

Odisha appoints 282 officers and staff cross various depts, CM calls them ‘pilots of progress’

BJP win in Haryana victory of politics of development, good governance: PM Modi



Addressing the new officials, Majhi described them as the “pilots of the progress” for the state’s growth engine. He urged them to work diligently for the successful implementation of government schemes aimed at public welfare. Stressing his

Governor-nominated MLAs could play a decisive role in government formation. In Haryana, where exit polls predicted a clean sweep for the Congress, the party's missteps like banking heavily on Jat stalwart Bhupinder Singh Hooda and the sidelining of Dalit leader Kumari Selja may have cost it the election. The consolidation of non-Jat votes by the BJP hurt the Congress further. The grand old party focused its efforts on

wooning the Jat community and neglected the politically consequential Ahirwal belt, which comprises urban and industrial centres Gurugram, Faridabad, Rewari and Mahendragarh. The BJP appears set to improve on its 2019 performance, when it won 40 seats and had to partner with the JJP. A key factor that could have contributed to this success is the party's strategy of fielding fresh candidates and

expanding outreach to Other Backward Class (OBC) and Scheduled Caste (SC) communities. Nayab Singh Saini is being credited as the key architect behind the BJP's success in Haryana. After replacing Manohar Lal Khattar as Chief Minister, Saini, an OBC, became the face of the BJP's poll campaign. His leadership is seen as instrumental in overcoming anti-incumbency and securing the party's third consecutive term in the state.

In Jammu and Kashmir, where a photo finish was predicted by most exit polls, the National Conference staged a sensational comeback. The party won 41 seats and is leading in one, while ally Congress bagged six seats. NC chief Farooq Abdullah expressed confidence about forming the government and said, "It will not be 'police raj' here but 'logon ka raj' here." The BJP dominated the Jammu region but posted a dismal performance in

the Kashmir Valley. Despite the central government's five-year push to transform the region into a 'New Kashmir' with a focus on peace, development, and prosperity, the promised change did not convert into votes for the saffron party in the region.

Congress candidate and wrestler Vinesh Phogat won in Julana on her poll debut. The Olympian secured 64,548 votes and beat her nearest rival, BJP's Yogesh Kumar, by 5,553 votes. Phogat was nominated by the Congress after her heartbreak at the Paris Olympics.

Staring at defeat in Haryana, the Congress lodged a complaint with the Election Commission alleging "inordinate and unacceptable delay in updating trends" on its website.

"Like the Lok Sabha elections, in Haryana we are again witnessing slowing down of uploading up-to-date trends on the

ECI website. Is the BJP trying to build pressure on the administration by sharing outdated and misleading trends?" tweeted Congress leader Jairam Ramesh. The Election Commission dismissed the Congress's charge as unsubstantiated. In a strongly-worded statement, the EC said it "unequivocally rejects" the party's attempt to "surreptitiously give credence to irresponsible, unfounded and uncorroborated malafide narratives". In a setback for the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), the party failed to win any seats in Haryana, the home state of its leader Arvind Kejriwal. However, AAP candidate Mehraj Malik is leading in the race for the Doda assembly seat in Jammu and Kashmir. AAP's loss in Haryana is significant, as the party could not secure a seat-sharing deal with the Congress, its ally in the national INDIA bloc.

golden opportunity to work directly with the public. "Be committed to the religion of humanity. Strive to improve yourself and engage in nation-building," he advised.

