

## 'Dana' aftermath: Odisha CM conducts aerial survey of cyclone-hit areas

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Sunday undertook an aerial survey of the areas affected by Cyclone Dana. Majhi was accompanied by Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari and Chief Secretary Manoj Ahuja. The CM undertook the aerial survey of coastal areas of Paradip in Jagatsinghpur district, Mahakalapada, Rajnagar and Rajkanika of Kendrapara district, and Chandbali of Bhadrak district this afternoon, the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) said in a statement.



After making the aerial survey, the Chief Minister has asked concerned departments to assess the damage caused by the cyclone and subsequent heavy rainfall as soon as possible so that relief can

be provided to the affected people, it said. A total of 35.95 lakh people in Odisha have been impacted by Cyclone Dana and subsequent flooding in 14 districts, Pujari said while speaking to media

persons earlier in the day. The worst-hit districts include Kendrapara, Balasore and Bhadrak, while the human casualty "still stands at zero", he said here. Cyclone Dana, which

struck the Odisha coast early Friday, has affected people in 1,671 gram panchayats under 108 blocks spread over 14 districts, the minister said. According to preliminary reports, around 5,840 houses have been fully or partially damaged due to the cyclone and subsequent flooding, Pujari said. The minister said that the special relief commissioner (SRC) has asked officials concerned to submit damage assessment reports by November 2 so that the state government can seek assistance from the Centre.

## Cyclone Dana impacted 35.95 lakh people in Odisha, 'no human casualty so far': Minister

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** A total of 35.95 lakh people in Odisha have been impacted by Cyclone Dana and subsequent flooding in 14 districts, the state's Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari said Sunday. Pujari also said as many as 8,10,896 people were evacuated to 6,210 cyclone relief centres. The worst-hit districts include Kendrapara, Balasore and Bhadrak, while the human casualty "still stands at zero", he told reporters in Bhubaneswar. "By 10.30am of Sunday, evacuated people were sheltered in 1,178



cyclone relief centres and they are being provided cooked food and other essential items," the minister said. Polythene sheets are being given to people who lost their houses in the calamity. He said cyclone Dana, which struck early Friday, affected people in

1,671 gram panchayats under 108 blocks spread across 14 districts. According to preliminary reports, around 5,840 houses have been fully or partially damaged due to the cyclone and subsequent flooding, Pujari said. "Whenever there is a disaster, people lose their houses and get compensation. This time, we want to bring a permanent solution to the problem and provide pucca houses to them in a phased manner," he said. The Odisha government was also planning to undertake a survey of kutchra houses located in cyclone and flood-prone areas of the state.

## 50 flights get bomb threats

**New Delhi(KCN):** At least 50 flights operated by Indian airlines received bomb threats Sunday, according to sources.

In 14 days, more than 350 flights operated by the Indian carriers have received hoax bomb threats. Most of the threats were issued through social media.

Akasa Air Sunday said 15 of its flights got security alerts and after thorough inspections, all aircraft were released for operations.

The sources in the know said IndiGo received threats for 18 flights and Vistara for 17 flights.

Against the backdrop of a spate of hoax bomb threats to airlines, the IT Ministry has asked social media platforms to observe due diligence obligations and promptly remove or disable access to misinformation within the strict timelines prescribed under IT rules.

Meanwhile, the civil aviation ministry is looking to take legislative actions to tackle the menace of the hoax bomb threats to airlines.

# Mann Ki Baat: PM Modi warns of ‘digital arrest’, urges people to stay vigilant

**New Delhi(KCN):** Prime Minister Narendra Modi Sunday addressed the issue of “digital arrest” in the 115th episode of ‘Mann Ki Baat’, labelling it as fraudulent activity. He urged people to remain vigilant and safe. The Prime Minister emphasised that those involved in the crime are enemies of society. “...There is no system like digital arrest in the law, this is just fraud, deceit, lie, a gang of criminals and those who are doing this are enemies of the society...,” the PM cautioned. Addressing the growing cases and concerns about techno-crime, PM Modi informed listeners that various investigative agencies were collaborating with state governments to combat these fraudulent schemes. He said to enhance coordination among these agencies, the National Cyber Coordination Centre has been established. “This initiative aims to strengthen efforts against



cybercrime and protect citizens from such scams, reaffirming the government's commitment to ensuring public safety in the digital realm," said the PM. "Beware of Digital Arrest frauds...No investigative agency will ever contact you by phone or video call for enquiries...The fraudsters of digital arrest phone calls, at times, impersonate police, CBI, and Narcotics; and at times RBI... using such various labels, they converse as fake officers with a lot of confidence. Many listeners of '#MannKiBaat' have

wished that we must discuss that. Let me tell you, how these fraud gangs work. What is this dangerous game? It is very important for you to understand this and it is equally important for others to understand it as well,” said the PM. During the radio talk, PM Modi played a video to make people understand the gravity of the crime. While making the audience understand the modus operandi, PM Modi said, “The First Move... They collect all of your personal information... “You went to Goa last month, didn’t

you? Your daughter studies in Delhi, right”? They collect so much information about you that you will be surprised.” “The second move – create an atmosphere of fear... Uniform, government office set-up, legal sections... they will scare you so much on the phone... In the midst of the conversation, you will not be able to even think. And then their third move begins – the time pressure. “You have to decide now or else you will be arrested” – these people create so much psychological pressure on the victim that one gets scared. People from every class and age group fall victim to Digital Arrest. People have lost lakhs of rupees earned through their hard work, out of sheer fear. Whenever you receive such a call, don’t be scared. You should be aware that no investigative agency ever inquires like this through a phone call or a video call,” the PM said. PM Modi enumerated the three steps to Digital Security. These three

steps are — ‘Stop – Think – Take Action. “As soon as you get a call, stop... don’t panic, stay calm, don’t take any hasty steps, don’t give away your personal information to anyone; if possible take a screenshot and record it for sure. After this comes the second step. The first step was ‘stop’ and the second step was ‘think’. No government agency threatens you on the phone like this, neither inquires nor demands money on a video call like this. If you feel scared, then know that something is wrong. The first step, the second step and now I spell out the third step. In the first step, I said – ‘Stop’... in the second step I said – ‘Think’, and the third step tells you – ‘Take action’.”

He also mentioned the national cyber helpline 1930, or to report on [cybercrime.gov.in](https://www.cybercrime.gov.in), or inform family and police, and preserve evidence. “Stop, then think, and then take action, these three steps will become the protector of your digital security,” said the PM.

## Odisha: Last rites of labourers killed in Pune tank collapse conducted in their native villages



**Berhampur(KCN):** The last rites of the two migrant labourers, who died in the water tank collapse in Maharashtra's Pune, were held in their native villages in Odisha's Ganjam district.

