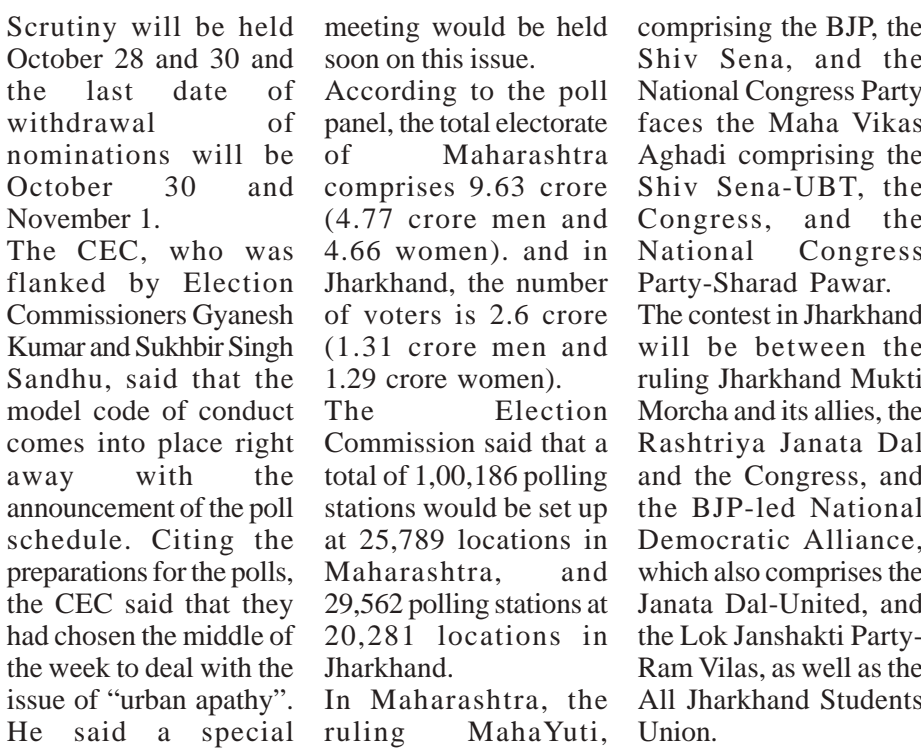

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Odisha government Tuesday said it will seal borders with neighbouring states when it begins paddy procurement for the kharif season next month. The decision was taken during a review meeting chaired by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, attended by ministers and departmental secretaries. The state plans to procure paddy at Rs 3,100 per quintal, fulfilling a promise made by the BJP before the elections. With the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for paddy set at Rs 2,300, the state will provide an additional Rs 800 per quintal as a bonus at government mandis, an official said. Given the rising price of paddy in the state, the government is concerned about the potential influx of lower-priced paddy from neighbouring states such as Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and West Bengal, he added. To address this, district magistrates have been instructed to deploy enforcement squads in border areas and implement 24-hour monitoring of highways using CCTV cameras. Chief Minister Majhi emphasised the need to prevent farmers from outside the state from selling their paddy in Odisha markets. The state has set an ambitious target to procure 1 crore metric

Two minor siblings drown in pond in Odisha

Bhubaneswar(KCN): A 13-year-old girl and her younger brother drowned in a pond while bathing in Odisha's Khurda district Tuesday morning, police said. The incident occurred this morning when the siblings went to the pond in Subala village under Baliana police limits on the outskirts of Bhubaneswar, a police officer said. The deceased were identified as Subhashree Jena (13) and her brother Bhagirathi Jena (9), he said. Villagers rushed to their help and rescued Subhashree. Later, police reached the spot and rescued Bhagirathi and took both of them to Capital Hospital, where the doctors declared the duo dead, the officer said. He said that a case of an unnatural death was registered at the Baliana police station and the bodies were sent for autopsy.



tons of paddy this year, with the possibility of increasing that figure based on demand, the CM said and directed that the procurement system be streamlined and made more transparent for the benefit of farmers. "Advised to take necessary measures to make paddy procurement system more simple, smooth and transparent for the benefit of farmers," Majhi said. Each minister will be assigned to oversee the procurement process in 2 to 3 districts, and there will be one authorised officer present at each mandi during grain purchases. Zones will be created with multiple paddy mandis, each supervised by a designated official. Notably, 83.16 per cent of registered farmers in the state are small farmers. Majhi highlighted the importance of ensuring that these farmers can sell their paddy without issues and instructed officials to prioritise them during procurement. Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari said paddy quality will now be assessed only once at the mandis, streamlining the process and reducing potential harassment of farmers over quality assessments. District collectors have been given the authority to extend the token deadlines for paddy procurement without needing to notify the state government, he added. Additionally, the government plans to construct godowns at mandis to facilitate proper storage of paddy, especially during rainy periods, allocating Rs 550 crore for the modernisation and development of these facilities. Procurement will be overseen by officers from various departments, including supply, cooperatives, police, and district administration, with the Panchayati Raj department also involved as necessary. All decisions regarding procurement tokens will be made by the district collector, officials said.

