

PM Modi's Odisha visit: Commissionerate Police issues traffic advisory

Bhubaneswar,(KCN): Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to visit Odisha to launch the ambitious Subhadra Yojana scheme at Janata Maidan, Bhubaneswar on September 17. Expecting huge gatherings, the Commissionerate police has issued a traffic advisory to ensure better regulation and free flow of traffic in the interest of the general public. The following restrictions and parking arrangements have been made for the convenience of the general public. The advisory will be in effect from 7:30 in the morning till 3 pm.



1. No vehicle is allowed to ply from Jaydev Vihar to NALCO Square and from NALCO Square to Jaydev Vihar and its connecting lane/by lane.
2. During this period,

the vehicles coming from Nandankanan intending to go towards Jaydev Vihar will avail the road Damana Square – Guru Kelu Charan Park- Sainik School –Acharya

Vihar or take the route via Sikharchandi – Patharagadia – DN School – Kalinga Studio Chhak – Fire Station.

3. Similarly, vehicles intending to go from Jaydev Vihar towards Nandankanan will avail the road via Acharya Vihar – Sainik School – Guru Kelu Charan Park – Damana Square or avail the route Fire Station – DN School – Patharagadia – Sikharchandi.
4. Vehicles from the Cuttack side are advised to avail of NH-316 for coming towards Bhubaneswar or avail Nandankanan road.
5. Furthermore, vehicles are advised to

take diversion from Behera Sahi chhak for going towards Acharya Vihar or CRPF chhak and avoid coming to Jaydev Vihar.

During this period vehicles coming from Cuttack side are not allowed to avail the service road from Acharya Vihar over bridge end towards Jaydev Vihar square. Similarly, vehicles coming from Baramunda side are not allowed to avail the service road from Crown Hotel towards Jaydev Vihar square. The Commissionerate Police, Bhubaneswar- Cuttack requested the public to plan their route accordingly.

Odisha on path to become leader in skill development: CM

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday said the state is on track to become a leader in skill development. He made the announcement while congratulating two local youths for their outstanding achievements at the 47th World Skills Competition held in Lyon, France, from September 10 to 15. The two youths are Amaresh Kumar Sahu and Gedela Akhil. Sahu earned a bronze medal in renewable energy, while Akhil received a medallion for excellence in water technology, bringing pride to Odisha on the global stage. Praising the achievements, Majhi in a statement said, “The accomplishments of our skilled youth at the World Skills Competition are a source of immense pride for Odisha. Their success exemplifies the state’s commitment to nurturing young talent and developing skills that



meet global standards.” He also noted that these victories would inspire many others to aim for excellence on a global platform. The Chief Minister also acknowledged the contributions of the institutions that supported their training, including the World Skill Center, Central Tool Room and Training Centre (CTTC) in Bhubaneswar, and CV Raman Global University. Amaresh, a native of Deogarh district, is currently pursuing a diploma in Mechatronics at CTTC, Bhubaneswar. Akhil is pursuing a B.Tech in civil engineering at CV

Raman Global University, Bhubaneswar. Sahu received expert training from Vietnam, while Akhil benefited from mentorship provided by a specialist from South Africa. The World Skills Competition is an international event that gathers participants from over 80 countries to compete across various sectors, including manufacturing, technology, and services. The 47th edition in Lyon saw 15 of India’s 60 participants hailing from Odisha, underscoring the state’s leadership in the skills ecosystem. Officials noted that the selection process for World Skills is rigorous, involving a three-tiered evaluation before participants represent India on the international stage. Odisha’s World Skill Center has played a crucial role in mentoring and preparing these participants, they said.

Odisha Deputy CM Assures Timely Disbursement of Subhadra Yojana Funds

Bhubaneswar: Odisha Deputy CM Pravati Parida on Monday assured that every eligible beneficiary of Subhadra Yojana will get the first installment of the BJP government’s flagship scheme credited to their bank accounts on September 17. Speaking at a press conference on Monday, Parida emphasized the government’s commitment to ensuring timely financial assistance to women across the state. The Subhadra Yojana, aimed at empowering women aged 21 to 60, promises a total of 250,000 in financial aid distributed over five years. Beneficiaries will receive 210,000 annually, credited in two equal installments of 25,000 each. This initiative is expected to benefit over 1 crore women in Odisha, providing much-needed economic support and promoting financial independence. Deputy CM Parida addressed concerns regarding the initial verification process,



where some beneficiaries did not receive the trial credit of 21. “We have conducted a trial run by crediting 21 to beneficiaries’ accounts to check the system. Those who did not receive it will still get the first installment on September 17,” she assured. Parida also advised beneficiaries to be cautious of cyber frauds and avoid suspicious links related to the scheme. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to officially launch the Subhadra Yojana during his visit to Odisha on September 17, marking his birthday. The launch event will take place in Bhubaneswar, where the Prime Minister

will also interact with beneficiaries and lay the foundation for several development projects worth 23,800 crore. Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan highlighted the significance of the scheme, stating, “Prime Minister Modi has given a big gift to the women of the state. This initiative will uplift women economically and support their financial independence.” As the Subhadra Yojana rolls out, the Odisha government remains focused on ensuring that all eligible women receive their due benefits, reinforcing its commitment to women’s welfare and empowerment.

Deep Depression Over Bob; IMD Issues Heavy

Bhubaneswar,(KCN): Rainfall Alert in Odisha Bhubaneswar: The deep depression over Gangetic West Bengal is currently centred over the region and adjoining Jharkhand. It is expected to move west-northwestwards across Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand, diminishing to a depression within the next 12 hours, as reported by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Monday. According to the IMD, it will proceed to move west-northwestwards across Jharkhand and North Chhattisgarh over the following 24 hours.

Sisodia to meet Kejriwal; likely to discuss names of next Delhi CM

New Delhi(KCN): Senior AAP leader Manish Sisodia will meet Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal Monday, a day after the party supremo announced to resign and not sit on the chief minister’s chair till people give him a “certificate of honesty”. The AAP national convener said that he would become chief minister and Manish Sisodia his deputy “only when people say we are honest”. A party functionary Monday said, “Kejriwal and Sisodia will be meeting today. This will be the first meeting after the decision by them. The



meeting is also likely to see a discussion over the next chief minister.” The meeting is slated to be held at the chief minister’s official residence in the Civil Lines area. Kejriwal, who was

released on bail from the Tihar Jail in the excise policy graft case on Friday, has said that he would hold a meeting of the AAP MLAs in a couple of days and one of his party colleagues would take over as the

chief minister. His unexpected announcement kicked up a strong buzz over the names of his wife Sunita and his ministers Atishi and Gopal Rai as his possible replacement.

