

CM Majhi to Visit Malkangiri Review Flood Situation

He will be accompanied by the Minister of Revenue and Disaster Management, Suresh Pujari, during his inspection of the district. Enhanced security measures have been implemented in Malkangiri ahead of the Chief Minister's visit.

Majhi will depart from Bhubaneswar at 1: 30 PM and reach Malkangiri Airport at 3:00 PM. Afterwards, he will visit the flood-affected areas. He will return to Bhubaneswar at 5:00 PM. It should be noted that heavy rains, triggered by a low-pressure system in the Bay of Bengal, have led to severe flooding in Malkangiri. As the flood waters recede, the Chief Minister will examine the damage and the ongoing response efforts in the district. The state government has designated two senior officials to oversee the flood response in Malkangiri. These officials, along with the Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) and the Revenue Minister, have been actively monitoring the situation.

positive trade balance of ₹138B. Between June 2023 and June 2024 the exports of Japan have increased by ₹29.8B (16%) from ₹186B to ₹215B, while imports increased by ₹11.8B (18%) from ₹65.5B to ₹77.3B. Signing of the historic I n d i a - J a p a n C o m p r e h e n s i v e

Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) and its implementation from August 2011 has accelerated economic and commercial relations between the two countries. Japan's bilateral trade with India totaled US\$ 22.85 billion during FY 2023-24. Exports from Japan to India during this period were US\$ 17.69 billion and imports were US\$ 5.15 billion. Japan's exports to India were 2.62% of India's total imports and India's exports to Japan were 1.17% of India's total exports. Shri Hari Shankar Halwasiya, President of

Tata Steel Foundation's Anti-Larval Drive Concludes

Over 16,800 households covered across 112 villages under Danagadi & Sukinda

Kalinganagar, (KCN): To protect communities from mosquito-borne diseases during the monsoon season in Odisha, Tata Steel Foundation had started a targeted anti-larval campaign as part of its ongoing Vector Borne Disease Prevention Programme in Kalinganagar region. This initiative, which began in early August has concluded on Wednesday.

The initiative aimed to reduce the prevalence of diseases such as malaria, dengue, and lymphatic filariasis by eliminating mosquito breeding sites in high-risk areas in Danagadi and Sukinda blocks in Jajpur district of Odisha. In the month-long campaign, the anti-larval campaign covered over 16,800 households and treated potential mosquito breeding sites across 112 villages across 13 Gram Panchayats of Danagadi



and Sukinda blocks. Led by Tata Steel Foundation's Public Health Team, the initiative was supported by government staff including ASHAs, ANMs, CHOs, multi-purpose health workers, community mobilisers, Sarpanchs and PRI members. This collaborative effort underscores a holistic approach to public health, working closely with government health institutions. The initiative focussed on reducing the risk of mosquito-borne diseases by targeting mosquito

breeding grounds through a combination of biological, chemical, and e n v i r o n m e n t a l interventions. The initiative aimed to reduce disease prevalence, control mosquito population, and engage the community in identifying and reporting breeding sites to encourage health-seeking behaviour. Equipped with personal protective equipment (PPE), including gloves, masks, goggles, and protective clothing, the teams were trained by District VBD health officials from Jajpur to

ensure proper spraying techniques and coverage of rural areas. In a world defined by climate change, the spread, transmission, and impact of vector-borne diseases is slated to intensify and therefore by fostering active community involvement, Tata Steel Foundation aims to reduce the risks associated with mosquitoes. As mosquito-borne diseases are become increasingly prevalent in the region, Tata Steel Foundation is working to reduce the associated risks by actively engaging communities.

Khel Khel Mein director on Akshay Kumar's low phase: Form is temporary, class is permanent

Mudassar Aziz, director of Khel Khel Mein, discussed Akshay Kumar's recent career challenges, comparing them to a cricketer's temporary dip in form while affirming his enduring talent.

A lot has been said about Akshay Kumar's career graph in the last two years. The superstar saw a string of flops at the box office, leading many to believe he had lost his charm. However, in a chat with India Today.in, Mudassar Aziz, director of his film Khel Khel Mein compared the actor's low phase to a cricketer who is out of form, emphasising that even during such times, their class remains intact.

