Bhubaneswar, (KCN): In a major political development ahead of the General Elections, Aravind Mohapatra, son of BJP leader Bijoy Mohapatra, entered politics by joining the Biju Janata Dal (BJD). Aravind joined BJD by meeting party supremo Naveen Patnaik at Naveen Niwas in Bhubaneswar. After joining BJD, Mohapatra addressed the media, saying, "I have been serving the people of Patkura since 2019. I felt I needed a platform

from where I could contribute to the area's development. I had discussed with the voters of Patkura, and took the blessings of my father before taking this decision." "I would like to thank Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik for giving me the opportunity to serve the people with the BJD. I am hopeful of taking the development of Patkura a notch higher," he said. It is pertinent to mention here that Patkura in Kendrapara is the political home ground of

his father Bijoy Mohapatra. He is considered a stalwart in Odisha politics. He is one of the founding members of Biju Janata Dal (BJD) and the blue-eyed boy of late CM Biju Patnaik. He had become so powerful during Biju Patnaik's time that he was termed as the super Chief Minister. However, after Biju Patnaik, his goodwill in the BJD fell. In 2000, Bijoy Mohapatra was prevented from contesting elections. He was denied ticket for Patkura from where BJD's Atanu Sabyasachi Nayak contested. In 2004, Bijoy as Odisha Gana Parishad candidate lost to Atanu in Patkura. In 2009, he lost as a BJD candidate to BJD's Prakash Agarwalla in Patkura. In 2014, Bijoy lost again to Atanu Sabyasachi Nayak from Mahakalapada. And in 2019, he was again defeated by BJD's Sabitri Agarwalla.

Artha Tatwa Chit Fund case: ED raids several places including a newspaper office in Bhubaneswar

Bhubaneswar, (KCN): After a brief halt in its probe of large-scale financial irregularities in chit fund, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) again raided several places in Odisha connected to Artha Tatwa chit fund on Thursday.

As per reports, the raids were made at three places in Bhubaneswar including at the office of a newspaper and at Berhampur and Chhatrapur.

It is pertinent to mention here that the CBI and ED were investigating 44 chit fund organisations in several parts of the country, mainly in Odisha and West Bengal. Artha Tatwa was one of them. The ED had earlier raided several places in connection with Artha Tatwa chit fund too and attached property worth more than Rs 133 crore.

Now the ED has again opened the AT chit fund file after getting information on involvement of other persons in this case.

On the other hand, the officials of the Enforcement Directorate had raided 10 places linked to Biju Janata Dal (BJD) MLA Prafulla Samal and his son Prayaskanti Samal on February 15 over an alleged land scam involving Barapada Engineering College. While Prafulla Samal deposed before the Enforcement Directorate (ED) officials in Bhubaneswar on February 28, his son Prayaskanti appeared before the ED for questioning on March 5.



Odisha hikes salary of outsourcing employees

Bhubaneswar, (KCN): In an important decision, the Odisha Government on Thursday announced a 25 percent hike in salaries of outsourcing employees working in various departments through service provider agencies. Besides, Rs 1000 will be given to the employees for every completed five-year completed in service. Moreover, the Odisha State

Outsourcing Employees OMBUDSMAN has been formed to sort out conflicts and complaints between outsourcing staff and service provider agencies. To hear complaints of the outsourcing staff and the service provider agencies, each department will have a nodal officer. Moreover, the complaint submission process will be simplified and the

complainants can upload their grievances through a software application to be developed by the CMG of the GA&PG Department. In another significant decision, women staff can avail of maternity leave of 120 days. To streamline all management works, all departments will sign supplementary agreements with service-providing agencies.

