

Advantage BJP+ In Maharashtra, Close Fight In Jharkhand

New Delhi(KCN): Maharashtra -- the state where complication was a given in the assembly election -- has left pollsters befuddled, with three out of nine predicting a hung house, four leaning towards the ruling alliance and two hedging their bets. Jharkhand, where most expected a clear outcome, did not offer much clarity, with poll analysts being divided sharply down the middle. Three are of the opinion that the ruling alliance will retain the state, three others equally convinced that the NDA will wrest the state from the INDIA bloc.

The aggregate of nine exit polls, though, indicates an NDA victory in Maharashtra. Data also

indicates a close fight in Jharkhand, where the end result could be a split verdict.

Numbers say Maharashtra's Mahayuti -- ruling alliance of Eknath Shinde's Shiv Sena, Ajit Pawar's Nationalist Congress Party and the BJP -- could win 150 seats and the Maha Vikas Aghadi, the coalition of Uddhav Thackeray's faction of Shiv Sena, NCP Sharadchandra Pawar and the Congress, may get 125. The majority mark in the 288-member assembly stands at 145. In Jharkhand, currently ruled by the alliance of Jharkhand Mukti Morcha and the Congress, the NDA could marginally fall short of the magic figure

of 41, ending up with just 39 seats, show the aggregate of eight exit polls. The INDIA alliance, though, will be close behind with 38 seats. Exit polls, however, can get it completely wrong as became amply clear in case of Haryana election, the results of which came out last month turning prediction on its head. This time, the exit polls that predict an NDA victory include People's Pulse, Matrize, Chanakya Strategies, and Times Now JVC. The naysayers are Dainik Bhaskar, Lokshahi Marathi Rudra and Electoral Edge. There are also a couple of fence-sitters also who covered all bases with very disparate margins, Poll



Diary and P Marq - the former predicting that the ruling alliance may get anything between 122 and 186 seats and the MVA 69 to 121 seats. The political tumult of the last two years - a change of government sandwiched between splits in two parties, the Shiv Sena and the Nationalist Congress

Party - made for a particularly complicated election in Maharashtra this time. While the results of the April-May Lok Sabha election indicated a clear public sympathy towards Uddhav Thackeray and Sharad Pawar, who faced rebellion, split and deprivation of power, party name and symbol,

of Opposition assurances. Of the eight Opinion Polls for Jharkhand, three have predicted for a change of guard with NDA victory. Chanakya Strategies have given NDA 45-50 seats and People's Pulse 44-53 seats. Times Now-JVC also expects an NDA win in Jharkhand with 40-44 seats and 30-40 for the INDIA bloc.

In 2019 too, the tribals had voted overwhelmingly against the NDA. In the Lok Sabha election, the BJP won eight of the state's 14 seats, down from 11 in 2019.

JMM-Congress-RJD alliance won a comfortable majority with 47 seats. This time too, the INDIA bloc hopes to retain power, riding on its welfare schemes like the women-oriented Maiya Samman Yojana and the outrage among tribals over the arrest of Chief Minister Hemant Soren in a corruption case.

Odisha to construct grand ring road connecting major commercial hubs across state: Minister

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Works minister Prithiviraj Harichandan Wednesday said the government will construct a six-lane grand ring road connecting all major commercial hubs of the state. This six-lane road will connect Mottu in Malkangiri district to Tiring in Mayurbhanj district. It will reduce travel time across Odisha to just 26 hours, linking all commercial hubs, Harichandan told media persons on the sideline of Odisha Infrastructure Conclave 2024. The All-Odisha Contractors Welfare Association (AOCWA) in association with the All-Odisha Contractors Association (AOCA) has organised the conclave here Wednesday.

The minister alleged the previous BJD government had clubbed several infrastructure projects while

contractors were found ineligible to take part in the tender process.

"Now, we have completely stopped it. However, there will be competition among contractors", he said.

Harichandan said the state government is going to amend the Odisha public works department code to enhance the limit of B and C class contractors. He emphasised that

contractors and engineers are essential members of the system and a vital part of the family, noting that no work can be accomplished without the involvement of contractors. The Odisha government is committed to execute major infrastructure projects to further boost development, the minister added.

Addressing the gathering, J Patra, president of AOCWA emphasised that the conclave is a transformative platform to

bridge the gap between contractors and the government while promoting innovation and sustainability in

infrastructure development.



CHSE Odisha announces Plus-II exams schedule

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Council of Higher Secondary Education (CHSE), Odisha Wednesday announced the schedule for Plus-II examinations for all streams. The examinations are scheduled to start February 18, 2025 and continue till March 27, 2025. According to the official notification, the examination for regular and ex-regular candidates of the science stream will start February 18, 2025, while the examination for regular and ex-regular candidates of the arts and commerce stream will start February 19 of next year. For vocational studies, the examinations will start February 20, 2025, it stated. Internal assessment examination will be conducted from December 23 to 30 this year, while the practical examinations for regular and ex-regular candidates will be conducted from January 2 to 12 next year, the notification stated.

