

Lucknow Super Giants sign Rishabh Pant for a record INR 27 crores

NEWDELHI: Rishabh Pant shattered the record for the most expensive player signed at an IPL auction after being bought by the Lucknow Super Giants for INR 27 crores. Pant surpassed the INR 26.75 crores that Punjab Kings shelled out to sign Shreyas Iyer earlier in the first marquee set of the IPL 2025 mega auction.

LSG entered the bidding for Pant straight off the bat and stayed the course to thwart attempts from Royal Challengers Bengaluru as well as the Sunrisers Hyderabad. Eventually, the bidding for him stopped at INR 20.75 crores, at which point the Delhi Capitals indicated their interest to use the Right To Match (RTM) option. LSG then decided to hike up the

price to INR 27 crores as per the new regulations, which proved to be beyond Delhi's valuation of their former captain. Before Pant's big payday, the 'M1' marquee set of the auction also saw IPL 2024-winning captain Iyer becoming the first Indian player to breach the INR 20 crore-mark in the auction. Iyer's signing was sought by both of the teams he's captained previously, DC and KKR, before PBKS flexed their hefty auction purse to wrest him for INR 26.75 crores.

A third Indian player broke the INR 20-crore mark, but it was not the one widely tipped in pre-auction predictions. Venkatesh Iyer, who hit half-centuries in Qualifier 1 and Final in KKR's title win this year, was bought back by the defending

champions for a

Odisha has always been a land of seers and scholars. The way the scholars here took our religious texts to every household and

connected the public with those, it has played a crucial role in the cultural prosperity of India," PM Modi said.

"There was a time when India's eastern region and the states there were called backward. However, I consider India's eastern region as the country's growth engine. That is why we have prioritised the development of India's eastern region," he said.

"The budget that we now allocate to Odisha is three times higher than what it was 10 years ago. We are working rapidly in every sector for Odisha's development and the budget has been increased

by 30 per cent this year," Modi added.

The Prime Minister informed that the Centre is committed to promoting ease of doing business in Odisha and said investments of Rs 45,000 crore have been approved within 100 days of the formation of

a Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government in the state.

"Last year, the G20 Summit was held in India. During the G20 Summit, we showcased the photo of the Sun Temple (in Konark). I am also glad that all four doors of the Jagannath temple (in

Puri) are open now. Besides, the Ratna Bhandar of the temple is also open," he added.

All-party meet: Govt appeals to all parties to ensure smooth functioning of Parliament

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Biju Janata Dal (BJD) held a rally in Bhubaneswar Sunday demanding the withdrawal of the Waqf (Amendment) Bill. The rally organised by the BJD Minority cell was held near the Raj Bhavan in Bhubaneswar where protestors raised slogans demanding the withdrawal of the bill as they claimed it would affect harmony among the community.

The government has listed 16 bills, including the Waqf Amendment Bill, for consideration in the Winter Session of Parliament beginning Monday.

The protestors also submitted a memorandum to the President of India

through the District Collector of Khurda where they made certain suggestions and expressed concerns regarding the proposed amendments to the Waqf Act, 1995.

"We urge that this proposed bill be withdrawn and that comprehensive consultations be held with stakeholders to address their concerns before any amendments are introduced in Parliament. We, as concerned citizens, are committed to the welfare of our nation, trust in your esteemed office to uphold justice and fairness in this matter," the memorandum said.

In the memorandum, the BJD Minority cell said that the proposed

changes in the Waqf Bill have "far-reaching implications" on the autonomy, protection, and governance of Waqf properties, considered as sacred and integral to the religious and social welfare of the Muslim community.

BJD Minority Cell president and MP Munna Khan said that his party MPs will strongly oppose the Waqf (Amendment) bill in the Parliament.

However, Odisha BJP president Manmohan Samal said that the central government would not do any injustice to any community. "The Centre will do justice to all and there is no reason to be worried," Samal said while rejecting Munna Khan's allegation that the Waqf land will be taken away by the central government.

As part of the scheme, women are being credited Rs 5000 directly into their bank accounts. BJP to analyse flaws post Jharkhand poll defeat: Odisha BJP leader Prithviraj Harichandan

Bhubaneswar, November 24(KCN): Expressing disappointment over the BJP's poor performance in the Jharkhand Assembly elections, Odisha Law Minister Prithviraj Harichandan acknowledged shortcomings in the party's strategy. He assured the BJP would critically examine its defeat and take corrective measures.

"We accept the people's mandate. I believe there will be some flaws. The party will analyze it and identify where we went wrong despite the misrule in Jharkhand. We will rectify our path accordingly," Harichandan stated.