As many as 5 ADCPs, 18 ACPs, 21 IICs, 84 SIs, and 93 ASIs will be deployed at various places in four shifts to ensure the smooth conduct of the festival, said Bhubaneswar DCP, Prateek Singh. "Special parking arrangements have been made at various places in Bhubaneswar for smooth traffic management. CCTV cameras will be installed and cops in civil dresses will be deployed at different places to

maintain law and order during the festival. Besides, ODRAF and Fire Services personnel will also be deployed to prevent any kind of untoward incidents," said Singh. Meanwhile, the temple administration has made elaborate arrangements and is leaving no stone unturned for the smooth conduct of the rituals during Maha Shivratri. It has been decided that all the rituals of Lord Lingaraj will be smoothly conducted in due time. The 'Mahadipa' of Lord Lingaraj will be raised atop the temple at around 10 pm on Maha Shivratri. This was decided during a preparatory meeting for

Maha Shivratri celebrations. The schedule of all other rituals has also been fixed in the meeting. As per reports, the 'Mangala Alati' and 'Abakasha' rituals of Lord Lingaraj will be conducted between 3 am to 3.30 am on Friday. Subsequently, 'Sahanamela Darshan' will be carried out from 3.30 am till 12 pm. Then 'Mahasana' and 'Besha' rituals will be held till 12.45 pm. Thereafter, 'Surya Puja', 'Dwarapala Puja', and 'Sakala Dhupa' rituals will be performed between 12.45 pm till 2.30 pm. Similarly, 'Bhoga Mandapa', 'Sandhya Alati', 'Majana', Jatra Puja, 'Bedha' and 'Sandhya Dhupa' rituals will be performed at 2.45 pm, 7.10 pm, 7.30 pm, 8.10 pm, and 8.55 pm respectively. Following the completion of all the rituals, the 'Mahadipa' of Lord Lingaraj will be raised atop the temple at around 10 pm.

CM Naveen Calls On Women To Contribute For Formation Of A 'New Odisha'

Bhubaneswar (KCN): On the occasion of the state-level International Women's Day celebration, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik today said that the women of Odisha have developed a lot in the last 20 years. The state government is making all efforts to protect their political, social and economic rights. Participating in a program organized at the convention centre in the Lok Seva Bhawan, the Chief Minister emphasized the importance of respecting women. Expressing his views on the progress of women in Odisha, the Chief Minister said that women in the state have now gained a reputation in politics. He said

that out of the 30 district councils of the state, women are leading in 20. More than 50 per cent of women represent the panchayat and municipal bodies, he said. This is a huge change and Mission Shakti boosted their confidence and inspired them to dream big. The state government is also giving huge numbers of work orders to the women through Mission Shakti. and said that the women are also handling this responsibility very well. "Now women have gone one step further and started a campaign to become entrepreneurs, said the Chief Minister. The state government is giving a loan of Rs 10 lakh without interest. Calling on the women, the Chief Minister said, 'You go ahead, I am with you'. Madhu Charan's victory has inspired women to protest against injustice

success Story of a girl fighting for the rights of thousands unmarried women

The daughter of a remote desert village in Rajasthan has become a symbol of women empowerment. She fought a long legal battle against the discrimination being done at the government level against unmarried women and ultimately won it and succeeded in giving women their rights. This is the story of 26-year-old Madhu Charan, resident of Googdi village of Balotra district in Rajasthan. Thanks to the struggle of Madhu, daughter of a poor laborer father, thousands of unmarried women of the state have got the right to become workers and helpers in Anganwadi centres. Recently, Deputy Chief Minister Diya Kumari has signed an order to this effect. In fact, for many decades, unmarried women in Rajasthan were being deprived of becoming workers and helpers in Anganwadi centres. The Women and Child Development Department had made it mandatory for these posts to be married. This condition was plain injustice but no any woman

was raising voice against it. Women and Child Development Department invited applications for the post of Anganwadi worker in Googdi village in the year 2019. Madhu went to the department's office with her application but they refused to accept her application saying that she was not married yet. Madhu was surprised to hear what the department officials said. He questioned that when she is fulfilling all the conditions including age, educational qualification, then why is there a question of her being unmarried? The officials sent him back citing the condition of the state government. Madhu returned home but continued thinking. This thought was coming to mind again and again that thousands of women across the state are being deprived of work just because they are unmarried. The more she thought about it, the more worried she became. Ultimately, he decided to fight against this injustice. The next day he told his intention to his father Muldan Charan. When her father agreed to support her in fight, Madhu's courage doubled. On the one hand, she immediately sent her application form to the Women and Child Development Department office through post, on the other hand, she approached the Rajasthan High Court against the injustice against women. The court sought a



