are extensively damaged and a huge amount of money has to be invested for reconstruction.” Therefore, there is a need to develop disaster-resistant sustainable infrastructure, he said.

The Chief Minister emphasised measures such as laying underground electricity cables in coastal districts, construction of embankments along the coast and large-scale afforestation. He also proposed the setting up of a modern disaster management center in Bhubaneswar and that the Union government provide necessary support in this direction.

Participating in the discussion, Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari said that the economic development of Odisha can be accelerated only if a sustainable infrastructure is created.

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi presented a supplementary budget of Rs 12,156 crore for the current financial year 2024-25 in the state Assembly Tuesday. The government in this supplementary statement of expenditure has allocated Rs 125 crore for the organisation of Pravasi Bharatiya Divas which is going to be held in Bhubaneswar in January next year. Similarly, Rs 299 crores has been allocated in the current financial year for the deployment of the Central Armed Police Forces in the state. The government has earmarked Rs 1,056 crore towards the state's share in the National Health Mission (NHM) programme. The government has made an additional allocation of Rs 644 crore for the implementation of



Loans to Public Sector Units under the state Energy Department. The state government has also provided Rs 196 crores towards transfer to Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) as per the State Finance Commission (SFC) award in the Supplementary Statement of Expenditure, 2024-25. Meanwhile, Rs 338 crore is provided under the Madhubabu Pension Yojana in the supplementary budget presented in the state Assembly Tuesday.

The government also allocated Rs 51 crore for Installation of CCTV Surveillance System in police stations and outposts. It is pertinent here to mention that the state government has received severe criticism for the absence of CCTV cameras at many police stations following the alleged assault on an Army officer and his fiancée at Bharatpur Police Station in Bhubaneswar.

The state government has provided Rs 120

crore towards Disaster Risk Mitigation in the Supplementary Statement of Expenditure, 2024-25 for the modernisation and extension of Fire Services. The state government asserted that the Supplementary Statement of Expenditure, 2024-25 is FRBM compliant as the provision is made against resource backup in the form of either adjustment against savings, surrender or additional revenue.

“The capital outlay for the year 2024-25 will exceed 6% of GSDP including the Supplementary provision. This will help in boosting the economic growth and at the same time enable the State to carry forward different developmental and welfare programmes,” states the state government in the supplementary budget.

FLOUR MILL EX-DIRECTOR ARRESTED FOR MISAPPROPRIATION OF GOVT. MONEY

Sambalpur, (KCN): Anil Kumar Beriwal, Ex-Director, M/s Ghanteswari Flour Mill Pvt. Ltd., Sambalpur who was charge sheeted by Odisha Vigilance for misappropriation of Govt. money over Rs.4.48 crore was arrested today in connection with the case and forwarded to judicial custody. The case relates to a

criminal conspiracy by four officials of Sambalpur District Cooperative Central Bank Ltd. (SDCC Bank) with M/s Ghanteswari Flour Mills Pvt. Ltd. by abusing their respective official position, showing undue official favour to M/s Ghanteswari Flour Mill Pvt. Ltd., Sambalpur in sanctioning and

disbursing of loan, and thereby causing a pecuniary loss of Rs.4,48,14,358/- to the Bank as well as to the public exchequer. For this, all the four officials of SDCC Bank with M/s Ghanteswari Flour Mills Pvt. Ltd. represented by the Director Sri Anil Kumar Beriwal were charge sheeted by Odisha Vigilance U/s 13(2) r/w

13(1)(d) PC Act, 1988/ 420/120-B IPC. However, as accused Sri Anil Kumar Beriwal repeatedly evaded attending the court during trial, an NBW was issued by Hon'ble Spl. Judge Vigilance, Sambalpur on 19.11.2024 and today Sri Anil Kumar Beriwal was arrested and forwarded to the Court of Spl. Judge Vigilance, Sambalpur.

TPWODL Announces 'Pay & Win' Winners for October 2024

Indian Rivers Need Protection for their Survival

The rivers in India, which have historically been lifelines of its civilization, are in a dire state due to pollution, overextraction, and ecological mismanagement. India's rivers are on the brink of ecological collapse. Addressing these issues requires stricter enforcement of environmental laws, community involvement, sustainable water management practices, and greater political commitment. Without immediate action, the degradation of rivers will have severe implications for health, livelihoods, and biodiversity. A detailed investigation of the unprecedented challenges faced by rivers across India is presented below:

1. Severe Pollution: Factories discharge untreated waste directly into rivers. For instance, the Yamuna and Ganga are heavily contaminated with chemicals and toxins. Cities and towns along riverbanks dump untreated sewage into rivers. According to studies, around 70% of India's surface water is polluted. Rivers are choking on plastic and garbage, further degrading water quality and harming aquatic life.

2. Declining Water Flow: Excessive water withdrawal for agriculture, industry, and drinking water has reduced the flow of many rivers. Rivers like the Cauvery and Godavari often run dry in stretches. The Himalayan rivers such as the Ganga and Brahmaputra are impacted by the retreat of glaciers due to climate change, threatening their perennial flow.

