

PM Modi To Dedicate, Lay Foundation Of Projects Worth Rs. 19,600 Cr In Odisha's Chandikhole

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate, dedicate to the nation and lay the foundation stone of multiple development projects worth over Rs 19,600 crore at Chandikhole, Jajpur in Odisha at around 3:30 PM. The projects relate to sectors including Oil & Gas, Railways, Road, Transport & Highways and Atomic Energy. The Prime Minister will inaugurate the Indian Oil Corporation Limited Mono Ethylene Glycol project in Paradip Refinery which will further help in reducing India's import dependency. He will also inaugurate a 344 km long

product pipeline traversing from Paradip in Odisha to Haldia in West Bengal. To augment the import infrastructure on the Eastern Coast of India, the Prime Minister will also inaugurate a 0.6 MMTPA LPG Import facility at Paradip. To boost road infrastructure in the region, the Prime Minister will dedicate to the nation four laning of Singhara to Binjabahal Section of NH-49; four laning of Binjabahal to Tilebani Section of NH-49; four laning of Balasore-Jharpokharia Section of NH-18 and four laning of Tangi-Bhubaneswar Section of

NH-16. He will also lay the foundation stone for eight laning of Chandikhole – Paradip Section at Chandikhole. Expansion of the railway network will also take place with a focus on modernising and extending rail connectivity. Prime Minister will dedicate to the nation, the 162 Km Bansapani – Daitari – Tomka – Jakhapura Rail Line. It will not only enhance the existing traffic facility's capacity but also facilitate efficient transportation of Iron and Manganese ore from Keonjhar District to the nearest ports and steel plants, significantly contributing to regional

economic growth. Inauguration of CONCOR Container Depot in Kalinga Nagar will be done to boost domestic and international trade. The foundation stone will be laid for the Electric Loco Periodical Overhauling Workshop at Narla, the Wagon Periodical

Overhauling Workshop at Kantabanji and the upgradation and augmentation of maintenance facilities at Baghuapal. Other railway projects, including flagging off new train services, will also be taken up during the visit. Prime Minister will also inaugurate a 5 MLD

capacity seawater desalination plant at Odisha Sands Complex of IREL(I) Ltd. This project has been built as a part of field applications of indigenous desalination technologies developed by Bhabha Atomic Research Centre. PM to visit Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Odisha, West Bengal & Bihar on 4-6th March

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Odisha, West Bengal and Bihar on 4-6th March 2024. On 4th March, at around 10:30 AM, the Prime Minister will inaugurate, dedicate and lay the foundation stone of multiple development projects worth Rs. 6,800 crores in

Sangareddy, Telangana. At around 3:30 PM, the Prime Minister will inaugurate, dedicate and lay the foundation stone of multiple development projects worth over Rs. 19,600 crores at Chandikhole, Jajpur in Odisha. On 6th March, at around 10:15 AM, the Prime Minister will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of multiple connectivity projects worth Rs. 15,400 crores in Kolkata. Thereafter, at around 3:30 PM, the Prime Minister will inaugurate, dedicate and lay the foundation stone of multiple development projects worth around Rs. 8,700 in Bettiah, Bihar.

Centre Readies 'Viksit Bharat 2047' Plan, Focus On Growth: Sources



New Delhi(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi today presented a Vision India document for 2047, saying planning for a "Viksit Bharat" (Developed India) by 2047 is a priority area, sources told NDTV. At a meeting of the Council of ministers today, he said The plan hinges on empowering citizens and creating a sustainable economy. The 25-year-plan envisages India as a developed nation providing leadership to the world in terms of

technology and innovation. The vision document has been prepared after more than 2700 meetings across ministries from December 2021 to January 2024. The government has examined 450 recommendations and consulted 15 stakeholders. The Prime Minister spoke for an hour in the meet, which was attended by ministers and departmental secretaries. Sources said he spoke about the ₹ 1 lakh crore

in budget to future technologies and ways to harness that so India leads in innovation. He also spoke of age-related demography changes – of ageing populations and the challenge it involves. PM Modi is believed to have asked for Viksit Bharat seminars to be included in the agenda of every department, which have been asked to prepare ideas and action plans. Business bodies like CII (Confederation of Indian Industries) and FICCI (Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry) should also be urged to start dialogue on this, he said. PM Modi also asked ministers and officials to go through the records of respective ministries to see how decisions evolved in the past, and how ideas have changed over the last 25 years.

