

Will there be an alliance between BJP and BJD ahead of 2024 elections?



Bhubaneswar, (KCN): Speculations of a possible announcement of an alliance between the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Biju Janata Dal (BJD) today, have warmed up the political atmosphere in Odisha. Ahead of the upcoming general elections 2024, if an alliance is formed, it will be after a gap of 15 years that the BJD will return to the NDA fold. However, it is still unclear whether the parties will come to any consensus for any alliance. As per sources, a discussion is probably going on between BJD and BJP over seat sharing. It is said that the BJD might get a majority of Assembly constituency seats while the BJP may

opt for more Lok Sabha seats. Such alliance speculations are rife as senior BJP leaders have been called to Delhi by the senior leadership for a crucial meeting this evening. Similarly, senior leaders of BJD have also been called by the Odisha Chief Minister and the party chief Naveen Patnaik to discuss several issues. Though both BJD and BJP leaders refuted alliance possibilities in the past, the recent developments have again reignited the coalition possibility. Both the crucial meetings by the BJP and the BJD have sparked coalition rumours in Odisha. It is being said that

several issues including seat sharing might be discussed. However, things are likely to get cleared only after an official announcement. The speculations assume ground as the camaraderie between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik was seen during the former's Odisha visit on Tuesday. PM Modi launched a scathing attack on Congress and INDIA alliance but refrained from making any attack on the BJD during a public meeting at Chandikhole yesterday. Besides, both PM Modi and CM Patnaik praised each other during an official programme in Jajpur yesterday.

Odisha court awards death sentence to five convicts for politician's murder

Keonjhar (KCN): A court in Odisha's Keonjhar district has sentenced five persons to death for the murder of politician Rama Chandra Behera in 2019. The additional district and sessions judge of Anandpur pronounced the verdict Tuesday based on the testimony of 53 witnesses and 94 documents, additional public prosecutor Aswini Kumar Mallick said.

The five convicts are Sanjay Prusty, Ajit Prusty, Arun Prusty, Alekh Prusty and Dola Boitei. One of the accused Pramod Das, who was a minor then, is under judicial custody of a child care institute (CCI), Mallick added. Behera, a former block chairman, was brutally murdered near his residence at Dhakotha village in Keonjhar district March 25, 2019,

prior to the general and state assembly polls. The perpetrators visited Behera's house, called him out, and then killed him. Additionally, they mutilated his body. He was initially taken to the sub-divisional hospital in Anandpur and subsequently referred to SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack. However, he succumbed to his injuries on the way to Cuttack, police said.

Crocodile survey begin in Sunderban Forest by West Bengal Government

Kolkata (AMBAR MUKHERJEE) : After a gap of 12 years, state forest department has started an exercise in the Sunderbans to estimate the population of crocodile, the delta region's top predator. The last one was conducted in 2012 when around 140 crocodiles were found, a forest official said. Forest officials on boats covered around 900 km of riverbanks and creeks for physical sighting. "We had 22 teams, out of which 14 were deployed for the Sunderbans Tiger Reserve (STR) and eight for the South 24 Parganas forest division. Each team had forest department personnel as well as representatives of local wildlife NGOs," said forest departmental official.



Apart from tiger, crocodile are found in the brackish waters in Bengal's mangrove region. The Sajnekhali and Basirhat ranges of the Sunderband Tiger Reserve and the Matla range of the South 24 Parganas division were

covered on January 17 and 20 during the course of the exercise. "Each boat covered 40 km in two days. The data, compiled on the basis of the physical sightings and the health of the habitat, is being prepared now. A preliminary report is