NCP(SP) worker assaulted, polling booth vandalised in Parli

Beed(KCN): A polling booth was vandalised and a worker of the Sharad Pawar-led NCP (SP) was assaulted Wednesday in Parli assembly constituency, from where minister Dhananjay Munde of the Ajit Pawar-led NCP is seeking re-election, an official said. Madhav Jadhav, a local leader of the Sharad Pawar-led party was assaulted in Bank Colony area of Parli town and the video of the assault went viral on social media, after which a polling booth at Ghatnandur in the constituency was vandalised, official said.



Central team to visit Odisha for assessment of damages caused by Cyclone 'Dana'

Bhubaneswar(KCN): A seven-member Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) is scheduled to reach Odisha November 24 for an on-the-spot assessment of the damage caused by Cyclone 'Dana', informed Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari, Wednesday.

As per official sources, this visit aims to evaluate the ground realities and provide critical insights for relief and recovery measures.

Speaking to media persons in Bhubaneswar Wednesday, Pujari said that the Union Home Ministry through a letter has intimated that a seven-member Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT), led by PK Rai, Joint Secretary, Ministry



of Home Affairs, will reach Odisha November 24. The team accompanied by officials of the Revenue Department will carry out an on-the-spot assessment of the damages caused by the cyclone and subsequent flooding in three coastal districts of the state between November 24 and 27. Pujari also stated that the collectors of the affected districts have been given instructions about the visit of the central team.

assessment through field visits in the three affected districts, the central team will return to Bhubaneswar and hold a briefing with the authorities of Revenue and other departments of the state government and collect reports related to the damages in the cyclone.

He said that Odisha will receive compensation from the union government on the basis of the damage report prepared by the state government and the on-the-spot assessment by the central team. Notably, the Cyclone 'Dana' that hit the Odisha coast October 25 has caused damages to the tune of over Rs 600 crore, as per the assessment of the state government.

New Delhi, (KCN): The Delhi government on Wednesday announced that all government offices functioning under the Delhi Government and Municipal Corporation of Delhi will operate with 50 per cent of the staff strength and the remaining 50 per cent of staff will work from home in view of the deteriorating air quality in the national capital.

The national capital has been witnessing 'severe' levels of air quality for the past couple of days. 'In pursuance of Commission for Air Quality Management in NCR and Adjoining Areas (CAQM) Order dated 17.11.2024 and directions contained in the judgment dated 18.11.2024 of Hon'ble Supreme Court in W.P.(C) No. 13029/1985; all government offices functioning under Government of NCT of



Delhi and Municipal Corporation of Delhi shall operate with 50 per cent of the staff strength and the remaining 50% staff will work from home," the Delhi government stated in the notice. "All administrative Secretaries and Heads of Departments of GNCTD shall attend their respective offices and call upon relevant officers/officials as per the requirement to ensure uninterrupted delivery of all essential and emergency public services," it added. If protection of culture under nature can be called its culmination then it is present in India. Here trees, plants, air, water, sky, fire, earth, sun, mountains all are worshipped. In Kabir's words, "If you worship the stones and get green, then I worship the mountains, no one should worship the mill of the house, go and let the world grind." In Kabir's words, we find attachment towards the formless, yet the faith that is associated with the mountains takes us forward. And there too we find that original infinite. Faith is such an attitude which does not look at whom it is towards, it looks at how much dedication, how much determination power, how much faith. Determination power, faith and dedication are essential to keep life alive. There can be any symbol to get these. Now take the mountains only, many people are drawn towards the mountains.

Land of Hills Devbhoomi Uttarakhand

Char Dham of Uttarakhand is a wonderful religious meeting place of different cultures of the country and abroad. They are also a symbol of the religious and cultural unity of North and South India. Along with the establishment of Joshimath, the northern seat of the Himalayas, in the eighth century, Shankaracharya also made arrangements to appoint a Namboodiri Brahmin from Kerala state of South India as Rawal for the worship of Badrinath with the aim of connecting the North and the South. It is a hill town located primarily on the slopes of the Himalayan mountain regions, having international borders with China (Tibet) in the north and Nepal in the east. The state is home to the four most important and revered Hindu temples: Yamunotri, Badrinath, Gangotri and Kedarnath. This is truly God's land (Devbhoomi). Uttarakhand is known as Devbhoomi or "Land of the Gods", as it is home to many Hindu holy sites. Moreover, Uttarakhand is known as Devbhoomi since ancient times, and

currently this state is known as Devbhoomi Uttarakhand in India. Devbhoomi Uttarakhand is also a part of the Himalayan region. The mountainous region and valleys of Devbhoomi Uttarakhand are also the home of gods and goddesses. India's longest and holiest river, Ganga, flows from the Gangotri Glacier in Uttarkashi district of Uttarakhand.

When did Char Dham Yatra start

Today lakhs of people reach Chardham Yatra. It is said that Adi Guru Shankaracharya discovered Badrinath in the 8th-9th century. It was he who rebuilt this place of religious importance. It is said that the idol of Lord Badrinath was in a cave near the Tapt Kund here and in the 16th century, a king of Garhwal placed it in the existing temple. While Kedarnath is one of the 12 Jyotirlingas of Lord Shiva. Local people used to visit the four Dhams with devotion, but in the 1950s, the movement here increased due to religious tourism. Due to the 1962 China war, when the transportation system in the area improved, the number of devotees coming on Chardham Yatra also started increasing.