Aziz discussed his

experience working with him and what Akshay felt about the negative online chatter surrounding him. He shared that he has been interacting with him for the last three years, from the time he conceived the film. Aziz also mentioned that his relationship with Akshay extends over 30 years. The filmmaker further revealed that the superstar pays close attention to what is being said about him.

"It all started when I as a little boy went to see Garam Masala in a theatre and laughed my lungs out. From then to coming to know him personally and now working with him, it has been such a wonderful ride. Also, he is an extremely perceptive, intelligent and aware person. It's not that a lot of this chatter does not land on his ears, it does.



He is not someone to carelessly brush that aside. It may not determine his next choice but he pays careful attention to what's being said about him," Mudassar Aziz said.

He further added, "There is a very important phrase in cricket, 'Form is temporary, class is permanent'. Every time

a cricketer is having a bad run, the whole nation unites to tell them what they should do, or shouldn't do. But you cannot take away their talent and the class reveal itself soon. There was no doubt in our minds about Akshay, and now with Khel Khel Mein, he's returned to comedy, batting on the wicket where he's scored many

centuries. He is back to entertaining his audiences the way they like it."

Mudassar Aziz also shared what he has learned from Akshay Kumar - a trait he feels everyone should adopt. "He treats success and failure as part of the same process. He doesn't process them differently, and that is commendable," he said.

The director also revealed how it's not just with Akshay but the entire Khel Khel Mein cast fell in love with each other while shooting. "We did not have to ask them to be friends as that camaraderie was very much already there by the time we started shoot. We have a WhatsApp group and we keep sharing reviews, posts, and even memes on it and laugh about it. The entire experience has been so satisfying. Also, none of us have the cockiness to claim we made a good film because we had trust and pride in our product."

Combating Sexual Violence with Collective Accountability

The gruesome gang rape and murder of a young medical PG student in West Bengal on August 9, 2024, have shocked the nation, bringing to light the alarming rise of sexual violence in workplaces across India. This heinous act is not an isolated incident but part of a broader epidemic of gender-based violence that has been spreading across the country. The memories of similar atrocities, such as the brutal sexual assault in Manipur in 2023, are still etched in the minds of citizens. The incidents in West Bengal and Manipur are not the only recent cases of gender-based violence in India. From the rape and murder of minors to sexual harassment at workplaces, the statistics reveal a distressing reality: women, regardless of their age, profession, or social standing, are increasingly vulnerable to sexual exploitation and violence. These crimes are a severe violation of basic human rights, and they undermine the safety, dignity, and respect that every woman deserves. These events call for urgent action, reflection, and reform. The time has come for every institution—government, law enforcement, judiciary, and society—to take concrete steps toward creating a safer environment for women.

Sexual harassment in workplaces, both private and public, has been a matter of grave concern for many years, but the frequency and brutality of recent cases have forced society to confront this issue with renewed urgency. The 2023 Manipur incident, where women were targeted and humiliated as part of a larger ethnic conflict, is a painful reminder of how gender-based violence intersects with other societal issues, including ethnic tensions, caste-based discrimination, and political instability. Other recent cases, such as the Unnao rape case in 2017, where a minor girl was sexually assaulted by a politician, or the Kathua rape case in 2018, where an eight-year-old girl from a nomadic Muslim community was brutally raped and murdered, reveal the horrific reality that sexual violence is not restricted to any one setting. It occurs in homes, workplaces, schools, and public spaces, cutting across lines of religion, class, and profession.

To understand the gravity of the situation, one must look at the staggering figures on gender-based violence in India. According to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report, 2021, a total of 31,677 rape cases were reported in India, which translates to an average of 87 rapes per day. This, however, is just the tip of the iceberg, as many cases go unreported due to societal pressure, fear of retaliation, or lack of faith in the justice system. Out of the total reported cases by NCRB, 1% are below 6 years, 4% are within 6-12, 10% are within 12-16, 16% are within 16-18, 45% are within 18-30, 17% are within 30-45 and 7% are more than 45 years of age. Thus, majority of rape victims fall in the age group of 18-30 years, with nearly half of all reported cases occurring in this demographic.