The bodies of Rabi Mahankuda (50) and Sudam Behera (33) reached their native villages, Kalyanpur and Palur, in an ambulance Saturday afternoon, officials said.

They were among the five people killed in the accident that happened in the Bhosari area of Pimpri Chinchwad township around 6.15am Thursday. The accident happened when some labourers were bathing under the water tank.

Ganjam's District Labour Officer (DLO) Barsha Jena said the administration was in touch with family members of the deceased labourers.

"We will take all necessary steps to get their families benefits under government schemes," she said.

The company for which the labourers were working has given Rs 11 lakh to each of their families, she added.

Both the deceased labourers went to Maharashtra through a contractor October 1, their families said.

## Cyclone Dana aftermath: SRC seeks damage assessment reports from Collectors

**Bhubaneswar, October 27(KCN):** Deo Ranjan Singh, Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) of Odisha government on Sunday sought damage assessment reports from collectors of 14 districts severely impacted by Cyclone Dana. The SRC has instructed district collectors to submit comprehensive assessments of the cyclone's impact, covering agriculture losses, crop damage, power infrastructure, and housing destruction, by November 2. In addition, heads of relevant departments have been directed to provide their respective damage reports by the same deadline. This initiative aims to consolidate an accurate and detailed account of the cyclone's effects, facilitating prompt relief and restoration measures.



# BJP's next big target is to form govt in West Bengal in 2026

**Kolkata, Oct 27(KCN):** Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday accused the TMC government in West Bengal of engaging in "state-sponsored infiltration" and declared that the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) "next big target" is to form a government in the 2026 West Bengal Assembly elections. Speaking at the launch of BJP's membership drive in Kolkata, the Union Home Minister noted that Syama Prasad Mukherjee founded the Bharatiya Jana Sangh, which has

since grown into the world's largest political party. "We are all proud to be members of the world's largest party. I have faith in the Bengal workers that we will not lag in membership numbers. The party has set a target of one crore members. If we examine the history of political parties today, most are run on caste or family lines. The Bharatiya Janata Party is unique, with a National President and Prime Minister who are ordinary workers, without any other background," Shah



He further emphasised that the BJP's next major goal is to establish a government in West Bengal in 2026. "In Bengal, state-

sponsored infiltration must be stopped. Joining the BJP in Bengal means joining the mission to free the state from the grip of communists and Mamata

Didi. This is a border state, and with the way infiltration is being supported at a state level, there is only one solution: a BJP government in 2026. To combat cow and

coal smuggling, we need to enlist one crore BJP members in West Bengal," he added. Shah also criticised the Mamata government over the RG Kar rapemurder case on August 9, stating that the safety of women is at risk in Bengal. "The dignity of mothers and sisters is being violated in Bengal. Incidents like Sandeshkhali and RG Kar must be stopped, which will only happen if the BJP forms a government in 2026. In 2026, we will secure a two-thirds majority in West Bengal," he asserted.

## Irregularities in the tender selection process of Sambalpur University

On October 7, 2014, Sambalpur University's Registrar published a tender notification for implementing LAN and Wi-Fi infrastructure across Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) under the Central and State Governments on the University's website. However, the eligibility criteria contain significant gaps, allowing the project to be awarded to a private consortium backed by a specific Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) CISCO and PSU. Notably, the "Make & Model" clause lacks a requirement for high-quality equipment, driving the tender toward inflated costs. It is therefore essential to address these issues, revise the flawed terms, and consider reissuing the tender. Without these changes, there is a risk of compromising transparency, potentially causing public dissatisfaction and raising concerns about the integrity of the selection process.

## Royal Bengal tiger translocated from Maharashtra to Odisha's Similipal Tiger Reserve

Bhubaneswar, (KCN): In order to increase the tiger population in Odisha, the state government has successfully translocated a Royal Bengal tiger from Maharashtra's Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve to the Similipal Tiger Reserve in Mayurbhanj district on Sunday. A special team from Similipal Tiger Reserve traveled to Maharashtra for the translocation of a Royal Bengal tiger from Maharashtra's Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve to the Similipal Tiger



Reserve forest. Last week, a team led by Similipal's Director, along with veterinary experts and a rapid response

team, conducted a mission to Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve, successfully transporting the tiger to its new

habitat. Earlier, Odisha government wrote to the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA), seeking approval for the translocation of tigers to strengthen Odisha's big cat population. This relocation is part of Odisha's larger initiative to enhance its tiger population, which includes plans to introduce five tigers: three for Debrigarh Wildlife Sanctuary in Bargarh district and two for Similipal Tiger Reserve.

## Bhubaneswar: Police introduce body cameras at reception desks to enhance accountability



**Bhubaneswar, (KCN):** The Commissionerate Police has initiated a pilot project in which officers at the reception desks of police stations will wear

body cameras. This measure aims to monitor interactions with visitors, particularly those who may cause disturbances. The body cameras will

record both audio and video, capturing the behavior of police personnel as well as that of visitors. This initiative responds to recurring

incidents of unruly behavior at police stations, including cases where intoxicated individuals have verbally abused officers. Additional Police Commissioner Uma Shankar Mishra visited the Kharvela police station in Bhubaneswar to observe the new equipment in action. This project follows a troubling incident in September, when an Army officer and a friend were allegedly assaulted by police at the Bharatpur station, leading to the suspension of five officers, including one at the rank of Inspector, for serious misconduct.

## Wild cat spotted during search for leopard near Bhubaneswar airport: Official

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** Personnel of the Odisha forest department spotted a wild cat near the Biju Patnaik International Airport in Bhubaneswar, a day after a woman claimed to have sighted a leopard near the facility's dump yard area, an official said Sunday. The forest department had launched a search operation on Saturday following the claim, the official said. "Till now, we have not found any tiger or leopard in the area. In the early morning, we sighted a wild cat moving around in that area," the Forest Ranger, Bhubaneswar, Radhakanta Hota, said. Trap cameras have also been installed in the airport area. Wildlife



experts will examine the visuals and confirm further details, he said. Earlier on Saturday morning, the woman, a worker at the dump yard, claimed to have spotted

a leopard there, Hota said. Forest officials and the local police scanned the area carrying nets, traps and other equipment Saturday, but could not

find any trace of a leopard. In 2019, a leopard was caught from the Bhubaneswar airport premises and released in the nearby Chandaka fores

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Vidya Balan says she rejected Bhool Bhulaiyaa 2 because she was 'scared'

Actor Vidya Balan addressed the audience at an event and revealed the reason behind not accepting Bhool Bhulaiyaa 2 when producer Bhushan Kumar went to her with the script.

Actor Vidya Balan returns to the Bhool Bhulaiyaa franchise with her iconic role of Manjulika. At an event recently, the actor opened up about her apprehensions of reprising the popular character, and how she decided to come on board the third film, after refusing to do Bhool Bhulaiyaa 2. Vidya was present at the launch of her song Ami Je Tomar 3.0 in Mumbai on Friday, October 25, when producer Bhushan

Kumar revealed that she rejected BB 2.