Who established the four Dhams?

According to Skanda Purana, Garhwal has been called Kedarkhand. Kedarnath is also described in Mahabharata. After the Mahabharata war, there are reports of Pandavas worshiping here. It is believed that the present temple was built by Adi Guru Shankaracharya in the 8th-9th century. Description about Badrinath temple is also found in Skanda Purana and Vishnu Purana. There is mention in the Puranas about the existence of the Badrinath temple even in the Vedic period (1750-500 BC). According to some beliefs, there was a Buddhist temple here till the 8th century, which was later converted into a Hindu temple by Adi Guru Shankaracharya.

According to the Puranas, the credit for bringing Ganga to earth goes to King Bhagiratha. The Gorkha people (Nepali) ruled Kumaon-Garhwal from 1790 to 1815, during which time the Gangotri temple was built by the Gorkha general Amar Singh Thapa. On the other hand, the original temple of Yamunotri was built by Maharani Guleria of Jaipur in the 19th century. However, some documents also indicate

that the old temple was built by Maharaja Pratap Shah of Tehri. The present temple has been constructed after the old temple broke down due to weather. **First day of travel**

The journey starts from the helipad built at Sahasradhara in Dehradun. From here the helicopter takes the first flight and in about forty-five minutes reaches Kharsali from where Yamnotri is six km away. After reaching

springs near the temple; Surya Kund is the most important among them. Devotees boil rice and potatoes in the pond and consume it as Prasad of the Goddess. Legend has it that Goddess Yamuna is considered the daughter of Surya and twin sister of Yama (god of death). It is said that sage Asit Muni lived here and used to bathe in both Ganga and Yamuna. In old age, when he was unable to go to Gangotri, a stream

meditation. Enraged Kapila opened his flaming eyes causing all 60,000 sons to turn into ashes. Later, on the advice of Kapil, Anshuman (Sagar's grandson) started praying to Goddess Ganga, requesting her to come to earth to clean the ashes of his relatives and grant them salvation. Anshuman failed in his objective; It was his grandson Bhagiratha whose rigorous meditation brought

ability to survive for many centuries in such harsh terrain. Legend has it that the Pandavas were searching for Lord Shiva to get salvation from the sins committed on the battlefield of Mahabharata. Lord Shiva was in no mood to forgive him so easily, so he transformed himself into a bull and headed towards Garhwal in Uttarakhand. Discovered by the Pandavas, he dived into the ground. Different

goddesses, the Badrinath temple has a 1 meter high black stone statue of Lord Vishnu. The idol is considered to be one of the eight self-manifested spheres, the self-manifested idols. The Vishnu temple has a majestic gate painted in bright colours. A hot pool in the temple; There is also a hot spring, which is believed to have medicinal properties.

Badrinath is considered

Mahabharata was composed by sage Vyasa in this cave with the help of Lord Ganesha. **Neelkanth Peak:** Popular among mountaineers, Neelkanth is a prominent peak in the Garhwal division, a part of the Himalayas. This snow covered mountain, known as the Queen of Garhwal, is situated 11398 feet above Badrinath.

Pandukeshwar: Located 18 kilometers away from Joshimath, Pandukeshwar is considered a holy place associated with the Mahabharata period. It is believed that King Pandu (father of Pandavas) worshiped Lord Shiva here. Today, there are two famous temples here, the Yoga Dhyana Badri Temple (which is dedicated to Utsava-murti) and the Lord Vasudeva Temple, which is generally believed to have been built by the Pandavas.

Mana Village: Believed to be the last Indian village near the border between India and Tibet/China, Mana is located 3 km from Badrinath in Chamoli district. The Government of Uttarakhand has recognized Mana as a 'Tourism Village'. This beautiful village situated in the Himalayas is situated at an altitude of 3219 meters above sea level and is situated on the banks of the Saraswati River.

Pandavas ascended to heaven from here

Be it Adi Guru Shankaracharya or before him, the arrival of Pandavas for atonement and ascension to heaven, Nagadhiraj, the pilgrimage of Uttarakhand situated amidst the high peaks of the Himalayas and its divine structure has been a source of inspiration for the human beings who have been pious and in search of spiritual peace for ages. Have been attracting and this trend is still continuing. It is believed that after the Mahabharata war, Pandavas had reached Uttarakhand to worship Lord Shiva to get rid of the sin of killing the Gotra. At Kedarnath he finally saw Shiva in the form of Nandi. Even today the stone temple built by the Pandavas is still present there. After this, Pandavas ascended to heaven from Satopanth Glacier on the side of Badrinath, passing along the banks of Alaknanda, the main stream of Ganga.

Kharsali, one can travel up the hill by foot, horse, doli etc. after resting in a normal hotel. When the helicopter lands amidst the mountains, it feels as if you are in the lap of nature. On the way, real views of the giant Himalayas are visible. At some places in the distance, snow covered mountain peaks, small hill farms, villages and towns were visible. At some places the high speed of the wind creates wrinkles and at some places we flaunt like birds in the distant sky. There are small shops all along the way where snacks and tea are available and the biggest thing is that the climb here is a bit steep and one has to stop at many places to rest. As we go higher the coldness increases. The melting snow from the mountains makes us yearn and the sun in the distant sky also becomes dim.

