New Delhi(KCN): The Bharatiya Janata Party was the largest beneficiary of electoral bonds between April 2019 and January 2024 - companies donated ? 5,594 crore in that period - the Election Commission of India said this week. The BJP pocketed over three times the amount (Rs 1,592 crore) the Trinamool Congress took home and more than four times the amount donated to its arch-rivals Congress (Rs 1,351 crore). Fourth on the list was former Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao's Bharat Rashtira Samithi, which was dumped out of power by the Congress in

November; the BRS got ? 1,191 crore. Odisha's Biju Janata Dal, the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam from Tamil Nadu, and the YSR Congress Party and Telugu Desam Party from Andhra Pradesh are next on the list; the BJD got ? 775 crore and the DMK got ? 632 crore, while the TDP raked in ? 211 crore and the YSRCP

Under the rules, the SBI was the only bank allowed to issue electoral bonds; this, of course, was only till the top court ordered the scheme be scrapped and the public sector bank to stop selling bonds. Group were used by Aam Aadmi Party in the Goa campaign in 2021-22," ASG Raju said, adding that proceeds of crime were not only the Rs 100 crore bribe but also the profits made by bribe payers. "Aam Aadmi Party is a beneficiary but it doesn't exist individually. It is a company. Every person

who is involved in the functioning of the company is responsible and shall be deemed to be guilty," he said. Kejriwal was arrested after being questioned at his official residence for more than two hours in connection with the money laundering case related to the alleged excise policy scam before he was taken to the probe agency's office on A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Road at 11 p.m. on Thursday. The Chief Minister remained in the ED jail overnight before he was produced before the Rouse Avenue Court on Friday after a medical examination.

Odisha plans green polling booths in Ganjam, Kandhamal districts



Berhampur(KCN): People in Odisha's Ganjam and Kandhamal districts can expect a novel experience when they go to polling stations to cast their votes in the upcoming Lok Sabha and Assembly elections. The Election Commission of India (ECI) has announced four-phase elections in the state on May 13, May 20, May 25, and June 1. Apart from introducing all-women and persons with disabilities (PWD) managed booths, both district authorities have decided to set up eco-

friendly polling stations, aiming to engage and educate voters on environmental sustainability. These green polling booths will be entirely plastic-free and adorned with fully biodegradable materials, officials said. The objective behind this initiative is to raise awareness about a plastic-free environment and attract voters to the polling booths, they added. The idea of eco-friendly polling booths is, however, not new. Previous elections in

Chhattisgarh's Bastar division, Goa, Meghalaya, Assam, and panchayat elections in Ernakulam district in Kerala have witnessed the setup of eco-friendly booths to engage voters and promote a plastic-free environment. Ganjam district collector Dibyajyoti Parida said they have planned to set up 13 plastic-free booths with at least one in each assembly constituency in the upcoming elections. The district has 13 assembly constituencies with 3,077 polling booths. The booths will refrain

from using plastic and instead utilise cloth and minimal paper. Natural colours will be used to mark the booths, he said. Similarly, in Kandhamal district, around 25 green booths will be set up. These booths will be decorated with saplings and the waiting area and corridors of the polling stations will be covered with green sheds. Earthen utensils like pots and mugs will be kept for drinking water, said Ashish Ishwar Patil, Kandhamal collector. Patil mentioned that the eco-friendly booths will be primarily established in schools, preferably those equipped with solar panels. Even schools without green energy infrastructure in urban areas will be utilised to sensitise voters about climate change and promote a plastic-free environment. The state government has already imposed a ban on the use, stock, and transport of single-use plastic since December 2021, further aligning with the efforts to create eco-friendly polling environments.

Strategic importance in Lakshadweep

China has increased India's strategic challenge by building inland waterways and ports in several countries bordering the Pacific Ocean-Arabian Sea. In the past few decades, Jean has become a sensation. Has rapidly modernized the power. India has also strengthened its navy and coast guard forces in the last few years to deal with it. In addition, Lashgadwip is very important among the centers that India has established to enhance its maritime security capabilities. Lakshadweep is a sum of sixty islands and its total area is thirty two square kilometers. It extends to about thirty thousand square miles in the Arabian Sea.