Ascent for Noel: Tata-Mistry families likely to come close

As Noel Tata, the half-brother of Ratan Tata, has appointed as the Chairman of the all powerful Tata Trusts on last Friday, it is almost curtains for Mehli Mistry to head the Tata Trusts. Mistry was regarded as the close confidant of Ratan Tata, the late Chairman emeritus of Tata group. After the demise of Ratan Tata, there were strong rumours in the corporate world of India as well as in the corridors of power that Mehli Mistry became the head of Tata Trusts. Mehli is the estranged first cousin of former Tata Group chairperson, late Cyrus Mistry. A director of the Meherji Pallonji Group, Mehli Mistry was appointed as a non-executive trustee of the Sir Ratan Tata Trust, its allied Tata Education and Development Trust

and the Sir Dorabji Tata Trust in November 2022. Those were the days when Ratan Tata was all powerful in Tata Trusts. Mehli Mistry is the first cousin of the late Cyrus Mistry. It may be recalled that Mehli Mistry was solidly behind Ratan Tata when he (Ratan Tata) removed Cyrus Mistry as chairman of Tata Sons in 2016. The acrimonious spat between Ratan Tata and Cyrus Mistry created a tremendous amount of media attention. Mehli Mistry's name also surfaced during the acrimonious dispute between Ratan Tata and Cyrus Mistry. Some says that Mehli Mistry allegedly played a behind-the-scenes role in orchestrating tensions that eventually led to Cyrus Mistry's removal from the Tata House. When Ratan Tata and Cyrus Mistry were on loggerheads, Mehli Mistry was supporting the cause of Ratan Tata. He was attacking Cyrus Mistry from all the possible fronts. That strengthened their ties.

According to Tata group watchers, Mehli Mistry's role within the Trusts has increased significantly in recent years. Therefore, his name was in the air to become head of Tata trusts. However, he lost the race. Despite being a frontrunner to lead the Tata trusts, Mehli Mistry could not become the head of Tata Trusts. It is said that Noel Tata appointed to the top post on a unanimous decision. Noel Tata's formidable reputation as a successful and non-controversial businessman played a decisive role in his selection as the head of Tata Trusts. He began his career at Tata International, the Tata Group's arm for the products and services offered abroad. In June 1999, he became the managing director of the Group's retail arm Trent, which was founded by his mother. By this time, Trent had acquired the department store Littlewoods International and changed its name to Westside. Tata developed Westside, turning it into a profitable



venture. In 2003, he was appointed the director of Titan Industries and of Voltas. On the other hand, Mehli Mistry was facing even some serious allegations in the business dealings. One major controversy involves Mehli Mistry's business dealings with Tata Power with allegations being that his firm had been awarded lucrative long-term dredging and shipping contracts by Tata Power without going through the proper tender process. However, Mehli Mistry

has always denied these allegations. Even Tata Sons has refuted allegations that Mehli Mistry and associates benefited from contracts allegedly awarded to him by Tata Power without competitive bidding. Mehli Mistry has been a director of the Meharji Pallonji Group. Mehli's mother and Cyrus's mother are sisters, while their fathers are also first cousins. Mehli Mistry, however, said that the allegation that he was behind the ouster of Cyrus Mistry from head of Tata Sons

was untrue. Mehli Mistry was accused of calling Cyrus Mistry a weak leader during the tumultuous boardroom battle that followed Cyrus's ousting. This comment reflected the deep animosity between Mehli and Cyrus. Cyrus Mistry's family, through their holding company Shapoorji Pallonji, owns an 18.37% stake in Tata Sons, making them the second largest shareholder after Tata Trusts. Well, the spat between Mehli Mistry and Cyrus Mistry was not just a personal fallout

but a public and legal battle that unfolded within the Tata Group, resulting in years of litigation and bad blood. Mehli's alleged role in this feud raises questions about his suitability to lead Tata Trusts, particularly given the bitter history between him and the Mistry family. Even though they were such close relatives, yet they were not on talking terms. With Noel Tata now leading Tata Trusts, there is a hope that a new chapter of reconciliation within the Tata-Mistry family would start. There is a sense of optimism that Noel Tata's able leadership would heal lingering wounds from the past. Noel Tata is married to Aloo Mistry, daughter of the late Pallonji Mistry and sister of the late Cyrus Mistry. The couple has three children: daughters Leah and Maya, and son Neville. Meanwhile, there is a question mark on the future role for Mehli Mistry in Tata group

despite his deep ties with Ratan Tata and experience within the Tata Trusts. As Ratan Tata is not around, there is a 'future tense' so far as Mehli Mistry's is considered. Tata group watchers say that while it is true that Mehli Mistry was very close to Ratan Tata, he was certainly not a material to head the Tata Trusts. If he was made the boss of Tata Trusts, it would have given very bad message to Mistry, a sworn enemy of Cyrus Mistry was made the head of Tata Trusts. Moreover, Mehli's appointment further alienate the Mistry family from Tata group. It is a well-known fact that it is a key stakeholder in Tata group companies. Finally, as Tata group would move forward under the watchful eyes of Noel Tata, one hopes that it would grow thick and fast.

Ratan Tata: The Visionary Industrialist Who Revolutionised the Tata Group.