The alarming rise in sexual crimes against minors is also a cause for concern, as children as young as 6 years are not spared from such violence. The distribution of rape cases also varies significantly across states. Rajasthan reported the highest number of rape cases in 2021, with 6,337 cases. Uttar Pradesh, the most populous state in India, reported 2,845 cases of rape. However, experts believe the actual number could be much higher due to underreporting in rural areas. With 2,947 cases, Madhya Pradesh has one of the highest incidences of rape, particularly in rural and tribal regions. 2,496 cases were reported in Maharashtra, including a high number of workplace harassment cases in urban areas like Mumbai. West Bengal saw a significant rise in cases, with 1,121 reported cases of rape, including the recent murder of the medical PG student in 2024. As the national capital, Delhi is often referred to as the "rape capital" of India, with 1,226 cases of rape reported in 2021. The high visibility of crimes in the city has led to better reporting, but it remains a dangerous place for women. Other states such as Haryana, Kerala, and Assam have also seen high numbers of reported rape cases. The north-eastern states like Manipur, which witnessed ethnic violence leading to sexual assaults, present unique challenges, as cases are often linked to broader social and political issues.

The Government of India has an obligation to ensure the safety and security of every citizen, especially women. While legislative measures like the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, the Criminal Law (Amendment) Act following the 2012 Nirbhaya gang rape case, and the Sexual Harassment at Workplace Act are steps in the right direction, implementation remains a major challenge. Law enforcement agencies are often under-equipped, under-trained, and, in some cases, complicit in gender-based violence, as evidenced by numerous cases where police failed to register complaints or delayed investigations. The responsibility of the legislative bodies does not end with the creation of laws; it extends to ensuring that these laws are enforced rigorously and uniformly across all states and sectors. Regular audits of workplaces, public awareness campaigns, and training programs for police and judicial officers on handling cases of sexual violence sensitively and effectively are essential. The government must also ensure that fast-track courts, which were set up to deal with rape cases expeditiously, function effectively to provide justice without unnecessary delays. Moreover, legislators should focus on reforming the criminal justice system to ensure swift justice for victims. Lengthy trials often discourage victims from pursuing legal recourse, leading to low conviction rates. By strengthening forensic infrastructure, improving the efficiency of investigative agencies, and ensuring protection for whistleblowers and survivors, the government can take concrete steps toward reducing the incidence of such crimes. The judiciary, as the guardian of rights and freedoms, must play an active role in ensuring justice for victims of sexual violence. While

landmark judgments, such as the one in the Nirbhaya case, have reaffirmed public faith in the judiciary, there are still gaps in the system. Delays in court proceedings, a backlog of cases, and sometimes lenient sentencing are just a few of the challenges that hinder justice. Judges must be sensitized to gender issues, and courts should adopt a victim-centered approach in handling cases of sexual violence. Victims should be provided with adequate legal support, including free legal aid and protection, so they can testify without fear of intimidation or harassment. Special provisions should also be made for the protection of minors and marginalized women, who often face additional barriers in accessing justice. Fast-tracking sexual violence cases, ensuring anonymity for victims, and providing compensation for their mental, physical, and emotional trauma should be prioritized by the judiciary. The courts must also collaborate with law enforcement and civil society to monitor and ensure the effective implementation of laws aimed at protecting women. At the heart of the issue of gender-based violence is the role of society and individuals. Patriarchal attitudes, deeply ingrained gender norms, and victim-blaming culture all contribute to the perpetuation of sexual violence. Often, victims are shamed for their attire, behaviour, or choices, while perpetrators are protected by systems of power and privilege. To bring about meaningful change, society must re-evaluate its attitudes toward women. Every individual has a role to