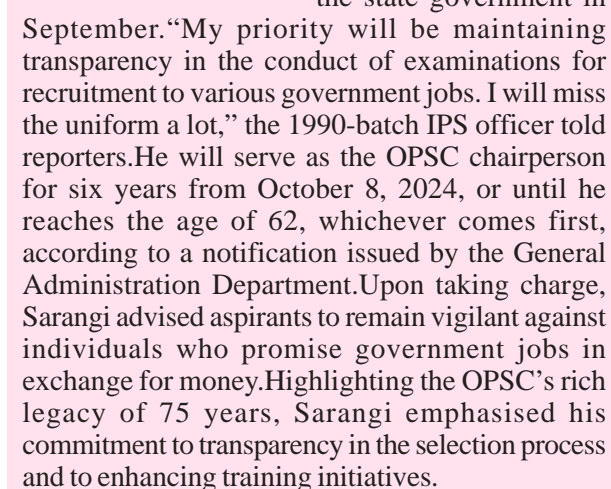

Villagers gherao Collectorate over Samakoi-Chakdar project

Keonjhar (KCN): Thousands of villagers from Telkoi block of Keonjhar district took out a huge rally in this district headquarters town and staged a demonstration in front of the district Collectorate protesting the proposed Samakoi-Chakdar Irrigation Project. The protest organised by the Samakoi-Chakdar Project Coordination Committee was led by the outfit's president Kailas Chandra Pradhan and co-ordinator Laxmidhar Pradhan. Thousands of Telkoi area residents marched to the district headquarters town located at about 60km distance and staged a rally holding placards and shouting slogans against the government.

Later, a protest meeting was held in front of the district Collectorate. Their agitation received a boost after leaders of various political parties including Congress and BJD joined them. The leaders strongly demanded the government stop its implementation saying that the project would not bring any benefit to people of Keonjhar district. "We cannot leave our birthland for the sake of an irrigation project from which only neighbouring Angul district will benefit," they thundered. Implementation of the project has been hanging fire for the last 20 years after protests by the local residents. However, after the new state



government announced financial support for the project in the state Budget-2024, people have expressed displeasure over the move. The residents have staged Telkoi bandh and road blockades on National Highway- 49 several times in the past, the leaders informed. The leaders said they would

take to the streets in state capital Bhubaneswar and threatened to lay siege on the Governor's office in the coming days if their demands is not met. They alleged that the project work is being expedited without conducting any Gram Sabha or Palli Sabha. They informed that the

dam work is being spearheaded by giving wrong information that a 402-feet dam will be built to store water up to 390 feet depth in the reservoir. They warned that they are the descendants of great revolutionary Dharani Bhuyan who fought against the royal system for democracy and will

never allow let it happen. They threatened that if required they will go for mass self-immolation. Police registering cases against 60 persons among the protesters will never deter them in carrying out their protest, they said. They also challenged Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi to carry on with the project work. This project is being built to appease the residents of Angul district, they alleged adding that previous governments of Congress and BJD stopped the project in the interest of the people. The leaders asked the CM to answer as to why his state government approved the anti-people project. Among others,

former PCC presidents Niranjana Patnaik and Jaydev Jena, BJD Zilla Parishad member Ashish Chakraborty, PCC general secretary Aloy Mishra, secretary Sangram Das, leader Nirmal Nayak, former MLA Subarna Nayak and Dhanurjay Sidhu, senior leaders Krushna Chandra Mohanty, former MP Yashwant Laguri, engineer Binod Nayak and others addressed the gatherings.

Sources said the Samakoi-Chakdar irrigation project, when completed, will provide irrigation to 24,194 hectares of land in both Keonjhar and Angul districts. However, locals fear the submergence of their lands as the reservoir

of the dam will be in Telkoi block. On the other hand, the people of Pallahara block of Angul district will benefit more from the project. This has been spreading discontent among the people of Telkoi block. The project was conceived about 20 years back but was put on ice due to protests. Keonjhar Sub-Collector Umashankar Dalei said, "We told the Water Resources department to prepare a report about the facts of the project including its social and other impacts. Villagers do not want any more projects. We have already intimated the government about the villagers' demands and are waiting for a report about the project."

Odisha: 20-year-old woman dies after 'setting herself on fire'

Berhampur (KCN): A 20-year-old woman, who allegedly set herself on fire because of torture by her father and stepmother, died during treatment at a hospital in Odisha's Ganjam district Tuesday, police said. Rani Pradhan, a final year undergraduate student from

Kukudakhandi village in Berhampur Sadar police station area, set herself on fire by pouring petrol near the Panchayat Samity office on Monday afternoon, they said. SP Sarvana Vivek M said she suffered 90 per cent burn injuries and was undergoing

treatment at the MKCG Medical College and Hospital where she died. Initial inquiry has revealed that she took the step as her father and stepmother allegedly tortured her, police said. Her mother died when she was just three years old, following which her

father married another woman and they have a son. "We have detained her father for interrogation. The exact cause will be known only after the integration of her father and other relatives," said the S.P.A case of unnatural death was registered, police said.