Source: Business History. People widely regard Ratan Tata as one of the most influential and forward-thinking corporate leaders in modern India. Ratan, who passed away recently at the age of 86, made significant contributions to the world of business. He was also responsible for elevating the Tata company to a global level through highly exceptional accomplishments. Ratan Tata, who was in charge of the Tata Group for 21 years, successfully transformed the company into the global powerhouse it is today by expanding into a variety of industries, including steel, automobiles, information technology, and telecommunication. He achieved this by acquiring a struggling British auto company and successfully transforming it. He also introduced the Nano, the most affordable passenger car. It was during his tenure from 1991 to 2012 (and for a short period from 2016 to 2017) that the conglomerate with its headquarters in Mumbai made significant acquisitions, such as Jaguar Land Rover (JLR), Tetley, and Corus, which helped to establish the company as a major player on the global arena. He reimagined and redesigned the

organization in his own image, as a careful, clever, and kind entrepreneur who was nevertheless brave and audacious. For over three decades, he guided the organization with great respect. Through his leadership, he not only brought about a transition inside the Tata Group, but he also became the leader in India's industrial development in a variety of different ways. Ratan Tata penned the Tata Tactical Proposal after replacing JRD as chairman of Tata Industries, more than a span before Ratan prospered him as chairman of the group holding company Tata Sons. This occurred following Ratan's assumption of the chairmanship of Tata Industries. In the times when Indian corporate and business were subject to the shackles of license sovereignty and the Tata Group, the dominant force in the country, was plodding along with its legacy industries, which mostly consisted of commodities, Ratan Tata's strategy would have seemed to be nothing more than a pipe dream. The most significant milestones achieved by Ratan Tata in the process of transitioning the Tata Group. Ratan Tata assumed the control of the multinational in the year 1991, succeeding his uncle JRD Tata. This occurred at the same time that India was beginning to implement significant economic reforms that would open the nation up to the rest of the globe and usher in a period of rapid

economic expansion. Tata was the driving force behind the group's expansion outside the borders of India, which included the acquisition of a British tea company. Although the purchase of Tata may not be as significant as the acquisitions of JLR or Corus, it is without a doubt of more significance in the process of making Tata a worldwide brand. In the year 2020, Ratan Tata presided over the purchase of Tetley, which at the time was three times as large as Tata Tea, for a total of \$430 million. It was the transaction that laid the groundwork for a string of subsequent acquisitions on a worldwide scale. Moreover, Tata also purchased Anglo-Dutch steelmaker Corus in 2007 for \$13 billion, which was the largest buyout of a foreign corporation by an Indian corporation at the time. At this time, Tata Motors' passenger vehicle business was speedily charming a household brand due to the over whelming accomplishment of the hatchback Indica, which made its debut in December 1998. In a short period of time, Tata Motors emerged as a formidable rival to automobile manufacturers from Japan, the United States, and Korea. Additionally, in 2008, Tata Motors paid Ford Motor Company \$2.3 billion to buy the British premium automobile brands Jaguar and Land Rover under the same name. It was Tata's domesticated developments at Tata Motors that featured the Indica, which was "the first car model designed and built in India," and the Nano, which was

"touted as the world's cheapest car." He submitted the preliminary drawings for both models. He submitted preliminary drawings for both models. Fast forward to 2007, when Tata Steel made headlines across the world with its purchase of the steel company Corus, which was located in the United Kingdom and cost \$12.9 billion. It continues to be one of the greatest purchases made by an Indian corporation, and Ratan Tata himself was the driving force behind it. This acquisition led Tata Steel to become one of the world's largest steel manufacturers, yet some refer to it as a venture that did not yield significant success for the company. However, the purchase of Jaguar Land Rover from Ford Motor, which is located in the United States, in 2008 for a total price of \$2.3 billion was a significant factor in the conglomerate's success in establishing itself on the international scene. The amazing turnaround that JLR has seen has completed the brand a formidable competitor in around of the most

important markets for automobiles in the world, including the United States of America, China, and Europe. A limited American administrators ridiculed Ratan Tata's 1999 effort to sell Tata Motors' passenger vehicle sector to Ford, making the purchase and turnaround a personal success for him. Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) went public in 2004, representing India's biggest and Asia's second-largest initial public offering (IPO) at the time. The company raised a total of \$1.17 billion. In detail, TCS was the individual large firm within the group to raise public capital. Also, Ratan Tata was the driving force behind the ambitious Tata Nano automobile project, which he conceived of and led. Designed to provide a safe form of transportation within the typical Indian customer's budget, Nano was a huge hit when it first hit the market. However, in the years that followed, sales of the Nano decreased because customers began shifting their choices toward larger automobiles.

He was also responsible for overseeing the hospitality side of the firm and ensuring that the Taj variety of hotels remained among the most opulent accommodations in the world. Additionally, it was under his rule that Titan expanded into new product groups and converted one of the furthestmost well-known shopper products in the nation. In 2021, the Tata Group acquired the state-owned airline Air India. The company also established Vistara, a full-service airline, in collaboration with Singapore Airlines; however, it recently amalgamated with Air India. In December 2012, Tata resigned, although he came back for a short period of time to serve as chairperson from October 2016 to February 2017 in order to address leadership difficulties within the organization. Despite the fact that Tata had retired, the organization continued to maintain the pioneering spirit that he had reintroduced in the community. Within less than a year, the organization has disclosed its intention to become the only provider of a sizeable portion of India's forthcoming high-tech engineering. It became the first Indian business to enter the Apple supply chain as an iPhone assembler when it purchased the India manufacturing plant of Taiwan's Wistron in November of the previous year. Two Tata semiconductor factories broke ground in March, four months later. The Tata Group plans to