The T-Series owner told the audience, "I had approached Vidya ji for Bhool Bhulaiyaa 2, but she had refused. When we were launching the trailer, we requested her to at least be a part of it, so she posted the trailer, and she loved the trailer, and she loved the film." Bhushan added that Vidya loved Bhool Bhulaiyaa 2 so much that she promised him to be a part of the third film in the franchise. Vicky Kaushal on perfecting 'Tauba Tauba' steps: Had 3-4 days to learn it

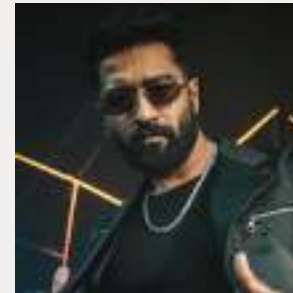
Vicky Kaushal spoke about the hard work and choreography behind the popular song 'Tauba Tauba' from 'Bad Newz'. The film releases on July 19.

# Direct Tax Vivad Se Vishwas Scheme 2024 : Salient Features

Direct Tax Vivad se Vishwas Scheme, 2024 was notified on 20th September, 2024 to resolve pending appeals in case of income tax disputes and has come into effect from 01.10.2024. The salient features of the scheme are as under:

- Disputes which can be settled: Under the scheme following disputes can be settled —
- (a) Quantum appeal including TDS appeal (by assessee or department) pending before CIT(A), JCIT(A), ITAT, High Court or Supreme Court or writ petition or SLP pending before High Court or Supreme Court as on 22.07.2024 or cases where the time limit of filing appeal has not expired on 22.07.2024
- (b) Appeal (by assessee or by department) in relation to fees, interest and penalty pending before CIT(A), JCIT(A), ITAT, High Court or Supreme Court as on 22.07.2024 or cases where the time limit of filing appeal, in such a case, has not expired on 22.07.2024.
- (c) Where an objection

before DRP is filed and DRP has not issued any direction on or before 22.07.2024.

- (d) Where a direction is issued by DRP u/s 144C(5) but the A.O has not passed the final assessment order u/s 144C(13).
- (e) Revision petition pending before CIT u/s 264 on 22.07.2024.
- Disputes have been specifically excluded: Certain disputes have been specifically excluded from the scheme like In direction is issued by DRP u/s 144C(5) but the A.O has not passed the final assessment order u/s 144C(13).
- (e) Revision petition pending before CIT u/s 264 on 22.07.2024.

disputes, then VSV cannot be opted for the said assessment year.

- Tax payable to settle the dispute
- Where assessee desires to settle quantum appeal (other than search case) i.e. disputed tax, he is required to pay entire disputed tax (including surcharge & cess). However if the declarant is an appellant on or before 31.1.2020 at the same appellate forum in respect of the tax arrear, then 110% of the dispute tax (including surcharge and cess) is required to be paid. On payment of such tax (including surcharge and cess), the interest and penalty will be waived provided the payment is made on or before 31.12.2024.
- In case payment is made after 31.12.2024 assessee shall be required to make an additional payment of 10% of disputed tax. But in case the appeal is pending on or before 31.1.2020, additional tax payable will be 20% instead of 10%.
- However, if the appeal is filed by Department or the Department has lost an issue, assessee is required to pay 50% of disputed tax (including surcharge and cess) if payment is made before 31.12.2024 and if payment is made after 31.12.2024, 55% of the disputed tax is to be paid. On payment of disputed tax, interest and penalty would be waived.
- Where assessee desires to settle appeals relating to interest, fees or penalty he will be

required to pay 25% of interest, fees or penalty, as the case may be, provided the payment is made on or before 31.12.2024. However, if the declarant is an appellant on or before 31.1.2020 at the same appellate forum in respect of the interest, fee or penalty arrear, 30% of the interest, fees or penalty, as the case may be, shall be payable.

- In case payment is made after 31.12.2024, assessee shall be required to pay 30% of the interest, fees or penalty as the case may be, in place of 25%. But in case the appeal is pending on or before 31.1.2020, the additional interest, fee or penalty payable will be 35% instead of 30%. On payment of interest, fees or penalty, the balance fees, interest or penalty, shall be waived.
- Where the appeal is filed before CIT(A) or JCIT(A) or objections are filed before DRP by appellant on any issue on which he has already got a decision in his favour from the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal (where the decision on such issue is not reversed by High Court or Supreme Court), assessee is required to pay only 50% of the tax determined as per above calculation. Where the appeal is filed before ITAT on which he has already got a decision in his favour from High Court (where the decision on such issue is

not reversed by the Supreme Court), then also assessee is required to pay only 50% of the tax determined as per above calculation.

- Rules and Forms notified under Direct Tax Vivad se Vishwas Scheme: As per Notification No. 104/2024 dated 20.09.2024, the following 4 Forms have been notified for the purposes of the Scheme. These are as follows:
- Form-1: for filing declaration and Undertaking by the declarant
- Form-2: for Certificate to be issued by Designated Authority
- Form-3: for Intimation of payment by the declarant
- Form-4: Order for Full and Final Settlement of tax arrears by Designated Authority

The Scheme provides that Form-1 shall be filed separately for each dispute provided that where appellant and the income-tax authority, both have filed an appeal in respect of the same order, single Form-1 shall be filed in such case.

- Online declaration: In order to opt for the scheme, assessee is required to make an online declaration in prescribed Form, to designated authority. Scheme provides that Form 1 and Form 3 shall be furnished electronically by the declarant on the e-filing

portal of Income Tax Department i.e. [www.incometax.gov.in](http://www.incometax.gov.in).

- Declarant is also required to furnish a undertaking: Declarant is required to furnish undertaking in the prescribed form and manner waiving his right, to seek or pursue any remedy or any claim in relation to the tax arrears for which declaration under the scheme is filed, which may otherwise be available to him under any law for the time being in force, in equity, under statute or under any agreement entered into by India with any country outside India whether for protection of investment or otherwise.
- Designated authority shall, determine amount payable by declarant within 15 days: The designated authority shall, within a period of 15 days from the date of receipt of declaration determine the amount payable by declarant and grant a certificate to declarant containing particulars of tax arrear and amount payable after such determination in prescribed form.
- Appeal pending before ITAT or Commissioner (Appeals) shall be deemed to have been withdrawn: From date on which certificate is issued by designated Authority, the appeal pending before ITAT or CIT (Appeals), in respect of disputed income or disputed

interest or disputed penalty or disputed fee and tax arrear shall be deemed to have been withdrawn.