3. Encroachments and Sand Mining: This depletes riverbeds,

causing erosion, disrupting ecosystems, and lowering groundwater recharge. Construction on riverbanks narrows rivers, restricts flow, and increases the risk of flooding.

4. Loss of Biodiversity: Polluted and disrupted ecosystems have led to the decline of native aquatic species. Iconic creatures like the Ganges river dolphin are now endangered. Dams and barrages have fragmented river ecosystems, blocking fish migration and altering sediment flow.

5. Religious Practices: Rituals such as idol immersion, cremation, and offerings contribute to pollution, despite efforts to promote eco-friendly alternatives.

6. Climate Change: Altered rainfall patterns lead to more intense floods and prolonged droughts, exacerbating the stress on rivers. Rising temperatures increase evaporation, reducing water levels.

7. Ineffective Policies and Implementation: Despite programs like Namami Gange aimed at rejuvenating rivers, the results have been limited due to corruption, lack of coordination, and inadequate enforcement of laws.

8. Urbanization and Industrialization: Rapid urban sprawl has overwhelmed river systems, particularly in metropolitan areas like Delhi, Chennai, Kolkata, Bengaluru and Mumbai, leading to the loss of natural floodplains and increased contamination.

Plight of Cauvery

Let us take the case of the river Cauvery for an example. Saving Cauvery is urgent; otherwise a civilisation will be lost for all time to

come; and to save Cauvery means to save the Kodagu forest. This has been found that between March and May this year, Kodagu was facing a drought like situation and water had become a scarce commodity, more precious than gold. The underlying reason is that the catchment of the Cauvery has been unable to hold water. There are multiple reasons for this but chiefly it includes a complete degradation of the Cauvery's catchment, Kodagu's newly-established plantation economy, change in land-use patterns along the river, tourism, climate change and illegal sand mining. Paddy farming has become unviable in the region as the cost of production for the crop has risen. Consequently, the numerous rice paddies which have dotted the region since centuries, are now diminishing. For instance, in 2010-11, 35,000 hectares (ha) of land in the catchment of the Cauvery and its tributaries like Hemavati and Lakshmantirth were under paddy cultivation. By 2018, this had reduced to 27,000 ha. These paddy fields had acted as natural feeders to the Cauvery. With paddy farming decreasing, the vacant land has either been diverted for non-agricultural use or for a plantation economy. The area under plantations of crops such as coffee, palm oil and areca nut has increased in the state. However, the problem with these industry-driven plantations is that unlike traditional trees, they don't have deep root and hence, cannot hold soil or water. A whole lot of traditional trees like Nandi, Rosewood, Jackfruit and all varieties of bamboos have been removed for

cultivation of coffee. Another problem is the development of infrastructure and urbanisation in the catchment. This report states that Kodagu lost around 3,000 ha of tree cover in the last 17 years. The impacts of decreasing tree cover are now visible as the Cauvery dried up in March-May. Save Our Rivers

Saving Indian rivers from degradation requires a multi-pronged approach involving policy reforms, community participation, and scientific interventions. Here are key strategies:

1. Reduce Pollution: Implementing of stringent regulations on industrial effluents, untreated sewage, and agricultural runoff entering rivers. Increasing the number of sewage treatment plants (STPs) and ensure they operate at full capacity will be very important. Reducing plastic pollution by banning single-use plastics and promoting alternatives is the need of the hour. Using organic farming techniques and controlled application of fertilizers and pesticides for reducing chemical runoff to the riverine and freshwater water ecosystems are urgently needed.

2. Afforestation and Riverbank Protection

Planting trees along riverbanks and creating green buffers to prevent soil erosion and regulate water flow are necessary for the revival of our rivers. Maintaining thick natural vegetation belts along riverbanks for ecological balance is also important.

3. Restoration of the Natural Flow: Ensuring Minimum Environmental Flow (E-Flow) and

regulating dam operations to allow adequate water flow downstream for ecological sustenance. Removing illegal encroachments and clearing illegal constructions blocking natural river channels and floodplains can speed up the river flow.

4. Rejuvenation Projects: Adopting to Integrated River Basin Management (IRBM) is a sustainable strategy for successful river conservation initiatives. Holistic planning at the watershed level to address issues of water management, pollution, and biodiversity are absolute necessity. Promoting and supporting local community-driven river rejuvenation programs, like those seen in the success of projects like the Narmada and Ganga cleanups are very good examples in sustainable river conservation.

5. Awareness and Community Involvement: There is an urgent need to raise awareness about the importance of rivers and the consequences of their degradation; and encourage citizen-based monitoring and surveillance. Fostering community involvement in reporting pollution and illegal activities can help river conservation initiatives significantly.

6. Improved Urban Planning: Enforcing zoning laws to keep construction away from floodplains and riverbanks; and designing urban drainage to prevent untreated stormwater runoff from entering rivers could serve as effective strategies.