Despite the BJP's loss in Jharkhand, Harichandan highlighted the party's commendable performance in Maharashtra, attributing it to good governance. "In Maharashtra, the performance was good. The people have lost faith in Congress and its allies, and the results reflect



that," he added. In Jharkhand, the INDIA bloc, led by Hemant Soren's Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM), secured a decisive victory, winning 56 out of 81 seats. The JMM itself won 34 seats, with Congress bagging 16, and other allies contributing six seats. In contrast, the BJP-led NDA managed just 24

seats, with the BJP securing 21 and its allies winning three. Meanwhile, the BJP-led alliance retained a stronghold in Maharashtra, winning 132 seats. Chief Minister Eknath Shinde's Shiv Sena (UBT), Congress, and Sharad Pawar's NCP faction. The contrasting results in Jharkhand and Maharashtra underline the need for introspection within the BJP, Harichandan suggested, as the party prepares for upcoming challenges.

Useful Points for Retraction in Search cases-Part 4

A confessional statement admitting extra income during search, may be retracted. However, one should be cautious on following points to make the retraction successful.

4. Relevant Points in case a Statement is to be RETRACTED

4.1 The Retraction must be made without delay: Kantilal C. Shah v ACIT [2011] 133 ITD 57 (Ahd) held that retraction of statement made u/s 132(4) will not be permissible if it has been made after a lapse of considerable time and not done immediately. In this case, after a lapse of around 9 months through an Affidavit. The said retraction was submitted before the AO with a covering letter after 50 days. According to department's pleadings the said delay thus demonstrated that the assessee was not confident about filing of the retraction. There must be some convincing and effective

evidence in the hands of the assessee through which he could demonstrate that the said statement was factually incorrect. Further there should also be some strong evidence to demonstrate that the earlier statement recorded was under coercion. In the present case, the retraction is general in nature and lacking any supportive evidence. Rather assessee took several months to retract the initial statement, which by itself created a serious doubt.

4.2 A belated retraction would fall in the category of afterthought: In Council of Institute of Chartered Accountants of India v Mukesh R. Shah [2004] 134 Taxman 265 (Guj) the Court held that it goes without saying that a retraction made after a considerable length of time, would not have the same efficacy in law as a retraction made at the earliest point of time from the day of admission. A belated

retraction would fall in the category of afterthought instead of being retraction.

4.3 Evidences to corroborate reasons for retraction: Sudharshan P. Amin v. Asst. CIT [2013] 35 taxmann.com 370 (Gujarat): In search, assessee had disclosed a sum as undeclared income. However, during assessment proceedings, assessee retracted from his statement. Assessee's CA who was present at time of confessional statements did not suggest any undue pressure or allurement by department. It was held that retraction made by assessee could not be accepted and addition should be made to his income as undeclared investment. When retracting a statement made on oath under section 132(4), it should always be supported by effective evidence which shows that the statement which was earlier recorded was incorrect on facts or was taken under inter alia coercion and intimidation. Merely mentioning that the statement was recorded using undue influence, threat or coercion, or that there was a mistake of facts or law, may not be enough. What has to be seen is how clearly the same is spelt out and what evidence, has been furnished to demonstrate the same.

4.4 Intimation of retraction to higher authorities: In Principal

CIT v Roshan Lai Sancheti [2019] 306 CTR (Raj) 140, the Court held that "Statement recorded under sec. 132(4) and later confirmed in statement recorded under sec. 131, cannot be discarded simply by observing that the assessee has retracted the same because such retraction ought to have been generally made within reasonable time or by filing complaint to superior authorities or otherwise brought to notice of the higher officials by filing duly sworn affidavit or statement supported by convincing evidence. Duration of time when such retraction is made assumes significance and in the present case retraction has been made by the assessee after 237 days.

4.5 Statements made involuntarily i.e. obtained under coercion, threat, duress, undue influence etc.: In Deepchand & Co v ACIT [1995] 51 TTJ (Bom.) 421, the ITAT, Mumbai held that there is no supporting evidence to confirm the additions except the statements of two partners recorded at the time of search. It would not be out of context to mention that the statements recorded by the search for 2 days cannot be considered to be free, fearless and voluntary. There is a considerable substance

in the assessee's contention that the statements were recorded under pressure and force. The Tribunal had held that retraction should be allowed if it is based on proper principles and evidence. In the ordinary course no assessee would say that he had much concealed unaccounted money as mentioned in the statements herein. Putting in the mouth of the assessee that so much amount was unaccounted and concealed would itself indicate that the admission was forcible and not voluntary.