The Arabian Sea borders Yemen, Oman, Pakistan, Iran, India and the Maldives. It is a

strategic area, which connects many important 'CP lanes' ports. It therefore becomes an important route for international trade. The Arabian Sea is rich in oil and natural gas. It is an important form of energy in the region. The archipelago can be used as a vantage point to monitor movement. It is also interesting to note that India's EEZ is very large, including Lakshadweep. The EEZ extends for over two hundred miles. For example, 370 km from the coast of any country. KM. Thanks to Lakshadweep, India has gained control over a large area of sea through which the movement of ships going far away can be monitored. There is an Indian naval base in Lapa. It is expected to be helpful.

The total coastline of India is seven thousand five hundred and sixteen kilometers. It extends to the states of Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa, Cuttack, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Odisha and West Bengal and the islands of Daman and

Diu, Lakshadweep, Puducherry, Ashman and Nicobar Islands. Located on the southwestern border of India between the Arabian Sea and the Sahidri mountain range, the state of Kerala is considered to be a major center of India's strategic security. Kodi is a port city in Kerala, bordering Lakshadweep. Kodi is considered as an important gateway to the Arabian Sea and the Indian Ocean. It is one of the major importers and exporters of the state, including agricultural products, industrial goods and raw materials

Controls critical parts. It has been an important port city since ancient times, attracting traders from all over the world including the East and Europe. Codport is well connected with the international bazaar through regular shipping services.

Vikram Saralai West Center is located in Ahubantapuram, Kerala. Here the designs of satellite launch vehicles and related technologies are

developed. It is the primary center of ISRO, which is responsible for the design and development of rocket technology. It conducts active research and development in the areas of aeronautics, space armaments, structures, chassis physics and system reliability. So Lakshadweep to protect these centers.

The lagoons and exclusive economic zones of the Lakshadweep peninsula have significant fisheries and mineral resources, which are economically important. India is developing Aglega Island in Mauritius. Lakshadweep, becoming a connecting point between India and the Aglega Peninsula, will give India a strategic border on China in the Indian Ocean. In other words, Lakshadweep's strategic location and its sensitivity to China and its territorial restrictions, efforts to promote it as a subclassified defense island could add to the security challenge. Citizens here are protesting against it. They believe that doing so will destroy the

unique culture and traditions of the beautiful islands.

Strengthening India's strategic capabilities in the archipelago is crucial. The Nine Degree Channel located in the Lakshadweep Archipelago is the most direct route for ships bound for East Asia through the Persian Gulf. This channel is used by all traders traveling to Europe, Middle East, West Asia, South East Asia and the Far East. During the war, India could block the channel and cut off enemy supply lines. The geographical location of the Lakshadweep archipelago also raises India's security concerns. Therefore, a monitoring system has been prepared on this. Language Island is very close to Macau Island. The continent is emerging as an anti-India center. Not because of the influence of China, where extremist activities have also increased.

In recent years, religious fundamentalism has also been exported from this

country with the help of Saudi Arabia and Pakistan. The South Asian country has the largest number of jihadist recruits for ISIS 100 percent are from the continental United States. While hundreds of islands of the continent are uninhabited, there is a danger of the rise of the aristocratic power. This could have a direct impact on India's internal security. Lakshadweep can be redeveloped to counter China's growing influence in neighboring countries such as the mainland, Mauritius, Mauritius, Settey, Sri Lanka, Pakistan and Myanmar. About three hundred kilometers away from India, China is in Sri Lanka. Hambantota is under construction. Similarly, it controls much of the continent.