reply from the state government on his petition. The trial started. Madhu endured court dates for almost five years. Finally, on 4 September 2023, the day came when the High Court gave its verdict in favor of Madhu. In this decision, the High Court termed the condition of women being married as illogical and a violation of their rights for unmarried women candidates and declared it illegal and unconstitutional. Although the government argued in the High Court that if an unmarried girl is appointed to an Anganwadi centre, then after marriage she will go somewhere else which will disrupt the work of the Anganwadi centre, but the court did not accept this argument. Making a strong comment, the High Court said that the Rajasthan government has started a new chapter of discrimination between unmarried women and married women. Which is

illegal and arbitrary. It is illogical to consider a candidate ineligible for public employment merely because he is an unmarried candidate. This is discriminatory and falls under the category of violating the fundamental rights given by the Constitution. This decision of the High Court brought a new dawn not only for Madhu personally but for thousands of women in the state. Although the Women and Child Development Department was in a dilemma for many months whether to accept the decision of the High Court or appeal against the decision, but finally a week ago, on 28 February 2024, Deputy Chief Minister Diya Kumari allowed unmarried women in the state to become Anganwadi workers and helpers. Approved the amendment in the rules and selection conditions. On this, the selection conditions have been amended, due to which all women have become eligible to apply for the posts of Anganwadi worker and assistant. The credit for this goes entirely to Madhu, who not only fought this battle for the rights of women but also won it. Madhu's victory has inspired women to protest against injustice.

No Equality for working women in any country in the world

No country in the world affords women the same opportunities as men in the workforce, according to a new report from the World Bank, which found the global gender gap was far wider than previously thought.

Closing the gap could raise global gross domestic product by more than 20%, said the report.

For the first time, the bank investigated the impact of childcare and safety policies on women's participation in the labour market in 190 countries. It found that when these two factors were taken into account, women on average enjoyed just 64% of the legal protections men do, down from the previous estimate of 77%.

Report author Tea Trumbic said childcare and safety issues particularly affected women's ability to work. Violence could physically prevent them from going to work, and childcare costs could make it prohibitive. The 10th edition of the women, business and the

law report, published on Monday, also for the first time assessed the gap between laws and the policies put in place to implement them. It found countries had, on average, established less than 40% of the systems needed for full

implementation.

Improving women's health 'could add at least \$1tn a year to global economy' While 95 countries enacted laws on equal pay, only 35 had measures in place to ensure the pay gap was addressed. Globally, women earned just 77 cents of each dollar earned by a man. Many sub-Saharan African countries had seen rapid progress in the reform of laws in recent years, said the study, but had the largest gap between legislation and implementation. Togo had the highest number of laws in sub-Saharan Africa, giving women 77% of the legal rights of men, but had structures in place to

implement just a quarter of them. "We've seen a consistent reform effort from several African countries ... this year the report really highlights Togo and Sierra Leone that had really big shifts in the last three to four years,"

said Trumbic. "But the supportive frameworks are largely lacking. So that's why the implementation gap is even larger in countries that reformed recently because they've raised the standard in their laws, but they don't have the supportive mechanisms to implement them." Addressing the childcare gap would immediately lead to a 1% increase in women's participation in the labour force. The report said less than half the countries had financial support or tax relief for parents of young children and less than a third had quality standards in place for childcare that could assure parents of their children's safety.

The teaser of Ajay Devgn's 'Maidaan' is finally out, leaving fans excited for the trailer which releases on March 7. The film has been in the making for about five years now. 'Maidaan' was first slated for release in 2020. Ajay's film will finally see an Eid release.