Odisha to frame SOP on appropriate behaviour with defence personnel at police stations

Cuttack (KCN): Odisha government Tuesday informed the high court that the state home department will soon frame a standard operating procedure (SOP) on appropriate behaviour with defence personnel at police stations. This was conveyed through an affidavit by senior IPS officer Dayal Gangwar, who was previously instructed by the Orissa High Court to submit a report following a recent incident at

Bharatpur Police Station in Bhubaneswar. In early September, there was widespread outrage after an army officer and his female friend were allegedly assaulted by police officers inside Bharatpur Police Station when they went to lodge a complaint about a road rage incident. During a hearing related to this matter, the HC expressed concern over the violation of Supreme Court guidelines regarding installation of CCTV cameras at police

stations. In response, Gangwar appeared before the court and said measures were being taken to install CCTV cameras in all police stations state-wide, with completion expected within 15 days. He also mentioned that the state government is working on two new Video Management Systems (VMS) that would allow the DGP and all 32 district police chiefs to monitor CCTV footage at police stations.

The High Court expressed satisfaction with the steps taken by the state government in relation to the incident involving the army officer and adjourned the matter to be heard again next month. Meanwhile, the state government has instituted a Judicial Commission of Inquiry into the incident, transferred the police investigation to the Crime Branch, and suspended at least five police personnel involved in the case.

approach. After much deliberation, we've unanimously decided to forgo pre-release screenings for our upcoming films. This decision has been difficult to make, however, we believe it's a necessary step in ensuring that every

viewer, including our friends in the media, witness our stories as they were meant to be experienced. We believe it will help in maintaining the excitement of the cinematic experience for all (sic)."

The production house clarified that though

there wouldn't be pre-release screenings, they would host screenings for the press in the first half of the film's release day for timely reviews. "Having said that, we understand the importance of timely reviews and the role they play in the success

of our films. Therefore, we are pleased to announce that we will be hosting press screenings in the first half of the release day for each of our movies. We warmly welcome all media personnel to join us at these screenings, where you will be the first to witness our latest offerings (sic)," the note said.

The makers concluded the note with, "We value the relationship built with each one of you over the years and look forward to your continued cooperation. Thank you again for your consistent support! (sic)."

Poverty eradication in India

- Rapid growth in population puts pressure on available resources and makes it challenging to achieve sustainable development. As a result, high levels of unemployment and limited access to essential services contribute to high poverty rates.



Recently, Prime Minister Narendra Modi mentioned poverty in his address to the United Nations. He said that in the ten-year tenure of our government, about 25 crore people have come out of the poverty line, which has improved their lives. After this statement of PM Modi, discussion has once again started on poverty in India and the world. Actually, there is a need to understand poverty and its causes in detail. Only after this can poverty removal measures be made effective. Poverty in India is a complex and multidimensional issue, which is influenced by a combination of historical, economic, social and political factors. According to the GDP of Indian states in the year 2023-24, Maharashtra is the richest state. At the same time, Bihar is considered the poorest state. According to the latest

report of NITI Aayog, about 24.82 crore Indians have come out of multidimensional poverty in the last nine years. Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan recorded the largest decline in multidimensional poverty, claiming to lift about 13.88 crore people out of poverty. The report points to a 17.89 per cent decline in multidimensional poverty over the last nine years, as the number of people living in this condition rose from 29.17 per cent in 2013-14 to 11.28 per cent (about 15.5 crore Indians) in 2022-23. The global Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) uses three broad dimensions: health, education and standard of living to measure the level and intensity of poverty. The United Nations Development Programme has used this methodology to determine poverty levels in more than 100 developing countries. India has added two new parameters maternal health and bank accounts under the dimensions of health and standard of living in its national MPI. Every

