Odisha BJP govt has renamed 24 schemes launched by previous BJD regime: CM Majhi tells Assembly

Bhubaneswar (KCN): The Odisha BJP government has renamed 21 schemes launched by the previous BJD regime, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi told the assembly Thursday.

The BJP government took oath June 12 after defeating the 24-year-old Naveen Patnaik-led BJD government in the assembly elections.

In a written reply to a query by BJD legislator Tusharkanti Behera, the Chief Minister said the state government has renamed 21 existing schemes and launched seven new ones.

According to a statement, the BJP government has

rebranded eight schemes that were named after the late Biju Patnaik, father of former Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik. The eight renamed schemes are Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana (BSKY), Biju Pucca Ghar Yojana, Biju Setu Yojana, Biju Yuva Sashaktikaran Yojana (distribution of laptop), Biju Saharanchal Vidyutikaran Yojana

(BSVY), Biju KBK, Biju Kandhamal 'o' Gajapati Yojana and Biju Sishu Surakhya Yojana (BSSY). Similarly, the new government has also renamed Krushak Assistance for Livelihood and Income Augmentation (Kalia), the flagship cash incentive scheme for farmers launched by the previous BJD government ahead of the 2019 elections. KALIA has been branded as CM-KISAN in line with the PM-KISAN scheme implemented by the Modi government at the Centre. KALIA Scholarship and 'Ama Odisha Nabin Odisha' (AONO) schemes have been renamed as 'Krishi Vidya Nidhi Yojana' and 'Viksit Gaon Viksit Odisha', Majhi said. The 'Mo School Abhiyan' and 'Mo College Abhiyan' schemes are now called 'Panchasakha Sikhya Setu' and 'Ama Gaurav Ama College'. Among other schemes, Livestock Health & Disease Control

(LHDC), BSKY and BSSY have been rebranded as Goal for Management and Treatment of Animals (GOMATA), Gopabandhu Jana Arogya Yojana and Jashoda. The Chief Minister also informed the House that the government has launched seven new schemes such as Godabarisha Mishra Adarsha Prathamika Vidyalaya, Corpus Fund for Sri Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA), Samrudha Krushaka Yojana, Subhadra Yojana, Madho Singh Haath Kharch, Odia Asmita Corpus Fund, and the Establishment of Paediatric Cancer Facilities.

Punjab, Haryana govts slow in acting against farmers burning stubble: Supreme Court



New Delhi (KCN): The Supreme Court Thursday said the Punjab and Haryana governments have been slow in taking action against farmers burning stubble and a mechanism was required to be devised for a long-term solution to the problem.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih said a machinery had to be set in motion to ensure 24/7 data was available.

"We propose to hear all the parties exhaustively. It is because of sowing done belatedly all this problem is happening. We want to go to the root of the matter and issue directions. Something needs to be done. Every year this problem cannot arise. From the data available,

we can say both states are very slow in taking action against farmers," the bench remarked.

The apex court said everyone was "smart enough" to understand during certain times data was collected and they did not burn stubble at that time.

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, representing the Centre, said ISRO was working on the protocol.

The bench took note of a media report related to Punjab wherein a land record officer and president of the Sangrur Block Patwari Union, reportedly admitted to advising farmers to burn stubble after 4pm to avoid satellite detection. Calling it "very serious" if the media report was to be

believed, the court directed Punjab state officials to not permit farmers to take advantage of the fact that activities were being detected during the particular few hours of the day.

"The Punjab government should immediately issue instructions to all officers not to indulge in any such activities," it said. The Centre previously opposed in the top court a proposal to form a committee of former apex court judges to oversee the implementation of measures to curb stubble burning, a key contributor to Delhi-NCR's air pollution.

In an order on November 18, the top court directed the Centre and the CAQM to procure data on farm fires using geostationary satellites, as opposed to NASA's polar-orbiting satellites, to ensure real-time monitoring. The court noted existing data from NASA satellites was limited to specific time windows and directed the involvement of ISRO in utilising stationary satellites for comprehensive day-long monitoring.

Bhubaneswar (KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Thursday said the state is set to become a powerhouse of sports with focus on producing large number of national and international athletes.

Speaking at the inauguration of 'Utsaha,' a state-level sports festival organised by the Odisha State Child Protection Society (OSCPS) at Kalinga Stadium here, Majhi emphasised the importance of early sports training, citing the example of the US, Russia, China, Japan, and Brazil, where children begin athletic training as early as 3 to 4 years old.