Ajay's 'Maidaan' teaser was finally unveiled on March 6. It offers a tiny glimpse into India's former glorious days in

football. The film is based on a true story. Sharing the teaser, Ajay wrote, "We're ready to present the incredible true story of the golden era of Indian Football (sic)." Ajay Devgn's 'Maidaan' release has been delayed by over four years now. Every year, the film's release date gets pushed, either due to a clash or due to an unforeseen circumstance. However, the film will not have a solo release. It clashes

with Akshay Kumar and Tiger Shroff's 'Bade Miyan Chote Miyan' on Eid. In 2023, the makers of Ajay Devgn's 'Maidaan', dropped another teaser. It offered a fleeting look at the illustrious era of Indian football, spanning from 1952 to 1962. Within this time frame, the Indian football team achieved the remarkable feat of qualifying for the Olympics on two occasions.

Problems facing working women

The barbarious behaviour of some youths in Dumka in Jharkhand last Friday, a week before the Women's Day, has raised more questions than we have found answers to far. First and foremost, it has raised the question of safety to working and other women who don't mostly remain confined to the four walls.

Times have changed. More and more women are coming out and want to work shoulder to shoulder with men in every field, not just in offices. But the Dumka incident has raised an alarm well. The Spanish woman in discussion was a traveller. Along with her husband she had covered more than sixty countries including the US before coming to India.

Her plan was to travel to Nepal via Jharkhand and from there to other countries which were not visited. They had safely reached the outskirts of Dumka. But by the time they came to the town riding on their bikes it was dark. So they decided to take rest and resume the journey next day. A tent which they were carrying was pitched up.

Unaware of what was in store for them, they were preparing for meal and rest. It had not dawned on them till then that they would be approached by some unknown persons at that hour. But this is what had happened.

Four youths in their 20s suddenly arrived at the spot and after a brief talk attacked the husband. She was sexually assaulted after his hands and feet were tied. Soon thereafter three others of the same age group were called. She cried and cried but no body could come as the place was located outside the populous area.

Details have been provided to give a lesson or two to our women and educate them further. Many a time women face a similar situation. To carry on and narrate the story further, she got up after they had left, started her motorcycle and parked that at a police station to register a complaint. Policemen behaved well, registered the complaint and took care of her. A team of policemen soon swung into action and three culprits were nabbed. Chief minister Champai Soren who has recently replaced Hemant Soren told media persons later that no nobody, howsoever big, would be spared and that he would take such a stern action that nobody would dare to repeat the act.

There are two problems and they must be highlighted for the good of women who work in the field and are not house makers: first, all such women should face such lawbreakers



bravely and two, they should not shy away from them. Many of them do not approach the police due to family pressure and stigma attached to it. Thousands of cases go unreported for these reasons in this country which is rising fast otherwise.

It is not to suggest that they have remained where they were in other areas until a decade back. Now, they are active and working together with men in

all fields including defence and aviation. The total number of working women in organised and unorganised sectors is not immediately available, but it would run into crores. And it is rising by the day.

What is noteworthy, many of them are ready to do night duties. Of course, the managements where they are doing night duties have taken special care and seen to it that they safely work and return home. Some

states in the country have framed laws and created special police teams to prevent harassment to school going girls and others. The number of stalking has come down heavily after these new decisions.

The intention behind the stalking is not only to harass a woman. That has some ulterior motives including having sexual relationship. In national capital Delhi hundreds of women live in make-shift or small houses in New

Seemapuri area. Most of them are migrant labourers from Bihar, UP, Jharkhand and Odisha. Some Bangladeshis have also joined them. Strangely, some officials for money or other reasons have provided Adhar and other necessary documents to them make the stay hassle-free.

The place has setups like Mahila Panchayats where they can complaint against stalkers and seek action against them. Councillors attached to them enlighten women -- tell them what they can do to and what laws are there for their safety. They also look for solutions to their other problems.

