

CM Mohan Majhi Presents 100-Day Report Card of BJP Govt in Odisha

Puri(KCN): Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Thursday showcased his government's 100-day report, asserting that the BJP's 2024 election manifesto promises have been fulfilled within the stipulated timeframe. After 24 years, the state has witnessed a change in government. The BJP has taken over the reins of power from the BJD. Marking 100 days since their governance began, Chief Minister Mohan Majhi's administration has reported on the fulfilment of its promises. The centenary celebrations of the BJP's tenure were held at Puri Saradhabali, where Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi led the inauguration. Deputy Chief Minister Pravati Parida, speaking at the event, stated that the government has fulfilled its promise by opening the doors of

Srimandir. Furthermore, the temple's Ratna Bhandar has been opened. The Subhadra Yojana for women has been initiated, with an allocation of 500 crore rupees for the development of Lord Jagannath's foundation land, marking a first in history. Although the development was not completed within 100 days, the groundwork for future development has been established, added Deputy Chief Minister Pravati Parida.

She added, "There were claims by the previous government that Mission Shakti would cease once the BJP took office, yet it persists." While it's true that development wasn't finalized within

100 days, the groundwork for progress has been established. The Cabinet of Ministers remains committed to serving the populace. Numerous plans are in place and will proceed. The trust of the people is essential. Despite doubts expressed by many, the Prime Minister was present and distributed Subhadra funds to 25 lakh 11 thousand women. Those who missed the first instalment will also receive the amount. The Subhadra Yojana is set to encompass over 1 crore individuals. Modi's promises are being realized sequentially. In addition, a 200 crore fund has been designated

for Odia Asmita. Significant progress has been made within 100 days. Following Mohan Majhi's declaration as Chief Minister, he began addressing public grievances, bringing the government closer to the people. Health Minister Dr. Mukesh Mahaling announced that medical colleges will be established in every district headquarters of the state. He shared this information at an event, noting that preparations will begin soon. The announcement coincided with the Mohan government's completion of 100 days in office. Currently, 11 medical colleges are operational within the

state, with two additional institutions slated for construction in Talcher and Kandhamal. Dr. Mahaling also mentioned that since Narendra Modi's assumption of the Prime Minister's office in 2014, there has been an initiative to establish medical colleges in every district across India. In Odisha, this initiative has resulted in 11 functional medical colleges, a joint effort between the Central and State governments. The Minister assured that the pace of this development will be accelerated to ensure medical colleges are available in all districts. The Vice-Chancellor of Odisha University of Health Sciences has addressed the issue of recruiting lecturers for medical colleges, stating that there are plans to hire retired doctors with experience to teach. A decision will be made following discussions with the departmental minister and other officials. The health department is overseeing all pertinent arrangements. There is also a focus on constructing medical colleges and hiring faculty members. The

government is attentive and committed to ensuring that the state's residents receive quality healthcare. Moreover, the minister has indicated that initiatives in this regard have already commenced.

Industry Minister Sampad Chandra Swain announced, "Within the next five years, we will construct four multi-modal logistics parks. This plan was outlined in the BJP government's 100-day agenda." Additionally, the Minister stated that 12 industrial projects received approval at a high-level meeting, with an investment of 39 thousand crores. Over the past 100 days, a capital investment of 45 thousand crores has been secured, which is expected to generate over 23 thousand job opportunities. The minister also mentioned plans to build hostels for workers and the construction of 11 MSME parks over the next five years. The budget includes provisions for FDI park construction. Currently, the state boasts 16 MSME parks.

The meeting is part of an ongoing series of regional consultations being held by the

Government of India with the States/UTs nationwide, which commenced with the convening of 1st regional meeting with southern States/UTs of Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Kerala, Puducherry, and Andaman & Nicobar Islands in Bengaluru, Karnataka. This was followed by 2nd regional meeting with northern States/UTs of Punjab, Chandigarh, Himachal Pradesh, Ladakh and Rajasthan in Chandigarh. The 3rd regional meeting with western States/UTs of Maharashtra, Goa, Gujarat, Daman and Diu, and Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep was held in Rajkot, Gujarat. The meeting will be chaired by Ms. Sumita Dawra, Secretary, Ministry of Labour &

Employment and attended by senior officers of the Governments of India and the States. 39K People Affected by Flood In 4 Odisha Districts

471 houses destroyed, 13,235 people moved to safer places

Bhubaneswar(KCN): More than 39,000 people have been affected in districts namely Balasore, Mayurbhanj, Keonjhar and Sundergarh due to the flood. As many as 471 houses have been destroyed while 13,235 people have been shifted to safe places, according to the Office of the Special Relief Commissioner(SRC) after making a preliminary

assessment of the damages due to the floods. According to the report issued by SRC office, the Jalaka and Subarnarekha rivers are flowing above the danger mark in the Balasore district. Due to this, floodwaters have entered the plains of Baliapala, Basta and Bhograi blocks in Balasore district prompting officials to evacuate people to safer places.