Yamunotri is the place where India's second most sacred river Yamuna originates. Yamunotri Dham, located in Uttarkashi district of Uttarakhand, is the first stop of the pilgrimage. It is believed that bathing in its waters washes away all sins and protects from untimely and painful death. It is believed that Yamunotri temple was built in 1839 by King Naresh Sudarshan Shah of Tehri. Apart from Yamuna Devi (Goddess), the idol of Ganga Devi is also installed in the iconic temple. There are several hot water

of Ganga started flowing across the river Yamuna. **Second day of the trip**

The helicopter takes off from Kharsali on the next day and takes about half an hour to reach Harsil village from where Gangotri is about twenty-five km away. After your stay at the hotel, a four-wheeler comes to pick you up and takes you towards Gangotri. The train moves forward through the mountains, through uphill roads and heavy traffic, and takes one and a half hours to Gangotri. After walking about 200 meters further you reach the temple. And nearby the river Ganga is flowing like a young woman. Taking a bath requires special courage because the water is so cold that teeth start ringing.

Gangotri Dham is dedicated to Goddess Ganga, who is said to have descended on earth to wash away the sins of mankind. This river originates from Gangotri Glacier at Gomukh which is about 18 km from Gangotri town. The original temple of Gangotri, located in the Uttarkashi district of Uttarakhand, was built by Amar Singh Thapa, a Gorkha general, in the early 19th century. Legend has it that King Sagar performed Ashwamedha Yagya and sent his 60,000 sons along with the horse. The horse was lost; Tracing the horse to sage Kapil's ashram, 60,000 sons raided the ashram and harassed the sage

into deep

parts of the Lord emerged at different places - the hump at Kedarnath, the arms at Tunganath, the navel at Madhya-Maheshwar, the face at Rudranath and the hair at Kalpeshwar. These five places together are known as Panch-Kedar. Pandavas built temples at all five places.

There is a legend that the history of this abode of Lord Shiva is connected with the incarnation of Lord Vishnu, Nar-Narayan, Pandavas and Adi Guru Shankaracharya.

This temple is in the Himalayan region, due to this it remains closed for about 6 months during winter season and is opened for devotees during summer season. Many beliefs related to Kedarnath Dham are prevalent. It is written in the Kotirudra Samhita of Shivpuran that in ancient times, Nar-Narayan, the incarnation of Lord Vishnu, used to worship Lord Shiva daily by making a mortal Shivalinga in Badri.

Fourth day of the journey

On the fourth day, the helicopter lands at the helipad of Badrinath which is located at a distance of five hundred meters from the temple and after the hotel stay, we go for darshan. Situated at an altitude of 10,279 feet in the Garhwal hills near the Alaknanda River, this temple offers beautiful views of the snow-covered Himalayas and the picturesque surroundings. Apart from various idols of gods and

A few days ago, I read an article on digital dawah in one of the leading newspapers, written by a student pursuing a Master's in Islamic Studies at Kashmir University. The article beautifully described the modern evolution of dawah. While my intention is not to critique, I felt compelled to reflect on the topic from a broader perspective. This reflection inspired me to explore the foundational principles of dawah, which form the bedrock of any successful outreach effort.

Aggressive Thinking: A Dangerous Weapon
Aggressive thinking, especially when met with peace, often stems from a negative mindset. Whether individual or collective, it is a reflection of weakness. Islam has no place for such thinking. When we resort to aggression as the final response, it signifies a failure to engage in meaningful dialogue and understanding. If we lack the knowledge and skill to communicate thoughtfully, we may fall back on ignorance, misrepresentation, or verbal violence—none of which lead to positive change.

Basics of Dawah

I once engaged in a conversation with a gentleman who claimed that Allah would destroy the disbelievers. I objected, pointing out that such a statement was made without wisdom or understanding. I reminded him that, just a few centuries ago, our ancestors were also disbelievers, and it was through the dawah of others that we became Muslims. If the early callers to Islam had viewed us as "infidels" and rejected us, how would we, as Muslims today, have ever found the truth?

Allah, in His infinite wisdom, instructs Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) to invite others to the path of righteousness with patience, wisdom, and beautiful words:

"Invite to the way of your Lord with wisdom and good advice, and argue with them in a way that is most beautiful. Verily, your Lord knows best who has strayed from His path and who is rightly guided" (Surah An-Nahl 16:125).

The qualities of selfishness, narrow-mindedness, and hard-heartedness have no place in a society built on Islam's values of kindness and compassion. The Prophet (PBUH) said, "I have been sent to perfect good

manners." This teaching underscores that Islam is not about rigidly proving others wrong; it's about rising above the desire for personal victory and engaging with others in a manner that nurtures understanding, respect, and empathy. In the Qur'an, over 6,000 verses speak to the importance of moral conduct—both positive and negative values are addressed throughout. The ethics of the Prophets and the righteous are fundamental in guiding our behavior. To be truly moral is not to retaliate under negative influences but to act with wisdom and kindness, regardless of the other party's actions.