Odisha CM Announces Hike In Pension For Construction Workers



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik today announced the increase in pension for construction workers. According to the Chief Minister's announcement, the pension amount of the construction workers registered under the 'Odisha Building and Other Construction Workers' Welfare Board' has been increased. All of them are benefiting from Nirman Shramik Pension Yojana. According to this new decision, construction workers who have crossed the age of 60 years will now get a monthly pension of Rs 1,000 instead of Rs 500. Similarly, construction workers above 80 years of age will get Rs 1200 instead of Rs 700. This new pension will be implemented from the month of February 2024. The necessary expenses in this regard will be borne by the Odisha Construction and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board.

Army Jawan Shoots Himself Dead At Defence Facility In Odisha: Police

Bhubaneswar(KCN): A 35-year-old army jawan allegedly shot himself dead with his service rifle at DRDO's Radar Observatory Air Surveillance unit in Odisha's Kendrapara district, police said on Sunday.

The incident took place when the army jawan, identified as Sepoy Raj Sekharan, a native of

Tamil Nadu, was on duty at the facility of the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) at Kiyarbanka village in Mahakalpada police station area around 2 am on Sunday. He was found lying in a pool of blood and was rushed to a nearby government-run hospital, where he

Cop, Maoist Killed In Encounter In Chhattisgarh's Kanker

Kanker(KCN): A police constable and a Maoist were killed in an encounter in Chhattisgarh's Kanker district on Sunday, a senior police official said. The gunfire occurred in a forest near Hidur village under Chhotebethiya police station limits, where a joint team of security personnel was out on an anti-Maoist operation, Inspector General of Police (Bastar Range) Sundarraj P said.

The operation was launched based on a specific input about the presence of Maoists in the Hidur forest, he said. Personnel from the District Reserve Guard (DRG) and Bastar Fighters, both units of the state police, along with the Border Security Force (BSF) and district force, were involved in the operation, the official said. The patrolling team was cordoning off the forest when Maoists fired on them indiscriminately, leading to the gun battle, he said. "Constable Ramesh Kurethi of the Bastar Fighters was killed in the gunfight. The body of a Maoist and an AK-47 rifle were recovered from the spot", the IG said. A search operation was underway in the area, he said. Kurethi hailed from Sangam village in the Pakhanjur area of Kanker district, the official said.

Jayadev MLA Arabinda Dhali, Former Malkangiri MLA Mukunda Sodi Join BJP



Bhubaneswar(KCN): Sitting MLA from Jayadev assembly constituency, Arabinda Dhali and former Malkangiri MLA Mukunda Sodi joined the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in the presence of the party's election in-charge, co-in-charge, and other senior leaders. Dhali resigned from the Biju Janata Dal (BJD) yesterday while Sodi

deserted the conch party earlier today. Five-time MLA Arabinda Dhali is the sitting MLA from the Jayadev assembly constituency. Dhali was first elected to the assembly in 1992 in a by-election from Malkangiri seat on a BJD ticket. Sodi sent his resignation letter to BJD president and Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik. He

resigned from the primary membership of the regional party, citing negligence and disrespect within the party ranks. The tribal leader won as an MLA from Malkangiri constituency in 2009 on a BJD ticket. In 2014, he was denied the party ticket. In 2019, he again contested on a BJD ticket but he lost to the BJP candidate.