- Declarant is required to pay the amount determined within 15 days of the date of receipt of certificate: Declarant is required to pay the amount determined within 15 days of the date of receipt of certificate by him and intimate details of such payment to the designated authority in the prescribed form along with proof of withdrawal of appeal/ writ before High Court or Supreme Court. The department shall also withdraw the appeal/writ before the issuance of final certificate for settling dispute. On receipt of intimation of payment, designated authority shall pass order stating that the declarant has paid the amount.
- Designated authority shall not institute any proceeding in respect of an offence; or impose or levy any penalty; or charge any interest under the Income-tax Act in respect of tax arrear which has been settled under the scheme. However, declarant shall not be conferred any benefit, concession or immunity in any proceedings other than mentioned above.
- Amount paid in pursuance of a declaration made under the scheme shall not be refundable: Amount paid in pursuance of a

declaration made under the scheme shall not be refundable under any circumstances. However, where the assessee had, before filing the declaration paid any amount in respect of his tax arrear which exceeds the amount payable under the scheme, he shall be entitled to a refund of such excess amount, but shall not be entitled to interest on such excess amount under section 244A of Income-tax Act.

- Declaration shall be presumed to be non-est in certain cases: The declaration shall be presumed to be non-est in case (a) any material particular furnished in the declaration is found to be false or (b) the declarant violates any of the conditions under this scheme; or (c) the declarant acts in any manner which is not in accordance with the undertaking given by him. In such cases, all proceedings and claims which were withdrawn under the scheme and consequences under Income-tax Act against declarant shall be deemed to have been revived.

The poet reflects on the profound connection between the divine and the natural world, suggesting that one does not need extraordinary experiences, like those of Prophet Moses at Mount Sinai, to witness the beauty and wonder of Allah's design. Instead, the mundane, everyday elements of life are filled with signs and symbols of His existence.

This reflection speaks to a universal truth: that the divine is not confined to grand miracles or sacred sites; rather, it permeates all aspects of existence. By recognizing the divine spark within nature, we cultivate a sense of spirituality that invites us to appreciate the intricate tapestry of life. Each stone, tree, and breeze serves as a reminder of Allah's creative power, urging us to engage in contemplation and appreciation of the world around us. Abu Huraira reported Allah's Messenger (?) as saying (Sahih Muslim 2564 a): "Don't harbor grudges and don't manipulate prices against one another. Do not allow hatred or enmity to develop among you, and do not interfere with a transaction once others have entered into it. Instead, be like

brothers and servants of Allah. A Muslim is the brother of another Muslim. He neither oppresses him, humiliates him, nor looks down upon him. Piety resides here," and he pointed to his chest three times. "It is a serious evil for a Muslim to look down upon his Muslim brother. 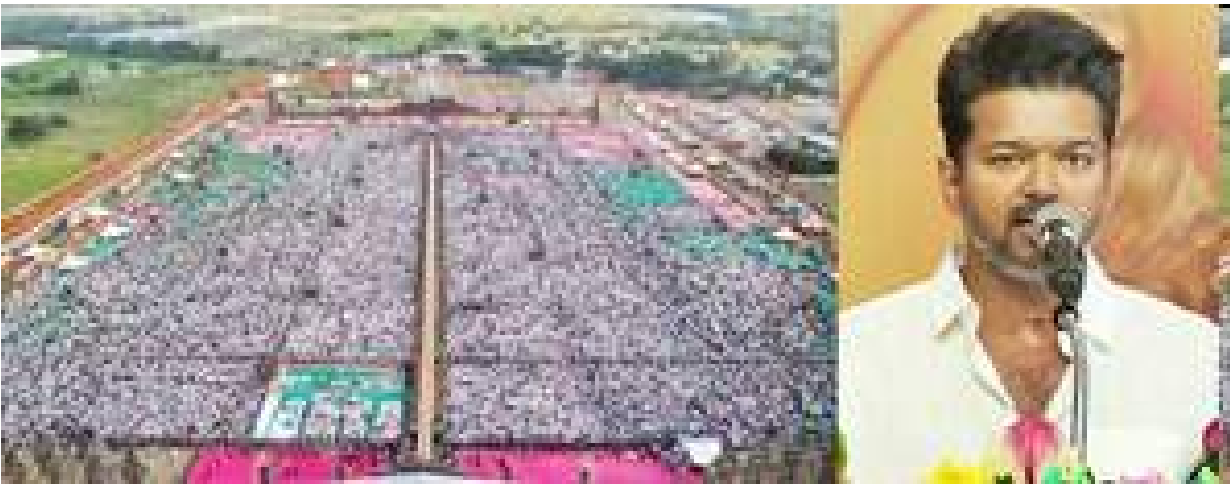
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# BJP is our ideological opponent, DMK is political adversary: TVK's Vijay

**Chennai(KCN):** Tamil actor turned politician and founder of Tamizhaga Vetri Kazhagam (TVK), Vijay Sunday said that the BJP is the ideological opponent of the TVK while the DMK is its political adversary. "There is a group that has been creating divisions within society. Those who create divisions are our first enemy. Those who claim to uphold Dravidian ideology but are exploiting Tamil Nadu as a family enterprise are our next rivals. The BJP is our ideological opponent while the DMK

is our political adversary," said Vijay addressing a massive gathering in Villupuram district's Vikravandi. He also pledged to follow the legacies of Dravidian icon Periyar, former Chief Minister Kamaraj, B.R. Ambedkar, Rani Velu Nachiyar, and Anjali Ammal. He assured his supporters there would be no "adjustment politics or compromise," adding that Tamil Nadu's political landscape needs transformative change. "I have not entered politics for personal



gain but out of social commitment. I may be a newcomer in politics but my commitment remains undaunted. Our party's core enemies are corruption and communalism," Vijay

said. He also accused the DMK of deceiving the public under the guise of the Dravida model, calling the DMK government anti-people.

The superstar-cum-politician also announced that his party would contest all 234 seats in the 2026 Tamil Nadu Assembly elections, emphasising that TVK's campaign is

a serious bid for victory, with no retreat from electoral politics. Vijay also hinted at power-sharing, saying, "We will provide a share of power to any political party that supports us,"

indirectly referencing DMK alliance partners such as the Congress and Dalit party, VCK, who have previously sought power-sharing in Tamil Nadu. He assured that TVK would not act as a front for any other political party. After years of anticipation, Vijay officially launched TVK on February 2, 2024, and unveiled the party's flag and symbol on August 22 at the party headquarters in Chennai. Vijay's fan club, the All India Thalapathy Vijay Makkal Iyakkam (AITVMI), contested

169 seats in the October 2021 local body elections, winning 113 seats—outperforming the parties of fellow celebrities Kamal Haasan's Makkal Needhi Maiam (MNM) and Seeman's Naam Tamizhar Katchi (NTK), both of which failed to secure any seats. This success was a stepping stone for Vijay's official foray into politics. His entry brings a fresh dynamic to a Tamil political landscape long dominated by Dravidian heavyweights, DMK and AIADMK, while observers are watching closely for Vijay's next moves.