HOWRAH AND KOLKATA GETS CONNECTED UNDER RIVER HOOGHLY THROUGH METRO SERVICES

PRIME MINISTER INAUGURATES HOWRAH MAIDAN-ESPLANADE STRETCH OF EAST-WEST METRO AND OTHER METRO CORRIDORS

Kolkata, (KCN): Another feather is being added to the cap of Kolkata Metro as Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the much awaited Howrah Maidan to Esplanade Stretch (4.8 km) of East-West Metro today from the newly constructed Esplanade Metro station of this Corridor. Shri Modi also inaugurated the Kavi Subhash – Hemanta Mukhopadhyay Stretch (5.4 km) of the Orange Line and extended Taratala – Majerhat Stretch (1.25 km) of Purple Line. With these inaugurations, the traffic scenario of Kolkata and Howrah is assumed to be undergoing a facelift. The Prime Minister waved to the waiting crowd waiting patiently outside as well as inside of new Esplanade station this morning before the inauguration. Shri P



Uday Kumar Reddy, General Manager, Metro Railway explained him the East-West Metro Project with the help of a 3-D Model. Shri Modi expressed his satisfaction witnessing such an engineering marvel and praised the Metro officers, staff as well as the engineers and labourers who have toiled hard to realise the dream of running Metro services under a mighty river like Hooghly for the first time in the country which is going to make public transport far, hassle-free as well as

environment-friendly. After the inauguration, the Prime Minister flagged off the first Metro services on these three routes. He also travelled in a Metro from Esplanade to Howrah Maidan and back. During this Metro journey, he sat beside the school children, labourers and engineers associated with these projects and interacted with them. He enquired them about their expectations from Kolkata Metro and also about their feelings while travelling under river Hooghly for the first time.

The students thanked the Prime Minister for making them experience a dream come true travel with the Head of the State. In a series of posts on X, the Prime Minister said: "The metro journey was made memorable thanks to the company of these youngsters and those who worked on this project. We also travelled through the tunnel under the Hooghly river." "It's a very special day for the people of Kolkata as the city's metro network gets

significantly enhanced. Connectivity will get a boost and traffic will get decongested. It's a proud moment that the Howrah Maidan-Esplanade Metro section has the first underwater metro transportation tunnel under any major river in our country." A total of 11.45 kms has been added with Kolkata Metro network today at a cost of Rs. 6925 crore. These projects will help people of far-flung areas of South 24 Parganas, Howrah, Hooghly Midnapur to travel in and around Kolkata without any traffic snarl and at a faster pace. This apart, the Prime Minister also inaugurated several Metro projects worth Rs 15,400 crore of Agra, Pune, Kochi and a part of Delhi – Meerut Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS). Shri Modi also flagged off the first metro services on these routes.

Former Union minister Srikant Jena returns to Congress



New Delhi (KCN): Former Union minister Srikant Jena returned to the Congress Wednesday and asserted that the INDIA bloc will defeat the BJP-BJD's 'unholy alliance' in Odisha. Jena had been expelled by the Congress in 2019 for alleged anti-party activities. At a press conference at the AICC headquarters

here, the party's in-charge of Odisha Ajay Kumar welcomed Jena into the party. "There were some misunderstandings which have now been clarified. I met Congress President (Mallikarjun Kharge), KC Venugopal. We had a long chat with Ajay ji and it has been sorted out. I have been working in favour of

the Congress even though I have been away," he said. "PM Modi and Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, their parties (BJP and the BJD), are uniting themselves in an open alliance. They had been in an open alliance, and now also they are joining hands," he said. The Congress and INDIA bloc will face BJP-BJD and defeat them, he asserted. "People of Odisha are angry with this unholy alliance. Their real face has been exposed," he said. Kumar said that the BJP and BJD had been in a "live-in" relationship and it is high time that the "marriage" between the two parties be made official.