play in ensuring that women are treated with respect and dignity. Men, in particular, must challenge toxic masculinity and speak out against harassment and violence. Parents and educators must work to instil values of equality, consent, and mutual respect in children from a young age. Public awareness campaigns, education programs, and community initiatives can help shift public attitudes and reduce the stigma attached to survivors of sexual violence. Additionally, bystander intervention programs can empower individuals to take action when they witness harassment or assault, creating a culture of accountability in public and private spaces. NGOs and social activists have played a critical role in advocating for women's rights and supporting victims of sexual violence. From providing legal aid and counselling to raising awareness about gender-based violence, these organizations have been at the forefront of the fight for gender justice. They have also played a crucial role in holding governments and law enforcement agencies accountable when they fail to act on cases of violence against women. NGOs should be supported and encouraged to work closely with law enforcement and the judiciary to ensure that victims of sexual violence receive the justice and support they deserve. Governments can collaborate with these organizations to run educational campaigns, set up helplines, and provide shelter and rehabilitation services for survivors. Social activists, too, have a responsibility to keep the issue of gender-based violence in

the public eye. Through protests, public campaigns, and social media activism, they can put pressure on the government and society to take action. In recent years, movements like #MeToo have shown the power of collective voices in breaking the silence around sexual violence and challenging the impunity of powerful perpetrators. While India has made significant strides in creating laws to protect women, there is still much more to be done. The Criminal Law (Amendment) Act of 2018 introduced the death penalty for rapes of minors under 12, but there is ongoing debate about whether capital punishment is a deterrent to sexual violence. More importantly, legal reforms must focus on prevention rather than just punishment. Stringent laws must be enacted to address workplace harassment, and all companies, irrespective of size, must be required to implement the guidelines of the Sexual Harassment at Workplace Act. Regular monitoring, mandatory training sessions on gender sensitivity, and the creation of safe spaces for reporting harassment are essential to ensure women's safety in professional settings. Furthermore, the introduction of more inclusive laws that address the intersectional vulnerabilities faced by women from marginalized communities—Dalits, Adivasis, LGBTQIA+ persons, and women with disabilities—is essential. Sexual violence is often exacerbated by social inequalities, and the law must recognize and address these complexities. The importance of women in society cannot be overstated. Women are the backbone of families, communities, and economies. They play pivotal roles as mothers, daughters, sisters, and leaders. Ensuring their safety and well-being is not only a matter of human rights but also essential for the holistic development of society. In Indian culture, women are often revered as goddesses and mothers. However, this respect must transcend symbolic gestures and translate into everyday actions. Men must learn to see women as equals, deserving of the same rights, opportunities, and respect. Treating women as mothers, daughters, and sisters does not mean imposing protectionist attitudes but rather recognizing their autonomy, agency, and humanity. The tragic incidents of gang rape and murder in West Bengal, Manipur, and across India are stark reminders of the pervasive threat of sexual violence that women face every day. To combat this, a collective and sustained effort is required. The government must strengthen laws and ensure their effective implementation, the judiciary must deliver timely and fair justice, and society must change its attitudes toward women. At the same time, NGOs, social activists, and individuals must continue to speak out against violence and work towards creating a world where women are safe, respected, and valued. Only through a concerted effort across all levels of society can we hope to eliminate the scourge of sexual violence and build a more just and equitable world for future generations.

Middle East Express (BMEx), a critical addition to the port's container shipping network, aims to boost trade connectivity between India, Bangladesh and the

Middle East. Until now, EXIM trade between the Kolkata region and the Middle East was routed through transshipment ports, resulting in increased costs and longer transit times. Shri

Raman praised the HDC team for their efforts in facilitating this new trade route, highlighting its potential to enhance economic ties and expand shipping operations.

Mamata Banerjee Says "Willing To Resign" Amid Stand-Off With Doctors

New Delhi(KCN): Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, stood up by junior doctors who were invited at the state secretariat for a meeting today, in an emotive speech said she was not enamoured of the top post in the state and was ready to step down "in the interest of the people". Assuring the doctors that no action will be taken against them, she said the government is always ready for a dialogue. Her anger fell on people, who, she hinted, were masterminding the protest with vested interests. Pointing to the proliferation of anti-government messages on social media, she said, "Our government has been insulted. Common people do not know there is a political colour to it". The people behind the political colour, she said, "Do not want justice. They want the chair". "In the interest of the people, I am ready to step down. I do not want the post of the Chief Minister. I want justice for Tilottama. And I want common people to get medical treatment," the Chief Minister said at a press conference after waiting two hours for the junior doctors' delegation. The doctors' delegation