An airport is being built there. The spatial distance of Chennai, Kodi and Visakhapatnam ports is about nine hundred to fifteen kilometers. Sriharikota Satish Dhawan Space Center for the Indian program

is also located about eleven hundred kilometers away. The importance of the island has increased for India to counter China's naval presence and activities in the Indian Ocean and to establish a new surveillance system. Six hundred and fifty kilometers away from Kodi, India's Sana Vicki land is being built on the 16th level at Kar Karwar in Karnataka on the west coast.

The development of warships has been targeted at the Naval Base of Thuba Karobar, 'Project Se Barhar Naval Infrastructure Project Seaberg', which is the country's largest *136 neighboring country. It is within reach of fighter jets and is very close to the world's shipping route between the Persian Gulf and East Asia. Karobar Kot in Karnataka is located in Vinaga Garh. It is currently the third largest Indian Navy and after its full expansion, it will be the largest naval base in the eastern leg of Golar. The Cha Lalun and Economic

Zone of the Las Vegas Peninsula are important fisheries and mineral resources that are important in the area. is important. Va India is developing Olega P in Mauritius. Lakshadweep, becoming an 11th point between India and the Aglega Peninsula, will give India a strategic frontier after China in the Indian Ocean.

In other words, Lakshadweep's strategic location and its sensitivity to China and territorial restrictions suggest the need to turn it into a special defense island, but efforts to promote it as a tourist center have increased security challenges. Citizens here are protesting against it. By doing so, the unique culture of the beautiful islands will be destroyed. There will be a possibility of smuggling due to tourism and research of this place. Recently, China and Pakistan are also doing this in India's security sensitive areas.

Thiamine Deficiency

When thiamine stores are depleted, symptoms start to appear. Dry beriberi occurs when the CNS is involved. This condition is usually due to poor intake. The neurological features include impaired reflexes and symmetrical motor and sensory deficits in the extremities. Thiamine deficiency due to inadequate intake is prevalent in people who have diets rich in carbohydrates, but lean in proteins. People most likely to suffer from inadequate intake of thiamine include those in developing nations, prison camps, and refugee populations where rice is often a dietary staple.

Thiamin (vitamin B1) helps the body's cells change carbohydrates into energy. The main role of carbohydrates is to provide energy for the body, especially the brain and nervous system. Thiamin also plays a role in muscle contraction and conduction of nerve signals.

The two main types in adults are wet beriberi and dry beriberi. Wet beriberi affects the cardiovascular system, resulting in a fast heart rate, shortness of breath, and leg swelling. Dry beriberi affects the nervous system, resulting in numbness of the hands and feet, confusion, trouble moving the legs, and pain. In conjunction with whole blood or erythrocyte transketolase activity preloading and postloading, a thiamine loading test is the best indicator of thiamine deficiency. An increase of more than 15% in enzyme activity is a definitive marker of deficiency. They include fatigue, irritability, poor memory, loss of appetite, sleep disturbances, abdominal discomfort, and weight loss. Eventually, a severe thiamin deficiency (beriberi) may develop, characterized by nerve, heart, and brain abnormalities. Different forms of beriberi cause different symptoms.

Vitamin B1, or thiamin, helps prevent complications in the nervous system, brain, muscles, heart, stomach, and intestines. It is also involved in the flow of electrolytes into and out of muscle and

nerve cells. Symptoms can worsen with a more severe, chronic deficiency, and may include conditions like nerve damage, heart problems, and even paralysis. The best approach is to eat a variety of thiamine-containing foods or take a multivitamin to prevent a deficiency from occurring.

In suspected cases of thiamine deficiency, prompt administration of parenteral thiamine is indicated. The recommended dose is 50 mg given intravenously or intramuscularly for several days. The duration of therapy depends on the symptoms, and therapy is indicated until all symptoms have disappeared. Maintenance is recommended at 2.5-5 mg per day orally unless a malabsorption syndrome is suspected. Thiamine is used to treat beriberi and to treat and prevent Wernicke-Korsakoff syndrome (tingling and numbness in hands and feet, memory loss, confusion caused by a lack of thiamine in the diet).