7. Adopt Technology: Extensively using satellite technology to

monitor river health and detect illegal activities like sand mining; and installing sensors to continuously track pollution levels and act promptly.

8. Financial Incentives: Providing incentives to industries and farmers adopting eco-friendly practices; and strictly promoting Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) to encourage private companies to fund river conservation projects.

9. Cultural and Religious Practices: Promoting alternatives for rituals that traditionally involve polluting the rivers; and engaging religious leaders by partnering with spiritual communities to spread awareness about protection and conservation of rivers.

10. Policy and Governance: Updating and enforcing policies like the National Water Policy with a focus on river rejuvenation; and addressing disputes to jointly manage rivers shared between states is important strategy for protecting our riverine resources. Creating dedicated bodies for specific river basins for continuous oversight is urgently needed. It is also encouraging to mirror success stories like the Namami Gange Programme that aims to rejuvenate the Ganga River through pollution abatement, afforestation, and biodiversity conservation. The Rally for Rivers Campaign focusing on public awareness and long-term policy changes to protect India's rivers needs to be actively supported across the nation. Developing sustainable

individuals is crucial for long-lasting impact are also needed.

Urgent Need for Water Conservation

Under these circumstances there is urgent need for water conservation. It is crucial for our survival because water is a finite and irreplaceable resource that sustains all life on Earth. Humans depend on freshwater for drinking, agriculture, sanitation, and industrial processes, but only about 1% of Earth's water is readily accessible for human use. As populations grow and economies develop, the demand for water increases, putting immense pressure on available freshwater supplies. Many regions of the world, especially in arid and semi-arid areas, already face severe water shortages. Climate change, overuse, and pollution are depleting freshwater resources, making water conservation essential to ensure long-term availability. Water is essential for growing crops. Agriculture accounts for about 70% of global freshwater usage, and conserving water ensures that we can continue to produce enough food for a growing population.

Freshwater ecosystems, including rivers, lakes, and wetlands, rely on consistent water availability to support biodiversity. Overuse and pollution of water resources threaten these ecosystems, which are crucial for maintaining ecological balance. Water is required for generating electricity, particularly in hydroelectric power plants and cooling

systems for thermal power plants. Efficient water use helps ensure the sustainability of energy production. Access to clean water is vital for health, hygiene, and sanitation. Without water conservation, millions of people face the risk of waterborne diseases and poor living conditions.

The world population has grown rapidly, increasing the demand for water for drinking, agriculture, industry, and sanitation. Expanding industries require significant amounts of water for production and cooling processes, contributing to higher consumption and pollution of freshwater sources. The growth of cities has led to increased demand for water, often leading to the over-extraction of nearby water sources and contamination from urban runoff. Industrial waste, agricultural runoff, and inadequate sewage treatment have polluted many freshwater sources, reducing the availability of clean water. Rising global temperatures are altering precipitation patterns, causing more frequent droughts in some areas and severe flooding in others, both of which affect water availability. In many parts of the world, water is wasted due to inefficient agricultural practices, leaky infrastructure, and poor water management, exacerbating the scarcity problem. To secure the future, adopting water conservation measures such as reducing waste, recycling water, improving irrigation techniques, and protecting water sources is essential.

International Day to End Violence Against Women: November 25, 1999

Violence impacts women across all ages, abilities, classes, and backgrounds without exception. It's truly shocking that 1 in 3 women around the globe will face violence at some point in their lives. Over 1 billion women and girls are confronting the harsh realities of physical or sexual abuse. Violence against women continues to be a significant issue in every country, not just in Canada. Canada is a vibrant tapestry of cultures, with immigrants coming from all corners of the globe. However, alongside their diverse backgrounds, some individuals may also

introduce challenging behaviors and criminal mindsets, which can be linked to male ego. Indeed, it has frequently been regarded as commonplace, and the worldwide culture of discrimination against women enables violence to happen without consequence. Advocating for women's rights and standing against abuses is a vital responsibility that human rights organizations should embrace daily. From advocating for better laws and services to collaborating with communities to shift discriminatory attitudes and behaviors, organizations and individuals are passionately engaged worldwide in addressing and preventing violence against women. On November 25, 1999, the United Nations General Assembly made a groundbreaking decision to combat violence against women by declaring this date as the International Day for

the Elimination of Violence Against Women. This significant day encompasses "any act of gender-based violence that results in, or is likely to result in, physical, sexual or psychological harm or suffering to women, including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, whether occurring in public or in private life." This definition is crucial as it illuminates some of the previously ambiguous aspects regarding violence. Patriarchy has created an environment where the abuse and violation of women, particularly in private spaces, is perceived as commonplace. Numerous women have shared their experiences of enduring marital rape and various forms of domestic violence in silence, as these issues were often viewed as personal or private matters between partners. Women workers have faced sexual harassment