The Legacy of Shah Hamdan: A Model of Dawah

A powerful example of dawah in Kashmir is Mir Syed Ali Hamdani, also known as Shah Hamdani. He came to the subcontinent, particularly Kashmir, where he spread Islam for over seven centuries. Formerly the son of the King of Hamdan in Iran, he was known by the title of Amir Kabir. Among the famous mosques he built during his preaching is the renowned 'Khankah Moula,' located on the banks of the Jhelum River, along with the Dargah Shah Hamdan in Srinagar. His personal character stood out in his preaching.

Shah Hamdani's teachings were not focused on a glowing exterior or aggressive tactics, but rather on his integration of dawah with practical life. He promoted the flourishing of industries in Kashmir, such as carpet making and pashmina weaving, alongside religious preaching. The industrialization that occurred was not the real goal, but rather a means to facilitate dawah. His methods were grounded in a deep understanding of the people's needs, making dawah relevant and embedded in their daily lives.

Thousands of GS coach with 370 regular trains within three months : Director I&P, Railway Board

Sambalpur, (KCN): In view of the ever increasing interest and attraction of the general public towards rail travel, the Railways is speeding up the expansion of facilities accordingly. In this sequence, the Railways has added about six hundred new additional coaches of general category (GS) in various trains in the last three months. All these coaches have been added to regular trains. Not only this, by the end of the current month of November, more than one thousand such coaches of GS category will be added to about 370 regular trains. According to an estimate, about one lakh passengers will be benefited daily by the addition of these new GS coaches in the fleet of the Railways. Apart from these, work is going on at a fast pace to include a large number of non-AC class coaches in the railway fleet in the next two years. The Railway

Board has given detailed information about the new facilities for general class rail passengers here. Railway Board Executive Director (Information and Publicity) Dilip Kumar said that general class passengers are among the top priorities of the railways. The railways are working in various directions to provide maximum facilities to the passengers of this category. Under this, a total of 1000 new GS coaches of GS category will be added to the trains during the three months from July to October. Also, these newly built coaches have been added to 370 regular trains. Thousands of additional passengers are getting benefit from this every day. With the inclusion of these coaches, about one lakh additional passengers will be able to take advantage of the journey of rail travel every day. The Executive Director said that in view of the

facilities of general class passengers, the construction of new GS coaches is going on at a fast pace. He said that in the next two years, more than 10 thousand such non-AC general class GS coaches will be added to the railway fleet. More than six thousand of these will be GS coaches, while the rest of the coaches will be sleeper class. With the inclusion of such a large number of non AC coaches, about eight lakh additional passengers of general class will be able to travel by train every day. All these newly built GS class coaches will be of LHB. Apart from making the journey comfortable and convenient, it will also help in making it safe and fast. Compared to traditional ICF rail coaches, these new LHB coaches are relatively lighter and stronger. In case of an accident, the damage to these coaches will also be minimal

He said that following the new delimitation, Punjab will also require a larger assembly building, and they can acquire land to construct their own facility. However, he criticized Punjab leaders for their disrespectful attitude towards the construction of Haryana's new assembly. We all should sit in this holy temple and make decisions that benefit humanity. Saini urged Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann to focus on the welfare of

the people of Punjab and provide the Minimum Support Price (MSP) to farmers, similar to the benefits being given in Haryana. He pointed out that the Supreme Court has also admonished Punjab regarding stubble management, urging Mann to prioritize these pressing issues for the state. The Chief Minister said that a total of four sittings have taken place during the winter session of the Vidhan Sabha, which has been ongoing since 13th November. These sittings included approximately 27 hours of constructive discussions. A resolution was passed in honour of the 555th Prakash Parv of First Patshahi Shri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. In addition, calling attention notices submitted by various MLAs were clubbed by subject matter, resulting in four proposals being discussed.

The Chief Minister expressed his gratitude to the people of the state for enabling the Non-Stop Government in Haryana for a third consecutive term. He described this as a golden chapter in Haryana's history, adding that such a phenomenon has never occurred before in the past. He said that this historic mandate reflects the dynamic leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, as well as a commitment to development, good governance, the welfare of the poor, and a spirit of patriotism.

Politics divides Bolangir royal family

Bolangir(KCN): The 2024 general and Assembly elections have ushered in a new era of political dynamics in Bolangir district. With the fall of the 24-year-old BJD government, the influence of the party's leaders is waning in this district. On the other hand, BJP leaders are slowly but surely taking centre stage. This shift has created a tense political atmosphere within Bolangir's royal family, igniting a quiet yet intense rivalry.

Key figures in this political drama include Deputy CM and senior BJP leader Kanak Vardhan Singh Deo and his cousin, Kalikesh Narayan Singh Deo who is BJD leader and MLA



of the Bolangir Assembly constituency. Their confrontations have become a hot topic of discussion. Despite publicly addressing each other respectfully during meetings, their speeches reveal underlying animosity between the BJP and BJD.

