Bhubaneswar(KCN): Sitting MLA of Telkoi constituency Premananda Nayak, who resigned from BJD recently, has eventually joined the Bhartiya Janta Party (BJP). Besides, former Dhamnagar MLA Rajendra Das also joined the saffron party. In a major setback to the ruling Biju Janata Dal (BJD), former minister and sitting MLA from Telkoi constituency Premananda Nayak

resigned from primary membership of the party. Nayak won the assembly election in 2009 and 2019 on a BJD ticket. During Naveen Patnaik's 5th term, he was picked as Skill Development and Technical Education Minister. Meanwhile, Das, popularly known as Raju Das, won as an MLA from Dhamnagar constituency in Bhadrak district on a Biju Janata

Dal (BJD) ticket in 2009. The BJD denied him a ticket in 2014 polls. The regional party again gave him the party ticket in 2019, but he lost. During the 2022 Dhamnagar by-poll, BJD again denied Das a party ticket, following which he filed his nomination papers as an independent candidate and lost. Later, Das was expelled from the BJD for his alleged anti-party activities.

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Chief Minister Shri Naveen Patnaik has announced that the monthly remuneration of Urdu teachers employed in Upper Primary, and English Medium schools of the state and Urdu teachers working in government-fully funded and newly funded high schools has been increased from Rs 7,400 to Rs 15,000.

It is worth noting that on the occasion of the visit of the 5T chairman Karthik Pandian to the districts, the Urdu teachers employed in different parts of the state drew the attention of the chairman regarding their problems.

The state government has appointed contractual Urdu teachers and Urdu resource teachers for students taking Urdu as their primary language in various Upper primary, and medium English schools and high schools of the state.

Earlier, they were paid Rs 7,400 per month. According to the decision of the state government, now they will get a salary of Rs.15,000 per month. According to the decision of the state government, 44 Urdu teachers working in Upper Primary, and medium English schools and 40 Urdu resource teachers working in government fully funded and newly funded high schools will be benefited.

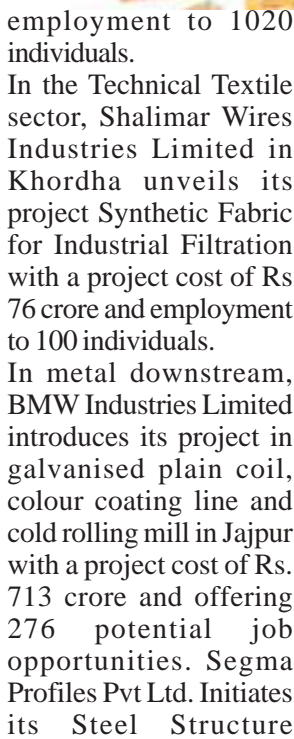

BIJU PATNAIK : The Legendary Administrator

Biju Patnaik had a brief tenure in office as he was 'Kamarajed' (A legendary Administrator) out in October, 1963. But during this period he injected a rare dynamism into the administration and lifted the "featureless and futureless" people of Orissa out of despondency. He acutely felt that Orissa mirrors the paradox of all backward areas – poverty amidst potential plenty. Orissa has a wealth of natural resources and yet it is the poorest and most backward state of India. Therefore for him any plan for the development of these vast natural resources, which shall help transform poverty into plenty may well serve as a model for other similarly situated areas in India.

Within that short period during which he took the stewardship of the State administration, Biju Patnaik laid the blue print for Orissa's development and the State was on the threshold of a new of industrial revolution. He not only accelerated the process of development, but was able to locate a number of new industries in the State – the MIG factory at Sunabeda, Balimela Dam, Public Corporations, Panchayat Industries, the Express Highway and a lot many. His ambitious projects, which he named as "Decade of Destiny" was meant to elevate the State to a new height.

Biju could not tolerate red-tapism. He would have a thing done immediately and not suffer any delay. Result he was charged with administrative impropriety. To the officials his advise was, "be loyal to me not to the government but to the destinies of this State, to the prosperity of the people". There is a story that once when a speeding motor truck carrying stones for the Paradeep Port was stopped by a traffic policeman, the driver humorously replied that the speed suggested by the policeman would delay the port work by several years, when Biju Patnaik wanted everybody to work at top gear.