36 mins ago A total of 580 kids from 165 childcare institutions are participating in the festival, which will conclude Friday. Majhi also highlighted the state's initiatives to provide specialised sports coaching at the school level and encouraged students to explore their innate talents to excel in sports.

He urged parents to broaden their aspirations for their children, emphasising that sports can now be considered a viable profession, alongside traditional careers in medicine, engineering, and civil services. Majhi also underscored the state government's investment in developing sports infrastructure and nurturing talent through sports hostels across districts, including Kalinga Stadium. Many international athletes from the state have launched their careers while staying in these hostels, he noted.

Before taking the oath, Soren, dressed in a white kurta, pyjama, and 'Nehru jacket,' sought blessings from JMM supremo and his father, Shibu Soren, his mother Rupi Soren, along with his wife Kalpana Soren and two sons. After the ceremony, he paid floral tributes to tribal icons such as Birsa Munda and Sido-Kanho and rushed to Project Building where he began his fourth innings as CM. Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated Soren on his re-election as CM, extending his best wishes for his tenure. "Congratulations to Shri Hemant Soren on taking oath as Jharkhand CM. Best wishes to him for his tenure ahead," PM Modi posted on X. Pandian makes public appearance after five months, attends wedding of BJD leader's daughter

More than five months after the BJD's defeat in the Odisha Assembly elections, bureaucrat turned politician VK Pandian made his first public appearance at a wedding function of a BJD leader in Cuttack. Pandian had June 9 announced to withdraw from active politics after BJD's electoral defeat in Odisha Assembly elections.

He was seen at a wedding function at Trisulia in Cuttack Wednesday night. It was the wedding of former BJD MLA Pravat Biswal's daughter and the sister of sitting Cuttack-

Choudwar MLA Souvik Biswal. Pandian did not have any media interaction during his visit to the wedding function Wednesday night, but speculations are rife about his return to active politics. Though Pandian withdrew from active politics, he remains a close aide of former Odisha chief minister Naveen Patnaik. The Tamil Nadu-born IAS officer had opted for voluntary retirement in October 2023 and officially joined the BJD November 26, 2023. He was the star campaigner of the BJD and toured the nook and corner of the state while campaigning for the regional party.

The bench then hoped that the government would remain cautious about protecting the law and order situation and lives and properties of the people of Bangladesh, the newspaper added.

"ISKCON has been operating in Bangladesh as a radical organisation, engaging in activities designed to provoke communal unrest," the notice alleged. Citing a book by former Bangladeshi intelligence officials, the notice alleges that ISKCON has been promoting religious events "with the intent of inciting sectarian violence," "imposing its beliefs on traditional Hindu communities," and forcibly recruiting members from lower Hindu castes, the newspaper added. Separately, a group of

Supreme Court lawyers sent a legal notice to Bangladesh government on Wednesday seeking a ban on ISKCON describing it as a "radical organisation." The notice, sent by Al Mamun Russell on behalf of 10 lawyers, also demanded prosecution of those responsible for Advocate Islam's murder. The Dhaka Tribune newspaper said quoting the notice.

The court had asked the attorney general to inform it about the steps taken by the government regarding ISKCON's recent activities, according to The Daily Star. Hindu leader Chinmoy Krishna Das, who was arrested this week, was earlier expelled from ISKCON. His arrest triggered clashes on Tuesday during which Advocate Saiful Islam, an assistant public prosecutor, was killed. 

Closure order issued for Aruha quarry

Jajpur(KCN): The state government has issued directives to shut down illegal black stone mining and crusher units on the Aruha hill of Jajpur district. A letter to this effect was sent by the state's Steel and Mines department to the Jajpur Collector and the Deputy Director of Mines (DDM). The directive follows a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed in the Orissa High Court (W.P.(C) PIL No. 2803/2024), which highlighted violations by illegal miners who ignored regulatory guidelines. Specifically, illegal mining at Aruha has been linked to rising cases of kidney disease in nearby villages. Additionally, schools near the mines have reported that students are suffering from various health issues due to the operations. Acting on the

PIL, Under Secretary Rajesh Prasad Nayak directed local authorities to halt black stone extraction and crusher units operating in the area.