develop the first of these plants, a semiconductor fab facility in Dholera, Gujarat, at a cost of eleven billion dollars, making it the first of its kind in the nation. It is true that Tata made several mistakes on his quest for invention, particularly with the Nano, which is the smallest automobile. Nano is a testament to Tata's inventiveness, pioneering vision, and patriotic zeal, despite the fact that it was a failure throughout its production. Nano was an audacious industrialist's gift to the normal Indian at a time when India had declared its independence from the previous communist economy and was eager to go forward. The fact that Tata dared the vision large at a time when the majority of his contemporaries shied away from taking risks and chose to stick to the tried-and-true path was a distinguishing characteristic of his personality. He has invested in over fifty new businesses in India, driven by his desire to vision and revolutionize. Every Indian entrepreneur with the courage to vision and transform will carry on Ratan Tata's legacy. The contributions that Ratan Tata has made to the Tata group have been particularly noteworthy. With worldwide processes in 100 nations, the Tata Group has now extended its goods and services to approximately 150 countries throughout the world. Ratan Tata's expertise and affectionate conduct. Ratan Tata gained recognition for his unpretentious and modest character during his

tenure as the head of TELCO. Later, Tata Motors strategically settled the workers strike in a tactical manner. Ratan Tata is renowned for his simplicity and humility. Tata visited each and every worker, listened to their complaints, and individually addressed the issues that they were experiencing. Furthermore, Tata assured the workers that they would handle the issues with utmost caution. The outside world did not have a kind opinion of Ratan Tata. Additionally, Ratan had a strong interest in charitable work and never favored wearing a tie. Instead, Ratan Tata preferred to wear casual clothing. Pockets of Middle Class Being Looted to Fund AAP's Political Ambitions, Alleges PPCC Chief

Chandigarh (JAG MOHAN THAKEN), Oct 15: Amarinder Singh Raja Warring, President of the Punjab Pradesh Congress Committee (PPCC) has alleged that AAP is looting the pockets of the middle class to fund its political ambitions. In a critique of the Aam Aadmi Party government in Punjab, Warring, PPCC chief and Member of Parliament from Ludhiana, has accused the Bhagwant Mann-led administration of betraying the people of Punjab and enforcing "GST-terrorism" to fill their political coffers. Warring lambasted the AAP for looting the state's middle class and small business owners to finance their lavish election campaigns and fund extravagant advertisement budgets, branding it as a total sell-out of the state's hard-earned resources. "Aam Aadmi Party

claims to stand for the common man, but they are the biggest enemy of the very people they pledged to protect. They are emptying the pockets of middle-class families, misusing public funds to fuel their political ambitions and self-glorification," Warring remarked. "This party has crossed all limits of excess, hiring a private jet to fly Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann to a rally, while the state's helicopter followed empty, just for security reasons. It's an outright mockery of the taxpayer's money, a shameful waste of public resources, all while Punjab's people struggle under the burden of rising prices and economic hardships." The PPCC Chief pointed out that the misuse of Punjab's resources doesn't stop with CM Bhagwant Mann. "Not only does Bhagwant Mann waste Punjab's

helicopter, but it has also been used to ferry Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal on multiple occasions. Why are Punjab's assets being used? This is the clearest evidence that the AAP government is not for Punjabis, but for their party bosses." Warring further highlighted the terror being unleashed on small business owners under what he termed as "GST-Terrorism." He pointed out that messages are being circulated across districts instructing government officials to conduct arbitrary raids on salons, beauty parlours, and cosmetic shops during the festive season, targeting them with undue pressure to check B2C invoicing. "On the eve of Karva Chauth, when families are preparing to celebrate, AAP is sending terror squads to harass small businesses under the pretext of



GST enforcement. These shops, many of which are struggling to survive, are being targeted as part of AAP's revenue collection drive to fund their political adventures. This isn't governance—this is daylight robbery!" The PPCC Chief expressed deep concern over the psychological

and financial strain AAP's policies are imposing on Punjab's middle class and business community. "Entrepreneurs in Punjab are living in fear, not just of criminals, but of their own government. The law-and-order situation is collapsing, corruption is rampant, and now

honest business owners are being terrorized by the AAP government's GST squads. How can anyone thrive in such an environment?" Warring also slammed AAP for their failure to tackle issues like illegal sand mining and corruption, issues they had once vowed to eradicate. "Instead of

addressing illegal activities or the rampant corruption within their own ranks, AAP is squeezing Punjabis dry to fund their next big election or build grand advertisements across the country. When will they stop extorting the people of Punjab for their personal gain?" he questioned. The PPCC Chief warned that this GST-enforcement drive, coupled with AAP's rampant spending, would only worsen the already fragile state economy. "They have chosen the festive season to execute these raids. At a time when Punjabis should be celebrating, they are being terrorized by this GST racket. AAP is ruining Punjab's festivals while they roll in luxury." Raja Warring made it clear that the Congress party would not stand by and allow AAP's

exploitation of the people to continue. "We will raise our voices and mobilize the public against this GST-terrorism! Samsung Workers Call Off Strike, Ready To Resume Work: Tamil Nadu