Soulful Sivasagar

Sivasagar is a district in the state of Assam, India, 369 kms away from Guwahati. The district is located on the upper Brahmaputra Valley. It is known for its historic monuments and temples built during the reign of the Ahom Dynasty. The Ahoms influenced the political and cultural life of Assam and ruled from the 13th century to the early 19th century. Charaideo was one of the earliest capitals of the Ahom Kingdom. Later, under the reign of different rulers, Saragua, Gargaon, Rangpur and Jorhat became capitals of the Ahom Dynasty at different points of time. The Ahoms were the descendants of the Shan/Tai tribe of Chinese origin who had settled in the region of Upper Burma. Thereafter, Sivasagar was founded by King Chaolung Sukaphaa, also known as Siu-ka-pha of the same tribe. It is said that Siu-ka-pha was accompanied by his soldiers, elephants, ministers and officials when he entered the Brahmaputra valley in the 13th century crossing the Patkai Hills. The rule of the Ahom Dynasty ended with the Burmese invasion of Assam somewhere between 1817 and 1825 and then the subsequent annexation by the

British East India Company in 1825. The Ahom dynasty reached its zenith under the reign of Rudra Simha (1696-1714). During his rule the capital was shifted to Meteka near present-day Sivasagar. He built the city of Rangpur with the help of Ghanashyam, the chief architect. It is believed that Ghanashyam was a Muslim from Bengal who later converted to Hinduism. As a result of Ghanashyam's influence we find an amalgamation of Islamic architectural elements such as domes, arches with Hindu elements like the sikhara. The architecture of the buildings constructed during the reign of the Ahoms can be understood in two ways - secular and religious. The secular architecture includes forts, pavilions and palaces. Whereas the religious architecture is dominated by temples dedicated to Lord Siva, Lord Visnu and Goddess Durga. A dynasty which lasted for almost six hundred years paid great attention to the security of their kingdom. They built ramparts at various points which are locally known as Garh. These were surrounded by deep and wide moats called Garkhawoi which were filled with water. In fact, today the presence of ramparts can be determined from places

whose names have 'Garh' as suffix. The city of Sivasagar is named after the famous Sivasagar tank, locally known as Borpukhuri. The city embraces multiple ethnic groups such as the Mishing, Naga, Manipuri, Garo and Deori. The peaceful co-existence of these ethnic groups have led to the evolution of their diverse cultures in the arena of Sivasagar. The art, folklore, costumes, dance, cuisines of these groups are unique and collectively exhibit the rich tradition of Assam. The monuments on the other hand, stand as a symbol of the power and the might of the Ahoms. The locals of Sivasagar embraced Hindu rites, beliefs and customs. Sivasagar is home to two popular saints of the Vaishnavite tradition, Mahapurush Srimanta Sankardeva and Sri Sri Madhabdeva. The Satra at Amguri, Assam has been imparting their teachings. Satras are social centres associated with the Ekaharana tradition of Vaishnavism. The word 'satra' has been mentioned in the Bhagavata Purana as a Sanskrit term 'sattra', which means a gathering of devotees. It is said that the Ahoms observed three Bihu which are the festivals

related to agriculture. Bihu has its origin from the Tai word 'Pi-hu' or 'Poi-Hu'. People of Sivasagar observe various traditional festivals and rituals among which Bihu is of great importance. Poi-Chankein or Bohang Bihu (observed in April) is the main festival and is observed at the beginning of Spring Season. It is celebrated right before the paddy cultivation. In this festival, people wish for a good harvest because this is the time when farmers start sowing. Chip-song-ka or Kaati Bihu (observed in October) is celebrated to mark the cutting and binding of grain and Meji Joluwa Utsav or Magh Bihu (observed in January-February) marks the season of harvesting of the crops. The main aspect of these three celebrations is the ancestor worship called Me-Dam-Me-Phi. Where, Me means worship, Dam means the dead and Phi means God. That is, the dead are worshipped as Gods. Another very popular festival celebrated in the new year's month of Dinsing or Aghun is called Kinon-Meu or Na-Khuwa. In these festivals, the first produce of the season is offered to the ancestors. Some of the traditional rituals performed during these festivals are chanting of

hymns by the priests, eating traditional food like Amroli-tup and pork and drinking lao or rice beer. The Bihu dance and the Bihu Song are the most popular art forms in Sivasagar. These are performed with an instrument called Dhol and Mahar-Singar pepa. The Bihu songs were initially sung in Tai language, but over time these have been replaced by songs in Assamese language. The husari group of dancers and singers used to visit the king and nobles to bless them with prosperity, good health and luck by performing Bihu dance. During the rule of the Ahom kings numerous tanks, temples and historical monuments were constructed. The most outstanding of these are water tanks by the name of Sivasagar, Joysagar and Gaurisagar. Various temples of great

