Of these, 77 percent pregnancy loss occurred in India alone, while 12 percent cases were reported in Pakistan and 11 percent in Bangladesh. 34,197 women were included in this study, out of which 27,480 women suffered miscarriage and 6,717 suffered stillbirth (baby's heartbeat missing). The research said that with increase in pollution the risk to human health has also increased. Professor at Chicago University, Michael Greenstone said that three-fourth of the impact of air pollution on the lives of people around the world is in just six countries - Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, China, Nigeria and Indonesia. The data clearly shows that air pollution remains the world's biggest external threat to human



health. Given the greatest threat to human life from air pollution, the collective current investment in global air quality infrastructure appears inadequate. Huge global funds are invested every year in HIV-AIDS, malaria and TB, but not so much in terms of air pollution. According to the live ranking of Swiss firm IQAir, India's three cities in the list of 110 most polluted countries in the world are the capital Delhi, Kolkata and Mumbai. Delhi is at number one in the list. The AQI here is 254, making Delhi the most polluted city in the whole world.

After this, Kolkata is at fourth place in the ranking with 216 AQI. After this, Mumbai is at tenth place, where AQI 155 was recorded. Recently, three deaths have occurred in Kanpur in seven days due to breathing difficulties. In Meerut, a young man suffered from high fever and his respiratory system failed. As a result, the young man died during treatment in the hospital. Doctors believe that pollution has reduced the oxygen level in the lungs. The tubes of the lungs have shrunk due to pollution. The inhaling of oxygen is gradually decreasing. During examination of patients coming to OPD

and Critical Care Unit, the oxygen level is not found to be correct. Research was conducted in China's Guangdong province regarding premature delivery caused by pollution. 687 women involved in this research had premature delivery and 1097 women had low birth weight babies. These were compared with 1766 women who had healthy births. The thing to note is that this province of China has less pollution than the average of the entire country. In China too, like North India, air pollution starts increasing from September-October and reduces in summer. In this research, it was found that

women and the fetus suffer the most harm from pollution in the first and last months of pregnancy. Three percent of the total premature births in America are due to pollution. The number of such children is 16 thousand. According to PLOS magazine, around 6 million children worldwide are being born prematurely due to pollution. Half of these children are underweight. The mother's womb is the safest place for an unborn child, but even the child growing in the mother's womb is not safe due to air pollution in the entire Uttar Pradesh including Delhi-NCR. The increasing pollution is affecting the elderly and small children as well as the unborn children. This is the reason why doctors are restricting pregnant women from going out in this poisonous air. Especially during the initial and late stages of pregnancy, women are being asked to stay at home. Most of the doctors have started online consultancy for pregnant women. Women are being called to the hospital for checkup only when necessary. Doctors say that heavy metals scattered

in the air are harming unborn children through mother's breath. Air pollution is fatal for the heart, brain and lungs of newborns. Paediatrician Dr. Anupama Verma says that by breathing polluted air, the pollution crosses the placenta and reaches the foetus. Pollution prevents nutrients from reaching the baby through the blood. Due to this, the baby's brain and lungs do not develop properly. In children, there are heart problems, congenital respiratory disease, side effects on neurodevelopment, and maturity of lungs is also affected. The problem of autism and intellectual disability has also been seen in many children. It is a matter of concern that pollution particles are being found in the foetus even in the initial tests of pregnancy. If a child remains exposed to this pollution for a long time, he remains at risk of getting cancer. Dr. Verma says that due to high levels of carbon monoxide, sulphur dioxide or nitrogen dioxide in the air, the cases of not only early delivery but also miscarriage can increase. As a solution to protect

against air pollution, doctors are advising people suffering from respiratory diseases as well as children and adults to wear masks. Senior Gynaecologist and Obstetrician Dr. Anupama Kalia Gangwal says that first of all wearing a mask should be mandatory for everyone. We should do yoga and exercise, which will strengthen our lungs. Apart from this, one should visit crowded places as little as possible. Dr. Anupama also says that eating a healthy and nutritious diet will strengthen the body, which will help in fighting air pollution. If you notice symptoms like panting while carrying weight, not being able to walk fast, shortness of breath while climbing stairs, breathing quickly and breathing through the mouth, get a checkup done immediately.