Chennai(KCN): Over a month-long indefinite strike by the employees of Samsung India Electronics Ltd at its plant near here was called off on Tuesday and the workers have decided to resume work, the Tamil Nadu government said. The state government in a statement said the strike at the factory of the

Korean electronics giant in Sriperumbudur has come to an end and all the workers would get back to work. Pressing for various demands, about 1,100 workers of the total 1,750 employees of Samsung India have been on strike since September 9, which includes wage revision, better work conditions, and registration of the

newly formed Samsung India Workers Union backed by CITU by the labour department. The decision to call off the strike was taken at the conciliatory meeting which was held at the office of the Department of Labour Welfare here on Tuesday in which representatives from the Samsung India and the striking workers took part. "All the striking workers will call off the agitation and return to work immediately. On returning to work the management will not victimise the workers for having participated in the protest," an official release said.

Maharashtra Polls To Test Chemistry Among Allies Post Shiv Sena, NCP Split

Mumbai(KCN): With half a dozen key players post splits in the Shiv Sena and NCP, a fragmented polity, Maratha quota stir and a spirited opposition, Maharashtra will see a riveting contest in the assembly polls amid dramatic changes since the last elections. Elections to the 288-member assembly, the second largest after Uttar Pradesh (403), will be held on November 20 in a single phase and the counting of votes will be on November 23, the Election Commission announced on Tuesday. The Nanded Lok Sabha by-poll, necessitated due to the death of Congress MP Vasant Chavan, will also be held on November 20.



The Mahayuti government led by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde is banking on its flagship scheme, Ladki Bahin Yojana, under which poor women get a monthly stipend of ? 1,500, to sway voters after the ruling bloc's poor show in the Lok Sabha polls. The ? 46,000-crore a-year welfare scheme is being widely seen as a "game changer" for the ruling bloc which comprises the BJP, Shinde's Shiv Sena and the NCP led by Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar, who joined the government just over a year ago after parting ways with his uncle Sharad Pawar. The government's target is to cover 2.5 crore beneficiaries under the scheme. There are about 4.5 crore women voters in Maharashtra. The Mahayuti (grand alliance) is in a direct fight with the opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) in a state where

splits within major parties and realignments in the last five years have led to a tectonic shift in political dynamics. The MVA consists of the Congress, Shiv Sena (UBT) and Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) faction led by veteran politician Sharad Pawar. Both the MVA and the Mahayuti are yet to announce their seat-sharing deals. The ensuing assembly polls, the first since the splits in the Shiv Sena in 2022 and the NCP a year later, will be a test of strength for the two major alliances and will also indicate the ability of their individual constituents to transfer votes to each other. Even though the Lok Sabha elections saw the ruling alliance (which won 17 of 48 seats) suffering a jolt and the opposition MVA (30 seats) performing well, the assembly polls are going to be a different political ball game as state and local-level issues will dominate campaigning. Maharashtra's political climate has never been more fragmented, with

six main parties vying for influence: BJP, Shiv Sena, NCP, Congress, Shiv Sena (UBT), and NCP (SP). This fragmentation is a product of recent political upheavals, including the collapse of the MVA government and the emergence of new political factions. The last five years have been unprecedented in Maharashtra politics -- collapse of a pre-poll alliance, three regimes, including a three-day government, splits in two major parties with the Election Commission recognizing the breakaway groups as "real". The murder of former state minister and NCP leader Baba Siddique on Dussehra (October 12) raised concerns about law and order and came as an embarrassment for the Mahayuti government ahead of the polls. The opposition was quick to target the government, especially Home Minister Devendra Fadnavis, over the killing and highlight issues of public safety and governance.

In the last fortnight, the Shinde government has taken a staggering 1,500 decisions, including around 160 in state cabinet meetings. These include the toll waiver for light motor vehicles at all five entry points into Mumbai. Despite reports that Ajit Pawar may walk out of the ruling alliance, he has stayed put. Maharashtra saw a change in government mid-way in June 2022 when the MVA government led by Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray collapsed following a rebellion in his party Shiv Sena. Shinde then succeeded Thackeray as Chief Minister with BJP support. The 2019 assembly polls changed several dynamics. First, a pre-poll alliance between the Shiv Sena-BJP snapped over the issue of chief ministership. Later, Shiv Sena joined hands with its traditional rivals Congress and the NCP to form a government under Thackeray's leadership. Congress leader Ratnakar Mahajan said the BJP is facing erosion

in its voter base, while the grand old party has gained people's trust by raising key issues like agrarian distress, unemployment and inflation. Mahajan asserted the Congress is not complacent after its encouraging Lok Sabha poll show -- the party won 13 seats in Maharashtra -- and it continues to highlight pro-people issues. He said the collapse of a Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj statue in Sindhudurg district, poor law and order situation, Maratha quota and agrarian distress were some of the issues the opposition is highlighting. The Maratha quota demand, an issue which hurt the Mahayuti in the Lok Sabha polls, continues to resonate with a significant voter base, according to analysts. In 2019, the BJP bagged 105 seats, emerging as the single largest party, while its then-ally Shiv Sena won 56. The Congress and its ally NCP contested 125 seats each and won 44 and 54, respectively.