historical significance were also built such as the Sivadol group of Temples. These are located on the bank of Sivasagar tank which is also known as Borpukhuri tank. The Sivadol complex comprises of three temples namely, Sivadol, Vishnudol and Devidol dedicated to Lord Shiva, Lord Vishnu and Goddess Durga respectively. The most unique temple of Sivasagar district is the Ghanashyam Dol, a terracotta brick temple which is located near Joysagar Tank. According to popular belief, it was constructed during the reign of king Rajeswar Singha (1751-1769) for his naati (grandson) belonging to the lineage of Parbatiya Gosain. Hence, the temple is also called Naati Gosain Dol. A different narrative of the origin of Ghanashyam Dol is that it was built under the

patronage of King Rudra Singha by Ghanashyam Khanikar who was brought by Rudra Singha as the chief architect to construct the city of Rangpur. Sivasagar houses royal pavilions like "Rang Ghar" which is also a popular amphitheatre, close to Joysagar Tank. It is an 18th-century structure built by Ahom king Pramatta Singha (1744-1751). Often referred to as the Colosseum of the East, it served as a pavilion where the royal families and other dignitaries used to watch various games and sports. An Army Base of the Ahoms, called Talatal Ghar has been well preserved till date. As the largest Tai monument, it has secret tunnels which were used as escape routes during the Ahom wars. The two main tunnels are known to be 16 kms and 3 kms in length. However,

these have now been closed due to security reasons. The tombstones of the Ahom kings and queens are known as 'Maidans'. They are constructed as pyramidal structures similar to the pyramids of Egypt. One of the popular structures is the 'Namdong Stone Bridge' which is made from a single solid rock cutting. The famous Ajan Peer Dargah Sharif in Sivasagar stands as the symbol of Hindu-Muslim integration. It is located in the Saraguri Chapori. This sacred mausoleum was built in the memory of a reformer and saint named Ajan Fakir who was originally from Baghdad and came to North East India in the 17th century. He played a pivotal role in unifying the people of the Brahmaputra Valley. Devotees in large numbers visit this Dargah from all over the world. Apart from the built heritage, Sivasagar is home to archaeological sites, zoo and sanctuary. One such place is Na-pukhuri Archaeological Site also known as Rudrasagar. It is located on the bank of Rudrasagar tank, a paradise for migratory birds. The Shivadol at this site is a structure of architectural importance. It was built during the rule of king Swaradew Lakshmi Singha in 1773. The monument is a typical Ahom structure built on an octagonal base. During the rule of Ahom Swargadeo Rudra Singha, Pohagarh came into existence as the first zoo in Sivasagar.

Rani Mukerji says how SRK's 'Pathaan' opened floodgates for films after pandemic

Rani Mukerji was at Ficci Frames event in Mumbai, where she spoke about how Aditya Chopra did not release his films on OTT after the pandemic, as he had faith in theatrical releases. The actor further mentioned how his films eventually flopped at the box office, leading to the company facing a low moment. The 'Mardaani' actor added how the success of Shah Rukh Khan's 'Pathaan' success brought things back on track.

Rani said at the event, "During the pandemic, Adi (Aditya Chopra) had these couple of big films that were to be released. They were those commercial potboilers, as we say, which started in the pre-pandemic time. Unfortunately, when the pandemic started, there was a question mark on all the films. And that's the time when I observed my husband (Aditya