CAUGHT BETWEEN RELIGION AND POLITICS – DEMOCRACY’S DARK DIMENSION



Without being cynical even a bit on the personality of Rahul Gandhi, the lone celebrity leader of the Congress who comes from the most powerful political family, the status that qualifies him to be a politician among the notables, on whom most of the members of the INDIA Alliance look up to for a better leadership; I have a question to ask, as to what makes him phenomenally land in the captivity of the BJP intellectually so that the saffron party and its leaders feel free to make satirical conclusions on his statements that are capable to cause serious political ramifications to him and his party. For instance, let us examine his concluding address delivered at the Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra in Mumbai, which the

Prime Minister has dramatically framed as a reason to lash out at him. Rahul Gandhi’s remark on the concept of “Shakti” in Hinduism has blown the lid of one more fresh controversy that the Prime Minister has alleged was made against the spiritual concept of Shakti the deity worshipped by Hindus which according to him, was not only derogatory and disrespectful on the Hindu concept of Shakti alone but also a remark against the women of the country. Narendra Modi scathingly called it an insult to Hinduism. Now, what among the statements of Rahul Gandhi made this fresh controversy? While addressing the INDIA rally, Rahul had said: “There is a word ‘Shakti’ in Hinduism. We are fighting against a shakti too. The question is, where is the shakti and what does it mean for us?” Undoubtedly, Rahul Gandhi was sharpening his arrow against the Prime Minister and the

statements he spelt out throughout his speech were literally attacking the government and its leader. Then, what was the fallout? Why did the BJP and the Prime Minister take it far to that extent of calling it an attack on Hinduism? A fresh look at the statement delivered by Rahul Gandhi does not qualify any resentment except the word Hinduism. The statement could have been presented without taking the name of a particular religion. Instead of referring to Hinduism, he could have said the word Shakti is a profound expression in Sanskrit or so. But, as usual, the BJP caught his misquote afresh, a new subject to politically choreograph Rahul Gandhi and his side of the alliance. The Congress and its allies should have the basic sense on the vocabulary they would choose to fling allegations at the ruling party, especially its leader Narendra Modi. Religions being the most inflammable in India’s present political climate,

Rahul Gandhi’s utterances on Hinduism were sure to catch fire and what Modi did was to wait for the Gandhi scion to make remarks that he would further use to fuel anti-Congress sentiments. Though he refuses to take Rahul Gandhi’s name directly, Modi leaves no chance from using his statements in public. This has two reasons. Modi absolutely understands the compulsion of the Congress and the parties that stand by it. The INDIA block does not have a face that enjoys the level of acceptance and attraction that the Gandhi scion does. Moreover, it is important for the saffron camp to deliberately project the kindergarten mindset of the Congress and its leaders so as to dismantle its efforts to bag relevance ever since it faced its devastating collapse. It’s also a trap that the ruling dispensation spreads for its opposition parties in order to get them lost on stray issues, while the BJP would belligerently come hammer and tongs on its

achievement in the government. Adding fuel to the fire, derogatory remarks made on Hinduism by the DMK, and other members of the opposition camp would also be full-grown and manipulative as the elections near in the BJP’s scheme of things bringing collateral damage to the INDIA framework. The saffron party and the Prime Minister would certainly draw instances from the archives where the Congress and its allies spew aggression on Hinduism with its complete inflammability. To count among the Congress insensitivities, the colossal and the most impactful was its approach on the Ram Temple at Ayodhya and its absence from its consecration. While in power, the Congress stance on Lord Ram embarrassed the country. The government led by the Congress in an affidavit filed in the Supreme Court questioned the authenticity and veracity

