## Odisha: Another tigress brought from Maharashtra, released in 'soft enclosure' in Similipal

**Baripada (KCN):** Another tigress brought from Maharashtra was released in a 'soft enclosure' in the core area of the Similipal Tiger Reserve (STR) in Odisha Friday, officials said. The three-year-old tigress, named Zeenat, was brought to the STR Thursday evening from Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve in Maharashtra, they said. It was tranquilised November 13 and then transported to Similipal



by road via Raipur, Sambalpur and Jashipur, a senior forest official said. The tigress is healthy and active, he added. A special team of Odisha's Forest Department, comprising

a veterinarian, a range officer, and an assistant conservator of forests, went to Maharashtra to bring the tigress. Another tigress was brought to Similipal October 27 with the approval of the National

Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA). It was kept in a quarantine before being released into the wild recently. The Forest Department is planning to bring six tigers from central India to supplement the big cat population in STR, which now has 27 tigers and 12 cubs, officials said. The tigers are being brought under the big cat supplementation project with the objective of introducing a new gene pool to the population at Similipal, they said.

## Sex racket busted: Couple arrested, 3 women rescued

**Baripada (KCN):** Bhanjapur police Thursday busted a sex racket in this town, rescued three girls and arrested a couple on charge of engaging them in flesh trade on the pretext of providing them jobs and helping them study. The accused couple was identified as Abhimanyu Sethy and his wife Ruby Sethy, residents of Raghunathpur area in Baripada town. A case was registered in this connection and the couple produced in the court. Later, they were remanded to judicial



custody after the magistrate rejected their bail pleas. Two of the girls were taken back by their families while another was sent to a stay home in the town for rehabilitation. Police said that the couple had lured a girl from Balasore town and engaged her in the flesh trade on the promise of job. The breakthrough came as her family members complained with Bhanjapur police after the girl did not return home. Police launched an investigation and a tip-off alerted them about ongoing flesh trade in the house of Abhimanyu at Raghunathpur.

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# Delhi & District Cricket Association elections start on wrong foot

(Unfolding mystery behind missing election officer for the DDCA elections)

Indian Cricket Associations play a pivotal role in the development of players who compete at the national, regional, and international levels, supporting them in achieving their aspirations to become prominent players in the future. Cricket, often regarded as a religion in India, has firmly established itself as one of the country's most popular sports. These associations work tirelessly to advance the welfare of the game, nurturing players for a brighter future. In addition to player development, Indian Cricket Associations are responsible for key functions such as managing the bidding process for the Indian Premier League (IPL), selecting players for international tournaments and leagues, and ensuring discipline among players and board officials. Cricket associations in India operate at various levels, including district, state, and women's cricket associations, with the Board of Control for Cricket in

India (BCCI) serving as the national governing body. India comprises 28 states, each with its respective cricket association. Within this national framework, the Delhi & District Cricket Association (DDCA) stands as one of the most prominent entities. Cricket associations across the nation are democratically constituted, with elections for office bearers being a regular feature. However, the recent elections within the DDCA can hardly be described as democratic, as they have undermined the democratic rights of the members. The Lodha Commission's efforts to bring transparency and democracy to the national cricket establishment deserve commendation, yet vested interests within the cricket community have managed to manipulate the process for their own benefit. The clear implication is that cricket has now become a highly lucrative business, attracting significant financial interests. The election process for the upcoming DDCA elections has encountered significant challenges even before it officially commenced. Reliable sources indicate that the outgoing President, Rohan Jaitley, and former Test cricketer and member of the 1983 World Cup-

winning team, Kirti Azad, have both expressed their intentions to contest for the presidential post. Additionally, Achal

elections on December 13, 14, and 15, 2024, which seemed to set the process in motion. However, Kirti Azad, one of the presidential candidates, has raised

contact details to facilitate communication between DDCA members and the Election Officer regarding objections,

undermining the very independence of his position—an essential feature of free and fair elections. Azad also highlighted that, in

communications intended for the Election Officer are being responded to by the Interim CEO, thereby compromising the independence of the Election Officer and undermining the integrity of the election process, making it far from free and fair.