Increase in bird population in Odisha’s Bhitarkanika National Park



Kendrapara(KCN): Population of nesting birds has registered a marginal increase in Bhitarkanika National Park, located in Odisha’s Kendrapara district in this monsoon season, a senior forest

official said Monday. The official statistics of the bird census pegged their population at 1,30,123 belonging to ten species. With this, the population of the monsoon birds has increased by 6,265,

compared to the last census as forest officials sighted 1,23,867 birds in 2023. As many as 27,282 nests atop 1,300 mangrove trees were counted this season. The census report

reflects the results only from the direct count method. The census teams monitored all the water bodies and mangrove forest areas of Mathadia, Laxmiprasaddia, Durgaprasaddia and Balidia heronries in and around the Bhitarkanika National Park, the official said. The increase in the number of birds visiting Bhitarkanika is a good sign for bird conservation programmes in the state, said Sudarshan Gopinath Yadav, Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) of Bhitarkanika National

Park. Abundant fish in the river and creeks and distance from human habitation have made it a suitable congenial breeding place for thousands of birds. Watching these birds make and mend nests, collect green branches for building and repairing nests, lay, incubate, hatch eggs, feed fledglings, guard them from predators, and cover them with outspread wings to protect them from scorching rays of sun and heavy downpours is a sight to behold, said the forest officer.

Khordha ‘murder’: Odisha Law Minister meets deceased’s family, assures police action within 24 hours

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Minister for Law, Works & Excise Government of Odisha and Chilika Assembly Constituency MLA Prithviraj Harichandan on Sunday met the family members of a suspected ‘murder’ victim and assured justice.

Law Minister directed the police administration to take immediate action in accordance with the law and arrest the accused within 24 hours. “Our government is committed to providing justice,” the minister said. A youth identified as Maga Subudhi was



found dead under mysterious circumstances at Hatabaradiha village in Khordha district. Suspecting murder, family members put the deceased’s body on the NH and blocked the National Highway. Tension ran high until the

Law Minister reached the spot and brought the situation under control. The agitation was called off after Harichandan assured of all help and immediate justice to the victim’s family members. Taking to his X handle, the Law Minister wrote, “Today, the family of

Maga Subudhi of Vishwal Sahi village near Hatabardiha village under Chilika constituency has alleged suspicious in the death of their son. After investigating, I directed the local police administration to take immediate action in

accordance with the law and take the accused into police custody within 24 hours.” “I offer condolences to the families of the deceased and assure that our government is committed to providing justice to everyone,” he added.

Revanth Reddy Unveils Rajiv Gandhi's Statue, Dares KCR's Party To Touch It



Hyderabad(KCN): Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Monday unveiled the statue of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi in front of the state Secretariat. In his address on the occasion, he slammed the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) for opposing the installation of the statue and asked if its party supremo K. Chandrashekar Rao's family was aware of the sacrifices made by the Gandhi family for the country. Referring to the threats of BRS leaders that they

would remove the statue of Rajiv Gandhi after their party came to power again, the Chief Minister dared them to touch it. On the claim of BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao that the place where Rajiv Gandhi's statue was installed was meant for the statue of Telangana Talli (Mother Telangana), Revanth Reddy asked what the BRS government did for 10 years. He said his government gave due place to Telangana Talli by recently laying the foundation stone for the statue in the Secretariat

premises and reiterated that the statue will be unveiled on December 9. The Chief Minister paid rich tributes to Rajiv Gandhi and said he laid down his life for the country. He claimed that Rajiv Gandhi had accepted the post of Prime Minister for the sake of the people and recalled that he lowered the voting age to 18 years. Recalling the words of Mahatma Gandhi that India lives in its villages, Revanth Reddy said Mahatma Gandhi's dream was fulfilled by Rajiv Gandhi through the 73rd Constitutional

amendments, which gave financial powers to the villages by empowering panchayats. The Chief Minister said Rajiv Gandhi politically empowered women and introduced Information Technology in the country. Stating that the Gandhi family's history is full of sacrifices, he recalled that Pundit Jawaharlal Nehru went to jail for the freedom of the country. He said it was Nehru who protected India's integrity by ensuring the merger of 564 princely states into the country. When there was bloodshed in the country due to communal violence, PM Nehru with his visionary approach established peace and it was Nehru who laid down the foundation for India's future by giving priority to education and irrigation, he said. Revanth Reddy remarked that "some useless fellows" talk about political succession and mentioned that when

Nehru was alive, Indira Gandhi did not take up any post. Even today, the poor worship Indira Gandhi as a goddess. The Chief Minister said it was Indira Gandhi who worked for the poor's development by nationalising banks and abolishing privy purses. She distributed lands to enhance the self-respect of Dalits, tribals and other weaker sections. It was Indira Gandhi who fulfilled the poor's dream of owning a house by building Indiramma houses. She shed her last drop of blood for the sake of the country. Ministers Uttam Kumar Reddy, Damodar Rajanarasimha, Ponnamp Prabhakar, Sridhar Babu, Komatireddy Venkat Reddy, Seethakka, Konda Surekha, AICC in-charge Deepa Dasmunshi, state Congress chief Mahesh Kumar Goud and others attended the programme.

PM Narendra Modi to inaugurate 26L PM Awas houses in Bhubaneswar today



Bhubaneswar,(KCN): Besides launching Subhadra Yojana, Prime Minister Narendra Modi will also inaugurate 26 lakh PM Awas houses at Gadakana in Bhubaneswar on September 17. According to the itinerary of the Prime Minister's visit, after his arrival at Bhubaneswar airport at 10.50 am, he will proceed straight to Gadakana slum. He will reach the slum at 11.10 am and he will be there till

11.45 am. During his stay in the slum, he is scheduled to interact with the PM Awas beneficiaries. The PM will leave the slum at 11.45 am and reach Janata Maidan at 11.55 where he will launch the Subhadra Yojana. For the Prime Minister's scheduled visit, preparations are at their last stages at Gadakana with last touches being given to the Bhagabata Tungi and houses of the beneficiaries. In view of the Prime

Minister's visit, a thick security blanket has been thrown around the city with the routes from the airport to Janata Maidan and Gadakana being declared as no-flying zones. For security purposes, 11 DCP rank officers, 22 additional DCPs, 66 ACPs, 100 IICs, 300 senior police officers, 81 platoons of force, around 500 home guards and three units of STO and ODRAF will be deployed during the PM's visit.