in the workplace but often remain silent, fearing they will be labeled as liars or that the situation will be turned against them. Women's rights advocates share the incredible journey they've undertaken in their fight

to prosecute domestic violence and sexual violence against women, often occurring in the private sphere. The United Nations General Assembly resolution was proposed by the Dominican Republic, as this date

celebrates the 1960 murder of three Dominican sisters—Patria, Minerva, and María Teresa Mirabal—whose bravery and sacrifice ignited a powerful movement. The story unfolds on November 25, 1960,

when three remarkable sisters, the Mirabal sisters, faced a tragic fate at the hands of the secret police under the regime of Rafael Trujillo, the dictator of the Dominican Republic. The sisters stood out as courageous political dissidents, bravely opposing Trujillo's oppressive regime, notorious for its severe human rights violations, including the tragic massacre of thousands of Haitians. On that unforgettable day, the sisters were on their way to see their two imprisoned husbands when their car was suddenly halted by the Dominican secret police. In a calculated move, they were brutally killed, and their bodies were returned to the car, which was then shoved over a cliff to mask the murders as a tragic accident. However, the cover-up was unsuccessful. The sisters' deaths ignited a powerful movement for the Dominican resistance, leading to Trujillo's assassination within a

year. The Mirabal sisters, affectionately referred to as "Las Mariposas" or "The Butterflies," have ignited a wave of inspiration with their remarkable courage. Their martyrdom captured global attention, shining a light on the brutality of Trujillo's regime. In the decades that followed, their story emerged as a powerful emblem of defiance and the urgent call to fight against violence towards women. The International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women serves as a powerful reminder of the ongoing efforts needed to safeguard women and girls all around the world. The day champions robust legislation, bolsters women's organisations, enhances training for law enforcement, and uplifts survivors.

Awareness Drive on Hilsa Conservation at Diamond Harbour: ICAR-CIFRI's Latest Effort

Kolkata, (KCN): ICAR-Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (ICAR-CIFRI), Barrackpore, in collaboration with the Kankura Masat Social Welfare Society, had organised a sensitisation programme at Diamond Harbour, South 24 Pargana, to promote Hilsa conservation under the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG). The event, attended by over 110 fishers, aimed at raising awareness about sustainable fishing practices to conserve Hilsa fisheries and highlighting the ecological importance of Hilsa. Dr. B.K. Das, Director of ICAR-CIFRI and Principal Investigator of the NMCG project stressed the ecological and socio-cultural significance of Hilsa in his address. He urged the fishing community to avoid catching juvenile Hilsa and to refrain from using zero-mesh nets, which significantly threaten the species' sustainability. During an interactive session, Dr. Das listened to the concerns of the fishers

regarding fishing regulations and challenges. He emphasised that conserving Hilsa is not only critical for maintaining the health of river ecosystems but for preserving the cultural heritage and livelihoods of fishing communities dependent on the species. Mr. Pratangshu Bose, President, Kankura Masat Social Welfare Society, underscored the importance of community involvement in conservation efforts. He highlighted that collective action, enhanced awareness, and adherence to sustainable fishing practices are essential for maintaining Hilsa populations. A technical session was organised by the staff of the NMCG in which all aspects of hilsa conservation were discussed. The fishers were advised not to catch "KHOKA ilish", maintain the ban period on Hilsa catching and not to use nets below mesh size 110 mm. They also informed us about the work done in Farakka at Hilsa Ranching Station, like live adult hilsa ranching, artificial breeding

of hilsa, and releasing fertilized hilsa eggs in the upstream of the Farakka barrage. The NMCG team also informed them about the salient achievements like 1,30,284 adult Hilsa ranching and more than 31.65 lakhs fertilised Hilsa eggs released at Jharkhand, Murshidabad region at the upstream of Farakka barrage in river Ganga. In the interactive session, the farmers also complained about zero mesh size net used by some local fishers, resulting in the depletion of Juvenile Hilsa stock in the region in this region. The program was concluded with a vote of thanks from Dr. Santhana Kumar V., Co-PI, Scientist, ICAR-CIFRI. The event, a key initiative under the NMCG, reaffirmed the commitment of stakeholders to adopt sustainable practices and safeguard Hilsa for future generations. It is a significant step towards integrating conservation goals with the livelihoods of the fishing community.

