New Delhi, (KCN): The President of India, Smt Droupadi Murmu, was in Mauritania yesterday (October 16, 2024), on the second leg of her State Visits to Algeria, Mauritania, and Malawi. On her arrival at Nouakchott-Oumtounsy Airport, President Droupadi Murmu was warmly received by the President of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania, H.E. Mr Mohamed Ould Ghazouani and accorded a ceremonial welcome. The Prime Minister and cabinet ministers of Mauritania were also present on the occasion. This is the first visit by an Indian President to Mauritania. The President was accompanied by the Minister of State, Shri Sukanata Majumdar, and Members of Parliament, Shri Mukeshkumar Dalal and Shri Atul Garg. The President addressed the members of the Indian Community in Mauritania at a Reception hosted by the Ambassador of India to Mauritania. Addressing the small but vibrant gathering of the Indian community, the President commended



the Indian community for contributing significantly to the socio-economic development of Mauritania. She said that experience are also important for India's

progress. The President appreciated the Government and people of Mauritania for supporting the Indian community. She said that because of their inclusive and welcoming spirit, the Indian community in Mauritania is prospering. After the community reception event, the President visited the Presidential Palace where she held a meeting with President Mohamed Ould Ghazouani of Mauritania. Both leaders discussed ways to further strengthen the relationship between

India and Mauritania. Subsequently, they led the delegation-level talk and witnessed the signing and exchange of four MoUs in the areas of training of diplomats, cultural exchange, visa exemption and Foreign Office consultations. Earlier, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Cooperation and Mauritanians Abroad of Mauritania, H.E. Mr Mohamed Salem Ould Merzoug called on the President in a separate engagement. The President left for Malawi – the final leg of her three-nation visit.

Habisyalis Express Dissatisfaction with Arrangements for 'Habisha Ritual' in Puri



Puri(KCN): Some habisyali women who have come to observe the month-long habisha ritual expressed their dissatisfaction with the arrangements at Brundavati Niwas on Thursday. The unrest began when unregistered habisyali women demanded the same facilities as those registered, leading to protests at Brundabati Niwas as well. Confusion

has arisen regarding the cancellation of registrations. Dissatisfaction stems from the fact that while some individuals have successfully registered, others have not. The Sub-Collector is attempting to pacify the protesters by assuring that registered women will be prioritized for facilities, and space permitting, unregistered women may also be

accommodated. With the sacred Kartika Brata commencing tomorrow, habisyali women from across the state are gathering in Puri to partake in the Habisha Brata rituals for a month. The government, under district administration oversight, has arranged for daily Mahaprasad, Lord Jagannath temple darshan, Radha Damodar puja, and month-long accommodation for 2,500 habisyali women.

India Criticizes Canada for Inaction Against Lawrence Bishnoi Gang

New Delhi(KCN): The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has expressed strong disapproval over Canada's failure to act on India's requests to arrest members of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang. Despite multiple appeals, the Canadian authorities have not addressed New Delhi's core concerns regarding the gang's activities. MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal stated that India had shared detailed information and requests with Canada, urging the



arrest of key gang members involved in various criminal activities. However, no significant action has been taken by the Canadian government. "We had shared some requests with the Canadian side for the arrest of those from Lawrence Bishnoi's gang,"

They haven't taken any action on our core concerns. There is a political motive also behind this," Jaiswal remarked.

The MEA also dismissed recent allegations made by Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau regarding the involvement of Indian government agents in the 2023 killing of Khalistani separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar. Trudeau admitted that Canada lacked “hard evidentiary proof” and relied solely on intelligence in making the accusations. In response, the MEA reiterated that Canada had not provided any evidence to substantiate its claims and rejected the “false imputations against our diplomats”.

IMD Predicts Fresh Cyclonic Circulation Over North Andaman Sea, Increased Rainfall in Odisha

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted a fresh cyclonic circulation over the North Andaman Sea by October 20, leading to the formation of a low-pressure area in the Central Bay of Bengal by October 22.

“A fresh upper air cyclonic circulation is very likely to form over North Andaman Sea around 20 October. Under its influence, a low-pressure area is



likely to form over the Central Bay of Bengal around October 22, thereafter, it is likely to move northwestwards and intensify further," the

IMD's press release stated. IMD, Director, Bhubaneswar, Manorama Mohanty said, "There are chances of rainfall in a few

Odisha districts under the influence of the low pressure during October 23 and 24.” Similarly, weather expert Sarat Sahu said, “The

fresh upper air cyclonic circulation is moving fast and is very close to making landfall either in Odisha, West Bengal, or Bangladesh on October 23 or 24. By the time it makes landfall, it will turn into a deep depression or marginal cyclone.” “Under the impact, there are chances of rainfall in coastal districts of Kendrapara, Jagatsinghpur, Balasore, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, and Dhenkanal,” he added.

Fake call centre: Odisha police seeks five-day remand of six accused

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Bhubaneswar cyber police have sought a five-day remand of the six accused who were arrested Wednesday for allegedly running a fake call centre here to cheat people, a police officer said.

Police said all the accused were produced in a local court Thursday which sent them to judicial custody for 14 days.

The accused, all from West Bengal, have been identified as Sameer Mobin (26), Md Javed Hussain (26), Md Tosif (23), Faizan Alam (24), Shaib Raza(22) and Md Haider Ali (34), police said.



Six laptops, 11 mobile phones, routers and cables were seized from their possession during a raid by Bhubaneswar cyber police. Briefing reporters, Bhubaneswar DCP Pinak Mishra said, "We have requested the court to allow us five-day

remand of the accused to get more details from them. Some investigation agencies have also contacted us to interrogate them.” Police are currently working to identify the local contacts in Odisha who helped the accused to operate a fake call

centre. Investigations are also underway to determine how many people have fallen victim to the gang and the extent of the fraudulent activities involved, he said.

The seized electronic devices have been sent for forensic analysis and a police team will be dispatched to Kolkata to verify the suspects' details.

Preliminary investigations revealed that the accused were sending fake emails to both national and international clients who had subscribed to various antivirus software, posing as customer care representatives for two

antivirus companies. Additionally, police discovered that the six accused were using laptops and mobile phones to make and receive calls from US citizens via Skype. "During interrogation, Haider Ali, the leader of the fake call centre, disclosed that his team was involved in sending fraudulent emails to clients, impersonating as customer care agents and providing fake phone numbers to induce customers into making fraudulent transactions. This operation reportedly generated a monthly income of Rs 1 lakh for the gang," another police officer said.