8. Whether the sale of a product is relevant for determining the question of commencement of business: It has been decided in the case of CIT v. Electron India [2000] 241 ITR 166 (Mad.) that where the assessee had set up the manufacturing unit after installing the requisite plant and machinery, and had commenced the production, the mere fact that the assessee was not able to sell the product before the end of the relevant year due to deficiency in its quality would not disentitle the assessee from claiming that the business had commenced, though no profit was earned and only a loss was incurred in that year. The assessee would be entitled to have its loss computed for that year.

9. Whether sale proceeds arising out of sale of carbon credit is a business receipt: Sale proceeds of a carbon credit has been held to

be a capital receipt and not a revenue receipt - ITO v. Perpetual Energy Systems Limited [2015] 43 CCH 0176 Hyd Trib; DCIT v. Kalpataru Power Transmission Ltd. [2016] 68 taxmann.com 237 (Ahm - Trib.); CIT v. Subhash Kabini Power Corporation Ltd. [2016] 69 taxmann.com 394 (Karnataka), Gujarat Fluorochemicals Ltd. v DCIT [2018] 97 taxmann.com 10 (Ahm - Trib.).

10. Whether the assessee is engaged in the business of real estate sells any immoveable property, whether the actual sale consideration will be considered as consideration for computing profit or value adopted by registering authority for stamp duty purpose will be considered as full value of consideration: As per new section 43CA w.e.f. asst. year 2014-15, for computing income under the head business and profession, on transfer of immoveable property, the registration value/assessable value or the

actual consideration whichever is higher shall be considered as full value of consideration. The new provisions of section 43CA might have adverse impact in case of builders/ promoters or those engaged in the business of real estate. It may be noted that existing provisions of section 50C are similar in nature but those are applicable for the purpose of computing capital gains on transfer of an immoveable property. Section 50C had no impact in case of builders/ promoters or those engaged in the business of real estate who held the land/ immoveable property as stock in trade i.e. as part of their business. But the new section 43CA will also affect them now w.e.f. asst. year 2014-15.

Where the date of agreement fixing the value of consideration for transfer of the asset and the date of registration of such transfer of asset are not the same, the value may be taken as the value assessable by any authority of a State Government for the purpose of payment of stamp duty in respect of such transfer on the date of the agreement. For this purpose the amount of consideration or a part thereof received must be by any mode other than cash on or

before the date of agreement for transfer of the asset. It may also be noted that as per the newly inserted provisions of section 194-IA, TDS will be required to be deducted w.e.f. 1st June, 2013 @ One per cent by the transferee responsible for paying (other than the person referred to in section 194LA) to a resident transferor any sum by way of consideration for transfer of any immoveable property (other than agricultural land), at the time of credit of such sum to the account of the transferor or at the time of payment of the sum in cash or by Cheque or Draft or any other mode, whichever is earlier. However, no such deduction is required to be made if the consideration for such immoveable property is less than Rs.50 Lakhs.

The issues are dealt hereunder -

(a) Retainership fee paid to Advocate General: In case of CIT v. Govind Swaminathan [1998] 233 ITR 264 (Mad.), it has been held that the retainership fee is assessable as income from business and profession. The brief facts of the case are that the Court decided the relationship between a person and an advocate who is engaged as a retainer. The assessee was a barrister who was appointed Advocate General of Tamilnadu. It was stated that the Advocate General is the Principal Law Officer and Legal Advisor to the Government and his appointment is made under Article 165 of the Constitution to hold office at the pleasure of the Governor. The Advocate General is debarred from advising or holding briefs against the Government, defending accused persons and giving advice to private parties in which he is likely to be called on to advise the Government. The assessee was paid a

monthly salary of Rs. 1,500 plus fees for his appearance on behalf of the Government in various Courts of law. The Court held that the sum in question paid to the assessee is essentially a retainer fee paid to retain the services of the Advocate General in the discharge of his multifarious duties of the Advocate General of the State. There is, thus, absolutely no distinction between professional fees and other amounts styled as salary received by the assessee. They retain the same character, and same quality as fees received by a professional advocate for performing his duties. Hence the Court concluded that the receipt is purely a professional receipt. The ratio of this decision would be applicable to cases where retainership fee is received by professionals, whether concerning legal services or others.