These Panchayats have a link with Delhi Brotherhood Society with which Father Solomon George has a long association. He has told many tales of harassment to women. For example, some of the stalkers somehow find mobile numbers of these

women, phone them in the night and send vulgar pictures. Some of the women get so perturbed that they even decide to shift or leave the work assigned to them. The Society has established a college in Delhi and a school in Haryana. Father said that most of the stalkers are thick-skinned and habitual offenders-- do not pay heed to sanely advices.

Clearly, something more has to be done to make the workplace safer for women and to make them self-reliant. Several laws are in existence for decades for women safety but the crime graph has not come down yet when World Women's Day (March 8) is only a few days away. What is needed is a major change----a major change in outlook and behaviour. In India, a woman is called a Goddess--- not for nothing.

Fair deal eludes women

There is still long and difficult road ahead to give fair deal to women in India. This is the impression one gets after visiting a 'Mahila Panchayat' in national capital that helps battered women to get justice. Alas, all the women coming here are victims of domestic violence, bigamy, alcoholism and sexual harassment. They came here to seek advice from the councillors of Women Panchayat.

Looking distraught and battered, Manju, 34, was standing outside the office of Mahila Panchayat in Delhi with some papers in a folder. A victim of abusive and alcoholic husband, Manju was here with her Saas (mother-in-law) to discuss the unending suffering at the hands of her cab driver husband. The only consolation for her is that she has the support of her mother-in-law in her fight for justice. After suffering for several years in a terrible

marriage, she now wants a divorce. Mother of two kids, Manju says "Even my Saas is solidly behind me in my struggle for fair deal. She has seen as to how her son treats me so shabbily after drinking bouts. My husband beats me without any reason." As she was narrating her sob story, her eyes were getting moist. From Vivek Vihar, arguably the first posh colony in East Delhi, New Seemapuri is not more than two-three kilometres away. If you are driving your own vehicle, you can reach there within couple of minutes. Even though both these areas are so close to each-other, yet their world are world apart. If Vivek Vihar is full of greenery and home to known transporters and realty company owners of Delhi-NCR, New Seemapuri is a barren land in terms of greenery. As you reach the office of Mahila Panchayat in B block, you can observe flurry of activities there as several women are coming here. Inside the Mahila Panchayat office, around 25 ladies are sitting on a floor. Some are waiting outside the

office for their turn. Inside the room, the floor is covered with a bed sheets and walls are covered with posters for the rights of women.

Kiran is also a councillor here in Mahila Panchayat, which is among the first in the national capital. It was started around 25 years ago by the Delhi Brotherhood Society (DBS). DBS has established St Stephen's College and now it is opening St Stephen's Cambridge school in Rai, Sonipat. To run the Mahila Panchayat, DBS gets the support of the Delhi government. Informs Kiran, "Panchayat gives space to women to speak without any fear. Many of them visit us to resolve disputes within their families. Here victims are told what legal rights they have and we can help them through counselling, police and courts."

Covering her head with her red saree, Sundari is a working woman in her own way. She cooks food in three homes in Vivek Vihar and earns around Rs 22 thousand per month. A native of Jharkhand, she has come to Mahila Panchayat or women's council because a ruffian of her area in



Dilshad Colony has been stalking her for the last several months. According to Sundari- "The guy was my neighbour earlier and now he follows me in his scooter as and when I move out from my house for my work. He asks me to marry him even though I am a married woman. I am so harassed with this mad guy. Despite my frequent rebukes, he is not changing. Finally, I am here to seek the advice of Women Panchayat."

In Delhi, there are more than 50 Mahila Panchayats. Each consists of around 10 staff members. "We identify and motivate ladies to work as councillors. We train them with legal issues and laws relevant to crimes against women as well as maintenance rights. We also train them in counselling, FIR writing, pursuing

cases with police," says Father Solomon George of DBS and who is the moving force behind the New Seelampur Mahila Panchayat. According to Father Solomon George- "I have been observing that stalking is the initial stage of a menace. The ultimate intention could be molestation or even rape. Stalking needs to be nipped in the bud without any delay. It is a serious crime that is rampant in New Seemapuri."