The importance that Biju attached to Orissa's industrial development was reflected in his speech which he delivered at the inauguration of the Orissa Planning Board on June

15, 1962. He had said – "A people cannot grow unless the industries were developed and established here". Calling upon the bureaucrats to change their work-style, Patnaik said, "In the new set-up in the new adventure which we are going to embark upon, I would expect my officials to become thinkers and administrators in turn. I would expect them to collectively and willingly push the State towards the goal of prosperity. I would expect them to become leaders of men and not leaders of the longest notes on the files".

At the invitation of Biju Patnaik, Internationally known Biologist, Scientist and Philosopher Prof. J.B.S. Haldane accepted the post of the Director of the Biometry and Genetics Laboratory at Bhubaneswar, which was set up by the Government of Orissa. Prof. Haldane, who imparted to the Indian scientific scene a certain colour and character, became an Indian citizen in 1960 and devoted himself to assisting development of science in this rapidly developing country. He accepted Biju's offer because he (Biju) was 'capable of displaying great respect towards individuals whom he considered to be performing worthwhile work'. This genius died in Bhubaneswar on 1st December, 1964.

After Biju Patnaik took the rein of the State administration, Orissa witnessed rapid strides in education. The period between 1961-67 is aptly described as the golden era in the history of education of the State. At his initiative the Regional College of Education was set up at Bhubaneswar. The Regional Engineering College at Rourkela was established in 1961, the Orissa University of Agriculture and Technology was set up and during the Chief Ministership of Biren Mitra (when Biju was the Chairman of the State Planning Board). Universities were established in Berhampur and Sambalpur. Thus Biju is responsible for the giant leap forward of education in Orissa. When the Union government refused to construct the Paradeep Port, as the Chief Minister of Orissa he took upon himself to mobilize resources from within the State and built the Rs. 14 Crore Port when the Centre did not show much interest in the project. Patnaik's strong stand on the issue was vindicated when the Centre took over the Port after some years. Biju Patnaik proved his extraordinary organising ability by successfully

holding the Congress Session in 1964 at Bhubaneswar. His dream was fulfilled when on 12th March 1966, the Paradeep Port was commissioned.

A close confidant of Pandit Nehru, Biju enjoyed free access to Teen Murti Bhawan, the P.M.'s official residence. Nehru had entrusted him with the additional responsibilities of advising him on defense matters during the Chinese aggression and Patnaik was allotted an office near P.M.'s office in North Block. Pandit Nehru had asked him to visit the United States as an Advisory to the Ministry of External Affairs and discuss sensitive defense issues with the U.S. administration. During his stay in Washington, Biju gave interviews to 'Baltimore Sun' and 'Washington Post', in which he said that he had come to seek both ground to ground and air to air missiles along with radars, which could conceivably be tied to a network of the South East Asian Treaty Organisation (SEATO). US newspapers also portrayed the Orissa Chief Minister as the coming



defense Minister as the coming defence Minister, who will replace Y.B. Chouhan. The opposition charged Biju Patnaik with 'impropriety of revealing defence secrets, including details of the strength of the Indian Army'. There was a furore in Parliament and even the Lok Sabha Speaker Sardar Hukum Singh ruled that- 'it is not proper to disclose such information which is denied here'. But the Prime Minister strongly supported Biju and declared in the Parliament that whatever has been said by him to American newspaper 'did not harm us in any way'. This controversy highlighted how close Biju was to Pt. Nehru.

The Indian National Congress has split in 1969. In May 1970 Biju Patnaik and his followers left the Congress (R) in protest against "naked bossism" and central imposition after he had been denied a ticket to Rajya Sabha by the Congress High Command; although his

case was sponsored by the Provincial Congress Committee. In 1970 he resigned from Congress Party and subsequently formed a regional party Utkal Congress. In the 1971 election, no party came out with a clear majority. Biju Patnaik and the Swatantra leader R.N. Singh Deo joined hands. This came as a surprise to political observers, as Singh Deo was a bitter critic of Biju. And with the support of the Jharkhand Party, they formed a United Front. Biju successfully persuaded the 82 years Old veteran Politician Biswanath Das to become the Chief Minister, after his long spell of Political retirement.

A Biju critic says that he functioned in an arbitrary and autocratic manner "I am the party and I am the government" – he used to say "Am I not enough?" What was his reaction when immediately after being sworn in as Chief Minister in 1990 he was asked, how long it would take for him to choose other members of the cabinet. Biju has a painful feeling that in spite of being so rich in natural resources, Orissa has remained one

Puri Jagannath Temple, he used to enter into a monologue with the Lord.