we have a B.Sc.(Nursing), ANM and GNM courses. On successful completion of the course, you need to get yourself registered with the state nursing registration council. Many universities are registered with RCI. So, the students get their license soon after completing their M.Phil. in case your university isn't registered, you can appear for the independent exam conducted by RCI. Physiotherapist: There are always patients who need physical therapies for getting better. Went here is an accident victim with a damaged spinal cord, their recovery needs a regular physiotherapy. Even the sportspersons need this from time to time. Most hospitals especially the orthopaedic ones have their own team of Physiotherapists. You too can be a physiotherapist if you have studied physics, chemistry, and biology in your intermediate. After that, you can go for a diploma as well as degree courses in physiotherapy. If your hospital has an oncology department, you will be also required to detect malignancy of the tumours. This is a highly technical and specialized job. Not only that, this one will always remain in demand. Even with all the automation, it will be the human intellect and expertise required in creating slides and studying them. If you find this career thrilling, you can get yourself enrolled either in the Diploma in MLT or related Degree course in medical laboratory technologies. You can start your work with any diagnostic centre or hospital. Pharmacist: A Pharmacist is a person behind the drug prescriptions to the patients. You can get into this field by completing

B.Pharma first. There are government as well as private colleges offering this course. You have to clear the AIPVT Entrance Exam, which is the national level test for getting admission in the BVSc. know that many of their health issues are due to their genetic makeup. In the old days, people used to regard every mentally challenged child as the same. But now we know that they can suffer from Down's syndrome or Klinefelter's syndrome and so on. So, usually, doctors advise the expecting parents to get themselves tested genetically to rule out any such condition. As a genetic counsellor, you will be required to educate them about the pros and cons of getting this test done. You will be counselling them if any genetic anomaly is detected. You will be doing the same with the cancer patients too. To get into this field, you need to have a certification from the board of genetic counsellors in India. Unfortunately, there are very few institutes that currently offer a course in the genetic counselling. VIT offers a full-time M.Sc (Biomedical Genetics) with genetic counselling. Manipal hospitals Bangalore offer a certificate course in genetic counselling, and Kamineni Hospital, Hyderabad offers a post-graduate certificate course in medical and genetic counselling. So the competition to get there is really tough. But the scope is unlimited. If you wish to go abroad, the career prospect is much brighter. They are in high demand there. Biomedical Engineer: With the growing demand for non-invasive surgeries, robotic surgeries, and accurate surgical devices, the Biomedical Engineers are going to be in high demand. The role of a biomedical engineer is to

act as the intermediary between the hospital needs and industrial manufacture. It is more of an R&D job. We have IITs, NITs and some good private colleges offering diploma, certificate, undergraduate courses like B.Tech.(Biomedical Engineering) as well as postgraduate courses. But unfortunately, in our country, it has got a limited scope. But, if you choose to go abroad, it will give you tremendous returns. Radiation Therapist: With a swift rise in the number of cancer patients, the need for radiation therapists has also risen. You can do a diploma or a full-time graduation in Radiation Technology. Currently, there isn't any national entrance test. Colleges take the candidate based on their intermediate marks or their own entrance test. After completing the graduation, you need to get yourself a post-graduate specialization in medical oncology or radiology or oncology. After that, you will be eligible to work as a radiation therapist. You will get numerous opportunities in cancer-specialist hospitals. The medical field is a vast arena. There are many untapped professions which are very good paying and have bright prospects. It is always better to look beyond the traditional career choices. You will get to explore a new field and carve a niche for yourself. We hope you have decided what you wish to be.

New Earthworm Species Discovered in Odisha's Eastern Ghats by CUO: A Breakthrough in Biodiversity Research

Koraput, (KCN): In a groundbreaking discovery, researchers from the Central University of Odisha, Koraput, in collaboration with scientists from Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, Kerala, have unearthed two previously unknown species of Megascolex earthworms from the Eastern Ghats of Odisha. Ms. Ayusmita Naik, during an extensive earthworm diversity study across various regions of Koraput, stumbled upon large earthworm specimens from Rani Duduma and the Jeypore Ghati area. Under the guidance of Prof. Sharat Kumar Palita, Dean of the School of Biodiversity and Conservation of Natural Resources at CUO Koraput, the specimens underwent meticulous examination in laboratory settings. With the assistance of Dr. R. Paliwal, a retired Scientist from the Zoological Survey of India, and earthworm specialists Dr. Prasanth Narayanan and Dr. A.P. Thomas from Mahatma Gandhi University, these specimens were identified as two distinct species previously unknown to science: *Megascolex jeyporeghatiensis* and *Megascolex quadripappilatus*. The findings have been published in the prestigious