Harsimrat K Badal calls for justice for farmers and Punjab in All Party meet on eve of parliament session

Chandigarh (JAG MOHAN THAKEN), November 24 – Senior Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader and Bathinda MP Harsimrat Kaur Badal Sunday made a fervent appeal for ensuring justice to the farmers of Punjab who were being denied minimum support price (MSP) on paddy and facing severe DAP fertilizer shortage as well as Punjabis whose right over Chandigarh had been further diluted by approval of a proposal to allocate land in the union territory to Haryana to construct a separate Vidhan Sabha, a party release states so. Participating in the all-party meeting on the eve of the winter session of parliament, Mrs Harsimrat Badal said both the centre and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) governments were responsible for the plight of the farmers of the State. "Our farmers had to sell short as they were



continuously harassed in Mandis on account of moisture content in their paddy crop. This is not all. The farmers are being denied supply of DAP fertilizer with the central government reducing the allocation of the fertilizer to Punjab by as much as Rs 1.28 lakh tonnes". She said farmers in Punjab also suffered due to the sale of spurious seed of early varieties of paddy which the AAP government failed to prevent as well as sale of fake DAP fertilizer. She also highlighted how Sheller owners in Punjab were complaining that even last year's paddy

stock had not been moved out of the State and that various State governments were rejecting rice sent to them from Punjab on flimsy grounds. The MP also reminded the centre that an MSP Committee which had been promised when the Kisan Andolan was lifted, was yet to be formed to the satisfaction of Kisan organizations. The Bathinda MP also registered her strong objection to the allocation of land in Haryana for construction of a separate Vidhan Sabha by Haryana. She said this was in violation of the Punjab Reorganization

Act even as she insisted State boundaries could be amended by parliament alone. Asserting that Chandigarh was an inalienable part of Punjab and should be transferred to the State immediately, she called for halting the allocation of land to Haryana in the union territory. Mrs Badal also delved on how democratic functioning was being thwarted in the Panjab University, Chandigarh with the government not holding elections to the varsity's Senate and moving to scrap the body altogether. She asserted the SAD would oppose this tooth and nail and demanded elections be held to the Senate immediately. The SAD leader also expressed her anguish at the delay in the release of Sikh detainees whom she referred to as Bandi Singhs. She said even though the central government had issued a notification on the 550th birth anniversary of Sri

Guru Nanak Dev ji in 2019 to release all the Bandi Singhs, the same had not been done till now. She said the central government was dragging its feet and denying parole to Bhai Balwant Singh Rajoana by not taking a decision on the latter's mercy petition for the last twelve years. Mrs Badal also called for release of all Punjab government funds which had been withheld by the centre including those for the National Health Mission, Sarv Shiksha Abhiyan, Ayushman Bharat as well as Rural Development Fund (RDF) dues. She also pressed for grant of fair compensation to land being acquired by the Amritsar-Jamnagar Expressway under the Bharat Mala project and condemned the AAP government for committing atrocities on farmers who were agitating peacefully for their right to fair compensation.

NSO Conducts Surveys In Digital Platform

New Delhi(KCN): National Statistics Office (NSO) under the MoSPI is responsible for conducting large scale sample surveys on various socio-economic subjects on All India basis. These surveys are either Household based surveys where the primary unit of enumeration is a household or Enterprise based surveys where the primary unit of enumeration is an enterprise.

These surveys are designed to meet the requirements of various stakeholder Ministries

and departments, based on recommendations from various expert groups and committees. The household surveys primarily collect information that is not available either through administrative records or through surveys conducted by domain-specific Ministries or departments.

The surveys are being conducted in digital platform using Computer Assisted Personal Interview (CAPI) or web-based application with in-built validation mechanism to ensure consistency at the stage

of data collection. Collected data are thoroughly scrutinized by the supervisory level officers to identify inconsistency, if any and necessary clarifications are obtained/corrections are incorporated.

Monitoring of survey process is also accomplished through the digital platform. Before commencement of any survey, extensive training on survey instruments as well as use of CAPI are provided to the field officials. Clarifications are also given on a regular basis on the



queries raised by field officials during the course of the survey. Further, Data quality workshops are also organised to address the

conceptual queries and monitoring the survey data quality time-to-time. Additionally, survey instruments are periodically improved to

enhance data quality. Before taking up any new survey, whether the indicators to be generated from the surveys are available from any other government survey/ administrative data sources, are extensively verified to rule out the possibility of duplication of surveys. Also, consultations with relevant line Ministries and departments are held to avoid duplication of work, effort, etc.

Regular dialogues with data users are conducted so that Ministries/ Departments can incorporate their

feedback on additional data coverage and disclosure requirements. To facilitate this, MoSPI conducts Data User Conferences after release of results of sample surveys with an aim to engage stakeholders and enhance understanding of the survey's findings, focusing on data access, interpretation, user concerns and survey methodology.

Further, to ensure transparency of survey results, unit level data of the surveys are also made available on

MoSPI's website for access by various researchers, policymakers, etc to better understand, analyze and explore the country's data.

Whale shark dies on sonapur beach

Even though Sonapur villagers tried hard to push the shark into the sea, it was not possible owing to the size and weight of the shark and large waves hitting the seashore. The giant shark eventually died after lying for a long time on the beach. A proper



autopsy will be conducted Tuesday and burial will be done on the beach, Das said. Though

it is said that sharks come near the beach after getting old, local intelligentsia alleged that

excess use of fishing trawlers and big nets to catch fish despite the fishing ban led to such incidents.