In the Balasore district, 5 blocks namely Bhograi, Basta, Jaleswar, Balasore Sadar and Remuna blocks have been affected due to flood. 35,654 people have been affected in 141 blocks of these blocks. Out of these, 11,632 people have been relocated while free food is being provided at 51 shelters. Similarly, 22 blocks were affected and 101 houses were destroyed in the



Mayurbhanj district. In Keonjhar district, 1,600 people from 5 blocks have been affected and 35 houses destroyed. In the

Sundergarh district, one block and 153 people from Rourkela town were affected. According to SRC, the

flood affected 35,654 people in 141 villages of Bhograi, Basta, Jaleswar, Balasore Sadar and Remuna blocks of Balasore district. 11,632 people have been shifted to other places while free cooked food is being provided at 51 locations. A total of 12,627 animals in the district have been affected. 102 houses have been partially damaged. Two medical teams and 2

veterinary teams have also been deployed in the flood-affected area. Similarly, 101 villages of 22 blocks have been affected due to flood water in the Mayurbhanj district. Flood water has also entered 11 wards of Baripada town. 2,035 people of the district have been affected by the flood while 1603 have been shifted to safer places. Four free-cooked food centres are opened and food is served to

affected people. 2 animals have died. 333 houses were partially destroyed and one house was destroyed. Similarly, a total of 22 villages in 5 blocks of Keonjhar district namely Patana, Champua, Sahadapada, Hatadihi and Harichandanpur blocks have been affected by the flood. 160 people have been affected and 35 houses were partially damaged by the flood.

Odisha: Popular Sambalpuri singer Ruksana Bano dies, kin allege poisoning

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Popular Sambalpuri singer Ruksana Bano has died while undergoing treatment at AIIMS Bhubaneswar, hospital sources said. Although hospital authorities said 27-year-old Ruksana was being treated for Scrub Typhus, they were yet to reveal the cause of her death that took place Wednesday night. However, her mother and sister alleged she was poisoned by a rival singer from western Odisha, without revealing the artiste's identity. They claimed Ruksana had earlier received threats. "Around 15 days back, Ruksana fell ill while



shooting in Bolangir after drinking some juice. She was admitted to a hospital in Bhawanipatna August 27. "After preliminary treatment, she was referred to Bhima Bhoi Medical College and Hospital in Bolangir and later shifted to a private hospital in Bargarh as her condition deteriorated. She was later brought to AIIMS Bhubaneswar as there was no improvement in her health condition," her sister Ruby Bano told reporters. The deceased's mother had also issued a video message, making similar claims. The video went viral on social media.

PMJUGA Covers 7667 Tribal Villages In Odisha

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Pradhan Mantri Janatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan(PMJUGA) will cover 27 districts, 234 Blocks, 7,667 tribal majority villages in Odisha, said Bishnupada Sethi, Principal Secretary ST & SC Development, Minorities & Backward Classes Welfare Department. This Flagship Program will benefit 10,85,661 Scheduled Tribe Households and 48,15,670 ST population, said Shri Sethi. The campaign also aims to promote innovative initiatives such as Tribal Home Stay Program, Support for Forest Rights Holders & Sick Cell Disease Management. The tribal villages covered under the Abhiyan would be mapped on PM GatiShakti Portal with the gaps identified by concerned department for its scheme specific requirements. The physical and financial progress will be

monitored PM GatiShakti platform and the best performing districts will be awarded, said Shri Sethi. The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister, Narendra Modi on 18 September 2024 approved Pradhan Mantri Janatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan with total outlay of Rs.79,156 crores (Central Share: Rs.56,333 crore and State Share: Rs. 22,823 crore) for improving the socio-economic condition of tribal communities, by adopting saturation coverage for tribal families in tribal-majority villages and aspirational districts. This will cover around 63,000 villages benefitting more than 5 crores tribal people as announced in the Budget Speech 2024-25. It will cover 549 districts and 2,740 blocks spread across all tribal majority villages across 30 States / UTs. The Pradhan Mantri Janatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan envisions

In the deep fake video call featuring Sood, the impersonator interacted with a family in need of funds for medical treatment, assuring them of financial assistance. The post read: "My film FATEH is inspired by real life incidents involving Deep Fake and fake loan apps. This is the latest incident where someone tried to extract money from an unsuspecting family, by chatting with them through video call pretending to be Sonu sood. Many innocent individuals fall into this trap. I request all of you to be vigilant if you receive such calls. #fateh"

Interestingly, inspired from such events, the actor turned writer and director for his new thriller, Fateh. Sood wrote the story after one and a half years of research and interviews with victims, cybercrime police officers, and ethical hackers. He essays the role of a tech-savvy investigation agent who is on a mission to protect the country from cybercrime.