"It may not be exaggeration to say that Biju Patnaik was the tallest among all leader from Orissa, who made their mark in national politics. A major reason why he acquired his status was undoubtedly his romantic, impulsive nature, which made him stand out even at a time when, with Nehru and J.P. at the height of their power and there was no death of colourful politicians in India". According to the veteran journalist, there is no epithet that is not used about him. "Why, volatile, flamboyant, dynamic, reckless, daredevil, damn efficient" and what not? Perhaps all these suit him in one context or the other. But in the jungle of attributes his essential human qualities, his deep love for the people, are often missed. Once Patnaik is deeply moved by the peoples' distress, he will move mountains to give succour. When Government at the State and the centre were busy doing maths on relief expenditure. Biju pressed into service a private aircraft and himself started dropping food packets to the marooned thousands who would have perished, but for this prompt step.

Tales and anecdotes about him are a legion. There is a story that Pt. Nehru once asked Dr. B.C. Roy – Have you met a man called Biju Patnaik? "I have heard about him: but not yet met him", was the reply of the Bengal Chief MINISTER. Nehru said, meet him sometimes. I like such forward-looking, brave people. The only difficult is that sometimes you don't know where he will land you.

A giant transference of energy had taken place between him and his people. He delighted the people by his youthfulness of spirit and body and the people were attracted to his spontaneity and utter freedom from pompousness. In the end, his great strength far outweighed his weakness. Therefore when he died, even his most partisan adversaries felt compelled to acknowledge the immensity of the man they had opposed.

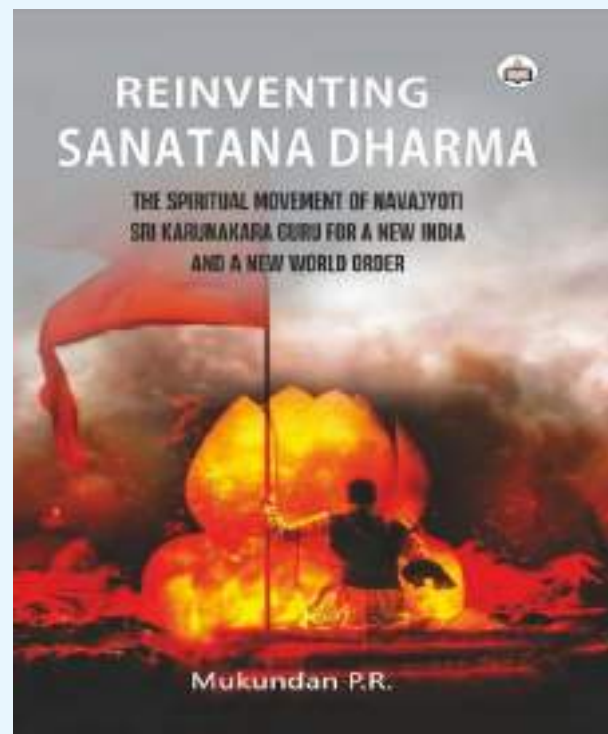

A fresh political outlook, a narrative that India proposes to the rest of the world has a spiritual flavor. This approach confines their search for solutions within a distorted framework, leading to

problems and a reluctance to acknowledge the conflicts arising from the corporate-led farming model promoted in recent decades. This model inherently favours large farms and unjustly marginalizes small farmers. A critical aspect of this corporate-led model is its relentless pursuit of increasing corporate and financial control over farming, leaving small and medium farmers increasingly vulnerable. Moreover, it encourages the extensive use and sale of high-profit inputs, such as chemical fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, machines, gadgets, and fuel, sold by big businesses. These inputs, often harmful to the environment, soil, water, and climate, underscore the need for a paradigm shift. Governments, unfortunately, have primarily supported this harmful model instead of rectifying it. Even when pressed to take environmental protection measures, they tend to make superficial changes that can only succeed with

broader systemic adjustments. For example, more than reducing agrochemical usage will be necessary if seeds are manipulated to require specific chemicals for proper growth. Addressing this issue necessitates paying more significant attention to protecting the on-farm diversity of seeds, varieties, and crops. Consider a scenario where a government, previously subsidizing costly and ecologically harmful agrochemicals, decides to reduce this subsidy to align with a green agenda. In this case, farmers may react negatively, perceiving it as an immediate cost increase. However, this opposition stems from the limited and insufficient nature of the government's green initiative rather than an inherent resistance to ecologically protective measures. Contrastingly, envision a different situation where the government is genuinely committed to creating a comprehensive, ecologically protective farming system. In this scenario, farmers would emerge as

