**Bhubaneswar (K-CN):** Union Government has decided to send Section Officers to the States, so that they will be trained in the field level and this process will be continued every year.

So for the first time Central Government Officers will under take training in the State as they are needed to get acquainted with the system of the State Administration.

Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) has written to the State Government in this regard and Odisha Government has agreed in Principle to accommodate these Officers for providing proper training at field level.

There will be 11 Weeks of training for the Section Officers, who are set to be promoted to Under Secretary Level

in Union Government.

This training will be mandatory for them and after successful completion of training they will be considered for promotion, said sources.

Each batch of officers will receive one week training at Gopabandhu Academy of Administration (GAA) and another week at District Level Offices, where they will study the system.

After that these officers will be attached with Block Development Officer (BDO) or Executive Officer in Urban Local Bodies for 08 weeks.

This field level training is for cutting edge and exposure regarding implementation of different schemes of the Government of India as well as the State Government.

After end of field level training they will receive briefings from the senior officers and they will prepare a Report each on a Central and State Sector Scheme.

District Collector of the District to which these trainees are attached will give their Performance Report, which will be submitted to the Union Government after completion of their training.

As the State Government has agreed in Principle to allow the Section Officers of the Government of India for 11 week training, the Director General (DG) of Gopabandhu Academy of Administration (GAA) has been asked to provide detailed estimate for such training.

## Cabinet clears food policy

**Bhubaneswar (K-CN):** Odisha Government has decided procuring 30 lakh metric ton of rice during the 2016-17 Kharif Marketing Season (KMS) beginning from 1 November.

The new Procurement Policy for 2016-17 was approved at the State Cabinet meeting presided over by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik here today.

The Cabinet also approved a proposal to extend of time for a period of another three months to reduce the rate of value added tax (VAT) on pulses and dals of all kinds under the Odisha VAT Act, 2004, said Chief Secretary Aditya Prasad Padhi.

As the State Government procures paddy from farmers during Kharif and Rabi seasons separately under the KMS, the target was set to collect 30 lakh metric ton of rice, which is equivalent to 44 lakh tons of

paddy. The Minister said that as per the minimum support

Civil Supplies Corporation (OSCS) used to procure 95 per cent of paddy,



price fixed by the central government, the farmers will get Rs 1470 per quintal of common variety of paddy.

The rate of Grade-A variety of paddy is fixed at Rs 1510 per quintal, he said adding that the procuring agencies and district administrations will make wide publicity regarding the FAQ (fair average quality) of paddy.

He said the kharif paddy will be procured during the period from November 2016 to March 2017 and Rabi paddy during May and June, 2017. The paddy will be procured from farmers who are registered in the online portals of the Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Department.

So far 8.29 lakh farmers have already got themselves registered with the department, said he adding that 95 per cent of the paddy producers have so far been provided Aadhar numbers.

Therefore, the Aadhar seeding will be used for paddy procurement and the farmers will be paid online under the P-PAS system. The facility has been extended to 294 of the 314 blocks of the state, he said.

Similarly the Cabinet also extended another three months for

imposition of only 1 per cent VAT instead of 5 per cent of VAT on pulses of all kinds in view of the demand of traders.

Though the Government has sustained a loss of about Rs 5 crore towards VAT during the three months due to reduction of the rate of VAT on pulses, it would like another three months extension as sale of pulses has increased, the Chief Secretary said.

In another decision, the Cabinet also approved a proposed of finance department to reduce the rate of VAT from 14.5 per cent to 5 per cent on LPG Cylinder manufacturing.

As the neighboring states like West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand maintain five per cent VAT on LPG cylinder manufacturing, the State government will also bring it down to increase the transaction, Mr. Padhi said.

# JEV claims 38 lives

**Bhubaneswar(KCN):** Union Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Dharmendra Pradhan today met Union Health Minister JP Nadda to seek Centre's help to State to curb the spread of dreaded Japanese Encephalitis Virus (JEV) that has claimed lives of 38 infants in Tribal zone of Malkangiri.

Talking to Media after meeting, Mr. Pradhan said, "I have requested the Union Health Minister to lay emphasis on cause and prevention of the vector-borne disease in the Maoists dominated district."

Mr. Pradhan has urged Mr. Nadda to send a central team to the district to take stock of the situation and take initiatives to control the spread of the disease.

Union Minister Health said that he will soon send a team of experts to Odisha to assess the situation.

He suggested the Odisha Government to try its best to provide all sorts of assistance in the ground level to the

people in the JE prone areas.

The Centre is in contact with the State government



over the situation. All possible helps will be provided to the State at the earliest after discussing with the state health secretary over the issue, Mr. Nadda said.

## LIC, pension funds must invest in start-ups: DIPP Secretary

**New Delhi (KCN):** In order to boost start-ups, the government would consider a slew of policies that could, among other things, enable pension funds as well as insurance firms such as LIC to invest in start-ups, according to Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP) Secretary Ramesh Abhishek.