of Lord Ram depicted in the Valmiki Ramayana. Though Valmiki Ramayana and Ramcharitmanas formed an important part of Indian literature, they could not be said to be historical records, the Congress claimed. With multiple narratives piling on its account, mostly belittling on what Hinduism stands for, the Congress and its allies once again seem to struggle to survive its depleting non-pragmatic existence. The alliance, with its faith being shown in Rahul Gandhi, needs to help him learn the basics of framing narratives, especially when the country is conspiringly captured and suffocated by the demeanors of immature politicians and their wayward political prologues and comments. Winning a General Election is a Himalayan task for all parties that are there in the fray. But for the political opposition of Narendra Modi, it is clearly an uphill task. That being the case, an internal leadership challenge would further

stretch the dilemma of the INDIA block. Squeezed not just by the controversial mishmash of the alliance, but also by the harsh dissonance on the comments made by its members would also be fulfilling the dreamy progress of the BJP pulling the grim popularity of the Congress and other parties again to a lower level. Extreme patriotic sensationalism has gripped the country with its burning issues being thrown into the cold storage. Obviously, the media pronounce what the ruling class dictates and amid such chaotically ideological primetime arguments, more scathingly illicit and disproportionate attacks and counter attacks would reveal the predictability of their dishonesty. Caught between religion and politics, India’s democracy seems to be once again struggling to land the monumental exercise of the electoral process on the ground without any damage. And

the voter, before he casts his vote, has a reason to think twice to decide as to what his priorities are. Concoction of irrelevant subjects should not attract his voting right. The one he would use his voting right should be for the country first and the country last. One of the largest democratic exercises in the world, India’s National Election cannot be stumbling on a litany of abuse on religions, race, societies and even individuals. Being the largest democracy, it is not hard for us to be the best. Elections should be a warm fight fought between ideal minds significantly tossing their views with great respect and of course religion should not be a paratrooper, a savior dominating the show.

Play organic Holi with Natural colours

Crafting art products from water hyacinth

Holi is one of the most loved and zestful festivals celebrated in India with immense joy and enthusiasm every year. Traditionally the Holi colours were created with naturally helpful ingredients like hibiscus flowers, henna leaves, Kesar, sandalwood and more. These natural colours are not just good for your skin, hair and eyes but even cleanse and clear the dead skin. As Holi arrives in the season of spring, the Gulal colour was made of plants and flowers that blossomed during this month. Holi gained popularity with time and natural colours got replaced with chemical-based synthetic colours gradually. These colours are cheaper compared to natural colours, but expensive for health as well as the environment. The famous quote “Bura na mano holi hai” implies that all playful mischief is allowed in holi. The primary risk which Holi brings along with itself is exposure to harmful chemicals in form of Holi colours. These colours are made from harmful



substances like acid, glass powder, industrial dye, copper sulphate, lead oxide etc. The toxicity from these chemicals are just not harmful for skin and hairs but exposure to them increases the risk of serious health complications such as Bronchial asthma, Renal failure, temporary blindness and much more. The situation becomes more alarming as it is young children who play Holi the most and thus get exposed to these harmful chemicals the most. Add to that later these chemicals cause environmental degradation and pollute groundwater and soil. So, what are the options? The best option is definitely to make your natural, herbal and safe Holi colors at home. 1--Gulal ---- The most popular color of Holi, Gulal can be made by

mixing 100 grams of turmeric power with 200 grams of arrowroot powder along with 50 grams of marigold flowers and 20 grams of powdered orange peel. Add to the mixture 20 grams of lemon or sandalwood essential oil and rub the mixture gently together to get a bowl full of safe and natural yellow colored gulal. 2--Red-Red colour can be made by boiling petals of red hibiscus or red roses, beet or carrots. Tomato or carrot juice, pomegranate peel, puroi xaak guti, red sandalwood can also be used for the same. Red colour can also be prepared using dried red hibiscus flowers. Take properly dried hibiscus or China rose flowers and then grate them into a fine powder. Red sandalwood can also be used in its place.