enthusiastic supporters of an agricultural paradigm that ensures their livelihoods and contributes significantly to climate change mitigation and adaptation. Governments and international trade organizations, in their pursuit of promoting corporate interests, often ensnare farmers in needless competition with one another. Rather than fostering a sense of global solidarity, farmers find themselves locked in hostile and unfair competition, ultimately causing problems for all involved. Meanwhile, corporate, trade, and finance interests thrive. Farmer movements must broaden their understanding and work towards a worldwide unity that combines the protection of small farmers' livelihoods with ecologically protective farming practices that safeguard soil, water, and pollinators while contributing considerably to climate change mitigation and adaptation.

The root of conflicts in achieving these objectives lies in the shortsightedness of vision and policy perspective, driven by the dominance of big business interests. Recent promotions of genetically modified (GM) crops further compound the issue, potentially causing severe environmental impacts and jeopardizing farmers' sustainable, safe, and healthy livelihoods. Examining the most desirable priorities and accompanying policies for the food and farm sector provides clarity: Prioritizing the cultivation of food that is healthy, nutritious, and safe on farms, processing food in ways that maintain health, safety, and wholesome nutrition without excessive use of harmful additives, protecting and improving soil organic content and porosity to conserve water, conserving water, provide protective irrigation, and avoid excessive, wasteful irrigation and water-intensive commercial crops, safeguarding earthworms, micro-organisms, insects, bees, birds, and

pollinators to maintain the balance of nature, ensuring sustainable, healthy, and creative livelihoods for those in food production and processing. Further, maximizing the potential of local, village-based cottage and small-scale food processing, regulating food trade to ensure farmers and small food processors receive a fair share of the retail price, developing farming technology using local resources while minimizing input costs for farmers, minimizing the use of fossil fuels, with no specific subsidies for them, providing subsidies directly to small and medium farmers, with higher incentives for adopting ecologically protective policies will go a long way towards sustainable development in agriculture. We need to ensure fair prices for safe, healthy, and nutritious food produced by small and medium farmers, minimize the distance food travels from farm to consumer, allocate farmland to landless rural families and promote kitchen

gardens, engage landless households in community efforts to use vacant land for growing indigenous tree species, provide adequate provisions for farm animals, emphasizing healthy fodder and better pastures, encourage diverse crops and crop varieties in mixed farming systems and crop rotations, prioritizing local food and nutrition needs. These priorities and policies are mutually consistent, supporting each other without any inherent conflict. They form an integral part of a comprehensive approach that addresses justice, peace, health, nutrition, sustainability, and environmental protection in the food and farming sector. Notably, these priorities gain even greater relevance in the perspective of climate change mitigation and adaptation. The comprehensive mix of policies, rooted in the wisdom of generations of farmers, aligns well with the urgent requirement to reduce fossil fuel usage, absorb carbon dioxide, and adapt to changing

climate conditions. Despite their well-documented benefits, big business interests now seek leadership in climate change mitigation and adaptation, posing a significant threat. There is a risk of the entire agenda being distorted to serve corporate profits and control, especially with disruptive technologies like GM crops. Farmers and advocates must vigorously oppose this threat and safeguard the agenda's integrity for desirable changes in the food and farming sector. The call for change extends beyond mere subsidy adjustments; it demands a fundamental shift towards a holistic, environmentally conscious farming system. Legendary Tall Man Biju Babu !!!

Legendary Son of the Soil Tall Man Late Bijayananda Patnaik, affectionately known to the people at large as Biju Patnaik, Biju Babu strode like a colossus in the politics and public life of Odisha, and played a very important role in our national life and politics as well. His life was an extraordinary saga of adventure and sacrifice, valour and prowess. Born on 5 March 1916 in Cuttack, Odisha, he hailed from a family of freedom fighters, ideologues and patriots. Biju Patnaik was educated in the Mission Primary School of Cuttack and Ravenshaw Collegiate School, in the same city and, thereafter, studied in the Science stream in the prestigious Ravenshaw College, Cuttack. Even as a student, Biju Patnaik was drawn to the national liberation movement. During his school days, Biju Patnaik took part in the