4.6 Retraction after obtaining copy of Statement on ground of mistaken belief either of fact or law:

a) In Jyotichand Bhaichand Saraf & Sons (P.) Ltd. v Deputy Commissioner of Income-tax, Circle 11(1) (ITAT, Pune) [2012] 139 ITD 10 (Pune), during search action, statement of the Director of assessee was recorded on 6th November 2001. The assessee was given copies of the statement recorded under section 132(4) on 20th May 2002. On receipt of copy of the statement, assessee realized that there was a mistake in the declaration of income. Statement of Director indicate that he was not mentally composed at relevant point of time.

b) Amritsar ITAT Bench in Asstt. CIT v Janak Raj

Assessing Officer and retracted the statement made under mistake of fact. The assessment was accordingly made but was set aside by the CIT under sec. 263 stating that the same was prejudicial to the interest of the revenue and was made by A.O. without application of mind. On appeal, ITAT held that the department has not brought on record any corroborative evidence so as to establish undisclosed income having been invested in agricultural land. Statement of the assessee cannot be sole basis without any cogent and corroborative evidence. The mistake in the statement is immediately clarified on the receipt of the statement by the appellant. Moreover, no material/evidence was found during the course of search action indicating on-money payment or any undisclosed investment in land. The statement was given under mistaken belief of law that the suppressed sale is unaccounted/undisclosed income instead of correct legal position that the gross profit arising from unaccounted sale is the undisclosed income. Statement of Director indicate that he was not mentally composed at relevant point of time.

4.8 Mode and Manner of Retraction: Retraction of a statement later on, which was made during the search operation is

Chiuhan [2006] 102 TTJ 316 (Asr.), observed that admission made at the time of search is an important piece of evidence, but the same is not conclusive. It is open to the assessee to show that it is incorrect and same was made under mistaken belief of law and fact.

4.7 Principles of Natural Justice to be applied: ITAT, Jodhpur Bench in Maheshwari Industries v Asstt. CIT [2005] 148 Taxman 74 (Jodh) (Mag.) held that additions should be considered on merits rather than merely on the basis of the fact that the amount was surrendered. It is settled legal position that unless the provision of statute warrant or there is a necessary implication on reading of section that the principles of natural justice are excluded, the provision of section should be construed in manner incorporating principles of natural justice and quasi-judicial bodies should generally read in the provision relevant section a requirement of giving a reasonable opportunity of being heard before an order is made which will have adverse civil consequences for parties effected.

4.8. Mode and Manner of Retraction: Retraction of a statement later on, which was made during the search operation is

not an easy way to escape the tax implications and requires corroborative evidence and documents to support the retraction and show the circumstances as to why the person is retracting his statement made earlier. The person has to go through minute scrutiny by the tax authorities and the Courts later on, if the need be. A retraction should be made on an affidavit along with supporting evidences. Additional affidavit of the witnesses present during search may also be filed. In case of a mistake of fact or law, it must clearly lay down as to what mistake took place in making the statement, reason for the same and the actual correct position. Evidences in support of the correct facts must also be attached.

Any retraction should be done at the earliest without any delay. A retraction made immediately may strengthen the case of the assessee whereas a belated retraction will in most cases would be seen as an afterthought.

Cultural medium of media and cinema

Every medium of expression has its own characteristic features. In literature, the author creates invisible images, whereas cinema is a completely visual medium. Therefore, the transformation of literature into cinema is simply the transformation of the invisible into visible things. That too, not in a static visual image like art or sculpture, but in completely alive and directly visible events of life. Obviously this transformation demands additional sensitivity and profound mastery of one's medium. Does it, and to such an extent of creativity, that it seems as if the director of the film has created it as his own original work.

When a person reads literature as a reader, he automatically gets associated with that creative process. The author creates the character presented to him through words in his own way, in his imagination. The events that the author presents before him, he gives shape to in his own imagination and sees them happening. In this way, a process of creation, which is initiated by the writer, and even if it is in personal form, it becomes complete by coming true in the imagination of the reader. When the same person watches a film, he is unable to connect with its creative process. Because his characters are presented before him in their full form and make-up. The entire incident is created and shown before his eyes like a real life, moving and talking. Of course it is based on the imagination of the film director. But the audience has no stake in creating them, just looking at

