

Donald Trump Becomes First Republican To Win Popular Vote In 20 Years

New Delhi, (KCN): Donald Trump has become the first Republican in two decades to secure the popular vote in the US presidential elections. The former president has reclaimed the White House, potentially becoming the first Republican to secure the popular vote since George W Bush in 2004. In the 2004 US Presidential elections, Bush won 62,040,610 votes and 286 electoral votes compared to Democratic nominee John Kerry who secured 59,028,444 votes and 251 electoral votes. According to election

voter data of the past 20 years, Barack Obama achieved the largest popular vote victory with 69.5 million votes (52.9 per cent) and a substantial 365 electoral votes in 2008. His second term in 2012, while still a decisive victory, saw a slight decline in popular vote percentage to 51.1 per cent and in electoral votes to 332. Contrastingly, the 2016 election saw an unusual outcome with Donald Trump winning the presidency with 304 electoral votes but only 46.1 per cent of the popular vote, while Hillary Clinton won 48.2

per cent of the popular vote - a 2.1 per cent margin higher than Trump's and yet insufficient for victory. In 2020, Joe Biden secured both a clear popular and electoral majority, winning 51.3 per cent of the popular vote and 306 electoral votes. In comparison, Trump won 74,223,975 votes and his electoral votes stood at 232. Trump gained early leads in crucial swing states, including North Carolina and Georgia. But the biggest prize of all was winning the crucial battleground state of Pennsylvania. With 19



electoral votes, Pennsylvania victory puts Trump closer to the White House. These wins, combined with his strong showing in traditionally Republican

strongholds like Texas and Florida, gave Trump a critical advantage in the electoral vote count. As results streamed in, Vice President Kamala Harris's campaign found

itself scrambling to regain momentum. Despite strong performances in Democratic strongholds, her path to victory seemed to narrow significantly. Harris's

campaign headquarters in Washington, DC advised supporters that the clearest path to victory would now hinge on the so-called "Blue Wall" states: Michigan, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin. With Pennsylvania now gone to Trump, all eyes are on the other two states. Election night saw dramatically different scenes in Washington DC and at Trump's Mar-a-Lago resort in Florida. At Howard University, a historically Black college in the nation's capital, excitement quickly waned as results began showing Trump's

mounting lead. Harris supporters, many of whom expected her to deliver a landmark victory as the first Black and South Asian woman in the White House, expressed concern and anxiety. Trump supporters at a Palm Beach viewing party on the other hand celebrated early victories. If confirmed, Trump's victory would make him the oldest president at the time of inauguration. His return to the White House would also make him the second president ever to serve non-consecutive terms, a feat only previously accomplished by Grover Cleveland in the 19th century.

"Important step towards PM's dream of Viksit Bharat" : Dharmendra on Vidyalaxmi scheme

New Delhi, November 6(KCN): The Union Cabinet's approval of the Pradhan Mantri Vidyalaxmi Yojana marks a pivotal development in making higher education more accessible for meritorious students across India. Announcing the scheme, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan highlighted it as a cornerstone in fulfilling the Prime Minister's vision of a 'Viksit Bharat,' or developed India. The scheme, aimed at

providing education loans up to ₹10 lakh for students admitted to high-ranking institutions, will support around one lakh students annually. A total of ₹3,600 crore has been allocated for the scheme, which promises collateral-free and guarantor-free loans for eligible students. To further ease the financial burden, students from families with an annual income up to ₹8 lakh will receive a 3% interest subsidy, with full interest subsidies for those from



families earning up to ₹4.5 lakh annually. Union Information Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw emphasized that no deserving student should

miss out on higher education due to financial limitations.

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Former BJD MLA Sunanda Das and her husband Debendra Das on Wednesday joined the BJP at the saffron party's state headquarters here. Das, who was the legislator of Barampura constituency in Jajpur district from 2019 to 2024, resigned from the opposition BJD last week. She was denied a party ticket to contest the elections this time. The couple joined the saffron party in the presence of state BJP president Manmohan



Samal and other senior leaders. While resigning from the party last week, Das had alleged that government officials had distributed BJD tickets during the simultaneous elections in

Odisha earlier this year.

“We (ticket aspirants) were asked to meet officials for tickets. I had met two IPS officers and was assured of a party ticket. However, they denied me a ticket at the last moment,” she had told a local TV channel.

Das also alleged that she was neglected in the BJD and was never invited to any of the functions at the party office, Sankha Bhawan.

Silver ornaments worth Rs 10 lakh looted from Odisha's Tara Tarini temple



Berhampur(KCN): Silver ornaments worth nearly Rs 10 lakh were looted from Tara Tarini temple, a famous Shakti shrine, in Odisha's Ganjam district, police said Wednesday.

The jewellery looted from the hilltop temple in Purusottampur includes the crowns of the deities, ceremonial umbrellas and masks of the deities. Though the miscreants attempted to loot the main 'hundi' (donation box), they could not succeed, a police officer said.