household in India is scored based on these 12 parameters. If the deprivation score of a household is more than 33 percent, it is identified as multidimensional poor. The NITI Aayog report shows that India is likely to achieve target 1.2 of its Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which aims to halve multidimensional poverty by the year 2030. The report emphasizes that government programs such as Poshan Abhiyaan, Ujjwala Yojana, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and Pradhan Mantri Jan-Dhan Yojana have contributed significantly to reducing multidimensional poverty. According to research by the State Bank of India released in February 2024, the poverty rate in the country fell to 4.5-5 percent in 2022-23. Based on data from the Household Consumption Expenditure Survey shows that rural poverty has declined from 25.7 percent in 2011-12 to 7.2 percent and urban poverty has come down by 4.6 percent from a

decade ago. According to SBI researchers, the new poverty lines were Rs 1,622 and Rs 1,929 for rural and urban areas, respectively. These figures were calculated based on the recommendations of a group of experts headed by Suresh Tendulkar, who had set the poverty line in 2011-12. The Multidimensional Poverty Index 2023 report says that more than a third of all poor people in the world live in South Asia, which is about 389 million people. India contributes significantly to this number, accounting for about 70 percent of the increase in extreme poverty. The World Bank defines poverty based on the international poverty line, according to which extreme poverty is set at \$2.15 per person per day, while \$3.65 falls in the lower-middle income category and \$6.85 is classified in the upper-middle income category. Considering the poverty line set at \$3.65, India's contribution is equivalent to 40 per cent with a marginal increase in the global poverty rate from

23.6 per cent to 24.1 percent. If we talk on the basis of historical facts, the British economic policy in India had a profound negative impact on the Indian economy, which was one of the major reasons behind the high rate of poverty in India. Many scholars have discussed the economic exploitation or plunder of India during the British colonial rule. They point to various mechanisms through which India's wealth was extracted, including heavy taxation, discriminatory trade policies, and extraction of resources. Dadabhai Naoroji, a strong critic of British economic policy in India, explained the financial exploitation of India under British colonial rule through the Drain Theory. According to Naoroji, the economic surplus generated in India was sent to Britain, impoverishing the Indian economy. This drain took various forms, including remittance of profits to Britain, high salaries for British officials in India, and payments for goods and services imported from Britain.

Many renowned economists and leaders have elaborated on the root causes of the high poverty rate in the country. Nobel Prize-winning economist Amartya Sen has stressed the importance of eliminating social inequalities and investing in education and healthcare to tackle poverty and sustain economic growth in India. Experts believe that the Indian economy is heavily dependent on the export of primary commodities, which is a legacy of the colonial economic structure. This makes the economy vulnerable to external market fluctuations. At the same time, social inequalities, which are often exacerbated by historical factors such as the caste system or ethnic divisions, cause persistent poverty in India. Discrimination limits access to education, employment and other opportunities for marginalized groups. Rapid growth in population puts pressure on available resources and makes it challenging to achieve sustainable development. This results

in high levels of unemployment and limited access to essential services, which contribute to high poverty rates in India. It is worth mentioning that like China, India is also one of the most populous countries in the world. Some experts also believe that the reasons for increasing poverty in India also include global economic dynamics including trade imbalance and debt burden. Unfavourable terms of trade and economic policies implemented by powerful countries hinder local development efforts. This affects the country's economic system, which proves helpful in increasing poverty. The causes of poverty in India also include high population density, low literacy rate, inadequate infrastructure, ineffective governance and limited industrial development. The government has assessed the improvement in poverty on the basis of criteria such as better education, health and lifestyle. This also includes facts like child nutrition, mortality rate, maternal

health, schooling, school attendance, cooking fuel, sanitation, drinking water, electricity, house, property and bank account. Certainly, work has been done to remove poverty in every government. Whether it is Manmohan Singh's government or Narendra Modi's, the country has played an important role in removing people from poverty and improving their standard of living. However, these efforts cannot be called completely successful, because efforts are still needed on a very large scale. For this, along with the government, social organizations, NGOs and even the common man need to work towards poverty eradication at their own level. Only with the continuous efforts of everyone will we be able to eradicate poverty from the country and achieve the goal of a developed India.