it and liking or disliking it. It happens. If the images in the cinema match or better the images he might have created in his imagination after reading the book, then he is able to like it otherwise not. But apart from this, a large audience is those who have not read it in literature. He directly narrates that story on screen. Its acceptance directly depends on how successfully the director has been able to convey the plot, sentiments and emotions of that literature in the film. If due to external pressures he has made unnecessary compromises, then obviously that the film does not leave the desired impact. The advantage of literature is that the writer can delve deeper into the emotions of the characters page by page, as happens in the prose of Nirmal Verma. Whereas cinema has to capture the expressions visible on the faces of its characters to reveal their emotions. He can

only catch the external image. Can't get inside his mind. But it has moving visual images, sound, lighting effects, and now even the latest technology, which makes visuals more meaningful than words. Can present in a powerful manner. Generally, the camera has the ability to present a scene or emotion in a more realistic form in just a moment, for which the writer has to go into detail. There is no time limit for the reader of literature. He can go on reading the same book for many days, or even read it several times. In a way, that work becomes a part of his sensibilities. Whereas cinema has a limit of presenting the same work in just two and a half hours. To do this he needs a lot of resources. Rupee and fractions also have to be removed from it. At the same time, the challenge is that while making all these changes, the original content, original feeling and

original sensibility of the literary work should not be tampered with. If this is not done with the necessary sensitivity, the film would neither leave the desired impact nor do justice to the literary work. Despite many such difficulties and limitations, literature is transformed into films. Occurs extensively in English. There is a tradition of making classics based on classic works. Films get made, and that too with the same grandeur, understanding and quality that is expected from adaptations. They reach the same heights of presentation and art as the literary work itself. A large number of films receiving Oscar awards are adapted from literary works. Then where is the hindrance in Hindi? Considering it to be a business, investing hundreds of crores of rupees in it, the commercial obligations of earning commensurate

profits, and all the good films have been made on Sharat Chandra, Rabindranath Tagore, Premchand or Amrita Pritam etc. But films are better. There is no need for plots, and there is a wealth of such plots available in Hindi literature, which remain untouched by films. In the era of parallel films, there was certainly a hope that an era of serious artistic films dealing with social problems would begin, and they would be based on the corresponding literary works. Some such excellent films have also come. But that phase could not go far. The prevailing perception in Hindi of considering films merely as a means of entertainment acts as a hindrance in the filming of serious literary works. Then movies Considering it to be a business, investing hundreds of crores of rupees in it, the commercial obligations of earning commensurate

Leave aside the part about 'means of entertainment' (which it is necessary and on the level of which it is desirable to pay attention), yet communication of deeper social reality is required from its other serious aspect. So that all such concerns of literature are more and more included in that powerful medium and it can live up to those expectations among its immense audience. There is a need for a more close relationship with literature. It is necessary to think deeply about how the committed and dedicated filmmakers who dare to take the risk and produce such films adapted from literature, can earn maximum profits. And other types of films should be given patronage, so that those films can connect with a larger audience.

After Stunning Win In Minority Stronghold, Assam BJP Eyes 5 Such Seats



Guwahati(KCN): After the by-election win in longtime Congress stronghold Samaguri, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma is eyeing for victories in five more minority-dominated seats in the next assembly election. "Our focus is always on minority votes, but with appeasement to none and justice for all, which reflects Sabha Saath, Sabka Vikas. So we will continue to go to the minority areas seeking votes, but with a clear notion that we are not here to appease. We are here to provide you justice," Mr Sarma said.

"We won Karimganj in the Lok Sabha polls and in my assessment, it was the best result and most critical because in the context of Assam, nobody expected that the BJP will win the MP seat in Karimganj where 65 per cent people is religious minority," he said. "The same thing has repeated in Samaguri and in the next assembly elections, we are going to repeat this in at least five constituencies. I have my pathway already defined and I know where to go and which constituency to go. We can't go everywhere

in Assam as the situation is not right at the moment," Mr Sarma said. So far as Assam is concerned, Mr Sarma said the BJP has maintained its winning streak. The by-elections result is a big boost ahead of the assembly election in 2026.

The BJP won three seats, while allies Asom Gana Parishad (AGP) and United People's Party Liberal (UPPL) won one each. The most remarkable victory came in Samaguri, a Congress stronghold since 2001, where BJP's Dipu Ranjan Sarma unseated veteran Congress leader Rakibul Hussain's influence.

Mr Sarma defeated Congress candidate Tanzil Hussain by a staggering margin of 24,423 votes, garnering 81,160 votes compared to Mr Hussain's 56,737. This historic win signalled the BJP's growing foothold in regions long dominated by its rivals.