They, however, looted money by breaking open two other hundis. The exact amount of the money looted is yet to be ascertained, the officer said.

The miscreants entered the sanctum sanctorum of the temple, located around 780 feet above sea level, by breaking at least three locks, including that on the main entrance.

A watchman, deployed by the temple management committee, was allegedly sleeping when the incident took place.

The incident came to light early on Wednesday when two priests first noticed that some locks were broken and some ornaments were missing. They informed some senior servitors and the police, said Bapuji Rana, one of the servitors.

Odisha: Woman, daughter killed in fire in Sambalpur district

Sambalpur(KCN): A woman and her daughter were killed allegedly after a fire broke out in their house in Odisha's Sambalpur district, a police officer said Wednesday. The incident took place in the Hatapada area under the limits of Sambalpur Sadar Police Station of the district Tuesday night when they were sleeping, the police officer said. The deceased were identified as Snehalata Dikshit (90) and Sairendri Dikshit (62). The old woman and her 62-year-old daughter used to stay on the first floor of a two-storey building. Her son lives on the ground floor of the building with his family, the officer said. On seeing the blaze on the first floor of the building between 10.30pm and 11pm Tuesday, locals intimated the police. A police team reached the spot and found that Sairendri Dikshit was engulfed in flames. The police doused the fire but she was dead by that time, Sub-divisional police officer of Sambalpur Sadar, Tophan Bag, said.

Some films run on good storylines. Some, on star power. But when you see Nawazuddin Siddiqui headlining a project, and that too, a cop thriller, you can't help but take note. That's where Zee5's latest offering, 'Rautu Ka Raaz' comes in. Set in the small, picturesque village of Rautu Ki Beli, the film is about a lazy murder investigation with sharp twists and even sharper turns. Let's decode if the film is worth your time.

Rautu, a small town in Uttarakhand, has witnessed no murders in the last 15 years. As a result, policemen in the village are extremely laid-back. One fine



morning, a sleepy Nawazuddin Siddiqui (SHO Deepak Negi) gets a call from Rajesh Kumar (sub-inspector Dimri) about the murder of a warden at a boarding school for the visually impaired. What they initially took for a natural death, turned out to be a never-ending rabbit hole with suspects, murders, disturbing incidents, politics and power. Nawazuddin Siddiqui leads the ship by playing the rowdy SHO Deepak Negi. By rowdy, we don't

mean the typical Bollywood masala film rowdy. He is intelligent, witty, knows when to say no, can get things done, disobeys seniors by standing firm on his grit and is unabashedly himself. He surely takes the bigger piece of the cake. Nawazuddin's comic timing, dialogue delivery, and demeanour have always taken him places. Thankfully, that continues in 'Rautu Ka Raaz' too. The film shines, thanks to its stellar star cast.

Everyone is perfect in their respective parts. There's Rajesh Kumar as sub-inspector Dimri, carrying on the film's weight with his acting prowess and remarkable bro-code with Nawazuddin's character. This duo will make you believe in good cops.

Other supporting actors such as Atul Tiwari and Narayani Shastri (warden) do a decent job with their limited screen presence.

'Rautu Ka Raaz' has nothing that you have never seen. However, it is real. And it gets more wholesome as you near the second half. The film introduced real-life visually impaired characters, who make blink-and-miss appearances, maintaining credibility.

It is scheduled to be released theatrically in early 2024 in standard, 3D and IMAX formats. The official release date of the film is yet to be announced.

Haryana Congress: Will Rahul Dare to Kick Out the Black Sheep?

The Haryana Congress party, which was flying high after winning half the seats in the Lok Sabha elections, is stunned by the results of the Assembly elections held just six months after that were highly contrary to its expectations. The Congress was not even dreaming of getting anything less than a two-thirds majority. The supporters of a Haryana leader had started sleeping with the Chief Minister's seat in their lap. "That leader" himself had also started speaking every word of his address in the manner of a Chief Minister. But the tables turned and the statement given by the then and BJP's declared future Chief Minister, Nayab Saini, -- 'We have made all the arrangements for the victory', shown a thumb to all the hopes and imaginations of the Congress by securing an absolute majority. Now the situation is such that the Congress, which has been defeated by an unexpected seat margin, is not even able to decide the name of the Leader of Opposition (LoP) in the Assembly even after almost a month has passed. People have started jokingly saying that if God forbid it had got the majority, would