## 2 Workers Killed, 7 Hospitalised After Inhaling Toxic Fumes In Gujarat Factory: Cops



**Ahmedabad(KCN):** Two workers died and seven were hospitalised after they inhaled toxic fumes at a textile factory in Gujarat's Ahmedabad on Sunday, police said. The incident occurred at Devi Synthetics in the Narol industrial area of the city. Nine workers inhaled toxic fumes that leaked when spent acid was being transferred into a tank at the factory, Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Ravi Mohan Saini said.

"Police received information around 10.30 am that nine persons were affected due to a toxic gas leak in a factory in Narol and were taken to LG Hospital, where two died," he said. Seven workers are hospitalised, of whom four are critical and are being treated in the ICU, he said. A preliminary investigation revealed that spent acid, used in the printing and dyeing industry, was being transferred into a tank

when the workers nearby were affected, he said. The official said a team from the police, Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL), industrial safety and Gujarat Pollution Control Board (GPCB) officials reached the site and started probing the exact cause. Industrial safety and FSL officials are probing to find out if the factory followed due procedures regarding NOC, etc., and police will take action based on their report, he said.

## "There Was No Response To 26/11 Mumbai Terror Attack": S Jaishankar



**M u m b a i ( K C N ) :** External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Sunday said that there was no response from the Indian side after the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks, and asserted that it won't be the case if such an incident were to recur. "We should not have a repeat of what happened in Mumbai. That there was a terror attack and there was no response," Mr Jaishankar told reporters in Mumbai. "Mumbai is a symbol of counter-terrorism for India and the world," the minister said. When India was a member of the UN Security Council, it was chairing the counter-

terrorism committee, Mr Jaishankar said. "We held the counter-terrorism panel meeting in the same hotel that was hit by the terror attack," he added. "People know that India is standing strong against terrorism. We are today leaders in fighting terrorism," Mr Jaishankar said. "When we talk of zero tolerance against terror, it is clear that when somebody does something, there will be a response," he said. "We also have to expose. It is not acceptable that you are doing business during daytime and indulging in terror during the night and I have to

pretend that everything is okay. "This India will not accept it. This is what has changed," the minister said. "We will expose terrorism and we will act where we have to act," he added. Jaishankar also said India and China would soon resume patrolling along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Ladakh, restoring the arrangement as it was in April 2020, before the border standoff began. "We expect to return to pre-October 31, 2020, patrolling arrangements in areas like Demchok and Depsang. This will take some time," Mr Jaishankar said.

## "Will Rise From Ashes": Sanjay Raut On Team Thackeray Losing Party Name

**New Delhi(KCN):** Shiv Sena (UBT) leader and Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Raut said the party will "rise from the ashes like a phoenix" despite the now Chief Minister Eknath Shinde-led split robbing the Uddhav Thackeray faction of the Shiv Sena name and symbol and many leaders walking away. Speaking at the NDTV Marathi Conclave on Sunday, Mr Raut said the Maha Vikas Aghadi's manifesto for the November 20 Maharashtra Assembly elections will be released after Congress leader Rahul Gandhi visits the state on November 4. He added that the coalition - comprising Shiv Sena (UBT), Congress and Sharad Pawar-led NCP - would look at putting the state's finances in order, battling corruption and the law and order problem and bringing stability to the state."Maharashtra's



industries have moved out and youth have lost their jobs. State leaders are being murdered and prisoners in jail are challenging law and order," he said, in an apparent reference to the killing of NCP leader Baba Siddique and the alleged involvement of jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi's gang. Mr Raut accused the Election Commission of partiality towards the Ajit

Pawar-led NCP and Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena in the fight for party names and symbols. "The father of the NCP party was sitting in front of the Election Commission, but they gave it to another person. We had demanded justice for us. Today, our symbol case is in the the Supreme Court for two-and-a-half years. They have allowed an

unconstitutional government to function in the state. Removing the blindfold of the God of Justice does not mean that everything is going according to the Constitution," he said. The Rajya Sabha MP also hit out at Prime Minister Narendra Modi for criticising the Ladli Bahana Yojana in Jharkhand and Rajasthan, a version of which was implemented in Maharashtra as the Ladki

Bahin Yojana. "In states where the BJP government is ruling, Modi praises the scheme. These are double standards. Women should start small industries, and should be made to stand on their own feet. People will get used to the scheme and the next government will have to do the same," he said. Denying any dispute among the Maha Vikas Aghadi constituents, Mr Raut said the coalition will win at least 20 of 36 Assembly seats in the Mumbai region. A solution for the dispute on 4-5 seats will be found soon, he added, while asserting that Eknath Shinde will not lead Maharashtra. When asked who are the top chief ministerial contenders from the Maha Vikas Aghadi, Mr Raut said, "First, Uddhav Thackeray. Second, Uddhav Thackeray. Third, Uddhav Thackeray."

## PM Modi Hails Soldiers' "Indomitable Spirit And Courage" On Infantry Day

**New Delhi(KCN):** Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday hailed the "indomitable spirit and courage" of all Ranks and Veterans of the Infantry on the occasion of Infantry Day. In a post on X PM Modi wrote, "On Infantry Day, we all salute the indomitable spirit and courage of all Ranks and Veterans of the Infantry, who tirelessly protect us. They always stand resolute in the face of any adversity, ensuring the safety and security of our nation. The infantry embodies the essence of strength, valour and duty,

inspiring every Indian. On this occasion, Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) General Anil Chauhan, Chief of the Army Staff General Upendra Dwivedi, and other senior officers lay wreaths at the National War Memorial. Infantry Day is celebrated every year to commemorate the landing of the 1st Battalion of the SIKH Regiment at Srinagar airfield on 27 Oct 1947 to protect the people of Jammu and Kashmir from the nefarious designs of Pakistani Kabaili Raiders aided by the Pakistan Army. This gallant action



resulted in the foiling of Pakistan's plans to occupy Jammu and Kashmir. Infantry is also known as the "Queen of the Battle" and its history is as old as the first human war. As per a government release, the infantry has

played a crucial role in the army in protecting the sovereignty of the nation since independence. Be it the war of 1962 with China or of 1947-48 with Pakistan, be it the war of 1965, 71, or the 1999 Kargil conflict. The contribution of

infantry in triumphing these historical wars is unparalleled. Apart from these wars, the Counter Insurgency/Counter Terrorist Operations in North and North East, Op BLUE STAR and Op RAKSHAK in Punjab, Op PAWAN in Sri Lanka, and recently Op SNOW LEOPARD in Eastern Ladakh have been the continuous witness of the sheer professionalism and commitment of infantry which eventually led to success of these operations, an official release said.