"BJP Single-Largest Party In J&K In Terms Of Vote Share": PM

New Delhi(KCN): The National Conference-Congress alliance may have won more seats in Jammu and Kashmir but the BJP has emerged as the single-largest party in terms of vote share, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Tuesday. In his customary evening address after election results, PM Modi pointed out that the BJP had set a record by winning in Haryana for the third straight time and thanked voters for the verdict. Shifting focus to Jammu and Kashmir, he said elections have taken place in a peaceful manner in the erstwhile state after decades. "Peaceful voting was held, results were declared. This is a victory for the Constitution, for democracy. The people of Jammu and Kashmir have given more seats to the National Conference and its allies. I send them my best wishes as well. In terms of vote share, the BJP has emerged as the single largest party in



Jammu and Kashmir," he said in Hindi. The National Conference-Congress-CPM alliance won 49 of the Union Territory's 90 Assembly seats for which elections were held. The National Conference contributed 42 of these, with the Congress winning six and the CPM one. The BJP achieved victory in 29 seats, four more than it had in 2014. Its vote share, however, stood at 25.64% while the National Conference polled 23.43%. The Congress' vote share was only 11.97%.

National Conference chief Farooq Abdullah has said his son and party Vice President Omar Abdullah will be the next chief minister of Jammu and Kashmir. Omar Abdullah, however, insisted that the chief minister will be decided by the MLAs of the party and the alliance. Terming the election result a rejection of the removal of Article 370, Mr Abdullah also said he hoped that the PM would fulfil his promise and restore statehood to Jammu and Kashmir at the earliest.

BJP Defies Anti-Incumbency In Haryana Polls, But 8 Ministers Fall Short

New Delhi(KCN): The BJP may have defied exit poll predictions to pull off a surprise victory in the Haryana election, but eight ministers in the incumbent Nayab Singh Saini government and Assembly Speaker Gian Chand Gupta suffered defeat.

Among the ministers who lost this election is Ranjit Singh, who served as Haryana's power minister from 2019-2024. The former MP finished third in Haryana's Rania seat, which was won by Indian National Lok Dal's Arjun Chautala. Kanwar Pal Gujjar, who handled multiple portfolios in the incumbent government and also served as Haryana Assembly Speaker from 2014-2019, lost in Jagadhri today. He was defeated by the Congress's Akram Khan by a margin of nearly 7,000 votes. The other ministers who



suffered defeats amid the BJP's surprise victory in this election are Subhash Sudha in Thanesar seat, Jai Parkash Dalal from Loharu, Abhe Singh Yadav in Nangal, Sanjay Singh in Nuh, Kamal Gupta in Hisar and Aseem Goel in Ambala City. Of these, Sanjay Singh and Kamal Gupta finished third. Haryana Assembly Speaker Gian Chand Gupta, who won the Panchkula Assembly seat in 2014 and 2019, has lost it this time to the Congress's Chander Mohan, son of former Chief Minister Bhajan Lal.

Defying exit poll predictions and anti-incumbency theories, the BJP scored its best poll show in Haryana today, winning 48 out of 90 seats and comfortably defeating the main Opposition Congress, which was widely seen as the favourite in this poll contest. The Congress was leading in early trends and party supporters responded by celebrating before the trends stabilised. As the counting entered later rounds, the BJP first clawed back and then left Congress far behind -- at 37 seats.