international taxonomic journal Zootaxa. Belonging to the Megascolex genus, these earthworms were discovered in the relatively unexplored hills of the Eastern Ghats in Odisha, adding to the biodiversity of Peninsular India. They are characterized by unique features such as two pairs of spermathecal pores and the absence of penial setae and calciferous glands. These species thrive in deciduous forests with brownish gravel-loamy soils. Endemic to India, specifically the Koraput District of Odisha, these species mark a significant addition to the earthworm diversity in the region. Their discovery expands the known range of Megascolex species into the northern Eastern Ghats, previously limited to the southern Western Ghats. *M. jeyporeghatiensis* was discovered in moist deciduous forests near Jeypore Ghati and Rani Duduma, while *M. quadripappilatus* was found in dry deciduous

forests near Rani Duduma. These earthworms are anecic worms, feeding on woody and fibrous materials of the forest floor, and play a crucial role in maintaining soil health and productivity by consuming fibrous plant material and aiding in carbon sequestration. Prof. Chakradhar Tripathi, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of Central University of Odisha has hailed this as a great achievement for the scientific community of CUO and stressed the need for this type of basic research which can put CUO on the world map. He congratulated the team of researchers involved in this discovery. Prof. S. K. Palita, Dean of the School emphasized the significance of this discovery, highlighting the need for continued biodiversity research through funding by Govt. bodies and conservation efforts in the Eastern Ghats region. They anticipate further discoveries and call for increased government funding to explore and protect the rich biodiversity of Odisha's Eastern Ghats.

Student Found Dead

Bhubaneswar (KCN): In a shocking incident on 18th March 2024, a student of KIIT Bhubaneswar found dead in his hostel room. Student died due to unhygienic hostel food. For the past several days, students were complaining that the food was being served bad. Last year, frogs and cockroaches were found in the food of the hostel mess. Food is becoming so bad that students have to beg from outside. Today around 25 students have got jaundice due to dirty drinking water. Water RO's are installed in every hostel but they have not been cleaned for years. Students are forced to bring bisleri water from the market. Students are very angry over the death of their colleague. The college administration is trying to whitewash. The college administration is also trying to scare the students by calling the police force. This is the current scenario in Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology Bhubaneswar, ranked 42 among engineering colleges in India, where parents pay approx 22 lakhs to get their child an engineering degree.

India Criticises Group That Is Opposed To UN Security Council Reforms

United Nations: India has criticised a model for the UN Security Council presented by the Uniting for Consensus group that includes Pakistan, saying it stands against the idea supported by a majority of member states to expand permanent and non-permanent seats and underscored that the world of the 21st century "desperately needs a UN 2.0". The Uniting for Consensus or UfC comprises Argentina, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Italy, Malta, Mexico, Pakistan, the Republic of Korea, San Marino, Spain, and Turkiye. China, a



permanent member, and Indonesia are participating in the group as Observers. The UfC group is opposed to the creation of new permanent members in the Security Council. The UfC model entails a Security Council with 26 seats, with an increase only in the non-permanent, elected members. It proposes

creating 9 new long-term seats with immediate re-election possibilities. "Threats to international peace and security have become more complex, unpredictable and undefined. The world of the twenty-first century desperately needs a UN 2.0 that is credible, representative, reflecting the needs and aspirations

of the member states and capable of maintaining peace and security," India's Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador Ruchira Kamboj said in response to the UfC model presented by Italy at the Intergovernmental Negotiations (IGN) meeting on UNSC reforms on Monday. "The UfC which comprises 12 countries and 2 observers including a P5 country stands against the idea espoused by a majority of UN member states, namely that of the expansion in permanent and non-permanent categories," she said.