It has come to light that the Election Officer is currently stationed outside Delhi, which has been cited as the reason for his inaccessibility to DDCA members. Despite this, he has been compensated generously for his role. In 2021, he was paid Rs. 25 Lakhs for overseeing the elections at the DDCA, despite never visiting the premises of the organization.

It raises a significant question as to why this individual has been deemed so indispensable that, over the course of the last three elections, he has been repeatedly appointed as the sole Election Officer, despite his absence from the DDCA premises during the last two elections. This situation is indeed paradoxical. Moreover, the same individual has conducted elections for the BCCI, the UPCA, and other state cricket associations, all while being situated remotely. In the present context, it is worthwhile recollecting the first major upheaval in the Willingdon Pavilion

building in 1978-79 when Delhi won its maiden Ranji Trophy Championship under Bishan Singh Bedi's captaincy. RP Mehra, then President, DDCA (a leading North India cricketer of pre-partition days) sent an adulatory letter to the manager and skipper of the winning team along with a packet of Rs. 150/- for each member of the winning team. However, skipper Bedi demanded a laudatory letter for each member of the triumphant team. It boiled over as a bone of contention between the DDCA hierarchy and Bedi. This long-drawn-out impasse finally led to the ouster of Mehra and for the first time, the cricketers took over the reins of the DDCA with Kamlesh Sharma (IAS & University cricketer) as President and Bishan Bedi as Secretary. Since then, it has been a triumphant march of the Delhi Ranji squad 7 times till 2007-08. From there it has been a long drought for which the DDCA officials need to explain. However, given the aforesaid circumstances, I will leave it to the readers to draw their own conclusions.

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Rohan Jaitley Kirti Azad

Kumar Joti, former Chief Election Commissioner of India, has been appointed by the DDCA Board of Directors as the Election Officer responsible for overseeing the elections. Following this, the Hon'ble Delhi High Court directed the DDCA to conduct

concerns regarding the conduct of the election process. He alleged that since the appointment of Achal Kumar Joti, the Election Officer has been mysteriously absent from the DDCA, remaining uncontactable. According to Azad, Joti has neither shared an email address nor any

grievances, or the KYC verification and voter list updates. Furthermore, the Election Notification was issued on November 2, 2024, but Azad pointed out that the Election Officer does not appear to have an independent office or staff to conduct the elections, thus

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# Pollution: Why the farmers alone are being made scapegoats?



Stubble burning always puts a damper on celebrations of Diwali festival for the farmers, especially residing in Punjab and Haryana. It is the harvest season for paddy just before the sowing of the next crop. Farmers have to vacate the land for the wheat showing immediately and they don't have much time to manage the straw of paddy just harvested. In order to quickly prepare their fields for the wheat crop, many farmers simply burn leftover plant debris after harvesting rice. The practice is known as paddy stubble burning. Due to the short period for stubble management and lack of readily available alternative means within reach of the farmers and no proper proportionate monetary help by the governments, the farmers have to adopt the old method of stubble burning. The surprising thing is that the governments do not seem seriously ready to resolve their problem, rather enforcing the farmers by inflicting the fine, depriving the farmers of MSP for the next two crops and lodging FIR against them. While stubble burning is a compulsive need for the farmers, it has become a noose around the neck for the

government also. To control the menace of this practice by 'Rule(stick) in the guise of Rule', Haryana Agricultural department has issued a letter on October 17, 2024 for lodging an FIR and restricting the farmers, who burn stubble, from selling their crops in Mandis through the e-Kharid portal. "Farmers who burn or have burnt stubble during the current season i.e from 15-09-2024, an FIR should be registered against them and a Red entry should be made in their MFMB records restricting them from selling their crops in Mandis through the e-Kharid portal during the next two seasons, says the Department of Agriculture, Haryana". To give another hammer blow to the farmers, recently the central Ministry of Environment has also issued a notification to double the penalty amount on stubble burning. Now, a fine of ₹5,000 will be imposed on landowners with less than two acres, ₹10,000 for two to five acres, and ₹30,000 for those with more than five acres, if they adopt the stubble burning. The governments of Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, and Delhi will be required to implement these rules. How Polluted Air affects health? Around the Diwali festival season, every year, a thick smoke layer covers up the sky umbrella almost in all the areas of Haryana, Punjab, Delhi, Rajasthan