At a recent 'Bolangir Day' celebration held at Koshal Kala Mandal ground in the town, attended by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, Kalikesh and



Kanak Vardhan exchanged sharp jabs. Kalikesh advocated for projects such as establishing an agricultural university, rehabilitating the Deogaon sugar mill, reviving local reservoirs and construction of an auditorium at the Koshal Kala Mandal ground. However, Kanak Vardhan, taking the stage after Kalikesh, openly questioned why these issues were not addressed during BJD's

24 years in power. He further warned against underestimating his stance. "If I open my cards, they (BJD) won't be able to handle it," Kanak Vardhan stated. Kanak's fiery comments left the audience astounded, as he displayed an unusually aggressive demeanour. Observers noted that such a strong response from him was unprecedented, highlighting the escalating tension between the BJP and BJD factions within the royal family.

Adding to the mix, BJD representatives, including Rajya Sabha Member Niranjan Bishi, Zilla Parishad Chairperson Devaki

Sahu and Bolangir Municipality Chairperson Lika Sahu also raised various demands during the meeting. A couple of days later, BJP's Lok Sabha MP Sangeeta Kumari Singh Deo criticised the previous government's handling of local issues, further intensifying the political friction. This ongoing rivalry reflects not only personal disputes but also the broader power struggle between the BJP and BJD in the region. As whispers of internal discord grow louder, the royal family's feud continues to draw public intrigue and political speculation.

Odisha CM extends Bali Jatra by one day, BJD demands national festival status

Bhubaneswar(KCN): In view of public demand, Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Tuesday announced the extension of the historic Bali Jatra in Cuttack by one more day, while BJD demanded national festival status for the annual event.

Majhi, who is on a business trip to Singapore, said in an X post that Bali Jatra will now end November 23 instead of November 22. He said there is massive enthusiasm among people over the event.

The festival is organised on the banks of Mahanadi River every year to mark the time of the year when mariners from the state set sail to

Bali, Sumatra and Java in Indonesia, Borneo and Sri Lanka in ancient times for the expansion of trade and culture.

Stating that Bali Jatra is the pride of the state, Mohanty alleged that Majhi was also annoyed when he found inadequate number of electric vehicles to ferry the foreign delegates on the inaugural day of the event.

"Bali Jatra is an Odia tradition. The double engine government must give it national recognition," Mohanty said.

The BJD demanded Rs 20 lakh compensation for the family of the man who died due to electrocution in Bali Jatra.

Wild boars damage paddy crops in Kendrapara district



Kendrapara(KCN): Farmers of Mahakalapada block in Kendrapara district, whose agricultural fields are located on the fringes of Bhitaranika National Park, are spending sleepless nights as wild boars have started damaging ripe paddy crops.

According to sources, wild boar menace has assumed serious proportions this year in Lanjuda and Gogua

gram panchayats (GPs) under Sasanpeta Reserve Forest area of the Gahirmatha Wildlife Range. Several hectares of paddy crops, ready for harvest, have been damaged, especially in these two GPs of Mahakalapada block.

The wild boars have wreaked havoc by sneaking out of their natural habitat within Bhitaranika National Park and entering

recently erected a kilometre-long section of fencing from the World Bank shrimp farming area towards Jagatjora and has deployed personnel to drive away the wild boars with the help of locals.

"We have been guarding our agricultural fields during foggy winter nights, risking attacks by wild boars. Armed with lathis, beating tin drums, creating noise, and bursting crackers, we are doing our best to protect our crops," said affected farmers.

The state government has provisions for compensating farmers if wild animals destroy their crops. Moharana added that an inquiry is underway, and a report will be submitted to facilitate compensation for farmers whose crops have been damaged by the wild boars.

Almonds Food for Fitness

Bhubaneswar: Engaging in exercise promotes a healthful lifestyle, but even when performed correctly, exercise causes fatigue and muscle damage. Recovery from exercise is important because it leads to muscle gain and improved fitness over time. A new study involving people who exercise occasionally (less than three times per week) demonstrated that snacking on almonds reduced feelings of fatigue and tension, increased leg and lower back strength during recovery, and decreased muscle damage during the first day of recovery. David C. Nieman, DrPH, FACSM, Professor and Principal Investigator, Human Performance Laboratory, Appalachian State University, led this novel research, supported with funding from the Almond Board of California. Dr. Nieman's team wanted to see if an almond snack compared to a high-carbohydrate cereal bar snack would improve inflammation and recovery in adults engaging in 90-minute exercise sessions. "What we found tells us definitively that almonds should be added to sports nutrition strategies to help people recover better from exercise," explained Dr. Nieman. "Almonds are food for fitness. Carbs get most of the attention when it comes to fueling for exercise, but almonds offer a nutrition package, including good unsaturated fats, the antioxidant vitamin E, and proanthocyanidins (class of polyphenols, which are protective compounds in plants) that help explain the beneficial outcomes in our study." One serving of almonds (28g) has 13 g of good unsaturated fat and only 1 g of saturated fat.