Odisha: Seven engineering students expelled from hostel for ‘cooking beef’ on premises

Berhampur(KCN): Seven students of a state-run engineering college in Odisha's Berhampur district were expelled from their hostel for allegedly cooking beef, a "restricted" activity on the premises, an official said Monday. Parala Maharaja Engineering College

authorities issued an order Thursday, stating that the seven boarders of two hostels were expelled for being involved in "restrictive activities". The college authorities also conveyed the decision to the parents of the students, he said. According to the official, the expelled students

cooked beef in their hostel room Wednesday, violating the rules and the code of conduct of the institution. "A section of college students drew the attention of the principal of the institution about the incident. The action was taken against the students after an inquiry,"

the official said. Activists of Bajrang Dal and VHP have demanded strong action against the erring students. Keeping in view of the situation, a team of police personnel was deployed near the college campus and hostels to avoid any untoward incident.

Odisha to emerge as Tata Steel's largest investment destination post Kalinganagar expansion

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Tata Steel Monday said Odisha would emerge as the company's single-largest investment destination after the phase-II expansion of its Kalinganagar plant from 3 million tonnes per annum to 8 mtpa. The steel major has invested Rs 27,000 in phase-II of the Kalinganagar plant expansion, and the company is on the verge of commissioning its expanded capacity at the unit, it said in a release. The ongoing expansion in Kalinganagar will play an important role in Tata Steel's ambition to achieve its target of 40 mtpa capacity in India by 2030, the company said. "The phase-II expansion of Tata Steel's



Kalinganagar plant in Jajpur district of Odisha... will also catapult the eastern state to an enviable position of becoming the single-largest investment destination for the country's oldest steel maker," the release said. Along with the Tata

Steel Meramandali (formerly Bhushan Steel Ltd) plant in Dhenkanal district, the company's total investment in Odisha stands at over Rs 100,000 crore. "Even as the company is on the verge of commissioning its expanded capacity in

Kalinganagar (to 8 mtpa), Tata Steel believes that the plant has a further scope to double this to 16 mtpa in the coming years, which will further strengthen Odisha's role in Tata Steel's growth journey," the release added.

Huge Quantity of ‘Duplicate Liquor’ Seized from Govt-Licensed Shop in Bhubaneswar

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Excise department officials on Monday confiscated a large amount of counterfeit liquor from a government-authorized shop in the Baramunda area in the capital city. Insiders reported that the confiscation occurred during a surprise inspection by Excise department agents at the shop

situated in Baramunda, within the state capital. Previously, officials had taken samples and noticed discrepancies in the bottle caps, holograms, and other characteristics compared to the authentic brands. Subsequently, the Excise team raided the residence of the shop's staff, uncovering numerous caps and excise stickers.

Following that, they inspected the shop and identified identical caps and labels on various liquor bottles, an official reported. Liquor authenticity can be confirmed by scanning the QR code, which reveals the bottle's serial number, brand, and volume. Excise personnel will routinely collect samples from various liquor outlets for

verification. Samples and inventory from other stores will be gathered and examined as well. In the Monday operation, all stock, valued at approximately Rs 40 lakh, was confiscated, and samples have been dispatched for analysis. The shop's license is held by an individual from Jharkhand.



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Why the UPSC Civil Services Personality Test can be a battle of nerves

how to crack the Personality Test which is now underway. To begin with, candidates must justify the credibility of their statements in the Detailed Application Form (DAF) which they need to mandatorily fill up on qualifying the UPSC Mains, think on their feet while facing a board of five members, and keep abreast of current affairs. Typically, there are 6-7 such boards conducting interviews for different candidates simultaneously with each candidate's interview lasting around 30 minutes to assess their suitability for a career in the public services. Even though the Interview round carries 275 marks out of a total of 2025 on which the merit list is based, this last leg of the Civil

Services exam is a crucial indicator of candidates' success. UPSC reports in the last few years reveal there has been a decline in the number of qualifiers in 2022 wherein 36.89% (933 candidates) cleared out of a total 2529 candidates; in 2021, the qualifiers were more at 41.09% (749 candidates) out of 1823 candidates; while in 2020, 37.07% (761 candidates) qualified out of 2053 candidates. In the pre-Covid years, the numbers significantly rose – in 2019, 45.58% (927 candidates) cleared the test out of 2034 candidates; while in 2018, 40.76% (812 candidates) qualified out of 1992 candidates. Overall, 63.11% candidates failed to clear the Personality Test in 2022, the highest since 2020, when 62.93% candidates failed to crack the interviews. **Practice makes perfect** who spent 35 years in the services after clearing the UPSC exams in 1982, says, "To cope with the rigours of the Personality Test,

candidates must attend mock sessions as it helps them get practice on how they need to conduct themselves, acquaints them with the questions while offering advice on ways to correct themselves, be it their lack of proper diction or even a stammer which they



might develop while articulating their thoughts. Since some of the coaching institutes provide free mock sessions, students are known to hop from one institute to another and end up attending as many as 15 mock sessions." The interviewers, who are mostly former civil servants or experts in their fields, tend to grill candidates in three categories at least:

candidates' educational/family background based on the DAF, their optional subject and general knowledge. "Lack of preparation in any of these sections can leave candidates flustered. Since the Interview is a clear equation between confidence and

knowledge, candidates need to consciously work on these," emphasising that students can answer either in English or Hindi, depending on their proficiency level, hence language should not be a barrier if they have qualified the written exam in either of the two. It is important to fill the DAF intelligently, since keeping it vague and

open ended would only be inviting trouble for the candidates. Students feel most challenged by general knowledge questions, and if they are appearing for the Interviews post the Union Budget, they may have to answer a volley of questions on that topic, Dadoo says,

pointing further that candidates should read the Economist magazine for a comprehensive analysis of international affairs, in addition to at least two national newspapers that cover economic and national news. Questions could be on burning issues of the day such as 'Should India be renamed Bharat', or 'Do you think one nation one poll is necessary', to which students should present diverse

perspectives, exercise balance, maturity and tact without taking the extreme position. **Arts over Engineering** Contrary to popular opinion, the arts graduates in the Interviews, have an edge over candidates from the Engineering stream since they are known to have better communication skills than engineers who are more proficient in the written (Prelims and Mains) exams, "UPSC exam toppers are not necessarily engineers, and it does not award marks based on one's educational background, but the overall personality of the candidate," says Rajesh Kumar Pathak, (1995 batch), secretary, Technology Development Board, Department of Science & Technology, elaborating, that students must be honest and back their opinions with proper data. Apart from knowing their DAF well, they should update themselves about their home districts/ place of education and the government point of view on contemporary and seemingly controversial matters, Candidates are also expected to demonstrate clarity of thought and logical