Bastina becomes a trailblazer in Kandhamal

Daringbadi(KCN): Bastina Singh, a tribal woman in Kandhamal district has carved a niche for herself as a social reformer by challenging conventions and breaking barriers. Her fight against liquor consumption by men at the expense of family welfare has been hailed by all and sundry. Bastina is a native of Dasingbadi locality under this block in Kandhamal district. She was recently felicitated with the state-level 'Ananya' award at a function organised by 'National Alliance of Women'. Bastina has become an example for others to emulate and a role model for scores of women to fight against various social evils. With liquor consumption

ruining many families, Bastina started a movement against it. She has also lent her voice and might to prevent child marriages and for providing education to kids. Bastina's work came to notice when she launched an agitation against liquor consumption by male members of many families in the 1990s. After drinking, these men used to torture women and other family members. Uncontrolled drinking also led to families facing severe financial constraints. The education of the kids suffered and there was never enough food in the house. Many of the male alcoholics also got their kids married off at a very early age. Bastina herself was married off



early when she was a 16-year-old kid. She knew the trauma associated with child marriages. She decided

to do something to curb and eradicate the drinking habits of men. The first thing Bastina did was to bring women

who were suffering due to their alcoholic husbands under one umbrella. These women then started protesting

against the sale of country-made liquor in Dasingbadi area. However, Bastina's road was never smooth as she

had to face opposition from the members of her community as she intensified her agitation against sale of liquor.

However, she refused to cow down and resolved to make Dasingbadi panchayat a liquor-free one. Her efforts began to show results as Dasingbadi panchayat was declared liquor-free and received the 'Gandhi Award' in 1995. Appreciating her work, the then Odisha Chief Minister Biju Patnaik sanctioned special powers to Bastina and 11 other women of her organisation. They were provided with 12 lathis known as 'Biju lathis' to launch a crackdown on liquor sales. Since then, Bastina has never looked back and has been in the forefront against liquor consumption and preventing child marriages in her area.

Hasaranga handed two-Test ban after coming out of retirement

New Delhi: Sri Lanka all-rounder Wanindu Hasaranga has been suspended for the two-Test series against Bangladesh, International Cricket Council announced on Tuesday. This comes after Hasaranga decided to make a return to Test cricket having retired from the format last year. During the third ODI in the recently-concluded series against Bangladesh, Hasaranga was found guilty of breaching article 2.8 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel, which relates to "showing dissent at an Umpire's decision during an International Match." The incident occurred in the 37th over of the game when Hasaranga snatched his cap from one of the umpires and ridiculed the umpiring in



the match. Bangladesh took the series 2-1 after winning the contest by four wickets. Hasaranga received a 50 per cent match-fee fine and accumulated three demerit points for his offense. This brought his total demerit points to eight in a 24-month period. The all-rounder

was already on five demerit points after receiving three demerit points in the third T20I against Afghanistan in Dambulla last month, due to which he was suspended for two T20Is against Bangladesh. Now, with the addition of the latest demerit points, he has breached the

threshold of eight demerit points, which, pursuant to article 7.6 of the Code, have been converted into four suspension points. The four suspension points equate to a ban from two Tests or four ODIs or T20Is, whatever comes first. Hasaranga will therefore miss the two ICC World Test

Championship Tests against Bangladesh. Sri Lankan skipper Kusal Mendis earned three demerit points. Sri Lanka ODI skipper Kusal Mendis also copped a 50 per cent match-fee fine and three demerit points for a Level 2 offence after he "abused the umpires while shaking hands with them" at the end of the third match. This breached article 2.13 of the Code, which relates to "Personal abuse of a Player, Player Support Personnel, Umpire or Match Referee during an International Match." This was a first offence for Mendis in a 24-month period. Both Hasaranga and Mendis admitted their offences and accepted the sanctions proposed by Andy Pycroft of the Emirates ICC Elite Panel of Match Referees.

RCB change Bangalore to Bengaluru in team name

New Delhi: RCB have replaced the anglicised 'Bangalore' in their team name with the city's official name Bengaluru. The change was revealed during the franchise's UNBOX event at the M. Chinnaswamy Stadium on Tuesday (March 19). The team, called Royal Challengers Bangalore since the inception of the tournament in 2008, will now be called Royal Challengers Bengaluru. The franchise had been teasing a name change through promotional campaigns on social media in the week building up to the event. In fact, the incorporation of 'Bengaluru' had been clamoured for by local fans for a while now after the capital city of Karnataka officially adopted the more vernacular name on November 1, 2014. RCB are not the first IPL team to change their team name. Kings XI



Punjab changed to Punjab Kings three years ago while Delhi changed from Daredevils to Capitals following JSW Group's investment in the franchise. Even earlier, the now-defunct Rising Pune Supergiant team dropped an 's' at the end of their name ahead of their second and final season in the league. WPL champions felicitated, Vinay Kumar inducted to RCB Hall of Fame

In a ceremony marked by song, dance and jersey launch, the franchise's women's team, recently

crowned WPL Champions, were given a guard of honour by the men's team. The winning captain Smriti Mandhana then led her squad on a victory lap around the ground with the trophy in tow to rapturous cheers from a near capacity crowd.