## Terrorist Hideout Busted In J&K's Poonch, 2 Grenades, 3 Pak Mines Recovered

**Poonch, Jammu and Kashmir(KCN):** Indian Army's Romeo Force, in a joint operation with Special Operations Group (SOG) police, busted a terror hideout in the Balnoi sector in Poonch, officials said. According to the Poonch police, the operation that took place on Saturday led to the recovery of two grenades and three Pakistani Mines from the hideout. Meanwhile, a search

operation was carried out in Tangmarg and several parts of Jammu and Kashmir as the Indian Army and police intensified their searches to trace the accused in terror attacks in Gulmarg, Baramulla in north Kashmir and Gagangir in the Ganderbal district of the Union Territory. On October 24, two Army soldiers and two civilian porters were killed after terrorists attacked a

military vehicle in Baramulla. Earlier on October 20, a doctor and six construction workers were killed when terrorists attacked a tunnel construction site on the Srinagar-Leh national highway in Ganderbal district. The terrorists struck as the labourers and other staff returned to their camp in Gund, Ganderbal. The incident raised serious concern as this was a targeted killing by the

terrorists. The terrorists believed to be at least two, opened fire indiscriminately on a group of labourers, which included both local and non-local people. On Wednesday, Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha directed the police to tighten security measures around key infrastructure projects and construction camps in the union territories. He further directed a security audit of infrastructure projects,

round-the-clock nakas at the strategic points, night patrolling and area domination. The Counter-Intelligence Kashmir (CIK) carried out a major operation in six districts of the Valley and caught recruiters linked to a terror outfit. The counterintelligence unit informed that the raids were conducted in districts including Srinagar, Ganderbal, Pulwama, Anantnag, Budgam, and Kulgam.



# Short shrift to Subarnapur in appointment of doctors

**Sonepur (KCN):** Subarnapur district has received a raw deal in the appointment of doctors by the state government as the western district has only 45 doctors against the sanctioned 123 posts. The issue assumes significance as the state government appointed 134 new doctors, Saturday in various hospitals of the state following the completion of their Post Graduation (PG) in medical science by the state Health and Family Welfare department. However, Subarnapur district's share is zero if we make a quick check of the list of newly appointed doctors. The

state government has not appointed even a single doctor for the district sparking sharp resentment among the residents. A new building of the district headquarters hospital was constructed at an expense of Rs100 crore at the district headquarters town Sonepur. The new seven-storey hospital building was inaugurated last February. However, healthcare service in the district is in tatters due to absence of the adequate number of doctors and nursing officers at the district headquarters hospital. Patients fail to avail proper healthcare services due to a lack of doctors.

Odisha has witnessed a change in government but the district has not seen any betterment in healthcare services. If this is the condition of the district headquarters hospital at Sonepur, then it is better not to speak of the condition of other hospitals in the district, residents alleged. Reports said that the posts of Chief District Medical Officer (CDMO) and Public Health Officer (PHO) have been lying vacant since the month of May. In this situation, one could very well assume the condition of healthcare services in the DHH at Sonepur. People visiting the hospital allege that the exterior of the hospital is shining but the interior is



almost empty due to a lack of doctors and other healthcare personnel. The DHH has 123 sanctioned posts of doctors including specialist doctors, senior consultants, senior medical officers and general duty medical officers (GDMOs). However, only 45

professionals are in the DHH. A leave training reserve medical officer (LTRMO) and senior specialist of anesthesia department are absent from their service for years but no action has been taken against them. The DHH has 81 posts of LTRMO doctors but only

24 are working. The hospital has 125 posts of sanctioned nursing staff out of which 53 posts are lying vacant. Similarly, there are several vacancies in 34 sanctioned posts of laboratory testing assistants. The new building constructed in the hospital has a modern

laboratory, operation theatre, outdoor ward, indoor wards of various departments, patient registration kiosk and a blood bank. However, healthcare services are in shambles due to inadequate numbers of doctors and nursing officers. The hospital is daily visited by several accident victims, but the hospital has only two surgeons making it difficult to treat them. Dr Durgadutta Dash is working as the superintendent of the DHH with the additional charge of the CDMO. He mostly remains busy with the administrative works of the hospital, which is why emergency patients have failed to avail proper

treatment in the health facility. The posts of specialists in the medicine, ophthalmology, skin and venereal diseases, gynaecology and obstetrics departments are also lying vacant in the hospital. The hospital also lacks an orthopaedician and persons with even minor fractures are often referred to Bhima Bhoi Medical College and Hospital (BBMCH) in Bolangir or to VSS Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (VIMSAR). Residents have demanded the state government intervene and fill up the vacant posts in the DHH on a priority basis.

## Beat constables at Rourkela parks from November



**Rourkela(KCN):** The police administration here has finally heard the long pending demand of citizens to make the 100-odd public parks in Rourkela safe and secure. During a recent interaction with senior police officers, IICs and members of the civil society, Rourkela SP Nitesh Wadhvani said that from the coming month (November), the beat constable concept

will be revived as the first step towards making the parks safe for visitors, especially after sundown. "They (constables) will be deployed in the parks to connect with people and address their daily concerns. They shall be available for the public during the crucial hours," Wadhvani told them, adding that stress will be laid on improving community-police relationship rather than enforcement. QR codes

will be put up at strategic points in the parks to keep tabs on the presence of the deployed personnel. "Also people can send their grievances or call them instantly by scanning the QR code. Feedback from the public would decide the performance of the cops," the SP said. He said that after the pilot launch at selected parks in November, the beat constable scheme

will be extended to other such places following a discussion with the stakeholders. It is worth mentioning here that the parks in the city have, of late, become a haven for antisocial elements, drug addicts and alcoholics. Besides, complaints of people indulging in sexual acts in public have been received from the parks. This has made visitors, senior citizens in particular feel unsafe to use the parks, especially after sunset. Significantly, the majority of the parks remain totally or partially dark owing to the failure of the Rourkela Municipal Corporation in providing proper illumination. Three months ago RMC Commissioner Ashutosh Kulkarni, who is also the ADM, took more than 15 public hearings, and on all those occasions the main complaints he received were about the poor lighting inside the parks. Though he promised to address the issue at the earliest, no steps were taken in that direction.

## Cyclone Dana aftermath: Odisha focuses on restoration, flash floods in Balasore




**Bhubaneswar/Balasore(KCN):** After successfully managing Cyclone Dana with zero-casualty goal, the Odisha government is now focused on restoration efforts following significant destruction to crops, thatched houses and public infrastructure. The cyclone made landfall on Friday but has since weakened into a low-pressure system over northern Odisha. "The well marked low pressure area over north Odisha persists. It is likely to weaken further and become insignificant during next 12 hours," the IMD said at 6.30 pm of Saturday.