they have decided the name of the Chief Minister? The problem is not that it does not have the desired number of MLAs, but the problem is that to take this decision has become a noose around the neck of the weak high command. The repeated wrong decisions of the high command have axed the feet of the high command itself, paralyzing its decision-making and control power and has left it as a puppet in the hands of only one person in the state. Who is that person, in front of whose aura the light of the high command fades? What is the reason that the high command is not able to come out of the state of indecisiveness? Why has this person become so powerful? To find the answer to all these questions, political analysts consider the initial step taken by the Congress high command, buoyed by the massive victory in the 2005 assembly elections, to hand over the Chief Minister's throne to Bhupinder Hooda, a Jat leader, by thrashing Bhajan Lal, the leader of non-Jats. In this election, which was fought under the leadership of former Chief Minister Chaudhary Bhajan Lal, the Congress had won 67 out of 90 seats. The high command, worried about the growing stature of Bhajan Lal, handed over the throne to a person, Bhupinder Hooda, who could be directed by the high command as per its desire, to cut Bhajan Lal's wings. From the very beginning,

the Congress had been getting support from all castes and classes. Although the Brahmin community remained dominant there, the Dalit and backward classes also considered the Congress as their well-wisher. The Jats had accepted the farmer leader, who emerged in the form of Chaudhary Devi Lal, as their umbrella leader, taking advantage of which Bhajan Lal expanded his sphere of influence by starting Jat-non-Jat politics. As, the Jats had started moving away from the Congress, so to reunite them and to narrow down the growing circle of Bhajan Lal, the congress high command used Hooda, an alternative Jat leader, as a weapon. The Congress high command did not realize at that time that the weapon they were sharpening to cut Bhajan Lal would one day weaken the high command itself and force it to bow down. And the results of this move started coming in the very next assembly elections. Though Bhajan Lal was ignored by the Congress party and forced to leave the party, his supporters were infuriated by this decision of the high command and the 2009 elections, which were fought under the leadership of Hooda, gave a glimpse of the result of this move by squeezing Congress to only 40 seats out of 90. Although Bhajan Lal's own separate party, Haryana Janhit Congress (HJC), won 7 seats and kept Congress below the majority mark, but a few

power-hungry MLAs, who are usually readily available all the time in Haryana, snubbed the Haryana Janhit Congress (HJC) and supported Congress to facilitate Hooda back to power. The move of the Congress high command to reinstate Hooda further angered the non-Jat community and in the 2014 assembly elections, which were again fought under Hooda's leadership, the Congress was restricted to 15 seats. The high command began to realize its mistake and re-inducted Bhajan Lal's political heir Kuldeep Bishnoi in 2016 to bring the angry non-Jat community to its side. This also had an impact and in the 2019 assembly elections, the Congress's seats increased from 15 to a respectable 31, but the Congress's move to separate Dalit community leader Ashok Tanwar from the Congress under pressure from Hooda's strategy also alienated the Congress from a particular community. To attract this class again, Congress made Kumari Selja take charge of the state Congress, which Hooda did not like and he slowly started reducing Selja's stature too and finally, by preventing Selja from being sent to Rajya Sabha again, he got his own son Deepender Hooda nominated and by removing further Selja from the post of president, he got his own yes man Uday Bhan crowned and strengthened his hold on

the state party. Hooda's next target was former Chief Minister late Chaudhary Bansi Lal's daughter-in-law Kiran Chaudhary, he not only deprived her of the post of Congress Legislature Party leader and got himself seated on this chair, but also forced her to leave the Congress. Before this, Bhajan Lal's son Kuldeep Bishnoi was also forced to leave the party again. Now only Randeep Surjewala and Kumari Selja are left as the opposing voices of Hooda in the state party. To prevent Surjewala from being made a Rajya Sabha candidate from Haryana, Ajay Maken, who is close to the high command, was made the party's nominee, but the neglected Kuldeep Bishnoi and Kiran Chaudhary gave Hooda a hard blow and Hooda's candidate Maken had to face defeat despite having the sufficient number of MLAs. Later, the high command had to send Surjewala to Rajya Sabha from Rajasthan. In the recently held assembly elections, Hooda alone grabbed 72 out of 90 tickets to keep Kumari Selja and Surjewala away from claiming the Chief Minister's chair in the state. Neglected in ticket distribution, Selja sat in 'K o p b h a v a n' (dissociating from election campaign) for 10 days during the assembly election battle and showed her displeasure to the high command, but the high

command did not pay any attention to Selja's indifference for 10 days. And this indifference of Selja showed the Congress its true colours. Either the high command was unaware of this matter or was pretending to be unaware and not giving any attention to Selja, but the question here is whether the high command was so confident that it could see a huge victory in Haryana even without Selja or was the high command under someone's pressure and was forced to overlook Selja's indifference? In both the cases, the high command's weakness and powerlessness in decision making is clearly indicated. Why the name of the leader of the legislative party not being decided? The Congress high command felt that the slogan of 'Kisan-Pehlwan- Agniveer' would give it a majority on the ground. Political thinkers believe that so much ruckus was created by the influential Jat community of Haryana that the high command felt that the Jat leader Hooda would conquer the stronghold. Hooda too, taking the sloganeering of the Jat voters as support for the Congress, was making arrangements to secure his seat as the Chief Minister and was engaged in a way to defeat his rival group instead of defeating BJP. It was appearing throughout the election as if the Congress party had turned into Hooda Congress, this election