Doctors Hold Protest Meet In Kolkata, Facing Off State's Puja Carnival



Kolkata (KCN): Protesting junior doctors in Kolkata launched their 'Droher Carnival' (carnival of protest) today from city centre Esplanade - a short distance from the Red Road where the state government was hosting the Durga Puja Carnival. The puja carnival, showcasing award-winning idols, has been a high-point of the city's festive landscape since 2016. But today, most footfalls were at the adjacent protest site, where the citizens decided to show support to the doctors who are holding an indefinite

hunger strike. With several doctors indisposed, two more have joined their ranks. They are Rumelika Kumar from All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health and Spandan Chowdhury from Midnapore Medical College & Hospital. The total number of junior doctors on hunger strike is now seven. The hunger strike had started on October 5, seeking justice for the young doctor raped and murdered at Kolkata's RG Kar hospital on August 9. So far, five of the doctors on hunger strike had to be

hospitalised as their health deteriorated. The rally started shortly after the Calcutta High Court set aside prohibitory orders in areas near the Durga Puja Carnival on Red Road. "Our protests on the issue have been going on for the last 66 days. Many of our fellow junior doctors are on hunger strike. We want to send the message to the state government and the Chief Minister that our protests on this issue will continue," Spandan Chowdhury, one of the protesting doctors, was quoted as saying.

Aruha hill turns mound of misdeeds

Jajpur(KCN): Despite many efforts taken by the state government to contain rampant plunder of minor minerals, there has been no let-up in illegal quarrying and smuggling of black stone, murrum and soil from Dharmasala tehsil area in Jajpur district. It has been over a year since the state government established the office of the deputy director of Minor Minerals department in Jajpur district as part of its move to curb the smuggling. However, this has failed to stop the illegal mining and smuggling of minor minerals. Instead, the illegal practice, depriving the state's exchequer of huge

earnings, has only flourished over the years. The Jajpur district administration has directed for deposit of penalty and closure of the quarries after mining of black stones beyond the permissible limit was proved at Aruha black stone mines under the Dharmasala tehsil. However, some unscrupulous miners continue to extract and smuggle murrum from the area. The murrum is being used for the establishment of a crusher unit named 'Mass', located about 300 metres from Tarakasuni Primary School in Aruha panchayat. Similarly, the Jajpur Road-Cuttack rail route lies at a distance of



200 metres from the under-construction crusher unit. Reports said that there are five black stone mines on Aruha hill and the state government has prepared a cluster mining plan for the area. However, it has comfortably ignored the presence of a school and the rail route near it

before preparing the cluster mining plan. This has left the local residents surprised as they questioned the wisdom of the district administration in permitting the establishment of a crusher unit which is likely to cause deafening noise and will lead to air pollution in the area.

Apprehending severe sound and air pollution, over 100 students and their guardians have sought the intervention of the district Collector, demanding to save them from the problem which is likely to impact their health and studies. Peeved over the development, locals have

written to the district Collector demanding closure of the illegal black stone quarry and crusher unit and necessary action for violation of norms. They have also forwarded copies of their complaints to the deputy director of Minor Minerals department, the secretary of Steel and Mines department and the regional officer of State Pollution Control Board (SPCB) at Kalinganagar in the district. According to the complaints, the district administration is yet to collect the penalty that was levied on the concerned leaseholders following satellite mapping held earlier. However, surprisingly,

the district administration has registered a certified case against one of the three leaseholders while the names of two of them have been excluded by allegedly showing them undue favour. It has been alleged that this is in direct contravention of the norms for environmental clearance. According to the complaints, two of the quarries BSQ-2 quarry no-1/16-17 and 34/21-22 are situated at a distance of about 300 metres from the primary school. Moreover, three of the quarries BSQ no-1 quarry no-35/21-22 and quarry no-36/21-22 lie at a distance of about 200 metre from the railway line. The presence of the quarry might endanger

the railway line anytime as residents expressed concerned over its security. This apart, four stone crushing units are in operation near these quarries on plot number 2733, 2594, 2704 and 2705 for which the students have been seriously affected by the deafening sound and air pollution emanating from the units. Residents Nirmal Nayak, Harihar Sahu, Pratap Rana, Anand Behera, Pramod Behera, Anam Behera, Sahadev Rana, Mohan Nayak, Chittarnjan Jena and over 100 others have demanded a proper probe into these irregularities and sought stringent action against the wrongdoers.

Four killed, two injured in three separate road accidents in Odisha

Jajpur / Bhubaneswar(KCN): At least four persons were killed and two others injured in three separate road accidents in Odisha, police said Monday.

According to police, two persons riding a motorcycle were killed when a bus travelling to Bhubaneswar from Balasore hit their two-wheeler near Chhatia on NH-16 in Jajpur district and dragged it

for some distance Monday. The bus caught fire after the mishap, however, all the passengers aboard the bus managed to escape unharmed, as they quickly evacuated the vehicle before the fire could spread, a police officer said. Police have sent the bodies to the Barachana Community Health Centre for postmortem. Police have also seized

the bus and the bike after registering a case and further investigation is underway. Barachana police station inspector in charge Srikant Barik said efforts are on to ascertain the identity of the deceased. Two persons were injured in the Chandbali area of Bhadrak district when a speeding SUV hit two vehicles and a bicycle. The SUV first hit an

autorickshaw, then a parked scooter and cycle. The auto driver and cyclist were injured in the mishap, the police said. In the third accident, two friends travelling on a bike were killed after being hit by another motorcycle Sunday night in Binka police station area in Subarnapur district. The Binka police have registered a case and started an investigation into the case.