6 awarded life term for murder of RTI activist

Baliguda(KCN): A local court handed down life imprisonment to six persons, including a supari killer, after convicting them in the murder case of an RTI activist in Baliguda area of Kandhamal district, Monday. The deceased was identified as Abhimanyu Panda, a trader by profession and a Right to Information (RTI) Act activist in Baliguda area. He was opposing the usurping of Jagannath temple land and houses in Baliguda area.

As a result, some people connived against him and eliminated him by hiring a supari killer.

Apart from the punishment, District and Sessions Judge Rupashree Choudhury in Berhampur also slapped a penalty of Rs 10,000 on each of the convicts. In default, all the convicts have to undergo an additional year of imprisonment, Public Prosecutor Trilochan Parida said. The court passed the order after examining the statements of 22 witnesses and the police chargesheet, Parida added. The convicts were identified as Rama Narayan Nahak, 25, alias Golak of Haridapadar Tarsingh village, his associates

Kanhu Charan Sahu, 27, of Kharia Humki village under Aska police limits, K Biswajit Patra, 47, of Sunapanka village in Kandhamal district, and supari killer Bablu Muni, 35, of Badamuni Sahi at MG Road in Aska were produced in the court under tight security during pronouncement of the verdict. Two others, identified as S Balaji Patra, 34, of Bandhasahi in Baliguda and Rasbihari Das, 34, a resident of Bandhaguda under Baliguda police limits, were out on bail but did not appear in the court during pronouncement of the order.

After an arrest warrant was issued, police arrested them from Gailundi in Berhampur and produced in the court. According to the case diary, Panda was shot dead by the convicts, December 10, 2019. Acting on a complaint filed by the deceased's cousin Nirmal Sahu, police registered a case and arrested Golak, his associate Kanhu Charan, key conspirator K Biswajit, S Balaji and Rasbihari, December 29, 2019 and produced them in the court. Later supari killer Bablu was also produced in the court.

World Bank Supports New Project to Revitalize Forests, Enhance Climate Resilience for People in India's Tripura, Nagaland States

NEW DELHI, Nov. 26, 2024: The World Bank's Board of Executive Directors on Monday, Nov. 25, 2024, approved a new project to support more than 700,000 people to manage forest landscapes better and enhance forest value chains in more than 400 villages across Tripura and Nagaland. With almost 1.5 million hectares, forests form a vital part of the rural economy in Nagaland and Tripura, providing livelihood to significant tribal populations. However, over the past decade, the states have experienced reductions in forest cover, threatening

biodiversity, and the well-being of forest-dependent communities. The \$225.5 million Enhancing Landscape and Ecosystem Management (ELEMENT) Project will help conserve and restore over 100,000 hectares of forest thus enhancing landscape-based value chains for economic transformation while avoiding almost 435,000 tons of carbon emissions per year. The Project will also strengthen soil conservation and improve water availability. "The Project will contribute to leveraging forests for private sector driven job creation in non-timber economic

activities, enhancing the carbon sink capacity of the forest, and ultimately contributing to economic growth and social well-being in Tripura and Nagaland," said Augustine Tano Kouame, the World Bank's Country Director for India. The ELEMENT project aims to open up economic opportunities for communities through forest produce such as agarwood, bamboo and honey in partnership with the private sector. It will also help to enhance national parks and protected areas, as well as develop nature-based tourism

facilities. The Project aims to create 60,000 jobs for youth and women, by promoting forest-based entrepreneurship through skills training in areas such as hospitality and training for nature guides. The Project will take an integrated and holistic landscape approach on forest management. "This goes beyond traditional forests to include areas like grasslands, wetlands, and farmlands to maximize community benefits," said Pyush Dogra and Raj Ganguly, the Task Team Leaders for the project. "This will improve climate resilience of rural and

forest-dependent communities and increase their livelihoods." This financing comes on the heels of the Bank's \$43 million financing to support similar activities in the sister state of Meghalaya. The loan from the International Bank of Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) has a final maturity of 12 years with a grace period of 4.5 years. The Project will also benefit from a complementary Global Partnership for Sustainable and Resilient Landscapes (PROGREEN) grant in the amount of \$2.4 million.

'Be nice, disciplined and make run-making difficult' - Bumrah's message to the team

New Delhi: India romped to a massive 295-run win on Monday (November 25) over Australia in Perth, outperforming the hosts in all facets of the game. But at the innings break on Day 1, it looked all doom and gloom for the visitors as the batting order collapsed to be bowled out for 150. It began to raise questions on whether India would pose a noteworthy challenge to Australia Down Under. And they did more than that, as the bowlers led by Jasprit Bumrah had Australia on the mat in the first innings, bowling them out for 104. Bumrah said that he passed on the message to his bowlers to be accurate in line and length and not be too desperate to go for wickets. Debutant Harshit Rana and Mohammed Siraj paid heed to their skipper's words, and by the end of Day 1, the trio had picked up seven wickets for only 67 runs. "The message was that sometimes when you are