and Uttar Pradesh, especially the NCR region, making it very difficult even to breathe in due to the polluted air and atmosphere. Delhiites, being the most sufferers, create much hue and cry, and as the country governing authorities are sitting there, so the issue becomes more complicated and gets highlighted in all spheres. Dr Ashok Dhillon, Agricultural scientist, Ambala Agricultural Science Centre, says that due to burning of paddy residue, 70 percent carbon dioxide, 7 percent carbon monoxide along with gases like methane and nitrous oxide etc. get dissolved in the atmosphere which is very harmful for human health as well as animals. World Health Organization (WHO), spreading awareness about the 'CLEAN AIR FOR CHILDREN'S HEALTH', highlights - A child, who is exposed to unsafe levels of pollution, can face a lifetime of health impacts. Exposure in the womb or in early childhood can lead to: Stunted lung growth, Reduced lung function, Increased risk of developing asthma, Acute lower respiratory infections, Impaired mental and motor development, Behavioural disorders, Low birth weight, Premature birth, Infant mortality, Childhood Cancers, Increased risk of heart disease, Diabetes and stroke in adulthood. It adds that household and ambient air pollution cause more than 50% of acute lower respiratory infection in children under 5 years in lower and middle-

income countries. WHO further warns that in 2016, ambient and household air pollution caused 543,000 deaths in children under 5 years and 52,000 deaths in children aged 5-15 years. What a horrific crisis is hovering over the world, one can imagine easily! **Is stubble burning the sole major factor of pollution?** Punjab farmers' front 'Bharatiya Kisan Union Ekta Dakounda', through its statement November 12, 2024, strongly condemning orders issued against the farmers, alleged that the authorities are ignoring the ground realities and ordering coercion on the farmers who produce only 4.4% of the pollution, while 95.6% are emitted by firecrackers, diesel generators, factories and transport. Instead of taking any action against the polluters, only reports are being sought about them. According to the instructions of the National Green Tribunal, it is the responsibility of the administration to arrange for the collection, transportation and consumption of straw. Neither the administration has fulfilled its responsibility nor the courts have taken any action against the administration. On the contrary, farmers are being made the scapegoat, which is a reprehensible act. Terming the centre government's allegations against the farmers as unscientific claims, All India Kisan Sabha (AIKS) through its

release to media on November 8, 2024, pleads that the claim that stubble burning in Punjab and Haryana is leading to air pollution in NCR is bogus, because air quality in these States, which should be more directly affected has been consistently lower than in the NCR. It is notable that vehicular pollution, pollution from factories and brick-kilns are going on unchecked and scientific studies point out that they are more responsible for the pollution in the NCR Region. AIKS adds that according to NASA's Visible Infrared Imaging Radiometer Suite (VIIRS) data there reportedly has been a 51 per cent drop in the total number of farm fires between 2018 and October, 2024. Data shared by the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM) indicate that between 12th October and 21st October this year, on average stubble burning accounted for only 0.92 per cent of the PM2.5 (Particulate Matter 2.5) levels in Delhi. Clearly, the dominant reasons for the pollution in NCR are vehicular emissions, emissions from factories, brick-kilns etc. If we analyse the NASA's data referred by AIKS, which show that there reportedly has been a 51 per cent drop in the total number of farm fires between 2018 and October, 2024, then why the AQI of Delhi and NCR has not lowered 51 %, if the stubble burning is the sole major factor for pollution?