Grammys Reduce Nominees From 10 to 8 In Top 4 Award Categories

Grammys has announced to reduce the number of nominees in four of its award categories - Album, Song, Record of the Year, and Best New Artist - from 10 to 8, Variety reported on Friday. An announcement in this regard was made after the Recording Academy updated its rules and guidelines following its semiannual board of trustees meeting. The number of nominees for those categories was increased from eight to ten in November 2021, just before the nominees for 2022 were announced -- a surprising and perplexing turn of events, given that such changes usually occur after the annual board meetings, Variety reported. While three new award categories were announced earlier this week, the reduction in the number of nominees in four award categories was announced on Friday. An Artificial Intelligence (AI)-related rule was also introduced, effectively stating that only human creators are eligible for awards; however, as with all things AI, the vast possibilities that the technology makes possible in this still-developing area necessitate an extensive series of caveats. Variety further reported. While Recording Academy CEO Harvey Mason Jr. stated at the time that the change was "an incredible opportunity for us to honour more artists and shine a light on more great music, and potentially offer a greater chance for more genres of music to be honoured", some speculated that it was done to ensure Taylor Swift received a best new album nomination for her album 'Evermore' and thus increase the chance that she would appear on the show and boost its rating, as reported by Variety.

The Pension Movement from NPS to UPS

(A comparative study between OPS, NPS & UPS)

Finally, the two decades of Pension Movement by all Central and State Govt. employees including teachers and pensioners across the Nation demanding to restore the Old Pension Scheme (OPS) and to scrap out the National Pension Scheme (NPS) introduced since 1st January, 2004 took another shape when the Union Cabinet, chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi approved a new pension system in the name of Unified Pension Scheme (UPS) on 24th August, 2024 guarantying an Assured Pension equivalent to 50% of the average basic pay drawn over the last 12 months prior to superannuation for a minimum qualifying service of 25 years which will be proportionate for lesser service period up to a minimum of 10 years of service, Assured Family Pension equivalent to 60% of pension of the employee immediately before her/his demise and Assured Minimum Pension of Rs.10,000 per month on superannuation after minimum 10 years of service. On Assured Pension, Assured Family Pension and Assured Minimum Pension,

Dearness Relief based on All India Consumer Price Index for Industrial Workers (AICPI-IW) as in case of service employees will be there. Lump sum payment at superannuation in addition to gratuity will be given equivalent to 1/10th of monthly emoluments (Pay + DA) as on the date of superannuation for every completed six months of service which will not reduce the quantum of assured pension. Soon after the Press Release of UPS while negligible positive responses are there from those supporting the BJP led NDA Govt., all the Central Trade Unions, Service Unions / Associations / Federations / Confederations involved in the pension movement for last 20 years have condemned the arbitrary action of the Govt. and released Press Notes demanding restoration of OPS. The movement to restore OPS started from the very moment of introduction of the NPS through an Executive Order by the BJP led NDA Govt. on 22nd December, 2003. The Confederation of Central Govt. Employees and Workers with the support of as many as 126 Unions / Associations / Federations under its affiliation having more than 1.5 crores workers, employees and pensioners across the Nation vehemently opposed it. Subsequently, many other

independent federations and Central Trade Unions extended their solidarity to the movement. Several new organizations formed with the support of NPS beneficiaries later jumped to the movement. The matter was severally discussed in the National Council JCM. Being pressurized continuously, though the Govt. brought some changes in NPS like Family Pension, DCRG, partial withdrawal including increasing its own contribution from 10% to 14%, the same couldn't appease the employees who only demanded restoration of OPS in toto. Subsequently, the National Council of Joint Action (NJCA) was formed comprising the Railway Federations, Confederation of Central Govt. Employees and Workers, All India State Govt. Employees Federation, All India Teachers Federation and Para-military Pensioners Association etc and the Pension Movement was accelerated from December 2022 which compelled the Central Govt. to constitute a Pension Committee under the Chairmanship of the Finance Secretary to improvise the NPS. When no positive solution did come out after several discussions with the Pension Committee, the Joint Forum of Restoration of OPS under the banner of NJCA submitted memorandum to the President, Prime

Minister, Finance Minister and the Cabinet Secretary of India to go on indefinite Strike from 1st May, 2024. With the intervention of the Prime Minister of India, it was assured to the Staff Side to consider their suggestions in favour of the employees. The proposed strike was postponed. The most unfortunate thing during the last two decades of uncompromising struggle of the employees is that the BJP led NDA Govt. arbitrarily introduced the NPS in the absence of any Act clearly violating the constitutional provisions guaranteed under CCS