However, despite the government's clear orders, local sources allege that political influence continues to shield illegal operators raising questions on the enforcement of these directives. On the other hand, the PIL petitioner has reportedly faced life-threatening attacks. Ten days after the incident, Dharmasala police registered Case No. 824/2024 but have yet to arrest the accused persons. Locals alleged that the police are protecting the perpetrators, fuelling public frustration. Residents and activists remain sceptical whether

these closure orders will effectively curb illegal mining or whether enforcement will falter under political pressure. Under the directive of the Director General of Mines Safety (DGMS), it was mandated that leaseholders failing to comply with legal requirements—such as appointing mine managers or obtaining blasting permissions—should not be issued e-transit passes (e-TP) for their mines. Despite this, reports indicate that illegal mining activities continue daily at several locations, including Aruha and other quarries.

In response, Bipin Kumar Behera of Aruha village has filed a PIL in the high court. It was alleged November 17 that leaseholder Manoj Kumar Samal sent a



group of persons to physically assault Behera, a matter that was subsequently reported to the police. A case was registered at the Dharmasala police station against Manoj Kumar Samal, Nirakar Samal, Suresh Samal, and Pramod Samal. However,

questions have been raised over the efficiency of the police, as none of the accused has been arrested so far. People have expressed concern over the lack of action by the police, with many

urging legal recourse. Separately, the District Deputy Director of Mines (DDM) ordered the closure of 26 black stone quarries in the district November 17. Despite these orders, allegations have emerged that Manoj Samal has been transporting soil, murrams, and black stone from the Aruha mines over the past three days.

Similar violations have been reported from other quarries such as Rahadpur, and Bichhakhandi, where leaseholders are allegedly disregarding DDM's directives and

illegally transporting stone day and night. Additionally, there are claims that preparations are underway for illegal stone extraction at another quarry on Aruha hill. Villagers have provided information regarding these activities, further highlighting the blatant disregard for DGMS and Mining department directives. When contacted, Jajpur DDM Jayaprakash Nayak stated that regular raids are being conducted to address illegal mining. He assured that necessary action would be taken against the ongoing illegal operations at Aruha hill.

Woman turns beacon of hope for Dongria Kondhs



Rayagada(KCN): In the foothills of Niyamgiri in Rayagada district, Lahari Kundika, a 44-year-old resident of Khambeasi village in Bissamcuttack block, has turned into a ray of hope for the underprivileged Dongria Kondh tribal community. Despite being uneducated, Lahari is actively raising awareness among the tribals about education, health, and development. Concerned about the decline of Dongria Kondh culture, including their iconic Kapdaganda shawls and traditional

dance, Lahari is doing her bit to revive these traditions. She has trained over 500 young women in weaving Kapdaganda shawls and performing traditional dances. Lahari's efforts stem from her understanding of how lack of awareness keeps the Dongria Kondh community on the fringes of mainstream society. She has taken it upon herself to bridge this gap. After finishing her household chores, Lahari spends her days working on the farmlands in Niyamgiri foothills and dedicates two to three days a week to visit nearby villages. Moreover, she conducts evening gatherings every Sunday to educate residents about the harms of child marriage, substance abuse, blind faith and superstitions. She also emphasises the importance of accessing government schemes, ensuring fair prices for their goods, and promoting education, particularly for girls.

In addition, Lahari teaches villagers about healthy practices, urging them to use government

health services for safe deliveries and other medical needs. She advocates for gender equality, girls' education and the importance of maintaining cleanliness and hygiene. Lahari's reason behind the commitment is personal—she regrets being unable to educate her eldest daughter due to her own lack of awareness. This realisation motivates her to work tirelessly to educate others. Supported by her family, which includes two sons and three daughters, Lahari has extended her influence on over 1,000 men and women in her community. Despite making a significant impact, Lahari acknowledges that economic hardship and other challenges often hinder the community's development. However, she remains undeterred, stating that collective awareness is the first step towards progress.

4 artistes in race for Kansa role

Bargarh(KCN): Dhanu Yatra, the grand open-air theatre festival, is set to commence January 3, 2025 and will continue for 11 days. Selection of the actor who will portray Kansa next year is now underway. According to sources from the district administration, one of the four actors who were ranked between second and fifth position in the previous audition will be selected for the role. The final decision on who will play Kansa in the upcoming edition of the festival will be revealed soon.