India's top-seven takes shape amid Perth rain and intense nets

New Delhi: "Khel le, Khel le... (keep playing, keep playing)". The rain had already started to get heavier, but Virat Kohli was in no mood to stop batting. Nor was he keen on letting Dhruv Jurel leave either, as he urged the stylish right-hander to stay put batting. Kohli had been in there for over 40 minutes by then and had faced the first group of seamers led by Prasidh Krishna. He'd then moved to the adjoining net to take on Mukesh Kumar and the rest, as the rain started pelting down. Wiping his bat on his pants in between facing deliveries, Kohli soldiered on, and so did Jurel, before both had to bail out, sticking their equipment under their shirts. While a lot of attention was focused on Kohli, as he went through his routines, pulling off exquisite

drives in between plays and misses, Jurel probably looked the best of all the Indian batters on show on Tuesday (November 19) morning. And if anything, the 23-year-old from Uttar Pradesh should have been the one hogging the spotlight at the Optus Stadium, three days out from the opening Test of the Border Gavaskar Trophy series. Jurel had impressed with the bat across both innings at the MCG against Australia A last week. He'd also looked solid during his knock in the match simulation at the WACA. And now, here he was priming to make a return to the Test XI, as a specialist batter. You'd think so with some certainty too when the reserve wicket-keeper of the Test squad is spotted spending 15-20 minutes each taking catches at silly-point and

third slip. Like Jurel was on Tuesday. It started with him being put through the test in close-in positions by the coaching staff. He was soon joined by Devdutt Padikkal, who'd started the fielding session at first slip alongside Virat Kohli and KL Rahul. Padikkal, who till three days ago was all set to leave Australia along with the other India A players, had only been asked to stay back after Shubman Gill had picked up a thumb injury at the WACA. His presence in the cordon at the start of India's first training session at the venue of the opening Test was another strong indication about the make-up of India's playing XI, at least in terms of batting options. Padikkal was also the first to hit the main practice area at the back of the stadium along with Rahul in an adjoining net.

The two were soon joined by the other batters. With Rahul paired with fellow opener Yashasvi Jaiswal, Padikkal with Kohli, and Rishabh Pant with Jurel, it more or less gave a clear enough picture of India's batting


line-up come Friday, November 22. Padikkal, like Jurel, was among the runs against Australia A, but also looked the part facing Jasprit Bumrah on a tricky WACA pitch on Saturday during the

match simulation. He was also one of the few batters not to be dismissed and ended up batting through the entire first session before being retired out. Perfect time as it turns out now for the stylish left-hander to remind the selectors of his ability to potentially succeed in these conditions. For the record, Sarfaraz Khan, the incumbent No 6 for India, did have a go in the nets too, though he was mainly seen facing throwdowns after being paired up with Ravindra Jadeja. Sarfaraz also spent some time at first slip once Padikkal was done having a go first. Abhimanyu Easwaran, the specialist opener picked in the squad, was a quiet bystander for large parts of training, before getting a late opportunity to face a few deliveries once the rain subsided briefly.

Then you have the question of the No 8. You'd think it'd be a very justifiable pick if the Indian team management does go in with the experience of R Ashwin on a surface that Nathan Lyon has flourished on over the years. Head coach Gautam Gambhir was spotted having a chat with both Ashwin and Jadeja by the Test pitch before Ashwin went and studied the pitch alongside the team analyst, Hari. Ashwin then joined Jadeja and Washington Sundar in the 'spin' net and wheeled away for a good 45 minutes before the rain came down, and he also then had a brief batting session. The veteran off-spinner had bowled for over an hour during the centre-wicket net session at the WACA on Sunday too, while Jadeja had not bowled at all during the three days that India were at Perth's older cricket centre. The only reason Ashwin doesn't play is if either India pick a fourth seamer in Rana, who is also handy with the bat, or they take a real punt by handing Nitish Kumar Reddy the Test cap, as the seam-bowling all-rounder. Reddy did bowl quite a bit along with Krishna to the likes of Kohli, Padikkal and Rahul. He was quite nippy too with his skiddish trajectory off the surface, with the senior batters constantly in his ear about what he was doing right and what he could be working on more. There are a few questions for India to answer over the next two days before things kick off in Perth, even if they seem to have found a formula to come up with a playing XI that still should be a handful despite some key missing boxes.

Coetze handed demerit point for dissenting 'wide' call in Johannesburg T20I

New Delhi: South Africa fast bowler Gerald Coetze was reprimanded and handed one demerit point for showing dissent after one of his deliveries was called a 'wide' during the fourth T20I against India. The incident occurred when Coetze made an inappropriate comment directed at the umpire, violating Article 2.8 of the ICC Code which relates to "showing dissent at an umpire's decision during an international match". He accepted the penalty, proposed by match referee Andy Pycroft, avoiding a formal hearing. Additionally, Netherlands captain Scott Edwards and Oman bowler Sufyan Mehmood have also faced sanctions for breaching the ICC Code of Conduct during the



third T20I. Edwards committed two separate breaches. He first showed dissent by gesturing with his bat after being given out LBW and later threw his bat and gloves onto the field in frustration. These violations of Articles 2.8 ("showing dissent at an umpire's decision during an international match") and 2.2 ("abuse of cricket equipment or clothing, ground equipment or fixtures

and fittings during an International Match") resulted in a 10% match fee fine and two demerit points for the Netherlands skipper. Oman's Sufyan Mehmood was also fined 10% of his match fee and given one demerit point for his actions following Teja Nidamanuru's dismissal. Mehmood pointed the batter towards the dressing room in a provocative manner, breaching Article 2.5 of the ICC Code.