You can add rice flour uniform quantity to obtain dry red colour. You can boil peel of pomegranate to get wet colour. 3--Green-Green colour is a vibrant and lively colour choice for holi celebrations. Green colour can be prepared by boiling different green leafy vegetables in water such as spinach (paleng), mustard greens (laai), coriander (dhania), etc. Neem leaves or other kinds of green leaves with medicinal values can also be helpful in this regard. Green coloured gulal can be made using henna or Mehendi powder. For wet colour, you can use any green leafy vegetables, such as spinach or Neem. The leaves when dipped in water will give it a green colour. To make it natural, corn starch, betel leaf and

bathua leaves are used. 4--Magenta-Beetroot is a good source of red/pink pigment. You can soak sliced beetroots in water, boil the mixture and leave it overnight. You can also use red onions. Strain the water and cool it before use. If you wish to have a darker shade of pink, just dilute the mixture a little more. 5--Pink: The light pink colour is one of the common colours used in holi celebration. Rose, rose periwinkle (nayantara) or four o’clock flower (godhuli gopal) can be used to make pink colour for Holi. Pink colour can also be prepared by mixing finely chopped beets in water or by boiling onion peels in water. To make it natural, corn starch, beetroot and dried rose petals are used. 6--Yellow: Yellow is another one of the favourite colours used in holi. Yellow colour can be acquired by boiling marigold petals or add turmeric in water to make wet yellow colours. Turmeric powder can be mixed with gram flour or rice flour for presenting yellow colour. To make it natural, corn starch, turmeric and dried lemon peels are used. Make sure the turmeric is organic, this will result in better colouring.

2. Identify hazards - control risks
3. Define targets - develop programmes
4. Ensure a safe and healthy system - be well-organized
5. Ensure safety and health in machines equipment and workplaces
6. Improve qualifications - develop competence
7. Invest in people - motivate by participation
The conference concluded with call for escalating efforts to promote Safety -Health-Wellbeing of people in every industry, in fact socio-cultural-economic system in every nation.

River Ranching: An Essential for the Conservation of Fish Fauna in the Ganga River



Kolkata(KCN): River ranching is a solution for conserving fish in natural open water systems, particularly the Ganga River in India. It highlights the importance of replenishing indigenous fish stocks and maintaining genetic diversity for sustainable fisheries. The ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute is

using river ranching to conserve endemic warm water Indian Major Carps in depleted stretches of the Ganga River. The report also highlights river ranching as a potentially important source of biological output in aquatic systems, especially in the Ganga River's diminishing sections. It

also emphasises the necessity of innovative technology and helpful interventions in the development of ranching practices, particularly in areas with inadequate riverine output. The achievement of a total production of wild IMC seed and the release of fish fingerlings at various events around the nation's five states serve

as evidence of the success of river ranching. The text also emphasises how crucial community involvement and public awareness campaigns are to the success of river ranching and ex-situ conservation, as is the teaching of fishermen on ecological issues. The river ranching strategy has created

enormous impact on overall production from the river in the last few years that can be manifested through the recent published data. ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute has implemented innovative technique for the ex-situ conservation of fish germplasm and the restoration of fish stocks in rivers. The goals of river ranching for conservation have been successfully attained by the holistic plan that includes captive breeding, nursery pond management, and the release of fish fingerlings, in addition to community involvement and awareness campaigns.

"Constant Humiliation": Congress Spokesperson Rohan Gupta Quits Party

Ahmedabad(KCN): In a setback to the Congress ahead of the parliamentary elections, its national spokesperson Rohan Gupta on Friday resigned from primary membership and all other posts of the party citing "humiliation" and "character assassination". Mr Gupta, who had been given a Lok Sabha ticket from the Ahmedabad East seat by the Congress, withdrew from the race on Monday citing his father's ill health.