thinking. **Preparation strategy** Highlighting that for every IIT student who tops the Civil Services exam, there is a Delhi University college student to match, IAS, says, "The key parameters of selection in the Personality Test go beyond the basic knowledge of a candidate to check whether he/she has the wisdom to be a part of the elite services and do justice to the job at hand. This is why even after extensive knowledge, approximately, 6 of the 10 students appearing for the Interviews have a tendency of not qualifying, though they may have an average and above score in the UPSC Mains." Candidates, he emphasises, should read up on a wide range of topics, be it honour killings or the Ukraine-Russia war, Venezuela-Guyana tussle, internationalisation of the rupee or even UFOs, to hone their general knowledge acumen. "The pressure to perform well in a short span can be intense, making it imperative for candidates to remain composed and articulate," . Over the years, the format of the

Personality Test has undergone subtle changes to ensure a more comprehensive evaluation of candidates. Earlier, the Interview primarily focused on assessing intellectual qualities, but the current format emphasises a holistic assessment of the candidate's personality, he says, adding further that success in the Interview is not solely dependent on whether a candidate comes from an urban metro or a small town. "While candidates from urban areas might have greater access to resources and diverse perspectives, it does not automatically make them more adept at cracking the Interview. Students from small towns often bring unique experiences and perspectives, and their challenges and triumphs can be equally valuable. Success depends on a combination of factors such as a deep understanding of subject matter, critical thinking skills, effective communication, and a well-rounded personality, **Retired Principal Educational columnist malout, Punjab**

In Turkish culture, wolves are admired for their nobility and strength, with parents often encouraging their children to embody the traits of a wolf—noble, brave, and loyal—rather than the more aggressive attributes of a lion. In Kashmiri culture, the wolf, known as "shaal," is deeply ingrained in the language and folklore. Several proverbs and idioms reflect the characteristics of wolves. There is also a taunt in Kashmiri: "Shaal jamadari," which refers to a scenario where many wolves gather in one place and make one wolf their captain by crowning him. When a lion approaches, all the wolves run back to their caves, and when the captain tries to flee, the crown prevents him from entering the cave, leading to his demise by the lion. This serves as a metaphor for giving someone responsibility while avoiding accountability yourself. Furthermore, "shawl" in Kashmiri also refers to a famous fabric, typically a square or oblong piece of woven or knitted fabric used as a covering for the head or shoulders. Khwaja Sanaullah Shawl of Khanyar, widely recognized as Son e Shale, was the most affluent merchant and landowner in

nineteenth-century Kashmir. His name, Son e Shale, has since become ingrained in Kashmiri vernacular, often used mockingly. The phrase "Zan Chu Su Son e Shale" (as if he is the Son e Shale of the past) is commonly employed to deride those who exhibit pretentiousness or self-importance. Even today, the legacy of his wealth and status serves as a cultural reference point for those who put on airs.. These cultural reflections reinforce the idea that the wolf is more than just a predator; it is a symbol of the best qualities we can aspire to. 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Haryana BJP's Efforts to Resolve Farmer Resentment



After confronting a significant setback in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, where it lost five crucial seats, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government of Haryana has made a series of political and economic decisions aimed at addressing the growing resentment among the state's farmers. These decisions come at a critical time, with the state preparing for legislative elections on October 1, 2024. The party's leadership, particularly Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, has been actively engaged in efforts to mitigate the dissatisfaction, especially among rural voters, which has been attributed to the electoral losses. The

strategies employed by the BJP reflect a broader attempt to regain the confidence of the agricultural community and ensure that the party remains politically relevant in Haryana's rural landscape. On August 16, 2024, Chief Minister Saini held a press conference before the Election Commission announced the state election date. He revealed a Rs 525 crore financial package for Haryana's farmers, crediting approximately 520,000 farmers with Rs 2,000 per acre as a bonus. The funds, aimed at relieving Kharif season challenges, were swiftly disbursed within one or two days. The primary reason for this bonus can be traced back to the difficult farming conditions prevailing during the Kharif season. The Chief Minister highlighted that the monsoon rainfall had been drastically below average, with only 87 mm of rainfall recorded between June 4 and July 29, 2024. The lack of

adequate rain forced farmers to rely more heavily on alternative water sources, particularly tube wells, which led to an increase in their input costs. This expense rise was further compounded by pest infestations, which were exacerbated by unfavourable climatic conditions. Farmers had to spend more on pesticides and other resources to protect their crops from disease and destruction. As a result, the overall cost of cultivating Kharif crops had skyrocketed, placing additional financial strain on farmers, many of whom were already struggling due to poor yields. Considering these challenges, the Haryana government's decision to offer a bonus payment is an attempt to alleviate some of the farmers' economic pressures. While the official narrative ties this financial support to the hardships of the current agricultural season, political observers believe that the

timing of the bonus is closely linked to the BJP's defeat in five Lok Sabha seats in rural Haryana. The loss of these seats was widely attributed to farmer resentment, which has been growing over the past few years, particularly in response to policies perceived as unfavourable to the agricultural sector. By extending financial support to farmers at this crucial juncture, the BJP government is attempting to rectify its political standing and address the root causes of rural dissatisfaction. In addition to the bonus scheme, the Haryana government has introduced several policies to support the farming community. A significant measure is the expansion of the Minimum Support Price (MSP) procurement list to include ten new crops. Besides traditional staples like wheat and rice, the MSP now covers ragi (finger millet), soybean, safflower, barley, maize, jowar

(sorghum), jute, copra (dry coconut), moong (green gram), and kalatil (nigerseed). This broadening provides greater security for farmers growing fewer common crops and responds to demands from farmer unions during protests of central agricultural reforms. Haryana has also launched the 'Mukhyamantri Horticulture Insurance Scheme' to protect horticultural crops from extreme weather, offering financial assistance to farmers in this vulnerable sector. Moreover, the government is promoting natural farming practices by allocating Rs 30,000 to livestock-owning farmers, aiming to reduce reliance on chemical fertilizers and pesticides, which have been criticized for their environmental and health impacts. Furthermore, the government addressed irrigation cost issues by waiving over Rs 133 crore in irrigation cess, a debt accumulated since

the colonial era. The farming community has widely praised this move, which alleviated long-standing financial burdens and demonstrated the government's commitment to supporting farmers and modernizing the agricultural sector. Apart from these measures, the government has also taken actions to address the concerns of arhtiyas, the traditional intermediaries facilitating transactions between farmers and buyers in mandis (wholesale markets). The government increased the commission for paddy prices from Rs 45.88 to Rs 55.00 per quintal and allocated Rs 12 crore to compensate commission agents for losses incurred during the wheat procurement process. By resolving the grievances of these intermediaries, the BJP government is attempting to maintain the smooth functioning of the agricultural market system, which plays a crucial role in ensuring farmers' access to buyers and fair prices.