Chandigarh(KCN): Senior Congress leader Bhupinder Singh Hooda on Tuesday said the outcome in Haryana was opposite to the atmosphere was in the state. He also said the results came as a surprise to the party. The BJP emerged victorious in 48 seats while the Congress won 26 seats and was leading in one seat, according to the Election Commission. The BJP is set to form the government for a third straight time, bucking anti-incumbency and overcoming the setback in Lok Sabha polls when its tally dropped from 10 in 2019 to five seats. Replying to a question on the results, Mr Hooda told reporters, "The results have left us 'achambhit' (stunned) and the BJP must also be 'achambhit'. These



results are opposite to what the atmosphere was in the state." "What is the role of 'tantra' (system), we will probe. We lost many seats with low margins," he further said. "We received complaints from many places as well. The way the delay took place. Anyhow, the AICC will meet the ECI. There is no doubt that these (results) have left us 'ascharyachakit' (surprised)," Mr Hooda said. Earlier in the day, the Congress raised with the Election Commission the issue of an "unexplained slowdown" in updating of results of Haryana elections on the poll watchdog's website and urged it to direct officials to update accurate figures so that "false news and malicious narratives" can be countered immediately.

Dismissal talk of any factionalism in the party, Mr Hooda said the Congress was united in the elections. "In a democratic party, anybody may have differences but there cannot be 'manbhed'," he said. On Congress leader Kumari Selja blaming coordination in the party, Mr Hooda asked who was responsible for proper coordination. He

then said it was everyone's job. Replying to a question on the Congress raising the issues pertaining to EVMs, he said, "There must be something. We received complaints from candidates." To a query on the consolidation of non-Jat votes in favour of the BJP, he said there was nothing like that. Asked about his next course of action, Mr Hooda said in a democracy "whatever is the people's decision, we will accept it". On party leader Jairam Ramesh raising doubts over the results, Mr Hooda said, "We will accept it under protest." Asked again about the reason behind the defeat, he said the situation at the ground was completely in favour of change. "That is why I am saying, these (results) are surprising."

UP bypolls: BJP shortlists 27 names as possible candidates for nine seats

New Delhi, (KCN): The BJP has chalked out a list of three contenders each to be made candidates for nine of the 10 seats it is planning to contest in the Uttar Pradesh by-election, sources said. A meeting of the BJP Core Committee was held on Monday under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath in Lucknow. Three names each were decided for the nine seats in this meeting. It was also attended by Deputy Chief Ministers Keshav Prasad Maurya and

Brijesh Pathak, UP BJP chief Bhupendra Chaudhary and Organisation General Secretary Dharampal Singh, among other senior party leaders. The 27 shortlisted names will now be sent to the BJP's central leadership, which will pick the final nine names as candidates for the nine seats. Nine of the 10 seats in Uttar Pradesh that fell vacant after their MLAs were elected as MPs in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls are Milkipur, Katehari, Majhwan, Phulpur, Khair, Kundarki,



Meerapur, Karhal and Ghaziabad seats. Bypolls to the

Sishamau seat were necessitated after the disqualification of

Samajwadi party legislator Irfan Solanki, who was

convicted in a criminal case. According to sources,

Jayant Chaudhary's Rashtriya Lok Dal (RLD) could be given the opportunity to contest the Meerapur seat. Meanwhile, the Nishad Party, led by UP Fisheries Minister Sanjay Nishad, is claiming two seats, but no decision has been taken on it. On the other hand, former Chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav has been holding meetings with every Lok Sabha and district-wise party officials and workers of the Samajwadi Party. Along with the by-elections, the

preparations for the 2027 Assembly elections were also reviewed during Akhilesh Yadav's meeting with the officials of Lalganj Lok Sabha on Monday. The Election Commission may soon announce dates for the by-elections to the 10 Assembly seats of Uttar Pradesh. It is expected that by-elections may be held in November, because according to the rules, the poll panel has to hold by-polls within six months after the seats fall vacant.

RSP signs contract to establish new Stamp Charge Coke Ovens battery

Rourkela(KCN): The Rourkela Steel Plant (RSP) has signed three contracts for the construction of a new Stamp Charge Coke Ovens battery, to meet the coke requirements of the plant apart from reducing the cost of production. RSP has six top-charge Coke Oven Batteries (COB). Out of them, five COBs are small in size while the COB6 which is taller was built during the last phase of expansion.

The planned Coke Ovens battery will be the first stamp charge battery of SAIL. The new battery with a capacity of 1 Million Tonnes per annum of coal throughput



will be set up along with new By-product and Coke Dry Cooling Plant (CDCP) facilities. The COB will reduce the input cost of the blend and will

produce better quality coke along with improved Techno-Economic Parameters. RSP sources said global open tenders were invited for

three major project packages and the bids were successfully finalised for award of work to the respective winning bidders.