was not being fought for the party but for the personal interests. As the Jat community getting more preference repeatedly, the OBC and the Dalit community turned away from the Congress due to Selja's indifference. On the other hand, seeing the factionalism in Congress, the Jat community also put aside their animosity towards BJP and gave 30% votes to the BJP. As a result, Congress was left helpless and BJP got win. Ground level political thinkers analyse that the Jats are always a divided house. While voting they never use their verdict unitedly in favour of a single candidate, rather they vote according to their village level politics, which never allows them to unite. BJP has understood this fact, whereas congress failed as its booth level roots have become defunct due to non-functioning of its organisational wings. The political analysts suggest that if the congress wants to regain its past glory in Haryana, it must have to woo its old-time core supporters such as OBC and SC categories voters by giving them a freehand representation as Leader of Opposition (LoP) and State Party President. Better they appoint a strong Ahirwal leader as state chief to get the strength in OBC, especially Yadav community and an SC leader as LoP. After the big blow in Haryana assembly elections, now the high command felt that the

local leaders of the party have ruined the party. Rahul Gandhi himself had to say -- In Haryana, the leaders ignored the party's interest and gave importance to their own interest. But what's the use crying over the spilled milk. If Rahul Gandhi has recognised the Black Sheep, 'Will He Dare to Kick Them Out?' Now the high command is facing a situation of snake and shrew. They neither can shake Hooda off nor embrace him. On one hand, there is a fear of the spark of disintegration in the party and on the other hand, there is a fear of losing non-Jat votes. If Hooda is again made the leader of the legislative party, then there is a danger of the non-Jat community, especially the Dalit community, getting alienated and if Hooda or the person nominated by him is not made the leader of the legislative party, on the strength of the numbers of his supporting MLAs, Hooda may divorce the Congress and become the leader of the legislative party himself and as a result of this development in Haryana, the Congress may lose access to power in Maharashtra also. In this state of confusion, the Congress is keeping the name of the leader of the legislative party hanging. This is a very difficult situation for the Congress and the gains and losses of this decision are now reflecting not only in the state but also in the politics of the country. Let us see which way the wind blows!

Conventional fertilizers often cause uneven nutrient distribution, poor crop response, and environmental damage. In contrast, water-soluble fertilizers provide a balanced nutrient supply, improve soil health, and prevent issues such as nitrate accumulation in forage, which can harm livestock. Fertilizer application is important in fodder production, but it comes with challenges.

While increasing biomass and crude protein in maize forage, nitrogen-heavy fertilizers can result in nitrate accumulation, which can harm livestock. Effective fertilizer use ensures balanced nutrient supply, improves crop response, and reduces environmental impacts. Indiscriminate fertilizer application can lead to poor crop yields, degradation of soil health, and pollution. Field trials reveal considerable variability in nutrient supply, nutrient use efficiency, and crop responses. Such inconsistencies in fields affect overall forage productivity. To combat these inefficiencies, precise nutrient and crop management tailored to specific field characteristics is essential. A knowledge-intensive approach to managing soil and fertilizer

distribution can significantly improve results in forage production. Water-soluble fertilizers offer a promising solution by offering better nutrients to plants. These fertilizers are completely water soluble and have a low salt index, making them easy to apply as a foliar spray or through irrigation. Available in various NPK formulations (e.g., 19-19-19), water-soluble fertilizers also contain secondary nutrients such as sulfur and zinc. They ensure that nutrients remain available to crops without being affected by environmental factors such as leaching, erosion, or evaporation. Water-soluble fertilizers improve nutrient use efficiency by preventing nutrient loss. For example, about 25–30% of the recommended fertilizer dose can be saved

through water-soluble fertilizers, reducing input costs for farmers. These fertilizers do not contribute to salt accumulation in the soil, maintaining soil health in the long term. Water-soluble fertilizers can be used in a wide variety of field conditions and provide an efficient, balanced nutrient supply, leading to higher forage yields and improved forage nutritional quality. While water-soluble fertilizers provide many benefits, there is a risk of nutrient overload if they are overapplied or improperly diluted, which can result in phytotoxic injury (plant damage). This underscores the need for careful monitoring and management to ensure correct dosage and application techniques. A field trial conducted by Krishi Vigan Kendra, Barnala, assessed the

effectiveness of water-soluble fertilizers (NPK 19-19-19) in maize fodder production. The study compared three fertilizer management practices: Kisan (RDF) and foliar application of water-soluble fertilizers. Tests showed that foliar application of water-soluble fertilizers at 1% concentration, combined with 75% RDF, significantly increased plant growth (fresh and dry weight) and green fodder yield of maize. The nutritional quality of the forage also improved compared to conventional practices. Water-soluble fertilizers reduce leaching, runoff losses of key nutrients (N, P, K), and nitrogen volatilization, which translates into lower production costs and reduced environmental impact. Less nutrient wastage