had come till the gate of the secretariat for the meeting that was expected to begin at 5 pm. But they refused to enter as the government had refused one of their demands - the live transmission of the proceedings. The government, the Chief Minister had said, could not allow live transmission since the matter is being heard by the Supreme Court. The government had accepted all others - including the presence of more members, 33 instead of 15, and then an extra member in the delegation that came. About live transmission, they had said they could not allow that but the proceedings will be recorded. But that proved the stumbling block for a meeting that many hoped, would end the impasse and herald the beginning of normalcy. Ms Banerjee said the

doctors were only carrying out instructions. "I know many in the delegation were interested in talks. But two of three people were giving instructions from outside. We have all that. We could see that because it was being recorded by the press, which were standing right behind... They were giving instructions - 'Do not negotiate, do not go to the meeting,'" Ms Banerjee said. The Chief Minister had waited while the debate continued outside - and she pointed out, this was not the first time. At the end of two hours, at the impromptu press conference, she said, "I apologise to the emotions of the people of Bengal. You thought this matter will be resolved today". Then with folded hands she said, "I have been sitting here for two hours. I waited yesterday too. Not just me, the senior officials

too against whom they are complaining all the time". And they will wait, she said. "Uttar Pradesh, she said, took action. "We also have ESMA (Essential services Maintenance Act). But I will not do that. I am not a supporter of Emergency". Her only request, she said, was that the doctors return to work, because the people are suffering - those who needed heart or kidney operations, those who need immediate care, like patients of heart attack or pregnant woman about to give birth. But there was a sting in the tale: "If the families (of patients who suffer because of the protest) want an answer from us, we will be ready for that," she said. The government has already claimed 27 people have died because healthcare has suffered during the protest -- an allegation rubbished by the doctors. "I have tried my best to speak to the doctors. I apologise to the people Bengal, the people of the country and the world who are supporting them. Please support them. We also want justice -- for Tilottama, for the patients of Bengal who are suffering," the Chief Minister added.

Ajit Doval, Reportedly Carrying Ukraine Peace Plan, Meets Vladimir Putin

Moscow (KCN): National Security Adviser Ajit Doval has met Russian President Vladimir Putin today on the sidelines of the BRICS National Security Advisers' meeting. The two were seen exchanging a handshake in a picture shared on X by the Russian Embassy in India. NSA Doval's visit to Russia comes over two weeks after Prime Minister Narendra Modi's historic visit to Ukraine. In his talks with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky, PM Modi said both Ukraine and Russia should sit together without wasting time to end the ongoing war and that India was ready to play an "active role" to restore peace in



the region. Sources had said that Mr Doval's visit to Russia would be aimed at resolving the Russia-Ukraine conflict. He was carrying PM Modi's peace plan for President Putin, sources said. In the talks, the Russian leader expressed hopes that

PM Modi will travel to Russia's Kazan next month to attend the annual BRICS summit. Mr Putin also proposed to hold a bilateral meeting with PM Modi on October 22 on the sidelines of the BRICS summit to summarise the outcomes of joint work on the implementation of the agreements reached

during his visit to Moscow and to outline prospects for the near future, the Russian Embassy said in a statement released on Telegram. "We are waiting for our good friend Modi and best regards to him," the Russian media quoted Putin as saying in the meeting. On Wednesday, Mr Doval had held wide-ranging talks with his Russian counterpart Sergei Shoigu in St Petersburg and discussed important issues of "mutual interests". It is understood that PM Modi's talks with the Ukrainian President on August 23 figured in the talks between the two NSAs.

Poultry farmers, firms battle over compensation money

Kendrapara(KCN): With bird flu being rampant in this district, the conflict between farmers and firms that deal with poultry products has once more come to the forefront. The district administration has started culling birds in various farms under Derabish block. Five poultry farmers have also been quarantined after they showed signs of being affected by the disease, sources said Wednesday. So far over 8,000 birds have been culled in various farms. The administration is also carrying out awareness drives urging people not

to consume poultry meat and eggs.