GPS Misleads Car To Damaged Bridge, It Falls Into River Killing 3 In UP



New Delhi(KCN): For most of those who travel by road, using GPS (Global Positioning System) technology to reach their destinations safely is an obvious choice. However, for three - including two brothers - in Uttar Pradesh, it led them to a tragic end. The car, being navigated using GPS, climbed onto a damaged bridge and plunged into the river flowing 50 feet below in Faridpur when it was travelling from Bareilly to Dataganj in the Badaun district this morning. The damaged Wagon R

mortem house said that the victims were relying on Google Maps. They also blamed the departmental officials because the bridge was left incomplete and there was no barricading around the area to caution the incoming vehicles.

The family blamed the negligence of the administration for the accident. They have also requested the district magistrate to take action against those responsible so that such incidents do not happen in future. "In addition, the absence of safety barriers or warning signs on the under-construction bridge compounded the danger, leading to the fatal accident," Ashutosh Shivam said. Two passengers have been identified as Vivek Kumar and Amit of Farrukhabad. The police are trying to identify the third victim.

Supreme Court Judges Highlight Importance Of Dissenting Judgments

Kolkata (KCN): Dissenting judgments were vociferously advocated as a means of facilitating a culture of debate today by a sitting judge of the Supreme Court. At an event organised in Kolkata by The West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences, Justice Dipankar Dutta highlighted why these comprise an important element of the judicial system.

"We don't write dissenting judgments to point out flaws and loopholes in the opinion of the majority," Justice Dutta said. "What the dissenting judge is doing is giving an absolutely new alternative view of the entire matter".

The event commemorated Justice Radha Binod Pal, an iconic figure in international jurisprudence, best known for his courageous dissenting opinion at the



Tokyo Trials, where he upheld the principles of fairness, impartiality, and legality. Justice Dutta said differences are bound to occur and it all depends on how one interprets the law and applies the law to given facts and circumstances.

"The second important aspect of a dissenting judgment is to stimulate debate and discussion. Dissenting judgments encourage critical

analysis and reflection of the issues at hand," he said.

To explain the point, he referred to statistics for this year at the Supreme Court, where there are nine-judge, seven-judge and five-judge benches. Of nine five-judge bench, three have had dissenting opinions, he said. Same happened with two of three seven-judge bench and all three of three nine-judge bench decisions.

"This means of 15 decisions delivered by constitutional benches during the year, eight, that is more than half, had dissenting opinions, facilitating a constant culture of debate and learning from our colleagues on the bench," he said.

Dissenting judgments also provide guidance for future cases by "planting seeds for potential reversal or modification," he added.

"There have been cases in the past, where the minority opinion has in course of time been accepted as the correct opinion," Justice Dutta added.

Justice Pamidighantam Sri Narasimha, who also spoke at the event, highlighted how the new Indian state distanced itself from the dissenting opinion of Justice Radha Binod Pal. The legal luminary was not India's representative, he said, highlighting the need to reinvent legal definitions inherited from the colonial past.

"My view is that the importance of Justice Pal's opinions is not really in the dissent. I think it is in the character of the person, it is in his courage... holding for what he thought to be truthful... If you have a larger interest, like the interest of a nation, or even higher - the interest of the truth," he added.

Congress Posts Worst Show In Maharashtra, Distant Junior Partner In Jharkhand

New Delhi(KCN): The Congress continued its losing spree on Saturday posting its worst-ever show in Maharashtra and ending up as a distant junior partner to the ruling JMM in Jharkhand, with further diminishing role in the opposition bloc as other allies perform better.

While the INDIA bloc's victory in Jharkhand was some consolation, losing a big state like Maharashtra after the upset in Haryana is likely to weaken the grand old party's broad bargaining power in this era of coalition politics.

The poor show of Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) in Maharashtra extinguished hopes of getting Rajya Sabha seats from the state in future. On the other hand, the NDA with its stupendous victory is set to get a majority in the Upper House in the next cycle of biennial elections. The BJP got a vote share of 26.78 per cent and was followed by Shiv Sena with 12.38 per cent and NCP with 9.01 per cent. Among the MVA, the Congress had the highest vote share of 12.42 per cent, followed by NCP-SP with 11.28 and Shiv Sena (UBT) with 9.96 per cent.

weight of the opposition bloc and stood decimated in the face of an NDA tsunami. The Congress which contested the highest number of assembly seats among MVA allies, 101 out of 288, was winning or leading in only 16 seats with one of the lowest strike rates of 16 per cent.

The worst strike rate in Maharashtra elections was of Sharad Pawar's NCP (SP) at 11.6 per cent (with lead/win in 10 seats out of 86 fought), Shiv Sena (UBT) managing 22 per cent (lead/ win in 21 seats as against 95 contested).

