

Rishi Girl On Police Radar Stern warning on Bird Flu

Bhubaneswar (K-CN): Commissionerate Police today claimed to have identified the girl friend of engineering student Ashutosh Mohanty alias Rishi even as Mahila Congress activists continued their protest today in front of the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation office here demanding the sacking and arrest of Mayor Ananta Narayan Jena who is alleged to have featured in a sex CD and involved in the 'murder' of Rishi.

Twin City Commissioner YB Khurania told Media Men that the girl friend of Rishi, who is claimed to have shot the video of the Mayor in a compromising pose with a woman, has been identified.

"She will soon be called for questioning," Mr. Khurania said adding all those alleged to be involved in the incident will also be quizzed.

The activists of

the women wing of the Congress today continued their in front of the BMC Headquarters by squatting and setting



on fire an effigy of the Mayor.

Even as the Police Commissioner asserted that all angles in both the episodes are being probed by sleuths, credence was laid to murmuring in the political corridors that Mayor Mr. Jena may have to face investigators to come clean

in the issue.

Meanwhile, Sourabh, a friend of the deceased student Rishi, reiterated his demand that the girl

friend be quizzed to bring forth the facts relating to the student's death.

Sourabh, has been twice recorded his statement with the police in the case.

Mr. Jena, notably, has denied his involvement in both the issues and asserted before media that the person in the CD was

not him. The BJP too claimed that the video was shot by the daughter of the woman shown in the CD. The party had ensured shot down of State Capital on December 21 from dawn to dusk to demand the sacking and arrest of Jena for his involvement. Sources in BJD had maintained that the distance between Jena – a General Secretary of BJD -- and Chief Minister and BJD supremo Naveen Patnaik has widened in the past two weeks.

If the sources are to be believed, the days of Mr. Jena as Mayor appear numbered as the BJD Supremo has to take an immediate call on the issue in view of the ensuing panchayat elections in the State to salvage some lost image due to the expose' notwithstanding the alleged show of strength by Mr. Jena immediately after the telecast of the CD by different channels

and his defamation suits against National Student Union President Itish Pradhan and owner of news portal niankhunta.com Pradeep Pandey.

“Odisha PR Elections” Defy Logic: Due to “Chatu Ainsa, Benta Niramisha” Attitude

Bhubaneswar (KCN): The State Election Commission (SEC) of Odisha is going to



conduct the 3-tier Panchayat Elections in February, 2017. The Freethought Party of India is deeply shocked to know the gross illogicalities & incongruities that have been thoughtlessly crept into the rules and regulations for the conduct of the said elections. The Odia saying : **“Chatu Ainsa, Benta Niramisha”** (the lower part of the kitchen utensil that helps in preparing fried items of food is called *chatu* in Odia). The substance of this Odia saying is very much there when one scans the election rules according to which the Ward Members of the GP, the Sarpanch thereof, the Panchayat Samiti Members and

Members of the Zilla Parishad are elected. According to the rules there would be no Name of the Party or Party Symbol for anyone who contests for the post of a Ward Member / Sarpanch / Panchayat Samiti Member. But surprisingly, the Name of the Party and the Party Symbol are quite good or quite OK at the level of Zilla Parishad Elections.

The voters are the same. It would be clear from the SEC Notification as published in the Odisha Gazette dated 15.07.2016 that has notified the colour of the Ballot Paper of different categories to be used in the General Elections to the Panchayat Raj Institutions (PRIs) in 2017. The colour of the Ballot Paper for the Ward Member is "Blue" while for the Sarpanch it is "Yellow". "Pink" is the colour of the Ballot Paper for someone contesting for the post of a Panchayat Samiti Member. For the Zilla Parishad candidate it is of "White" colour. Thus a voter has got four votes to cast. For three posts, he has to have a partyless mind.

But the same voter has to have a Party mind while voting for the post of Zillaparishad member. Quite naturally the voter is asked to conduct himself / herself in an illogical manner.

For the good of the Indian Democracy and for the good of the young people anxious to emerge as Political Leaders at the Rural Level, Political Parties with their ideological platforms, Aims and Objectives should be given the freedom to operate at grass-root level. Commitment to Equality, Freedom of Speech and Expression. Love for Human Dignity, Yearning for Scientific-cum-Humanistic Outlook should be cultivated on the part of each and every voter. Particularly, all these qualities should be cultivated by all those who would like to work as People's Representatives at the GP level, Panchayat Samiti Level. For strange reasons, Political Parties have been barred to put up their candidates at the GP level, and at the Panchayat Samiti Level. This is termed as Partyless Democracy.

Pseudo-intellectuals, often quoting JP and Gandhiji, stand for Partyless Democracy. But such people do not feel ashamed to have Party Democracy at the Zilla Parishad Level.

FPI is totally opposed to this illogical & bogus dichotomy. It pleads that all Political Parties should be given the freedom to carry out their legitimate political activities from the Village Level upward. If they can do so at the urban and semi-urban areas, why should they be prevented from doing the same in the rural localities?