New Delhi: Davis Cup FInals: Rafael Nadal's glorious career ended on a bittersweet note as Spain lost their quarter-finals to the Netherlands in Mallaga on Tuesday. Nadal lost the last match of his professional career, but only after showcasing glimpses of his famous fighting spirit. Rafael Nadal played his last professional tennis match on Tuesday. True to his famous never-say-die attitude, Nadal fought valiantly in his last match. Nadal reflected on his career with characteristic humility while addressing fans. Like a gladiator bidding farewell to the arena, Rafael Nadal was overcome with emotion as the final chapter of his

extraordinary tennis saga unfolded. The tennis great played the final match of his professional career on Tuesday, November 19. In front of a packed crowd at his home in Málaga, the Spaniard brought the curtain down on one of the most inspiring sporting journeys in history. Nadal lost his last singles match while representing Spain in the Davis Cup Finals quarter-final against the Netherlands. His hopes of an extended farewell were dashed as Spain fell 2-1 in the tie. Nadal's reddened eyes brimmed with tears as he stepped onto the court to address the thousands of fans for one last time. Chants of "Rafa, Rafa" reverberated across the

venue as Nadal expressed his gratitude for the fortune and success that defined his career. Earlier this year, Nadal had announced his retirement, confirming he would hang up his boots at the conclusion of the Davis Cup Finals. "The titles, the numbers—they're there, and people probably know that. What I'd like to be remembered for more is as a good person from a small village in Mallorca," he said, prompting thunderous applause from the crowd. Rafa Nadal during his retirement speech: True to his famous never-say-die attitude, Nadal fought valiantly to the final point of his last match. He was overwhelmed with emotions on Tuesday -- the sight of him wiping away tears during the Spanish national anthem at the start of the tie was particularly poignant. But, once Nadal stepped onto the court, he turned into the gladiator that fans have watched with awe over the years. Nadal, playing his first professional match since the Olympics in August, gave it his all, but it was not enough. It was a bittersweet end to an extraordinary career, as Nadal was defeated by World No. 80 Botic van de Zandschulp in straight sets, 4-6, 4-6. Even in the face of defeat, Nadal managed to lighten the mood with a touch of humour. "In some ways, it's fitting that this was my last match—I lost my first match in the Davis Cup, and I've lost my last. So, we close the circle," he quipped.

Bavuma back to lead South Africa's bid to reach WTC final

New Delhi: Temba Bavuma has recovered from an elbow injury and been included in the squad to play two Tests against Sri Lanka as South Africa look to nail down a place in next year's WTC final. Bavuma, South Africa's captain, hasn't played since October 4, when he hurt himself diving to make his ground during an ODI against Ireland in Abu Dhabi. Consequently he missed the Lions' opening two first-class fixtures and won't be involved in the third, against Western Province at the Wanderers from Thursday, because South Africa will go into a two-day camp in Pretoria on the same day. On Saturday they will travel to Durban, where the

first Test starts next Wednesday. When Bavuma walks out for the toss will have gone more than seven weeks without playing competitive cricket and more than three months without featuring in a Test, which he last did against West Indies in Guyana in August. He missed the Tests in Bangladesh last month, when South Africa won 2-0 under Aiden Markram's leadership. "Temba is going in cold on the back of not having played any matches, but we're going to simulate match situations during our camp," head coach Shukri Conrad told a press conference on Tuesday. "Whatever guys achieve and gain playing a four-day match, we feel we can

do the same in two days in our camp. So I don't think it plays that much of a role [that Bavuma hasn't played domestic cricket]. "His fitness test was always going to be yesterday, and then it would be too close [to the first Test] for him to play in a four-day match. If we had asked him to or forced him to play last week, I think it could have been detrimental. And I don't think there was anything to gain from that." Conrad said Bavuma had passed his fitness test, which included assessing the state of his elbow as well as his aerobic conditioning, with flying colours. The concern was the impact [on the joint] when striking the ball; if there was any pain associated with that, he got through that unscathed and with

too slowly in ODIs, where his strike rate is 88.71. Bavuma's supporters, some blinded by his blackness, point out that he has made 21 Test half-centuries, often in challenging conditions and situations - and that from his debut, against West Indies at St George's Park in December 2014, only Dean Elgar has scored more runs for South Africa. Conrad was firmly among Bavuma's fans: "We're thrilled to have Temba back. He's like a kid in a toy shop because he hasn't played Test cricket in a while. It's important to have him back. When I was appointed [in January 2023], I appointed him as captain. We work very well together." Conrad's faith in using a camp in Pretoria, rather than competitive cricket, to

prepare for a series in Bangladesh's wholly foreign conditions was successful. So he is justified in sticking with that approach: "The bowlers will have at least three spells a day, and they'll spend enough time on their feet. We're comfortable we can get everything out of this two-day camp that the players would have got from playing a four-day match." Maybe more: "You play a four-day game and a guy gets a first-baller. Then what? Or the opposition get rolled and a bowler doesn't get in the spells he wanted." The series against India in December and January were South Africa's most recent Tests at home, and Elgar's last before he retired.