On the other hand, the strike rate of the BJP was the highest with 88.6 per cent (lead/win in 132 seats out of 149 it contested). The BJP got a vote share of 33.18 per cent while JMM got 23.44 per cent and the Congress 15.56 per cent.

Interestingly, other parties got more vote share of 13.82 per cent than each of the MVA partners. Among some of the prominent Congress leaders who lost in Maharashtra were former CM Prithviraj Chavan, senior leader and eight-term MLA Balasaheb Thorat, ex-CM Vilasrao Deshmukh's son Dhiraj Deshmukh in Latur rural, Yashomati Thakur, Ramesh Bagwe and Ganpatrao Patil.

Among MVA allies, those who lost include Harshvardhan Patil and Sharad Pawar's grand nephews Rohit Pawar and Yugendra Pawar, all from NCP-SP. Besides, Amit Thackeray, son of MNS leader Raj Thackeray, also lost in his political debut.

gained 2 per cent. The JMM won 34 seats while the Congress won 16 seats, with RJD winning 4 seats and CPI-ML in 2 seats. The BJP won 21 seats.

The Saturday outcomes revealed that the Congress continued to falter on the slippery electoral landscape, struggling to win or improve in states where it is ruling and failing to uplift alliances where it is the senior partner.

In Haryana, where the Congress and BJP were in direct contest, the party could not convert the anti-incumbency of BJP's two terms into a win. Now in Maharashtra, it was unable to retain its Lok Sabha gains or help its allies pull through after the MVA had won 30 out of 48 Lok Sabha seats in general elections.

Earlier in Jammu and Kashmir also, the National Conference had powered the INDIA coalition to victory while the Congress ended up as a distant junior ally in the poll results.



Maharashtra has given several tall leaders to the Congress including Y B Chavan, Murli Deora, Sharad Pawar, Vasant Sathe, Sushilkumar Shinde and Shivraj Patil. In Jharkhand, it was Chief Minister Hemant Soren-led JMM that saw the ruling coalition through as his party gained a four percentage vote share over the last elections while the share of the rest of the parties either fell or remained stagnant.

Chorus grows for tourism tag to Panchubarahi Temple

Kendrapara(KCN): The demand for declaring the 500-year-old Maa Panchubarahi Temple at Rehabilitation Colony in Bagapatia under Rajnagar block in Kendrapara district as a tourist spot has gathered steam as locals believe that the Mother Goddess is a living deity and is the saviour for people during natural disasters.

Rarely anywhere in the state are women appointed as trustees of a temple. Similarly, it is uncommon to find women priestesses performing rituals in temples. However, at this famous Shakti Pitha, only women from Dalit communities are engaged as priestesses, while men are forbidden from touching the deities. The tradition has



been followed for nearly 500 years which is not to be found anywhere. The five deities in this temple, built from black stone, are served by women priestesses without any formal government support. Locally cultivated grains, fruits, and, in some cases, financial contributions from devotees are accepted as offerings at this shrine.

Rashmita Sahoo, a local, said that the Mother Goddess is perceived as a living deity. "During natural disasters, or in times of happiness and sorrow, she is believed to fulfil the wishes of devotees," she said. At some point, a male priest was given the responsibility of performing the rituals, but after he was

besotted by the beauty of the sculpture, the priestly duties were returned to women. Currently, the four Dalit women entrusted with priestly responsibilities are Sujata Dalei, Banalata Dalei, Rani Dalei and Sabitri Dalei. Only married women are

allowed to serve as priestesses, said Rashmita. Priestess Sabita Dalei shared that her mother-in-law, Sita Dalei, was a priest at the temple, and after her demise, she took on the mantle. No male devotees are permitted to enter the temple or touch the Panchubarahi deity.

Nigamananda Rout, another local, said the Dalit women priestesses are highly respected in the village, with a tradition of villagers bowing at their feet. However, men are not

permitted to enter the rituals held Tuesdays, and they must view the deity from the temple's walls through a narrow passage. Sabita Dalei feels content that no devotee has ever shown disrespect to her as a Dalit woman priestess.

Dr Sarbeswar Sen, a researcher, stated that the temple is unique in the state as Dalit women serve as priestesses here. "Only a few places in the country have female priestesses. Recently, Krishna Veni, S Ramya, and N Ranjitha were appointed as priestesses in the Sri Vaishnava Temple in Tamil Nadu. Additionally, temples like the Attukal Temple and Chakkulathukavu Temple in Kerala, Maa Bhagabati Temple in Tamil Nadu, and Mata Temple in Bihar also prohibit the entry of men.