Many villages in Balasore and Bhadrak districts are facing flash floods due to intense rainfall, prompting the Odisha Fire Service to rescue stranded residents. The Balasore district administration has urged those living near the Budhbalang River to shift to relief camps, as water levels have risen to 7.84 metres—above the warning level of 7.21 metres and danger level of 8.13 metres. State Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari said the government is prioritising the restoration of facilities and rehabilitation for affected residents, particularly

farmers. Assessments of house and crop damages will begin once the rains stop. Electricity has been restored in about 90 per cent of the 2.24 million households in affected districts, he added. Pujari emphasised the need for accurate damage assessments to ensure that no deserving individuals are overlooked. Preliminary assessments indicate that several homes and agricultural lands have been affected across 14 districts. A central team is expected to visit soon for further damage evaluation, but the state government plans to start

disbursing assistance and compensation immediately, he said. Deputy Chief Minister KV Singh Deo, who also holds the agriculture portfolio, said district-level officers will conduct assessments and send geo-tagged reports of damaged crops once the rain subsides. He confirmed that 14 districts have been affected, with Kendrapara, Bhadrak, Balasore, Jajpur, and Mayurbhanj being the most severely impacted. According to government guidelines, small and marginal farmers with landholdings up to 2 hectares and over 33 per cent crop loss due to natural calamities are eligible for compensation—Rs 8,500 per hectare in rainfed areas and Rs 17,000 in irrigated areas, with Rs 22,500 for perennial crops. Assistance decisions will be made based on district reports, agriculture secretary Arabinda Padhee said.

# Need to find ways of scoring runs to put bowlers under pressure: Rohit Sharma

**New Delhi:** Rohit Sharma admitted that his side didn't bat well in the first innings of the Pune Test and that a deficit of over 100 on a tricky surface ultimately proved to be too huge to surmount a turnaround. India slipped to their first Test series loss at home in 12 years on Saturday (October 26) with another failure in this game fuelling talks of a decline in batting standards against spin.

While the Indian captain steered clear of indulging in hyperboles or finger-pointing, he did admit that there was a need to consider varied means of countering spin - something the visiting batters managed to do so. "We didn't bat well in the first innings. We got only 150 [156] and the batters do understand that they failed to respond to that pressure, that challenge of playing on whatever pitch," Rohit said after the 113-run loss in Pune.

"The pitch was not bad at all. We just didn't play

well enough to get closer to that first inning score of theirs. And then obviously with 100 [103] runs behind, we always knew that it is going to be challenging whatever score we have to get. Because as the game went on, the pitch started behaving slightly differently.

"And then, yeah, 350 to get, we knew that the mindset that we had was wanting to get those runs. We had a great partnership with [Yashasvi] Jaiswal and [Shubman] Gill in the middle. But again, then we lost wickets, quickly after that. And then obviously we knew that the game was slipping out of our hands. And we failed to respond to that pressure."

Elaborating on redirecting the pressure applied by Mitchell Santner & Co., Rohit admitted that the batters needed to find different scoring options - both in front and behind square - in order to manipulate

the field and ease the stranglehold the opposition spinners can create. This topic came into prominence earlier this year after Ollie Pope swept and reverse-swept England to a famous win in Hyderabad. While India's batters found their own ways to push back the England threat in the remainder of that series, they were unable to do so on a pitch with substantial purchase for spin.

"You have to look to get runs also and that's how you try and put the bowlers under pressure," Rohit said. "Like I just mentioned about New Zealand batters, they were trying to do different things and it worked very well for them. Because they were trying to do different things and put bowlers under pressure and in that process, there is a good chance that the bowlers will try and do different things, misread the length, and that works in the opposition's favour and that is exactly what



happened.

"That's one thing that we wanted to do as a team. Try and play paddle, reverse, sweep. Because when you do those kind of things, they have to take one extra man from the front and put it behind. And that allows you to then play straighter and hit those gaps. And that is what New Zealand did. They exploited that fielders, they played that reverse and sweep and paddle, which meant we had to

put the fielders behind square.

"And that allowed them to then play with a straighter bat as well. So that is what we have been discussing. We need to try and find ways to score runs.

"Because when you are playing on pitches like this, where the odd ball turns, the odd ball comes with the arm, you have to find options to do different things. And then when you play with that field a little bit, it allows

you to then play with a straighter bat as well. We have been talking about that for a while, of sweeping and reverse sweeping and stuff like that.

"But eventually, when the player goes out in the middle, it is his decision what he thinks at that particular time is right to do against certain bowlers. Certain bowlers, it is not easy to sweep and reverse sweep. Because they get the ball to come in really quick.

So yeah, it depends on every batter that is in the middle to take that call. Whether it is doing that or whether it is going down the ground, stepping out and playing with your soft hand, pushing the ball in the gap, all those things. So that is what I think overall, if I look at the last 10-15 Test matches that we played in India, we did that. We were not able to do it in these two games."

The Indian captain also came out in defence of his two ace spinners, Ravichandran Ashwin and Ravindra Jadeja, who were off colour in the Test and outbowled by Santner in particular, who found the right variety in speeds and trajectories for the surface and more importantly kept the stumps in play enough to walk away with a rich match haul of 13 for 158. "There is too much expectation on those two guys. Every game they play, they are expected to take wickets, they are expected to run through

the team and they are expected to win Test matches for us. I don't think that's fair," Rohit said.

"It's the responsibility of all of us to make sure that we get the Test match wins, not just the two guys. Of course, by their standard, they know where they stand and what they haven't been able to do or what they have done really well. But again, both of them have played so much cricket here and have such huge contributions to our success of having that home streak of 18 series. These two have played a major role in that. So, a couple of series, I am not going to look into too much, especially with those two guys. They know exactly what happens and sometimes they are allowed to have some bad games here and there, and not go by that expectation that this is the opportunity for me to take wickets and run through the opposition.

## 'We wanted to fire a shot first up and I certainly think we've done that in both games'

**New Delhi:** Adam Gilchrist and Alastair Cook have company in the form of Tom Latham in the rather exclusive list of captains to have won a Test series in India in the 21st century. Conquering a nearly invincible side at home will have a rightful place in the sport's history. And rightly so, the captain of New Zealand was a proud man at the end of the third day in Pune.

"I'm still at a loss for words a little bit. It's obviously an immensely proud moment for this group," said a beaming Latham. "Coming off the back of a Sri Lankan series where we didn't get the results that we wanted to come here and play the style of cricket that we've played... We're obviously immensely proud to be in the position of winning two Test matches here. A lot of New Zealand teams have come here over the past 69 years, I think it is, and 13 series. To be the first team to win a series over here is



immensely special and very proud of this group," said Latham.