A Central team has also visited this district and taken stock of the situation. Farmers whose birds are culled are usually provided compensation by the state government. However, many firms who deal in poultry products and have offices here are asking the farmers to hand over the compensation money. This has come as a huge blow to the farmers. The relationship between farmers and companies that deal in the products has never been good. Farmers have always alleged that the



companies are eating into their profits leaving them with nothing to survive.

Some of them said Wednesday that

representatives of some of the firms that deal with poultry products are threatening them with dire consequences unless they hand over

the compensation amount provided by the government. Sources pointed out that the farmers an average make a profit of rupees three

to rupees five per bird which is indeed a very nominal amount. They added that poultry meat is sold at prices between Rs 250- Rs 350 per

kilogram. And it is the companies that make the maximum profits. It should be stated that not just meat, these companies also sell other poultry products like eggs after procuring them from farmers at nominal rates.

Such is their dominance that farmers cannot directly sell their products to customers. Hence despite the demand for chicken and eggs growing in the state, the farmers have not been able to reap the benefits. It is the companies that deal with poultry products who are eating both the cream and the pie. As

there are no proper administrative measures in place to shackle the companies, the farmers have nowhere to go. They suffer silently and sell their products at minimal prices and without getting properly paid for the hard work they put in. These farmers are the last independent link in the company-owned supply chain, a source informed. He added that unless some steps are implemented to protect their interests, more and more poultry farmers will be forced to look for other means of livelihood.

Scrub typhus claims three lives in Bargarh




Bargarh(KCN): At least three persons, including a minor girl, succumbed to scrub typhus, a disease caused by bacteria, in Bargarh district within a week, official sources said Wednesday, adding that three more patients are undergoing treatment. The deceased were identified as Saroj Pradhan, 42, of Bungapali village under Ambabhona block, Sakhi Pradhan, 70, and Sikha Rana, 16, of Padmapur in the district. This was revealed by the

chief district medical officer (CDMO) Nirupama Sarangi while speaking to media persons, Wednesday. The three persons died while undergoing treatment at various private hospitals in this district. She further said that 20 blood samples were taken for examination at the district headquarters hospital (DHH) out of which three were found to be positive for the bacterial disease. All three of them are undergoing treatment

at home. Meanwhile, no scrub typhus patient has been admitted to the DHH yet, the CDMO asserted. Necessary medical kits have been despatched to all sub-health centres, primary health centres and community health centres in the district while ELISA test is being conducted at the district headquarters in Bargarh. Moreover, awareness programmes are being undertaken in the district while residents are being advised to undergo blood

tests if they have any symptoms of the disease or suffer from fever for a prolonged period. Authorities of all private hospitals in the district have been directed to inform the DHH authorities about any possible scrub typhus patients there. Notably, over 2,800 cases of scrub typhus were reported from various districts of Odisha last year. The disease had claimed the lives of at least eight people in the state.

NewDelhi:Led by Travis Head's blazing 23-ball 59, Australia powered away to a 28-run win over England in the first T20I at the Rose Bowl. It was a day where the bowlers had ample wickets to take back, with all 20 falling across two innings, but Sean Abbott stood out with his spell of 3 for 28. The most productive period for the batters came in the Powerplay after Australia were put in to bat. After a fairly watchful start, yielding 11 runs in the first nine deliveries, Matthew Short cut loose, tonking Reece Topley for consecutive sixes. The most productive of the

overs in that period was the fifth when Head, who had made a fairly slow start with three runs in six balls, went after Sam Curran and hammered three sixes and as many fours in a 30-run over as Australia cruised to 86 in the powerplay. That said, the southpaw eventually fell off the last delivery of the phase. The English bowlers ensured that Australia couldn't return to their attacking ways as quickly as they would've liked following the departure of Head. Short, who had also blazed away to a strong start departed soon after the field restrictions were

taken off, becoming the first of Liam Livingstone's three victims in this period. The all-rounder seized the momentum by dismissing Marcus Stoinis and Tim David off successive deliveries in the 13th over. Attempts to hit their way out of trouble didn't quite prove too successful as Jofra Archer, Curran and Saqib Mahmood kept chipping away with wickets in the death overs, with no one in the Australian lower order being able to make a noteworthy contribution. The visitors were bundled out with three balls left in their innings. England attempted to be



on the offensive much like Australia, but didn't get the desired results. Barring the fourth over in which Jordan Cox and