and better efficiency result in less financial burden for farmers, especially in terms of fertilizer costs. Israel, which is known for its water-efficient agricultural practices, has adopted , which integrates irrigation with fertilizer application. Water-soluble fertilizers are dissolved in irrigation water and delivered directly to the root zone through drip irrigation systems. Australian farmers combine the use of water-soluble fertilizers with organic and slow-release fertilizers to achieve a balanced nutritional profile. Japan has been at the forefront of developing controlled-release water-soluble fertilizers, which allow nutrients to be released slowly over long periods of time. In Europe, especially in countries such as the Netherlands, sustainable agriculture certification schemes encourage the

use of water-soluble fertilizers in combination with environmentally friendly farming practices. Farmers need to be educated about the benefits of water-soluble fertilizers and proper application methods. Precision farming techniques like soil testing and nutrient mapping should be integrated with the use of water-soluble fertilizers. This ensures that nutrient management is tailored to specific field conditions, reducing wastage and improving crop responses. Ongoing research should focus on the development of new water-soluble fertilizers that cater to different crops and environmental conditions. Cairo, Egypt - A groundbreaking session

New Delhi, (KCN): Cairo, Egypt - A groundbreaking session at the World Urban Forum 12 (WUF12) on 5th November, 2024 highlighted the critical importance of integrating adolescent voices in urban planning and development. The session, "Cities for Adolescents – The NexGen Agenda," highlighted the transformative impact of giving adolescents a platform in urban planning. Adolescents bring unique perspectives that resonate with their generation's needs, challenges, and dreams, yet their voices often remain unheard in shaping the environments where they live, study, and socialize. The session showcased an innovative tool, a Public Space Assessment Framework that is for gathering insights from adolescents about the public spaces of cities. The Public Space Assessment Framework, developed by World Resources Institute (WRI) with



support from Foundation Botnar, has been successfully implemented in the Indian cities of Bhubaneswar and Jaipur. This comprehensive framework enables adolescents to actively participate in urban planning processes through systematic assessment of public spaces. Founder Chairperson, Humara Bachpan Trust Dharitri Patnaik was the panellist of the session spoke on how the Public Space Assessment Framework

tools can be instrumental in empowering adolescent children, youth, local and national administrations, and global leaders alike. She underlined the versatility of the framework in assessing the inclusivity, safety, accessibility, and usability of public spaces, helping to identify specific gaps and areas for improvement. The framework serves multiple stakeholders:

- For adolescents: Provides a structured way to document their experiences and needs
- For local

administrators: Offers data-driven insights for youth-centric urban planning

- For global leaders: Demonstrates a replicable model for inclusive city development

WRI has collaborated with Humara Bachpan Trust since 2022 to implement Healthy City for Adolescents (HCA-II) program in Bhubaneswar to transform the city into a safer, more inclusive, and engaging environment for its young residents. Around 800+

adolescents have been outreached whereas 211 of them are fully capacitated in public spaces and its assessment for betterment which makes them key contributors to the development of cities as adolescent-friendly space. Humara Bachpan Trust is one of the frontrunners in participatory and collaborative process-based project implementation and the initiative to make Bhubaneswar a child-friendly city is a testament to the impact of involving children and adolescents in shaping their surroundings. The recognition of Bhubaneswar as India's First Child-Friendly City highlights the success of this approach, which combines grassroots engagement with strategic urban planning. SER'S FREIGHT LOADING AND EARNINGS

Kolkata, (KCN): South Eastern Railway (SER) has loaded 122.14 million tonnes of originating freight in the first seven months (i.e. April-October) of the current financial year, 2024-25 which is 2.41% higher than the corresponding period of the previous financial year. There has also been an increase of 4.6% in originating freight revenue in April-October, 2024 in comparison to the same period of last financial year. During April-October 2024, the revenue generation from originating freight loading was Rs 11144.72 crore as against Rs. 10656.93 crore during the same period of the previous year. SER has loaded 31.95 million tonnes of coal during April-October, 2024 which is 7.87% more than the corresponding month of last fiscal. Other major commodities of freight loading were Iron Ore, Pig Iron & Finished Steel, Cement, Food grains, Fertilisers etc.