India, New Zealand, and the shades of transition

New Delhi: To m Latham is no stranger to Test captaincy, being New Zealand's go-to for seamlessly slipping into big leadership boots as a stand-in. Yet, this latest trip to India should add a little more weight to his broad shoulders as he arrives with what is officially his New Zealand squad. The captain's seat is not for him to keep warm in the temporary absence of an incumbent anymore - it comes with his name in block letters and a sense of permanence. But this take over comes engulfed in a struggle with form, consistency and inevitable transition. There's enough evidence in the 137 years of its existence that progress for a Test side can't always be linear. Less than four years ago, Kane Williamson and Ross Taylor saw New Zealand through to the maiden WTC crown in

Southampton against an Indian team that made such rapid strides that it called into question the very format of the competition where the champion was crowned based on a one-off final. Since then the two teams have charted very different looking graphs in whites. In all these years, India have landed on their feet with more poise when faced with the difficult situation of phasing out a few regulars. Ishant Sharma's bowl-dry abilities and leadership within the bowling group was dispensed with by the start of 2022, and Umesh Yadav didn't play a game beyond last year's World Test Championship final. The altered bowling group has still kept up India's pace in each of the WTC cycles that followed. The door, they say, is still not shut on Cheteshwar Pujara and Ajinkya

Rahane but the middle-order make-up suggests otherwise. Shubman Gill turned the tide earlier this year in the series against England and scored a ton against Bangladesh at No.3 while KL Rahul too made a strong return from injury to reclaim his middle-order spot. Besides a win for their Test philosophy, the series against England gave India a glimpse of what the next attempt at transition would be like, with Sarfaraz and Dhruv Jurel making an instant impact. Jurel's 90 in Ranchi eased India's worry lines in the absence of a difference-maker in Rishabh Pant, who too has now made an astonishing recovery to return in mint condition to the longest format just in time for another big Australian tour. Filling the gaping void of Mohammed Shami has not been easy but Akash



Deep brought some efficiency to the job of the third pacer in the side against Bangladesh - throwing his hat in the ring for an away gig to Australia this year. Even if Shami makes it back, Akash Deep has done well enough to warrant a spot as another pace option should India decide to line-up a fast bowling quartet. Even with Ravindra Jadeja and Ravichandran

Ashwin potentially in the last leg of their Test careers, India have the cushion of progressing with them until at least the next big checkpoint - the WTC final in 2025. Not having to hit reset in the middle of a cycle is a luxury that has eluded New Zealand. For instance, Kyle Jamieson, the bowling star of that 2021 final, has not been fit enough to play more than 11 of the 23 Tests

the team has played since. Their best batter Kane Williamson too has missed six of those, while Trent Boult chose to give up on the NZC contract less than a year after the Test title triumph, and eventually retired from international cricket earlier this year. New Zealand also lost a tireless fast bowler in Neil Wagner, first to injury and then to retirement in 2024.

Tim Southee is only one of the three players who has featured in all 23 games in this phase, but touches down in India with dwindling form and relinquished captaincy. Latham himself has been middling with the bat - having scored a century last in December 2022. New Zealand have put up a fight in spurts through the likes of Daryl Mitchell and Devon Conway, but inconsistent resistance will almost always fall flat against a relentless force like India at home. As the last 12 years have shown, there's never a good time to tour India for Tests. It's a fact that New Zealand were acquainted with as recently as December 2021. They now arrive with the squad further along in transition, where a young pacer like William O'Rourke - all of four Tests old, will have to bowl alongside an out-of-sorts Southee against

a batting line-up that recently displayed their propensity to not adhere to Test match batting conventions. The last week of September showed how far apart the two teams were in their Test journeys despite crossing paths on that June evening of 2021 in Southampton. India did the unthinkable in what should've ended as a damp squib in Kanpur, while New Zealand - despite batting gains in the fourth innings - succumbed to an innings defeat in Galle. As England and Bangladesh found out this year, the experience of playing India in India can be harrowing at worst, and a learning curve, at best. Latham and his lukewarm New Zealand squad might have a mountain to move over the course of the next fortnight to sway towards the latter.

Shakib joins Chittagong Kings for upcoming edition of BPL



New Delhi: Shakib Al Hasan has joined Chittagong Kings for the upcoming edition of Bangladesh Premier League. Last year, Shakib had signed a two-year deal with Rangpur Riders but later both parties parted ways on mutual understanding to help Kings bring him in as a direct signing. Fortune Barishal selected Rishad Hossain, but this was only after 40 other cricketers had already been picked by the franchises. Perhaps,

the franchises were hesitant to pick Rishad as his availability is slightly unclear after Hobart Hurricanes picked him for this season's Big Bash League. Bangladesh captain Najmul Hossain Shanto was also a late signing, with Barishal again bringing him in. Mashrafe Mortaza being placed in Group B led to a few raised eyebrows considering he did not perform well in the last edition. However, he was picked by Sylhet Strikers for whom he appeared in