Chopra) closely because there were no talks of films releasing." She added, "And there is a business point of view where each film needs to be released at a particular time for it to be able to sustain the cost that it has incurred. There was a lot of pressure on filmmakers to release all these films on OTT and a lot of them were doing that. The biggest films were releasing on OTT. And my husband was

completely calm and composed. I would use the word 'conviction', that my husband had, and he said, 'These movies were made for theatricals, for the audiences at large to enjoy. I would want to release these films theatrically.' He was being offered a lot of money to release it on OTT, and it was a complete business call where it would be a win-win situation for the OTT platform and for the

producers, where he was making a profit by releasing it on OTT." She further said, "But there I see my husband, taking this brave call and saying, 'No, I would not release any of these films on OTT because I believe in the power of Indian cinema of what it does theatrically. And in time, when the films came, all of those films flopped because the whole way the audience watched content changed overnight because of

OTT. The kind of content they saw globally, everything changed. All these films failed at the box office and it took a complete hit commercially because none of the films did well. It was like complete depression. People were sad in our company and the whole conviction that Adi stood with that his movies would be released theatrically. We thought that there would be some divine intervention and that he would be rewarded for his conviction of releasing films theatrically, and everything kind of didn't work for us. And then came 'Pathaan'. It changed the entire thing forward at Yashraj." Rani shared, "And it became the highest-grossing film. Jab bhagwan deta hain toh chappar faad ke deta hain (When God provides, he gives it in bounty). So He just tests

you and sees how much courage you have. Adi had that courage and I, as a colleague of his, completely salute that because I thought it was commendable", further adding, "So when you ask me, what are the things that need to change is, filmmakers need to have more faith in the product that they make, and they should believe in what they make and they should stand with each other to make that change. Today, 'Pathaan' stood the test of time and opened the floodgates for people going into cinemas."

The film industry witnessed an all-time low after the pandemic. Theatres were shut for almost two years, halting income and businesses for many. As the world steadily returns to normal, the world of cinemas is again witnessing a boom. 2023 was a great year for Hindi cinema and here's hoping it continues.

Central Board of Secondary Education recently announced the experimental implementation of Open Text based Assessment (OTBA) in the examination for grades IX- XII. The first phase of examination is going to be held in the month of November and December. The said pattern is going to be introduced in the subjects like English, Mathematics, and science for grades IX - X and Biology, English and Mathematics for grades XI- XII. But there will be no OTBA in board examinations meant for grade- X and grade- XII. Although it is going to be a paradigm shift in the examination system of education, it has created a furore among a few children and parents. By and large it is going to be challenging one for all the concerned. Literally OTBA means

the textbooks will remain open in the examination hall and children will be allowed to refer to the texts and other text supporting materials while answering to the questions. As a result, the pressure of examinations on children can be minimized. The night before examinations is no more tensed in any way. Children will remain in no state of uncertainty, confusions and worries. All sorts of nightmares are likely to disappear from the minds of the learners. On the other hand, open text book reading in the examination hall is a cutting edge that fosters examinees' intelligent reading. Questions set in the examinations are going to be competency based, not based on knowledge. Application. Creativity and extrapolation are the hall marks of question papers. Suffice it to say, cramming the information is strongly discouraged. Not for nothing, it not only bids good bye to exam. Anxieties, but also says NO to mal practice in exam. Examinees have to delve into the subject matter, going beyond the text books. In all likelihood adopting

unfair means in examination is no more a concern. Besides, children will remain phlegmatic and no more death-and life condition as there will be no so much importance on winning the exam lottery. OTBA is the brain child of John Dewey, an American philosopher of Education. It was also implemented in some states of America and gained a wonderful response. Even the greatest economist of our country, Kutyalya, popularly known as Canakya favoured this system of examination to maintain transparency. Many countries like- the U.S.A, the U.K., Netherland, Canada and Singapore have already implemented this system of examination. Even C.B.S.E. introduced this system in the academic years of 2014-15 and 2016-17. The result was not satisfying because of some inadequacies. In spite of that, it is going to be a forward looking and progressive one that will have a profound impact on the existing examination system. The traditional method of rote learning and memorization of facts are no longer going to be