In a letter to party chief Mallikarjun Kharge, Mr Gupta said, "I hereby resign from all posts and primary membership of the Congress party with immediate effect." He also posted a copy of the resignation letter on X. "I am deeply pained to inform you that constant humiliation and character assassination by one of the senior leaders connected to the Communications department of the party for last two years (which many senior party leaders are aware of) and now at the time of personal crisis has compelled me to take

this decision," he said in the letter. "His behaviour has caused serious mental agony and stress and has compelled me to resign from the party with a broken heart to protect my self-esteem," he said. In a separate post on X, along with the copy of the resignation letter, Mr Gupta said he was not afraid of anything but needed to raise his voice when there was a "systematic conspiracy" to betray him. "My humbleness should not be considered as my weakness. I have learnt

my lessons the hard way," he wrote. He went on to say, "The person who has humiliated me for the last two years, the person who has not budged from doing it in last three days, I am sure that he will not refrain from doing it in future and nobody will be able to stop him. But now I am not ready to take any more assault on my self-esteem." Mr Gupta said he chose to quit the party with a broken heart, calling the decision "very difficult but necessary to protect" his self-respect.

"The same leader has also damaged the party with his arrogant and rude behaviour. Due to his extreme leftist mindset he ensured party's silence on insult of Sanatan Dharma which hurt me personally and I was forcefully stopped from opposition insult of Sanatan Dharma on national TV," he wrote. This has done serious damage to the party's image and the morale of Congress leaders, said Mr Gupta. "The leadership should not ignore such activities by this kind of leaders which leaves imprints of insult on the souls of honest workers and leaders and compels them to leave party," he said. According to Mr Gupta, he decided to withdraw his candidature from the Ahmedabad East Lok Sabha seat due to his father Rajkumar Gupta's reluctance to let him contest from the constituency that he represented as the candidate of the same party two decades back. Mr Gupta's father was the one who put his foot down and stopped him from contesting the upcoming elections despite the

former's desire, the Congress spokesperson had told mediapersons earlier. His father was not happy with his son's decision to contest the election, and to pressure him, he even resigned from Congress a few days before his withdrawal and severed his ties with the party he was associated with for decades. He even fell unconscious and had to be rushed to the ICU where he refused to take injections, asking his son to give in writing that he won't contest the election, Gupta had said then. Mr Gupta, however, did not disclose what exactly made his father oppose his candidature. Mr Gupta's father had unsuccessfully contested the 2004 Lok Sabha elections as a Congress candidate from the then Ahmedabad seat, which after the reorganisation of 2009 became split into Ahmedabad East and Ahmedabad West seats. Lok Sabha elections in Gujarat will be held in a single phase on May 7. In the 2019 elections, the BJP won all 26 seats in the state.



Male(KCN): Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu has struck a reconciliatory tone after his anti-India rhetoric, saying India will continue to remain his country's "closest ally" as he sought a debt relief from New Delhi. The Maldives owed approximately \$400.9 million to India at the end of last year. Ever since taking oath as the President in November last year, the pro-China Maldivian leader has pursued a hardline stand towards India and within hours demanded that Indian military personnel operating three aviation platforms be repatriated from his country by May 10. On Thursday, in his first interview with the local media since assuming office, President Muizzu said India was instrumental in providing aid to the Maldives and implemented the "greatest number" of projects. India will continue to remain the Maldives' closest ally, he said and emphasised that there was no question about it, Maldives news portal Edition.mv said in a report with excerpts of the President's interview to its Dhivehi language sister-publication 'Mihaaru.' The comments praising

India came after the first batch of Indian military personnel left the island nation this month as planned. By May 10, President Muizzu had demanded that all 88 military personnel, manning the three Indian aviation platforms, should leave the country. India has been providing humanitarian and medical evacuation services to the people of the Maldives for the last few years with two helicopters and a Dornier aircraft. The Maldives' proximity to India, barely 70 nautical miles from the Minicoy island in Lakshadweep and 300 nautical miles from the mainland's western coast, and its location at the hub of commercial sea lanes running through the Indian Ocean Region (IOR) gives it significant strategic importance. During the interview, President Muizzu urged India to accommodate debt relief measures for the Maldives in the repayment of "the hefty loans taken over consecutive governments". "The conditions we have inherited are such that there are very large loans taken from India. Hence, we are holding discussions to explore leniencies in the repayment structure of