"LIC and pension funds must step in (in the start-up segment). Employees' Provident Fund Organisation had recently taken steps to increase their exposure in stock markets. So definitely their money needs to be leveraged (for start-ups)," Abhishek said at the World Economic Forum's India Economic Summit 2016.

Mr. Abhishek, who is in charge of DIPP, the nodal Central government department for start-ups and its related policy 'Start-up India', said he has personally written to over 100 corporates to utilise their Corporate Social Responsibility funds for start-ups and incubators. He said the government has already set up a Rs 10,000 crore Fund Of Funds, which will in four years help

mobilise private investments worth around Rs 50,000 crore for investments into start-ups.

"There should not be any regulations that will choke the start-up ecosystem," Mr. Abhishek said.

"What is the qualification for the office bearers? Do they have any special or essential qualification? Is the President of BCCI a politician," the bench asked.

Responding to the query, senior advocate Kapil Sibal, who was representing BCCI, said that Thakur was a cricketer.

Interrupting, senior advocate Gopal Subramaniam, who is assisting as an amicus curiae, said "we all have played cricket".

Taking objection to his remarks, Sibal said, "Thakur was a serious cricketer".

At this point, the CJI said, "I am the cap-

## Make a decision and back it, real essence of a captain: Skipper Kohli

NEW DELHI (KCN): Virat Kohli and it takes a lot of courage to do that. I me play even better than I probably strive for. "To have the re-



boasts of an impressive record as captain since taking over the reigns of Indian Test team two years ago and the right-hander feels the essence of being a leader lies in taking bold decisions and backing it to the hilt without thinking about consequences.

Under Kohli's leadership, India has won nine Tests out of 16 matches and lost only two with other five ending in draws. As a skipper, the aggressive Delhi batsman is yet to lose a Test at home.

By his own admission, Kohli has been an admirer of his predecessor Mahendra Singh Dhoni's leadership abilities.

"Decision making is very hard at times

learnt a lot from Dhoni seeing the way he made decisions. They might have been right or wrong but to convince yourself to make one decision and go forward with it; I think that is the essence of being a captain," Kohli told BCCITV.

Kohli takes pride in donning the whites and feels that the leadership responsibility has made him a much better cricketer.

"It is an honour to be leading the Test team for the country. It is something that I take a lot of pride in. To be a Test cricketer for starters and then to lead a Test side; for me it is paramount," he said.

"That extra responsibility helped

## ITF blasts Sharapova for 'making example of me' doping rap

LONDON (KCN): The International Tennis Federation (ITF) has blasted Maria Sharapova after she said that the governing body was attempting to make an example of her during her bitter doping ban.

The 29-year-old Russian superstar, who had a two-year suspension slashed to 15 months on Tuesday by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), also said the ITF exhibited a lack of neutrality in the dispute.

In an interview with the US broadcaster PBS the world's highest-earning sports-woman was asked that as a former

world number one and five-time major winner, if the ITF was trying to make an example of her.

"I never wanted to believe that, but I am starting to think that," said the Russian.

"I got a 24-month suspension, but they (the ITF) wanted four years for me."

But the London-based ITF hit back yesterday, defending its procedures and the tribunal which originally handed down a two-year ban after Sharapova tested positive for meldonium at the Australian Open in January.

"The ITF did

not 'try to ban Ms Sharapova for four years'. The ITF took the position that it is the inde-

pendent tribunal's responsibility to determine what the appropriate sanction should be," said a statement

from the governing body released to the British Press Association.

"This included

programme -- which are the same as those in the WADA code -- for a

meldonium." Sharapova also claimed the ITF were not neutral in their deliberations.

"I went through the ITF hearing, which was in front of an arbitration (panel) which was chosen by the ITF," she said.

"I am at a hearing (in London) knowing the people I am speaking to were chosen by the people that I am actually in a fight with.

"They call that neutral? That is not neutral. CAS is neutral and this is what CAS has awarded to me."

The ITF hit back in their statement, insisting that

Sharapova and her legal team had the right to object to any member of the independent tribunal.

"The members of the independent tribunal, which consisted of a barrister as chairman and medical and scientific experts as co-members, are appointed by the ITF," their statement added.

"However, Ms Sharapova's legal team was given the opportunity to object to any member of that tribunal, and they agreed in writing that they had no such objection."

Sharapova had admitted using

meldonium for 10 years to help treat illnesses, a heart issue and a magnesium deficiency.

She said she was unaware though that the substance had been added to the banned list by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) on January 1, shortly before her positive test.

The CAS decision means Sharapova will be able to return to action on the WTA Tour next April.

She will, however, be back on court as soon as next Monday when she takes part in a fundraiser event in Las Vegas.