In Big Move, Congress Dissolves Himachal Pradesh Unit

New Delhi, (KCN): The Congress has dissolved its state unit in Himachal Pradesh, one of only three states where it has its own chief minister. In a statement on Wednesday, Congress General Secretary KC Venugopal said, "Honourable Congress President has approved the proposal to dissolve the entire state unit of the PCC, District Presidents and Block Congress Committees of Himachal Pradesh Congress

Committees of Himachal Pradesh Congress Committee, with immediate effect." The president of the outgoing state Congress unit is Pratibha Singh, who is the widow of former chief minister Virbhadr Singh. Hon'ble Congress President has approved the proposal to dissolve the entire state unit of the PCC, District Presidents and Block Congress Committees of Himachal Pradesh Congress

Committee, with immediate effect. A similar exercise was carried out in 2019 as well, when the Congress had dissolved its state unit, but retained the president, Kuldeep Singh Rathore, who had been appointed earlier that year. Pratibha Singh was appointed the head of the Congress' Himachal Pradesh unit in 2022 and was seen as one of the frontrunners for the chief minister's post after the Assembly elections that year.

Union cabinet minister Sri C R Patil, Minister of Jalsakti ranched endangered Mahaseer at Haridwar

Kolkata, (KCN): On the occasion of Ganga Utsav, ICAR-CIFRI, Barrackpore has released about 6,000 Mahaseer fingerlings into the river Ganga in the august presence of Shri C.R. Patil, Hon'ble cabinet minister of Jal Shakti ministry, GOI. Fishes were released in a ranching program on

4th November, 2024 at Chandi Ghat to conserve and restore them. The event was organized under NMCG project with a aim to increase the population of decreasing Mahaseer in the Himalayan stretch of the Ganga river. Being the important fish of

Illegal crusher units flourish on govt land

Jajpur(KCN): There has been a significant increase in the number of illegal crushers in Dhamasala tehsil of Jajpur district owing to the alleged apathy of the district administration in initiating action against these rogue units. Sources said that the crusher operators are encroaching on valuable land belonging to the Irrigation and Public Works department, Forest land, hill areas, and barren lands with impunity. One such instance is playing out in Paikarapur village under Dhamasala tehsil where Maruti Stone Products and Suppliers, a crusher unit, is operating on government land (plot number 1, under khata number 252) belongs to

Irrigation Department. Some time ago, local residents had filed a complaint with the Chief Secretary, Manoj Ahuja, over the issue. Following this, Alok Kumar Kar, the Additional Secretary of the State Water Resources Department, directed the Superintendent Engineer of the Jajpur Irrigation Division to investigate the matter. The directive emphasised the need for urgent action. Maruti Stone Products and Suppliers, locals alleged in their letter to the Chief Secretary, has been carrying out business on government land under the Minor Irrigation Department in Paikarapur for the past ten years. Although an NOC was issued to the



crusher in 2018, it is alleged that the unit has extracted over a hundred truckloads of black stones from the hill near the Paikarapur Minor Irrigation Project. This has resulted in the

creation of a pond-like pool on the hill, preventing rainwater from reaching the irrigation project. As a result, farmers are deprived of getting the water required for their

irrigation needs. It is also alleged that several officials from the Minor Irrigation Department are receiving monthly bribes

from the crusher owners to turn a blind eye to the blatant violation. Illegal blasting and transportation have exacerbated pollution

issues in the area. This leaves one wonder how the State Pollution Control Board (SPCB) and the district administration granted an NOC to a crusher operating on government land. Of late, the Minor Irrigation Department lodged a complaint with the local police, demanding the recovery of government land. Notably, in 2015, a notification was issued for strict action against illegal crushers in the Dhamasala and Danagadi tehsils of the district. Following the directive, the district administration had sealed over a hundred

crushers in the past nine years. However, many of these crushers resumed operation after a while. Considering the livelihood issues of the workers, the administration had promised to relocate the sealed crusher units to four specific clusters in the district. Although the Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (IDCO) has completed the construction of these clusters, they are still to be operational. As a result, the crusher units continue to operate along national highways and residential roads, leading to significant pollution problems.

Dip in Hadagarh jumbo population worrisome



Hatadihi(KCN): Decline in elephant population in Hadagarh elephant sanctuary has sparked concern among nature lovers and environmentalists, a report said. Located in Hatadihi block of Keonjhar district, the Hadagarh elephant Sanctuary, spread over 91.89 sqkm, got official recognition in 1978. Forest department records show that approximately 4,898 people from 868 families reside in 12 villages – Ratnamara, Daliki, Pitanau, Sajanapal, Junapasi, Saramundi, Malipasi, Balipal, Mayura, Raighati, Bhanra, and Siadimalia – within the sanctuary limits, indicating human-animal conflict. Elephant census data reveals a gradual decline in their population over recent

years. In 2012, there were 26 elephants which reduced to 25 in 2015 and then 24 in 2024. However, three elephants died between June and September this year, reducing the current jumbo population to 21. Notably, eight elephants have died in the last six years with two in 2019-20, one in each of 2020-21, 2022-23, and 2023-24, and three in 2024-25. Death of 24 other wild animals has also been reported while human-wildlife conflicts have led to seven human fatalities. The conflicts also left 24 people injured and 21 cattle dead. This apart, 43 houses have been destroyed in attack by the wild animals. In the past six years, authorities registered 11 poaching cases, leading to the arrest of 23 poachers. Confiscated items