The Haryana government has also announced financial assistance for milk producers. Under the Chief Minister Milk Producer Promotion Scheme, Rs 15.59 crore has been allocated as a subsidy for 35,000 milk producers for April, May, and June 2024. This is in addition to the government's commitment to bear the insurance premium for those supplying milk under the Pradhan Mantri Bima Yojana, further supporting rural livelihoods. Lastly, the government has tried to tackle the issue of stray cattle, which has been a persistent problem for farmers. Stray animals often cause significant crop damage, leading to losses for farmers. The government has introduced incentives for gaushala (traditional cowshed) operators to address this. Under a new scheme to free Haryana from stray cattle, individuals who capture stray cows or calves and bring them to

a gaushala will receive financial rewards. Despite these efforts, farmer discontent remains evident, particularly at the Shambhu border in northern Haryana, where protesters have expressed dissatisfaction with the state's recent MSP announcements. These farmers have vowed to continue their protests until an MSP guarantee law is enacted nationwide, indicating that the BJP government's efforts may not fully appease the agricultural community. As the state election approaches, it remains to be seen whether the government's initiatives will be sufficient to sway voters in favour of the BJP or if farmer resentment will continue to challenge the party's electoral prospects.

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The ozone hole is continuing to shrink and could fully repair by 2050 : Scientists

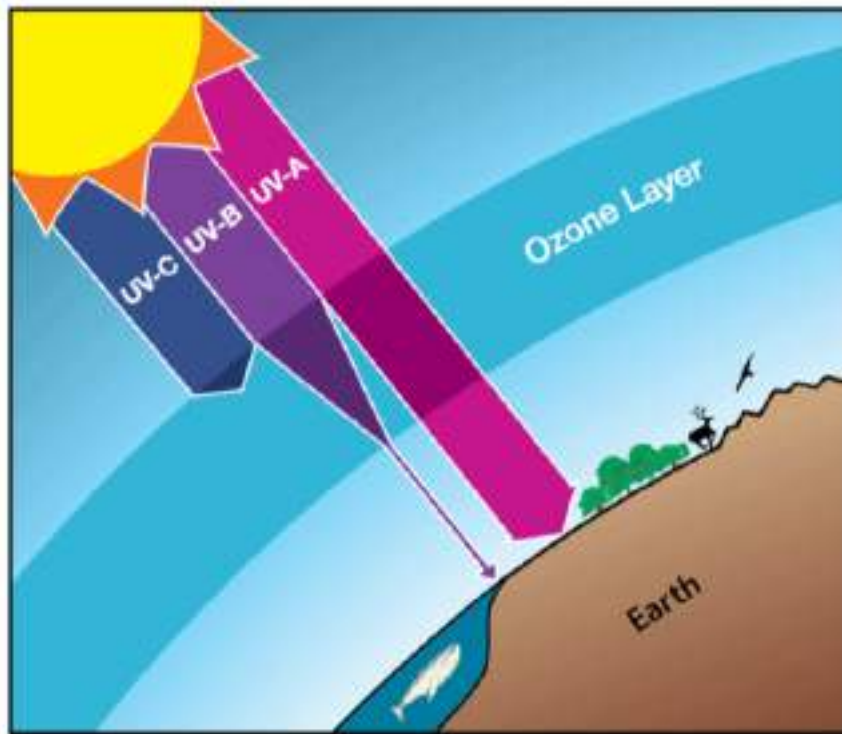


"The ozone layer is a region in the earth's stratosphere that contains high concentrations of ozone and protects the earth from the harmful ultraviolet radiations of the sun." The ozone layer is mainly found in the lower portion of the earth's atmosphere. It has the potential to absorb around 97-99% of the harmful ultraviolet radiations coming from the sun that can damage life on earth. If the ozone layer was absent, millions of people would develop skin diseases and may have weakened immune systems. However, scientists have discovered a hole in the ozone layer over Antarctica. This has focussed their concern on various environmental issues and steps to control them. The main reasons for the ozone hole are chlorofluorocarbons, carbon tetrachloride, methyl bromide and hydrochlorofluorocarbons. "Ozone layer depletion is the gradual thinning

of the earth's ozone layer in the upper atmosphere caused due to the release of chemical compounds containing gaseous bromine or chlorine from industries or other human activities." Ozone layer depletion is the thinning of the ozone layer present in the upper atmosphere. This happens when the chlorine and bromine atoms in the atmosphere come in contact with ozone and destroy the ozone molecules. One chlorine can destroy 100,000 molecules of ozone. It is destroyed more quickly than it is created. Some compounds release chlorine and bromine on exposure to high ultraviolet light, which then contributes to ozone layer depletion. Such compounds are known as Ozone Depleting Substances (ODS). The ozone-depleting substances that contain chlorine include chlorofluorocarbon, carbon tetrachloride, hydrochlorofluorocarbons, and methyl chloroform. Whereas, the ozone-depleting substances that contain bromine are halons, methyl bromide, and hydro Bromo fluorocarbons. Chlorofluorocarbons are the most abundant ozone-depleting substance. It is only

when the chlorine atom reacts with some other molecule, it does not react with ozone. Montreal Protocol was proposed in 1987 to stop the use, production and import of ozone-depleting substances and minimise their concentration in the atmosphere to protect the ozone layer of the earth. Recent studies of UN Environment Program, Ozone Secretariat, support evidence of a recovering ozone layer and the diminishing size and depth of the Antarctic hole since 2000, despite substantial interannual variability in the size, strength and longevity of the ozone hole which is driven by meteorological conditions. Outside of the Antarctic region (90°N-60°S), there is limited evidence of total column ozone recovery since 1996. There is evidence showing decrease of 1-2% per decade in the tropical lower stratospheric ozone from the period of 2000-2020. Ozone protection efforts have contributed significantly to slowing climate change by avoiding an estimated 135 billion tonnes of carbon dioxide (CO₂) equivalent emissions from 1990 to 2010. This is five times larger

than the annual emissions reduction target for the first commitment period (2008-2012) of the Kyoto Protocol, the predecessor to the Paris Agreement. The decline of ODS emissions due to the implementation of the Montreal Protocol is estimated to avoid global warming of approximately 0.5-1 °C by mid-century compared to an extreme scenario with an uncontrolled increase in ODSs of 3-3.5% per year. Averaged over the globe (including the oceans), about 1°C avoided warming corresponds approximately to a