**Why the farmers alone are made scapegoats?** Punjab governor Gulab Chand Kataria, presiding over an international conference at Punjab Agricultural University on November 12, 2024, said that it was wrong to blame only farmers for the air pollution. He underscored the need for ensuring crop residue management (CRM) machinery to farmers in sufficient numbers in order to curb stubble burning incidents. "The farmer won't give up paddy unless he is given a crop that yields more profit (than paddy). They put in so much hard work; they need profit. Farmers have no choice. They have to sow wheat in time," he said. Kataria added that the state government and centre have tried to make residue management machines available but it is still far from the number of machines required to deal with the issue. The All-India Kisan Sabha (AIKS) alleges that while the urban rich and capitalists are not being fined and little is being done to regulate the proliferation of vehicles, the poor farmers are being targeted for their role in the historic farmers' struggle against the pro-corporate Farm Acts as well as the electoral setback for BJP in the rural areas. In fact, the farmers through Agro-forestry and protection of green cover are doing an ecological service to the nation and the BJP led Union Government is

punishing them. Former Union Minister and the General Secretary of the All-India Congress Committee, Kumari Selja, also alleges that instead of working in the interest of the farmers, the BJP government is focused on oppressing and exploiting them. Kumari Selja adds that following strict remarks from the Supreme Court on the issue of air pollution caused by stubble burning, the central government has now taken out its frustration on farmers by deciding to double the fine for stubble burning. In a statement released to the media, she said that stubble burning is not a recent issue; it has been happening for years. There is no doubt that stubble burning increases air pollution. The government should create a system so that farmers do not have to burn stubble. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has also strongly criticised the Central Government's decision to double the fine for stubble burning. AAP senior leader and spokesperson Neel Garg said that the Punjab Government had sought Rs. 1200 crore from the Centre to tackle this issue and reduce incidents of stubble burning by providing financial incentives to farmers to discourage the practice. He questioned why the Centre had refused to provide this assistance if they were genuinely concerned about stubble burning?

If the Centre had provided the requested financial support, these incidents would have dropped even further. However, instead of offering help, the Centre has imposed a fine. Haryana Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister Shyam Singh Rana has said that the State Government is promoting the use of straw as manure by encouraging farmers to incorporate it into their fields. He added that attributing the rising pollution in Delhi solely to stubble burning is misguided. He advised the Delhi government to implement concrete measures similar to those in Haryana. Head of the department of climate change and agriculture meteorology of Punjab Agricultural University (PAU), Prabhjyot Kaur Sidhu, who had compiled a study on stubble burning effects in 2020, said, "Every paddy-growing state is suffering from factors adding to its air pollution. In simple terms, Punjab's smoke is not travelling 300-400 km to choke the lungs of Delhi, rather Punjab farmers are harming their own children and brethren by setting the fields on fire." Will Delhi governments stop the blame game of alleging the farmers for each and every smoke particle hovering over Delhi and NCR in the name of Stubble Burning?

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# The cyber world poses a threat to the safety and dignity of women.

This has called for urgent action by both tech companies and governments. Today, when threats to women in the cyberspace have multiplied, there is no safe haven left where they can hide or a heavily guarded area where they can sit and wait for the cyber threats that threaten their dignity to end. A global survey has revealed that 60 percent of girls and women have faced harassment on social media platforms, and about 20 percent of them have either said goodbye to social media or reduced its use due to

this. Similarly, UN Women has found that 58 percent of women and girls worldwide have been subjected to some form of online abuse. These include trolling, stalking, doxing, and other forms of online predatory behavior based on gender, which are emerging as new threats of the digital

age. Artificial intelligence is being used to create deepfake videos and images that target women with fabricated content that is often sexual or defamatory in nature. U.S. Vice President Kamala Harris faced deepfakes depicting her in false and harmful contexts during her campaign for the 2024

presidency. Artificial intelligence tools spread false narratives or misogynistic content designed to undermine the character and credibility of women, particularly targeting



women in leadership roles. Nikki Haley was a victim of manipulated images and fake news during the Republican primaries. Women face a disproportionate level of objectification and sexually explicit content online, amplified by artificial intelligence's ability to create realistic fake content. Explicit

photos of Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni created by artificial intelligence circulated widely on social media. Deepfakes and altered images created by artificial intelligence

violate women's privacy, often resulting in significant reputational damage and mental distress. Bangladeshi politician Rumin Farhana was targeted with deepfake content ahead of elections. Steps to mitigate the problem by tech companies and governments .