During the event, RCB also inducted Karnataka legend and former player Vinay Kumar into the franchise's hall of fame. Vinay played five seasons for RCB with his best season coming in 2013, where he claimed 23 wickets at 21.43.

Suryakumar Yadav fails to get NCA clearance; faces another fitness test on March 21



Mumbai: Suryakumar Yadav has suffered a temporary setback as the National Cricket Academy (NCA) has not cleared him to participate in the upcoming Indian Premier League (IPL). A known Twenty20 specialist, Suryakumar underwent a fitness assessment at the NCA in Bengaluru on Tuesday. However, the NCA management is understood to have withheld clearance, preventing him from fulfilling his IPL commitments with the Mumbai Indians for the time being. The immediate fallout of this decision is that Suryakumar will be unavailable for the opening match, without a doubt. Mumbai Indians'

first game is scheduled against the Gujarat Titans on March 24 in Ahmedabad. The enormity of this setback for Suryakumar, who captained India in a Twenty20 series in South Africa in December before undergoing ankle surgery, can be understood from his social media post on Tuesday, where he shared a heartbreak emoji expressing his disappointment. Further updates on his availability will be contingent upon his clearance in the upcoming fitness test, scheduled for March 21. There is optimism within the Mumbai Indians camp that he may join the squad sooner rather than later. MI's second game - against Sunrisers

Hyderabad in Hyderabad - is three days after the first, and there is a belief that he could be available for that match.

While addressing the media on Monday Mumbai Indians coach Mark Boucher hinted that Suryakumar could miss a few games. "We are awaiting updates on Suryakumar from the BCCI. We have always been under a cloud of fitness issues but we have a world-class medical team. We may lose one or two in terms of fitness but we have to move on," Boucher said. He went on to add, "As the coach of Mumbai Indians, I am going to be a little bit biased and hope to see my best players in all the games. I have a soft spot for my players and I do understand that they might have niggles and that's when I will fall back on my medical team and work with them accordingly."

Meanwhile, the MI management has issued a statement saying that the practice games this year will be behind closed doors at the Wankhede as always.

Gujarat Titans for the first time in IPL 2024 after he took over the reins from Hardik Pandya. Hardik, who led the Titans to their maiden title win in their very first season in IPL 2022 and finished off as runners-up in IPL 2023, was traded to Mumbai Indians. The 24-year-old Gill was handed over

the captaincy role on the back of his stellar performances for the team in the last 2 years. He has scored 1373 runs for Gujarat Titans at a strike rate of 147.79 so far. He was last season's orange cap winner with 890 runs in 17 matches including 3 hundreds. He became the 2nd highest run-scorer in a single

season of the tournament, after Virat Kohli's record-breaking 973-run season in 2016. Meanwhile, Williamson was ruled out of IPL 2023 after featuring only in the very first match of the season for Gujarat Titans. He suffered a nasty injury to his knee while fielding for his team

against the Chennai Super Kings. However, he will be back for the Titans this season. The veteran Kiwi player, under whose captaincy SunRisers Hyderabad reached the final in 2018, will look to be a guiding force for Gill. Mushfiqur Rahim ruled out of Sri Lanka Tests

Dhaka: Bangladesh received a huge blow ahead of the two-match Test series against Sri Lanka as Mushfiquur Rahim is ruled out from the series due to a fractured right thumb. "He (Mushfiquur) is ruled out from the series due to the fracture," a BCB official confirmed Cricbuzz on Tuesday. It is understood Mushfiquur sustained the injury during the third ODI against Sri Lanka at Zahur Ahmed Chowdhury Stadium on



March 18 and subsequently went for an MRI. The first Test of the series begins on March 22 in Sylhet while the second game will be played in Chattogram from March 30.

B o t h Bangladesh and Sri Lanka reached Sylhet on Tuesday ahead of the opening Test. The tourists won the T20I series by 2-1 margin while the hosts clinched the ODI series by 2-1 margin so far before heading for the Test series which is part of the 2023-25 ICC World Test Championship cycle. BCB is yet to name any replacement for Rahim.