include ivory, animal carcasses, horns, meat, and animal hides. The Forest department has relocated 170 families from villages like Pitanau, Daliki, Ratnamara, and Sajanapal and rehabilitated them at Jhanjhana and Durgapur villages in efforts to reduce human-wildlife conflict. Local leaders, including former Soso sarpanch Bailochan Nayak and Anandapur Civil Society secretary Bhagaban Mallik, voiced concerns over the protection of elephants and the sanctuary's future. Noting the apparent lack of protective measures in the sanctuary, they raised doubts over effective utilisation of funds provided by the government for the purpose. Conservation efforts are being

criticised for being limited to slogans and paperwork, as habitat destruction continues to escalate. The sanctuary is heading towards extinction day by day. Wild animals are straying into human settlements due to perceived threat as well as lack of food and water in the sanctuary. Poor fencing, lack of water sources, and encroaching human settlements are cited as ongoing challenges. Local leaders alleged mismanagement of funds and expressed skepticism about the role of Anandapur DFO and the Forest Department in protecting the sanctuary. As the elephant population steadily declines, they fear the species may face extinction in the years to come. They claimed that the truth will be out if a special audit is conducted on the funds allocated to the Forest department for the protection of elephants and the sanctuary. Anandapur DFO Abhaya Dalei said comprehensive safety measures have been implemented, including installation of CCTV cameras and deployment of a dedicated squad in the sanctuary.

BJP, BJD engage in war of words over cracks on Jagannath temple boundary wall

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The ruling BJP and opposition BJD engaged in a war of words over cracks appearing on 'Meghanad Pacheri' or outer boundary wall of Puri's Jagannath temple. The ruling BJP and the Odisha government claimed that the cracks appeared due to construction activities carried out during the heritage corridor project by the previous BJD regime. "The damage to Meghanad Pacheri was stated to have been caused during the eviction undertaken for the 'Parikrama Prakalpa' (heritage corridor project)," Odisha's Law Minister Prithviraj Harichandan said Tuesday. "Many people, including local



residents and priests are of the view that the cracks appeared during the eviction process. They believe that the huge structure suffered damage during the eviction work," he said. Harichandan said that as soon as the cracks were detected, the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) started repair work. Odisha BJP spokesperson Anil

Biswal directly blamed the previous BJD government for the cracks on the Meghanad Pacheri. He alleged that 20-foot-deep excavation using heavy excavators was done around Meghanad Pacheri for the Parikrama project. The structure was put in danger, Biswal alleged. "The people of the state are now paying for the mistake of the previous government. They

(BJD) have done the heritage corridor project for political gains," Samal said. Dismissing the BJP's allegation, BJD MLA Ganeswar Behera sought to know whether the saffron party leaders were technical experts to level such charges. "Do the BJP leaders have technical expertise? The claim would have been acceptable had it been spoken by technical experts," Behera said and alleged that the BJP's allegations were politically-motivated. Meanwhile, Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) chief administrator Arabinda Padhee said that repair work of the outer boundary wall was underway.

Almonds Food for Fitness

Bhubaneswar : Engaging in exercise promotes a healthful lifestyle, but even when performed correctly, exercise causes fatigue and muscle damage. Recovery from exercise is important because it leads to muscle gain and improved fitness over time. A new study involving people who exercise occasionally (less than three times per week) demonstrated that snacking on almonds reduced feelings of fatigue and tension, increased leg and lower back strength during recovery, and decreased muscle damage during the first day of recovery. David C. Nieman, DrPH, FACSM, Professor and Principal Investigator, Human Performance Laboratory, Appalachian State University, led this novel research, supported with funding from the Almond Board of California. Dr. Nieman's team wanted to see if an almond snack compared to a high-carbohydrate cereal bar snack would improve inflammation and recovery in adults engaging in 90-minute exercise sessions. "What we found tells us definitively that almonds should be added to sports nutrition strategies to help people recover better from exercise," explained Dr. Nieman. "Almonds are food for fitness. Carbs get most of the attention when it comes to fueling for exercise, but almonds offer a nutrition package, including good unsaturated fats, the antioxidant vitamin E, and proanthocyanidins (class of polyphenols, which are protective compounds in plants) that help explain the beneficial outcomes in our study." One serving of almonds (28g) has 13 g of good unsaturated fat and only 1 g of saturated fat.

From Australia, 76 cricketers have thrown



their hat in the ring for the upcoming auction. 91 South African cricketers are on the list as well. England and Afghanistan have 52 and 29 players respectively in the auction. New Zealand have 39 players

while Afghanistan and Sri Lanka have 29 players each. The list of players in the auction will be pruned as only 204 slots are up for grabs. Every squad will have a maximum of 25 players in the squad.