Companies should invest in advanced artificial intelligence detection systems to proactively flag and remove harmful content before it is widely disseminated, with human monitoring to prevent errors. Meta (Facebook) recently announced artificial intelligence tools to combat deep fakes, but their implementation remains inconsistent. Platforms must provide clear accountability measures and report how they handle flagged content with transparent audits of their moderation policies. The EU Digital

Services Act (2022) mandates digital platforms to report content moderation actions. Tech companies need to ensure that algorithms are designed in a way that reduces gender bias and prevents misuse of artificial intelligence tools for harmful purposes. The Google artificial intelligence principles highlight the responsible use of artificial intelligence, but more implementation is needed. Governments should enact data protection laws and create specific legal provisions to address the misuse of AI-generated content, including deepfake-specific laws. India's Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules 2021 provide a framework for content moderation but lack stringent AI-specific regulations. Governments should establish AI ethics boards and frameworks that mandate ethical AI development, with a focus on preventing gender-based discrimination. The EU's Artificial Intelligence Act

aims to regulate high-risk AI systems, especially in media and surveillance. Governments should launch public awareness campaigns to identify and report deepfake content, particularly targeting vulnerable groups. India's National Cybercrime Reporting Portal facilitates easy reporting of cybercrimes involving AI-generated content. Tech companies should be held accountable through monetary penalties if they fail to remove harmful content within a stipulated time frame. 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## Book titled 'CHEKA: The road of bones' launched at Press Club Kashmir

**Srinagar(Aasif Malik ):** In a solemn tribute to India's great leader, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Joydeep Mukherjee's new book CHEKA: The Road of Bones was launched today at the Press Club, Kashmir. In CHEKA, The Road of Bones, Mukherjee explores compelling evidence suggesting that Bose survived the plane crash on August 18, 1945, and instead sought refuge in the Soviet Union. According to the author, Netaji was held in Cell No. 56 of Yakutsk Jail in Omsk, Siberia, based on testimony from Dr. Satya Narayan Sinha, an esteemed diplomat. Mukherjee argues that



Bose may have been one of the many prisoners subjected to harsh conditions under the Soviet Army, where two hundred thousand captives were either executed by Soviet soldiers and the KGB or perished due to Siberia's punishing -30°C cold. These victims were

allegedly buried along a pathway near the Ob River, now famously known as "The Road of Bones."

The book addresses findings from two government commissions the Mukherjee Commission and the Justice Sahay Com.mission which,

according to Mukherjee, prove Bose's remains were not housed in Tokyo's Renkoji Temple, contrary to popular belief. The Justice Sahay Commission also established that "Monk Gumnami" was not Bose, leaving the Soviet connection as the last possible lead to

uncovering his fate. Mukherjee passionately called upon India's central government to engage in diplomatic discussions with Russia, urging them to reveal Bose's final whereabouts and the truth of his last years. Mukherjee emphasized that the government owes it to the Indian people and to history to seek this truth and honour Bose's legacy. The author and attendees further appealed for a dedicated war memorial at Rajpath, New Delhi, to commemorate the sacrifices of the Indian National Army (INA), known as Azad Hind Fauj, in India's struggle for independence.

## 'Interference': Jay Shah Slams Pak For Champions Trophy Tour In Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir

**New Delhi,(KCN):**Citing concerns over "territorial integrity and political interference in sports", BCCI Secretary Jay Shah on Friday launched a sharp attack on Pakistan Cricket Board's announcement to conduct the Champions Trophy tour in Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK) areas, say reports. The International Cricket Council (ICC), the sport's governing body, has decided to cancel the planned trophy tour of the Champions Trophy 2025 in Skardu, Murree, and Muzaffarabad - areas that fall within PoK. "BCCI secretary Jay