Odisha govt rolls out 15 vehicles for patrolling in wildlife sanctuaries

Bhubaneswar(KCN): The Odisha government Thursday rolled out 15 customised four-wheelers for patrolling different wildlife sanctuaries, including the Satkosia Tiger Reserve in Angul district, an official said. Additional Chief Secretary (ACS), Forest, Environment and Climate Change (FE&CC) Department, Satyabrata Sahu, flagged off the vehicles here in the presence of Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF) (Wildlife) Susanta Nanda.

“Strengthening of range staff will provide much-needed capacity for protection of our wildlife,” Nanda said on

ACS FE& CC department flagged of 15 vehicles for all the Ranges of Satkosia TR, Kapilas, Balukhand & Chandaka Dampada Wildlife sanctuary. The patrolling vehicles have been provided by state-owned Mahanadi Coalfields Ltd (MCL) as part of its corporate

social responsibility (CSR) initiative. Sahu said such patrolling vehicles will also be rolled out in other wildlife sanctuaries like Debrigarh in the coming days. According to officials, 12 vehicles have been rolled out for patrolling in Satkosia Tiger Reserve and three for Kapilas, Balukhanda and Chandaka-Dampada wildlife sanctuaries.

Sans local body, 8 villages left in lurch

Rourkela(KCN): In a glaring example of administrative apathy, the non-inclusion of eight villages into any local body in Sundargarh district has deprived their residents of constitutional recognition and democratic right of self-governance. The eight revenue villages — Tumkela, Hamirpur, Luakera, Tangarpali, Rengadi, Badasuna Parbat, Jharmunda, and Bankia — come under Rourkela and Raghunathpali Assembly constituencies but have not been included in any panchayat or the Rourkela Municipal

Corporation (RMC). Election after election, the villagers cast their valuable votes and elect representatives with the hope of receiving constitutional recognition and benefits. However, they have been left in the lurch for many decades in the absence of local self-government. The tribal communities residing in these villages have repeatedly demonstrated in front of the offices of Rourkela SubCollector, RMC, and also the Rourkela Additional District Magistrate pressing for their demands, but there has been no progress in



this regard. Residents say they have been living in the eight villages since pre-Independence times. The tribal population has been the original inhabitants of these villages. However, neither the administration nor the elected representatives have paid

any attention to their demands for inclusion in a local body. Their votes in every election go to waste, they lamented. Moreover, the state's Panchayati Raj department has not extended any kind of grants or benefits to these villages owing to the non-

inclusion. The tribal villagers met the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST) in Delhi September 26, 2018 to bring their issues to its attention. The NCST then ordered a ground survey and asked the Panchayati Raj department and the district administration to submit a report on the matter. As per the order, a boundary survey of these eight villages was conducted August 20 in 2022. The survey

showed that Tangarpali, Rengadi, Badasuna Parbat, and Jharmunda are closer to Suidi panchayat in Lathikata block, while Bankia, Luakera, Tumkela, and Hamirpur are near Jhirpani panchayat under Bisra block. However, even after the survey, these villages have not been included in the panchayats. Frustrated with the situation, the tribals are now planning to resort to protests if their demands are not met. On the other hand, efforts are being made to bring these villages under the RMC, despite

the Orissa High Court's interim stay order issued March 27, 2015 regarding the municipal elections. The tribals have protested such efforts to include the villages in the RMC area without their consent. They argue that they are indigenous people and should be included in the panchayat. They wish to live a free life without the burden of various municipal taxes such as house tax, road tax, and electricity tax, which would be a hardship for them, said local tribal leaders like Lachhu Oram, Mangra Oram, Ramchandra Sahu,

Gajendra Tanti, Sonu Madak, Pyari Kerketa, and Jashenta. Questioned in this regard, Additional District Magistrate, Rourkela Ashutosh Kulkarni said all the necessary reports regarding these eight villages have already been submitted to the Odisha Panchayati Raj department. The MLA of Raghunathpali has also taken considerable initiative in bringing these issues to the attention of the department. The decision is expected to come after a hearing, he added.

Interestingly, it does a great deal of glorifying a woman's beauty, referring to Triptii Dimri in the video, but ends up highlighting Vicky as the very definition of 'tall, dark, handsome'. Vicky's tryst with Punjabi music and his casual dance moves have made



many videos go viral on Instagram before, but this time, he seems almost unstoppable. The choreography does justice in utilising the actor's full potential as a dancer in a never-seen-before fashion. It was Sonam Kapoor's graceful moves on the song 'Prem Ratan Dhan Payo' which made everyone sit up, take notice, and try it again and again till they got them right. So, we didn't just get influencers, but also the brides, the bridesmaids and everyone who could keep their timidity at bay, grooving to the song with their waist out hands up. The popularity of the song made the singer, Palak Muchhal, an overnight star, and Sonam, who was not known for her dance until then, a quintessential demure Bollywood heroine.

'Maidaan' Review: Ajay Devgn strikes a goal, yet again

Ajay Devgn's 'Maidaan' is a biopic on the life of pioneering football coach, Syed Abdul Rahim. The film immortalises the unsung hero, says our review.

Listen to Story India celebrated its 'golden era' in football, even earning the moniker of 'Brazil of Asia' in the 1950s. During this time, with players like Chuni Goswami, P K Banerjee, Peter Thangaraj, Tulsidas Balamar, Jarnail Singh, and Pradyut Barman, the team ended in fourth place at the 1956 Olympics and won gold at the Asian Games in 1951 and 1962. While they played hard on the turf, Syed Abdul Rahim was the man who created and coached this team. 'Maidaan', starring Ajay Devgn, acers the job of celebrating the passion and love of 'Rahim saab' towards the sport and how he put India on the world map. However, the film is not jingoistic or only highlights his big feats - it's more about the roadblocks he faced during his stint. It's about how he fought politics, media animosity, and regional biases to build a team that could



fight against the best. 'Maidaan' is about a park with that stands by this man's deep passion, asking him to choose football rather than spend his last few months with them. It is about how 'jazbaa' (enthusiasm) is all that you need to fight the toughest opponents on any field. And when you are 'that' good at what you do, you do win over your naysayers one day Director Amit Ravindernath Sharma is used to making 30-second advertisements, and 'Maidaan' gives him a chance to helm something more than 300 times longer. He did falter in the first half of the 180-minute film, as the slow pace tests your patience. However, in

the second half, he headbutts it out of the park with an engaging screenplay and some delightful camera work. Special mention to sports directors of photography, Fyodor Lyass, Tassaduq Hussain, and Christopher Reed. Given football is a sport of movement, probably for the first time, go-pro cameras have been used in a feature film, adding to the nail-biting experience. The matches are gripping and make you cheer for the players and even shed a tear at their failure. Also, the best biopic or period film is the one that makes you want to Google more about it. 'Maidaan' scores full points with that, as many

in the audience were slyly searching more about the players or even the tournaments that Syed Abdul Rahim coached, while in the theatre. After '83', this film has also struck gold when it comes to casting. The team not only got actors who looked like the original players but also trained them to play like professionals. Chaitanya Sharma aka Slow Cheeta and Amartya Ray stand out as PK Banerjee and Chuni Goswami. So do Davinder Gill and Tejas Ravishankar as Jarnail Singh and Peter Thangaraj, respectively. Priyamani, as Rahim's wife, may have just a few scenes, but her pleasant screen presence and highly expressive face do leave an impact.