freedom struggle and had to face police lathi charge while attempting to meet Mahatma Gandhi in 1926. In his formative years, he came under the influence of Mahatma Gandhi and the great nationalist sons of Odisha, Gopabandhu Das and Madhusudhan Das. He actively associated himself with the freedom struggle and participated in the Quit India Movement in close association with revolutionary leaders like Aruna Asaf Ali. He also underwent imprisonment from 1943 to 1945. A nationalist to the core, Biju Patnaik was an inspiring leader who was deeply committed to the national cause, public welfare and development. He was a socialist at heart and was greatly inspired by the ideals and ideas of Acharya Narendra Deva, Jaya Prakash Narayan, Dr. Rammanohar Lohia and Minoo Masani. His life was a shining example of how commitment to certain finer human values can be the guiding force for the welfare of the people. Naturally, he was a leader of the masses who articulated their

concerns in the Chambers of the nation's representative institutions. During his long innings in public life, Biju Patnaik was elected time and again to the Odisha Legislative Assembly as also to both the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha. He was elected to the State Legislative Assembly for the first time in 1947. Thereafter, he was returned to the State Legislative Assembly six more times. During these eventful years, he adorned the Office of the Chief Minister of Odisha during 1961-63 and three decades later during 1990-95. Biju Patnaik's commitment to parliamentary democracy and to the development and progress of the country through industrialization, his concern for the development of the States and his belief in true federalism provided not only a roadmap for holistic development but also a plan of action. Biju Patnaik has been hailed as the maker of modern Odisha and the architect of industrialization in the State. Himself a successful industrialist,



he brought Odisha into the map of industrial India. Before entering the arena of politics, he had played a vital role in the industrialization of Odisha by setting up the Kalinga Airlines, Kalinga Tubes, Orissa Textile Mills, Kalinga Iron Industries, etc. Odisha's economic development owes a great deal to Biju Patnaik for the construction of the Paradeep Port, the Express Highway, the MIG air engine factory, cement factory, several irrigation projects, etc. He also started two Universities and several other centres of higher education in the State. Biju Patnaik believed

that unless the States became strong, India could never be a strong nation. He used to assert that when he championed Odisha's development, it was not because of any narrow consideration but to make the country as a whole strong and prosperous. He stressed that true federalism would result in strengthening India's unity in diversity which would accelerate the pace of progress of the nation. Concerned as he was for the poor and the downtrodden, as the Chief Minister of Odisha, Biju Patnaik took a major initiative to raise the minimum wages in the State. He was an articulate champion of

women empowerment and gave due recognition to the talent of the womenfolk by making reservation not only in employment but also in local bodies in the State during his Chief Ministership. It was his commitment to women's welfare which impelled him to take the stringent measures of enforcing prohibition and abolishing dowry. At the national level, Biju Patnaik came to be recognized as a very eminent parliamentarian. He was a member of the Sixth, Seventh, Eighth and Eleventh Lok Sabhas representing the Kendrapara parliamentary constituency during 1977-79, 1980-84, 1984-89 and the Aska

constituency during 1996-97, respectively. He was also a member of the Rajya Sabha in 1971. During 1996-97, he was the Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Finance. As the Union Minister of Steel, Mines and Coal during 1977-80, he provided a new direction and dynamism to the steel industry in the country. The 'Son of the Soil' breathed his last on 17 April 1997 at the age of eighty-one. Biju Patnaik was a man of rare courage, action and creativity. He is regarded as the 'Bhumi Putra' or the 'son of the soil' in Indonesia for his faring actions during the Indonesian freedom struggle in conducting rescue operations and saving the life of the then President of Indonesia, Sukarno, in the late 1940s. He headed an Air Transport Command in the Second World War during 1940-42. A grateful Russia honoured him for the overtime service to the country in 1945 for flying across to the embattled Soviet troops during the Second World War. In 1948, he landed the first platoon of troops in Srinagar which fought the

Pakistani raiders. An icon and role model for the youth and the younger generations of India, Biju Patnaik was a great patron of science and technology and took several steps in this direction. The Kalinga Foundation and the Kalinga Prize instituted by him and monitored by the UNESCO is an everlasting testimony to his vision of modernisation of society through the dissemination of science and popularising scientific knowledge and ideas. Since its institution in 1951, the Kalinga Prize has become a source of encouragement and inspiration to all those who aspire for excellence in their respective fields. Legendary Biju Patnaik was a great optimist and had an unshakeable faith and confidence in the infinite potential of the youth of the country. He dreamt of a prosperous and developed India where everyone had the opportunity to develop his or her personality and realize the full potential. Deep Homage to Tall Man!!!