Shah strongly condemns the Pakistan Cricket Board's announcement to conduct the Champions Trophy tour in PoK, reiterating India's objection to the move," news agency ANI reported citing unnamed sources. "Jay Shah has raised the matter with the International Cricket Council (ICC), urging the body to take appropriate action in light of the BCCI's concerns over territorial integrity and political interference in sports," the news agency added. The ICC informed the PCB last week that India would not tour Pakistan for the eight-team tournament,

leaving the fate of the event hanging in the balance. Pakistan had previously rejected the option of a hybrid arrangement that would allow India to play their matches at neutral venues, for example in the United Arab Emirates. Deteriorating political ties have meant the arch rivals have not played a bilateral cricket series for over a decade -- squaring off only in ICC multi-nation events. India last toured Pakistan for the Asia Cup in 2008. Pakistan visited India for last year's ODI World Cup and the PCB had expected the gesture to be reciprocated for the Champions Trophy.

## Shraddha Walkar Murder Accused Was On Hit List Of Gangster Lawrence Bishnoi: Sources

**Mumbai (KCN):** Aftab Poonawala, who allegedly killed his live-in partner Shraddha Walkar in 2022, was reportedly on the target list of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang, according to Mumbai Police officials investigating the murder of politician Baba Siddique last month. Sources in the Crime

Branch have said that Shivkumar Gautam, the alleged main shooter in the Ajit Pawar party leader's murder, revealed that Bishnoi gang member Shubham Lonkar had discussed attacking Poonawala with him. The gang, however, reportedly refrained from attacking Poonawala due to his heightened security at



Tihar jail, the sources added.

In a grisly crime that shocked the country,

Poonawala allegedly strangled 27-year-old Walkar to death at their rented accommodation in south Delhi's Chhattarpur Pahadi on May 18, 2022. The police, in its charge sheet that contains spine chilling details, said Poonawala used a saw, among other weapons, to dismember the body into several parts and

store them in a refrigerator. He later disposed of the body parts around forest areas over time. He was arrested on November 12, 2022 and is currently lodged in Tihar jail. Siddique (66) was shot dead by three gunmen near his MLA son Zeeshan Siddique's office in Mumbai's Bandra area on

October 12. The Bishnoi gang has claimed responsibility for the murder. According to the police, three shooters were involved in the murder and all of them have been arrested. Gangster Bishnoi is currently lodged in Gujarat's Sabarmati jail in a cross-border drug smuggling case.



# Dams to soon have automatic gates

**Jajpur(KCN):** Dams, barrages and inland storage structures (ISS) will soon be equipped with automatic gates that would help in achieving the target of additional irrigation and aid in flood control measures, a report said. Most of rivers like Baitarani, Brahmani, Birupa, Mahanadi, Kharasrota and their distributaries experience floods almost every year due to lack of proper and permanent flood mitigation measures. Though the state government has constructed dams and some river embankments as part of flood control measures,

water from swollen rivers during heavy rains continue to inundate vast tracts of lands and human habitats year after year. In a latest development, the state Water Resources department has planned to build automatic gates in dams, barrages and ISS in the state. The objective behind the construction of the automatic gates is to ensure timely discharge of floodwaters, mitigate floods and increase the water retaining capacity of the dams and related projects. Gates will also be installed in dams that don't have any. Funds worth Rs 239.60 crore will be spent on the



construction of gates in gateless dams in the next three years and Rs 80 crore for the construction of automatic gates in the

next four years, an official of the Water Resources department said. According to a notification issued by the department, the

automatic gates, when constructed, will help in control of floodwaters in downstream during the period of incessant rain.

In the first phase, 76 gates of 14 dams, 153 gates of 10 barrages and 344 gates of 27 inland storage structures will be converted into

automatic gates. These gates can be controlled mechanically through high-powered equipment that will help in proper control and functioning of unsafe gates in the dams and barrages. This will also help in reduction of human errors and assist in protection of dam officials, a report released by the department said. The scheme will be executed from the financial year 2024-25 to FY 2027-28 at an expenditure of Rs 80 crore. Similarly, gateless dams, once fitted with gates, will help in increasing the complete water retaining capacity

of the reservoirs and in maintaining the maximum water levels in the dams. As a result, the excess water stored can be used for drinking, irrigation and industrial purposes. The project will help create 124 million cubic metres of additional water storage facilities in 12 medium irrigation projects and 47 minor irrigation projects. The move will also help in the irrigation of 19,097 hectares of land and additional irrigation facilities in 2,750 hectare of land. The proper control of water levels in the reservoirs will help in removing water scarcity in the state.