Local resident Sudarshan Rout explains that the temple of the Mother Goddess was originally located near Barahipur in the Satabhaya Panchayat. "However, due to coastal erosion, the deity had to be relocated. In 2020, the Mother Goddess was temporarily moved to Bagapatia, about 12 km from the original site where men were allowed to touch and transport the deity during the relocation," he said.

Now, with the establishment of a new temple at Bagapatia, 571 families have been provided land and homes by the state government. Efforts are underway to recognise this temple as a religious tourism destination, with local political leaders and administration continuing their work on development plans.

Shoddy construction of Joda flyover out in open



Joda(KCN): Questions have emerged regarding the durability of Odisha's longest flyover recently constructed in Joda of Keonjhar district with funding from the District Mineral Foundation (DMF). Since its inauguration, the structure has required frequent repairs, with large potholes appearing with exposed rebar in many patches. Initially, cracks appeared, revealing iron rods protruding from the concrete. Despite intermittent repairs, significant sections of the road have been closed owing to ongoing railing restoration work disrupting traffic. Poor road conditions have worsened congestion, particularly affecting the

plying of cargo-laden trucks during peak hours. The flyover, built at a cost of Rs 250 crore from the DMF funds, was inaugurated March 10, 2024, by the then-chief minister of the state. Its construction was overseen by Odisha Bridge Construction Corporation Limited (OBCC), which subcontracted the project to Gujarat-based Chevrox Company. At the time of inauguration, the consultancy agency claimed the flyover would have a lifespan of 100 years. However, within less than a year serious structural issues including cracks have cast doubt on its durability. Persistent road damage and ongoing repairs have exposed corroded iron rods in various locations,

sparking further concern. Local residents and truck drivers expressed frustration as recent maintenance work caused traffic snarls from Banspani to Jurudi. Truck drivers such as B Gupta, Digvijay Singh, and Digpal Yadav voiced fears over using the flyover, citing safety concerns. They reported that barricades placed to block damaged sections increase the risk of accidents, while the lack of speed control measures has led to overspeeding by smaller vehicles. Purushottam Das, former vice-chairman of Joda Municipality, criticised the flyover's subpar construction, emphasising the potential threat to public safety. "The 3-km-long flyover, meant to

Jaiswal, Kohli lead India's dominance on Day 3

NEW DELHI: Virat Kohli brought up his 30th Test century and his 81st overall in international cricket before India declared their second innings at 487 for 6, setting a massive target of 534 for Australia. Yashasvi Jaiswal also scored his fourth Test century during the day with a massive 161. India continued to put Australia to the sword in the final session of play on Day 3 in Perth, firstly with the bat as Kohli registered an 89-run partnership with Washington Sundar and a quickfire 77-run partnership in just 8.4 overs with Nitish Kumar Reddy. India then picked up three wickets in the final 27 minutes of the day to leave

the hosts tottering at 12 for 3 at Stumps.

Kohli, unlike the first innings, looked calm at the crease and left the ball alone outside the off-stump with ease on Sunday. He played some classic drives during his 143-ball knock and punished any loose deliveries and got to his fifty with a flick to mid-wicket. Sundar and Kohli continued to rotate the strike and managed to negate any tricks the pitch started to play before the former attempted a wild slog-sweep off Nathan Lyon but only saw his stumps rattled. Despite a weary having spent the better part of two days on the field under 34 degrees of heat in Western

Georgia Plimmer ruled out of Australia series, domestic season until 2025

NEW DELHI: New Zealand Women's opener Georgia Plimmer was on Sunday (November 24) ruled out of action for the remainder of the year after sustaining a bone stress reaction in her groin.

"Plimmer experienced pain in her left hip joint during the recent ODI series in India last month, and a subsequent MRI scan followed with an assessment by a specialist upon her return to New Zealand confirmed the injury," New Zealand Cricket said in a statement. The injury - which requires about six weeks of rest and rehab - effectively rules out the recent T20 World Cup winner from the home ODI series against Australia and the subsequent domestic white-ball season. Plimmer, 20, will then see a progressive return to high-speed running in



January.

"We're really gutted for this to happen to Georgia when she's at the top of her game," said head coach Ben Sawyer. "She's certainly a loss for us heading into an important series against Australia. "After her recent success at the World Cup and in India, it's disappointing she won't be able to continue that form for the Wellington Blaze and against Australia next month.

Georgia's determined to rehab well and get back as soon as she can, and we're wishing her a smooth recovery." Plimmer made 105 runs across the three ODIs in India that immediately followed New Zealand's maiden T20 World Cup win in the UAE, where the opener was her team's joint-leading run-scorer - alongside opening partner Suzie Bates - with 150 runs in six innings at a strike-rate of 119.04.