Phil Salt combined to hit four boundaries off Josh Hazlewood, it largely remained a phase where the Australian bowlers

could impose themselves. After dismissing Will Jacks in the second over, they could have almost had the wicket Cox too,

but Barlett dropped a return chance. Nonetheless, his stay didn't last too long, as he along with Salt were both dismissed in the Powerplay. Much like it was with their bowling performance, England put up an improved act in the middle overs with the bat as well. Yet again, it was largely due to the efforts of Livingstone, who smashed a 27-ball 37. In the company of Sam Curran, he offered a brief hope of a revival of a chase that had never really taken off. Despite scoring at nearly 9-an-over through the middle overs, four more wickets

had further dented their chances. There wasn't much of a resistance offered from the English lower order. With the required rate mounting and barely any wickets to play with, the lower order tried to swing their way out of trouble but only with limited success as Australia ensured there were no late twists. Three in fray for election to Associate CEC post this week

New Delhi: The International Cricket Council (ICC) will hold the election for one Chief Executives Committee (CEC) position this week. Three candidates, Dr Vignaesh Shankaran of Germany, Sumod Damodar from Botswana, and Richard Done of Papua New Guinea are in the fray for the position vacated by UAE's Mubasir Usmani, who has been elected to the ICC Board as Associate Nation Director in July. The ICC has said that the election will be held between September 12 and 18 and the elected candidate will complete the current term of two years that started in 2023 and will end in July 2025. The CEC has three representatives from Associate nations.



Raspal Bajwa, former president of Cricket Canada, and Umair Butt, the head of Denmark Cricket, are the other two sitting members in the CEC from the Associate Members. The big issue among the Associate nations is the recent rule change by the ICC to the qualification pathway, making it difficult for the East Asia Pacific teams to qualify for the World Cups. PNG made it to the recent

Twenty20 World Cup but that will change as they have to compete against higher-ranked nations from Asia. East Asia Pacific has one berth and the Asia region has two and the two regions will compete jointly for three berths in the pathway tournament. Done previously told ABC Radio that he is disappointed with the ICC decision to merge the two regions. "The

EAP region as a whole were pretty disappointed. It sort of looks at us as a region and says, 'well, you know, you don't deserve a spot'. Even though we are ranked 20 currently and we're 19 going into that event and there are 20 teams in the World Cup. So, you know, on rankings alone, we probably deserve a place. Their argument is that the region is a lot weaker and it should be challenging that stronger region to earn a spot." When contacted, Done said he wants to make difference for all the regions. "My interest is not for that specific reason. I have worked hard for Associate cricket for over 20 years. The drive to be on CEC is to continue

to make a difference by working with all regions and members, to ensure to range of Associate views are understood at CEC, and help to grow the future of our Associate members for the betterment of cricket globally. "More specifically, I want to see more certainty and consistency in the funding model and competition structures so members can plan better and further ahead," Done, the CEO of PNG, who previously worked as High Performance manager at the ICC for over 15 years, told Cricbuzz. The election will be held over this week and the outcome is expected to be announced immediately after that.