Carl Gustaf - Army's Go-To Portable Rocket System To Be Made In India



New Delhi: In a significant development toward self-reliance in defence manufacturing, Carl Gustaf M4, a recoilless multi-role rocket system widely used by the infantry, will be made in India. The manufacturing facility will be located in Haryana's Jhajjar. Manufactured by Saab, a Sweden-based company, received a 100 per cent Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) approval from the Centre and will now produce the Carl-Gustaf M4 system under Saab FFVO India Private Limited.

"I am proud to start constructing our first facility outside Sweden for Carl-Gustaf, a product with a long history with the Indian Armed Forces. We look forward to starting production of our excellent product, now engineered and made in India", says Gorgen Johansson, Senior Vice President and Head of Saab's business area Dynamics. "Today is an important milestone for Sweden and India. Saab's factory will be the first foreign fully-

owned defence production facility in India. It is a testament to the strong bilateral relationship between our countries," says Hakan Jevrell, State Secretary for Foreign Trade, Sweden.

Carl-Gustaf has been in service with the Indian Army since 1976 and has been used extensively in counter-terrorism/insurgency operations. It's a portable, shoulder-fired, single-shot, rocket system that is used for destroying tanks and built-up structures. It is seen as a game changer in urban combat. The M4 variant, which will be manufactured in India, is the latest variant. The origins of Carl Gustaf can be traced to World War II, the fourth-generation variant is the latest. "We will partner with Indian suppliers and will fully meet the requirements of "Make in India" for the systems manufactured in the facility. At the new factory, Saab will deploy complex technologies, including the latest sighting technology and advanced carbon fibre-winding to

manufacture Carl-Gustaf M4 for the Indian armed forces, and components which may be included in other users' systems," Saab said.

One of the components of the Centre's Aatmanirbhar or self-reliance project is to build a domestic defence infrastructure with public-private participation. Fighting in Built-up Areas (FIBUA), in other words, an area dense with buildings and structures will entail lethal urban warfare, posing severe challenges for the Israeli ground troops and armoured units. The Indian Army has witnessed urban warfare and troops have been extensively used in Jammu and Kashmir, the northeast, Punjab, etc. Carl Gustaf has been a mainstay of several forces around the world including India. The system can fire various ammunitions like High Explosive Anti-Tank (HEAT), High Explosive (HE) to anti-structure munition and High Explosive Dual Purpose (HEDP) and multi-target ammo that can be used against tanks and Infantry Fighting Vehicles.

SBI Requests Supreme Court To Extend Deadline To Give Electoral Bonds Info



New Delhi(KCN): The State Bank of India (SBI) has requested the Supreme Court to extend the deadline till June 30 for giving information about electoral bonds to the Election Commission. The Supreme Court in a historic judgment last month had struck down the electoral bonds scheme and told SBI to give the information to the Election Commission (EC) by March 6. The Supreme Court ended the controversial electoral bonds scheme on the grounds that it violated citizens' right to information. The electoral bonds scheme, Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud had said, was unconstitutional and arbitrary and may lead to a quid pro quo arrangement between political parties and

donors. The Supreme Court had ordered SBI to stop issuing these bonds and give details of donations made through this mode to the EC. The poll body was then told to publish this information on its website by March 13. The Constitution bench of five judges held that the stated objective of fighting black money and maintaining the confidentiality of donors cannot defend the scheme. Electoral bonds, the court said, are not the only way to curb black money. Of blocking black money from entering the political system. The then Finance Minister Arun Jaitley had said the conventional practice of political funding in India was cash donations. "The

sources are anonymous or pseudonymous. The quantum of money was never disclosed. The present system ensures unclean money coming from unidentifiable sources. It is a wholly non-transparent system," he had said. On the confidentiality clause, he had said the disclosure of the donors' identity would make them go back to the cash option. Soon after the scheme was implemented, multiple parties challenged it in court. These included CPM, Congress leader Jaya Thakur, and the non-profit Association for Democratic Reforms. They argued that the confidentiality clause came in the way of the citizen's right to information.