At around 1:30pm every Wednesday, Mahila Panchayats across Delhi meet with victims of domestic violence, listen to their sob stories, suggest possible solutions to disputes and educate women about their legal rights.

Says Father Solomon George "I can tell you that the cases related to stalking are only

increasing thick and fast. Those who are involved in stalking are very thick-skinned people. Even after firm rejections, they keep on stalking the lady shamelessly. After rejections, they humiliate the victim by sending her obscene stuff online."

The DBS run Mahila Panchayat is perhaps the only one in capital that gives training of self-defence to thwart the ulterior motives of vagabonds.

Says Kiran as a matter of fact way the Mahila Panchayats are not courts. "We try to resolve the cases through social pressure and advice. We call those who treat their wives like animals here and first politely told them to change for the better or face the police action. I assure you that thanks to our persistent efforts, things have improved in many

homes," informs Kiran.

After spending more than three hours here, one clearly gets an impression that women belonging to the lower economic strata of the society deserve our empathy and help.

The sad part is that even after facing all kinds of odds in their homes, the victims do not want to separate from their husbands. Reason is financial insecurity. If they get divorce from their husband, they have no place to go. It is a very difficult situation for them.

If the only option is divorce, the panchayat sends the case to the courts. Take the case of Nimmo, a mother of four kids. Her husband got married again. Still, Nimmo is ready to live with her husband. "Where will I go if my husband's ask me to leave the house? My parents are not around. My siblings have no time to support me. I am ready to live with the second wife of my husband. I am only here (Mahila Panchayat) so that they convince my husband not to beat me," says Nimmo. She works as a maid in Anand Vihar and earns around Rs 16 thousand per month. Almost 20 years into

her traumatic marriage with a man, who tried to set her on fire more than once, the poor woman is still ready to live with her husband. She shows you the burn marks on left hand.

"We stop a home from breaking but we also ensure the woman is treated well after we put the case as resolved. Follow-up is an important part of what we do," says Kiran, a councillor of Mahila Panchayat.

We found the victims thronging the Mahila Panchayat are mostly from U.P, Bihar, Jharkhand Rajasthan, Bengal, Orissa and Madhya Pradesh. Most of them live in and around the New Seemapuri that was came up in late 1970s and early 1980s. In New Seelampur slums, very large numbers of Bangladeshis also live. Now they have Aadhar card to PAN.

As you leave the Mahila Panchayat and ladies there, you tend to think that the debate of women power would be incomplete unless women belonging to the lowest strata of our society gets just and fair deal. Ends.

Ben Sears confirmed for Test debut in Christchurch

Shanto wants more opportunities for leggie Rishad in domestic competitions

New Delhi: New Zealand captain Tim Southee confirmed Wellington seamer Ben Sears will make his Test debut in the second Test against Australia, starting on Friday (March 8) in Christchurch. The 26-year-old Sears will come in to replace Will O'Rourke, who was ruled out after suffering a hamstring injury in New Zealand's 172-run defeat in the opening Test. "Offers real pace. We saw him clock 150 (kmh) earlier in the summer in a T20 against Bangladesh, so excited to see what he's got at test level," Southee said on the eve of the Test. "He's a tall fella. He's got pace, he's got something about him. Obviously the job Will O'Rourke did in the couple of test matches he played... again another tall guy with a bit of pace and skill about him, so excited to see what Ben has got." Southee was non-



committal whether the introduction of Sears will be the only change for the hosts. New Zealand opted to play an extra seamer in Scott Kuggeleijn on a green-looking track in Wellington and in the process left out left-arm spinner Mitchell Santner. It was a decision, when viewed retrospectively, had been a mistake given the assistance it

accorded to Nathan Lyon, who became the first spinner since Muttiah Muralitharan in 2006 to return a 10-wicket match haul in New Zealand. While conditions at the Hagley Oval have tended to favour the faster bowlers, who have taken 349 wickets to the spinners' 34 in the last 12 Tests here, Kuggeleijn wasn't penetrative enough at Wellington and

took 2 for 87 in the first innings and then used for only three overs in the second as Glenn Phillips produced an excellent display of spin bowling. New Zealand's selection conundrum is exacerbated by the series scoreline and Southee's own bowling form. The New Zealand captain, who will become the first fast bowler to feature in a 100 games in each of the three international formats this week, has taken just four wickets from his three Tests this year at an average of 80.25. It's a record he didn't shy away from amidst the celebratory mood of his impending 100th Test. "You always want to be performing at your best and I think there's no hiding from the fact that the currency we deal in as a bowler is wickets, and the last three Test matches I haven't got the wickets I would have liked," he said.