Director's Remuneration: In case of a Director of a Company, employer-employee relationship cannot be presumed, but it should be ascertained based on the service agreement, if any, executed or, the Articles of Association of the company. In the case of CIT v. B.P. Dalmia [1994] 207 ITR 267 (Cal.), followed in the case of Sajid Mowjee v. ITO 279

ITR 467 (Cal), Calcutta High Court held that where as per the clauses of the Articles of Association, Director performs the duties subject to control of Board of Directors and is liable to be removed from office by resolution of shareholders in general meeting, the relationship of company and Director is that of employer and employee and remuneration received by director is assessable under the head salary. The Supreme Court in CIT v. Navnit Lal Sakar Lal [2001] 247 ITR 70 (SC) held that commission paid to managing director of the company is chargeable to tax as part of salary since employer-employee relationship exists. Similar view has been expressed in the cases of - CIT v. M.S.P. Rajes [1993] 202 ITR 646, 656 (Kar); CIT v. Smt. Gira Sarabhai [1994] 209 ITR 356, 362 (Guj); CIT v. Gautam Sarabhai [1985] 44 CTR (Guj) 143.


business income and not salary - K.P. Bhargava v. CIT [1954] 26 ITR 489 (All.); Dayachand Hardayal v. CIT [1953] 24 ITR 318 (Pun.); Jeewanlal v. CIT [1954] 217 (All.).

(d) Commission or incentive bonus received by development officers from LIC: Commission or incentive bonus received by development officers from LIC is assessable as salary - CIT v. MD Patil [1998] 229 ITR 71 (Kar.-FB); BM Parmar v. CIT [1999] 235 ITR 679 (P&H).

(e) Share of fees received by a doctor who is an employee of a Government medical college from its paying clinics: Share of fees received by a doctor who is an employee of a Government medical college from its paying clinics is assessable as salary - CIT v. Dr. Mrs. Usha Verma [2002] 254 ITR 404 (P&H).

(f) Professional Musician agreed to coach music in America for one year. In absence of master servant relationship, it was held that the consideration received is not salary but professional income - CIT v. Jnan Prakash Ghosh [2005] 205 ITR 454 (Cal.).

Lyon spins Australia to big win in Wellington

New Delhi: Nathan Lyon took a second-innings six-fer and registered a 10-wicket match haul for the fifth time in his illustrious career as Australia romped home to victory by 172 runs on the fourth morning of the series - opening Wellington Test. New Zealand had shown admirable resistance on the third day after being pushed so far behind in the game and even teased the possibility of an incredible come-from-behind win but eventually the turn and bounce accorded by the pitch at the Basin Reserve was enough for Lyon to rubber-stamp his influence on the game. Lyon's feat was the first 10-wicket match haul by a spinner in New Zealand since 2006 and extended the hosts' misery in Test matches against Australia, who they have beaten just once since 1993 now. The hosts, playing in front



of a near-capacity Sunday crowd, began sedately in pursuit of the 258 runs they needed at the start of the day's play. The overnight pair of Rachin Ravindra and Daryl Mitchell were largely untroubled in the first half-hour leading to a switch in strategy from Pat Cummins. To shackle the free-flowing Ravindra, Australia stationed three fielders

on the off-side and got Lyon to swap to the RA Vance bowling end. The move took only three balls to pay off as Ravindra cut a short ball straight to point and was dismissed for 59. That was enough for the veteran offspinner, who struck two more times over the next four balls, to dismiss Tom Blundell and Glenn Phillips. The former was forced to

lunge forward in defence and inside-edged his attempt on to his thigh-pad and into the hands of short-leg. Phillips, in Lyon's next over, was pushed back in his crease and defeated by an sharp turner that missed his flick and struck him in front of the stumps. The hosts, whose hopes were snuffed in a matter of two Lyon overs, found brief resistance through

Mitchell and Scott Kuggelein, but it was always a matter of time before Australia opened up one end. First-innings centurion Cameron Green found a delivery to misbehave off a good length and kick up onto Kuggelein, who could only glove it to the keeper.