Previously, devotees would bring offerings and worship items in polythene bags, but now they are using Sal leaf plates and bamboo baskets. Even in the temple's food distribution centre, disposable plates and bowls made of paper and polythene have been

replaced by Sal leaf alternatives. Visitors to the shrine are lauding the initiative to make Harishankar shrine polythene-free. Furthermore, a decision has been taken to prohibit the use of soap and shampoo by visitors bathing in the nearby waterfall. Harishankar has gained recognition as a unique religious and tourist destination in the country. In 2023, recognising the significance of Gandhamardhan hill's unique biodiversity, the state government declared it a biodiversity heritage site. The Gandhamardhan

**New Delhi:** Sam Curran (41), Liam Livingstone (39) and Will Jacks (32) guided England past the finish line by three wickets in a tricky chase as the visitors clinched an unassailable 3-0 series lead over the West Indies in St. Lucia on Thursday. Earlier, fast-bowlers Saqib Mahmood and Jamie Overton picked three wickets each to restrict the West Indies to 145 for 7 in the first innings, a respectable total considering the hosts were 37 for 5 at one stage.

Jos Buttler won the toss for the third straight game running as England opted to field on one of the highest scoring grounds in the

West Indies. It didn't take long for England to vindicate their captain's decision as they picked up four wickets in the first four overs. First was Shai Hope, who was run-out in the first over by youngster Jacob Bethell while Mahmood struck with his third ball in the second over as Evin Lewis holed out to third man.

Things got worse for the West Indies as the dangerous Nicholas Pooran played across the line to see his stumps rattled off Jofra Archer before Roston Chase edged one to slip. Mahmood picked up his third in the sixth over as Hetmyer skied a pull to deep mid-wicket to

leave the hosts tottering at 39 for 5 at the end of the PowerPlay. Rovmann Powell (54) and Romario Shepherd (30) registered a 73-run partnership in 9.3 overs to try and take their side to a respectable score. They targeted legspinner Rehan Ahmed and Livingstone as the batters scored 26 runs across the ninth and tenth over. Powell also survived a LBW decision through DRS thanks to an inside edge. The West Indies skipper brought up his fifty with a six off Curran but just as the hosts looked set to push for a big score, Overton brought about another twist. The fast-bowler picked

up Shepherd and Motie in the 16th over while Powell fell in the 18th over. Through Alzarri Joseph and Akeal Hosein, the hosts managed to score 23 runs in their last two overs to take them to 145. In reply, the visitors didn't get off to the best of starts either as they lost Phil Salt cheaply for four - bowled by Hosein. Jacks slowly got his eye in and scored couple of boundaries before he saw his captain Buttler got a thick edge straight to his counterpart while Bethell scored a boundary before being caught behind off Joseph. This left the hosts at 42 for 3 after



the PowerPlay. Jacks, who witnessed his partners fall for low scores, registered a 38-run partnership with Curran. The left-hander clinched two boundaries off

Terrance Hinds to bring some calm in the tourists' camps. But Jacks fell at a crucial time punching one straight to cover. Livingstone had an eventful start to his

innings with a six off Joseph before being put down twice across two overs, and made sure he made the most of his reprieves. Curran then latched into Motie with a six over long-off to

bring the equation down to 38 off 30 balls. Hinds picked up his maiden wicket off Curran but a six by Dan Mousley and a 16-run 8th over by Livingstone left England with five runs to get off 12 balls. Although Livingstone fell in the penultimate over, the damage was already done. England crossed the line comfortably.