Earlier on October 31, the 10 teams named their retentions. Amongst the big names that will be in the upcoming auction are Rishabh Pant, KL Rahul and Shreyas Iyer. Last season, Shreyas helped Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) end their 10-year-long wait to win an IPL title.

But instead of him, KKR preferred retaining Andre Russell, Sunil Narine, Rinku Singh, Ramandeep Singh, Varun Chakravathy and Harshit Rana.

New Delhi: New Zealand's historic 3-0 whitewash of India saw the side conquering different types of challenges. The major hurdle among them was the nature of the pitches, with varied conditions greeting the teams in Bengaluru, Pune and Mumbai.

The weather had a major role in the pitch for the first Test and New Zealand made the most of the pace friendly conditions to run through India in the first innings, which essentially sealed the game in their favour. The Pune wicket, although it assisted spin, was a slow one and needed recalibration from the slower bowlers. Again, the visiting side read the conditions better and their spinners, led by Mitchell Santner, set up New Zealand's maiden series win against India.

Then came Mumbai and this time it was Ajaz Patel, bowling in familiar

climes, as he helped New Zealand overcome the Rishabh Pant challenge and become the first team to achieve a whitewash in India (minimum 3 Tests). Speaking to the media in a Zoom conference, Ajaz highlighted the different conditions that New Zealand encountered and the preparations they had in place to rise up to the challenge. "It's been three different surfaces and three different games, and I guess we're well aware that one of the challenges of going to Asia is that the conditions are going to change all the time and you have to be adaptable and even within the game the conditions change very quickly. I mean even in this Mumbai Test I was bowling...I think in the first innings and I felt like I was bowling really well but the wicket wasn't really turning and then I came back after Lunch and all of a sudden

everything started happening.

"So I guess when you come to the subcontinent it's about having that skill set and that range of being able to whether it be bowl in the high 90s or bowl in the low 80s and being able to be adaptable in those ranges I guess from the outset. It's also reading the surface quickly because the conditions like I say do change at a constant (rate). Sometimes the conditions in the morning can be very different to the conditions in that middle session and so as a spinner it's about knowing how to get the most out of that, how to change your pace, how to go up and down while still having the ball shape," said Ajaz, who added that New Zealand had prepared well back home to counter the different pitches in the subcontinent.

"If I'm honest with you, we had a great winter



back home where we prepared on turning wickets and we made sure we had different surfaces that we tried and practiced on so we were, I guess, conditioned to bowling on different surfaces as well. So yeah it's a lot to do with preparation but then it's also about backing your skills and kind of I guess you know going out there and doing

it really," he said. Before the Test series against India, New Zealand lost out on crucial preparation time with the Test match against Afghanistan in Greater Noida being abandoned without a single ball being bowled. In the subsequent two-match series against Sri Lanka, they were blanked 2-0 by the hosts, with New Zealand losing

the toss in both games and having had to bat second. In India, however, they had the best of batting conditions and New Zealand ensured they capitalised on it. Speaking about how crucial the toss factor is in Asian conditions, Ajaz said: "I guess, from Sri Lanka to here, I don't think we were too much different, to be honest with you. I think we played some really good cricket in Sri Lanka, but unfortunately (we lost the series). When you come to the subcontinent, the toss is so important and bowling in the last innings in comparison to bowling in the third innings, especially on a turning wicket, can sometimes be the difference as spinners. "While the results didn't go our way in Sri Lanka, I don't feel like we played too poorly or anything like that. Even from a batting department, we still put

runs on the board. It was just a matter of, I guess, you know, having a bit of luck our way as well in the series."

Ajaz credited spin consultant Rangana Herath for his contributions and strategic insights that helped the New Zealand spinners come out on top against the Indian batters. He also spoke about the importance of the straighter delivery for a spinner and how it makes life difficult for batters on turning tracks, and also how the New Zealand batters were well-prepared in that regard.

"Obviously he's got a wealth of experience in the subcontinent, and his record kind of speaks for itself, really, in terms of left-arm spin bowling. So I mean, for me, it was great to have him because we're quite similar, I guess, in terms of the style of bowling that we both bowl. But I

think the biggest thing was, he gave us a really good idea around the kind of fields to set in terms of Asian conditions, and still be attacking, but also at the same time, have our options to limit the boundaries as well. "It's an art," said Ajaz about the straighter delivery. "Every spinner should have it. Especially if you come to Asia or the subcontinent, the most difficult thing is to bowl a straight ball. Because on a lot of wickets, if you want to turn the ball, you can, but the challenge is to keep the ball straight. Rangana has helped a lot in that. He's taught us some new techniques, some action techniques. So, the batsmen don't get cues quickly. We've practiced all of that. And we knew that in batting as well, for our batsmen, the straight ball is dangerous. So, we've taken care of that in batting as well as in bowling."