"I still feel like there's more to it. There's roles within that as well. I have probably not been where I should be as the most experienced bowler of the side. But like everyone, each week you're trying to get better. Each week you're trying to go out and put your best foot forward. Prepare as well as you can to give yourself the best chance and that's the same over the last couple of days. I've done that. "I've felt okay at times. Sometimes you feel good and you don't get the wickets. Sometimes you feel not so good and you actually pick up a few wickets. So I think it's just about trusting your game. Trusting what you do. "But there's no hiding from the fact that the last couple of Test matches have been disappointing. I know that. I'd always like more wickets. And hopefully, there's some to come.



Dhaka: Bangladesh skipper Najmul Hossain Shanto admitted that he was impressed by leg spinner Rishad Hossain and sought more opportunities for the youngster in the finishing school of domestic cricket to fine tune his craft for the top level. The 21-year-old played a vital role in Bangladesh's series-levelling win in the second T20I against Bangladesh, giving away just 21 runs in his three overs to slow down the opposition. Rishad was also a bright spot in an otherwise ordinary bowling performance in the series opener, his four overs costing only 32 runs and giving Bangladesh the vital wicket of Kusal Mendis. He displayed great calm in the cauldron of T20 wicket even after being hit for 18 runs in his previous over.

Bangladesh's team management has kept their faith in Rishad after handing him a debut against Ireland in March 2023 and Shanto's decision to back the youngster even after getting hit in an over was validation of their trust in the legspinner, a rare skillset in the country's cricket. Though Rishad has had a promising start to his international career, only recently he was considered not good enough to regularly make Comilla Victorians' playing XI. Rishad played

Rishabh Pant should not rush his comeback, advises Robin Uthappa



New Delhi: India and Delhi Capitals wicketkeeper-batter Rishabh Pant is expected to return to professional cricket in the Indian Premier League 2024. Pant has been out of the action since his near-fatal accident in December 2022 and has shown incredible grit to steadily progress in his recovery period. With Pant set for a return in a limited capacity with Delhi Capitals, Robin Uthappa has warned the batter against a hurried return. In an interview with InsideSport, Uthappa has said that Pant should take his time

and return back to his best. "Well as far as Rishabh Pant is concerned, it all depends on his fitness and how he recovers from what has been a tough year and a half for him. I think, we should send all those energies to him that he recovers and comes back to his best. It's good to see He's back in the nets, he's hitting the ball well, doing center wicketkeeping practice. He shouldn't rush the process," Uthappa said in an interview with InsideSport. Uthappa has warned Pant against hurrying into

the action and said that there are high chances that Pant will aggravate his injury if he tries to force his way into cricket. "It's hard to stay out of the game for so long, especially when you are super competitive and you want to perform and win matches. But sometimes when you hurry the process you end up doing more damage and go back to the wait line which is more frustrating. I really hope he takes his time to comeback and when he does he comes out good," Uthappa added. Delhi Capitals' director of cricket Sourav Ganguly had earlier said that there was no pressure on Pant to make a return. Ganguly revealed that Pant himself wanted to make a comeback in the IPL 2024 and was training hard under the watchful eyes of medical staff in the National Cricket Academy in Bengaluru.