The end came quickly thereafter as Josh Hazlewood bagged a pair of wickets while Lyon had the home skipper miscuing a slog to long on for his sixth wicket. It capped off a thoroughly impressive show from the visitors, who completed an impressive victory despite being put into bat on a green-top on the first morning, found a way to move into the ascendancy and stayed there through the course. Brief scores: Australia 383 & 164 beat New Zealand 179 & 196 (Rachin Ravindra 59, Daryl Mitchell 38; Nathan Lyon 6-65) by 172 runs.

New Delhi: Real Madrid manager, Carlo Ancelotti was left frustrated with Jude Bellingham being shown a late red card in his side's 2-2 draw against Valencia on Sunday, March 3. The England midfielder was sent off for a referee feud after his late goal was disallowed.

A full-time drama unfolded in Valencia's Mestalla Stadium on Sunday when Bellingham's 98th-minute

goal was disallowed after the referee blew the final whistle while the ball was in the air. This led to Madrid's 20-year-old midfielder getting into a heated argument with the on-field referee, and resulted in him swiftly pulling out the red card at the England international. Madrid coach Ancelotti, visibly irked with the scenario, reflected on the mishap and expressed how this was the first-time

ever he had such an incident happen to one of his players in his coaching career. "There's not much to say. Something unprecedented has happened and it's never happened to me before. After the rebound, we had possession. It's never happened to me before and there's nothing more to add," Ancelotti said after the match, as quoted by Real Madrid's official website.

Lionel Messi, Luis Suarez rekindle Barca magic as Inter Miami rout Orlando City



New Delhi: On a sun-drenched afternoon in Fort Lauderdale, Luis Suárez and Lionel Messi turned back the clock to their Barcelona days, orchestrating a footballing masterclass that left Orlando City reeling.

The stage was Chase Stadium, as Suárez and Messi helped Miami put their state rivals to the sword and continue their unbeaten start to the MLS season.

Suárez wasted no time in announcing his arrival to the MLS, netting his first two goals in the league

within the opening 11 minutes.

The first goal showcased his predatory instincts; a swift move initiated by Messi found Julian Gressel on the right, whose precise cross was met by Suárez's outstretched boot, directing the ball into the net with clinical finesse. Not content with just one, Suárez doubled his tally through a beautifully crafted give-and-go with Gressel, showcasing strength, intelligence, and skill to glide past defenders and coolly slot home.

Messi, added two goals of his own in the second half, further compounding Orlando City's misery. His first was a simple tap-in after Suárez's effort ricocheted off the crossbar, a moment of being in the right place at the right time. The second was a perfect header from the Argentine maestro, which more or less put the result beyond any doubt.

Robert Taylor contributed the fifth and final goal, rounding off a performance that was as dominant as it was dazzling. Behind these headline acts, the contributions of players like Gressel, who assisted on Suárez's goals, and goalkeeper Drake Callender, who kept a clean sheet with two saves, were pivotal. Their efforts ensured that Inter Miami not only entertained but also executed with efficiency.

O'Rourke walked off the field during Australia's second innings following a hamstring injury and didn't bowl again. However, he did come out to bat in the New Zealand second innings. Wagner did walk out as a substitute fielder during the Test to a great response from the crowd. "We haven't had a lot of discussions as yet," Southee said after New

Zealand's loss. "We'll see how Will scrubs up. The physio hasn't sort of put a timeframe on it or how bad it is. We'll just wait and see how Will goes over the next couple of days. I'm sure there'll be an update in the next 24 hours.