Traditionally, an actor is selected every three years to play the character of the demon king in the Dhanu Yatra. Hrusikesh Bhoi, who portrayed Kansa in the last two editions, had his final opportunity to reprise the role this year. However, controversies surrounding him have led to his exclusion. Reports surfaced that Bhoi, while working as a driver for the district health



department's hearse service, faced allegations of demanding and accepting bribe for the transportation of a body, October 7. This led to his suspension from duty and Bhatli police filed a criminal case against him. Following public outrage and demands for his removal, the Dhanu Yatra Advisory Committee and the working council decided November 22 to

bar Bhoi from participating in the festival. To replace him, four previous contenders—Artatranra Sunani, Jagadananda Mishra, Bhubaneswar Pradhan, and Sushil Kumar Meher—have been shortlisted. These artistes will participate in the selection process, the Dhanu Yatra Committee announced Monday in a press

Spinner Sultana Khatun, who claimed three wickets, addressed the media in her place.

When asked if this was the best batting performance by a Bangladeshi batter in women's ODIs, Sultana responded: "No, she (Sharmin) can do better than this. I hope she will perform even better in the next match," she added.

Sultana also commented on the pitch, describing it as unusually batting-friendly for Mirpur, which is typically slow and low. "I didn't feel today's wicket was slow and low. in Brisbane that begins four days after the scheduled end of the Adelaide Test.

Meanwhile, Webster's call-up is a reward for his excellent performances in first class cricket over the last two seasons. Last year, he became only the second player in Sheffield Shield history - after Sir Garfield Sobers - to score more than 900 runs and

take 30 wickets in a season. This season, he's already hit 448 runs at an average of 56 along with his 16 wickets in first class cricket. This includes knocks of 61* and 46* and figures of 3 for 19 and 3 for 49 against the visiting India A side this month.

"To get a few runs and

wickets (for Australia A) was pleasing against a

strong Indian side," Webster said. "Any time you're playing 'A' cricket, it's one step below Test level, so it does hold you in good stead. To get the call from 'Bails' (selector George Bailey) at the end of the NSW game was a really proud moment and I can't wait to get stuck in.

"There's a tight turnaround between the Adelaide and Gabba Test so I think (I'm there) just to have some cover there for that middle-order role, whichever way they go." express displeasure over the ongoing uncertainty. This, it can be confirmed, is independent of the questions the PCB had sent to the ICC after the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) said the Men in Blue would not travel to Pakistan.

It is being reported, meanwhile, that the broadcaster opposes any proposal to decouple India and Pakistan into separate groups, which would allow Pakistan to play all its league fixtures at home. Having India and Pakistan in the same group would require the hosts to travel to another country for their match against India under the hybrid arrangement, a plan the ICC is most likely to adopt during its November 29

meeting. There may be some truth to these points, as they highlight the context of the 50-over format, which has been steadily and rapidly losing its appeal to the shorter T20 version. Worldwide debates have been questioning the relevance of ODIs altogether. The loudest argument in favour of the 50-over



format remains the quadrennial World Cup, which is a huge commercial success, with the India-Pakistan clash being its blue ribbon fixture. While the World Cup itself features 10 teams, a Champions Trophy with just two teams less, would make little sense without an India-Pakistan match, particularly when there are efforts to pump oxygen into the ODI format. It is being contended that if the ICC aims to revive the 50-over Champions Trophy - last played in 2017 - an India-Pakistan clash would be its most significant booster, a potential elixir for its success.

Notably, the ICC had previously rejected proposals to convert the Champions Trophy to a Twenty20 format. Given the ongoing uncertainty surrounding the tournament's draw and fixtures, there is a growing debate over whether a shorter format might have been more logically, operationally, and commercially viable.

It is now the biggest challenge for the ICC to convince a defiant Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) to embrace the hybrid model, which is expected to be overwhelmingly backed at the ICC board meeting on Friday. The PCB's rigid stance of not accepting it means the Champions Trophy will have implications since

Financial repercussions likely as ICC misses CT25 contractual deadline

New Delhi: As the Champions Trophy controversy nears its conclusion, with a final decision expected in the next two days, new dimensions are unfolding. Notably, the International Cricket Council (ICC) may have missed the contractual deadline to release the tournament's fixtures and schedule, which it is required to provide to all its stakeholders at least 90 days before the event. That deadline has passed, leaving many of its stakeholders badly affected, chiefly Disney Star or merged Jio Star, the ICC's media partners and the biggest bankrollers of global cricket. The broadcaster's inability to fully exploit the

commercially is a significant and hitherto unknown facet of the entire Champions Trophy saga. The ICC would not comment on matters that are commercial but time is running out for its business partners, stakeholders as well as the hosts. There may be some commercial impact for this delay. In a separate yet relevant development, the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB), the designated hosts, has taken serious exception to the prolonged delay in resolving the crisis.