(Pension) Rules, 1972, now 2021 and the historic judgement dated 17th December, 1982 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in D S Nakra versus Union of India which categorically states, inter alia, "Pension is neither a bounty, nor a matter of grace depending upon the sweet will of the employer, nor an ex-gratia payment". Going one step ahead, the Congress led UPA-I Govt. after coming to power in May 2004 brought the Pension Fund Regulatory Development Authority (PFRDA) Bill in 2005 which couldn't be materialized due to strong opposition by the left party

MPs supporting the Govt. at that point of time. After withdrawal of their support from the UPA-I Govt., the UPA-II Govt. reintroduced the above Bill in 2011 and could be able to pass the same with the support of NDA MPs on 19th September 2013 and implemented PFRDA Act 2013 on 1st February, 2014. Again when BJP led NDA Govt. came to power in May 2014, it continued to run the NPS accusing the Congress led UPA Govt. During the 20 years of continuous struggle for restoration of OPS both the UPA Govt. and NDA Govt. were / are in power for 10 years each. Had the UPA Govt. shown little interest for employees' welfare in protecting the social security of the pensioners, it could have been refrained from bringing the PFRDA Bill / Act and thus, there would have not been any possibility of UPS. So both Congress (UPA) and BJP (NDA) are equally responsible to snatch away the constitutional rights of the employees and pensioners. Under the circumstances, the above decision of introducing UPS is just a bolt from the blue for the employees and pensioners since except restoration of OPS, nothing such as UPS was there in the agenda. Witnessing the result of the relentless struggle for last 20 years in vain, the

entirety of workers, employees and pensioners of both the Central and State Govt. are getting annoyed. Now all the Service Unions / Associations / Federations / Confederations including Central Trade Unions are determined to accelerate the Pension Movement once again till OPS is restored. We have given a Table of Comparison which aptly speaks the positive aspects of OPS and negative aspects of both the NPS and UPS so far as social security to a pensioner is concerned. UPS is not the exact substitute of OPS as demanded. Though it has guaranteed Assured Pension, Assured Minimum Pension and Assured Family Pension, it is still contributory. 10% of the Basic Pay plus DA of the employee will be deducted per month as is being done under NPS. However, the Govt.'s share is likely to rise from present 14% to 18.5% of the Basic Pay plus DA of the employee. India, with its vast and diverse population, has always faced the challenge of ensuring social security for its workforce. One of the most contentious issues in this domain has been the transition from the OPS to the NPS, now more commonly referred to as the UPS,

a hybrid model of OPS and NPS. This shift has led to significant unrest among government employees, sparking numerous protests and struggle movements across the country. The success of the proposed UPS depends on its implementation and acceptance by the workforce. The government will need to strike a delicate balance between fiscal responsibility and social security to ensure that the interests of both the state and its employees are protected. As India continues to evolve, the debate over pension schemes is likely to remain a contentious issue, with employees and their unions continuing to fight for what they perceive as their rightful dues. The outcome of this struggle will have significant implications not just for the future of pension schemes in India, but also for the broader relationship between the state and its employees.

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Will Kejriwal meet the same fate as Madan Lal Khurana ?

Two days after being released on bail from Tihar Jail, Arvind Kejriwal has created a stir by resigning from the post of Delhi's Chief Minister. Kejriwal says he will only sit on the Chief Minister's chair if the people re-elect him in the Assembly elections, considering him honest. Looking at Delhi's recent history, we find that in 1996, Madan Lal Khurana also resigned from the Chief Minister's post when his name surfaced in the Jain Hawala case. He had also said almost the same thing then as Kejriwal is saying now. Khurana had said that once he is cleared of the charges by the court, he will again become the Chief Minister of Delhi. However, even after being acquitted in the Jain Hawala case, Khurana could not become the Chief Minister. The BJP leadership kept him away from the Chief Minister's chair. Due to this, the outspoken Khurana started making statements against his leaders. This more or less

brought his political career to an end. **Who Will Be the Chief Minister?** Now the question is, who will be the Chief Minister of Delhi after Kejriwal's resignation? Delhi's current Education Minister Atishi may be given the responsibility of hoisting the national flag at the Delhi government's program on the occasion of Independence Day. However, Delhi's Lieutenant Governor V.K. Saxena had assigned the responsibility of hoisting the flag to Delhi's Transport Minister Kailash Gahlot. The name of Kuldeep Kumar, who hails from the Valmiki community, is also being taken in the race for the Chief Minister. He contested the last Lok Sabha election from East Delhi. He is considered close to Kejriwal. If he becomes the Chief Minister, the Dalit vote can go en masse in favor of Kejriwal in the upcoming elections. However, Kejriwal can also make a Muslim or Sikh MLA of his party the Chief Minister. By taking such a step, he will give a very positive message. Delhi has never had a Muslim