Coming to Ajay Devgn, the superstar is on a roll after 'Shaistaan' emerged as a sleeper hit earlier this year. He sheds his 'Singham' personality and embodies the part of the coach so naturally. He is known to emote through his eyes, and he does that in 'Maidaan' so well. Even with a quiet demeanour and subtle personality, he stands his ground with his players and the authorities. The film also allowed him to tap into many shades of a human personality, as Rahim tries to perfect the part of a husband, father, and coach. He is also marvellous in the emotional scenes, especially when he sees the love of his life - football - slipping away from him. However, we would have to give a yellow card to the dialogue and music department of the film. Apart from the 'Team India' song, none of the AR Rahman compositions really stand out in the film. Given that sports films are high on adrenaline, we also expected some more dialoguebaazi that could pump things up. There is an SRK-esque '70-minute' coach diktat

like 'Chak De', as Rahim talks about the power of 'one' as a team and position in the game. But given Rahim's soft personality, the makers may have chosen to underplay it, keeping things quite non-dramatic. However, one of the sequences where Ajay's character calls out a senior sports journalist, Roy Choudhury (played brilliantly by Gajraj Rao), and uses Elvis Presley's statement - 'Don't criticise what you don't understand. You never walked in that man's shoes' - did have the theatre whistling. 'Maidaan' is not only a treat for football enthusiasts but also quite a delight for movie lovers. It immortalises the unsung hero, after whom India never qualified for the Olympics. Rahim, in one scene, says 'Kismat haathon se nahi, pairon se likhi jaati hai (destiny is written by foot, not hands)'. While it was the truth back then, you realise in reality, luck favours the brave, and SA Rahim was truly Indian football's Braveheart.

Why should I vote?

(A call of an unemployed youth under creamy layer for justice)



At 30 years old, I find myself grappling with unemployment and the restrictions imposed by the “creamy layer” classification. As the son of a central government employee, I am excluded from various benefits, making it difficult to secure a job, access healthcare, pursue further education, or even start my own business. While I am deemed privileged by the government’s standards, the reality is starkly different. My frustration lies not just in my personal struggles but in the systemic failure that denies me opportunities and support, leading me to question: Why should I vote?

Under the current system, families earning more than Rs.8 lakh annually, or where parents hold government jobs at certain levels, are categorized as creamy layer. According to government data, more than 27% of the Indian population belongs to the OBC category. However, out of this, roughly 10% of the families fall under the creamy layer, rendering them ineligible for key benefits. This 10% comprises many individuals like me who, despite having a relatively stable family income, are far from wealthy. We are excluded from crucial opportunities for social mobility, such as reservations in government jobs, which significantly reduces our employment prospects. Statistically, youth unemployment in India stands at approximately 23.75% for those between the ages of 20 and 34. Without the cushion of age relaxation

or reserved categories, my chances of securing a government job have been dramatically reduced, leaving me to fend for myself in an oversaturated private job market. This is a significant issue in a country where the public sector is still one of the most sought-after career paths for job security. India’s healthcare system is already strained, with over 63 million people falling into poverty due to healthcare costs annually. Programs like the Ayushman Bharat Yojana aim to alleviate this burden by providing health insurance to vulnerable families, covering up to Rs.5 lakh per family per year. However, as someone from the creamy layer, I am automatically ineligible for this scheme. A significant portion of healthcare costs in India, approximately 62.4%, is borne out-of-pocket by individuals. My family is no exception to this, and despite my father’s

g o v e r n m e n t background, the Central Government Health Scheme provides limited coverage for dependents once the employee is no longer in active service. With medical expenses rising sharply—hospitalization costs have increased by over 300% in the last decade—I am left vulnerable to financial strain without access to government healthcare schemes. Education is often the key to overcoming socioeconomic barriers, but even this avenue is largely closed to me due to my creamy layer status. India’s higher education system offers several scholarship schemes, such as the Post-Matric Scholarship for OBC Students and the National Fellowship for OBC candidates, which provide financial assistance for further studies. These programs have a significant impact, as they support nearly 40 lakh students annually. However, the creamy layer classification

renders me ineligible for these scholarships. Additionally, the All India Survey on Higher Education reports that only 26.3% of Indian youth are enrolled in higher education. Financial constraints are a significant barrier for many aspiring students, and for those like me, pursuing higher education without government support becomes a difficult proposition. Private institutions charge exorbitant fees, with professional courses such as engineering or management costing upwards of Rs.10–15 lakh. This leaves me with limited options to upgrade my qualifications and improve my employability. In recent years, the government has launched several initiatives to p r o m o t e entrepreneurship among the youth. Schemes such as the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana provide loans of up to Rs.10 lakh

for small enterprises, and the Stand-Up India scheme offers loans to SC/ST and women entrepreneurs. However, as a male member of the creamy layer, I do not qualify for targeted schemes that offer concessional loans or financial backing for new businesses. Data shows that only about 17% of Indian startups are able to secure financial support in their initial stages, highlighting the difficulty of starting a business without access to funding. Without financial support, many potential entrepreneurs, like me, find their business ideas stifled before they even take off. The arbitrary income cap of Rs. 8 lakh per year to classify families as creamy layer fails to take into account inflation, regional variations in living costs, or individual family expenses rendering the classification out of touch with the economic realities many families face. Additionally, while

my father’s central government job might seem like a ticket to financial stability, the actual disposable income we have is far less than what the government assumes. The assumption that being part of the creamy layer equates to financial privilege overlooks the many hidden costs and financial responsibilities that families like mine bear. As I stand at this crossroads, I find myself asking: why should I vote? What have I gained from this government or any previous one? Despite numerous schemes promising support for health, education, employment, and entrepreneurship, I find myself excluded from them due to my creamy layer status. The system has failed me, and many others like me, by creating an arbitrary classification that denies opportunities to those who genuinely need them. Voting is meant to be a way to effect change, but when the

system is designed to exclude people like me, the very act of voting feels futile. Why should I vote for a government that has continually overlooked my struggles and failed to provide me with the opportunities I need to secure a better future? The creamy layer classification, while well-intentioned, has become a barrier to opportunity for many individuals who fall under its purview. It is time for the government to reassess this policy and create more inclusive solutions that reflect the economic realities faced by its citizens. Until then, the question remains: why should I vote for a system that has left me behind?