A voter can take membership of a Political Party whether he lives in an urban or rural area. But he can not say so publicly if he is contesting the post of the Ward Member / Sarpanch / Panchayat Samiti Member. But if he is contesting for the post of a Zilla Parishad Member then he can take the name of his Political Party. This Political Unethicality and Hypocrisy should be given a goodbye. "Political Identity" of a voter does not amount to any act of criminality. Political education on secular lines is

necessary to bring an end to casteism and social inequality.

Pseudo-intellectuals say that the Entry of Political Parties at the GP and Samiti Elections would disturb the peace and unity of the rural life. This is a wrong premise. Rather, Political Parties would

one more illogicality that needs to be pointed out. In Digital India of Prime Minister Modi's dream and emphasis, why should a candidate for the post of Sarpanch or Panchayat Samiti in a small locality of a Grampanchayat be required to spend Rs. 80,000/-?. How many

Zilla Parishad Members.

There is one more incongruity in the whole system of PR Elections at the GP Level. The Sarpanch is directly elected. But the Naib-Sarpanch is to be elected by the votes of the elected Ward Members. Each indirect election breeds corruption. One who can buy more than 50% of the Ward Members can easily become the Naib-Sarpanch. Besides, there is no provision for direct election for the post of the Chairman of the Panchayat Samiti. Nor is there any such provision for the Chairman of the Zilla Parishad. Why should not we promote strong political leadership at the Samiti Level and at the Zilla Parishad Level. Both the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Panchayat Samiti and both the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Zilla Parishad should be directly elected on Party Symbols. Political corruption that happens in indirect election should be brought to zero.

FPI pleads that Elections for the PRI Institutions should be conducted with a

minimal budget reasonably fixed by ethically committed authorities of the SEC and GA Department of Government of Odisha. The system of election should be not on the FPTP model but on the model of PR (Proportional Representation) System of Election as it is there in countries like South Africa, Nepal etc. This is required to make Indian Democracy at the rural level 100% inclusive. Elections to the posts of Sarpanch / Naib Sarpanch / Samiti Chairman / Vice Chairman, Zilla Parishad chairman / vice-Chairman should be "Presidential and director and each Political Party should have a pair of candidates on the Model of the USA, so as to avoid post-Election Manipulation and Corruption by Party high Commands and, accordingly, the Constitution of India and laws made thereunder should be amended for full scale uniformity all over India, adds Party General Secretary B. Ramchandra CST Voltaire.



Arun Jaitley Thanks People For Supporting Note Ban, Says No Incident Of Unrest Reported

Sentiment turned for the better after Finance Minister Arun Jaitley on Thursday

said there has been a sharp jump in tax collections, belying fears of a sharp slowdown in the economy in view of demonetisation.

After a higher start, the 30-share index hit the day's high of 26,678.60 and closed up 260.31 points, or 0.99 per cent, at 26,626.46 — a level last seen on December 13 when it settled at 26,697.82.

It had gained 155.47 points yesterday as December derivatives contracts expired amid recovery in the rupee.

The Nifty rose 82.20 points, or 1.01 per cent, to end at 8,185.80, after touching the day's high of 8,197.

For the week, the Sensex and the NSE

Nifty recorded a rise of 585.76 points, or 2.24 per cent, and 200.05, or 2.50 per cent, respectively.

"The euphoria continued on the last trading day of the year, hoping for radical remarks in the Prime Minister's speech on Saturday. Additionally, an expectation of tax sops in the budget, weakness of the dollar and robust tax collection are adding to the positive sentiment," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit BNP Paribas Financial Services.

The year saw the Sensex zooming to a high of 29,077.28 on September 8 and a low of 22,494.61 on February 29. Today's closing meant a net gain of 508.92 points, or 1.94 per cent from

its last year-end close of 26,117.54.

During the year, the Nifty gained 239.45 points, or 3.01 per cent. The gauge had climbed to a high of 8,968.70 on September 7 and touched a low of 6,825.80 on February 29.

Domestic institutional investors (DIIs) bought shares worth a net Rs 957.83 crore as per provisional data. But foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) net sold shares worth Rs 662.29 crore yesterday.

GAIL saw the maximum jump, up 3.07 per cent, followed by Sun Pharma (2.59 per cent), ITC (2.31 per cent) and PowerGrid (2.14 per cent).

In terms of sectors, the rally was

driven by FMCG (up 1.67 per cent), power (1.30 per cent), healthcare (1.11 per cent) and realty (1.10 per cent).

Broader markets such as BSE mid-cap and small-cap ended higher with gains of 1.07 per cent and 0.77 per cent, respectively.

Trading was thin across the globe during the last day of the year, with volumes remaining below average. In the rest of Asia, Hong Kong's Hang Seng rose 0.94 per cent while Shanghai Composite gained 0.24 per cent. Japan's Nikkei shed 0.16 per cent.

In Europe, London's FTSE, Germany's Frankfurt and France's Paris were down by up to 0.25 per cent in their late morning deals.

deteriorated, the RBI said. "Asset quality of the non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) also worsened. The degree of interconnectedness in the banking system measured by the connectivity ratio showed a declining trend. Banks



warned against a sharp rise in the non-performing assets (NPAs) of banks as "the banking stability indicator shows that the risks to the banking sector remained elevated due to continuous deterioration in asset quality, low profitability and liquidity".