Chief Minister. Yes, Delhi's second Chief Minister Gurumukh Nihal Singh Musafir was a Sikh. While serving as Chief Minister, Musafir did not allow liquor shops to open in Delhi. Interestingly, the Arvind Kejriwal government had shown great enthusiasm in opening liquor shops in Delhi at one time. Musafir's son S. Nihal Singh was a prominent journalist. However, even though Arvind Kejriwal's image may have been spotless until now in the alleged liquor policy case, many of his ministers and MLAs have been caught in corruption cases. It was expected from Kejriwal that he would clear the way for clean

and alternative politics in the country. But he has disappointed the country with his hollow claims, promises, and actions. **When Development Happened Smoothly** Before Arvind Kejriwal, there were also governments and Chief Ministers in Delhi. Development happened smoothly between the elected governments of Delhi and the central governments. But as soon as the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government came to power in Delhi in 2015, daily clashes and arguments began. The first Assembly elections in Delhi were held in 1951-52. Chaudhary Brahm Prakash of the Congress

became the first Chief Minister of Delhi. Chaudhary Sahab remained Chief Minister from 1952 to 1955. The Congress removed him and made Sardar Gurumukh Nihal Singh Musafir the second Chief Minister here. After that, Pandit Nehru's government at the center abolished the Delhi Assembly. However, in 1966, Delhi got a Metropolitan Council. This was equivalent to the Legislative Assembly. The head of the Metropolitan Council was the Executive Councilor. Leaders like Vijay Kumar Malhotra and Jag Pravesh Chandra also held this position. In 1991, Delhi

was declared the National Capital Region by amending the Constitution again. Under the new delimitation, elections for the Legislative Assembly were held in 1993. After that, stalwarts like Madan Lal Khurana, Sahib Singh Verma, Sushma Swaraj, and Sheila Dikshit became the Chief Ministers of Delhi. During this time, the government at the center was sometimes led by the Congress and sometimes by the BJP. But the wheel of development in Delhi never stopped. When Madan Lal Khurana became the Chief Minister, P.V. Narasimha Rao was the Prime Minister of the country.

There was no problem. When Sheila Dikshit was the Chief Minister, the Prime Minister was Atal Bihari Vajpayee. Even then, Delhi was developing fully. There was no controversy at all. All controversies were being resolved through mutual talks. Atalji and Sheila Dikshit extended the metro rail in Delhi and solved the power problem permanently. It's another matter that Arvind Kejriwal kept saying that the 24-hour power supply in Delhi was possible because of him. However, he never explained why he could not solve the drinking water crisis in Delhi. Why did the Yamuna remain dirty? How did Delhi become the world's most polluted capital? Arvind Kejriwal never felt the need to answer these questions. When you move ahead from the GT Road in Delhi, you start seeing the Black Mountain in Bhalswa from afar. This is a garbage heap. Similar garbage mountains are also in Ghazipur and Okhla in the capital. In the capital Delhi, where there are lush green Lutyens Delhi, New Delhi, Delhi Cantonment, and dozens of other magnificent areas, garbage forts spread over almost a

hundred acres are a shame. These three garbage forts expose all the claims of Arvind Kejriwal. Helpless people live around them. There is a terrible stench from them all the time. Now, the Aam Aadmi Party has governments in the Delhi Assembly and the Municipal Corporation. But these garbage forts are standing as before or it should be said that they are getting bigger every day. No one knows that as soon as the Aam Aadmi Party government came to power in Delhi in 2015, chaos spread. The situation got so bad that the Chief Secretary of the Delhi government, Anshu Prakash, was beaten up with kicks and punches at the Chief Minister's official residence. Such a shameful incident had never been heard before that an IAS officer would be beaten up at the Chief Minister's residence. Well, it has to be said that the coming time is going to be quite challenging for Arvind Kejriwal and his party. Now the wind is not blowing in favor of him or his party in Delhi. The End.