**New Delhi:** Tim Southee is set to retire from Test cricket at his home ground, Seddon Park in Hamilton, against England this December. New Zealand's highest wicket-taker in international cricket, Southee will however make himself available for the country should they qualify for the ICC World Test Championship (WTC) Final next June.

"Representing New Zealand was all I ever dreamed of growing up," Southee said. "To play for the BlackCaps for 18 years has been the greatest honour and privilege, but the time feels right to now step away from the game that has given so much to me. "Test cricket holds a special place in my heart, so to be able to play such a big series against the same opponent my Test career began against all those years ago, and on three grounds that are



incredibly special to me, seems the perfect way to end my time in the black cap." Southee first rose to fame with his 17-wicket campaign at the U19 World Cup in 2008, at the average of just six, to be named the Player of the Tournament. In his 18-year decorated career since, Southee led the New Zealand bowling attack across all three formats, appearing in four ODI World Cups, seven T20 World Cups, two Champions Trophy tournaments, and a WTC Final in which he picked up a fiver at

Southampton.  
New Zealand's second-highest wicket-taker of all time in red-ball cricket  
Southee has claimed 385  
Test wickets in 104  
matches till date, and is  
the only player in the  
world to claim more than  
300 Test scalps, 200 in  
ODIs and 100 in T20Is.  
Most recently, Southee  
played a vital all-round  
role in New Zealand's  
historic 3-0 whitewash of  
India in India - a first by a  
visiting team since the  
2012-13 season. Prior to  
the series, the senior  
seamer had passed on the  
captaincy hat to Tom  
Latham.

NZC chief executive Scott Weenink saluted Southee as one of New Zealand's greatest, especially crediting him for the team's red-ball success over the past few years. "Tim has been a constant in the improving fortunes of the BlackCaps and he'll be remembered as a giant of the modern New Zealand game," he said.

"From the moment he exploded on to the Test scene against England in Napier eighteen summers ago, he's given his heart and soul to playing for New Zealand and has helped the team achieve some unthinkable results.

"There's already unprecedented interest in this England Test tour and I'm sure the chance to farewell one of our all-time greats will only further drive the anticipation and hype for this series. Tim has an incredible bank of experience and

knowledge of the game and while he may have called time on his playing career, I'd be surprised if we don't see him in another capacity at some stage in the future."

Team's head coach Gary Stead too heaped praise on Southee for his contributions in setting up victories for New Zealand.

"Tim's durability and resilience has been outstanding," Stead said.

He's an incredibly tough competitor who gets himself up for big occasions and is rarely injured. Tim cares deeply about the team, its reputation and performances, and he will be missed within the Black Caps environment. He now deserves some time with his family and I'm sure he will reflect very positively in years to come about his impact and achievements in the game."

**New Delhi:** Border-Gavaskar Trophy: India batter KL Rahul overcame an injury scare during a match simulation session on Friday morning ahead of the first Test against Australia at the WACA in Perth.

India's first Test vs Australia begins on November 22

India batter KL Rahul suffered an injury scare during a practice session at the WACA in Perth on Friday morning, just days ahead of the highly anticipated Border-Gavaskar Trophy opener against Australia. The 32-year-old, set to open alongside Yashasvi Jaiswal in the Perth Test, was hit on his right elbow during an intra-squad match simulation. When asked about KL Rahul's injury, sources



by a bouncy short delivery, forcing him to temporarily pause his innings. Though he attempted to continue batting after receiving initial treatment from the physio, discomfort led him to exit the session. Images of Rahul walking off the field with the physio have since

sparked concern amongst fans and experts alike, adding uncertainty to India's opening lineup for the first Test at Optus Stadium in Perth, beginning November 22. The match simulation was organized as part of India's strategic preparations in the absence of captain Rohit Sharma, who is expected to miss the series opener. Rahul, who has struggled with form in recent Test outings, had been entrusted with the responsibility of leading India's batting alongside Jaiswal in Rohit's absence. His injury now poses a selection conundrum, potentially opening the door for alternate options like Abhimanyu Easwaran or others who could partner Jaiswal at the top.