PM Means "Elder Brother": Revanth Reddy Bats For Better Centre-State Relation

Hyderabad(KCN): Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy stood up to be counted on a day the BJP was going big with the 'Modi ka Pariwar' campaign on social media. "Hamare hisaab se Pradhan Mantri matlab bade bhai (According to us, Prime Minister means elder brother)," Mr Reddy said in Adilabad, where he had gone to receive Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his visit to Telangana. Then he made his context clear -- that states cannot prosper without the Prime Minister's help and he wanted to bring Telangana on par with Gujarat. "Only with his (PM Modi's) help can Chief Ministers take their states forward. It is my request that if Telangana has to progress, if it has to move ahead like Gujarat, your help is required," he said at Adilabad, where he shared dais with the Prime Minister.



To reach the Prime Minister's goal of a 5 trillion dollar economy, India needs five metropolitan cities. "Hyderabad wants to contribute. Please support us in the Metro rail... Just as you developed the Sabarmati river, we want to regenerate our Musi river," Mr Reddy said to cheers from the audience at gathering where PM Modi laid the foundation for ? 6,697 crore worth of projects. Mr Reddy said it is the people who ultimately lose when there is friction between the Centre and the states. Politics should be limited

to elections only and after the polls the elected leaders should thrive for the development of the state with the help of the Centre, he added. In a marked departure from the tradition of his predecessor K Chandrasekhar Rao, the Congress Chief Minister flew to the Adilabad airport early this morning to receive the Prime Minister, keeping the traditional protocol. His address, many said, was a textbook example of political sagacity. He knows the Modi development story has many takers. Instead of being critical of it, he publicly announced that

he wants to be a part of it, openly declaring that he will not be on a political warpath, taking a confrontationist approach against the Centre. Mr Rao, who was the chief of Bharat Rashtra Samithi, had skipped PM Modi's official visits to the state on several occasions. He suffered a massive defeat at the hands of the Congress in the state elections last year, and was replaced by Mr Reddy, who had led his party's campaign. The Prime Minister greeted Mr Reddy warmly and shook hands with him after his address. But that did not stop him from

attacking the Congress, along with the Bharat Rashtra Samithi. "Changing name from TRS to BRS did not change anything, changing BRS government with a Congress government did not change anything either," he said. PM Modi also made a reference to the Kaleshwaram project, saying that even though the Congress has been criticising BRS for alleged big-ticket corruption in the irrigation project, they were not making sensitive documents public. The Prime Minister inaugurated infrastructure projects to the tune of ? 6,697 crore and dedicated a second unit of NTPC plant worth ? 6000 crore. Tomorrow, he opens the Civil Aviation Research Organisation at Begumpet and launches over ? 9000 projects in Sangareddy, where it will be followed by a public meeting.

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Odisha on March 5 amid rising speculations of alliance between the ruling Biju Janata Dal (BJD) and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) ahead of the simultaneous elections to the Lok Sabha and the state Assembly in April. The prime minister will unveil the projects from a function in Chandikhole in Jajpur district, an official statement said. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to visit Odisha on March 5, which happens to be the 108th birth anniversary of late chief minister Biju Patnaik, father of CM Naveen Patnaik. Is it

being reported that the PM will pay his respect to "The Tall Man Of Odisha" soon after his arrival at the Biju Patnaik International Airport here in Bhubaneswar. The BJD has made grand arrangements to commemorate the day and reiterated its demand for a Bharat Ratna for Biju Patnaik. The buzz in the state is that the PM may announce the honour for the late CM, which will galvanise the alliance between the two parties. PM Modi has already announced five Bharat Ratnas this year, for former Bihar chief minister and socialist leader late Karpoori Thakur, late Prime



Minister PV Narasimha Rao, late agricultural scientist MS Swaminathan, BJP stalwart and former deputy PM LK Advani, and late Prime Minister and farmer leader

Chaudhary Charan Singh. Following the official programme, he will address a rally of the BJP in Jajpur, considered a stronghold of the Biju Janata Dal (BJD).