these loans. "Instead of halting any ongoing projects... to proceed with them at speed, so I see no reason for any adverse effects (on Maldives-India relations)," President Muizzu added. President Muizzu's conciliatory comments towards India came ahead of Parliament elections in Maldives slated for mid-April. He said Maldives has taken significant loans from India, which are heftier than can be borne by the Maldivian economy. "Due to this, he is currently discussing with the Indian government to explore options to repay the loans to the best of the Maldives' economic capabilities," the news portal said quoting him. The President, who expressed hope that India would "facilitate debt relief measures in the repayment of these loans," said he has conveyed his appreciation to the Indian government for their contributions. During the previous regime, headed by pro-India leader Ibrahim Mohamed Solih's administration, the total loan taken from the Export and Import Bank of India (Exim Bank) stood at \$1.4 million.

Forest care fosters community spirit

Sundargarh(KCN): In a concerted effort to safeguard the forests in Ujalpur range, 31 Van Surakhya Samities (VSSs) have launched a comprehensive awareness campaign under the leadership of dedicated officials and community leaders. Odisha: Two get 30 yrs in jail for raping minor

Keonjhar (KCN): Additional District-cum Special POCSO Court Judge Shubhashree Tripathi convicted two persons for raping a minor and sentenced each of them to 30 years of rigorous imprisonment in Keonjhar district Thursday.

The two convicts have been identified as SK Shahzad Ali (53) and Amita Karua (46). Incidentally, the latter is the stepgrandmother of the victim. The court also imposed fines of Rs30,000 on Ali and



Rs20,000 on Karua. Failure to pay the fines will lead to an additional three years in prison for Ali and two for Karua. According to information available, the victim was living with her

grandparents when she was raped. Incidentally, the victim's grandfather had married a second time and hence Karua became the stepgrandmother of the victim. When the victim's

grandfather was not present in the house June 22, 2018, Ali raped her and threatened her with dire consequences if she disclosed the matter. Karua helped him in committing the heinous act. Ali repeated the crime a number of times in the following months. However, the two were taken into custody when the victim complained to the Joda police station October 27, 2018. Police arrested Ali and Karua and registered two separate cases against them.

5-year-old critical; teacher detained

The victim's father accompanied by a few villagers complained in this regard with Kunderi police. They have also launched a probe into the incident.

CONSTRUCTION WORK FOR SUB-WAY NEAR NIDHIPANDA BRIDGE STARTED



BHUBANESWAR,(KCN): Railway Minister Kept his promise and was sanctioned fund of rupees 14.7 Crores in September 2023The construction work for Sub-way near Nidhipanda Railway Bridge started today. No. 259).

Railway Board for construction of Subway near Nidhipanda Bridge of Balasore.

Nidhipanda bridge is an important bridge in Haldipada-Balasore section of Kharagpur – Bhadrak section. One of the spans of this bridge is being used by local people for commuting of both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. The area gets water logged during monsoon and the crossing under the bridge b e c o m e s unapproachable cutting connectivity to villages. In light of these issues, after Hon'ble Minister for Railways instructions, a survey was immediately conducted for provision of alternate, safe arrangement for vehicular traffic as well as pedestrians. A scheme was prepared whereby a subway of size 5m (W) X 5m (H) has been proposed at the

approach of the bridge at Kharagpur end. This subway will be used for passing of all kinds of vehicles including heavy vehicles.

In view of the above, the construction work has been started which will fulfill the demand of local people. Additionally, keeping in mind that the area is prone to waterlogging during monsoon, a second subway is proposed having dimensions of 4m(W)X 2.7m(H) which is about 1.6m above the bed level of the bridge and will act as an all-weather road even in times of heavy water discharges. With the intervention and close monitoring of Hon'ble Minister for Railways, the project and fund of Rs 14.7 crores was sanctioned in September 2023 and work is now started with close monitoring.