The stress test indicated that under the baseline scenario, the GNPA ratio may increase from 9.1 per cent in September 2016 to 9.8 per cent by March 2017 and further to 10.1 per cent by March 2018, it said. "If the macroeconomic conditions deteriorate, the GNPA ratio may increase further under such consequential stress scenarios," the RBI said in its Financial Stability Report for December 2016.

The business growth of banks remained subdued with PSBs continuing to lag behind their private sector peers. System level profit after tax (PAT) contracted on y-o-y basis in the first half of FY17, the RBI said. "The asset quality of banks deteriorated further between March and September 2016. PSBs continued to record the lowest capital to risk-weighted assets ratio among the bank groups with negative returns on their assets," the FSR said.

According to the FSR, the macro stress test shows that GNPA ratio of banks may increase further under assumed baseline macro scenarios. "The PSBs may record the highest GNPA ratio and lowest capital to risk-weighted asset ratio (CRAR) among bank-groups although the CRAR at the system as well as bank-group levels is expected to remain above the regulatory required minimum," it said.

Asset quality of scheduled urban co-operative banks (UCBs)

were the dominant players accounting for nearly 59 per cent of the total bilateral exposures followed by NBFCs.

On a net basis, asset management companies managing mutual funds (AMC-MFs) followed by the insurance companies were the biggest fund providers in the system while NBFCs followed by banks were the biggest receivers of funds," the RBI said.

With the implementation of global regulatory reforms most of the major international banks have become more resilient in terms of capital and liquidity, the RBI said. "However, risks of divergence from the demanding global standards amidst discriminatory treatment of foreign financial institutions seem to have increased. Globally, some risks inherent in banks may be getting transferred to other segments of the financial markets due to increased regulatory scrutiny and elevated capital requirements for banks," it said.

Mitchell Starc's brilliance earns Australia series win over Pakistan

Mitchell Starc shone with bat and ball as Australia's pace spearhead tore Pakistan's 52-year wait for a maiden series win in Australia goes on and they have now lost four matches in succession heading to the series finale in Sydney on Jan. 3.



Australia dismissed Pakistan for 163 to secure an innings and 18 run victory in the second Test on Friday, the win giving the hosts an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match series.

Home captain Steve Smith smashed an unbeaten 165 and gave his bowlers 68 overs on the fifth and final day to run through their opponents after declaring their first innings at 624 for eight before lunch, a lead of 181 runs.

In the end, they only needed 53.2 overs

through the tail after tea, finishing with 4-36, with Pakistan crumbling on a benign Melbourne Cricket Ground pitch bathed in brilliant sunshine.

Pakistan lost the first Test in Brisbane by 39 runs but won admiration for their dogged fourth innings resistance.

However, much of that acclaim evaporated on Friday as their shambolic batting display followed an abysmal effort in the field in the morning.

"It's fantastic for us to get that result. We always thought that if we could find a way to get ourselves ahead of the game we'd find a way to win," said Starc, who smashed seven sixes in an MCG record during a swashbuckling knock of 84 in the morning.

lieving that if we took those chances we would

create enough to get 10 chances today.

"It was a fantastic way to finish the Boxing Day Test."

Pakistan resumed on an already precarious 91-5 after tea, with opener Azhar Ali and wicketkeeper Sarfraz Ahmed tasked with surviving 36 overs to usher their team to safety.

But their partnership lasted less than three overs after the break when Josh Hazlewood trapped Azhar, Pakistan's last specialist batsman, lbw

LYON STRIKES

At 143-6, Jackson Bird thudded a delivery into Amir's pads when the tail-ender was on 11 but Smith wasted a review after the lbw appeal was turned down.

It changed little, however, as Bird bowled him two balls later.

Sarfraz Ahmed had battled doggedly as his partners disappeared around him but he was bowled for 43 through the gate with a sizzling Starc inswinger.

Starc then gave the

same treatment to Wahab Riaz, bowling the paceman for a duck with another fiery delivery that beat the outside edge.

He wrapped up the win by having Yasir Shah sky an easy catch to Bird at mid-on.

Off-spinner Nathan Lyon, who was under pressure to retain his spot in Sydney after a run of mediocre performances, set Australia on course for the win when he captured three wickets in the middle session, including two in

three balls. The tourists were already one wicket down at lunch, with Hazlewood having bowled opener Sami Aslam for two and Babar Azam soon departed for three off the first ball after the interval, trapped lbw by Starc.

Azhar and Younus Khan dug in for an hour but Lyon removed the latter two overs after the drinks break for 24, when the veteran coughed up a catch to Peter Handscomb at short leg.

Captain Misbah-ul-Haq then departed for a duck two balls later, caught at fine leg by Nic Maddinson following an appalling sweep shot off Lyon.

Lyon grabbed his third victim late in the session when Asad Shafiq deflected a catch off his body for Handscomb to take a fine catch at short leg.

Smith and Starc hammered Pakistan's bowlers in a 154-run partnership after Australia had resumed on 465-6 in the morning.