The PM will inaugurate Indian Oil Corp's mono ethylene glycol project at the Paradip Refinery. He will also inaugurate a 344-km-long product pipeline from Paradip in Odisha to Haldia in West

Bengal. He will also inaugurate 0.6 mmtpa LPG import facility at Paradip. PM Modi will dedicate to the nation four-laning of the Singhara-Binjabahal section of NH-49, four-laning of the Binjabahal-Tileibani section of NH-49, four-laning of the Balasore-Jharpokharia section of NH-18, and four-laning of the Tangi-Bhubaneswar Section of NH-16. He will also lay the foundation stone for the eight-laning of Chandikhole-Paradip road. The PM will dedicate to the nation the 162-km-long Bansapani-Daitari-Tomka-Jakhapura rail

line. It will not only enhance the existing capacity but will also facilitate efficient transportation of iron and manganese ore from Keonjhar to the nearest ports and steel plants, the statement said. A CONCOR container depot in Kalinga Nagar will also be inaugurated by the prime minister. He will also lay the foundation stone for an electric loco periodical overhauling workshop at Narla, a wagon periodical overhauling workshop at Kantabanji and upgradation and augmentation of maintenance facilities at Baghuapal.

Modi will also inaugurate a 5-mld seawater desalination plant at Odisha Sands Complex of Indian Rare Earths Ltd. It has been built as a part of field applications of indigenous desalination technologies developed by Bhabha Atomic Research Centre. While one will have to wait for the PM to spell out his pitch for Odisha, observers say a friendship between the ruling party and the opposition during election season does not bode well for either, though it may help the BJP close in on its target of "Mission 400" for the Lok Sabha polls.

9 Bangladeshi Nationals Detained While Entering Puri Jagannath Temple



Puri(KCN): The Singhadwar police in Odisha's Puri district detained nine non-Hindus who were nabbed while entering the Jagannath temple on Sunday. According to reports, all nine are from Bangladesh and they were staying at

a hotel in Puri Town. Among the nine, four reportedly entered the 12th-century shrine while the other five persons were found outside, sources said. The police have detained them and launched a probe into the incident.

The cops have also conducted searches at their hotel rooms, sources said. Notably, non-Hindus are barred from entering the Jagannath temple. "Five non-Hindus were found at the heritage corridor of Jagannath

temple today. We talked to them and came to know that four of their friends had entered the temple. We immediately informed the incident to Singhadwar police. The police detained them and launched a probe. We urge the cops and the district administration to step up security at the shrine," said Shantanu Pandey, a Vishva Hindu Parishad-Bajrang Dal activist from Puri. When contacted, an official of Singhadwar police said, "It has been alleged that some non-Hindus had entered Jagannath temple. We detained them and launched a probe. We are verifying their passports and other documents."

CONSTRUCTION WORK FOR SUB-WAY NEAR NIDHIPANDA BRIDGE STARTED



BHUBANESWAR, (KCN): Railway Minister Kept his promise and was sanctioned fund of rupees 14.7 Crores in September 2023. The construction work for Sub-way near Nidhipanda Railway Bridge started today. Sri Ashwini Vaishnaw, Hon'ble Minister for Railways during his visit to Balasore on 21st June, 2023 had met the villagers who had a long pending demand for construction of a subway near Nidhipanda Bridge (Br. No. 259).

The Railway Minister discussed the issue with local villagers and assured them to resolve the matter. The 'Designing team' of Railway has immediately prepared the design for Subway which was approved by the competent authority. A fund of Rs. 14.7 crores has been sanctioned in September 2023 by the

Railway Board for construction of Subway near Nidhipanda Bridge of Balasore.

Nidhipanda bridge is an important bridge in Haldipada-Balasore section of Kharagpur – Bhadrak section. One of the spans of this bridge is being used by local people for commuting of both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. The area gets water logged during monsoon and the crossing under the bridge becomes unapproachable cutting connectivity to villages. In light of these issues, after Hon'ble Minister for Railways instructions, a survey was immediately conducted for provision of alternate, safe arrangement for vehicular traffic as well as pedestrians. A scheme was prepared whereby a subway of size 5m (W) X 5m (H) has been proposed at the

approach of the bridge at Kharagpur end. This subway will be used for passing of all kinds of vehicles including heavy vehicles.

In view of the above, the construction work has been started which will fulfill the demand of local people. Additionally, keeping in mind that the area is prone to waterlogging during monsoon, a second subway is proposed having dimensions of 4m(W)X 2.7m(H) which is about 1.6m above the bed level of the bridge and will act as an all-weather road even in times of heavy water discharges. With the intervention and close monitoring of Hon'ble Minister for Railways, the project and fund of Rs 14.7 crores was sanctioned in September 2023 and work is now started with close monitoring.