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan: The Peacemaker in India's Multi-ethnic Society.

Syed Ahmad Taqvi bin Syed Muhammad Muttaqi, well known as Sir Syed Ahmad Khan, was born on (17 Oct, 1817, Delhi_died on 27 March,1898, Aligarh) into a devoted Nawabi family. During the foundation period, he studied the Quran and many other sciences. His mother, Aziz un Nisa, had a significant influence in his early years, instilling in him a strong sense of discipline and a stronger focus on contemporary education. In contemporary Indian history, Sir Syed Ahmad Khan marks a unique and distinctive moment. Despite his wide range of interests and his well-known prowess in the fields of history, theology, jurisprudence, and social and educational reforms, his political beliefs, thoughts, and deeds have caused historians and political analysts of subsequent times to have differing views. He saw a period of historical change from the fall of the medieval government to the establishment of the contemporary colonial government. He embraced modernity and promoted contemporary western scientific education for the Muslims who were then living in medieval times, rejecting the revivalist impulses that

were common among a persecuted and devastated Muslim population. This had a significant impact on his political beliefs and behavior as well. It is widely acknowledged that Sir Syed Ahmad Khan was a remarkable visionary, educator, philosopher, social reformer, and thinker. His numerous works include Asar Us Sanadid, Ain-e-Akbari,Risala-e-Asbab-e-Bagawat-e-Hind (The Causes of the Indian Mutiny of 1857), Hayat-e-Javed, Tarikh-e-Firoz Shahi, Tuzk-e-Jahangiri, Jam-i-jum, Silsilat-ul-Mulk, Khutbat-e-Ahmediya(A Series of Essays on the Life of Prophet Muhammad PBUH) as a response to William Muir’s book The Life of Prophet, Kalamat-e-Haq,Tafsir-al Quran and The Loyal Muhammadans of India. His writings made it apparent that he was a social reformer who wished to do away with customs and rituals that were unworkable. His use of logic and reasoning served as the foundation for his views. He personally stayed away from the society’s irrational and unworkable customs and sought to keep its members at bay. He also expressed his opinions on the negative social practices, especially in the Muslim community, in Urdu writings such as Rasoomaat and Bahes-o-Takrar. Sir Syed established the Tehzeeb-ul-Akhlaq, which was committed to enforcing moral education and removing immoral

activities from Muslim society, in an effort to persuade the Muslims to embrace modern education. Regarding the Shia and Sunni dispute, he also addressed it in his Urdu-translated work Tuhfa-i-Isna Ashriya. In the 1850s, he was very interested in seeing education progress. He saw the value of a c o n t e m p o r a r y education—which at the time was only offered in English-speaking schools nationwide—while researching a number of subjects, including European law. He was charged with British influence because he opposed religious dogma and outdated ideologies, but this did not stop him from being passionate about empowering and changing the country. The nation's ultimate aims of wealth, peace, harmony, and political stability can only be attained via education, according to Sir Syed Ahmad, who highlighted the value of modern education. “Look forward, pick up fresh knowledge, and don’t waste time learning boring old things.”Although he did not undermine Muslims’ identity, he did support the modernization and reformation of society, especially among Muslims who were falling behind. In addition to advocating for Hindu-Muslim harmony, Sir Syed was a pioneer of interfaith communication on the subcontinent. He was a supporter, promoter, and ambassador of peace

among India’s major communities rather than someone who was hostile to the local population. His sayings, which focused heavily on compassion and peaceful cohabitation among diverse religion followers, demonstrate his vision of not just peaceful coexistence in a heterogeneous society but also cooperation and social harmony. He once said, “We (Hindus and Muslims) eat the exact same food, drink water from the same rivers, and breathe the same air; we are the two eyes of the exquisite bride that is Hindustan; weakness in either one of them will spoil the beauty of the bride (Dulhan)”in reference to maintaining peaceful communal harmony amongst interreligious groups, particularly Hindus and Muslims in the late 1980s. The unity, fraternity, and cooperation of society’s many elements are necessary for a pluralistic and developing society, as Sir Syed recognized. In order to implement the principle, he kept the college’s doors open to all students, and in 1898, there were 64 Hindu and 285 Muslim students enrolled, along with seven Hindu staff members.

He once said in front of a crowd, “Remember that the labels Hindu and Muslim should only be used for religious differentiation; otherwise, all people who reside in this country belong to the same nation.” He emphasized to his fellow citizens that “fighting for the welfare of all people, regardless of caste or religion, is the first and essential task of all well-wishers of the country.” He is said to have emphasized that if we ignore the portion of ourselves that we owe to God, then we are both basically one nation since we are both citizens of India, and collaboration between us is the only way for our country to develop. Additionally, he emphasized that social interactions, mutual respect, love, and compassion between Muslims and Hindus should not be hampered by religious differences between them, which should also not be hampered by political difficulties. At another point, he said, Muslims and Hindus should work to make their hearts and souls one in line with this ethic. Only by sticking together will we be able to live; otherwise, we will soon perish. He held that all faith adherents should be united and live in harmony with one another in order to cooperate and struggle for the betterment of society as a whole. Through his prose, literature, and poetry, he frequently emphasized the value of Hindu-Muslim unity and urged Muslims and Hindus to stand firm and cooperate even in the face of the colonial forces’ post-1857 uprising. Sir Syed emphasized the importance of employing modern education to achieve intellectual advancement for people of all religions, but especially for Muslims. In

actualy, he was the first Muslim from India to progress to the institutional and scientific foundations of Muslim modernity in South Asia. Despite great challenges and criticism from all quarters, including his own people, he persisted because of his love for his country and his strong conviction that modern education is essential. He tried to use a thread of rich and complex cultural diversity to bring the populace together. He articulated his views on culture in the first edition of his journal Tehzeeb-ul-Akhlaq, writing, “The objective of building this complete degree of civilization, meaning culture, so that the hate with which the civilised (cultured) countries look them should fade away, and they may likewise be called to be (one of the) elevated and cultured nations of the earth.” He went into further detail about this in two lengthy articles named “Culture and its Definition” and “Civilization or Sophistication and Culture” that were published in Tehzeeb-ul-Akhlaq. According to Sir Syed, promoting harmonious society, engagement, and peaceful coexistence all depend on education and related learning objectives. To illustrate his point, Sir Syed used the metaphor of an eye that weeps for the agony and suffering of every part of the body: the same metaphor used by Hakeemul Ummat Alama Iqbal in below couplet “Mubtalaye Dard Koi Uzoo Ho, Roti Hai Aankh