bowled out for a lower score, you can be a little too desperate and you could go pole hunting. So that was the message that when you try too much over here, it doesn't really help and the run-scoring goes high. "So the message was, we will be nice and disciplined and we will make run-making as difficult as we can. Because that is what has worked in the past over here as well. And when we are able to do that, that gives us a lot of success." He credited the bowlers as well for finding the right lengths and not getting distracted with the extra bounce on offer on Australian decks. The bowlers stuck to bowling at a little fuller than the back-of-a-length mark and weren't induced to bowl short to the batters. "Usually in Perth, there could be a scenario where when we come from India, the bounce is not as prominent as what is here. So you tend to bowl a little

short, you can get excited by the bounce and you can't find the length. It looks good when you bowl a back of length delivery and the batsman gets beaten, but the batsman is still there. "So you have to find the right length. And as I said, we knew that if you make them play more, there is enough in the wicket to give us assistance. So we were focussing on our strengths. We, as a bowling unit, do get a lot of dismissals with bowled LB(W) and caught behind. So we realised that you have to stick to your strengths and find the right length over here. And we were able to do that." Bumrah led India to a historic win in Perth in only his second Test match as captain, leading from the front with the ball in hand. He ended the match with figures of 8 for 72 and was duly named as the Player of the Match. He was pleased with his first win as captain and always banked on providing his insights to the team in case



of any pressure situations. "Obviously, a special win, first win as a captain. Very happy about that. And more happy with the performance of the team. That yes, we were put under pressure and then the character was shown. Obviously, whenever tough scenarios come, I look at myself and how can I contribute. Even when I am not the captain. So whenever tough scenarios are there, I look at answers that... Okay, if I am going to

bowl at this moment, what can I do? So in this moment, we were a new side. "So I automatically wanted to put myself in tough scenarios whenever we needed to do something. I was trying to put myself in that tough scenario to make the job a little bit easier for the new guys coming in. Because it is not very easy in the first goal to take a lot of responsibility." In the post match interview with the official broadcaster, Bumrah

was thrilled with the performance and how the team handled the pressure after being bowled out for 150 in their first innings after having won the toss and opting to bat first. The fast bowler took notes from when he played on the same ground in 2018 on how the pitch would play. He felt that the pace and bounce of the deck would gradually increase after a few sessions of play which was visible as Australia struggled in their two outings with the bat under the fading light.

Bumrah added that he wanted his team to have faith in themselves after India's first innings and emphasised that if a player has faith in themselves, special outcomes can be achieved. He also credited the 10-12 day preparation camp India had leading into the first Test which allowed them to also get acclimatised with the conditions. "Yeah, very happy with the beginning you know, we were put under pressure in the first innings but the way we responded after that, I'm really proud of the team. I played here in 2018 so I remembered that when you start here the wicket is a little soft and it becomes quicker and quicker later. Obviously, this wicket was a little less spicy than the last one I played on here. But we were really well prepared so I was just telling everyone to have faith in their process and ability because over here at this moment, we had an opportunity to do something special. So on a given day, experience

does matter but if you have faith in your ability, you can do something special." He briefly touched on opener Yashasvi Jaiswal and deemed his 161 as the batter's best Test hundred so far. He credited the change in technique after Jaiswal was dismissed for a duck in the first innings and how he curbed his attacking nature and strokeplay. "Jaiswal, I think out of all his innings, he has had a great start to his career but the last innings was probably his best Test innings so far. He left the ball, he has an attacking nature but he left the ball well and played long." Virat Kohli was the second centurion for India with his 30th Test ton and despite a string of poor scores, Bumrah sided with the batter and said you can't judge a batter's form completely if they play on challenging wickets and the skipper hopes that this knock helps Kohli build confidence leading up to the remaining Tests.

RCB's latest overseas star Jacob Bethell handed England Test debut vs New Zealand

London: England's young all-rounder Jacob Bethell is set to make his much-anticipated Test debut against New Zealand in the opening match of the three-Test series at Hagley Oval on Thursday. The 21-year-old, who bats left-handed and bowls left-arm spin, has been drafted into the XI at number three, marking his first appearance at that position in first-class cricket. Bethell's Test debut comes on the heels of his lucrative acquisition by the Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) in the IPL auction. Purchased for ₹2.6 crore, Bethell drew bidding interest from Sunrisers Hyderabad and Punjab Kings before RCB secured his services. His



hard-hitting abilities and versatility make him a valuable addition to the star-studded franchise. Bethell's inclusion comes as part of a reshuffled England side, with regular wicketkeeper Jordan Cox sidelined due to a thumb injury. Ollie Pope will don the gloves, batting at number six, while Bethell slots into the pivotal first-drop position ahead of veteran Joe