R Ashwin begins hunt of Glenn McGrath, Nathan Lyon's records in Bangladesh Tests



NewDelhi:Legendary India spinner R Ashwin will resume his international season with the Test series against Bangladesh. Ashwin, who has 516 wickets to his name has been the standout bowler at home in recent years. The spinner has been the standout bowler for India at home in the last 4 years India spinner Ravichandran Ashwin will resume his international season with the home Test matches against Bangladesh. Ashwin, who has 516 wickets to his name in the red-ball format will be eyeing to clasp a few more in the series vs Bangladesh and New Zealand before flying out to Australia to play the Border-Gavaskar Trophy. The mystery spinner is one of India's finest bowlers of all time and has been especially effective in the last three years. It is not like Ashwin has had a dip in form ever in home Tests, but since 2021, Ashwin has 109 wickets at home nearly double that of the

next-best Indian bowler - Ravindra Jadeja - who has 56 wickets. Ashwin, who is easily one of the two greatest spinners in the Test format in recent times, will hope to solidify his position in the echelons of history in the next 5 Test matches. At the moment, Ashwin's tally of 516 wickets puts him in the 9th position among all-time wicket-takers in Test history. Immediately ahead of Ashwin, there are Courtney Walsh (519), Nathan Lyon (530) and Glenn McGrath (563). It is a real possibility that Ashwin will chase down Lyon's tally in the home Tests itself, which will give a nice flavour to the Border Gavaskar Trophy, set to begin in the month of November. Apart from Lyon and McGrath, Ashwin is also chasing Stuart Broad in a different list altogether. Ashwin, who has 363 wickets at home will look to go ahead of Broad, who has 398, while playing in Test matches at home in England. In fact, Lyon is the greatest home spinner of

all time, where he took over Anil Kumble (350) in the previous series against England. Ashwin picked 26 wickets in 5 matches against the Ben Stokes side. If he continues the same touch, he might just pull off a stunner and go over Broad in 2024 itself. Ashwin will have a fantastic support cast around him including the likes of Jasprit Bumrah, Kuldeep Yadav, Jadeja and Axar Patel. The spinner will hope for a terrific precursor to the Border-Gavaskar Trophy, potentially his final one in Australian soil. Ashwin has 39 wickets in Australia in 10 Test matches and is expected to be one of the main threats Down Under due to his experience and guile. The mystery spinner, who is in his last legs in international cricket will hope to secure his legacy as one of the best of all time in the next run of 10 Test matches before potentially playing the World Test Championship Final in Lord's.

Saurabh Netravalkar returns to international cricket for Namibia tour

NewDelhi:Saurabh Netravalkar, who shot to prominence during the T20 World Cup, will return to international cricket after parenting duties saw him miss the USA's Netherlands tour in August. The 33 year-old fast bowler, however, is only set to feature for the ODI leg of the and has been granted leave for the T20Is for reasons similar to the ones that had him miss the Netherlands tour. Netravalkar's absence has catapulted 21-year-old left arm seamer Ayan Desai into the T20I side for the first time. Desai, the U23 pick for Seattle Orcas got a solitary game in the final league game against the Texas Super Kings and dismissed big fishes Devon Conway and Marcus Stoinis in a spell of 2 for 30. USA are set to miss the services of vice captain Aaron Jones after Jones opted to prioritise his CPL stint with St Lucia Kings. It is understood that Andries Gous, who has been turning out for Trinbago Knight Riders



this CPL, found himself at similar crossroads to eventually settle for his international commitments over the CPL. Gous is now poised to make his ODI debut in Namibia after making his maiden appearance to the ODI squad. Former captain Steven Taylor has been ruled out of the tour due to an injury. The injury couldn't have come at a worse time for Taylor, who has been battling form since the start of the Bangladesh series. The left hander has failed

to score a fifty in his last 13 international innings as he finds a slew of top order batsmen breathing down his neck including the likes Sai Teja Mukkamalla and Smit Patel. Smit has been rewarded with a T20I berth after his exploits in the ODIs in Netherlands, which saw him impress with 2 half centuries in 4 games. Milind Kumar finds similar favours after an all round show in the ODIs on the Netherlands tour. The 33-year-old was

ejected out of the T20I squad after the T20 World Cup but parachutes in on the back of his performances in the ODIs. Sushant Modani, 35, makes a startling comeback to the ODI team after an year. Modani, who has remained undrafted in both the MLC seasons, has been inexplicably preferred over MLC performers like Shehan Jayasuriya, Unmukt Chand and Sanjay Krishnamurthy. Some of the non

selections reeks off an increasing wedge in the selection ideologies of USA Cricket and MLC.