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"Speculative, Misleading": India On Report Of Its Ammunition In Ukraine

New Delhi(KCN): Dismissing a report by news agency Reuters claiming that ammunition sold by Indian manufacturers has been diverted to Ukraine by European customers and New Delhi did not stop the trade, the Ministry of External Affairs has termed it "inaccurate and mischievous". Answering questions on the report, MEA Spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said on Thursday, "We have seen the Reuters report. It is speculative and misleading. It implies violations by India, where none exist and, hence, is inaccurate and mischievous. Emphasising that India

has an impeccable track record of compliance with international obligations on the export of military and dual-use items, Mr Jaiswal added, "India has been carrying out its defence exports taking into account its international obligations on non-proliferation and based on its own robust legal and regulatory framework, which includes a holistic assessment of relevant criteria, including end-user obligations and certifications." In its report, Reuters cited conversations with eleven Indian and European government and defence industry officials and an analysis



of commercially available customs data to claim that artillery shells sold by Indian arms manufacturers had been diverted to Ukraine by European customers and the

against Russia, had been happening for over a year and the Kremlin had raised the issue with India at least twice, including in July, during a meeting between Foreign Minister S Jaishankar and his Russian counterpart Sergei Lavrov. It said Indian arms export regulations specify that weaponry can be used only by the declared purchaser and future sales to them can be stopped if there are unauthorised transfers. "Two Indian government and two defence industry sources told Reuters that Delhi produced only a very small amount of the ammunition being used by Ukraine, with one official estimating that it was under 1% of the total arms imported by Kyiv since the war. The news agency couldn't determine if the munitions were resold or donated to Kyiv by the European customers," the report said."Among the European countries sending Indian munitions to Ukraine are Italy and the Czech Republic, which is leading an initiative to supply Kyiv with artillery shells from outside the European Union, according to a Spanish and a senior Indian official, as well as a former top executive at Yantra India, a state-owned company whose munitions are being used by Ukraine," it added.

Andhra Government Cites Lab Report In Row Over Animal Fat In Tirupati Laddoos

Hyderabad(KCN): Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu has slammed rivals YSR Congress and his predecessor, YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, over a lab report about animal fats in ghee used to make laddoos offered as prasadam, or devotional offerings, at the temple town of Tirupati. A July 17 report from the Centre of Analysis and Learning in Livestock and Food, or CALF, lab at the centre-run National Dairy Development Board in Gujarat, released Wednesday, said it found animal fat in ghee used to make the famous Tirupati laddoos when the YSRCP was in power. The report indicated the ghee contained traces of fish oil, beef tallow, and lard; the last is a semi-solid white fat product obtained by rendering the fatty tissue of a pig. "Even Tirupati laddoo was made with standard ingredients... they used animal fat instead of ghee," the Chief Minister raged at a legislature party meeting in Amravati the day before. He declared his



government has ensured a higher quality of ingredients, including ghee, is being used now, and that that all food offerings at the iconic temple were now of improved quality. Mr Naidu's son and Andhra Pradesh IT Minister Nara Lokesh also joined the attack. "The Lord Venkateswara Temple at Tirumala is our most sacred temple. I am shocked to learn that the Jagan Mohan Reddy administration used animal fat instead of ghee... shame on them... (their) government could not respect the religious sentiments of crores of devotees." Union Minister Ram Mohan Naidu, who is from the TDP, told NDTV "we always knew YSRCP was involved in corruption... but didn't think they

would do this with Tirupati". "The deity is sacred and special to all in the state... and now NDDDB itself has confirmed presence of animal fat. This is beyond shocking and disgusting. The government will get to the bottom of this," he said, vowing action against those responsible. "We know this is the beginning. More will come out." The YSRCP, however, has slammed the "malicious" claims and accused the TDP of lying for political gain. The party also said it was Mr Naidu, in fact, who had damaged the sanctity of the temple, and of the crores of devotees, by making such outrageous comments. YSRCP's YV Subba Reddy wrote in Telugu on X that "it has been

proved once again that Chandrababu (Naidu) will not hesitate to do anything bad for the benefit of politics". The YSRCP leader also declared himself ready "to take an oath as witnesses... in (this) case" and asked, "Is he also ready to take oath?" The Congress, meanwhile, has also taken shots at the YSR Congress, with the former Chief Minister's sister, now the boss of the Congress' state unit, demanding a high-level CBI inquiry. The claim, she said in Telugu on X, is "damaging to the sanctity of the deity worshipped by millions of Hindus". "If there are no political angles to your allegations... if you have no intention of playing politics on this issue... form a high-level committee or call for a CBI inquiry. Find out who is responsible," she said. An estimated three lakh laddoos are made in Tirupati every day. To make these the temple trust buys massive quantities of ghee via e-tenders issued every six months.

Anti-Terror Watchdog Praises India, Says Faces Serious Threat From...