25% mitigation of global warming expected from all greenhouse gases. Assuming full compliance with the Montreal Protocol, surface solar UV radiation is expected to decrease 2-6% by 2090 at mid-latitudes with variable changes in the tropics of less than 3%. The Montreal Protocol has prevented large increases in surface UV-B radiation, with greatest benefits at high latitudes. In the United States, full implementation of the Montreal Protocol is expected to prevent approximately 443 million cases of skin cancer, 2.3 million skin

cancer deaths, and 63 million cases of cataracts for people born in the years 1890-2100, according to the US Environmental Protection Agency. The Multilateral Fund for the Implementation of the Montreal Protocol has been assisting developing countries comply with their Protocol commitments. As of May 2023, contributions had reached nearly US\$5.1 billion. The Fund has also received additional voluntary contributions of US\$25.5 million from a group of donor countries to finance fast-track activities for the implementation of

the HFC phase-down. The Montreal Protocol will result in an estimated US\$1.8 trillion in global health benefits (US\$1.109 trillion for skin cancer alone) and almost US\$460 billion in avoided damages to agriculture, fisheries, and materials from 1987 to 2060 (both cumulative estimates). The Montreal Protocol's success inspired an effort to avoid HFCs, which have been used as replacements for many banned gases. The average global warming impact of 22 of the most used HFCs is about 2,500 times that of CO₂. Global CO₂-equivalent emissions of HFCs derived from observations increased by 18% from 2016 to 2020. The Kigali Amendment requires a phasedown of 18 high global warming potential HFCs by more than 80 per cent (in CO₂-equivalent) from the baseline level over the next 30 years. Estimates suggest that emissions avoided by 2100 could reach 420 gigatonnes of CO₂-equivalent, which is more than 10 years of present-day annual emissions of CO₂ due to human activities. The potential avoidance of up to 0.5°C of global warming by the end of

the century would significantly add to global climate warming mitigation efforts. Replacing HFCs also creates an opportunity to increase energy efficiency of cooling equipment by 10-50 per cent, significantly reducing energy costs to consumers and businesses and potentially doubling the climate impact of the Amendment. Ozone recovery is a long-term mission. While the levels of ODSs are expected to decline throughout the world in the coming decades, the evolution of the ozone layer will be increasingly influenced by future abundances of greenhouse gases, natural events such as wildfires and volcanic eruptions, and even possibly geoengineering, that influence climate change and ozone recovery.

Will Bury Terrorism In J&K To Such Level It Can Never Rise Again: Amit Shah



Gulabgarh (J-K)(KCN): Asserting that BJP-led central government will bury terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir so deep that it can never rise again, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday reiterated that Article 370 is now history and will never be a part of India's constitution again. Addressing an election rally here in Padder-Nagseni assembly segment of Kishtwar district on the last day of campaigning, Mr Shah said the National Conference-Congress alliance will not be able to form the J-K government. "Today, I promise to the people of Jammu and Kashmir, including this region which has a history of sacrifices following the eruption of terrorism in 1990, that we will bury terrorism to such a deep level that it will never surface again," the home minister said. He added that attempts are being made to revive and strengthen terrorism like the 1990s The home minister paid tributes to all those who have been killed in terror-related incidents, and specially referred to the deaths of BJP leaders Anil Parihar, Ajit Parihar and RSS leader Chanderkant Sharma. "National Conference and Congress have made

promises like releasing terrorists from jails after the formation of their government. In front of Maa (Machial Mata's) shrine, I am saying to you that this is Modi's government and no one has the courage to spread terrorism on the soil of India," he said. Mr Shah said the BJP government has strengthened the village defence guards and Special Police Officers who are being provided modern weapons, replacing the old .303 rifles with self-loading rifles. "The security grid being laid is such that any number of people (terrorists) who want to come here from anywhere will face their end in these hills at the hands of our Army and police jawans," the home minister said. This was the home minister's second visit to the Jammu region within a fortnight. Earlier, during his two-day visit to Jammu on September 6 and 7, he released BJP's manifesto for J-K assembly elections and addressed a workers convention. Monday is the last day for campaigning in 24 assembly constituencies, including Padder-Nagseni, which goes to polls in the first phase on September 18. BJP has fielded former minister

Sunil Sharma from the constituency for the assembly elections. Seeking support for the BJP candidate, Mr Shah said, "This election is between two powers, on one side National Conference and PDP and on the other BJP. The NC-Congress are saying that if we form the government we will restore Article 370. Tell me should it be restored?" he asked. "Reservation given by BJP to Paharis and Gujjars and others will be snatched," he said. "Don't worry, I am watching the situation in Kashmir and be assured that neither Abdullahs' nor Rahul's party are going to form the government in J-K," the home minister said. Mr Shah said Prime Minister Narendra Modi has revoked Article 370, and it has now become a part of history books. "There is no place for it in the constitution of India anymore". The home minister said if they are in power in Delhi, how will the NC restore Article 370. "I am leaving with a promise that neither Article 370, nor terrorism will be allowed to return or reservation of Scheduled Tribes and Scheduled castes can be touched," he said. Shah added that the NC and Congress insulted the

Dogras by deporting the last Dogra ruler Maharaja Hari Singh. The minister said he has seen a video of Maharaja's son Karan Singh expressing displeasure over the return of his ashes to J-K, instead of the mortal remains. "They insulted the Maharaja and forced old Kashmiri Pandits. Whenever they came to power, terrorism got encouragement. They snatched rights of women and never granted reservation to the deserving sections," he said. Referring to Jana Sangh leader Pandit Prem Nath Dogra from Jammu and his agitation against Article 370, he said "do vidhan, do pradhan aur do nishan (two constitutions, two prime ministers, two symbols) can never be there in our country. There will be only one constitution, one prime minister and one flag that is our beloved tricolour." Targeting Farooq Abdullah, he said when terrorism erupted in J&K in 1990's, he was enjoying in London. His son Omar Abdullah, Shah said, is in the meantime giving contradictory statements on contesting elections. Sometimes Omar Abdullah is saying that he will not fight elections in the Union territory, but later he came out to submit his nominations from two seats, the home minister said. His defeat is certain from both seats, he said. Mr Shah further said that the prime minister has encouraged leadership among the youth by holding elections to all tiers of Panchayati Raj Institutions to strengthen grassroots democracy. Highlighting the BJP's manifesto, he said the party will ensure development of the region and utilisation of its natural resources to provide jobs to the local youth besides developing a Machail Mata shrine.