the last two editions of BPL. There was a lot of uncertainty surrounding the player draft which eventually took place in Dhaka on Monday (October 14). BCB president Faruque Ahmed was pleased that the draft took place. "We were all in a lot of uncertainty. I wasn't even sure how many teams would participate. It took a lot of hard work. My BPL team also worked on it. Now, we've held the draft. With two

and a half months left until the main tournament, I'm confident the teams will be able to further strengthen their squads," said Faruque. "Most teams still have some spots to fill. So far, we've conducted the draft as planned, though it was delayed once. Given that, I wouldn't say it's been too bad," he said. "There are seven teams. We are trying many new things. It won't be 100 percent perfect but it will be better than before." Faruque also said the focus will be on providing good batting pitches for the BPL. "This time, our utmost effort will be to ensure good batting wickets where bowlers will be respected if they bowl well. I believe the wickets weren't too bad in the last tournament either. Runs were low in the daytime matches. This time, we will try to make T20 cricket more enjoyable."

BCCI does away with Impact Player rule in SMAT, two-bouncer rule retained

New Delhi: The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has done away with the Impact Player rule from the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy (SMAT), the national domestic T20 competition. While this move was largely anticipated, it is at odds with the BCCI's persistence with the rule in the IPL. Recently, the BCCI informed the IPL franchises that the rule will be retained for the upcoming season of the IPL.

The SMAT decision was confirmed to the state association by the BCCI through a communication on Monday evening. The Syed Mushtaq Ali T20 tournament starts across the country on November 23 and will run till December 15. In a short communication, the BCCI has said, "Kindly note that the BCCI has decided to do away with the provision of 'Impact Player' for the ongoing season."



The Impact Player rule was introduced in the SMAT on an experimental basis a couple of seasons ago, subsequently and expectedly adopted in the IPL as well. While it added excitement for broadcasters, turning the league into a massive visual spectacle with high totals posted and chased, it did not exactly resonate as well with the

players. Many captains and coaches felt the rule was not in the best interest of the competition. Additionally, it hindered the development of all-rounders, as teams began preferring specialist batters and bowlers over all-round players. The BCCI, however, has continued with the two-bouncer rule, a clause that was introduced in the

SMAT last season and subsequently in the IPL too. The relevant clause in the playing conditions states: "41.6.2 A bowler shall be limited to two fast short-pitched deliveries per over." The two-bouncer per over rule is a novelty in the BCCI T20 matches. Globally, the International Cricket Council (ICC) permits only one bouncer per over. The extra bouncer was welcomed by the cricketer fraternity in the country, particularly in the IPL. "It's an excellent move," Laxmipathy Balaji, a former India pacer and a former bowling coach of the Chennai Super Kings, had told Cricbuzz. "It will be a good addition to the armoury of fast bowlers and will provide bowlers, captains, and coaching staff with something to strategise and work with for a particular batter. It will also make the contest between bat and ball much more balanced."

Women's T20 World Cup: India crash out in group stage, fail to reach semis after 8 years

New Delhi: Team India suffered a heart-breaking group-stage exit from the ongoing ICC tournament after New Zealand defeated Pakistan to storm into the semi-final. India's campaign in the ICC Women's T20 World Cup 2024 came to a heartbreaking end as the Women in Blue crashed out of the ICC tournament in the group stage for the first time in eight years. Harmanpreet Kaur's side faced an early exit after a dramatic nine-run defeat to Australia, followed by New

Zealand's subsequent victory over Pakistan, which officially sealed India's fate. India finished in third place in Group A with four points, having lost two matches — against New Zealand and Pakistan. Australia topped the group as it won all four games while New Zealand finished second with six points from four games. This marks India's earliest exit since their group-stage eliminations in 2012, 2014, and 2016. In the last three editions, India had consistently

reached the semifinals, including a memorable run to the final in 2020. However, the 2024 tournament highlighted areas of concern for the Indian team, sparking questions about their preparation and approach. New Zealand stormed into the semi-finals of the Women's T20 World Cup, eliminating both India and Pakistan in the process. Pakistan's bold attempt to chase down 111 in just 10.4 overs ended disastrously, as they were bowled out for a mere 56 runs. Fatima



Sana Khan and Muneeba Ali Siddiqi were the only players to reach double digits, as Pakistan crumbled under the pressure of an aggressive start. Their total stands as the second-lowest all-out score in the history of the tournament, a bitter ending to their campaign despite their effort to play outside their usual comfort zone. New Zealand's clinical performance, particularly in the field, sealed their spot in the semi-finals. They were sharp, pulling off two run-outs and catching everything that

came their way. Kerr led the bowling attack once again, with Carson taking two wickets, while Mair, Jonas, and Tahuu chipped in with one wicket each. This marks New Zealand's first semi-final appearance since 2016, and they'll be eyeing a spot in the final—a feat they haven't achieved since 2010. For Pakistan and India, it's the end of the road in this tournament, as New Zealand march on. India were eliminated from the Women's T20 World Cup after New Zealand stormed into the

semi-finals with a commanding 54-run victory over Pakistan on Monday. Notably, India started their campaign with a lackluster performance against New Zealand, losing by 52 runs, which immediately placed them in a tough spot for semifinal qualification. However, they bounced back impressively against Pakistan, with Arundhati Reddy's three-wicket haul helping restrict Pakistan to 105/8. Despite a sluggish chase, India secured a win in 18.5 overs.