NewDelhi,(KCN):Terror financing watchdog Financial Action Task Force (FATF) has said India has achieved a high level of technical compliance with its recommendations and taken significant steps to implement measures to tackle illicit finance. In a report released on Thursday, the watchdog has also, however, said the country needs to improve its system as the economy continues to grow, pointing to a need for faster trials for money laundering and terrorist financing. India has been placed in the regular follow-up category, a distinction it shares with only four other G20 countries. The mutual evaluation report says a joint FATF-APG (Asia/Pacific Group on Money Laundering) -EAG (Eurasian group on combating money laundering and financing of terrorism) assessment of India's measures to tackle illicit finance has concluded that India has implemented an anti-money laundering and counter-terrorist financing (AML/CFT) framework which is achieving good results. The areas in which these



results have been seen include risk understanding, access to beneficial ownership information and depriving criminals of their assets. The report says authorities in India make good use of financial intelligence and cooperate effectively, both domestically and internationally. The evaluation noted that India is the largest country in the world by population and has the largest diaspora. It is also a lower-middle-income country with one of the world's fastest-growing economies, which is currently the fifth-largest economy in the world. India's main money laundering risks, the report says, originate from illegal activities within the country - relating primarily to fraud, including cyber-enabled fraud, corruption and drug trafficking. India pursues money laundering cases related to

fraud and forgery in line with predicate crime (a criminal act that is a component of a larger crime) risks to a large extent, the report says, but needs to do more for some other offences such as human trafficking and drug trafficking. The country, it said, needs to address the backlog of money laundering cases pending conclusion of court processes. The report says India faces serious terrorism and terrorist financing threats, including related to ISIL (Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant) or al-Qaeda active in and around Jammu and Kashmir. Praising India's emphasis on disruption and prevention and its ability to conduct complex financial investigations, the evaluation points to a need for focusing on concluding prosecutions and convicting and sanctioning terrorist financiers.

Another area pointed out by the report is a need to ensure that measures aimed at preventing the non-profit sector from being abused for terrorist financing are implemented in line with a risk-based approach, including by conducting outreach to such organisations. Appreciating India's steps towards financial inclusion, the report said the proportion of the population with bank accounts has more than doubled, due diligence for small accounts is taking place and reliance on digital payment systems has been encouraged. These efforts have supported financial transparency, contributing to efforts to tackle anti-money laundering and counter-terrorist financing. "Despite the size and institutional complexity of the Indian system, Indian authorities cooperate and coordinate effectively on matters dealing with illicit financial flows, including the use of financial intelligence. India also achieved positive results in international cooperation, asset recovery and implementing targeted financial sanctions for proliferation financing," the report states.

In Madhya Pradesh, BJP Leaders Squabble, Congress Claims 'Internal Strife'

Bhopal(KCN): The Congress has claimed discord within the BJP's Madhya Pradesh ranks - less than a year after that party romped to victory in an Assembly election. The opposition party has pointed to a series of public statements from the ruling party's MPs and MLAs that seem to target each other. This, the opposition claims, comes as the ruling party is conducting a 'sangathan parv', or an initiative to expand its base by recruiting citizens as party workers. In Chhatarpur district, ex-MLA Manvendra Singh alleged Union Minister Virendra Kumar Khatik had appointed Lokendra Singh - a man with a criminal background - as his representative. This claim was backed

by three-time MLA Lalita Yadav, with both voicing their concerns. Lalita Yadav said, "Virendra Kumar is a central minister. He should choose his representatives wisely." Khatik responded sharply, declaring, "Those who wear blankets and drink ghee should measure their words. These imported people, whose own time has passed, are giving certificates to workers. We don't need their certificates." In Rewa a spat between MP Janardan Mishra and MLA Siddharth Tiwari raised eyebrows. The dispute arose after Mr Mishra made sharp remarks about late Congress leader Srinivas Tiwari, who is Mr Tiwari's grandfather. The



MLA objected and public protests ensued. Tiwari said, "One should not speak ill of a deceased person who dedicated his

life to serving the poor. The BJP is a party driven by values... and this issue will be raised within the party."



Mishra, however, responded, "We always said Srinivas Tiwari did politics of terror, loot, and hooliganism. His

grandson may have joined BJP... but BJP hasn't joined him. If you're part of the family, you must also listen to

what your baba did." Finally, in Raisen on Teachers' Day (September 5), BJP MP Darsha Singh Chaudhary and Public Health Minister Narendra Shivaji Patel argued over a perceived protocol violation. The issue stemmed from an invitation card for a school event in which the MP's name was placed in front. The District Education Officer later issued a notice to the school, warning of possible de-recognition. BJP leaders have downplayed these incidents as minor but the Congress is using them to criticise the party, arguing these are signs of deeper problems. "BJP is the largest party in the world... with leaders from the

panchayat level to the Prime Minister. But we are also a party of humans. With such a large number of people, small issues are bound to arise. We have a system to address these problems," state unit boss VD Sharma said, "I've spoken to everyone involved and this is normal in any large organisation." However, the Congress' media-in-charge for the state, Mukesh Nayak said, "Infighting in the BJP is increasing... but this is not about politics. It is a fight for resources and benefits. From disputes over liquor trade to sand mining... these conflicts are about personal gains. When a party stays in power for too long, such issues often come to the surface."