"We obviously have to go on and make a decision on who comes in and what role we sort of see that playing out in

Christchurch. [Wagner's] had a great reception here over the last week where he got a couple of moments on the field and obviously he's been a fan favourite for a long time."

However, one player

Southee definitely did rule out of contention was long-time new-ball partner Trent Boult. The 34-year-old hasn't played a Test match

since June 2022 and has only been playing T20 cricket recently. The skipper was also less critical of Scott Kuggelein, who in his second Test match wasn't quite able to lift the slack after O'Rourke had to walk off the field.

"He bowled well at times,"

Southee noted. "It was tough out there with that wind, the job he did, picked up a couple of wickets in

the first innings which were crucial. It's obviously a very small sample size in the two matches he's played and there's a bit of time, a year between Test matches as well. It's not easy to come in and make an impact straight away."

The 35-year-old admitted that Cameron Green's spectacular century in the first innings was the difference between the two sides. Green smashed an unbeaten 174 and frustrated the hosts alongside Josh Hazlewood as the last-wicket pair added 116.

"I think we probably could have tried to get Green out on that second morning," he said. "I think the way he played that night before, we thought he was probably going to come out and play some shots. But we probably could look to get him out and on that second morning and make things slightly easier than what we did."

No easy fixes to RCB's middle-order muddle

New Delhi: For the ninth time in nine games of WPL 2024 so far, the captain winning the toss has elected to field. On Saturday, the chasing team won for the seventh time.

Barring Delhi Capitals, who have won once and lost to a last-ball six, no other team has consistently put up a strong show batting first. Royal Challengers Bangalore did win their opening game against UP Warriorz, but that was off the last ball. Saturday's game between RCB and Mumbai Indians panned out in a very familiar way. By the end of the second

innings' powerplay, the fate of the contest had become obvious. Chasing a target of 132, Yastika Bhatia's early onslaught powered the visitors to 60 for 1 by the end of six overs.

That RCB couldn't stick to their bowling plans of attacking the stumps aided that free-flow of runs, admitted head coach Luke Williams. However, given that it wasn't the first time that such a massive disparity has been noted between the powerplay performances of the batting and the chasing sides in this tournament, the question on whether

the team has batted second has significant impact in the context of the games was posed to the RCB coach.


Williams though didn't want to peel the layers of the loss. The understanding was much more upfront for him: Mumbai Indians had batted better and bowled better. "It's been different days where it has got slightly better to bat in the second innings," Williams noted. "But the difference in results doesn't quite reflect the wicket. At different times it has certainly been advantageous to be able to bowl first, but throughout the tournament, the team

electing to field, pushing the home side down to 34 for 3. Unlike some of the other games so far this season, there wasn't as much movement on offer and the damage was primarily a result of false strokeplay coupled with disciplined bowling. The wickets were orchestrated by some fine field sets, tight bowling and execution error in the shots.

The early damage also cracked open a weakness in RCB's playing combination, wherein their bowling all-rounders, Sophie Molineux and Georgia Wareham, take up the No 6 and 7 spots. While the duo has batted

at such positions and higher for their state team and in the WBBL with a fair amount of success, it leaves them with much to compensate for in situations such as the one that panned out against Mumbai Indians. Moreover, they haven't fared too well either at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium either.

While the tournament hasn't turned out too well for opener Sophie Devine (9.75 av/102.63 SR), neither Molineux (11 av/88 SR) nor Wareham (11 av/110 SR) have been able to add much muscle with the bat. The selection of the XI currently is the limitation of the squad that has been



been able to execute better and been the better side on that particular day. It has been a combination of different times. Certainly tonight, we were comprehensively outplayed."

Despite being struck by the absence of their lead pacer Shabnim Ismail, Mumbai Indians grabbed hold of the contest within the powerplay after

assembled, wherein the excesses in bowling options have been offset by the lack of batting depth and cover. In case of an injury to any of the players in the top five, like in the previous game where Perry was ruled out, RCB have to call on their bowling all-rounders starts from position No 5.