It was important that New Zealand stuck to their guns even after the defeat in Sri Lanka, felt Latham. He was keen on firing the opening salvo as he admitted. "We've come here and we've wanted to compete and we've wanted to fire a shot first up and I certainly think we've done that in both games, obviously with the ball in the first game but also with the bat here, being able to put first innings runs on the board has been really important and obviously the bowlers

went to work over the last couple of days which has been very pleasing to see," he quipped. Mitchell Santner finished with match-figures of 13 for 157 was a constant presence across the two days when New Zealand bowled, and earned a pat on the back from his captain. "He did a fantastic job, I think obviously the wickets that he got but I think it will go unnoticed the amount of overs he bowled back to back. I think Will [O'Rourke] bowled one over with the new ball from that end and Mitch bowled the rest.

"Someone like that to come and bowl that amount of overs to keep being a threat for that amount of time... I kept trying to take him off but he kept taking a wicket, so I said you can keep going," said the happy captain and added, "But I can't praise him enough in terms of what he's done this game."

New Zealand ended up outplaying India with the bat as well, particularly so in the first innings. "From our batting point of view that's all we wanted to do was try to put them under pressure I think we saw a slightly different way that we played yesterday just being a little bit more attacking. We tried to counteract any punch that they threw at us whether it was around the wicket or over the wicket or different field changes. "So obviously it's pleasing that we're in that position where they might have found it a little bit hard. We've certainly been on that side of things before when we've come to these parts of the

world where anything you do doesn't work and you do feel under pressure so it's obviously a nice position to be in when you put a score or you get a lead of what we did," he said and credited the preparation done for the series. "Nothing prepares you like playing hard Test cricket and I think that was a really important thing for us - being in Sri Lanka beforehand just understanding conditions a little bit more. Even though they're different they are similar in terms of playing a lot of spin trying to find ways to be successful in these conditions. So I think that certainly helped. "We try to leave no stone unturned in terms of what we're going to get. We've been to these parts of the world before and guys understand how they want to approach things and the approach may have looked slightly different in terms of trying to be a little bit more attacking and put India under a little bit of pressure. So I think that was very pleasing."



**New Delhi:** MS Dhoni has cleared the air over his participation in the upcoming season of the Indian Premier League (IPL), and a relieved Chennai Super Kings are not wasting any time to confirm that their talisman will indeed be playing in the coming season. "When he is ready, what else (do) we want. We are happy," franchise CEO Kasi Viswanathan told Cricbuzz on Saturday. Viswanathan's assertion comes a day after Dhoni said he is looking forward to enjoying his cricket in the few years that are left in his career. "I just want to enjoy whatever last few years of cricket I am able to play," Dhoni was quoted

as saying to TOI. "When you play cricket like a professional sport, it becomes difficult to enjoy it just like a game. That's what I want to do. It's not easy." The emotions keep coming, the commitments are there. I want to enjoy the game for the next few years. I have to keep myself fit for nine months, so that I can play two and a half months of IPL. You need to plan it out, but at the same time chill a bit." Although Dhoni's decision, rather announcement, was widely on the expected lines, CSK officials had been maintaining that they were waiting for the final confirmation from him. They have been

insisting that they expected to hear his decision by October 28. With Dhoni's intentions now clear, the franchise will soon make its final retention decisions. Viswanathan confirmed that Dhoni will call N Srinivasan, the franchise owner, in the coming days to finalise the list of players to be retained. Dhoni, of course, will come in the uncapped category, impacting the auction price by a mere INR 4 crore. It's a given that Ravindra Jadeja will be the No. 1 retention, followed by Ruturaj Gaikwad. Matheesha Pathirana, essentially a CSK product, is believed to have agreed to be the No. 3 retention, with his manager finalising the deal in Chennai last week. Among Shivam Dube, Devon Conway, and uncapped player Sameer Rizvi, two should be retained. The final selections will be confirmed in the upcoming conversation between Srinivasan and Dhoni, who is expected to return to Ranchi from Goa within the next few days.

## Evin Lewis ton earns consolation win for WI

**New Delhi:** Evin Lewis hit four sixes and nine fours on his way to a 61-ball 102 that earned West Indies a consolation win in the third ODI against Sri Lanka in yet another rain-truncated fixture in P a l l e k e l e . Complementing Lewis's ton was Sherfane Rutherford with a 26-ball 50. Sri Lanka posted 156 for 3 in the 23-overs-a-side fixture, leaving West Indies to chase a mammoth 195 on the basis of DLS method. Sri

Lanka got rid of Brandon King and Shai Hope but Lewis and King blitzed their way to a win with an over and eight wickets to spare. Compared to how Sri Lanka finished, their start could be considered sedate as openers Avishka Fernando and Pathum Nissanka took the team to 47 for 0 in 10 overs. Nissanka made the most of the chance offered to him in the first over when Brandon King couldn't hold onto a tough

chance at first slip, to push Sri Lanka along. Even as the threat of rain loomed the two openers solidified Sri Lanka's essay, taking them to 81 for 0 in 17 overs. On the first ball of the 18th over, Fernando gave Roston Chase a return catch after which the players were forced indoors as rain arrived. It kept the players indoors for nearly the next five hours, before they were out to play the truncated fixture. Kusal Mendis took the

change as an invitation to take risks as he hit Chase for four successive fours in the same over. While Nissanka got to his fifty, Mendis flew from the other end. He carted nine fours and a six in his 22-ball 56 as Sri Lanka added 75 runs in the 5.4 overs after the rain break. The re-calculated target left West Indies with a mountain to climb and were perhaps staring at a 3-0 series defeat. West Indies started well behind the asking rate

through King and Lewis before the former hit a delivery from Asitha Fernando to the deep square leg fielder in the sixth over. Lewis and Shai Hope dragged West Indies to 76 for 1 in 10 overs and were still way behind the eight-ball. In the 12th over, Lewis got to a 34-ball 50 even as the game started to slip away from the visitors' grasp. Things slipped further as Hope's laboured stay was then brought to an end in the

15th over by Dilshan Madushanka - a wicket that inadvertently gave West Indies the shot in the arm they needed as Rutherford joined Lewis. The pair dragged Sri Lanka to 125 for 2 in 17 overs, with the equation now reading: 70 runs off 36 balls. The pair slowly but surely turned the screws on Sri Lanka from here as they hit three fours off Charith Asalanka in a 14-run 18th over. Rutherford then took apart Theekshana

for 18 - two sixes and a four, that brought the target down to 38 off 24. Fernando nailed his full lengths outside the off-stump but the pair smartly took singles after Rutherford got an early boundary in the over, to take 10 off it. Rutherford then carved a Madushanka yorker for a four and Lewis hit him for a six to move into the 90s and take the game by the scruff of its neck. 15 off 12 was swiftly reduced to 5 off 7 as

Rutherford tonked another six over long-on in the 22nd over from Fernando. Lewis then fittingly finished the game with a straight six that also earned him his exceptional century.