Simultaneous polls: Odisha CM welcomes Cabinet's nod

Bhubaneswar(KCN): Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Wednesday welcomed the move as the Union Cabinet cleared the proposal to hold simultaneous elections in India, as recommended by a high-level committee headed by former President Ram Nath Kovind.

"The approval of #OneNationOneElection by the Union Cabinet under the leadership of the illustrious Prime Minister of India Shri @narendramodi is a significant and welcome step," the Chief Minister wrote on X.

The Chief Minister further stated that the decision to approve the 'One nation, one election' policy will strengthen the security



of the country. He said the decision will ensure rapid development in the country by bringing political stability. "This decision will definitely help in strengthening the security system of the country and accelerating

the pace of development. By achieving political stability, it will also give a new direction to the economic development of the country. I wholeheartedly thank the Hon'ble Prime Minister for such a historic decision," added

the Chief Minister.

Meanwhile, the opposition Biju Janata Dal's spokesperson Lenin Mohanty told media persons that much before PM Modi's Cabinet passed this 'One nation, one election', BJD had successfully implemented it in Odisha.

Mohanty further stated that the party in 2004 went for the elections after the completion of just four years to implement the 'One nation, one election' policy.

The senior BJD leader said that the party won in 2009, 2014 and 2019 following the same policy. He claimed the party also supported the 'One nation, one election' because of its

merit in the 2024 elections as well despite the defeat.

Mohanty however questioned that many things have been passed by the BJP government in the past but they have not been implemented. Notably, the PM Modi government approved the report from a high-level panel led by former President Ram Nath Kovind on the concept of 'One nation, one election' Wednesday.

A bill to implement simultaneous elections is expected to be introduced in the upcoming Winter session of Parliament. This initiative aims to synchronise Parliamentary and Assembly elections, which has been a part of the Modi government's 100-day agenda.

Woman jumps into river in Odisha's Jajpur, goes missing



Jajpur(KCN): A woman went missing after she jumped into the Kharasrota River from a bridge in Odisha's Jajpur district Thursday, police said.

The incident happened near Baruhan under the jurisdiction of Jajpur Sadar police station. She left her electric scooter, helmet, shoes and mobile phone near the vehicle before jumping into the river, the police said.

The woman is a resident

of the Krishnapada area under the Kuakhia police jurisdiction in the district. Fire services personnel and Jajpur Sadar Police went to the spot and launched a search operation to trace the woman.

"We have launched a rescue operation. The woman is yet to be traced," the Additional Superintendent of Police of Jajpur district, S K Kanungo, said.

Sources said the woman is an Anganwadi

supervisor working at Rasulpur block.

Police suspect that she might have taken the step because of some family problems. "While taking a morning walk, I saw a woman jumping into the river from the Rajghat Bridge," said Raj Kishore Das, a resident of the area. He said he could not reach the woman on time to prevent her from jumping into the river as the distance between them was about 200 meters.

Forest officials tranquilise, fix radio collar on elephant



Rourkela(KCN): Forest department officials Wednesday tranquilised and fixed a GPS-enabled radio collar on an elephant that had been running amok in areas under Bonai Forest Division for the last five years and claimed the lives of at least 15 people during the period. Besides, the pachyderm had caused enormous damage to properties and crops making the locals' lives miserable. "The elephant was tranquilised near the Jamdih section under Koira forest range of Bonai Forest Division

and the process of attaching the radio collar began at around 4am Wednesday morning," informed Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Lalit Patra. Units of Bonai Forest Division, consisting of Koira, Bonai, Tamra, Jarda and Sole ranges, were engaged for the purpose, the top Forest official informed. The DFO informed that the entire process was carried out in the presence and guidance of Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (PCCF), Wildlife and

Chief Wild Life Warden (CWLW) Susanta Nanda. Besides, the Regional Chief Conservator of Forest (RCCF) of Rourkela Circle, the veterinary units of Satkosia Wildlife Division, Kapilash Wildlife Division, Rourkela Forest Division and RRT team were also present. "It is our primary duty to avoid human-elephant conflict and ensure safe passage to the elephants using various safety measures," clarified Patra adding that the solitary elephants

especially are aggressive and cause damage.

The DFO further informed that the radio collar started providing information once the elephant became mobile around midday. "Regular tracking will help us track the movement of the elephant and take necessary action much before it could cause any damage to human lives and properties in Koira and Barsuan forest ranges. We will keep a constant watch on the animal through the signals," informed Patra.