Tendulkar congratulates Ashwin, Bairstow for reaching Test milestone

New Delhi: Legendary India batter Sachin Tendulkar has congratulated Ravichandran Ashwin and Jonny Bairstow for playing their 100th Test match in Dharamsala. India is facing England in the fifth and final Test of their series at the HPCA Stadium. Both Ashwin and Bairstow reached a huge career milestone in Dharamsala, with Ashwin becoming just the 14th Indian to achieve the feat, while Bairstow became the 17th Englishman to hit the 100-Test mark. Ahead of the fifth Test in Dharamsala, Tendulkar took to social media platform 'X', lauding the two cricketers for an incredible achievement. Tendulkar has played the most number of Test



matches in cricket, being the only cricketer to have played 200 Tests. "It's a historic day in Dharamsala as @ashwinravi99 and @jbairstow21 don the international whites for the 100th time. An incredible achievement that speaks volumes

about their passion and perseverance for red-ball cricket. I wish them both a fantastic game ahead!," Tendulkar posted on 'X'. Ashwin joined an elite list of Indian cricketers to have played 100 Test matches, following in the

footsteps of Tendulkar (200), Rahul Dravid (163), VVS Laxman (134), Anil Kumble (132), Kapil Dev (131), Sunil Gavaskar (125), Dilip Vengsarkar (116), Sourav Ganguly (113), Virat Kohli (113), Ishant Sharma (105), Harbhajan Singh (103)

and Cheteshwar Pujara (103). Prior to the Dharamsala Test, Bairstow had scored 5,974 runs in 99 Tests at an average of 36.43 while smashing 12 centuries and 26 half-centuries. Bairstow made his Test debut in 2012 and has been a constant in the England side since then. Apart from playing 99 Test matches, Bairstow has represented England in 107 ODIs and 70 T20I matches. England won the toss and opted to bat first in the fifth Test. The hosts had taken an unassailable 3-1 lead over England in the Test series, bouncing back to win in Vizag, Rajkot and Ranchi following their 28-run loss in the series opener in Hyderabad.

Kuldeep five-fer triggers England collapse

New Delhi: Kuldeep Yadav became only the third left-arm wrist spinner to get to 50 Test wickets en route to his fourth five-wicket haul in red-ball cricket. The 29-year-old put on a spin bowling masterclass in the post-lunch session to put India firmly on top on the opening day of the fifth Test against England in Dharamsala. Dramatically, England fell from 175/3 to 183/8 in the space of just 37 deliveries. Zak Crawley resumed his innings after lunch in a seamless manner and looked set for a deserving ton before he fell prey to a beautiful set up from Kuldeep. After varying

his pace and lengths against Crawley with the odd googly thrown in between, Kuldeep produced a big-turning leg break that drifted and spun sharply to beat the opener on the drive, past the inside edge. It was a massive wicket in the context of the day's play, given how effortless Crawley had seemed at the crease during his knock of 79. The opener, however, was fortunate to survive a catch at short leg by Sarfaraz who insisted on the review, only for Rohit Sharma to deny the request. UltraEdge showed a minor spike but the blip didn't cost India a lot.



After offering considerable help to the seamers in the morning, the Dharamsala surface started to assist spin in the afternoon. It is no rank turner, though, as Crawley's innings showed. Kuldeep's genius allowed him to extract appreciable turn while Ravindra Jadeja used the skid and hold in the pitch to probe the batters. The latter of the two dealt the other big blow of the session when Jadeja had Joe Root LBW after the England mainstay misjudged a slider. These wickets swung the momentum completely and Kuldeep started to operate at high levels, making it difficult for England's batters. Jonny Bairstow decided to hit his way out of trouble and did connect a few blows before nicking a googly against Kuldeep. Ben Stokes cut a sorry figure as he struggled to read the variations before being trapped LBW to one that spun in. In his 100th Test, Ravichandran Ashwin didn't strike in

his early spell but came back in his second burst to pick up two wickets in an over. A rash shot from Tom Hartley saw him holing out to long-on while Mark Wood was dismissed for a first-ball duck to push England further back. Ben Foakes hung around with reasonable assurance but with just no.10 and no.11 for company, the England wicket-keeper bat has a lot to do.