Kis Qadar Hamdard Saray Jism Ki Hoti Hai Aankh.” He had so sworn to reform, educate, and empower communities outside the boundaries of religion, caste, and creed, and the hardships of all civilizations would make him unhappy. The greatest example still in existence is AMU (Aligarh Muslim University), whose first graduate was a Hindu named Ishwari Prasad. Its accomplishments are spreading around the world and cutting across religious boundaries. Being a multi-religious, multi-cultural, and multilingual country, India is currently going through a very challenging time. The ideas of the Muslim reformers must be immediately remembered as intolerance spreads not just in India but all across the world at this crucial juncture, when hate crimes are on the increase, mostly between Muslims and Hindus, and certain fringe elements with their own small-scale political agendas are purposefully sowing hatred and animosity among all segments of society. There is something for everyone, including hate speech, racial violence, mob lynching, intolerance for minorities, anti-immigrant sentiments, and more. The best way to combat all forms of violence and prejudice both within and between people is to engage in intra- and inter-religious discussion, find and promote the commonalities found in all religions, communicate with the masses in a language they understand, and provide them with

educational opportunities that they can grasp. Sir Syed’s message of religious peace offers a rejuvenating, welcoming location to start the process of developing harmony, unity, and compassion in society. In fact, his final words, which are inscribed on a large sandstone pillar in one of the University Circles, perfectly capture his philosophy and the goals he pursued during his life, which were primarily to elevate Muslim Qaom by transferring knowledge, morals, and discipline for a successful Qaom; read as: “Oh my dear children, you have reached a particular stage, and remember one thing that when I undertook the task, there was criticism all around against me, abuses were hurled upon me, life had become so difficult for me that I aged before my age, I lost my hair, my eyesight, but not my vision. My vision never dimmed, my determination never failed, I built this institution for you and I am sure, you will carry the light of this institution far and wide, darkness will disappear from all around”. Sham dar sham jalenge Teri yaadon ke Chiragh, Nasl dar nasl Tera dard numaya hoga ! Happy 207th Birthday Sir Syed Ahmad Khan! May Almightyelevate your rank in Jannah...Aameen!

ADVANCE RESERVATION PERIOD FOR TRAIN JOURNEY, REDUCED TO 60 DAYS

Kolkata, (KCN):So long, there was a confusion in the minds of passengers regarding "when the reservation will be done" in 120 days, but Indian Railways has removed the puzzle and introduced reservation in 60 days instead of 120 days, which is good news for passengers. There are many passengers who find it difficult to plan their journey long in advance due to several limitations. The Railways has

reduced the Advanced Reservation Period (ARP) for train journeys from 120 days to 60 days. The revised new ARP will be effective as follows: 1. With effect from November 1, 2024, the ARP will be 60 days (excluding the day of journey) and booking will be done accordingly. However, all the bookings done up to October 31, 2024 under ARP of 120 days will remain intact. 2. Cancellation of the earlier booking made

beyond the ARP of 60 days will however be permitted. 3. There will be no change in the case of certain day time express train like Taj Express, Gomti Express etc. where lower time limits for advance reservation are at present in force. 4. There will be no change in the case of limit in the 365 days for foreign tourists in international trains like that of Bandhan Express & Maitree Express trains.

"Need Justice, My Family Needs Justice": MLA Zeeshan Siddique On Father's Murder

Mumbai(KCN): In his first reaction after his father and former Maharashtra minister Baba Siddique was shot dead last week, Bandra East MLA Zeeshan Siddique has said he and his family want justice. Mr Siddique also made an appeal that his father's death should not be politicised and nor should it go in vain. In a post on X on Thursday, Zeeshan Siddique wrote: "My father lost his life protecting and saving the lives and homes of poor innocent people. Today, my family is broken but his death must not be politicised and definitely not go in vain. I NEED JUSTICE, MY FAMILY NEEDS JUSTICE!" Baba Siddique, 66, was shot dead by three men outside Zeeshan's Bandra East office around 9.30 pm on Dussehra, October 13. Police had said six bullets were fired at him, four of which hit him and another hit an aide in the leg. Siddique was rushed to the Lilavati Hospital, where he was declared dead. Two of the shooters, Gurmail Baljit Singh



from Haryana and Dharamraj Kashyap from Uttar Pradesh, were arrested soon after the murder while Shiv Kumar Gautam, who is also from Uttar Pradesh, is on the run. On Sunday, Kashyap had claimed in a Mumbai court that his age was 17 despite his Aadhar card stating that he was 19, and a bone ossification test had been ordered. On Monday, the results of the test proved that he is not a minor. Police sources said the suspects have claimed that they work for gangster Lawrence Bishnoi, who is lodged in Gujarat's Sabarmati jail, and the same claim was

made in a social media post on Sunday. The Facebook post was made on the handle of one Shubuu Lonkar, believed to be Bishnoi gang associate Shubham Rameshwar Lonkar, claiming responsibility for the murder. Police said the post was made by Lonkar's brother, Pravin, who was arrested from Pune on Sunday evening. On Tuesday, another arrest was made in the case - that of Harishkumar Balakram, 23, from Bahraich in Uttar Pradesh. Balakram worked as a scrap dealer in Pune and officials said he was part of the conspiracy to kill Baba

Siddique. The alleged handler of the three shooters, Mohammad Zeeshan Akhtar, is also on the run. Baba Siddique, who was a three-time MLA from Bandra West, was associated with the Congress for 48 years. He had quit the party in February and joined Ajit Pawar's Nationalist Congress Party (NCP). Zeeshan Siddique was expelled from the Congress in August. The NCP leader was murdered ahead of the Assembly elections in Maharashtra and the opposition has attacked the Eknath Shinde-led ruling BJP-NCP-Shiv Sena coalition over the

law-and-order situation in the state. After the killing, NCP (Sharadchandra Pawar) President Sharad Pawar had said people in the government should take responsibility and step down from their posts. "The deteriorating law and order situation in the state is a matter of concern. It is sad that former state minister Baba Siddique was shot dead in the country's financial capital, Mumbai. If the Home minister and the rulers will take the state's vehicle forward with such leniency, it can be a warning sign for the common people. This not only needs to be investigated, the rulers need to accept responsibility and step down from their posts. My heartfelt tribute to Baba Siddique and condolences to his family," he wrote in Marathi on X. Chief Minister Shinde said law and order had deteriorated under the alliance led by the opposition coalition, which is known as the Maha Vikas Aghadi, and promised that the people responsible for Siddique's killing would not be spared.