"Can Trigger Narrative": Veep After Top Court's CBI "Caged Parrot" Remark

New Delhi(KCN): Days after a Supreme Court judge said that the CBI must dispel the notion of it being a caged parrot, Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar has said all organs of the State need to work in tandem, and that institutions work under tight situations and observations can despirit them, set off a political debate and can trigger a narrative. The Vice President, who has had a long and illustrious career as a lawyer, made the remarks at the inauguration ceremony of Samvidhan Mandir at Mumbai's Elphinstone Technical High School and Junior College yesterday. "All organs of the state - Judiciary, Legislature, and Executive -- have a single purpose: to ensure the success of the fundamental spirit of the Constitution, to guarantee all rights to the common people, and to help India prosper and flourish," he said. "They need to work in tandem and togetherness to nurture and blossom democratic values and further constitutional ideals. An Institution is well served when it is conscious of certain limitations. Some limitations are obvious, some limitations are very fine, they are subtle. Let



these sacred platforms - judiciary, legislature and executive -- not be trigger points of political inflammatory debate or narrative that is detrimental to the established institutions that serve the nation well in a challenging and daunting environment," the Vice President added. "Our Institutions, all kinds of Institutions -- Elections Commission, the investigative agencies they perform duty under tight situations, an observation can despirit them. It can set a political debate afloat. It can trigger a narrative. We have to be extremely conscious about our Institutions. They are robust, they are working independently, they are under checks and balances. They work under rule of law. In that situation, if we work in a manner to just generate

some sensation, to become a focal point or epicenter of a political debate or a narrative that I will appeal to the concerned is wholly avoidable," Mr Dhankhar said in his remarks. Supreme Court judge Justice Ujjal Bhuyan made the strong remarks in his judgment on Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's petition challenging his arrest by the CBI in a case linked to alleged irregularities in Delhi's now-scrapped liquor policy. The court granted Mr Kejriwal bail, six months after his arrest. While Justice Surya Kant did not find the arrest illegal, Justice Bhuyan wrote in a separate judgment that the CBI is a premier investigating agency and must be seen to be above board. "In a functional democracy governed by

the rule of law, perception matters. Like Caesar's wife, an investigating agency must be above board. Not long ago, this court has castigated the CBI comparing it to a caged parrot. It is imperative that CBI dispels the notion of it being a caged parrot. Rather, the perception should be that of an uncaged parrot," he said. The judge's remarks prompted the Aam Aadmi Party to launch a scathing attack on the BJP-led central government and Union Home Minister Amit Shah. "The Union home minister should resign as this raises questions on him. The Supreme Court called the CBI (Central Bureau of Investigation) a caged parrot," Delhi Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj told the media after the top court's judgment.

"One Nation, One Election Not Possible Under Present Constitution": P Chidambaram

Chandigarh(KCN): Congress leader P Chidambaram on Monday lashed out at the BJP-led NDA government at the Centre over the 'one nation, one election' issue, saying it is not possible under the present Constitution and requires at least five constitutional amendments. Replying to a question on reports that the BJP-led NDA government

would implement 'one nation, one election' within its current tenure, he said Prime Minister Narendra Modi does not have the numbers to place those constitutional amendments either in the Lok Sabha or Rajya Sabha. In his Independence Day address last month, the prime minister made a strong pitch for 'one nation, one election', contending that frequent

polls were creating hurdles in the country's progress. Addressing reporters here, Mr Chidambaram said, "One nation, one election' is not possible under the present Constitution. It requires at least five constitutional amendments." "Mr Modi does not have the majority to put those constitutional amendments in either in the Lok Sabha or Rajya

Sabha," the former Union minister said. He asserted that there were greater constitutional obstacles to 'one nation, one election'. "It is not possible. The INDIA bloc is totally opposed to 'One Nation, One Election.'" To a question on PM Modi recently alleging that the Congress wanted to end reservation, Chidambaram rejected the charge.

Keonjhar: Non-Odia mafia continue to plunder mines

Keonjhar(KCN): Odia Asmita (pride) seems to have taken a beating in mineral-rich Keonjhar as non-Odia mining mafia and miners continue their nefarious activities unhindered in the district, a report stated. During his first visit to the district after assuming charge as Chief Minister of the BJP-led state government, Mohan Charan Majhi, who is also an MLA from the district, announced to launch of a crackdown against mineral smuggling, and initiated stringent action against outside (nonOdia) mineral traders. He had stated that action would be taken against non-Odia miners for smuggling minerals and other illegalities in mining operations in Keonjhar

district. They will be rounded up and put behind bars – from Keonjhar to Jharpada jail in Bhubaneswar Majhi had said. The CM's resolve was welcomed by the residents of the district wholeheartedly. This was because it kindled a hope in them that Odia Asmita will be protected in the district after the BJP governments came to power both at the Center and the state. Also it will be in line with the Odia Asmita pre-poll plank which helped the saffron party ride to power in the state. However, even three months after the BJP government assumed power in the state, the promises made by the CM has yet to meet reality. This has sparked resentment

among the residents. While Opposition leaders and activists have become vocal about with their criticism over the inaction, workers and leaders of the saffron party are maintaining a dubious silence. This in the backdrop of the relentless criticism made against the previous government by the same BJP leaders and workers over the mining scam. Majhi, after becoming the chief minister, had spoken about mining corruption and mafia menace in Keonjhar district. Subsequently, the CM's statement became a subject of discussion across the country and the state government's action was keenly watched. However, to everyone's



disappointment, the government is yet to initiate any visible steps in that direction. "Nevertheless, the people of Keonjhar district have not given up all their hopes in the Majhi government. They are eagerly waiting for the day action begins against the mining mafia, and see the accused packed behind bars – from Jharpada Jail to Keonjhar jail," said state Congress OBC Cell vice president and senior local leader Gurbax Singh Ahluwalia.