Accordingly, a contract was signed with the Consortium of M/s L&T & M/s Thyssenkrupp Uhde GmBH, Germany October 7 for Battery proper with oven machine and refractory. Earlier, another contract was signed October 5 with the Consortium of M/s BEC & M/s GIPROKOKOS, & M/s CUI, Ukraine, for CDCP and DM Water Plant. The contract for the erection of the By-product plant including BOD plant was signed with the consortium of M/s Hutni Projekt Frydek, Czech Republic and M/s Hutni Projekt FM (India) October 4.

Maintenance issues plague Mo Bus service in Rourkela

Rourkela(KCN): Lack of maintenance has hit 'Mo Bus' service in the Steel City hard. Commuters are at the receiving end of the situation as breakdowns and cancellations of these public transport buses have become a regular affair of late, and there seems to be no immediate respite to their woes in sight. "I frequently travel to Bonai by 'Mo Bus' for my official engagements, and therefore, bought the monthly pass. Last month, the 8am bus broke down on three occasions and arrived late a few more times," said Rourkela resident Susant Biswal. Similar complaints are also surfacing from different

routes frequently. The Capital Region Urban Transport (CRUT)-managed 'Mo Bus' touches different destinations in and around Steel City and is a hit among commuters who completely depend on it for their daily travel. "I prefer 'Mo Bus' for daily commute to college as it is both comfortable and quite punctual. However, nowadays the frequency of cancellations has gone up. What I hear from the bus staff the next day is that the vehicle broke down due to poor maintenance," said a college-going girl from Nuagaon, which is nearly 12 km away from Rourkela. "First the new government changed the colour of the vehicles and

is now probably planning to completely stop this service. We are not very hopeful about the future of 'Mo Bus' service," said some passengers. Investigations with the bus staff revealed that there are serious maintenance issues due to which buses are getting cancelled. "Go to the depot, you will find a few buses standing on rims because there is no tire available," said a driver. Another one said, "Many buses suffer from acceleration issues." The driver of an air-conditioned 'Mo Bus' said, "The AC doesn't cool the vehicle properly. They took away the compressor for maintenance and the bus remained stranded for more than seven days."

195 teachers fail to report for duty due to locals' opposition

Nabarangpur(KCN): As many as 195 newly appointed junior teachers failed to report for duty after villagers and members of a joint action committee locked up the concerned schools in various villages in this district, Monday. Sambalpur(KCN): Three postgraduate students were injured late Sunday night in a violent clash between two groups of students at the Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Science and Research (VIMSAR) in Burla, sources said Monday. The injured individuals are former UG students' union president Dr Prabhat Kumar Jena, former general secretary Dr N Biswaranjan, and Dr Amit Shubham. According to sources, the incident occurred late Sunday night during the ongoing 'Prisms2024' event at

the newly constructed auditorium at VIMSAR. While the event was progressing late into the night, a sudden argument erupted between the two groups, which quickly escalated into a full-blown clash. The exact cause of the altercation is still unknown. However, following the incident the house surgeons called for a strike, demanding better security arrangements and addressing other grievances. Following a discussion between VIMSAR authorities and both student

groups, the house surgeons withdrew from their protest. The injured students received primary medical treatment and have been discharged. Both student groups have refrained from making any public statements regarding the incident. It is believed that the clash occurred due to a minor issue between the groups. The misunderstanding has since been resolved, and the house surgeons have resumed their duties, as stated by VIMSAR Director Dr Bhabagrahi Rath. He mentioned that after

receiving information about the incident, Dean Dr Pradeep Mohanty and Superintendent Dr Lalmohan Nayak reached the scene late at night. This morning, the house surgeons who had called for the strike were invited for a discussion with the Dean, Superintendent, and other senior doctors. During the discussion, the misunderstanding was resolved, and assurances were given to address their demands. Dr Rath further clarified that no police case has been registered regarding the incident.