25 Lakh Contract For Salman Khan Hit, AK-47 From Pak: Chargesheet



New Delhi(KCN): A contract of ₹ 25 lakh was taken out to kill actor Salman Khan near his farmhouse in Maharashtra's Panvel, a chargesheet filed by the Navi Mumbai Police stated. In the chargesheet that named five people, police stated that the contract was taken out by the gang led by jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi. The accused were preparing to buy state-of-the-art weapons AK 47, AK 92 and M 16 from Pakistan and the Turkish-made Zigana weapon, with which Punjabi singer Sidhu Moosewala was killed. The accused had hired boys below 18 years of age to kill Salman Khan, all of whom are hiding in Pune, Raigad, Navi Mumbai, Thane and Gujarat. About 60 to 70 people were keeping track of Salman Khan's movement, especially at his Bandra house, Panvel farmhouse and Goregaon Film City. Further, the plan to kill Salman Khan was hatched between August 2023 and April 2024, as per the chargesheet. Investigation revealed that Sukkha, who was arrested from Haryana's Panipat on Thursday, assigned the hit to the designated shooter Ajay Kashyap alias AK and four others involved in the conspiracy. A recce by Kashyap and his team led to the conclusion that owing to the actor's tight security and bulletproof vehicles, high-end weapons would be required to carry out the murder.

2 Months On, Former Bangladesh PM Sheikh Hasina Still In India

New Delhi(KCN): Former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, who came to India in early August, is still in the country, the foreign ministry said today after a court in Bangladesh ordered her arrest. "On the stay of the former Prime Minister I had earlier mentioned that she had come here at a short notice and she continues to be here," a spokesperson said. Sheikh Hasina had arrived in India on August 5, as an uprising led by students against her turned violent. The government had not mentioned how long she would stay and there was much speculation about her final destination. A number of names have come up, including US, UK and even Finland. "At very short notice, she requested approval to come for the moment to India. We simultaneously received a request for flight clearance from the Bangladesh authorities. She arrived yesterday



evening in Delhi," foreign minister S Jaishankar said a day after she landed at the Hindon airport, near Delhi. Her son Sajeed Wazed, who is based in Washington, had said the 76-year-old was contemplating retirement and is likely to divide her time between her family members. Asked about multiple reports about UK's "silence" her request for asylum and revocation of her visa by the US, he had said that she has not requested asylum "anywhere". Today, Bangladesh's International Crimes Tribunal issued arrest

warrants against the former Prime Minister and 45 others -- including her party Awami League's top leaders -- for alleged crimes against humanity. The warrants came on the first day of the judicial proceedings started by the re-constituted tribunal, Dhaka Tribune newspaper said. So far more than 60 complaints of enforced disappearance, murder and mass killings have been filed at the ICT against Hasina, other leaders of her Awami League party and the 14-party alliance, journalists and former top officials of law enforcement agencies.

Malnutrition strikes again in two Jajpur villages

Jajpur(KCN): The death of 19 children in July 2016 due to malnutrition in the three Nagada villages in this district grabbed international attention. However, it seems that neither the district administration nor the state government has learnt from that tragedy. Eight years on hunger and malnutrition continue to plague other areas. Sources informed here Tuesday that 10 cases of malnutrition have been reported from villages adjacent to Nagada. Six cases including two who are suffering from acute malnutrition, have been reported from Tumuni

village which is to the left of Nagada. Four more cases of acute malnutrition have been reported from Taladiha village which is to the right of Nagada. In all the 10 cases, those affected are kids. Chief district medical officer (CDMO), Shibashis Moharana on getting the news directed the medical officer of Sukinda CHC to rescue the malnutrition-afflicted kids from Tumuni and Taladiha villages and admit them for treatment in a nutrition rehabilitation centre. He also asked him to rush a medical team to the villages, Tuesday. However, no medical team visited these two

villages when reports last came. A six-member team only visited Nagada and returned. They avoided visiting Tumuni and Taladiha as there are no pucca roads to the villages. The members of the team refused to walk through forests, fearing attacks by wild animals. Lack of connectivity to many villages in this district is one of the main causes of malnutrition among kids, locals pointed out. Both children and adults have always been deprived of proper food and treatment facilities as they stay in remote areas. Despite the presence of



many prominent industries in Kalina g ana g ar, Sukinda, Danagadi and Dharmasala of this district, the poverty that exists in many villages is a huge cause of worry. Locals pointed out that many mining

units and companies earn revenue in crores by using forest, land and water in the district but they do not come to aid of those suffering from hunger malnutrition and other diseases. The death of the 19 kids due to malnutrition was sort of

an eye-opener. The Odisha government constructed a road through the hills to the Nagada villages spending over Rs 13 crore. The state government also ensured education, healthcare, power supply, drinking water facilities and

distribution of essentials through a public distribution system to Nagada villages. However, no road has been constructed to connect Tumuni village which is about 2.7km from Nagada. It is inhabited by 25 tribal families who eke out their living by collecting wild fruits, herbs and honey from the jungle and selling those in the weekly market. With the money they earn, they use it to buy kerosene and other rations. However, on many occasions, the money is not enough for them to meet their daily requirements. Tumuni village is located in such a remote area that a villager

wishing to buy salt, leaves home in the morning and returns only the next day. As the area is forested, there is always the chance of animal attacks. Several residents of Tumuni village have lost their lives to bear attacks in the past. The village does not have electricity. The situation in Taladiha village is similar to that of Tumuni. Here also road connectivity is an issue. When contacted, Moharana said that every Thursday a medical team is visiting the two villages. However, the residents of the two villages are not ready to follow the advice given to them due to which they suffer from malnutrition, he added.