a way of excellence. Children will not go for convergent thinking, which cripples their creativity. The cognitive domains of Benjamin. S. Bloom's Taxonomy, especially the last domain- Evaluation (1956) revised to CREATION (2001) will play significant role in determining the performance of learners in the examination. The most notable feature is that OTBA is against only objective and multiple-choice questions which squeeze the fecundity, creativity and imagination of the learners, but it will facilitate insightful and divergent thinking. Broadly speaking, the focus of teaching-learning and assessment would be shifted from content-understanding to concept-understanding. Although nothing is mentioned about OTBA in NEP-2020, it fully justifies its veritable worth. This is the time for inculcation of life skills- critical thinking, creative thinking, problem solving and decision making. Each learner is unique in their own ways. Open ended, skill based,

value based and extrapolative questions are the ideal ones to test the capability and perspicacity of the learners. The traditional questions- who, what, where, when etc. must take back seats otherwise 21st century learners will not be well equipped with to overcome the challenges ahead. Problem solving questions and decision-making answers should go hand in hand in order to strengthen the bedrock of creativity, analysis and logical aspects of the learners. Children will be no more overdependent on reference books, key books available in the market. The aim is to shift towards the 'criterion referenced testing' to from the present 'norm referenced testing'. Ground breaking research work will be promoted from the beginning as each learner is free to cut their teeth, bring something new and add something to the existing. Over and above, it will prime the pump of idea of VIKSHIT BHARAT and ATMA NIRBHAR BHARAT because each child will be moulded as a creative thinker. For the western civilization education means

modification of behaviour in a desirable manner, Indian philosophy believes in "Manifestation of perfection already in man" (Swami Vivekananda). It is blindingly obvious that children have the potentials and they require only a push in the right direction. Let the children find their own ways under the supervision of parents and teachers. The idea of OTBA may not be fool proof, but can be the touch stone of new examination process. If certain road blocks are removed, it will be adjudged as the master stroke of entire education system. There are no reservations in stating that trained, knowledgeable and highly skilled teachers are required who can deal with the children efficiently and expeditiously in the class room. Pedagogy should be finetuned keeping the creativity of the learners in view., otherwise all the planning in bringing a change will go pear shaped. Of all the stake holders teachers are only instrumental in proper execution of this

system. In order to enhance the creativity of children, a congenial, joyful learning atmosphere in class room is essential. The teachers must be intellectually rich and aesthetically sufficient to create interest and inquisitiveness of the learners. Teachers can only ensure that learners are well grounded and

well-rounded. The text books meant for class transaction should be a model for divergent thinking. Time has come to embrace the new system instead of casting aspersions on it. (Views are Personal)

Ranching of Hilsa fertilised eggs and Spawn for restoration at Jharkhand upstream of the Farakka Barrage in the River Ganga



Kolkata, (KCN): Hilsa, one of the most well-known commercial fish, is a favourite in West Bengal and national fish of Bangladesh. It is very valuable economically and socio-culturally, especially in Bengal. But dramatic reduction in the natural stocks of Hilsa compelled ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute, Barrackpore, making constant attempts to revive Hilsa's decreasing population in order to preserve the

sustainability of the Gangetic stretch and past five years have been spent raising captives. As part of the NMCG project, mature Hilsa were caught from the wild were artificially bred on board using the stripping method at Beniagram (Downstream of Farakka Barrage), West Bengal on 6th March, 2024. A total 11 males Hilsa and 4 females (maximum weight 168 g and 182 g, measuring 26.3 cm and 26.7 cm in

length respectively) were utilized for the artificial breeding. To re-establish the Hilsa population in proportion to the Ganga's decreasing sections, a total 30,000 Hilsa spawn and 1.8 lakhs Hilsa fertilized eggs were ranched. Eggs were carefully transported to Rajmahal, Jharkhand at upstream of the Farakka barrage, ranch location in the Ganga River above Farakka to avoid heavy water currents and human intervention.