Root, who is set to play his 150th Test. Born in Barbados and now representing England, Bethell has been turning heads with his explosive performances in limited-overs cricket. The left-handed batter recently showcased his potential during England's T20I series against the West Indies, where he struck two half-centuries, raising his T20I tally to 173 runs

at an impressive average of 57.66 and a strike rate of 167.96 across seven matches. His domestic T20 stats are equally promising, with 909 runs from 52 matches at a strike rate of 142.47, including six half-centuries. Despite these accomplishments, the transition to the longest format poses a fresh challenge for Bethell, who averages 25.44 in first-class cricket and is yet to score a century in any format. England's Test line-up reflects adjustments prompted by Cox's injury. Pope, who has prior experience as a wicketkeeper in Tests, will temporarily fill the role until a specialist replacement arrives from the UK. Bethell's

Both KL Rahul and Axar Patel will lead Delhi Capitals: Co-owner Parth Jindal

New Delhi: Delhi Capitals co-owner Parth Jindal said that KL Rahul and Axar Patel will captain the side in the upcoming season of the Indian Premier League. DC bought Rahul for Rs 14 crore in the IPL mega auction. KL Rahul and Axar Patel will lead Delhi Capitals in the 2025 season of the Indian Premier League, said DC co-owner Parth Jindal. The franchise bought KL Rahul for a sum of Rs 14 crore in the IPL auction on Sunday, November 24. DC beat bids from KKR, RCB and CSK to buy the player. Speaking via an official press release, Jindal said that both players will guide the junior members of the team and will be expected to captain the side next season. The

franchise signed 9 players on Day 1 of the IPL mega auction buying superstars like Mitchell Starc, Harry Brook and KL Rahul. The team also activated the Right To Match (RTM) card for Jake Fraser-McGurk at Rs 9 crore. "We were looking for stability in the top order, someone with experience who can build the innings. And, I think KL Rahul, given his record in the IPL, he's someone who's consistently given more than 400 runs every season. I think with the Kotla wicket, it is going to suit his game. We're very excited to have him," Parth Jindal said after the auction. "We have a very young batting lineup. Both KL and Axar are going to lead them and are going

to guide them. KL's batting and experience will be a vital cog in the wheel," he further explained. Full list of sold and unsold players on Day 1 of IPL auction 2025 Englishman Harry Brook was snapped up for Rs 6.25 crore, while Indian players T Natarajan and Karun Nair were acquired for Rs 10.75 crore and Rs 50 lakh, respectively, in the latter half of the day. Delhi Capitals also acquired the services of domestic players Sameer Rizvi (Rs 95 lakh) and Ashutosh Sharma (Rs 3.80 crore) respectively along with experienced pacer Mohit Sharma (Rs 2.20 crore). Jindal confirmed that DC will hunt for more bowlers on Day 2 of the IPL auction.

Vaibhav Suryavanshi's father quashes age fraud rumours after historic IPL deal

New Delhi: Vaibhav Suryavanshi made history by becoming the youngest player in IPL ever. The 13-year-old's father Sanjiv Suryavanshi quashed all rumours surrounding his age fraud. India batter Vaibhav Suryavanshi etched his name in the history books as he became the youngest player to be sold in the history of IPL auction on Monday, November 25 in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. Suryavanshi was sold for a whopping Rs 1.10 crore to Rajasthan Royals (RR) after an intense bidding war with Delhi Capitals (DC). Hence, the 13-year-old

will be seen playing in the grandest T20 league being the youngest player ever in the history of the tournament. Following his record-breaking bid, Vaibhav's father Sanjiv was elated with his son's achievement and also quashed rumours of any age fraud being done by him giving open challenge for age test. "When he was 8 and half years old he first appeared for BCCI bone test. He has already played India U-19. We don't fear anyone. He can again undergo age test," Sanjiv told PTI. Born in Samastipur, Bihar, Suryavanshi recently hit the fastest



hundred by an Indian in Under-19 Tests, achieving the milestone against the

Australia Under-19 team at the MA Chidambaram Stadium in Chennai in

October 2024. The 13-year-old smashed his hundred in just 58 balls in

his maiden red-ball match for the India Under-19 team.

Earlier, in January 2024, he became the fourth-youngest Indian to make his debut in a recorded first-class match at the age of 12 years and 284 days in the Ranji Trophy 2023-24 against Mumbai. His father hailed his son's achievement calling him the 'son of Bihar'. He also recalled days of hardships as he stood beside his son in his formative years. Suryavanshi will be guided by Rahul Dravid in Rajasthan "Woh ab sirf humra bituwa nahi pura Bihar ka bituwa hai (He is not just my son now but entire Bihar's son). My son has worked hard. At the age of 8 years, he

excelled at U-16 district trials. I would take him for his cricket coaching to Samastipur and then take him back," he added. "Not just investment, it's big investment. Aapko kya bataye humne toh apna zameen tak bech diya. Abhi bhi halat pura sudhra nahi (I have sold my land. Financial issues are still there)," he further said. Meanwhile, Suryavanshi will get to work with one of the finest minds of Indian cricket, Rahul Dravid, who returned to the Rajasthan Royals as their head coach. He will get to share the dressing room with Sanju Samson, Dhruv Jurel, Riyan Parag, Jofra Archer among others.