Villagers attack police team in Binika; 22 held



Sonepur / Binika(KCN): Binika police Wednesday arrested 22 persons from Papi (Anandnagar) village in Subarnapur district on charge of attacking and injuring three police personnel while they were trying to rescue three minor boys held captive by the villagers since Tuesday night. According to reports, three minor boys from Rampur village allegedly attacked a villager and attempted to loot his mobile and bike near SinghijubaKhairamal road Tuesday night. However, they were caught, brutally thrashed and held hostage by the

villagers inside the clubhouse. When police Wednesday morning tried to take the trio into their custody, they were opposed by the villagers. Binika police then sought the help of Rampur police and deployed a platoon of force in front of the clubhouse. While a discussion was going on between the police and the villagers, police tried to rescue the accused from the clubhouse which irked the villagers. The angry villagers attacked the accused along with the police team injuring Sub Inspector Sujata Budek, ASI Trinath Sahu and constable Gopinath Sahu

of Binika PS. The villagers also ransacked the police van, broke its windshields and punctured its tyres. Later, more police personnel rushed to the spot and rescued the minors. They were detained at the Binika PS after a medical examination. Following a complaint lodged by the villagers, police registered a case against the three accused and arrested them. Similarly, Binika police also registered a case (357/24) against the villagers for attacking police personnel as per a written complaint lodged by injured SI Sujata Budek.

Police arrested 22 villagers and forwarded them to the court. The number of arrests may increase, informed the police. On the other hand, hundreds of villagers from Singhijuba, Papi and Anandnagar area gathered in front of Binika police station. Meanwhile, Northern Range IG Himansu Kumar Lal reached the police station and took stock of the situation. Subarnapur SP Ram Prasad Sahu, Sonepur SDPO Pratap Tripathy and IIC Sarangadhar Panigrahi along with a police team rushed to the spot and launched an investigation.

Bereaved Father Donates Son's Organs through KIMS, Saves Three Lives

Bhubaneswar, Oct 17(KCN): Displaying extraordinary compassion, Kailash Chandra Sahoo, a grieving father from Aripada village in Kendrapada district, has donated the organs of his 23-year-old son, Manoj Kumar Sahoo, who was declared brain dead following an accident here.


Manoj, who worked at a private firm, met with the accident four days ago and was admitted to KIMS. He received serious injuries on his neck from the mishap and was declared brain dead. Speaking about his decision, Kailash Chandra Sahoo, a driver by profession, said, "I decided to donate my



son's organs so that three other lives could be saved." Prof (Dr) Dr. R.C. Das, Medical Superintendent, KIMS, commended the father's selflessness. "Organ donation is a regular process governed by strict guidelines. Every brain-dead case is assessed to ensure the possibility of

organ donation as per the government mandate. In this instance, the father himself came forward, expressing his willingness to donate his son's organs. His realisation of the value of organ donation is truly inspiring." The two kidneys and one liver will be transplanted

in separate hospitals in Bhubaneswar. "Three lives will be saved because of this generous act," Dr. Das added, expressing deep gratitude to Kailash for his courageous decision. The Delhi Capitals' search for new support staff appears to have concluded, with the franchise finalising its team for the next two IPL seasons. While there remains some element of uncertainty over Rishabh Pant's future with the team, it is confirmed that Hemang Badani will take charge as head coach for the upcoming two seasons. Additionally, Badani's former India teammate, Venugopal Rao, will serve as the



team's director of cricket. The two, who have long played together for MRF in the Chennai league, are known for their strong association and professional understanding, and the Delhi Capitals management has granted them the freedom to select the rest of the coaching staff. Replacing the likes of Ricky Ponting, who served as the franchise's head coach for the past seven years may not be easy but the management has apparently made a conscious decision to not

go for big names. Venugopal (42) played 16 ODIs and represented three sides, including Delhi Capitals. Badani (47) represented India in four Tests and 40 ODIs. Both Venugopal and Badani have been involved with the franchise's subsidiaries elsewhere - mainly in the ILT20 in UAE and Major League Cricket (MLC) in the US. Incidentally, both those sides - Dubai Capitals and Seattle Orcas - are owned by Delhi Capitals co-owner Kiran Kumar Grandhi of the GMR Group. The JSW group is the other

co-owner of the Delhi side and as reported previously, the GMR group currently holds the reins of the franchise management that alternates between the partners every two years. As for Pant, whose midnight post on October 12 sparked a wave of curiosity in IPL circles, he is understood to be set to continue with the team. Currently occupied with a Test assignment, the management is refraining from disturbing him, but they expect him to confirm his commitment after the series. For the record, the franchise has

time until October 31 to announce their player retentions.

Meanwhile, a major talking point in the IPL is that several players, some big names at that, are opting not to be retained, choosing instead to test their market value in the auction. They are emboldened by the new Right to Match (RTM) rule, which allows the highest bidder one final chance to lift their bid to the amount of their choice before the RTM is exercised. Although the new clause has faced opposition from some franchises, it has empowered player agents - especially those representing foreign players - to start negotiations with teams for better deals. While a new franchise may not always secure the player, the auction can drive up the player's value to the desired amount. Some player managers, it is learnt, have opened up back channel discussions for their clients.

Dale Steyn confirms exit as Sunrisers Hyderabad bowling coach

New Delhi: Dale Steyn, the former South Africa pacer, announced that he won't return as the bowling coach of Sunrisers Hyderabad for the upcoming season of the Indian Premier League (IPL). Steyn, however, added that he will continue in a coaching capacity with Sunrisers Eastern Cape in the SA20 league. "A big thank you to Sunrisers Hyderabad for my few years with them as bowling coach at the IPL, unfortunately, I won't be returning for IPL 2025," Steyn stated in a post on X. "However, I will continue to work with Sunrisers Eastern Cape in the SA20 here in South Africa." Earlier this year, Steyn had made himself unavailable for IPL 2024 due to personal reasons and Sunrisers brought in former New Zealand cricketer James Franklin as their bowling coach to work alongside head coach Daniel Vettori.



The 41-year old Steyn had represented Deccan Chargers (now defunct), Royal Challengers Bangalore, Sunrisers and Gujarat Lions (now defunct) in the IPL during his playing days. He last played for RCB in IPL 2020 before being named bowling coach of Sunrisers ahead of the 2022 season. He is credited with playing a significant role in the development of Umran

Malik and several other pacers in the Sunrisers ranks. Sunrisers reached the final of IPL 2024 before losing to KKR. This was their first appearance in an IPL final since finishing runners up in 2018. Sunrisers could look at retaining their coaching staff considering their success under the Vettori-Franklin combo last year.