"Truly Important Partners": S Jaishankar Describes India, South Korea Ties

Seoul (KCN): External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar today said that India and South Korea have become "truly important partners" for each other and stressed that bilateral exchanges have witnessed steady growth. On a two-day visit to South Korea, Mr Jaishankar said that India is interested in now expanding the partnership to new areas like critical and emerging technologies, semiconductors, green hydrogen and nuclear cooperation among others. Mr Jaishankar recalled that the ties between the two countries were elevated to a special strategic partnership during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to South Korea in 2015. He noted that the two countries celebrated the 50th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic ties in 2023. In his opening remarks at the 10th India - South Korea Joint Commission Meeting in Seoul, Mr Jaishankar said, "Last year, as you noted, we celebrated the 50th anniversary of the establishment of our



diplomatic ties. During our Prime Minister's visit in 2015, our relations were elevated to a special strategic partnership. It is important that we live up to that. "We have grown from strength to strength in the years that have passed. We have become truly important partners for each other. And our bilateral exchanges - trade, investments, defence, and S&T cooperation, have all seen a steady growth," he added. Mr Jaishankar and his South Korean counterpart, Cho Tae-yul, chaired the 10th India-South Korea Joint Commission Meeting in Seoul on Wednesday. The External Affairs Minister congratulated Cho Tae-yul on his appointment as South Korea's Minister of

Foreign Affairs. Stressing expanding cooperation between India and South Korea to new sectors, Mr Jaishankar said, "While keeping up the momentum in the traditional areas of cooperation, we would be very much interested now in expanding it to new areas, such as critical and emerging technologies, semiconductors, green hydrogen, human resource mobility, nuclear cooperation, supply chain resilience, etc, to make our ties more contemporary." He recalled the meetings between PM Modi and South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol in Hiroshima and New Delhi in 2023. He further said, "I think their discussions have

provided us the guidance to go forward." The External Affairs Minister said, "We have also noted the growing convergence of our views in the international forum. Your focus on the Indo-Pacific region is a good case to point, and we both have stakes in its stability, security, and prosperity." He held a meeting with South Korea's Trade, Industry and Energy Minister Ahn Dukgeun in Seoul on Tuesday in which the two leaders held discussions on trade and economic cooperation between the two countries. In a post on X, Mr Jaishankar stated, "Pleased to meet with Trade, Industry and Energy Minister Ahn Dukgeun today in Seoul. Wide-ranging conversation on our trade and economic cooperation, both current and future, which is at the heart of the India-South Korea relationship." He also met South Korea's think tank representatives. In a post on X, Mr

Jaishankar stated, "Interesting conversation with think tank representatives of RoK. Our exchanges and interaction would only increase as the convergences between our two countries grow." Mr Jaishankar also held a meeting with Director of National Security Chang Ho-jin in Seoul. During the meeting, the two sides discussed shared convergences in the Indo-Pacific and contemporary regional and global issues. In a press release, Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) stated, "India - Republic of Korea Special Strategic Partnership has expanded to diverse areas of cooperation, which include trade, investments, defence, education, S&T, and culture." "The Joint Commission Meeting is expected to comprehensively review the entire gamut of bilateral cooperation and explore avenues for further strengthening it. It will also provide an opportunity for the two sides to exchange views on regional and global issues of mutual interest," it added.

Breach in Indravati canal submerges village, farmlands in Odisha's Kalahandi



Bhawanipatna(KCN): More than 250 acres of agricultural land and houses were submerged as water flooded several parts of Kalampur block in Odisha's Kalahandi district following a 20-foot breach in the Indravati

Right canal around 3.30 am Monday, officials said. Water also entered some houses in Deypur village due to the breach, they added. Executive engineer of Indravati Right canal

division, Rajkumar Behera, said the breach took place in the canal's left bank. The spot where the breach took place was weak as it hadn't been renovated for the construction of a bridge,

officials added. Behera said the breach took place as farmers had closed three of the five canal gates located near the spot, creating additional pressure at the spot. Canal engineers have reached the spot and are taking stock of the situation. Water supply will resume tonight, he said. After the water recedes from the fields, officials of the agriculture and revenue departments will assess damages to the fields and standing crops, Behera said.