The Shah Commission paid a visit to the state and asked the government to collect fines from mine owners for illegal mining transactions. However, it was alleged that in a subsequent period, no action was taken for the realisation of the penalty from the illegal miners, and no steps were initiated to confiscate their properties. Significantly, it is now alleged that the loot of mineral resources is going on more than ever

before. Illegal miners have been evading huge taxes by declaring 'high grade' iron ore as 'low grade' and transporting iron ore lumps with the permit of iron fines. The unscrupulous miners and agents are also manipulating in overloading of vehicles and the quantity of iron ores. They are also transporting iron ores more than once using the same transit pass. The mining department often conducts raids on receipt of complaints, but its failure to carry out further probe and follow-up action against the guilty has only encouraged the wrongdoers to continue smuggling minerals with impunity, it is alleged. As a result, such illegal business is thriving as before. Mineral

transportation through rail routes has its pitfalls as the railways lack an established system to check such illegalities. This has raised many eyebrows. To bring transparency in mining transactions, the state government introduced some restrictions on issuing commercial certificates. Former MLA Subarna Naik said as a result of the restrictions, people, or organizations, previously involved in illegal transactions regrouped again and started trading using alibis and changing names of the organizations. In 2012, the owner of a monopolistic mining company was arrested in connection with a shootout that took place at Rungta Mines in Jajang. However, he was back in

operation once he was released from jail on bail. He was later detained under the National Security Act (NSA), while many cases were pending against him. Owing to this, he left the mining area for many years and hid in the Capital City. However, what has surprised many is that soon after the new government took charge, he got a NoC for his business which helped him expand his operations by establishing his monopoly over railway loading and transportation work in Nayagarh, Bansapani and Jurudi railway sidings. He has a fleet of trucks to transport ore, while truck owners who make a living out of transporting ore are on the verge of bankruptcy.

Dhenkanal Heritage Walks showcases art of Dhokra craft



Dhenkanal(KCN): Despite heavy rains and adverse weather conditions, over 30 heritage and culture enthusiasts visited the villages of Nuagaon and Sadeibareni on the outskirts of the town Sunday. These villages are renowned for their Dhokra craft. The participants interacted with the artisans and observed the intricate processes involved in creating this

metal craft, which has been passed down through generations in these small, forested hamlets. The 17th Dhenkanal Heritage Walk (DHW), centred on Dhokra crafts, provided an opportunity to explore not only the art form itself but also the struggles and lifestyles of the craftsmen who, despite facing significant hardships, continue to preserve and sustain this traditional art.

"Dhokra is a non-ferrous metal casting technique with a rich history, utilizing the ancient lost-wax casting process. This unique method has been practiced across India for over 4,000 years and remains in use today. One of the earliest known examples of this technique is the famous 'Dancing Girl' from Mohenjodaro. The simplicity, enchanting folk motifs, and bold forms of Dhokra

products make them highly sought after in both domestic and international markets," said one participant. Award-winning artisan Sanatan Pradhan, a master craftsman from the Nuagaon Dhokra craft village, demonstrated the metal casting process to the visitors. The group also visited the Sadeibareni Cluster House on Dhokra art, built by the district administration.

6 killed, 11 injured in road accidents




Baripada / Bolangir(KCN): At least six people were killed and 11 others injured in three separate road accidents in the state, police said Sunday. Two persons, riding a motorcycle, were killed Sunday morning after being hit by a vehicle on National Highway-26 near Madhiapali in Bolangir district, a senior officer said. Locals spotted the two victims lying in a pool of blood and

informed the police. The two were taken to Bhima Bhoi Medical College and Hospital, where doctors pronounced them dead on arrival, he said. The deceased are yet to be identified, the officer said. He added that the police had registered a case and started an investigation. Four people were killed and 11 others injured in two separate accidents in Mayurbhanj district late Saturday. Two persons,

riding a motorcycle, rammied into a truck and died on the spot near Palbani on NH-18 on the outskirts of Baripada town, the police said. The deceased were identified as Bikash Mohanta (25) and Mitu Mohanta (26). In another accident, a speeding car with 13 people on board hit a roadside tree near Khasadiha on the BaripadaLulung road, another officer said. The driver and one passenger

died on the spot, while 11 others were injured, he said. The deceased were identified as Bhuban Singh (40), the driver, and Jayanta Singh (30). The injured passengers were admitted to the PRM Medical College and Hospital in Baripada, the official said. The district police registered two cases and bodies were sent to the hospital for post-mortem, the officer informed.

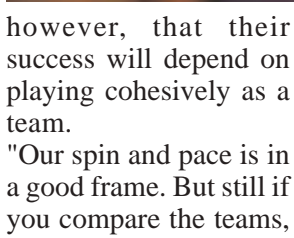

New Delhi (KCN): Mohammad Shami thinks India have a strong chance of making it three-in-a-row against Australia Down Under this winter. "I believe India are the favourites to win the series. In the last series in Australia, we played with a young team, with many senior players absent, yet we still proved we were the best. I expect the next series to be highly competitive, but I'm confident that India will come out victorious," said the Indian pacer, who has been sidelined due to injury for close to 10 months. India have won the last two away series in Australia, in 2018-19 and

2020-21. In fact, Australia have not laid hands on the Border-Gavaskar Trophy since 2014. Shami was part of the 2018-19 series in Australia but did not feature in the team's most recent visit two years later. Incidentally, Shami's last Test appearance was against Australia in the World Test Championship final at The Oval in June 2023. He has been out of action since the India-Australia World Cup final in November last year, having undergone a surgery in the meantime. When asked about his return, Shami said, "I don't want to rush myself, even though I want to come back as soon as

possible. It's not advisable to return with any doubt. I need to be stronger, and the stronger I feel, the better it will be. My goal is to return at my strongest. While I aim to come back at the earliest, my priority is to be fully fit. So whether it's for the Australia, New Zealand, or Bangladesh series, it doesn't matter. Shami was speaking at the annual awards function in Kolkata on Saturday night. When questioned about his current fitness status, Shami said, "I've already started bowling. I want to ensure there are no doubts in my mind and that I must not feel any discomfort. Unless I'm 100 percent in every

make a comeback in international cricket. I have been training at the NCA and I want to play as and when I am 100 percent fit."

"I can't thank Bengal enough. I was born in a family in UP where there was no opportunity. So I often say I was born in UP but made in Bengal. This is a journey of 22 years and I am so grateful to Bengal for making me what I am. The love and warmth Bengal has shown will never be forgotten. I want Women's cricket to come up in a big way. People should not discriminate and I would be very happy to see our families."