Paul Pogba keeps World Cup 2026 dream with France after doping ban reduction

New Delhi: Paul Pogba has claimed that he still keeps the World Cup 2026 dream alive and is eager to make a return to the playing field with Juventus. Pogba last played a match almost a year ago. Juventus midfielder Paul Pogba is keen to make his football comeback after his doping ban was reduced from four years to 18 months and is dreaming about playing in the 2026 World Cup. Pogba had been provisionally suspended by Italy's National Anti-Doping Agency (NADO Italia) in September 2023 after testing positive for DHEA, a banned substance known to enhance testosterone. Earlier this month, the Court of Arbitration for

Sport (CAS) reduced the 31-year-old's ban. Pogba maintained that the consumption of DHEA was unintentional. He is set to return to action for Juventus in March. Speaking to Gazzetta dello Sport, the French midfielder said that while national coach Didier Deschamps hasn't kept the door for anyone it is up to him to work and take the chance. "The dream of the World Cup is there, but Deschamps hasn't opened the doors for anyone. It's up to me to open them he told me to work," the midfielder said. Pogba said that he is ready to return to normal in 2025 and his desire is to play football. The midfielder also said that

he remains a player for Juventus for the moment. Pogba said he is ready to give up money to be back for Juve on the field. "I am ready to return to normal in 2025. I only have one desire, to play football. The reality is that I am a Juve player and I am preparing to play for Juve," "I don't have to speak, the pitch will speak and then (coach) Thiago Motta will judge with his own eyes, based on what he sees. I'm ready to give up even money to play for Juve again. I want to come back," said Pogba. The French midfielder said that getting the initial ban was the most toughest moment in his life. The 31-year-old said that his former and current teammates was a constant support for him during this period.

Sajid Khan puts another positive spin on Pakistan's dramatic turnaround measures

New Delhi: There have been few sessions - and fewer days - in the last four Tests between Pakistan and England that the former could truly claim to be theirs. It is certain that Pakistan will never have had dinner twice in as many days, content with themselves and their performance against England. The hosts entered the second Multan Test after their most humiliating defeat in the format in recent memory. As Joe Root and Harry Brook racked up record after record, Sajid Khan was hatching a plan - one that he never thought he would get to execute - to stop the latter in his tracks. As fate would have it, Pakistan took some drastic steps over the weekend to force their way back into the series. One of those included putting Sajid on an

eight-hour drive from his hometown of Peshawar to Multan. It was not as controversial as the others, but Sajid had not played competitive red-ball cricket since the first week of January, when he opened the bowling for Pakistan at Sydney in the second innings and accounted for Usman Khawaja in the first over to give his side some bleak hope of defending 130. That he was playing in Sydney was because Abrar Ahmed and Noman Ali - who Pakistan have placed ahead of him in the pecking order over the last two years - were unavailable. Sajid had last played in the format almost two years ago against the same opposition on the pitches that the Pakistan Cricket Board had specifically got designed to make sure his brethren - Nathan Lyon - was put



through the proverbial ring. Before that, Sajid had picked up eight wickets in an innings in Bangladesh. That spell promised a new dawn for a country running out of spin-bowling stocks, but Pakistan, after the home series against Australia, axed Sajid rather than taking him to Sri Lanka, one of the countries with the most hospitable conditions for finger spinners. Pakistan had solid grounds

imminent as Duckett and Root showcased their towering credentials against spin bowling. As Duckett brushed away the close catch-in fielders with his audacious sweeps and scoops, Root's elegant drives off long strides drives and punches off the backfoot had the Pakistan spinners toiling on a pitch that - as data would say - continued to get difficult to bat on. But, such was the batters' class that they brought back the memories of last week's dead surface where England batted with ease and comfort. Pakistan needed the odds to go in their favour and there was Sajid, with 'a little luck'.

Too soon, but not soon enough for another Australia-South Africa epic

New Delhi: With apologies to Prince and Sinead O'Connor, it's been one year, seven months and 21 days. Or 599 days. Or 14,376 hours. Or 862,560 minutes. Or 51,753,600 seconds. At least, it will be when the first ball is bowled in the women's T20 World Cup semifinal between Australia and South Africa in Dubai on Thursday.

In other words, it's too soon. Not enough time has passed, for South Africans, to take the raw edge off the events of February 26 last year at Newlands.

For the Australians, it was another World Cup final - their 16th across both formats. For the South Africans, it was their first final - by any senior team



from their country. For the Australians, it was another triumph - by 19 runs to clinch their 13th white-ball title. For the South Africans on the field, in the stands, and watching from afar, it was hope crushed. The women had gone one step further than the men's team had then been. To be pushed back from where they had come hurt more than could be imagined. It still does.

Worse, unlike in the men's T20 World Cup final at Kensington Oval in June, when India beat South Africa by seven runs in a white-knuckle classic, the Aussies seemed hardly stretched. Their 156/6 was their lowest total in the three games in the tournament in which they had batted first. No matter. They simply bowled and fielded better than they had batted to stifle South

Africa's reply. Shabnim Ismail was all but ablaze with effing and blinding incandescence when she roared in to bowl in her 241st and last international. Laura Wolvaardt's bat looked like it was carving ice as she held her nerve and with it her compatriots' dreams in an innings that might have realised the unthinkable. Until it didn't. Midway through the 17th over with 48 needed off 22, Megan Schutt went full and straight and had Wolvaardt bang to rights lbw. No such passion was discernible in any of the Australians. When they needed to go up a gear, they did. You could almost hear and see the clicking and movement of the gears. They were a machine, and not in a

complimentary way. It was as if AI stood for Australian Indifference. Even when, hours after the match, they emerged from the dressing room and sat around the pitch for a few minutes, there were no obvious signs of happiness. Maybe that's what happens when you've been there, done that, and got so many trophies.

Had that been the South Africans, they wouldn't have left the field in the first place. There would have been too many laps of honour to take, too many bows to make, too many tears of joy to shed, too many smiles to smile, too many other South Africans to wave at and hug and share the moment and the selfies and the gleam of the trophy with.

There would have been a fear that, if they went to the dressing room, they would wake up and discover it was all only a dream.

So it was heartening to see that their spirit has survived last year's blow. They were training at the ICC academy in Dubai on Tuesday when their place in the semi was confirmed by what had happened two kilometres away at the main stadium.

England batted first against West Indies, and their 141/7 meant South Africa had sealed second place in group A because their net runrate was 0.291 better than England's. The top spot would go to the winners of that game - the Windies, as it would transpire.