NEW DELHI: West Indies continued their dominance over Bangladesh through Justin Greaves' maiden Test hundred and a late burst of wickets, that has left the visitors trailing in the first innings by a massive 410 runs with only eight wickets in hand at Stumps on Day 2 of the first Test in Antigua.

Greaves, unbeaten on 11 overnight, found an ally in Kemar Roach, who made a patient 47 in a 140-run stand for the eighth wicket to frustrate Bangladesh and eventually declare their innings on 452 for 9. However, it was without some early success for the hosts on the second morning where Hasan Mahmud trapped Joshua da Silva LBW on 14 and then sent back Alzarri Joseph cheaply on 4 in the space of 10

deliveries to slip to 261 for 7. That's when Roach joined hands and dug in. Together the pair took the hosts past the 300-run mark on their way to recovery, before raising the team's second century partnership of the match and then eventually the 400 before Roach

became Hasan Shamar Joseph (11 off 8) took West Indies to the 450-run mark quickly after Tea and the hosts declared.

Greaves raised his first triple-digit score in Tests with a boundary straight down the ground just after losing Roach, but handy cameos of Jayden Seales (18 off 25) and Alzarri Joseph striking late in the day to reduce the tourists to 21 for 2. The openers were

patient enough, and enjoyed a slice of luck, but Seales eventually put an end to Zakir Hasan's knock in the 10th over just as he seemed to be settling in with a couple of boundary hits earlier in the same over. Perth level-up: A bold new chapter in Jaiswal's rise

NEW DELHI: Yashasvi Jaiswal has had to grow up quickly throughout his life. That's been the reality of his being from the moment he left home before his teen years with the hopes of making it in cricket in the big, bad world of Mumbai.

He's had a lot of growing up to do at a rapid pace over the last couple days at the Perth Stadium, in what many would consider a baptism by fire to Test cricket in Australia. And like he has done so successfully throughout his young life, Jaiswal has risen to the challenge. He's grown up. He's evolved and he's flourished.

It's a remarkable story overall of a boy who was always meant to play cricket. And on Saturday (November 23), at the Perth Stadium, Yashasvi Jaiswal showed that he

also perhaps always was meant to play Test cricket in Australia. That's the ease with which he tackled one of the greatest bowling attacks in the history of the sport, on their turf. That's the comfort with which he settled in for the grind in one of the hardest places to do so as a visitor.

Instead, Jaiswal started his second innings like the first had never happened. Or like he'd completely shut out that memory. It's a skill batters with great experience and mastery over their craft crave for. It's a power that even the greatest batters have not always been able to tap into or even procure at times. But here was the 22-year-old from the maidans of Mumbai, in more ways than one, showcasing the kind of technique, discipline, will-power and skills that few with even multiple visits to these shores have displayed.



less than 27 hours later on the same pitch against the same attack, you'd have expected some level of anxiety. Some level of nerves. Some desperation to take the game on and break away. There was the way in which he picked length from the moment he walked out to bat after the lunch-break on Day 2 in Perth. Leaving deliveries on length, and leaving deliveries with the kind of positive footwork and intent, which tells the

opposition that he's the one dictating terms. That they need to come to him to get him out, even if he's always looking to come after them.

The last Indian opener to leave deliveries with the kind of conviction and precision on Australian soil was perhaps Murali Vijay at his peak. Though KL Rahul was doing an exceptional job of it as well on Saturday. All you felt Jaiswal needed was one piece of luck early in his innings, a play and a miss, a reprieve, and that happened when he poked at a length delivery from Hazlewood but unlike in the first innings didn't get an edge.

Then there was the confidence with which he'd stretch his front-foot forward and defend deliveries right under his nose, like he'd grown up doing so in these conditions all his life.

There was never a sense of uncertainty, whether it was with the balls he chose to come forward to or the way he'd cover his defence. Contact was made right under his eyes, and the ball more often than not either

dropped dead by his feet or rolled a few feet in front of him. As if you couldn't make out whether he was batting on a placid deck in India or on a quick pitch in Perth.

Then came the judgement of bounce when the ball was pitched short. It was a ploy that Australia only went to after Jaiswal had thwarted their Plan A, of using the new-ball as devastatingly as they had in the first innings by hitting the traditional Aussie lengths. There are many ways of avoiding a short ball aimed at your head, but they can mostly be split into two. When a batter reacts so early to it that he has enough time to let the ball go past or when a batter reacts late and has to get out of the ball's way.
